

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

He said the RPP is primarily concerned with combating the United States Government wherever it is possible and by all means that are effective, including violence. He continued "we want to join other progressive forces in and outside the United States. We must exert the greatest possible pressure and gain the power which is necessary in order to smash the Government apparatus."

He talked of the plight of the black people in the United States and when reminded of the social advances of the black people since 1960, he said he did not care about changes "in slices." He spoke of the number of Party members "murdered" and said "the Washington Government and the FBI are willfully attempting to eradicate us." He denied that most Panther leaders are now facing trimic are in jail, are living in exile, or have been killed and that the Party has been weakened. Eldridge Cleaver Black Panther Party

With regard to one of his previous statements as to the great educational value of killing, Cleaver said it is regrettable that weapons are needed to obtain the aims of the blacks but their liberation is involved and in this case it is an inevitable educational method to teach the people to hate their enemy—to hate what is oppressing and killing them. He stated President Nixon is responsible for the situation where the year—long work of the civil rights fighters has been reduced to nothing. "He is being hated by many people. And we believe that it would have been of educational value, that it would have an inspiring effect, if he were eliminated by violence. He is an obstacle on the way to our freedom. For this reason he should be eliminated brutally."

On the question of guerrilla warfare in the towns Cleaver stated he did not share the opinion of Cuban dictator Fidel Castro that such action would be folly. He said that one cannot maintain that actions in the towns are senseless and he could only repeat what Che Guèvara (Cuban guerrilla leader) said, "Wherever death may surprise us, it is welcome, if only our war cry has reached a willing ear and another hand reaches out to take up our arms."

In speaking of prominent black leaders in the United States he described the Reverend Ralph Abernathy as "an Uncle Tom" and said Abernathy's statement made in Sweden that the Black Panthers do not lead anybody was probably a lobbying effort by Abernathy for the Nobel prize which his predecessor Martin Luther King had been awarded.

In response to a question as to what the aims are for the work of the Panthers in West Germany, Cleaver stated there are 50,000 black GI's in that country from which the BPP can try to obtain recruits and that many black soldiers are already cooperating with the Panthers.

ELDRIDGE CLEAVER BLACK PANTHER PARTY

Cleaver, Black Panther Party (EPP) Minister of Information, was interviewed in Algiers, Algeria, his place of self-imposed exile.

Cleaver was asked if in establishing the International Section of the BPP in Algiers as an agency competing with the United States State Department, it was his intention to form an opposition government against the United States administration. He responded that revolutionary liberation movements have always borne the seed of future governments within themselves and if the struggle ends with a victory, it is quite natural that they take over authority. He said the EPP is primarily concerned with combating the United States Government wherever it is possible and by all means that are effective, including violence. He continued "we want to join other progressive forces in and outside the United States. We must exert the greatest possible pressure and gain the power which is necessary in order to smash the Government apparatus."

He talked of the plight of the black people in the United States and when reminded of the social advances of the black people since 1960, he said he did not care about changes "in slices." He spoke of the number of Party members "murdered" and said "the Washington Government and the FBI are willfully attempting to eradicate us." "Kill Mixon? -- "With Pleasure" ("Spiegel" interview of Black Panther Reader Eldridge Cleaver)

Spiegel: Mr. Cleaver, you are the "Information Minister" of the militant American Black Panther Party. In Algerian exile, on the run from the FBI, you have now established an international section of the Panther Party; in your words, a competitor of the State Department in Washington. Do you want to set up a "countergovernment" to the administration in the U.S.A.?

Cleaver: Revolutionary liberation movements always carry a seed of future governments in them. When your struggle ends in victory, it is quite natural that you take over the authority. However, as far as we, the Panther Party, are concerned, the main question is to fight the U.S. government whenever this is possible.

Spiegel: By what methods?

Cleaver: By all the methods that are effective.

Spiegel: And you believe that violence is effective?

Cleaver: Yes. We want to unite with other progressive forces within and putside the U.S.A. We must put one the greatest possible pressure and gain power which is necessary to destroy the government machinery.

Spiegel: A civil rights commission established as far anch as 1968 that "two societies," black and white, are developing in America. Will they fight against each other to the the the

Cleaver: The number of blacks murdered by the underlings of the repressive government keeps rising. Blacks have as before high unemployment; they don't get reasonable housing, adequate clothing -- not even enough to eat...

Spiegel: Nevertheless, there is social progress, for blacks as well. For example, their family income has risen 50 per 1960.

Cleaver: I'm not interested in piecemeal changes. We cannot be satisfied as long as we don't have what we are entitled to.

Spiegel: Your party had to take some setbacks in this uncompromising fight. The police have taken the offensive.

Cleaver: The killing of Comrade Hampton in Houston raised the number of murdered party members to 31. The Washington government and the FBI are engaged in a deliberate effort to exterminate us.

Spiegel: At any rate, most of the Panther leaders now are on trial, in jail, living, as you, in exile here in Algeria, or have been killed. It proves that your party is weak.

Cleaver: It isn't true. Only a few members of our leadership are known at all to the public. The Panther Party has grown of late.

Spiegel: You complain about the violence used by the police against the Panthers. At the same time you yourself preach the use of force to overthrow the allegedly fascist U.S. government. Isn't this a contradiction?

Cleaver: Not at all. White racists in the United States don't have any right to deprive us of our human rights. We fight to get back what belongs to us. This doesn't need any justification.

Spiegel: You have said that you would like to teach people how to kill the enemy. You spoke of the "great educational value" of killing.

Cleaver: Objectively it may be regrettable that we need weapons to attain our ends. But at stake is our liberation, our freedom. And here is the indispensable educational method to teach men to hate their enemy, to hate what oppresses and destroys them.

Spiegel: And the call for political murder is one of them?

Cleaver: Well, let's take President Nixon, for example. He has intensified the oppression of blacks and other progressive forces. He is responsible for the fact that many years of work on the part of civil rights activists have been destroyed.

He is hated by many. And we believe it would be of an educational value, it would be inspiring if he were done away with by force...

Spiegel: And then?

Cleaver: Then, people would realize that it is not only desirable but also possible to eliminate such individuals as Nixon. He stands in the way of our freedom. Therefore he should be brutally done away with.

Spiegel: He would be replaced by Spiro Agnew.

Cleaver: We have actually experienced how the succeeding Presidents continue to oppress the blacks. We haven't yet had the pleasure and honor of getting rid of one of them ourselves.

Spiegel: At any rate this kind of violence can only constitute the first step toward an armed revolution.

Cleaver: I'm not sure here. In a revolutionary process there may be violence from beginning to end, or maybe only sporadically. It is the function of an act of violence to cross the limits set by the oppressors. When a man rises up in arms against his oppressor, he takes his destiny in his own hands.

Spiegel: You have done it yourself.

Cleaver: I know from my own experience and from experiences of others: one gets a very good feeling from squeezing the trigger of a rifle aimed at the tormentor.

of a talk with <u>Fldridge Cleaver</u> which the news magazine <u>Der Spiesel</u> published in its issue of December 14, 1970, under the headline

"Kill Nixon? - It Would be a Pleasure"!

Mr. Cleaver, you are the "Minister of Information" of the militant American Black Panther Party. In your Algerian exile, while on the run from the FBI, you have founded an international division of the Panther Party which, as you put it, is to compete with Washington's State Department. Are you going to form a countergovernment to the US Administration?

Cleaver: Revolutionary liberation movements always bear in themselves the seed of future governments. When their fight ends victoriously it is quite natural that they take over authority. For the time being, however, we, the Black Panthers, are faced with the task of fighting the US Government wherever possible.

Spiegel: By what means?

Cleaver: By all means that are effective.

And you do believe that force is effective?

Cleaver Yes, we do. We are going to unite with other progressive forces both inside and outside the United States. We have to exercise a maximum of pressure and gain the power that is required to destroy the government machinery.

"two societies," a white and a black one, are developing in America. Will both fight each other for life and death?

<u>Cleaver</u>: An increasing number of Blacks are murdered by the henchmen of the repressive government. The Blacks continue to suffer from a high unemployment rate. They are not given acceptable apartments, decent clothing, and not even enough to eat...

<u>Spiegel</u>: Nevertheless, there is some social progress among the Blacks. For example, their average family income increased by about fifty percent since 1960.

Cleaver: I don't care for piecemeal changes. We can't be satisfied until we get everything that's due us.

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Spiegel: However, in conducting this uncompromising fight your party had to accept reverses. The police have taken the offensive.

<u>Cleaver</u>: The murder of Comrade Hampton in Houston increased the number of murdered party members to 31. The Washington Government and the FBI are making a conscious effort to annihilate us.

<u>Spiegel</u>: There's no denying the fact that most Panther leaders are now awaiting court action, are in prison, live in exile — as you do here in Algiers — or were killed. Doesn't this confirm the statement that your party is weakened?

<u>Cleaver</u>: This simply isn't true. After all, only a few of our members are known to the public. The Panther Party actually has grown in the more recent past.

Spiezal: You complain about police violence versus the Panthers while at the same time you proclaim the use of force to overthrow the allegedly fascist US Government. Isn't this a contradiction?

<u>Cleaver</u>: By no means. The white racists in the United States have no right to deprive us of our human rights. We fight for getting back what is ours. This needs no justification.

Spiegel: You said you wanted to teach people to kill their enemy. You spoke of the "great educational value" of killing.

Cleaver: Objectively seen it is perhaps regrettable that we need arms to reach our goals. But what is at stake is our liberation, our freedom. And to this end it is an indispensable educational method to teach people to hate their enemy, to hate what suppresses and kills them.

Spiegel: And this also includes an appeal to malitical murder?

Cleaver: Well now, take President Nixon, for example. He further intensified the suppression of the Blacks and other progressive forces. He is responsible for the fact that the long work of the Civil Rights advocates was undone. He is hated by many. And we believe that it would be of educational value, that it would have an inspiring effect if he were removed by force...

Spiegel: And then?

Cleaver: Then people would realize that it is not only desirable but also possible to eliminate individuals like Richard Nixon He is in the way of our freedom, and for this reason he should be brutally removed.

Spice ... He would be replaced by - Spiro Agnew.

Character. We have had the experience, in fact, that successive presidents continued the suppression of the Blacks. It is only that we haven't had the please yet of removing one of them ourselves.

Spiencel: But this kind of force can at best be the preliminary phase of armed revolution.

<u>Cleaver</u>: I'm not so sure about this. In the revolutionary process there possibly is force from beginning to end, or only sporadically. The function of violence is to transgress the limits laid down by the suppressers. If a man raises in arms against his suppresser he takes his fate into his own hand.

wagel: This is what you have done, too.

<u>Cleaver</u>: I know from my own experience and from the experience of others that you get a very good feeling if you pull the trigger of a gun that's aimed at your tormentor.

Spingel: A.P this is of great e. acational vel

Yes, it is. When people see that another person does that they identify themselves with him, especially so when they share his natro of the tyrant. Then they fall into withful thinking, can do a bit of daydreaming — and perhaps picture an exploit of their own.

<u>Spiceol</u>: Do you really believe that the individual terror of a small minority can shake the power structures of the USA?

Clear: The point is not whether we, with our numbers, can defeat the Government. The point is to create a situation in which other people are forced to start thinking and do something for a solution.

Spices: Even if the methods you are using in this strategy are suicidal?

Clever: If we remained quiet and accepted the fascization of US society witnout opposition: that would be suicide. We prefer, in the words of Huey Newton, our Defense Minister, to commit revolutionary suicide if we are to die anyhow. Then our death would at least mean something.

Spiege: What you want is guerilla war in the cities. According to Fidel Jastro, this is "not only a stupidity but a crime."

Chaver: Fidel Castro said that.

Spiegel: and what does Eldridge Cleaver say?

Cleaver: That's quite clear: I don't share this view, because Cestro's statement doesn't apply to our situation. The Blacks are crowded into the gnettos of the American cities. Fidel Castro isn't familiar with this. He is concerned with the Cuban situation. As I was in Cuba myself I must say that he hasn't the experience to judge our situation or even to dictate our methods of fighting.

Spiegel: Not only revolutionaries in developing countries like Castro deem it absurd to aim for guerilla warfare in the cities. Also many Marxists in industrialized countries say that violence on the part of minorities in the metropolitan areas of highly developed societies cannot be a means of revolution and would even be counter-revolutionary, as Rudi Dutschk said.

Cleaver: But we can't just sit there and do nothing! Passivity will condemn our people to certain suicide. By the way, Castro and Dutscake are not the only ones who commented on the highest. Spiegel: Marighela, the leader of the Brazil guerillas, was killed by the police. And the Brazil revolutionaries are returning from the cities to the country.

Cleman: Nevertheless, you can't claim that actions in the cities are meaningless. I can only repeat what Che Guevara said, "Wherever death may surprise us, he shall be welcome if only our summons to arms has reached a willing ear and another hand reaches out to take up our weapon."

<u>Spiegel</u>: You call your revolutionary theory Marxist-Leninist. Many professed Marxist-Leninists will not accept that. You yourself called Marx and Lenin racists.

Cleaver: And I have very precise information in this respect. One of our comrades is writing a book about this subject. The attitude taken by Marx and Lenin is not surprising if you consider the time in which they lived. I think my assumption is reasonable.

Spiegel: Is your fight a racial fight or a class fight?

Cleaver: We prefer a racial fight. But in view of the racist attitude of the white Americans and in view of the conscious attempts of the Government to instigate the Views against the Placks, we have no other choice. It might become ascessary that race fights against race because the objective situation requires this.

Spical: Would this mean recial fight before class fight? To fight White recism with Black racism?

Cleaver: No, I don't say that. We know from experience that this would be an unsuitable method which wouldn't nelp us. Therefore, in the fight against racism our party has assumed the leadership among the American revolutionsries.

Spical: According to Markist teaching, revolution is not made by suppressed minorities but by the mass of the workers' class. However, in the US most white workers form one of the mest reactionary groups of society.

<u>Cleaver</u>: Difficulties in fact begin when we talk about the workers' class and the proletariat. The Black Americans are members of the workers' class. The Black Panthers are members of the proletariat.

Spic most of them belong to the "proletariat in rags" which, according to Lenin, can never become the revolutionary avant-garde.

Cleaver: In his judgment on the proletariat in regs, Mork was a bit of a snob. The proletariat is defined as the class that doesn't own any means of production. And we conform to this definition.

Spiegel: How are you going to organize the Waites who don't own any means of production?

Cleaver: To organize the White workers is primarily the job of the White revolutionaries. We are going to conclude alliances with them.

Sties 1: There is a surprising statement by Eldridge Cleaver, namely, that the White middle-class is becoming one of the most revolutionary groups of US society.

Cleaver: I don't think I have to retract this statement. Many people who don't stem from the workers' had any joined the revolution.

They received a better education and are sensitive to the nuances of suppression in the United States. Once they have crossed the line and become revolutionaries, they are extremely revolutionary.

Spiegel: So far you have been much more successful in obtaining support from the Black community than from the White. According to a poll conducted by the Harris institute, the large majority of the Whites feel hostile towards the Panthers, whereas every fourth Black American emphasizes that "the philosophy of the Panthers is mine, too."

Cleaver: We always knew that the Black population appreciates us and what we do — even if they are afraid to do it themselves.

Spiegel: Nevertheless, various prominent Black leaders spoke against the Panthers. Minister Ralph Abernathy, for example, the successor of Martin Luther King, said that the Black Panthers "do a lot of talking, but they have no program, and they lead no one."

Cleaver: Well, he didn't say that in the US but in Sweden. Perhaps he was lobbying there for a Nobel Prize as the given to his predecessor, Martin Luther King. We see in Abernathy's statement the typical opportunism of certain Black leaders of the middle-class who see to court the rulers.

Special: Do you hold Abernathy to be an Uncle Tom?

Classer: I've always held Brother Abernathy as a shining example of what has become of Uncle Tom in our time.

Spiegel: A Black "Pig?"

Cleaver: I would say Abernathy is an Uncle Tom but no "Pig."

Spiegel: Are there Black "Pigs?"

<u>Cleaver</u>: Yes, among the leaders of the moderate Blacks. There even are "Pigs" who infiltrate the Black revolutionary parties.

Spiegel: This very infiltration is being discussed in the trial of your party chairman Bobby Seale that is being conducted in New Haven. Seale is charged with having ordered the murder of an alleged police spy who had infiltrated the Panther Party.

Clamar: That trial is a frame-up.

Spingel: It's a fact, though, that two former Panther members admitted that the party leadership — probably Bobby Seale — had ordered them to liquidate the traitor.

Clear: The American Government always found it easy to buy denouncers for the witness stand. The Government repeatedly summoned liers to serve as witnesses against our party members in order to manipulate these trials. Proceedings against Bobby Seale were also staged to liquidate the Panther Party.

Spingel: This trial caused many White radicals to identify themselves with the Panthers. Does your alliance with Whites who are estranged from society include such people as the "LSD prophet" Timothy Leary? A short while ago he, too, came to live in Algiers.

Character We don't conclude alliances with individuals, although we acknowledge the progressive role which Leary played in the past.

Spiegel: Drugs as a means for obtaining political consciousness?

Cleaver: We acknowledge the importance of people who were dissatisried with the closen, "Turn on, tune in, drop out." For many of them this was a final step to separate themselves from the status quo.

Spiegel: Is it also a step towards revolutionary consciousness?

Cleaver: Many people who began with the Leary method became true revolutionaries. Dr. Leary himself escaped from prison, broke with the American establishment and today advocates revolution by force.

Spiege: But in the US your party fights the consemption of drugs?

Cleaver: We don't deny this. What we need for our fight are sober people with a clear mind rather than people who flee from reality by going on drug trips.

Spiegel: In 1968 you yourself had to flee the American reality. Subsequently you lived for more than half a year in Fidel Castro's Cuba. You hardly had a chance there to work politically: Are you disappointed with Cuba.

Cleaver: I was very dissatisfied.

Spie 1: Why did you go to Algiers?

Cleaver: The Algerian Government extended generous hospitality to us; it demonstrates solidarity with us.

Spinal: You now wish to visit the Federal Republic. Do you have concrete goals for the work of the Panthers in West Germany?

can recruit among them. Already many Black soldiers are cooperating with us. Apart from this I would like to discuss with the antiimperialist students our common fight.

Entered: But in the US problems are of a quite different nature than in the Federal Republic. We have no ghettos...

Spiegel: And this has great educational value?

Cleaver: Yes. When people see that somebody else

is doing it, they begin to identify themselves, with it especially when they share the same hatred of tyrants. Then, they fall into wishful thinking, they can do a little daydreaming...and maybe picture their own

act of heroism.

Spiegel: Do you really believe that individual terror

by a small minority can shake the power structure

of the U.S.A.?

Cleaver: It is not a question of whether we can defeat

the government with our numbers; it is a question of creating a situation where other people will be forced to sout it and do

something about finding a solution.

Something about linging a solution.

Spiegel: Even if the methods used by you in this

Spiegel: You want guerrills warfare in the cities.

According to Fidel Castro, this is "not only

a folly but a crime."

Cleaver: That's Fidel Castro.

Spiegel: And what is Eldridge Cleaver?

Cleaver: It goes without saying -- I don't share this

view. Castro's statement does not apply to our situation. Blacks are penned up in the ghettos of American cities. Fidel Castro knows nothing about it. He had to deal with a Cuban situation. Since I myself was in

Cuba, I must say: he doesn't have the experience

to judge our situation or even dictate our

methods of fighting to us.

Spiegel: Revolutionaries of developing countries such

as Castro are not the only ones believing

that a city guerrilla is an absurdity. Likewise, many Marxists in industrial countries say that the violence by minorities in metropolitan areas of highly developed societies cannot

be the means of a revolution and, according

to Rudi Dutschke, it would even be counterrevolutionary.

Cleaver: We just wan't sit on our hands! Passiveness

condemns our people to a certain suicide. Incidentally, Castro and Dutschke are not the

only ones who spoke out on this subject. You are maybe familiar with the publications

of Comrade Carlos Marighela.

Spiegel: Marighela, leader of the Brazilian guerrillas,

was killed by the police. And the Brazilian revolutionaries are returning from the cities

to the countryside.

Cleaver: Nevertheless, one cannot claim that actions

in the cities are meaningless. I can only repeat what the Guevana said: "No matter where death may surprise us, it is welcome if only our battle cry strikes a receptive

ear and another hand reaches out thepick up our

weapons."

Spiegel: You describe your revolutionary theory as Marxist-Leninist. Many professed Marxist-Leninists would not accept it. You yourself

have called Marx and Lenin racists.

Cleaver: And I have very accurate information about it. One of our comrades wrote a book on this subject. Marx's and Lenin's attitude is not surprising if we consider the time in which they lived. I believe my assumption

is reasonable.

Spiegel:

Is your struggle a race struggle or a class struggle?

Cleaver: We would prefer a class struggle. However, in view of the racist attitude on the part of white Americans and faced with the deliberate efforts by the government to incite whites against blacks, we don't have any choice. It could become necessary to have one race fight another race because the objective situation calls for it.

Spiegel: This means race struggle before class struggle?
To fight white racism with black racism?

Cleaver: No, I don't say that. We know from experience that this is a bad method, that it will not hap. Our Party has consequently taken the leadership among the American revolutionaries in the struggle against racism.

Spiegel: According to the Marxist teaching, revolution is not made by oppressed minorities but by the masses of the working class. In the United States, however, the majority of the white workers are one of the most reactionary groups in the country.

Cleaver: The difficulty begins in fact when we start talking about the working class and the proletariat. Black Americans are members of the working class. Black Panthers are members of the proletariat.

Spiegel: Mostly they are members of the "Lumpenproletarist."
According to Marx, however, it can never become

the revolutionary vanguard.

Cleaver: Well, Marx was a little bit snobbish in his judgment on the "Lumpenproletariat". The proletariat is defined as a class without the means of production. And this applies to us.

Spiegel: How do you propose to organize the whites who don't have the means of production?

Cleaver: It is the task of the white revolutionaries to organize the white workers. We want to form alliances with them.

Spiegel: There is a surprising statement by Eldridge Cleaver; samely, that the white middle class is one of the most revolutionary groups in American society.

Cleaver: I don't think I have to retract it. Many people who don't come from the working class have joined the revolution. They received a better education and are more sensitive to the various shades of oppression in the United States. Once they cross the line and become revolutionaries, they become extreme.

Etter

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Spiegel: Until now you have had/success in getting support from the black than white community. According to the Harris Survey, a great majority of the white people is a hostile to the Panthers. However, every fourth black American said: "The Panther philosophy is also my philosophy."

Cleaver: We always knew that the Black people appreciate us and what we are doing, even when they were afraid of doing it themselves.

Spiegel: Nevertheless, various prominent black leaders have spoken out against the Panthers. For example, Martin Luther King's successor, the Rev. Ralph Abernathy said: The Black Panthers "talk a lot but they don't have any program and they don't lead anyone."

Cleaver:

Yes, he said/in Sweden but not in the U.S.A. Maybe he was lobbying these for a Nobel Prize which his successor, Martin Luther King, had received. We see in Abernathy's statement a typical exportunism by certain black leaders of the middle class who want to ingratiate themselves with the ruling class.

"To Hate is to Love Yourself a Little Less"

("Spiegel" reporter Kai Hermann's visit with Eldridge Cleaver in Algeria.)

Eldridge Cleaver keeps one waiting but not so long that one has to take it as a provoking lack of courtesy. He welcomes one with a kind of "hallo" that creates an atmosphere of alcofness even before the talk starts. interview with a white representative of the capitalist press is a transaction in reciprocity to him.

Cleaver does not do his partner the favor of becoming emotional. He knows what he wants to tell the liberal and "half-left" public. He doesn't permit solidarity to come up; he lets you feel some of his contempt. After an overcool scene he leaves without a farewell flourish.

Eldridge Cleaver, the Information Minister of the Black Panther Party in Algerian exile and the Ambassador of revolutionary America appointed by his political friends, pays back in small coin for what he owes the whites and their system.

He was born near Little Rock, the symbol of hatred, and learned to shine shoes in Goldwater's State of Ariyona. He was a part of the American legend of the poor, little shoeshine boys who become great men, and turned it upside-down.

He left the South with his parents for California and did what a young Negro man could do, to get out of the slums. He played football to become a star; he stole and he sold drugs to have some money.

At 18 he landed in jail. There a prison guard ripped off a picture of a white pin-up girl from the wall in his cell and let him replace it with that of a black girl.

Cleaver learned something. When he was released, he began to rape white women. It gave him satisfaction to "trample upon the white man's laws, upon his system of values, to degrade his women."

For the first time in his life he had luck when he was given 15 years in prison instead of landing in an electric chair for rape and attempted marder.

The stations of his education were San Quentin, Folsom and Soledad state penitentiaries. First he read, then he began to write to "save myself." By writing he fought with his desperation and his hatred.

Eldridge Cleaver in Algerian exile is not the subtle assayist who won literary world acclaim with his book "Soul on Ice" written in prison. His life, his experiences with the U.S. society have coagglated into a political theory, into a "Marxism-Leninism" made in U.S.A.

A Markist gets quite touchy when he is suspected of being a racist. He does not want a race war; and yet he thinks it is unavoidable.

He has green eyes and light brown skin, "the mark of (white) beasts," as one of his fellow prisoners believed to have discovered on him.

Already in prison, he parted company with the radical Black Muslim radists. Today he is also looking all over the world for white allies whom he cannot quite bring himself to trust. He made an ally of LSD prophet Timothy Leary who escaped from an American prison to join him in Algeria. He brought him the theory of the revolutionary effect of drugs on whites.

He remained the same Cleaver who doesn't hate whites, in his essays, but merely suffers because of them. His calls for hatred must be viewed in the realization that "the price of hating other people is to love yourself a little less."

Eldridge Cleaver in Algeria wears neither the Afrolook nor the black Panther uniform. He wears cordured pants and stylish boots. Neither could one suspect in him the Behemian who was enjoying freedom for a few weeks after his release from prison.

However, even then, back in 1966, he resisted the temptation to let himself be integrated into the American society as a celebrated writer of the black protest movement.

He joined the Black Panthers and finally let himself be nominated as a presidential candidate of the "Peace and Freedom Party". Thereby he voluntarily chose again an alternative which he seemed to have just escaped: prison or death.

A merciless hunt was launched for the prisoner released on bond who suddenly became a dangerous political opponent. When policemen staged a gun battle with Panthers, among whom Cleaver had found himself, they provided the authorities with a formal justification for putting the presidential candidate back behind the bars. As Cleaver and his friends claim, on this occasion, the person who was shot from behind was an 18-year-old Panther who had been taken for him. Shortly before he was to go back to prison, he disappeared.

His friend, Robert Scheer reports how much Cleaver likes "freedom and women and food and Scotch and Berkeley and Bobby Dylan." One of his former girl friends in San Francisco said "He hates and fights to be able to freely enjoy life in America some day."

The Panther headquarters in Algeria is turned, in the evening, into a Berkeley campus shack. Then Eldridge Cleaver, his wife Eathleen and his aide Larry Mack, who lost an eye in a street fight and escaped from the United States to Cuba by plane, sit on the floor listening to jazz music, cracking nuts and talking about America.

Spiegel: Do you consider Abernathy to be an Uncle Tom?

Cleaver: I have always regarded Brother Abernathy as a shining example of what becomes of an Uncle Tome in our age.

Spiegel: A black "pig"?

Cleaver: I would say, Abernathy is an Uncle Tom but not a "pig".

Spicel: Are there black "pigs"?

Cleaver: Yess -- among the leaders of the moderate blacks. There are "pigs" who infiltrate the black revolutionary parties.

Spiegel: This infiltration is coming up for discussion at the trial of your Party Chairman Bobby Seale in New Haven. Seale is accused of having ordered the killing of an alleged police informer who had infiltrated the Panther Party.

Cleaver: This trial is a frame-up.

Spiegel: Two former Panther members testified that the party leadership, none else than Bobby Seale, had ordered them to liquidate the traitor.

Cleaver: It has always been easy for the U.S. Government to get paid informers on the witness stand. It has repeatedly used liars as witnesses against our party members in order to manipulate these trials. The trial of Bobby Seale has also been staged to liquidate the Panther Party.

Cleaver: We do not ally ourselves with individual persons.
We do however recognize the part played by Leary
in the past.

Spiegel: Drugs to awaken political consciousness?

Cleaver: We recognize the importance of those who were dissatisfied with the American society and fled from reality. They took drugs in accordance with the slogan: "Turn on, turn in, drop out." For many this was the final move to break with the "status quo."

Spiegel: Is this also a step toward becoming a revolutionary conscious?

Cleaver: Many of those who had begun with Leary methods ended up being real revolutionaries. Dr. Leary himself has fled from prison, has broken with the American establishment and today is for a violent revolution.

Spiegel: But in the United States, your Party is combating drug abuse!

Cleaver: We make no bones about it. For our struggle we need sober people with clear minds, not people who flee from reality by going on drug trips.

Spiegel: You yourself had to flee from American reality in 1968. You lived in Fidel Castro's Cuba for over six months. You could hardly work there politically. Are you disendented with Cuba?

Cleaver: I was quite dissatisfied.

Spiegel: Whyy did you go to Algeria?

Cleaver: The Algerian Government has offered us a magnamimous hospitality; it is in solidarity with us.

Spiegel: You want now to visit the Federal Republic of Germany. Do you have any definite plans for the Panther activity in West Germany?

Cleaver: There are 50,000 black GIs in your country.

Spiegel: The Black Panther Solidarity Committee in Frankfurt thied in vain to get an entry visa for you from Minister of the Interior Genscher. Recently, Bonn refused an entry visa to your wife, Kathleen.

Cleaver: Kathleen was supposed to take part in a solidarity conference for Bobby Seale and in Frankfurt demonstration held November 28. Unlike me she is not sought by the "pigs" in Washington which gives orders to those in Bonn on how to deal with us...

Spiegel: ... and therefore you believed your wife would be allowed to enter the country?

Cleaver: Yes. "Pig" Genscher doesn't have any right to prevent Kathleen from entering his neo-Nazi State. But he and the puppets in Bonn have given in under pressure from Washington. They are lackeys of the American imperialists.

Spiegel: Mr. Cleaver, thank you for this interview.

SPIEGEL-Gespräch mit dem "Black Panther"-Führer Eldridge Cleaver

SPIEGEL: Mr. Cleaver, Sie sind "Informationsminister" der militanten amerikanischen Black Panther Party. Im algerischen Exil, auf der Flucht vor dem FBI, haben Sie jetzt eine internationale Abteilung der Panther-Partei gegründet — nach Ihren Worten eine Konkurrenz zum Washingtoner Außenministerium. Wollen Sie eine Gegenregierung zur Administration der USA bilden?

CLEAVER: Revolutionäre Befreiungsbewegungen tragen immer den Keim künftiger Regierungen in sich. Wenn ihr Kampf siegreich endet, ist es ganz natürlich, daß sie die Autorität übernehmen. Für uns, für die Panther-Partei, geht es allerdings vorerst darum, die US-Regierung zu bekämpfen, wo immer das möglich ist.

keine vernünftigen Wohnungen, keine ordentliche Kleidung — und nicht einmal genug zu essen ...

SPIEGEL: Gleichwohl gibt es soziale Fortschritte — auch bei den Schwarzen. Zum Beispiel ist ihr durchschnittliches Familieneinkommen seit 1960 um rund 50 Prozent gestiegen.

CLEAVER: Mir sind scheibchenweise Veränderungen egal. Wir können uns nicht zufriedengeben, solange wir nicht alles erreicht haben, was uns zusteht.



SPIEGEL: Mit welchen Mitteln?

CLEAVER: Mit allen Mitteln, die effektiv sind.

SPIEGEL: Und Sie glauben, daß Gewalt effektiv ist?

CLEAVER: Ja. Wir wollen uns mit anderen fortschrittlichen Kräften innerhalb und außerhalb der USA zusammenschließen. Wir müssen größtmöglichen Druck ausüben und die Macht erringen, die notwendig ist, um den Regierungsapparat zu zerschlagen.

SPIEGEL: Eine Bürgerrechts-Kommission stellte schon 1968 fest: In Amerika entwickeln sich "zwei Gesellschaften", eine weiß, eine schwarz. Werden sich beide auf Tod und Leben bekämpfen?

CLEAVER: Immer mehr Schwarze werden von den Handlangern der repressiven Regierung umgebracht. Die Schwarzen leiden nach wie vor unter hoher Arbeitslosigkeit; sie bekommen stieg die Zahl der ermordeten Parteimitglieder auf 31. Die Washingtoner Regierung und das FBI unternehmen den bewußten Versuch, uns auszurotten.

SPIEGEL: Jedenfalls stehen die meisten Panther-Führer jetzt vor Gericht, sind im Gefängnis, leben — wie Sie hier in Algier — im Exil oder wurden umgebracht. Das bestätigt doch: Ihre Partei ist geschwächt.

CLEAVER: Das ist einfach nicht wahr. Nur wenige Mitglieder unserer Führung sind ja der Öffentlichkeit überhaupt bekannt. Die Panther Party ist in jüngster Zeit gewachsen.

SPIEGEL: Sie beklagen sich über die Gewalttätigkeit der Polizei gegenüber den Panthern. Gleichzeitig aber proklamieren Sie selber Gewalt, um die angeblich faschistische US-Regierung

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zu stürzen. Ist das nicht ein Widerspruch?

CLEAVER: Keineswegs. Die weißen Rassisten in den Vereinigten Staaten haben kein Recht, uns unserer Menschenrechte zu berauben. Wir kämpfen dafür, das zurückzubekommen, was uns gehört. Dies braucht keine Rechtfertigung.

SPIEGEL: Sie haben erklärt, daß Sie die Leute lehren möchten, den Feind zu töten. Sie sprachen vom "großen erzieherischen Wert" des Tötens.

CLEAVER: Objektiv ist es vielleicht bedauerlich, daß wir Waffen brauchen, um unsere Ziele zu erreichen. Aber es geht um unsere Befreiung, unsere Freiheit. Und da ist es unerläßliche erzieherische Methode, den Menschen beizubringen, ihren Feind zu hassen, zu hassen, was sie unterdrückt und umbringt.

SPIEGEL: Und dazu gehört auch der

Aufruf zum politischen Mord?

CLEAVER: Nun, nehmen Sie zum Beispiel Präsident Nixon. Er hat die Unterdrückung der Schwarzen und anderer progressiver Kräfte noch verstärkt. Er ist dafür verantwortlich, daß die jahrelange Arbeit der Bürgerrechtler zunichte gemacht wurde. Er wird von vielen gehaßt. Und wir glauben, es wäre von erzieherischem Wert, es würde inspirierend wirken, wenn er gewaltsam beseitigt würde . . .

SPIEGEL: Und dann?

CLEAVER: Dann würden die Leule begreifen, daß es nicht nur wünschbat, sondern auch möglich ist, Individuen wie Richard Nixon zu eliminieren. Er steht unserer Freiheit im Wege. Deshalb sollte er brutal beseitigt werden.

SPIEGEL: Er würde ersetzt - durch Spiro Agnew.

CLEAVER: Wir haben es in der Tat erlebt, daß aufeinanderfolgende Prädie sidenten Unterdrückung Schwarzen fortsetzten. Nur das Vergnügen und das Verdienst, einen davon selber zu beseitigen, hatten wir noch nicht.

SPIEGEL: Diese Art von Gewalt kan doch allenfalls die Vorstufe zur bewaffneten Revolution sein.

CLEAVER: Da bin ich nicht sicher. Im revolutionären Prozeß gibt es möglicherweise von Anfang bis zum Ende Gewalt, möglicherweise auch nur sporadisch. Die Funktion der Gewalttat ist es, die von Unterdrückern festgelegten Grenzen zu überschreiten. Wenn sich ein Mensch mit der Waffe gegen seinen Unterdrücker erhebt, nimmt er șein Schicksal in die eigene Hand.

SPIEGEL: Das haben Sie auch selber tetan.

CLEAVER: Ich weiß aus meiner eigenen Erfahrung und aus der Erfahrung anderer: Man bekommt ein sehr gutes Gefühl, wenn man den Abzug eines Gewehrs durchzieht, das auf den Peiniger gerichtet ist.

SPIEGEL: Und das hat großen erzieherischen Wert?

CLEAVER: Ja. Wenn die Leute sehen, daß ein anderer das macht, dann identifizieren sie sich damit, besonders, wenn sie den Haß auf den Tyrannen teilen. Dann verfallen sie in Wunschdenken, können ein bißchen tagträumen — und sich vielleicht eine eigene Heldentat ausmalen.

SPIEGEL: Glauben Sie wirklich, daß individueller Terror einer kleinen Minderheit die Machtstrukturen der

USA erschüttern kann?

CLEAVER: Es geht nicht darum, ob wir mit unserer Zahl die Regierung besiegen können; es geht darum, eine Situation zu schaffen, in der andere Menschen gezwungen sind, nachzudenken und etwas für eine Lösung zu

SPIEGEL: Selbst wenn die Methoden, die Sie bei dieser Strategie anwenden, selbstmörderisch sind?

CLEAVER: Wenn wir ruhig blieben und die Faschisierung der US-Gesellschaft ohne Widerstand hinnähmen das wäre Selbstmord. Wir ziehen es vor, mit den Worten unseres Verteidigungsministers Huey Newton, revolutionären Selbstmord zu begehen, wenn wir schon sterben müssen. Dann wird unser Tod jedenfalls etwas bedeuten.

SPIEGEL: Sie wollen Guerilla-Krieg in den Städten. Nach Fidel Castro ist das "nicht nur eine Dummheit, sondern ein Verbrechen".

CLEAVER: Das ist Fidel Castro.

SPIEGEL: Und was ist Eldridge Cleaver?

CLEAVER: Ganz klar - ich teile diese Meinung nicht. Weil Castros Erklärung nicht auf unsere Situation zutrifft. Die Schwarzen sind in den Gettos amerikanischer Städte zusammengepfercht. Damit ist Fidel Castro nicht vertraut. Er hat es mit der kubanischen Situation zu tun. Da ich selbst in Kuba war, muß ich sagen: Er hat nicht lie Erfahrung, unsere Lage zu beureilen oder uns gar unsere Kampfmethoden zu diktieren.

SPIEGEL: Nicht nur Revolutionäre der Entwicklungsländer wie Castro halten Stadtguerilla für absurd. Auch viele Marxisten in industrialisierten Ländern sagen, daß die Gewalttätig-keit von Minderheiten in den Metropolen hochentwickelter Gesellschaften kein Mittel der Revolution sein kann, ja sogar — laut Rudi Dutschke konterrevolutionär wäre.

CLEAVER: Wir können doch nicht die Hände in den Schoß legen! Passivität verurteilt unser Volk zu sicherem Selbstmord. Ubrigens sind Castro und Dutschke nicht die einzigen, die sich zu diesem Thema äußerten. Sie kennen vielleicht die Veröffentlichungen des Genossen Carlos Marightela.

SPIEGEL: Marighela, der Anführer der brasilianischen Guerilla, wurde von Polizisten getötet. Und die brasilianischen Revolutionäre kehren von den Städten zurück aufs Land.

CLEAVER: Trotzdem kann man nicht behaupten, daß Aktionen in den Städten sinnlos seien. Ich kann nur wiederholen, was Che Guevara sagte: "Wo immer uns der Tod überraschen mag, er sei willkommen, wenn nur

unser Kriegsruf ein aufnahmebereites Ohr getroffen hat und eine andere Hand sich ausstreckt, unsere Waffen zu ergreifen."

SPIEGEL: Sie bezeichnen Ihre revolutionäre Theorie als marxistisch-leninistisch. Viele erklärte Marxisten-Leninisten werden das nicht akzeptieren. Sie selbst haben Marx und Lenin Rassisten genannt.

CLEAVER: Und ich habe darüber sehr genaue Informationen. Einer unserer Genossen schreibt ein Buch über dieses Thema. Die Einstellung von Marx und Lenin ist nicht überraschend, wenn man die Zeit bedenkt, in der sie lebten. Ich glaube, meine Annahme ist vernünftig.

SPIEGEL: Ist Ihr Kampf ein Rassenkampf oder ein Klassenkampf?

CLEAVER: Wir möchten lieber einen Klassenkampf. Aber angesichts der rassistischen Haltung der weißen Amerikaner und angesichts der bewußten Versuche der Regierung, die Weißen gegen die Schwarzen aufzuhetzen, haben wir keine Wahl. Es könnte notwendig werden, daß Rasse gegen Rasse kämpft — weil die objektive Situation es erfordert.

SPIEGEL: Das hieße Rassenkampf vor Klassenkampf? Den weißen Rassismus mit schwarzem Rassismus bekämpfen?

CLEAVER: Nein, das sage ich nicht. Wir wissen aus Erfahrung, daß dies eine ungeeignete Methode wäre, daß sie nicht weiterhelfen würde. Unsere Partei hat daher im Kampf gegen den Rassismus die Führung innerhalb der amerikanischen Revolutionäre übernommen.

SPIEGEL: Nach der marxistischen Lehre wird die Revolution nicht von unterdrückten Minderheiten gemacht, sondern von der Masse der Arbeiterklasse. In den USA jedoch ist die Mehrheit der weißen Arbeiterschaft eine der reaktionärsten Gruppen in der Gesellschaft.

CLEAVER: Die Schwierigkeit beginnt in der Tat, wenn wir über die Arbeiterklasse und das Proletariat reden. Die schwarzen Amerikaner sind Mitglieder der Arbeiterklasse. Die Black Panthers sind Mitglieder des Proletariats.

SPIEGEL: Zumeist sind sie Mitglieder des "Lumpenproletariats". Aber nach Marx kann dieses niemals die revolutionäre Avantgarde werden.

CLEAVER: Marx war in seinem Urteil über das Lumpenproletariat eben ein bißchen snobistisch. Das Proletariat ist definiert als die Klasse, die keine Produktionsmittel besitzt. Und das trifft auf uns zu.

SPIEGEL: Wie wollen Sie denn die Weißen organisieren, die keine Produktionsmittel besitzen?

CLEAVER: Die weißen Arbeiter zu organisieren, ist vor allem die Aufgabe der weißen Revolutionäre. Mit ihnen wollen wir Bündnisse schließen.

SPIEGEL: Es gibt da eine überraschende Erklärung von Eldridge Cleaver: daß nämlich die weiße Mittelklasse eine der revolutionärsten Gruppen in der US-Gesellschaft wird.

CLEAVER: Ich glaube nicht, daß ich das zurücknehmen muß. Viele Leute, die nicht aus der Arbeiterklasse stammen, haben sich der Revolution angeschlossen. Sie erhielten eine bessere Erziehung und sind empfindlich für die Nuancen der Unterdrückung in den Vereinigten Staaten. Wenn sie erst einmal die Linie überschritten haben und Revolutionäre werden, dann sind sie extrem revolutionär.

SPIEGEL: Bis jetzt hatten Sie wesentlich mehr Erfolg darin, Unterstützung von der schwarzen Gemeinschaft als von der weißen zu erhalten. Nach einer Umfrage des Harris-Instituts ist die große Mehrheit der Weißen den Panthern gegenüber feindlich eingestellt. Jeder vierte schwarze Amerikaner betont jedoch: "Die Philosophie der Panther ist auch die meine."

Tom in unserer heutigen Zoit geworden ist.

SPIEGEL: Ein schwarzes "Schwein"?

CLEAVER: Ich würde sagen, Abernathy ist ein Onkel Tom, aber kein "Schwein".

SPIEGEL: Gibt es schwarze "Schweine"?

CLEAVER: Ja — unter den Führern der gemäßigten Schwarzen. Es gibt sogar "Schweine", die die schwarzen Revolutionsparteien unterwandern.

SPIEGEL: In dem Prozeß, der zur Zeit in New Haven gegen Ihren Parteivorsitzenden Bobby Seale geführt wird, kommt eben diese Infiltration zur Sprache. Seale ist angeklagt, den Mord eines angeblichen Polizeispitzels befohlen zu haben, der sich in die Panther Party eingeschlichen hatte.

CLEAVER: Dieser Prozeß ist doch ein abgekartetes Spiel.

CLEAVER: Wir wußten schon immer, daß die schwarze Bevölkerung uns und das, was wir tun, schätzt — auch wenn sie Angst hatte, es selbst zu tun

SPIEGEL: Gleichwohl haben sich verschiedene prominente schwarze Führer gegen die Panther ausgesprochen. Pastor Ralph Abernathy zum Beispiel, der Nachfolger Martin Luther Kings, hat gesagt: Die Black Panthers "reden zwar viel, aber sie haben kein Programm, und sie führen niemanden".

CLEAVER: Ja, das sagte er nicht in den USA, sondern in Schweden. Vielleicht hat er dort wegen eines Nobelpreises antichambriert, wie ihn sein Vorgänger Martin Luther King erhielt. Wir sehen in Abernathys Erklärung den typischen Opportunismus gewisser schwarzer Führer der Mittelklasse, die sich bei den Herrschenden beliebt machen wollen.

SPIEGEL: Halten Sie Abernathy für einen Onkel Tom?

CLEAVER: Ich habe Bruder Abernathy immer für ein leuchtendes Beispiel dessen gehalten, was aus Onkel

SPIEGEL: Zwei frühere Panther-Mitglieder sagten immerhin aus, die Parteiführung — also wohl Bobby Seale — habe ihnen befohlen, den Verräter zu liquidieren.

CLEAVER: Der amerikanischen Regierung ist es stets leicht gefallen, gekaufte Denunzianten für den Zeugenstand zu gewinnen. Sie hat immer wieder Lügner als Zeugen gegen unsere Parteimitglieder vorgeladen, um diese Prozesse zu manipulieren. Auch das Verfahren gegen Bobby Seale wurde inszeniert, um die Pantner-Partei zu liquidieren.

SPIEGEL: Das Verfahren hat zur Solidarisierung vieler weißer Radikaler mit den Panthern beigetragen. Schließt Ihr Bündnis mit den von der Gesellschaft entfremdeten Weißen auch Leute wie den "LSD-Propheten" Timothy Leary ein? Seit kurzem lebt auch er in Algier.

CLEAVER: Wir gehen keine Bündnisse mit Einzelpersonen ein. Wir anerkennen allerdings die progressive

Rolle, die Leary in der Vergangenheit gespielt hat.

SPIEGEL: Rauschgift als Mittel, um politisches Bewußtsein zu erlangen?

CLEAVER: Wir anerkennen die Bedeutung derer, die mit der amerikanischen Gesellschaft unzufrieden waren und aus der Wirklichkeit flohen. Sie nahmen Drogen — gemäß dem Slogan: "Turn on, tune in, drop out." Für viele war das ein endgültiger Schritt, sich vom Status quo zu lösen.

SPIEGEL: Ist es auch ein Schritt zur revolutionären Bewußtwerdung?

CLEAVER: Viele, die mit der Leary-Methode begannen, sind wirkliche Revolutionäre geworden. Dr. Leary selbst ist aus dem Gefängnis geflohen, hat mit dem amerikanischen Establishment gebrochen und tritt heute für eine gewaltsame Revolution ein.

CLEAVER: Es gibt 50 000 schwarze GIs in Ihrem Land. Da kann unsere Partei rekrutieren. Viele schwarze Soldaten arbeiten schon jetzt mit uns zusammen. Im übrigen würde ich gern mit den anti-imperialistischen Studenten über unseren gemeinsamen Kampf diskutieren.

SPIEGEL: In den USA liegen die Probleme aber doch ganz anders als in der Bundesrepublik. Wir haben keine Gettos...

CLEAVER: Gewiß, damit hat Hitler aufgeräumt! Aber Unterdrückung und Imperialismus haben keine nationalers Grenzen. Darum verbünden wir uns mit den revolutionären Kräften in Deutschland ebenso wie mit den Befreiungsbewegungen anderer Länder.

SPIEGEL: Das Black Panther Solidaritätskomitee in Frankfurt forderte

SPIEGEL: Aber in den USA bekämpft Ihre Partei den Rauschgiftkonsum doch.

CLEAVER: Daraus machen wir auch kein Hehl. Für unseren Kampf brauchen wir nüchterne Leute mit klarem Verstand, keine Leute, die aus der Wirklichkeit fliehen, indem sie auf Rauschgift-Trips gehen.

SPIEGEL: Sie selbst mußten 1968 aus der amerikanischen Wirklichkeit fliehen. Sie lebten dann über ein halbes Jahr im Kuba Fidel Castros. Dort konnten Sie politisch kaum arbeiten—sind Sie von Kuba enttäuscht?

CLEAVER: Ich war sehr unzufrie-

SPIEGEL: Warum gingen Sie nach Algier?

CLEAVER: Die algerische Regierung hat uns großzügige Gastfreundschaft gewährt; sie zeigt sich solidarisch mit uns.

SPIEGEL: Sie möchten nun die Bundesrepublik besuchen. Haben Sie konkrete Ziele für die Arbeit der Panther in Westdeutschland?

Innenminister Genscher vergebens auß, Ihnen freie Einreise zu gewähren. Unlängst hat Bonn sogar Ihrer Frau Kathleen die Einreise verweigert.

CLEAVER: Kathleen sollte an einer Solidaritätskonferenz für Bobby Seale und an der Frankfurter Demonstration am 28. November teilnehmen. Sie wird im Gegensatz zu mir von den "Schweinen" in Washington, die den Bonnern die Order für den Umgang mit uns geben, nicht gesucht ...

SPIEGEL: ... und deshalb glaubten Sie, man würde Ihre Frau hereinlassen?

CLEAVER: Ja. "Schwein" Genscher hat gar kein Recht, Kathleen daran zu hindern, seinen neonazistischen Staat zu betreten. Aber er und die Bonner Hampelmänner haben sich eben dem Druck aus Washington gebeugt. Sie sind Lakaien der amerikanischen Imperialisten.

SPIEGEL: Mr. Cleaver, wir danken Ihnen für dieses Gespräch.

The release of Huey Newton, prisoner No. B17121 of the St. Luis
Obispo Prison, one of the founders and leaders of the Black Panthers,
revived the interest of the press in this most radical black party.
The Black Panthers, who lost during the last 3 years thirty of their
leaders in street gun battles with the police, and had three hundred
members arrested, emerged as a main political group of black America.
The Chief of the FBI, Hoover, calls them the "most dangerous organization
of the U.S. new left."

Below we are giving two interviews held with pegro leaders living outside the U.S. The interviews were taped.

Hakim Janial, member of several black organizations, one of the leaders of the Black Panthers who presently lives in London and is writing a book on Malcolm X.

- Q. Why did you leave the Black Muslims?
- A. The Black Muslims attract Black Americans because they have rejected the "white master's" religion -- Christianity. Of course, the practive of Islam in the U.S. is very different from the orthodox Eastern Teligion and the Eastern cleaders do not preach to us poor negroes. When they come to the States, they go to Florida and Hollywood and we are not there.

instance, they can not marry a person of a different race. They are not allowed to even meet people of other races. Due to this, the Black Muslims are losing many of their followers. They also insist that they will not fight unless attacked. But, a month ago a group of Black Muslims moved from New Oakland to Georgia and bought a farm where they planned to raise cattle. A few days later a group of KKK men came from Alabama and set the farm on fire. And, what did the Black Muslim leader do? Did he fight? No. He just gave up the farm and everybody went back to live in cities. This kind of attitude is to us not acceptable anymore.

And the Black Nationalists? They preach that each nation should have its own country. The Chinese have China, the French, France, the Jews, Israel and the Black American, therefore, should have their own country. But where? In the Southern part of the U.S. But, this is unobtainable vicus and besides, the political ideas of the Black Nationalists are foggy and country changeable.

- Q. Many people consider Martin Luther King the greatest leader Black America had. What do you feel about this?
- A. King ended in a very sad way. He was naive and thought that he could obtain in the U.S. what Gandhi succeeded in India. But, he forgot that he did not have the large following (army) that Gandhi had at his disposal. Five million Endians were ready to fight the one hundred thousand British soldiers who opposed them. Gandhi was a peaceful elephant sitting

on a belligerent mouse. King did not realize that he instead was a very belligerent mouse sitting on an elephant.

- Nover it class,
 Q. And, therefore, you consider Malcolm X to be the most prominent leader?
- Yes. Even I personally owe him a great deal. I met him in Boston when I was 14 years old and already a heroin addict. At this age many black boys are alcholics. I was also one. I met Malcolm while I was getting heroin; at the time he was also a heroin addict. We spent that night talking which is customary for drug addicts. Our roads parted soon after. Malcolm went to prison and I was drafted. But, being an addict, I was released soon after. A few years later I met Malcolm again in California. He was already a Muslim leader and several times I listened to his sermons. You won't believe me, but a month later I was off the drugs with no medical help whatsoever. Malcolm had such a strong influence on his followers that the Health Department in New York was sending him addicts to be cured. People had great faith in him and they were ready to follow him blindly. He felt that education had a great importance and he must have been the first black man who spent all his free time reading. He told us about the books we should read and many of us followed his advice. I was one of them. He also taught us to be proud of our race and he spoke about the old African culture, about Egypt, Mali and Ghana. Also about civilizations which were at their peak while the Europeans were still living in trees. Malcolm was the first one to tell us "you're somebody, and if you want to become somebody you have to know about your own values. If you continue thinking that you aren't worth anything, you won't be worth anything.

Remember not to forget about the achievements of our ancestors." Nobody before him spoke that way to Black Americans.

I remember very well the day Malcolm was killed. It was the 22nd of February, 1964, and he was at the time 39 years old. Fourteen bullets hit him in the face. He was killed by fanatic Black Muslims, followers of Elijah Muhammad. But, I'm sure that it was a conspiracy organized by the CIA and the U.S. Government. They convinced Muhammad that Malcolm is trying to take over the leadership of the Black Muslims. Muhammad was already very jealous of Malcolm, especially after his triumphant trip to Mecca, Middle East Countries and Africa.

The day Malcolm was killed he was speaking to about 500 Black Muslims and while doing so was approached by four men who shot him fourteen times without outside interference. Where were the police? Where were the plain-clothesmen who always shadowed Malcolm looking for a pretext to arrest him? The police did not find the killers! They were found by Malcolm's friends.

America is a country of murderers. America loves to kill. She kills her own negroes and kills Vietnamese in Viet Nam. Do you know that the negroes are 11% of the population, but the U.S. Army in Viet Nam consists of 16% negro and that 20% of the American soldiers killed are negro?

America sends black men to Viet Nam so that people of that area start hating them. America tells the black man to fight and he does. Orders him to die and he does. I'm sure that at the end the Vietnamese people will win this war. They will because they are right. They have not invited Americans to their country. America would like the whole world to love her and she is puzzled why nobody does. It is because she perpetrates rape on other countries. She digs out gold from the soil leaving behind empty holes. She poisons the air, water and atmosphere. She would like to

have slaves, not only in her own country, but all over the world. America is perverted. It's a cancer on the world's body. The only solution is a bomb that would wipe her off our globe. Allow did the Black Panther Party start? / The complete name is Black Panther Party for Self Defense. The Black Panther symbol was first used in local elections in Mississippi in 1964. The party was founded by Huey Newton who having studied American law was able to prove that the Constitution gives every citizen the right to bear arms in his self defense. The first members of the Black Panther party were: Huey Newton, Bobby Seale, Bobby Hutton and David Hilliard. They were patrolling the black ghetto streets with their pistols at their side. As soon as a policeman would stop a black man, they would stand by If a policeman would draw his gun, they would do the same. And so, the police found out that they wouldn't be free to kill black people. There are many examples of policy brutality that I could give you. One of the most well known was the case of a 35 year old black deaf man. He left one morning with his dog for a walk and was stopped by a policeman. He tried to reach into his pocket for a sign stating "I am deaf," but the policeman shot him on sight and explained later that he thought the man was reaching for his But / no gun was found on him. Do you think that anything happened to the policeman? Of course not! And another example: a California negro by the name of Leonard Deadwyler was bringing his wife to a hospital with labor pains. He attached to his car antennae a white scarf which means emergency in America. He was driving fast with his lights on and blowing his horn. After a few minutes he noticed a few police cars following him. He thought they were escorting him to the hospital. But, at an intersection

one of the police cars blocked him and the policeman, John Mova, approached Positive or's car and killed him in front of his wife. I could give you many more examples of this kind. America is a country where murder is committed every few minutes and it is legalized by law.

The first confrontation of Black Panthers with the police took place in San Francisco in front of the editorial building of the magazine, A meeting of several black organizations was, held in the The police surrounded it because they knew we were armed. Huey Newton came out of the building and confronted a police officer in the middle of the street. The police officer was standing with Huey who had his gun at his side and they were talking in front of the other policemen. For us it was a great moment when we realized our fight had a purpose. Now we understand why Huey Newton is in prison (the interview was held before Newton's release). He had to end up there sooner or later. This episode changed the feeling of the black masses. We started to crawl from out of our holes into the daylight. We understood that the period of lawlessness had begun. In time the Black Panther Party became a clearly defined political organization, highly disciplined and well organized. The Black Panther Party is the party of the lowest and poorest black population and, therefore, its ideology is based on Marxism. The American ruling class, and especially the police, are doing their utmost to liquidate the organization. The police have a free hand in killing Black Panthers. You must have heard about the Chicago murder when Fred Hampton was killed by the police while asleep. Those are facts. The hunting season on the Panthers is still on and you have to realize that one recognizes a Black Panther by the color of

and not his uniform and, therefore, any black man is killed in America and labeled a Black Panther member.

self defense. We are living in a country where in order to survive one has to be ready to shoot at all times in self defense. Who shoots first wins. This is America, brother. But Black Panthers have also other aims. Recently they started in the black ghettos free distribution of milk. The members of the Black Panthers are collecting money and buying milk for the hungry black children. We have also a free clinic. Anyone who needs help is accepted to it, white or black. Of course, only the very poor and the very needy including addicts and alcholics are accepted. The clinic is manned by volunteer doctors. The Black Panther party is also publishing its own magazine. Yes, self defense is our main purpose, but it certainly is not the only one.

- Q. Could you tell me something about your experiences while you were as a an active member of the Black Panthers?
- A. I worked in the Editorial Department of the Los Angeles Sentinely black which
 This publication has a large circulation. My job was to inform the readers about the activities of the Black Panthers because not many black people knew about us. I was also in charge of getting in contact with people who were financing our organization. Among those I was in contact with was Marlo Brando who was helping us a great deal. As I have mentioned before, at this point the Panthers were mainly engaged in acts of self-defense and several times I was battling the police myself. For the first time ever I was shot at in Los Angeles. This was a few years ago during a meeting at which James Baldwin, a writer, and myself were addressing.

The police penetrated the building and I was wounded. At the same time a young woman was also hit. The most dramatic experience I had was last year in Detroit. I was addressing a meeting of the para-military organization called the Republic of New Africa. At the end of the meeting which was held in the negro church, a shot was fired. It was a signal for the waiting police nearby to attack. The shot must have been triggered off by an undercover policeman. Immediately about fifty policemen rushed in and started shooting at random. At this point (in the church there were only women and children because the men managed to escape. There were about one hundred people left. The police threw tear gas and continued to shoot. Luckily the church had heavy wooden pews and everybody lay on the floor and escaped injury. I was still standing on the podium and, therefore, I could observe the whole scene very well. Next to me was one of the leaders of the Republic of New Africa. We noticed some policemen running in our direction. I had just enough time to hide under the altar where I was covered by a large cloth. But my friend was hit in the thigh. The policeman ran to him and started tearing his uniform of the Republic of New Africa which he was wearing. This was when they noticed me under the altar and one of them shot at me with his machine gun. shots missed my head by a few inches. We were all taken by force and lined up next to the wall. We were forced to disrobe almost completely and we had to take off our shoes. We were searched and arrested. After this was all over we found out that only one person on our side was wounded while two policemen were killed and a few wounded. You see this is what I mean by

intelligent self-defence. The police held us all through the night in a garage because they were lacking space in the police station. We were all given paraffin tests. Such a test is made on the index finger and or not it shows whether the finger has been used or not to trigger a gun. (A mark from the trigger would be seen) One hundred and twenty-two of us were tested and some and I among them showed a positive result. Therefore, we were brought to court for trial but the negro judge, Judge Crocker, freed us after ruling that the tests were not admissible because they were taken too late and so we were freed. From then on Crocker has to watchout for himself and be guarded closely because he has received many to the court of the court from white extremists.

America is a police state and the police can do whatever they please. Have you heard about the arrest of Eldridge Cleaver? Since α

headquarters. The police used all its means including tear gas and dynamite. When the building was filled with gas, Eldridge Cleaver decided to surrender. He wanted everybody to undress and step outside. This way the police could see that they did not carry guns with them. The first one to run out was Bobby Hutton, the seventeen-year old treasurer of the Black Power party. As soon as he ran out of the gate he fell to the ground. The policeman ordered through a megaphone for him to get up and to run toward the police car. As soon as he arose seven bullets hit him in the chest. Eldridge was arrested and later had to leave the United States.

Can you blame us for not using Martin Luther King's methods? We will take revenge for the injustices, old and new. If anybody is trying to shoot me I have to kill him first in order not to be killed myself.

There are twenty million black Americans no one is defending and therefore we have to defend ourselves. America is a mentally deranged country. No arguments of logic would convince her. She has to be spoken to in her own language and that language is bombs and guns. She is now scared after the scrice of the bombings in her cities. There is no other solution for America than the huge bomb which would destroy her completely. America knows well the language of the bombs and it is using them freely. She invented the saturation bombings of civilian cities. She invented the napalm bomb as well as the atomic hydrogen bombs. America loves bombs because no one has as yet answered her in her own language.

Eldridge Cleaver, one of the main leaders of the Black Fewer and author of the well-known and regarded book, "Soul On Ice", The book tells about his experiences in prison.

- Q. Eldridge, you have left the U.S.A. a few years ago. Was that a deposition?
- A. Yes, the 6th of April, 1968 I took part in a fight with the police.

 Panthers

 at the time the treasurer of the Black Power, Bobby Hutton, was called and

 the rest of us were arrested. I was released though because the police

 could not prove that I was guilty of any crime. My case was then transferred to another court. In the meantime the court's attitude towards

 the Black Power had changed radically and, therefore, I decided not to

 wait for the beginning of the trial...
 - Q. How did you become involved with the Black Power?
- A. My youth was no different from any other teenager of a black ghetto: Narcotics, confrontation with the law and sentences. The conditions in prisons ere bad and I was considered a potential revolutionist

and, therefore, I was sent from one prison to another. This was meant to keep me from influencing other prisoners. I heard that there are acres prisons in the States where a prisoner is allowed to play golf, use swimming pools and work in gardens, but I was not in any of those. prison I remember is the California Men's Colony in which Huey Newton is being held now. TV cameras are following you every step, strong lights ere beaming from the ceilings and in every corner photo cells are activating mechanical gates, etc. I was using none I had to indoctrinate my follow, prisoners and, therefore, the so-called special privilege ID card was taken away from me. Without this card I did not have access to the library, I could not have a TV and I was not able to leave the block. I was left with only my regular ID card which I needed in order to leave my cell. My stay in prison left a permanent mark on me. A man can be let out of prison but it will always remain in him... I was freed a month after the Black Power party was founded and in January, 1965 I became a to this day member and I remained a member/ I remember that day very vividly. It was in San Francisco and the Black Power-Party was making preparations to commemorate the anniversary of Malcolm X's death which is on the 22nd They were to be the armini guards of February. Armed guards were to be present at the ceremonies. never seen anything like it before. The Black Power members came to the meeting in uniforms and bearing arms. This impressed me tremendously. was also my first contact the I finally met directly with teachings of Malcolm X. In the prisons I heard a great deal about them but only Seale and Newton were able to convert his words into deeds.

Q. You were a member of the Black Muslims. Why did you break up with them?

A. The Black Muslims is a very unimportant movement and mixes

a mixture of views

religious and political ideals together. Their leader Elijah Muhammed,

preaches that 6,300 years ago all people were primitive blacks but on the island ratmos away from the continents lived a deranged scientist called and ratmos away from the continents lived a deranged scientist called and ratmos who decided to create the white race by permitting marriages only between partners of slightly whiter skin. In this way after one hundred years the blue-eyed white race came about.

Malcolm X worked for closer ties to the religion of the followers of Islam. After Malcolm X was killed I left the party.

- Q. Are you remaining in elese contact with Stokley Carmichael?
- A. No. In my opinion Stokley became apolitical. I do not believe where in his foggy pan-African ideals nor do I think that any body else does.

 I tried once to mend our differences but he said: "You are now on top.

 I will wait on the side and see how well you can do in your America."

 After I heard this I lost interest in further discussion. Stokely insists that for our fight in the States we need a strong African base and he would like to move many black Americans to Africa. We do not believe in such a theory. Our people are in America and I do not think it is a good idea to leave them to their own destiny and go somewhere else and participate in a revolution of a continent whose history one doesn't understand well. I do not think that Stokely will ever achieve the goals he is talking so much about.
- Q. You have often spoken about the Marxist influence on the Black Cantices.

 Power Party Do you consider yourself a Marxist?
- A. Almost-certainly. Our party is a political party and Marxism is the most appealing social theory we have found. We do not agree though with those who would like to implement the kind of socialism that is to

be found in other socialist countries. We read books published in the U.S.S.R., in Cuba and in China. We do not see how the methods used in those countries could be instilled in America. We agree with the general premises but we have to use our own methods to make them work.

Am I a true Marxist? To a certain degree yes because I believe it to be true that the war between classes will change capitalism into socialthen ism and as a final result a classless society will emerge. But our party cannot be called strictly a Marxist party. You must understand that at the moment the class structure of America is just as important to us as divising its racial structure. We have our own black bourgeoisie which is working hand in Jhand with the white Government classes. But we need it now because they finance us. At the moment we are telling them: "Now your law to give your money and about the rest we will talk later." We cannot dismiss the black capitalism without which our revolution would not make sense.

Q. The Black Panthers have been accused often of abuses and the use of force. Is that true?

Our only means at the present are guns. You are asking if we use force and terror. Yes, we do but it is force and terror directed at a tyrant and oppressor of our revolution.

Q. Have you talked-about other means to reach your goals?

- A. You know what? Imagine yourself standing in the middle of San Francisco eye to eye with a policeman who is aiming a gun at you. Now tell me, what method would you use to take his gun away from him so he could not kill you? When I spoke of injustices perpetrated against us I not only spoke of the few dozen of the Black Panthers shot by the police, I spoke of black ghettos where rats are crawling over children's beds, where the plaster peels from the walls. I spoke of the lack of schools, jobs, and food as well as of prices which exceed five times the value of articles for sale.
 - Q. But the Black Panthers also have other aims don't-they?
- A. Oh, of course. Like for instance our free breakfasts for hungry before use half-measures. children. You see until our revolution wins, we have to pay for methods. We have to fight with the inheritance of a four hundred year period of slavery; we have to fight against the exploitation of women and to give them equal rights.

Another problem is the narcotics which are so widely used by the inhabitants of black ghettos. They are used because they let us forget the miseries of our every day existance but you can not allow them to reduce the effectiveness of Narcotics soften our minds and they influence our actions. destroy us. trumb card arrest us They also give another arm to the police. The black population of Atlanta reaches 36%, 27% in Chicago, 39% in Detroit, 40% in Newark and 63% in Washington, D.C. While the percentage of black policemen in the same cities is 10%, 17%, 5%, 10%, and 21% respectively.

Black people are 11% of the population of the United States, while the number of addicts among white and black is almost identical (31, 34 and 32,624). Among white women with illegitimate children the percentage is 4.9%, While among black women it is 9.29%. 4% of white families do not have a head of the household while among the black families the percentage is 29%. The percentage of black people in mental institutions is twice as high as white people. Among black men living in ghettos in the age range of 30 to 40, the suicide rate is twice as high among men in the age bracket of 30 to 40 than white men living in similar conditions.

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
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

LEROY ELDRIDGE CLEAVER

The December 14, 1970, issue of the news magazine ("Der Spiegel," published in Hamburg, Federal Republic of Germany, contained a report of an interview with Leroy Eldridge Cleaver which had been conducted in Algiers by two reporters from "Der Spiegel." A translation of that article follows:

W'KILL NIXON? - WITH PLEASURE'

("Spiegel" interview of Black Panther Leader Eldridge Cleaver)

Arhele Jublin- in

Spiegel: Mr. Cleaver, you are the "Information Minister" of the militant American Black Panther Party. In Algerian exile, on the run from the FBI, you have now established an international section of the Panther Party; in your words, a competitor of the State Department in Washington. Do you want to set up a "countergovernment" to the administration in the U.S.A.?

Cleaver: Revolutionary liberation movements always carry a seed of future governments in them. When your struggle ends in victory, it is quite natural that you take over the authority. However, as far as we, the Panther Party, are concerned, the main question is to fight the U.S. government whenever this is possible.

Spiegel: By what methods?

Cleaver: By all the methods that are effective.

Spiegel: And you believe that violence is effective?

Cleaver: Yes. We want to unite with other progressive forces within and outside the U.S.A. We must put on the greatest possible pressure and gain/power which is necessary to destroy the government machinery.

100-447251-933 ENCLOSURE Spiegel: A civil rights commission established as far back as 1968 that "two societies," black and white, are developing in America. Will they fight against each other to the death?

Cleaver: The number of blacks murdered by the underlings of the repressive government keeps rising. Blacks have as before high unemployment; they don't get reasonable housing, adequate clothing -- not even enough to eat...

Spiegel: Nevertheless, there is social progress, for blacks as well. For example, their family income has risen 50 per per cent since 1960.

Cleaver: I'm not interested in piecemeal changes. We cannot be satisfied as long as we don't have what we are entitled to.

Spiegel: Your party had to take some setbacks in this uncompromising fight. The police have taken the offensive.

Cleaver: The killing of Comrade Hampton in Houston raised the number of murdered party members to 31. The Washington government and the FBI are engaged in a deliberate effort to exterminate us.

Spiegel: At any rate, most of the Panther leaders now are on trial, in jail, living, as you, in exile here in Algeria, or have been killed. It proves that your party is weak.

Cleaver: It isn't true. Only a few members of our leadership are known at all to the public. The Panther Party has grown of late.

Spiegel: You complain about the violence used by the police against the Panthers. At the same time you yourself preach the use of force to overthrow the allegedly fascist U.S. government. Isn't this a contradiction?

Cleaver: Not at all. White racists in the United States don't have any right to deprive us of our human rights. We fight to get back what belongs to us. This doesn't need any justification.

Spiegel: You have said that you would like to teach people how to kill the enemy. You spoke of the "great educational value" of killing.

Cleaver: Objectively it may be regrettable that we need weapons to attain our ends. But at stake is our liberation, our freedom. And here is the indispensable educational method to teach men to hate their enemy, to hate what oppresses and destroys them.

Spiegel: And the call for political murder is one of them?

Cleaver: Well, let's take President Nixon, for example. He has intensified the oppression of blacks and other progressive forces. He is responsible for the fact that many years of work on the part of civil rights activists has been destroyed. He is hated by many. And we believe it would be of an educational value, it would be inspiring if he were done away with by force...

Spiegel: And then?

Cleaver: Then, people would realize that it is not only desirable but also possible to eliminate such individuals as Nixon. He stands in the way of our freedom. Therefore he should be brutally done away with.

Spiegel: He would be replaced by Spiro Agnew.

Cleaver: We have actually experienced how the succeeding Presidents continue to oppress the blacks. We haven't yet had the pleasure and honor of getting rid of one of them ourselves.

Spiegel: At any rate this kind of violence can only constitute the first step toward an armed revolution.

Cleaver: I'm not sure here. In a revolutionary process there may be violence from beginning to end, or maybe only sporadically. It is the function of an act of violence to cross the limits set by the oppressors. When a man rises up in arms against his oppressor, he takes his destiny in his own hands.

Spiegel: You have done it yourself.

Cleaver: I know from my own experience and from experiences of others: one gets a very good feeling from squeezing the trigger of a rifle aimed at the tormentor.

Spiegel: And this has great educational value?

Cleaver: Yes. When people see that somebody else is doing it, they begin to identify themselves with it especially when they share the same hatred of tyrants. Then, they fall into wishful thinking, they can do a little daydreaming...and maybe picture their own act of heroism.

Spiegel: Do you really believe that individual terror by a small minority can shake the power structure of the U.S.A.?

Cleaver: It is not a question of whether we can defeat the government with our numbers; it is a question of creating a situation where other people will be forced to think about it and do something about finding a solution.

Spiegel: Even if the methods used by you in this strategy are suicidal?

Cleaver: If we were to remain silent and take the fascistization of the U.S. society lying down, it would be suicide. We prefer to commit a revolutionary suicide—to use the word of our Defense Minister Huey Newton—if we have to die. Then our death would, at least, mean something.

Spiegel: You want guerrilla warfare in the cities.

According to Fidel Castro, this is "not only

a folly but a crime."

Cleaver: That's Fidel Castro.

Spiegel: And what is Eldridge Cleaver?

Cleaver: It goes without saying--I don't share this

view. Castro's statement does not apply to our situation. Blacks are penned up in the ghettos of American cities. Fidel Castro knows nothing about it. He had to deal with

a Cuban situation. Since I myself was in

Cuba, I must say: he doesn't have the experience

to judge our situation or even dictate our

methods of fighting to us.

Spiegel: Revolutionaries of developing countries such

as Castro are not the only ones believing

that a city guerrilla is an absurdity. Likewise,

many Marxists in industrial countries say that the violence by minorities in metropolitan

areas of highly developed societies cannot be the means of a revolution and, according

to Rudi Dutschke, it would even be counterrevolutionary

Cleaver: We just can't sit on our hands! Passiveness

condemns our people to a certain suicide.

Incidentally, Castro and Dutschke are not the only ones who spoke out on this subject.

You are maybe familiar with the publications

of Comrade Carlos Marighela.

Spiegel: Marighela, leader of the Brazilian guerrillas,

was killed by the police. And the Brazilian revolutionaries are returning from the cities

to the countryside.

Cleaver: Nevertheless, one cannot claim that actions in the cities are meaningless. I can only

in the cities are meaningless. I can only repeat what Che Guevara said: "No matter where death may surprise us, it is welcome if only our battle cry strikes a receptive

ear and another hand reaches out to pick up our

weapons."

Spiegel:

You describe your revolutionary theory as Marxist-Leninist. Many professed Marxist-Leninists would not accept it. You yourself have called Marx and Lenin racists.

Cleaver:

And I have very accurate information about it. One of our comrades wrote a book on this subject. Marx's and Lenin's attitude is not surprising if we consider the time in which they lived. I believe my assumption is reasonable.

Spiegel:

Is your struggle a race struggle or a class struggle?

Cleaver:

We would prefer a class struggle. However, in view of the racist attitude on the part of white Americans and faced with the deliberate efforts by the government to incite whites against blacks, we don't have any choice. It could become necessary to have one race fight another race because the objective situation calls for it.

Spiegel:

This means race struggle before class struggle? To fight white racism with black racism?

Cleaver:

No, I don't say that. We know from experience that this is a bad method, that it will not help. Our Party has consequently taken the leadership among the American revolutionaries in the struggle against racism.

Spiegel:

According to the Marxist teaching, revolution is not made by oppressed minorities but by the masses of the working class. In the United States, however, the majority of the white workers are one of the most reactionary groups in the country.

Cleaver:

The difficulty begins in fact when we start talking about the working class and the proletariat. Black Americans are members of the working class. Black Panthers are members of the proletariat.

Spiegel:

Mostly they are members of the "Lumpenproletariat." According to Marx, however, it can never become the revolutionary vanguard.

Cleaver:

Well, Marx was a little bit snobbish in his judgment on the "Lumpenproletariat". The proletariat is defined as a class without the means of production. And this applies to us.

Spiegel:

How do you propose to organize the whites who don't have the means of production?

Cleaver:

It is the task of the white revolutionaries to organize the white workers. We want to form alliances with them.

Spiegel:

There is a surprising statement by Eldridge Cleaver; namely, that the white middle class is one of the most revolutionary groups in American society.

Cleaver:

I don't think I have to retract it. Many people who don't come from the working class have joined the revolution. They received a better education and are more sensitive to the various shades of oppression in the United States. Once they cross the line and become revolutionaries, they become extreme.

Spiegel:

Until now you have had success in getting support from the black than white community. According to the Harris Survey, a great majority of the white people is hostile to the Panthers. However, every fourth black American said: "The Panther philosophy is also my philosophy."

Cleaver:

We always knew that the Black people appreciate us and what we are doing, even when they were afraid of doing it themselves.

Spiegel:

Nevertheless, various prominent black leaders have spoken out against the Panthers. For example, Martin Luther King's successor, the Rev. Ralph Abernathy said: The Black Panthers "talk a lot but they don't have any program and they don't lead anyone."

Cleaver: Yes, he said it in Sweden but not in the U.S.A.

Maybe he was lobbying there for a Nobel
Prize which his successor, Martin Luther King,
had received. We see in Abernathy's statement
a typical opportunism by certain black leaders
of the middle class who want to ingratiate
themselves with the ruling class.

Spiegel: Do you consider Abernathy to be an Uncle Tom?

Cleaver: I have always regarded Brother Abernathy as a shining example of what becomes of an Uncle Tomin our age.

Spiegel: A black "pig"?

Cleaver: I would say, Abernathy is an Uncle Tom but not a "pig".

Spiegel: Are there black "pigs"?

Cleaver: Yes -- among the leaders of the moderate blacks.

There are "pigs" who infiltrate the black
revolutionary parties.

Spiegel: This infiltration is coming up for discussion at the trial of your Party Chairman Bobby Seale in New Haven. Seale is accused of having ordered the killing of an alleged police informer who had infiltrated the Panther Party.

Cleaver: This trial is a frame-up.

Spiegel: Two former Panther members testified that the party leadership, none else than Bobby Seale, had ordered them to liquidate the traitor.

Cleaver: It has always been easy for the U.S. Government to get paid informers on the witness stand. It has repeatedly used liars as witnesses against our party members in order to manipulate these trials. The trial of Bobby Seale has also been staged to liquidate the Panther Party.

Spiegel: Mr. Cleaver, thank you for this interview.

Along with the above interview 'Der Spiegel' printed an article dealing with the meeting of CLEAVER. A translation of that article follows:

ATO HATE IS TO LOVE YOURSELF A LITTLE LESS"

("Spiegel" reporter KAI HERMANN'S visit with ELDRIDGE CLEAVER in Algeria.)

Eldridge Cleaver keeps one waiting but not so long that one has to take it as a provoking lack of courtesy. He welcomes one with a kind of "hallo" that creates an atmosphere of aloofness even before the talk starts. An interview with a white representative of the capitalist press is a transaction in reciprocity to him.

Cleaver does not do his partner the favor of becoming emotional. He knows what he wants to tell the liberal and "half-left" public. He doesn't permit solidarity to come up; he lets you feel some of his contempt. After an overcool scene he leaves without a farewell flourish.

Eldridge Cleaver, the Information Minister of the Black Panther Party in Algerian exile and the Ambassador of revolutionary America appointed by his political friends, pays back in small coin for what he owes the whites and their system.

He was born near Little Rock, the symbol of hatred, and learned to shine shoes in Goldwater's State of Arizona. He was a part of the American legend of the poor, little shoeshine boys who become great men, and turned it upside-down.

He left the South with his parents for California and did what a young Negro man could do to get out of the slums. He played football to become a star; he stole and he sold drugs to have some money.

At 18 he landed in jail. There a prison guard ripped off a picture of a white pin-up girl from the wall in his cell and let him replace it with that of a black girl.

Cleaver learned something. When he was released, he began to rape white women. It gave him satisfaction to "trample upon the white man's laws, upon his system of values, to degrade his women."

For the first time in his life he had luck when he was given 15 years in prison instead of landing in an electric chair for rape and attempted murder.

The stations of his education were San Quentin, Folsom and Soledad state penitentiaries. First he read, then he began to write to "save myself." By writing he fought with his desperation and his hatred.

Eldridge Cleaver in Algerian exile is not the subtle essayist who won literary world acclaim with his book "Soul on Ice" written in prison. His life, his experiences with the U.S. society have coagulated into a political theory, into a "Marxism-Leninism" made in U.S.A.

A Marxist gets quite touchy when he is suspected of being a racist. He does not want a race war; and yet he thinks it is unavoidable.

He has green eyes and light brown skin, "the mark of (white) beasts," as one of his fellow prisoners believed to have discovered on him.

Already in prison, he parted company with the radical Black Muslim racists. Today he is also looking all over the world for white allies whom he cannot quite bring himself to trust. He made an ally of LSD prophet Timothy Leary who escaped from an American prison to join him in Algeria. He brought him the theory of the revolutionary effect of drugs on whites.

He remained the same Cleaver who doesn't hate whites, in his essays, but merely suffers because of them. His calls for hatred must be viewed in the realization that "the price of hating other people is to love yourself a little less."

Eldridge Cleaver in Algeria wears neither the Afrolook nor the black Panther uniform. He wears corduroy pants and stylish boots. Neither could one suspect in him the Bohemian who was enjoying freedom for a few weeks after his release from prison.

However, even then, back in 1966, he resisted the temptation to let himself be integrated into the American society as a celebrated writer of the black protest movement.

He joined the Black Panthers and finally let himself be nominated as a presidential candidate of the "Peace and Freedom Party". Thereby he voluntarily chose again an alternative which he seemed to have just escaped: prison or death.

A merciless hunt was launched for the prisoner released on bond who suddenly became a dangerous political opponent. When policemen staged a gun battle with Panthers, among whom Cleaver had found himself, they provided the authorities with a formal justification for putting the presidential candidate back behind the bars. As Cleaver and his friends claim, on this occasion, the person who was shot from behind was an 18-year-old Panther who had been taken for him. Shortly before he was to go back to prison, he disappeared.

His friend, Robert Scheer reports how much Cleaver likes "freedom and women and food and Scotch and Berkeley and Bobby Dylan." One of his former girl friends in San Francisco said "He hates and fights to be able to freely enjoy life in America some day."

The Panther headquarters in Algeria is turned, in the evening, into a Berkeley campus shack. Then Eldridge Cleaver, his wife Kathleen and his aide Larry Mack, who lost an eye in a street fight and escaped from the United States to Cuba by plane, sit on the floor listening to jazz music, cracking nuts and talking about America.

Mr. Cleaver has been an editor on the staff of "Remparts" magazine since his release from prison in 1966. He is author of the book "Soul on loe" from which he reportedly received considerable income. He is not known to have been otherwise gainfully employed.

His Social Security member is unknown. His date of birth is August 31, 1935.

It is requested that no active investigation be conducted based solely on this request.

Cleaver was paroled from prison in 1966 where he became affiliated with Nation of Islam. Since his release he has traveled the "civil rights circuit" with Stokely Carmichael, wrote for "Ramparts" magazine in San Francisco, and became Minister of Information of Black Panther Party (BPP) in 1968. He was an active, violent BPP representative involved in one shoot-out with police and fled to Cuba and Algeria when faced with arrest.

Subject resides in Algiers, Algeria, and has traveled to Red China, North Vietnam, North Korea, and Russia, representing BPP. Cleaver recently declared himself the leader of the BPP and completely repudiated BPP National Headquarters in Oakland, California, along with the current leaders.

As a Key Black Extremist (KBE), subject warrants investigation to determine his sources of income and assets. If you approve, attached memorandum should be returned to Domestic Intelligence Division so that income tax returns can be obtained and reviewed.

RECOMMENDATION:

That attached memorandum be approved requesting subject's income tax returns for period 1966 through 1969.

BLACK PANTHER PARTY PACTIONALISM

The following is a complete text of the article as it appears in the March 6, 1971 issue of the "Black Panther".

PREE KATHLARN CLEAVER

Kathleen Cleaver, the Communications Secretary of the Black Panther Party, is unable to come to the U.S. to speak on March 5th at the Oakland Auditorium in behalf of our incarcerated Chairman, Bobby Scale and in behalf of Ericka Huggins, who are on trial for their lives. Some months ago. she had agreed to return to the Empire, having been away for quite a while, to speak on that Revolutionary Intercommunal Day of Solidarity for Chairman Bobby Seale and Ericka Huggins. But we did not hear from Kathleen again. We would call and her husband, Eldridge Cleaver, would always talk for her, indicating and finally saying that she would not come to speak for the Chairman. He would tell us that he was not going to send her. Kathleen is a member of the Central Committee of the Black Panther Party, yet we were told that beyond all else her husband would not let her out of the In other words, she was "his woman" first, and if house. that conflicted with her work as a revolutionary, then his chauvinist rule would take a primary position over that. Even to the point of stopping the progress of our glorious struggle.

I was not surprised, however, for it was not so long ago that I spoke with Kathleen in person, and, began to get a complete picture of what kind of terror under which she had been living and suffering during the past two years that she has been away from the U.S.

During July and August of last year, I was in the Democratic Peoples Republic of Korea, as a member of a group which came to be known as the Anti-Imperialist Delegation. (I should point out that of the eleven delegation members Eldridge Cleaver chose, I was the only black woman.) While in the Democratic Peoples Republic of Korea (DPRK), Kathleen and I had whispered conversations regarding the dilemma in which she had found herself over these years.

In listening to it all, the main point Kathleen made was that although Eldridge Cleaver publicly stated opposition to male chauvinism, her life with him had been a testimony of the contradictory nature of this statement. What it all amounted to was that Eldridge wanted her as his woman -- wife, mother, maybe secretary -- wanted her support, but did not want her to either be another man's woman, nor a revolutionary. In these clandestine (secret) meetings,

Kathleen - most of the time literally in tears - would, in the relief of being able to finally tell it, tell me anecdotes of what he had done to keep her his virtual prisoner.

I remember one incident she described, in particular, that occurred right after she first arrived in Algiers, and had just had their first baby (Antonio Maceo). She had just gotten back from the hospital and asked where Eldridge was. (They were living in a small hotel at the time.) She found he was in another room of the hotel with another woman. She managed to get up and go downstairs to that room. After knocking on the door for a while, Eldridge answered — speaking through the closed door. He asked what she wanted. She told him she wanted him to get something for the baby. He belligerently told her to go away — which she did. Later on that day, while she was in the process of breast-feeding their newborn son, he stormed into the room and knocked her around severely for having interfered with what he had been doing.

This kind of incident became more and more common over the months that followed, causing her anxieties and fear of him to intensify to the severe degree they had reached when I finally saw Kathleen in Korea.

Their life together personified the double-standard. manifested to the highest degree: A man can run from woman to woman; but a woman must be his and his alone. Every progressive and thinking person knows the ridiculousness of this attitude. particularly in the context of the revolutionary struggle to which we are all supposed to be committed. And because of the practical example of living with the Champion of Male Chauvinism. Kathleen began to respond by more clearly understanding and speaking out on the particular issue of liberation of women as an important part of the revolutionary struggle. She wrote several articles for our Party paper. And she would give these articles to Eldridge to mail for her. When none of the articles appeared. Eldridge explained lied that the staff of the Party's paper just had not decided to print them. Later she found all of these articles in one of his desk drawers, having never been mailed.

Even when I was there, she was still soliciting him to mail her articles. He would only laugh. One evening, while I was in Korea, Kathleen sent me a rare copy of Kim Song Ae's (the wife of Kim Il Sung, the respected and beloved leader of the Korean People) book regarding the woman's struggle in

Korea. (She and I were living in separate quarters.) When I received the book; it was wrapped up. When Eldridge found Kathleen had sent such a book to me, he grabbed the book and refused to let me have it. He explained that Kathleen was going crazy and that I shouldn't let her influence me.

So we held our conversation to whispers and clandestine discussion. Kathleen explained at another time that although Eldridge said he had sent her to Korea to maintain our solidarity with the courageous Korean people and because they would take good care of her during her second pregnancy, that, in fact, Eldridge saw himself as using the Korean People to get rid of Kathleen for a while, so he could have his new "woman" without interference. This new woman, an 18-year old girl named Malika (see picture), had threatened to leave Eldridge as long as Kathleen was around. So he manipulated as many people as possible, and Kathleen stayed in Korea for several months.

When he did finally join her in Korea (during the Delegation tour), he constantly harassed her with the state-ment that the baby she was carrying was not his. In her pregnant state, and with everything else, this remark had a devastating effect. And finally, the day after Kathleen had, the baby, we (Eldridge and myself) went to the hospital to visit her. And, at that time he repeated somewhat what he had done when she had had their first baby. He slapped her there in the hospital bed, told her he was leaving her, that she was no longer his wife and that he was returning to Algiers and Malika, and leaving her in Korea indefinitely. I again watched Kathleen suffer through another torment. However, because of her devotion to the Party, she refused to make any overt attempts to leave and return to the U.S. to bring charges against him to the Party's Central Committee.

About a month after I returned to the U.S., Kathleen did finally get to Algiers. But since that time, she has not been able to make any moves. I spoke with her for the last time in October of 1970. She had called to say that she wanted to send a message about Ericka Huggins to the People for a November 3rd rally in New Haven. I asked her to try and come back for that rally, for the People would like to see her. She told me that was "easier said than done". For, she said, "that man will never let me to." That was the last time I spoke with her.

And now she is locked up there in Algiers with him. Forced to stay there and accept whatever is meted out to her, for fear of her very life. In fact, when I last saw Eldridge, he was laughing about how "we bury people here" (Algiers). He was referring to a brother he had in fact murdered in Algiers. As many beatings and as much suffering that Kathleen endured from Eldridge, she had finally been able to break away, steal away, and make contact with another man. wanted to do this all along. She had never been narrow in her approach, for just as Eldridge had had many women with whom he had relationships, she, like him, also wanted relationships with other men. This is only natural, reasonable. Only she was always blocked in this area. That is, what was all right for him was not all right for her. But she finally did manage to slip in a moment in which she too could have freedom of choice.

She began relating to a brother who had just - at that time - come to Algiers. His name was Rahim (Clinton Smith). He and a brother named Byron Booth had escaped from the California State Penitentiary at Chino. They had hijacked a plane to Cuba, where they had met Eldridge. All of them went to Algiers. And there Kathleen and Rahim met.

In an act exemplifying the true nature of a chauvirist, a combination of cowardly terror and an inferiority complex, Eldridge snatched even this from Kathleen. He killed - which act he could never seem to be able to commit against any of the People's oppressors - killed this brother, Rahim. He murdered him and buried his body right in Algiers, because Kathleen had done only once what he had made an integral part of their relationship.

Of course, the chauvinist behavior he exhibited and the resulting murder of Rahim was endorsed by the Algerian government of Houari Boumedienne, who himself being an extreme chauvinist and opportunist, gave Eldridge the plot of ground in which to bury Rahim; and Boumedienne kept it quiet for him. Yasir Arafat and Al Fatah might accept this, but we know that Dr. George Habash of the Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine would never accept this. The Democratic Peoples Republic of Korea, the Democratic Republic of Vietnam and the Republic of China would never have tolerated this kind of behavior. And the government of Albania will not tolerate this, although Eldridge Cleaver has intentions and has made plans to leave Algiers in the near future to try to establish himself there. And the Cubans did not tolerate his infantile

leftism and reactionary chauvinism, for they put him out of the country for which they had fought so hard, shortly after he arrived.

Because of what I witnessed, I am truly afraid for Kathleen Cleaver's life. Eldridge has sent out statements about his and the other two "Central Committee" members', in Algeria, decisions. But no one has heard directly from Kathleen. We know her to be imprisoned there in Algeria, held against her will. Even though, if Kathleen is allowed to speak for herself, she will probably support the ravings of her personal, mad oppressor, we know that to speak otherwise at this time would be a death warrant for her. So we will understand.

SO I WANT TO SAY TO YOU, DEAR KATHLEEN, IF YOU CAN READ THIS, PLEASE BE STRONG, FOR THE PEOPLE WILL SET YOU FREE!



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

The November 21, 1970, edition of the weekly newspaper "UNSERE ZEIT" (U Z - OUR TIME), which is the organ of the West German Communist Party, published an appeal for a "Save ANGELA DAVIS Solidarity Action." The paper said that DAVIS was being detained under "especially intolerable conditions in a New York jail and was engaged in a desperate fight against the racist justice" of California Governor REAGAN. The article continued saying that by means of trumped up and infamous charges the Federal Bureau of Investigation and California race fanatics were trying to send the active fighter for the rights of the colored people to the gas chamber. The article said that in firm solidarity with the Communist Party of the United States and in close alliance with all progressive forces in the United States, the Communist Party of Germany was appealing to the trade unionists, and social



democrats, youth and student organizations and to the works councillors and shop stewards to help through solidarity actions to prevent the plot against freedom and the life of ANGELA DAVIS and to protest against attacks on the freedom of action of the Communist Party of the United States to prevent the emergence of a new fascism in the United States. The article ended with appeals for statements and resolutions, demonstrations and other manifestations in support of DAVIS. These were supposed to be addressed to the United States Embassy in Ead Godesberg in Federal Republic of Germany, as well as to American Consulates General in the FRG.


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IV. "DER SPIEGEL" INTERVIEW WITH ELDRIDGE CLEAVER

Late in October 1970, the prominent West German news magazine "Der Spiegel" entered into negotiations with ELDRIDGE CLEAVER to arrange for an interview with CLEAVER in Algeria. negotiations were carried on through HANNES WEINRICH in Frankfurt/ Main, FRG. "Der Spiegel" originally offered CLEAVER one thousand marks (about \$300) for the interview. CLEAVER refused the offer Subsequently the figure of five and demanded ten thousand marks. thousand marks was agreed upon. The interviewer was to be KAI HERMANN and another reporter from "Der Spiegel." CLEAVER was to make arrangements with Algerian authorities for HERMANN's entry into Algeria. The interview was carried out in Algeria and appeared in the December 14, 1970, issue of "Der Spiegel", which is published in Hamburg, FRG. Shortly after the publication of the interview WEINRICH was informed that the five thousand marks payment had been made by the magazine to CLEAVER's account in a bank in Switzerland.

To recommend that the attached letter be sent to the State Department requesting it to furnish to the Algerian Government data concerning the allegation by the BPP that Eldridge Cleaver in Algiers murdered a former Panther who is a fugitive from justice. Leaver

Based on the recent split between BPP leaders Huey P. Newton in Oakland, California, and fugitive/Eldridge cleaver in Algiers, Algeria, our special coverage developed information that Cleaver in Algiers killed a former Panther named Clinton Robert Smith between February and April, 1970, because he was having an affair with Cleaver's wife Kathleen. The 3/6/71 issue of the BPP newspaper contains a lengthy article condemning Cleaver and this murder charge is publicly set forth in detail. article further accuses the Algerian Government of endorsing the murder, covering it up and providing Cleaver with the plot of ground Smith was buried in. Smith is a fugitive who escaped from a California prison in January, 1969; hijacked a plane to Cuba where he associated with Cleaver, and accompanied him to Algiers in June, 1969, as part of Cleaver's international BPP In March, 1970, Smith was expelled from the BPP by Cleaver and was last known to be in Africa during Spring, 1970,

The attached letter requests State to advise the Algerian Government of the allegation and furnish it a copy of the BPP paper which is enclosed with the letter. State is also asked to request the Algerian Government for any information regarding the fate of Smith and to determine any investigative or prosecutive action taken by the Algerian Government based on the allegation. The ultimate purpose behind this request is to officially confirm if possible the death of fugitive Smith

and, if the murder charge is true, to goad the Algerian Government into investigating it. 

I enclose an excerpt from TUPART Monthly Reports, which sets forth the basis of the argument between Eldridge Cleaver and Timothy Leary about whether to endorse or discourage drug usage.

It seems to me that most of the analysis of the spreading use of drugs fails to take cognizance of the fact that those who would destroy our society have been prime agents in the spread of the use of illegal drugs in order to make outcasts of an increasing number of people. This has been a particularly effective thrust because the recommended action turns out to be either gratifying to the senses or pleasurable in bringing on an escape from the problems of the world.

I believe those who would try to maintain an open and liveable society must help all citizens and particularly the young, to commit themselves to a system of law--not to keeping all laws as they are--but insisting that laws must be obeyed until they are changed.

I enclose a copy of a statement I made to students at Valparaiso University in which I tried to get this point across.



October period our analyses showed a decline in the amount of attention given to revolutionary tactics and actions—every sample since October 1970 has suggested the July-October period was one of re-evaluation of tactics and re-alignment of strategy. At precisely the same point in time—October 1970—the topics SOUTHEAST ASIA WAR and REVOLUTION! reversed their downward trends, the SOUTHEAST ASIA attention shooting upward in a curve all out of proportion to anything going on in the war—well

Included in even the earliest statements by the Dohrn sisters are hopes that enough disaffection can be encouraged among U.S. troops in Vietnam for them to refuse to fight to defend the Saigon government when it is attacked, but the latest versions hedge this bet by picking a time after U.S. troops are scheduled to have stopped participating in ground fighting—in order to go to the assistance of the Saigon government after that time the President would have to order the troops back into combat, at great cost in morale—and in the face of what are being planned as massive anti-war demonstrations at home—or use air power in the city of Saigon—again, in the face of massive anti-war demonstrations at home.

Further attempts to affect U.S. troop behavior in Vietnam are evidenced in Fusion and the East Village Other where appeals are made for support for New York "radio station WPAX" in its project to tape and mail to Hanoi for broadcast "daily programs to fill the gap left in the programming fed to GI's by the Armed Forces Network." Readers are asked to furnish material from their own areas

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Below the top ten, HOMOSEXUALITY and POLLU-TION/ECOLOGY showed the greatest increase in emphasis. Each climed 6 positions in the period and now stand at 18th and 15th respectively. NIXON/P EW climbed five positions and now ranks 16th. LABO1, climbed 3 to 9th. BUSINESS AND INDUSTRY climbed to 11th after falling to 12th in the previous period. CAMPUS ACTIVITIES continued to hold 14th position-it had fallen 6 in December after gaining 9 in November, PRISONS slipped 1 position to 20th. MILITARY/DRAFT fell 4 positions. RELIGION/THE OCCULT fell 9. THE COURTS dropped 10 and FEDERAL AGENCIES dropped 13. The last five topics have a tendency to fluctuate and are simply displaced when other fluctuating topics, such as DRUGS and MINORITY GROUPS command so much of the attention.

THE DRUG ISSUE

The topic DRUGS was catapulted into prominence in the current period by a public argument in Algeria between former college professor Dr. Timothy Leary and Black Panther leader Eldridge Cleaver over the appropriateness of drugs in "the revolution." Leary, with his "Turn on, tune in, drop out" slogan, has contended drugs are essential in the revolution and Cleaver stands his ground that drug usage has served its purpose in bringing large numbers of White youths into the revolutionary camp, but now must be regarded as counter-revolutionary. Not only have the underground papers given wide publication to the separate and joint statements of the two men on this matter, but they have also carried numerous articles and letters expressing the views of supporters of each side as the argument has been followed by radicals and revolutionists in the United States in the press, on radio, and finally on television.

A study of the basic positions of the two men, the comments of their separate supporters, and an examination of the treatment of drugs and drug usage by the underground press appear to us to offer a great amount of information on drug usage in the United States today and perhaps some clues as to the reason for its spread through such a large portion of the youth population. The story of Leary and Cleaver also reveals a great deal about Black-White relations in the revolutionary movement and involves several of the key organizations and people in that movement. We therefore will try to piece the story together, as it can be gleaned from the underground papers, and provide some information on how the underground papers handle drugs in general.

We suspect this last might have more broad relevance than is immediately apparent. We note that in a survey conducted by a panel of nationally recognized experts, in an East Coast school system, high school and junior high students gave four sources of information as influencing them to use drugs: television, magazines, friends, and underground newspapers. Of these four, the students overwhelmingly named friends as most influential, with underground newspapers second.

The Leary-Cleaver dispute is not only a matter carried in the underground press, it is actually an argument concerning how the underground press should portray drug usage as part of the revolution—for, by its own repeated admission, the underground press is the primary means for dissemination of the "party lines" of the various revolutionist organizations. The conventional media and conventional drug authorities have a tendency to categorize drugs as to whether they are "phasely addictive" or "psychologically addictive." The underground publications and authorities categorize them according to political values. The majority of the underground papers encourage the usage of certain drugs with an amount of discouragement toward the usage of others. Cleaver's party encourages no usage! We believe the reasoning from both sides to be significant.

In an interview of Cleaver and Leary by Michael Zwerin, for New York's Village Voice, it becomes quite clear as to how and why Timothy and Rosemary Leary happened to be accepted under the protectorate of the Black Panthers "in exile," or as Cleaver prefers, "the Inter-Communal Section of the Black Panther Party." Leary says: "Rosemary and I saw ourselves as being the first white Americans to say that we would rather be under the protection of Huey Newton's guns than J. Edgar Hoover's guns." And Cleaver says "You and Rosemary coming here and placing yourselves within the framework of our activity here, does result in some political leverage."

This interview took place a few days after Cleaver had placed the Learys under house arrest because of what he considered Timothy's continued advocacy of the "drug culture" and his reception of a continual flow of "hippies" and "drug freaks" coming to Algeria to "worship at the feet of the high priest of drugs."

And herein lies the paradox of the situation in which Cleaver and the Learys found themselves at the time this discussion was taking place. Leary had long been the self-styled high priest of the "drug culture," the advocate of LSD and marijuana who gave up his professorship and eventually went to prison over his insistence on their use. In truth, Leary had just about worn out his attractiveness to young drug enthusiasts when he was sent to prison. But he went to prison over drugs! And the underground press said he was a "political prisoner" and that if the drug laws were to be seriously challenged Timothy had to be freed. "Free " Timothy! Contribute to the Timothy Leary Defense Fund!" went the cries on the pages of the underground papers. Leary was suddenly a "cause" and not only did people contribute to the defense fund to "free Timothy" and challenge the drug laws, but he caught the eye of the Weatherman organization and became a possibility for them to demonstrate their prowess in helping him to escape from prison and spiriting him to Algeria as Cleaver's Panther associates had spirited him some weeks earlier.

Thus, however and whenever Cleaver was talked into taking Timothy and his wife under the wings of the Panthers in Algeria he must have believed he was accepting the comradeship of the "chosen one" of the elite of the White revolutionist organizations in the United States—the FBI-eluding, hard-bombing Weathermen. As he says quite plainly in the interview cited, he was looking "toward unity in the American revolutionary movement. He was not expecting, nor did he intend to accept, the "silly, psychedelic drug culture... which we allied ourselves with in the past because it was our judgment at that time... what we had to work with from white America."

Jennifer Dohrn apparently foresaw trouble between Leary and Cleaver when she visited Algeria last fall. As we reported previously, she seemed overly apologetic about Leary's drug philosophy and kept repeating in her interview with the underground press how the Panthers understood Timothy and how Timothy "underst and was into the revolution." And this, perhaps, is the pay Cleaver would have had it.

He said "Several years ago, what Timothy was doing was very progressive, it had an uprooting effect, a jarring effect, and it was part of the long process of young White people turning away and rejecting the values of their society. "But that has passed," he added, "Things have changed since then. We want people to gather their wits, to sober up, and to get down to the serious business of destroying the Babylonian empire" (Cleaver's habitual reference to the United States). "We need," he continued, "sober, stone-cold revolutionaries, motivated by revolutionary love, men and women who fit the description given by Comrade Che Guevara: 'cool, calculating killing machines to be turned against the enemy,' people who have a firm ideological foundation, who know how to implement their ideology for the purpose of carrying out this revolution."

Apparently Leary was not his man. Cleaver told him quite directly that he wanted an announcement of denunciation of drug usage—specifically LSD—to be broadcast to Leary's political "constituency" in the United States.

Cleaver told him he needed "the active support of those people who are waiting on you. Those people comprise sufficient numbers to liberate political prisoners, and to construct the revolutionary weapon we need to overthrow the government... the way they are dealing with it now is ultimately passive. It's not actively dismantling the System. It rejects the System, it condemns the System, but it does not physically demolish the System." Later, Cleaver told Leary: "Using acid, using drugs is a form of escape from confrontation of something that CAN be dealt with. If the System could NOT be dealt with, if it was utterly impossible to deal with that System, then I would advocate the next best thing. Tripping out."

Here perhaps lies another paradox in the opposite views of Leary and Cleaver on drug usage. Cleaver quickly thinks of drugs as an out for complete frustration—when something simply can NOT be dealt with. This is the common reason we hear for drug usage in the ghetto culture from which the Panthers try to recruit. Extreme frustration and futility are natural parts of that environment. The world is ugly and appears deprayed and oppressive from the ghetto.

Some weeks later, when he was not, as he put it, "arguing with his parole officer," Leary expressed his views on revolution and drugs: "My tensions with the Panthers have stemmed directly from my philosophy of revolution. Many revolutionaries today—not just the Panthers—feel that if you're a real revolutionary, you'll go out there full time with a gun. I don't agree with that. You've got to have Internal Peace of Mind... then you move into the political arena... I think if my philosophy is understood, we might find a way out of this boring, repetitious cycle of one armed group overthrowing another and becoming just as bad... In order to break this cycle you must free people's nervous systems. Free their nervous systems and the rest follows. That is my philosophy..."

Cleaver told the world that Leary had "blown his mind with too many acid trips." He may or may not have been serious about this. And, he may or may not have realized Leary either did not understand the tactical and political

use of drugs, the time for which Cleaver said had passed, nor the "revolutionary consciousness raising" uses his Weatherman liberate speak of, or he chose to ignore both.

Cleaver's original erence to a time when he approved of drugs as a revolutionary tool had to do with their use being an "act of defiance of the law." This is a point long made in the underground press. A Liberation News Service article, in 1969, made the point: "The first thing drugs do is put you immediately outside the law. They give a lot of kids their first sense of belonging to a special group that's against the government... laws won't hurt real revolutionaries; they're outside the law already..."

This is a major point in the use of drugs in young White American revolutionist groups—and it is not a purely legal proposition. The Las Vegas Free Press, which maintains it does not advocate drug usage, ran an article in Eebruary recommending the legalization of all drugs as a means of reducing the spread of addiction and crime. This may or may not be effective in ordinary drug usage, but it has nothing to do with the tactical advocacy of drugs Cleaver referred to and the Liberation News Service spoke of. Whatever drug was legalized would be abandoned by the revolutionist recruiter for one which had not been legalized. The point is to encourage some form of behavior which the society simply cannot accept. When an individual can be led into that behavior he will incur the disapproval, perhaps punishment, even rejection of the society and thus be an alienated candidate for recruiting.

The Chicago Seed, a strong advocate of psychedelics, makes this point: "... The secondary effects of drug use (the harassment, the drug busts) have provided real, and sometimes frightening experiences for many of us with white skin, who, otherwise might have gone on thinking that a cop was just that guy in uniform who directs traffic, and that jails really were full of 'criminals'."

What we are seeing a very small part of here is the artificial creation of a cultural gap. A writer in the Ann Arbor Argus spoke of it as moving from a "generation gap" to an "interstellar" war. That may be far-fetched but the point being recognized is that the strategy being followed by the revolutionists in America today is one best suited to inter-class or intercultural warfare-the "have nots" or the "outs" becoming angry enough to use violence against the "haves" or "ins" in the face of great odds. In the case of the young Whites involved, they are from the "have" or "in" group and to become angry or alienated enough to be willing to attack their own and to attack a system as strong as they see this one to be they have to be provided with what amounts to a completely separate culture-"counterculture" is a very common expression in the underground papers. It has to be a real cleavage too, to be effective. In a society as permissive as the American society today it takes some doing. Sex would not be strong enough, elthough as Other Scenes put it, "Sex is one of the things that gets the other generation up tight ... it's one of the things that revolutionaries use as an inexpensive, effortless tactic to upset people." The society has simply absorbed more liberal sex customs. Obscenities have worked essentially the same. Hair keeps dander up, as do "freaky" clothes, but none of these is the society as likely to react to so strongly

Bernardine Dohrn touches on this in her "Weatherman communication" concerning last fall's change in tactics. She

says: "And marijuana and LSD and little money and awakening to the Black revolution" made it possible for them to "move against the system" in such drastic ways.

Again, there is a paradox here in connection with drugs and the revolution. The Black revolutionist not only did not need drugs to set him off in a separate culture-years of segregation and, for many, the ghetto did that-but his people are often so aware of drug abuse and what it has done in their ahettoes that they have been known to barricade their streets in their demands for stopping drug traffic. Underground papers aimed at the ghettoes do not advocate drugs. Black leaders, whether revolutionist or reformist cannot get support from their people unless they denounce drug abuse. Although Cleaver makes the point that he is not really against marijuana, "when not on revolutionary business," the Panthers' paper has none of the drawings, ads, or articles encouraging marijuana that are almost the hallmark of the undergrounds aimed at primarily White audiences.

In addition to using drugs as the keystone of the "counter-culture," the revolutionists use them as a substitute for the "consciousness raising" the hard-line ideologues speak of.

Diane di Prima, who might be regarded as the "poetess laureate" of the revolution, suggests this to be true: "One of the most revolutionary things that's happened is the use of hallucinogens. Drugs don't only reveal the falseness of bourgeois structure, they release the life force in us, they awake in us the desire to live as free animals in a particular landscape... Information was opened to us through acid. Now if revolutionaries are talking from the head (following ideology rather than dealing with root things, like dance, sex, and magic), history has already passed them by... I think it's stupid for the white drug culture to goose-step with the Communist Party."

As perhaps Cleaver was suggesting, underground writers further along the road to revolution than Diane di Prima think drug usage is a stage in revolutionary development. This from the Berkeley *Tribe:* "We can no longer relate to the drug culture and its slogans of 'peace' and 'love.' All it has meant in our experience is 'peace' in the suburb, and 'love' of the conditions necessary to maintain it. It is time to come down... we must take the initiative to acquire an objective view of the world. Since we have generally not based our thinking on dialectical materialism, we have denied ourselves the only weapon that leads to a concrete understanding of the contradictions in our society."

Both the counter-culture point and "consciousness raising" are made in a letter to the editor of Philadelphia's Thursday's Drummer: "Before drugs found their way to middle Amerika, middle Amerikan children were just that—middle future Amerikans. Through the course of my last six years in the 'drug scene' I have seen hundreds of ho-hum minds expanded, broadened, etc. It is a true fact, drugs open the mind. We must realize that without the help of grass and hashish and a little mescaline that many of today's young people would have followed their parents' wishes... some young Amerikans would have plotted their lives in a revolutionary course; however, many would not have done this. Drugs were the first common ground; drugs are part of our culture."

Neither the revolutionists nor many of the publications which make up the large and varying family we see as the undergrounds advocate what they speak of as "hard drugs."

In discussing Cleav "busting" of Leary for advocating the psychedelics: "We turned onto acid since everybody knows that smack [heroin] is a bringdown, and you can't function behind it. But who told us that? Well, it was our sisters and brothers who are struggling in the ghetto, on the reservation, and in all the other outlets to the Mafia services. So did we get uptight when the Panthers condemned heroin and relate it to ourselves?"

It has been a common story in the undergrounds for a number of months now that the "establishment," sometimes said "the government," keeps heroin going into the poor areas and among the "street people" to "keep them under control." Perhaps this is a transferral from the views and language of the ghetto—which is often true in the underground press—where the Malia very likely appears to be "establishment." This is not the case, however, with the following story taken from the February 20-27 edition of the Berkeley Tribe.

"There is a new theory going around the psychedelic world about the American presence in Indochina and specifically about the invasion of Laos... We are invading Laos and Cambodia to get the opium harvest, for if we don't, the economy of Laos, and hence the Royal Laotian Government will fall." It goes on to say the CIA is masterminding this operation and using its aircraft to fly the opium out. "This is the route by which some heroin gets into the U.S. Between the heroin from Southeast Asia and that from Turkey, the CIA is able to flood the ghettos of America with this killer and destroy the revolutionary process of the poor."

DRUG ENCOURAGEMENT IN THE UNDERGROUND PRESS


Much has been said and written in recent months about the suggestiveness of some popular song lyrics toward drug usage. This is often so subtly done a member of the "straight world" might miss it. From the previous paragraphs this is obviously not always true in the underground newspapers. Although there are some subtleties still, not as many as there were a year or so ago. They are quite open in advertising drug paraphenalia and even in advertising marijuana plants and synthetic drugs of various kinds—especially LSD and mescaline. Perhaps of more critical concern, however, should be the manner in which under-

The Bureau considers the funding of the MP and principals thereof to be of the atmost importance. SCPI was organized to hold MPP funds and assets, and it has been reported that Swiss bank accounts will be used to incilitate flow of funds between Europe and SCPI.

In addition to the lead is referenced memorandum to determine if the BPP is conducting any banking activity in Switzerland, details of Cleaver's banking activity at the Credit Swiss Bank and/or any other Swiss banks is desired.

The U.S. Mission in Berlin, Department of State, furnished the following on March 16, 1971. The Free University's Department of Philosophy and Social Sciences requested the President of the University on January 14, 1971, to extend an invitation to Davis to be a guest professor. While the President's Office was considering this, word of the proposed invitation appeared in the press, and without waiting for approval of the President, the Chairman of the Department sent Davis a formal invitation through Professor Marcuse. A Vice President of the University, Dr. Wesel, then requested Marcuse to determine with Davis' attorneys

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whether such an invitation could be considered as interfering with judicial proceedings pending against Davis. It was then tentatively agreed the invitation be given her attorneys, leaving them to decide what effect such an invitation would have on her case. A formal offer of a guest professorship was sent on February 1, 1971. The offer states it "will remain as a standing invitation until such time as you will be able to accept."

The Department of Philosophy and Social Sciences has also requested the President that Eldridge Cleaver be appointed a guest professor. A representative of the President's Office has stated it is unlikely such an invitation will be sent Cleaver. He pointed out that while Davis is a qualified academician, Cleaver is not.

The American Consulate General in Munich, Federal Republic of Germany (FRG), furnished the following on March 11, 1971.

Two members of the committee "Freiheit fuer Angela Davis" (Freedom for Angela Davis) visited the Consulate General for fifteen minutes on March 9, 1971, to read and present a "Declaration of 9th March." Committee members said this date was chosen because the Davis defense was to make a plea for a larger courtroom on that date. Committee members said a list of over 400 signatures gathered in Munich in support of Davis had been sent to her defense attorneys in California. They also asked that the Amerika Haus be a site of public discussion between the committee and a United States representative to inform the public about the Davis case. They were told to make a written request.

The Freedom for Angela Davis Committee also staged a protest march the evening of March 9, 1971. The march route ended before the Amerika Haus where approximately 300 youths gathered.

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

The Black Panther Party (BPP) is a black extremist organization started in Oakland, California, in December, 1966. It advocates the use of guns and guerrilla tactics to bring about the overthrow of the United States Government.

As of October, 1970, the Subject's address was Boite Postal 118, Grand Poste, Algiers, Algeria.

II. ACTIVITIES AND/OR CONNECTIONS WITH THE BPP

CLEAVER was in frequent contact with the leadership of the BPP at the BPP National Headquarters in Oakland concerning his activities as head of the International Section of the BPP until the latter part of February, 1971, when he and HUEY PANEWTON, the Supreme Commander of the BPP, had a falling out and each subsequently expelled the other from the Party.

San Francisco Television Station KGO on February 26, 1971, broadcast an interview with BPP Supreme Commander HUEY NEWTON who was present in the studio and ELDRIDGE CLEAVER who was contacted by long distance telephone from Algeria on the Jim Dunbar Television Talk Show. Most significant was ELDRIDGE CLEAVER's reply to a question by DUNBAR as to whether CLEAVER had any message for his followers. CLEAVER then gave what appeared to be a prepared statement saying that the recent purges of "Brother Geronimo" (ELMERS PRATT, a former BPP leader from Los Angeles) and the New York 21 by NEWTON had been "regrettable and should not have taken place, and were done without prior consultation with the three members of the Central Committee in Algeria." CLEAVER demanded the ouster of DAVID ϕ HILLIARD as Chief of Staff of the BPP saying his actions over a long period of time had brought the Party to the point where it was falling apart at the seams.

NEWTON disagreed with CLEAVER indicating that he fully supported HILLIARD's work as Chief of Staff and that he, NEWTON, took full responsibility for the purges. NEWTON described CLEAVER's demand as untimely in that the contradiction was aired before the public instead of in the privacy of the BPP Central Committee.

The New York 21 are former members of the New York Chapter of the BPP presently being tried in New York on various charges including conspiracy to bomb.

On February 26, 1971, HUEY NEWTON issued orders which in effect appeared to expell the Algerian section of the BPP. Part of instructions to BPP personnel at National Headquarters in Oakland, California, and at National Distribution in San Francisco, California, were that there were to be no communications of any kind between BPP officials and the Algerian Section. NEWTON further ordered that no material of any kind be sent to Algeria and that no phone calls were to be made or accepted by anyone from any of the members in Algeria.



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
ELDRIDGE CLEAVER, KATHLEEN CLEAVER, and DON COX made an appeal to NEWTON to come to Algeria and KATHLEEN CLEAVER attempted to reach NEWTON by references to past activities in which the Party in earlier times had been successful. NEWTON, however, refused and accused them of having destroyed the Party. It was the CLEAVERs' contention that NEWTON was receiving a distorted picture of things and could not make proper decisions without personal discussion with people in Algiers. NEWTON reportedly concluded the conversation by stating that the entire International Section was not in accord and that he would do everything possible to destroy them. ELDRIDGE CLEAVER responded as the action he had taken was the only possibility open to him and he wanted NEWTON to come to Algiers right away. NEWTON indicated that if he went to Algeria it would be to kill CLEAVER.

DON COX is Field Marshal of the BPP and KATHLEEN CLEAVER is Communications Secretary of the BPP.

During the above conversation NEWTON made reference to CLEAVER having done something to RAHIM (CLINTON SMITH), the inference being that CLEAVER had killed him or had had him killed.

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III. STATEMENTS AND WRITINGS

Section and all recently expelled members of the BPP.

An article captioned "Exclusive Interview Cleaver's Plans for Revolution" written by WILLIAM TUOHY appeared in the October 28, 1970, issue of the "San Francisco Chronicle." This article was datelined in Algeria and reads in part as follows:

"ELDRIDGE CLEAVER declared here yesterday that he intends to expand his Party into an international operation dedicated to overthrowing the U. S. Government.

"He said he will add members of other revolutionary groups to his overseas Panther group to make 'a common cause' against the 'establishment, imperialist' government of the United States.

"CLEAVER, who has been living here in exile 15 months, said he viewed this broadened international organization 'as a rival institution to (WILLIAM P.) ROGERS' State Department to properly represent the American people in other parts of the world.'

"CLEAVER declared, 'our job is to destroy Babylon.'

'It is a symbol of decadence and corruption of the (national) power that is now the number one enemy of the people of the world' (United States)." The following are excerpts from an article captioned "There Is No U. S. Ambassador to the Republic of Africa but There Is a Charge d'Affaires. Then There Is Eldridge Cleaver, Our Other Man in Algiers," written by SANCHE DE GRAMONT, appearing in the November 1, 1970, issue of the "New York Times": "Put in Algiers, the Panthers were expecting each one of approximately a dozen liberation movements acredited by the Algerian Government and Soviets with assistance and support in the task of overthrowing the Governments and power in their respective countries. "'This', as CLEAVER pointed out when he announced the opening of his new headquarters in mid-September, 'is the first time in the struggle of the black people in America that they have established representatives abroad.' "Now in the new quarters CLEAVER and his friends are the only Americans recognized by the Algerians, who brushed off diplomatic relations with the United States several years ago... "In Algiera the Panthers feel safe. They are protected by the Algerian Government, surrounded by kindred spirits. There was no sign of weapons at the headquarters. The reception was like any diplomatic reception, with militants from the anti-war groups serving soft drinks and cookies to the Communist Chinese, the Viet Cong, the North Koreans, and the members of other revolutionary movements. CLEAVER was a genial host, greeting each new arrival, entering into long discussions full of references of CHE GUEVARA and FRANTZ FANON. the guests told CLEAVER he was impressed by his grasp of revolutionary theories." - 6 -

In addition to the article by GRAMONT, there appeared copies of a statement given to the author by CLEAVER in Algiers. It reads in part as follows:

"Here in Algiers we have set up an International Section of the BPP. Through this tactic we internationalized our struggle. We show the oppression is an international problem. We have been successful in making alliances with other movements. We are going to bring up the issue of our oppression in the international public forum. We will publicize our struggle, develop expansions with other groups and receive assistance from them. Although we realize that the United Nations is only a puppet of the United States, we are going to lay a concrete proposal before the United Nations...


"We have black people who are our deadly enemies. The black pig, a white pig, a yellow pig, a pink pig - a dead pig is the best pig of all. We encourage people to kill them because the police constitute an Army...our problems derive from the System itself. We have to completely eliminate a capitalist system and replace it with Socialism...

"There are also advantages to political assassination, in that this can eliminate the function, but you know that the man will be replaced, and it has great educational value. It teaches the people to kill the enemy and hit at America. It would give me great satisfaction if RICHARD NIXON should be killed. I would consider that an excellent thing.

"My ambition is the destruction of the present system."

The December 14, 1970, issue of <u>Der Spiegel</u> of Hamburg, West Germany, contained an article reflecting the results of an interview with ELDRIDGE CLEAVER. Portions of that interview read as follows:

"Interviewer: This includes also the call for political murder?"





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'CLEAVER: Now, take President NIXON for example. He has even intensified the oppression of the black population and other progressive forces. He is responsible for the situation where the year-long work of Civil Rights fighters has been reduced to nothing. He is being hated by many people. And we believe that it would be of ... that it would have an inspiring effect, if he were eliminated by violence..."

"Interviewer: And then?"

"CLEAVER: Then the people would understand that it is not only desirable but even possible to eliminate such individuals as RICHARD NIXON. He is an obstacle on the way to our freedom. For this reason he should be eliminated brutally."

On February 18, 1971, the International Section of the BPP in Algiers, Algeria, wrote a letter to HUEY P. NEWTON, Minister of Defense of the BPP, in Oakland, California. This letter included the transcript of a statement presented by BPP Field Marshal DONALD COX to the Palestinian Student Conference at Kuwait February 13-17, 1971. The signer of the letter was ELDRIDGE CLEAVER, and this letter reads in part as follows:

"We have received a series of invitations for a delegation of Black Panthers to visit North Vietnam, China, and North Korea. These invitations are of very long standing and are very important towards solidifying our revolutionary intercommunal relationships and elevating our revolutionary consciousness.

"The invitations to China and North Vietnamwere extended to me during my visit to those countries last summer, when I was asked to bring a delegation of Black Panthers to visit. The invitation to North Korea has been extended for even longer, and all these invitations were open in terms of time. But now, the invitation to visit North Korea has been made very specific. They want to have a delegation of Black Panthers, about four or five people, to visit around the end of April or the beginning of May...



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"I feel that you should be a member of the delegation to North Korea, and especially you should to in the delegation to China. This visit is going to be a key trap in establishing working relationships with our true friends. We must make intercommunalism as much a part of our practice as it is of our rhetoric...

"As I told you before we have sent D. C. (DONALD COX) and SEKOU as the representatives of the BPP to the Palestinian Student Conference held in Kuwait February 13-17, 1971. We were invited there by AL FETH. I have enclosed a copy of the speech we drafted to be presented at the conference. This states our position on Israel and Zionism as it has never been stated before and we would like to have it published unedited."

The "statement" of the BPP to the Palestinian Student Conference reads in part as follows:

"The BPP is honored to be invited to participate in the Conference of Palestinian Students here in Kuwait. We thank our comrades for making our presence here possible. We bring to you fraternal greetings and heart-felt solidarity from the American revolutionary movement.

"Long years of treachery, torture, bloodshed, and exploitation at the hands of the imperialist butchers link the struggle of the Palestinian people and the Afro-American people for their just liberation. We both have suffered years of defeat for trusting our so-called friends to solve our problems for us; we both have discovered that it is only when we throw off dependency and patience and pick up weapons ourselves to fight for our own freedom that we begin to taste success.

"The usurpation of territory by Imperialism is a world-wide phenomena, causing untold misery, suffering, exploitation, and destruction to the people of the world. In fact, there is a global conspiracy on the part of the racist imperialist powers to maintain domination over the land and its resources occupied by oppressed peoples. Within the United States, the black, red, yellow, and brown people are victimized by extreme economic exploitation and blatant racial oppression, and are moving towards the resolution of their problems with revolutionary organization and revolutionary violence. We live on the land, but we cannot share in the fruits



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of our labor nor the wealth of the land. We are victims of fascist repression and insidious murder by the local police forces occupying our communities. Outside the United States, the same Imperial administration that governs us perpetrates heinous crimes against the people of Asia, Africa, and Latin America. It has usurped their resources, wrenched control over their governments, and prevented the people from employing the wealth of their land and their human talents for their own benefit.

"Throughout Latin America, Yankee Imperialism is strangling the people with its neo-colonial domination. And in the face of this world-wide butchery and misery, cold blooded revisionists work hand-in-glove with the imperialists, revealing themselves as partners in the international white racist conspiracy to rule the world. Regardless of their spoken ideology, practice makes it clear that they share the same goals: the end result is to block revolution. They will let you get killed, cause you to get killed, assist your being killed, or kill you if you stand in their way.

"The BPP stands for power to the people. We support the struggle of the Palestinian people to give the power back to the people that has been usurped by the Zionist-Imperialist monster, Israel. The Palestinian people have become, like black people in the United States, a dispersed collection of communities having no land to call their own.

"The BPP unconditionally and firmly supports the just struggle of the Palestinian people and their war of national salvation against the lackey state of Israel and its imperialist backers. The BPP calls upon all the progressive people, parties, organizations, governments and movements to mount a new offensive against the piratical and barbarous U. S. Imperialist Empire and its bootlicking Zionist puppet Israel. Let the people of the world rise up against the common enemy and thus usher in a new day of freedom, prosperity, and peace for the whole world."



The March 9, 1971, issue of the "Oakland Tribune" contained an article captioned "CLEAVER: NEWTON is Expelled." The article is datelined in Algiers and reads in part as follows:



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"ELDRIDGE CLEAVER, who leads one segment of the quarreling BPP, asserts that HUEY NEWTON and DAVID HILLIARD have been expelled as revisionists.

"NEWTON is the Party's leader and HILLIARD is its Chief of Staff. Both are in California where NEWTON said just about the same thing last week about CLEAVER.

"CLEAVER, in a weekend statement to the press, said that NEWTON, HILLIARD, HILLIARD's wife, JUNE and 'all those who follow NEWTON's revisionist line no longer form a part of the BPP.'

"CLEAVER who leads what he calls the Party's 'International Section,' said that 'for a long time these deviationists have been in disagreement with the International Section of the Party.'

"'NEWTON has abandoned party principles and proceeded with unjustifiable expulsions. His methods and the way he approaches problems have led him to work like the American Communist Party, a narrow-minded and stagnant Party.'

"He also called for Panthers to get rid of 'hippies anf followers of drugs' and 'bring about revolution by means of the 'gun.'

"In an interview, Mrs. CLEAVER said her husband's section of the Party had the support of the New York chapter and 'rank and file members,' including those purged by NEWTON and HILLIARD."

The March 31, 1971, issue of the "Daily Californian", the University of California at Berkeley (UCB) newspaper, contained an article captioned "Cleaver Seeks Whites' Support." The article was written by CON O'LEARY and reads in part as follows:

"ELDRIDGE CLEAVER, in a taped 10 minute message received by the 'Daily Californian' Monday called upon the white radical community to support him in the power struggle now going on within the BPP...



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"In his first unequivocal call for white support CLEAVER said: 'We hope that white radicals will come out and take a principle position in this struggle, because to allow vicious elements like HILLIARD and NEWTON to continue functioning is, I feel, contrary to the American revolution as a whole.'"

IV. MISCELLANEOUS

CHARLENE MITCHELL, publicly identified Communist Party (CP) member and that Party's Presidential candidate in the 1968 national election, spoke at a Connecticut State CP meeting in New Haven on September 27, 1970. During her speech she stated that she had traveled to Algiers where she visited with ELDRIDGE CLEAVER. She said she tried to induce CLEAVER to tell the BPP in the United States to follow less militant tactics and to use a more Marxist-Leninist approach. She said she was not successful. She said that the whole Panther movement is following the wrong approach and the wrong tactics in using guns.

The February 5, 1971, to February 12, 1971, issue of the "Berkeley Tribe", an underground newspaper published weekly in Berkeley, California, contained an article captioned "ELDRIDGE on Tim and Rosemary." The article reads in part as follows:

"This is a transcript of the tape made by ELDRIDGE CLEAVER in Algiers, after the Inter-Communal Section of the Black Panther Party 'busted' TIMOTHY and ROSEMARY LEARY.

"Today is January 12, 1971. Since September of 1970, Dr. TIMOTHY LEARY and his wife ROSEMARY have been with us here in the Inter-Communal Section of the BPP in Algeria. During that time, much confusion has been generated, partly because of our own silence on the subject, as to the relationship between the BPP and Dr. LEARY and his wife.

"I want to take this opportunity to set forth our position on that and also to make a few observations on the drug culture as a whole inside the United States specifically, as it relates to the process of carrying out the revolutionary struggle against the fascist imperialist empire of the United States of America.

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
"A couple of months ago, I was talking to Dr. LEARY about...how we would integrate him into our operation here... how he could function, and specifically how he could be projected to the press in terms of his public image...He stated that he thought that he should be projected as the 'Aristotle' or the 'Socrates' or the 'Sartre' of the American revolution. I think that kind of symbolizes...how Dr. LEARY has constantly tried to relate to us. He seems to take himself seriously as the high priest of the revolution; and in some sense sees himself as sort of a secular god,...around which the revolutionary movement inside the United States revolves.

"And also, after many discussions with him on the subject of drugs and the relevancy of drugs, specifically LSD, as a weapon in the revolutionary struggle, I've come to conclude that Dr. LEARY is irrevocably wed to the idea of the beneficial aspects of LSD in the context of the revolutionary movement...He would rather die than give up the idea of changing American society by dosing everyone with LSD. Well, this is not a principle or a suggestion that we in the BPP can in any way endorse, because we think it's absurd and unrealistic as an approach to carrying out our struggle.

"LEARY seems content to continue advising people to 'Turn on, tune in and drop out,' and he really means it when he says that freedom means getting high. This is in direct conflict with the needs of the American revolution...We need people with clear heads, sober people who have their wits about them, because we're confronted with murderous facist pigs who will stop at nothing and who have so much manpower at their disposal..."

The February 22, 1971, issue of the "San Francisco Examiner" contained an article captioned "CLEAVER Tells How to Free ANGELA." This article is datelined Rome and reads in part as follows:

"A Pro-Communist Italian Daily Today' newspaper quoted BPP leader ELDRIDGE CLEAVER as saying a Latin American style political kidnapping can be a means of liberating ANGELA DAVIS...





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"CLEAVER: 'The time for protesting against political trials in the traditional way is ended. The most efficient way can only be a revolutionary attempt to liberate ANGELA DAVIS as the experience of the Latin Americans show.'

"Paese Sera (newspaper): 'Does this mean that you intend to kidnap a diplomat or political exponent to exchange him for ANGELA DAVIS?'


"CLEAVER: 'It is a matter of variations on a theme. One could kidnap a pig, a hog, someone highly esteemed..."

ANGELA DAVIS is publicly identified CP member presently awaiting trial on charges of kidnapping - murder in Marin County, California.

On February 24, 1971, educational television station KQED of San Francisco, California, broadcast an hour-long interview featuring drug cultist TIMOTHY LEARY, an escapee from a California prison and ELDRIDGE CLEAVER, in Algiers, Algiera. The indication was that the interview had been video-taped in early February, 1971, and concerned the argument between CLEAVER and LEARY on how the drug culture relates to carrying out the revolution. CLEAVER ridiculed LEARY for his public position on drugs and particularly LSD and indicated that it was not desirable for revolutionaries to follow LEARY's advice to utilize LSD. He further ridiculed JERRY RUBEN -ABBY HOFFMAN type revolutionary as having a psychedelic approach to revolution which has been ineffective and said that he wanted a Weatherman type underground development in the United States for the purpose of dealing seriously in terms of war with the empire of Babylon to give up toy guns, to stop gathering and to start "Weathermaning" and "Panthering."

The March 6, 1971, issue of "The Black Panther", the official BPP newspaper, contained an article captioned "Free Kathleen Cleaver" which article indicated it was written by ELAINE BROWN, Deputy Minister of Information of the Southern California Chapter of the BPP. This article reads in part as follows:






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"KATHLEEN CLEAVER, the Communications Secretary of the BPP, is unable to come to the U. S. to speak on March 5th at the Oakland Auditorium in behalf of our incarcerated Chairman, BOBBY SEALE and in behalf of ERICKA HUGGINS, who are on trial for their lives. Some months ago, she had agreed to return to the Empire (United States), having been away for quite a while, to speak on that Revolutionary Intercommunal Day of Solidarity for Chairman BOBBY SEALE and ERICKA HUGGINS. But we did not hear from KATHLEEN again. We would call and her husband, ELDRIDGE CLEAVER, would always talk for her. indicating and finally saying that she would not come to speak for the Chairman. He would tell us that he was not going to send her. KATHLEEN is a member of the Central Committee of the BPP, yet we were told that beyond all else her husband would not let her out of the house. In other words, she was 'his woman' first, and if that conflicted with her work as a revolutionary, then his chauvinist rule would take a primary position over that. Even to the point of stopping the progress of our glorious struggle.

"KATHLEEN explained at another time that although ELDRIDGE said he had sent her to Korea to maintain our solidarity with the courageous Korean people and because they would take good care of her during her second pregnancy, that, in fact, ELDRIDGE saw himself as using the Korean People to get rid of KATHLEEN for a while, so he could have his new 'woman' without interference.

"When he did finally join her in Korea (during the Delegation tour), he constantly harassed her with the statement that the baby she was carrying was not his. In her pregnant state, and with everything else, this remark had a devastating effect. And finally, the day after KATHLEEN had the baby, we (ELDRIDGE and myself) went to the hospital to visit her. And, at that time he repeated somewhat what he had done when she had had their first baby. He slapped her there in the hospital bed, told her he was leaving her, that she was no longer his wife and that he was returning to Algiers and MALIKA, and leaving her in Korea indefinitely.



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"And now she is locked up there in Algiers with him. Forced to stay there and accept whatever is meted out to her, for fear of her very life. In fact, when I last saw ELDRIDGE, he was laughing about how 'we bury people here' (Algiers). He was referring to a brother he had in fact murdered in Algiers. As many beatings and as much suffering that KATHLEEN endured from ELDRIDGE, she had finally been able to break away, steal away, and make contact with another man. She had wanted to do this all along. She had never been narrow in her approach, for just as ELDRIDGE had had many women with whom he had relationships, she, like him, also wanted relationships with other men. This is only natural, reasonable. But she finally did manage to slip in a moment in which she too could have freedom of choice.


"She began relating to a brother who had just - at that time - come to Algiers. His name was RAHIM (CLINTON SMITH). He and a brother named BYRON BOOTH had escaped from the Californa State Penitentiary at Chino. They had hijacked a plane to Cuba, where they had met ELDRIDGE. All of them went to Algiers. And there KATHLEEN and RAHIM met.

"In an act exemplifying the true nature of a chauvinist, a combination of cowardly terror and an inferiority complex, ELDRIDGE snatched even this from KATHLEEN. He killed - which act he could never seem to be able to commit against any of the People's oppressor - killed this brother, RAHIM. He murdered him and buried his body right in Algiers, because KATHLEEN had done only once what he had made an integral part of their relationship.

"Of course, the chauvinist behavior he exhibited and the resulting murder of RAHIM was endorsed by the Algerian government of HOUARI BOUMEDIENNE, who himself being an extreme chauvinist and opportunist, gave ELDRIDGE the plot of ground in which to bury RAHIM; and BOUMEDIENNE kept it quiet for him.

III. STATEMENTS AND WRITINGS

The following are some of the comments which appeared in the April 19, 1971 edition of the Oslo, Norway daily newspaper, "Dag Bladet" in an interview between ELDRIDGE CLEAVER and GAENS BJORNEBOE:

ELDRIDGE CLEAVER in response to a question concerning his treatment in Algeria stated, "I have excellent working conditions here, complete freedom."

When asked what were the long-range goals of the BPP CLEAVER stated, "Total revolution. A complete transformation of the American society. In a way this will also mean-back to the constitution, also nullified today by those in power. But we want a socialist society. I think Marx created the concepts that are best to work with--I regard myself as a Marxist-Leninist--but it is quite certain that we have to aim at an American socialism, a socialism that to quite a different degree respects the individual person, the rights of the individual and above all, personal freedom."



In response to a question concerning CLEAVER's attitude towards white students and intellectuals who sympathize with him, he stated he has a positive attitude towards them. He said that the people must be prepared for a coup on the part of right wing forces in the United States and must be ready for the introduction of a completely fascist state.

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
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



New York sources indicate possibility rumors have been planted by the Cleavers concerning his potential return to the U.S. in an effort to cover the ouster of the BPP International Section from Algeria.







Taken from the September 20, 1971 issue of the French newspaper "L'Opinion" which is published in Paris(?), France.

Exclusive: Eldridge Cleaver, leader of the Black Panthers, answers the questions of "L'Opinion."

Created in 1966 by Huey P. Newton (Defense Minister of the party) and Bobby Seals (president of the party), the Black Panther Party saw its first light in the slums of Oakland, in the suburbs of San Francisco. A ghetto like so many others where the conditions of life and of work are disastrous. It is there that the most revolutionary black organization of the U.S.A. was born. The Black Panthers allied themselves with the SNCC which was a student organization directed by Stokely Carmichael. He became the First Minister of the party where the Minister of Justice is no one other than Rap Brown. The acquired effectiveness and audience are such that the Black Panthers today constitute the most influential black organization in the U.S.A. and the most formidable by the Federal police. The American administration, is waging it a furious battle against them which exposes the nature and the harshness of the system in which they live.

The Black Panther Party has numerous representatives in foreign countries, especially in Algeria. It is there that our co-worker Ahmed Chahid encountered Eldridge Cleaver, Minister of Information of the Party. He is the author of a book entitled "Soul on Ice." Eldridge Cleaver answers the questions of "L'Opinon."

II. ACTIVITIES

"San Francisco Chronicle", a daily San Francisco, California newspaper, on September 4, 1971 carried an item from Reuter's News Service, to the effect that the previous day, ELDRIDGE CLEAVER, Minister of Information of the BPP, Algiers, based international section, from that city had called for vengeance in the killing of GEORGE JACKSON, an inmate at San Quentin Prison in California, August 21, 1971.

The article stated that CLEAVER urged black prisoners in American jails to escape.

The September 23, 1971 edition of "San Francisco Examiner", a daily newspaper of San Francisco, contained an article, bylined ALMENA LOMAX, reporting that ELDRIDGE CLEAVER had turned up in Brazzaville, Republic of Congo. CLEAVER's whereabouts became known at that time as a result of an article written for the October 1971 edition of "Black Scholar", a publication of Sausalito, California. The article was entitled, "Culture and Révolution; Their Synthesis in Africa."

The article read in part:

- "'Afro-American liberation struggle between the cultural freaks and those who relate primarily to the gun. The cultural nationalists refused to understand that 'political power grows out of the barrel of a gun', and this is why it was necessary to wage such a hard and uncompromising struggle against them.
- "We find here in the Congo a revolutionary Marxist Leninist state, party, and a People's Army built along the lines of a true People's Republic to deal with safeguarding construction of a socialist society from both internal and external enemies.
- "'It is very beautiful that this has been done in the Congo, in the heart of Africa. Of all words. . . connected with Africa, more than the word 'Africa' itself, the

> "'word, 'Congo' sets off some very deep vibrations in black hearts, souls, minds,' Cleaver says..."

"Denouncing both the 'pig media and the bootlicking black bourgeois media,' Cleaver calls on American Negroes to demand that the U.S.'withdraw its troops from Congo Kinshasa and cease all military aid to the reactionary Mobutu regime' and also demands that the U.S. 'and other imperialist countries stop their hostile economic acts against the People's Republic of the Congo.'

"Black Scholar" is a black militant monthly magazine, published at Sausalito, California.

During October, 1971, a San Francisco source received information that Cleaver might attempt to reenter the U.S. at San Diego, California, by unknown means. As a result of leads set forth for the San Diego Office as well as Los Angeles, alerts were placed with other agencies, INS, and FAA, in an effort to determine the method by which Cleaver might attempt this reentry. As a result the succeeding communications within these two agencies to their respective border stations, a number of repetitious leads were set out which in turn resulted in a number of inquiries by our field offices. This information has been previously resolved in part at San Antonio where rumor allegedly started concerning Cleaver's reentry. San Antonio is being instructed to run out one additional phase of their investigation, however, the only person located to date by who allegedly started this rumor, has the name of denied any knowledge of Cleaver or initiating the rumor.

Assistant Attorney General Wilson's memorandum of November 3, .1970, both of which requested investigation in this matter under the sedition statutes.

In view of the technical problem of the sufficiency of the voice identification of the tapes of the speech purportedly made by Eldridge Cleaver, there is a question as to whether the presently available evidence is sufficient to establish that it was, in fact, Cleaver who made the speech. We also note that Cleaver presently is in selfimposed exile out of the country, and he faces a jail term should he return to this country. In these circumstances, we do not contemplate initiating a prosecution against Cleaver under 18 U.S.C. 2387 or 2388 at this time.

We have examined the results of your investigation of and it is our conclusion that the evidence against her is not sufficiently strong to warrant a sedition prosecution.

In view of the foregoing, we are not requesting any further specific investigation of Cleaver and the sedition statutes, but we would appreciate receiving any additional pertinent information which may come to your attention.

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

-L'Opinion: A wisely-arranged bad propaganda claims that the Black Panther Party is a racist organization while your movement follows a revolutionary road. Could you explain, for those who still refuse to believe it, in the name of which principles do you struggle?

INFORMATION CONTAINED

*Eldridge Cleaver: We struggle for a number of objectives. The principal one consists of liberating our people from all forms of exploitation. We struggle for the complete transformation of the capitalist and imperialist American system which provides the base and the arms for our repression. After several defeats on the organizational as well as the operational level, the present generation of Afro-Americans has reached the following conclusion: order for our people to enjoy their freedom, they must build a base capable of uniting the different revolutionary forces in the U.S.A. in order to tear down the capitalist and imperialist system and to replace it with a socialist system.

> We are also of the opinion that the oppressive system under which we suffer is international. It is not a national system with branches abroad. No, it is international in the sense that it is composed of different reactionary and feudal regimes which support the reaction forces in the world against all the progressive forces. Our position is international in nature. We wish to work together, and thus we seek national and international alliances.

No reconciliation between the oppressed and the executioners

-L'Opinion: The last massacre in the Attica prison is a revealing sign that the use of force against the Afro-Americans is highly valued in the U.S.A.

*Eldridge Cleaver: Our analysis of the situation takes into account the open and fascist repression such as we saw it in Attica. We grow taller against this attempt at destruction, all the more because the unity of the revolutionary forces in the U.S.A. and the increasing awareness of the masses have led us to a definite choice: it is no longer a question of reconciliation between the oppressed and the executioners. To us, this is clear and evident. The present leaders are not going to surrender; we will continue to fight them. In their hands rest a certain number of political tools to eliminate us-such as the judicial authorities, the police or the prisons. This leaves us only one tool to employ against them, and this is why we are now in a state of war in the U.S.A. All subterfuge is outmoded, all political means of repression are exhausted: we are now face to face. The only possibility is violence. We do not accept any "reform" solution. We wish to beaclear on this subject. In answer to our grievances, the leaders love to apply semimeasures. As far as we are concerned, we organize armed actions in order to make our revolution more effective. What matters to us the most is the manner of rendering the struggle more effective and the more rigorous application of revolutionary violence.

> I believe it is necessary to point out some facts in order to make more understandable the savage blood bath provoked by the "cops" in the U.S.A. Take, for example, Jackson's murder. What I learned this very morning clearly shows the attitude of the U.S. leaders. It is murder, pure and simple, the physical elimination of a militant who has become dangerous for the system. I contacted a comrade in the U.S.A., and he told me that when the authorities attacked the prison, they stated that 28 persons had been shot and 8 or 9 others had been killed. was nothing but a maneuver to kill them in cold blood. These militants were very much alive when the authorities took over the prison. All this reveals the political schemes of those in power who have decided to eliminate the revolution by attacking the imprisoned militants who have demonstrated leadership qualities.

The soldiers and the prisoners are no longer spectators

-L'Opinion: Jackson's death appears to have given a new dimension to your struggle. What will be its repercussions?

*Eldridge Cleaver: The atrocities which take place at the penitentiaries have been known for a long time in the U.S.A. They have now attained such a dimension that, sadly enough, they are "issues" throughout the world. This is an evident manifestation of a new center of activities.

The other center being developed now is inside the military establishments. In both cases, it is obvious that the prisoners and the militants have received a fast political education by confronting annumber of contradictions. The result of this is that the prisoners are in the process of becoming politically organized to fight the system of repression.

On the other hand, those in the military who refuse to be cannon fodder are finally realizing that they have always been used to repress other people's fight for freedom. They make an issue of everything, to the extent of using revolutionary violence against their own officers and their superiors.

Because of these violent acts inside penitentiaries and military establishments, the disillusioned prisoners and soldiers are taking their places within the revolutionary movement, while in the past they had been merely spectators. The situation in the prisons is totally ripe. It is developing in the army. We should then attend to insurrections, riots and violent incidents on a large scale. I would even say that we must attend to it at all times, perhaps even at this moment when I talk to you. This shows you the importance which must be given to this dimension within the movement.





Reference is made to San Prencisco airtel dated February 28, 1967, entitled "Stokely Carmichael, IS -Miscellaneous."

Airtel of reference advised that the captioned subject recently became a member of the editorial staff of "Remparts." It was further advised that Clouver, who is currently on parole after conviction of assault with intent to commit morder and assault with a deadly weapon, was being considered for assignment to accompany Carmichael abroad. was subsequently decided not to assign him for travel abroad in view of the possibility it might violate his perole.

A review of Bureau files regarding Cleaver reveals that he was identified during 1963 as one of the leaders of the Black Muslims in San Quentin Penitentiary.

It is desired that you review your indices and contact your informants to determine if this subject has reactivated himself in the affairs of the Nation of Islam or any other subversive movement to determine whether a security investigation should be initiated under current Bureau instructions. Advise Bureau of the results of your inquiries in this regard.

In the event there is not sufficient information to warrant a security investigation of this subject, you should submit his activities to date along with a description in a



Subject resides 407 Belvedere St. and is employed as a Staff Writer for "Ramparts" magazine, 301 Broadway, both addresses in San Francisco, California. Subject released from prison 12/12/66, and is on parole until 3/20/71. While in prison, Subject was a member of the Nation of Islam. Since his release on parole, he has spoken before groups sponsored by the "National Guardian", anti-Vietnam war organizations, militant Negro organizations, and has travelled with STOKELY CARMICHAEL of the Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee. He has written two articles for "Ramparts" magazine on Negro matters.

DETAILS:

I. BACKGROUND

Except as otherwise noted, all background information appearing in this section was obtained on May 1, 1967, from Region 2, San Francisco Work Unit 2, State of California Department of Corrections, 69 - 11th Street, San Francisco, California, hereinafter referred to as Department of Corrections. Other information appearing elsewhere in this report received from the Department of Corrections on May 1, 1967, will show the date the report was written rather than the date received by this office.

A. Birth

Subject was born August 31, 1935, to LERGY and THELMA ROBINSON CLEAVER in Little Rock, Arkansas.

B. Education

Subject left school at the age of 17, at which the highest grade reached was the eleventh.

Subject, while at San Quentin Prison, was enrolled in high school between 1958 and 1962. Average grade, "B-". Comment: "A good student with interest and cooperation".

Subject re-enrolled in high school courses from March, 1966, to October, 1966, and received an average grade of "D". Comment: "At first student did not work and was uninterested. Dringpast semester, he has improved much and has been a good student. Subject's leisure time is spent studying, reading, writing, painting and listening to the radio. He uses the library regularly".

The record indicated that he was a high school graduate since 1962 from San Quentin.

Subject was released on parole on December 12, 1966, to the supervision of the Department of Corrections.

II. ACTIVITIES IN CONNECTION-WITH SUBVERSIVE ORGANIZATIONS

A. Nation of Islam (NOI)

The NOI is characterized in the Appendix Section of this report.

Subject was very active in Muslim activities while at Folsom Prison. In fact, he was considered a leader in this. His Muslim activities have tapered off, and he has completely resolved himself (according to him) as a result of the demise of MALCOLM X.

Department of Corrections Report dated 10/20/66

MALCOLM X is characterized in the Appendix Section of this report under the caption Organization of Afro-American Unity, Incorporated (OAAU).

Since his incarceration, the Subject has been identified strongly with the Muslim movement. He admitted that he does not accept all of the Muslim tenets in its full scope but feels it is a useful tool for the Negro race in general.

Department of Corrections Report dated 9/18/63

The February, 1967, issue of "Ramparts" magazine contained an article entitled, "Prisons: The Muslims' Decline." As a prelude to this article, it was written, "The author, now a "Ramparts" Staff Writer, served eight years in various California prisons, where he was for a while a member of the Muslims".

The article appeared under the name of ELDRIDGE CLEAVER. He pointed out that at one time the Muslims had a very high concentration of adherence in such prisons as Soledad, San Quentin, and Folsom; but they are no longer taken seriously by prison officials. He cited the reasons for this decline as follows:

- 1. ALLAH has failed to come as promised to destroy the white devils and those blacks who were not Muslims.
- 2. The callous ouster and subsequent murder of MALCOLM X, who was the universal hero of black prisoners, by ELIJAH MUHAMMAD and the princes of the Nation of Islam in the upper echelons of the hierarchy.
- 3. Failure of the Nation of Islam to render any legal assistance to the Muslims behind the walls.

CLEAVER concluded his article by saying that what black inmates in prison now look to with rising hopes is the cry for Black Power and the elaboration of its details in the name of MALCOLM X.

Confidential informants, generally familiar with NOI activities in the San Francisco area, advised during May, 1967, that they know of no NOI activities on the part of CLEAVER.

On January 20, 1967, the "National Guardian" sponsored a forum at the YMCA, 1530 Buchanan Street, San Francisco, California. The forum was entitled "New Directions for the Afro-American Struggle". ELDRIDGE CLEAVER was the moderator of the program.

In his speech, CLEAVER stated that he had just returned from a tour with STOKELY CARMICHAEL for "Ramparts" magazine. He stated that it was his belief that CARMICHAEL was the most qualified person for a position of leadership and that he would follow him.

CLEAVER went on to state that certain white radicals felt that they were the most capable of exercising theoretical leadership in the civil rights movement. He stated that this is no longer true, that historical circumstance dictates that the Negro must be led in their struggle for black power by a Negro.

He stated that he felt that the time had come to stop working with the "system". The Democrats no longer have the Negro in their pockets. He felt that the machinery had to be set up to express the drive for black power outside the system, that black people now are the most radical element in society and should actually be leading the radical movement.

The April 3, 1967, issue of the "National Observer", a weekly national newspaper published in New York City, contained a feature article on "Ramparts" magazine, which announced that the magazine's publisher, EDWARD KEATING, had just recently accepted the George Polk Memorial Award for magazine reporting. It stated that the Polk Award came at the end of a year of journalistic coups and exposes that have made the outspoken left-wing magazine one of the most controversial and highly publicized in the country. This

article reported that "Ramparts" has only been published as a monthly for two and one-half years and is expected to reach a 250,000 circulation figure some time in 1967, at which figure it should publish without a loss. The "National Observer" article reported that the magazine had lost about \$2,000,000.00 to date, of which \$600,000.00 is EDWARD KEATING's.

The "National Observer" stated that "Ramparts" views include the following: Opposition to U.S. policy in Vietnam, a belief that the U.S. needs to change its attitude toward the cold war and Communism, dissatisfaction with domestic progress on civil rights, and the elimination of poverty.

At the forum sponsored by the "National Guardian" held at the YMCA on January 20, 1967, Subject stated that he favors an organization like that once headed by MALCOLM X called the OAAU.



The Spring Mobilization Committee to End the War In Vietnam (Spring

Mobilization Committee) was intended as a broad based demonstration against the war in Vietnam, which would be centered in New York and San Francisco on April 15, 1967. The appeal was directed to all persons opposed to the war, from all walks of life and political persuasions. In San Francisco, a parade began at lower Market Street and culminated with a rally at Kezar Stadium. About 55,000 persons assembled in the Stadium on that date.

Subject was scheduled to speak on "Anti-Draft" matters under the sponsorship of the SDS in Room 101, California Hall, University of California, Berkeley, at 7:00 p.m. on April 20, 1967.

The April, 1967, issue of "Ramparts" contained an article by Subject entitled, "My Father and Stokely Carmichael." This article contained very little about his father and concerned itself mostly with a day he spent with STOKELY CARMICHAEL in Chicago. Concluding his article, CLEAVER wrote that CARMICHAEL believes that the most important area outside the United States, as far as working alliances are concerned, is Latin America. He believes that within the next ten years the struggle for liberation from American domination throughout Latin America will provide black America with some very important and strong allies. CLEAVER went on to state that the Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee (SNCC) has already found an official, public alliance with the independence movement of Puerto Rico and that SNCC has agreed to throw its influence behind Puerto Rican Nationalists in their struggle for United Nations membership and recognition as a sovereign nation. In turn, the Puerto Rican Nationalists have committed themselves to an all out effort to raise the problem of black America

before the United Nations and to lobby unceasingly for support in this effort from the Afro-Asian bloc.

At the end of the article, the following appeared: "ELDRIDGE CLEAVER, formerly a member of the Black Huslims, is currently Chairman of the MALCOLM X Afro-American Society in the Bay Area."

The February 25, 1967, issue of the "Berkeley Barb", a weekly newspaper published in Berkeley, California, on page 1, carried an article captioned, "Armed Panthers Here--Black Power Joins Left," which stated in part that approximately 300 Berkeley High School students attended a rally on Tuesday noon (February 21, 1967) and that the rally had been held in spite of police threats to ban the meeting. This article stated further that ELDRIDGE CLEAVER, "Ramparts" Staff Writer and Chairman of the Bay Area Afro-American Unity Steering Committee, called for the building of MALCOLM X organizations "all over Black American Ghettos and territory." CLEAVER also reportedly stated, "If MALCOLM X can die, we can die. We are proud to be black and we don't hide behind our women. One day it will be Molotov cocktails; next, handgrenades and bullets. If we can't have our freedom then white America will die."

On the night of April 14, 1967, about 150 Negroes, mostly members of the Black Panther Party of San Francisco, met at 1711 Broderick Street, San Francisco, California. The meeting was spent mostly in conversation and drinking wine. Several references were made to the hatred for the white race. There was a stock pile of about 70 rifles at this location. No one was permitted in the basement as it was termed a restricted area.

In his speech, he devoted his time to drawing comparison between the White House and the black house. His remarks were generally derogatory of the present Administration in the White House in its treatment of Negroes who were represented by the black house. b2 b7D 4/20/67 The April 21, 1967, issue of the "Contra Costa Times," published in Walnut Creek, California, on page 1, contained an article captioned, "Armed Group Demands To See Sheriff Over Shooting," which stated in part as follows: "The quiet routine today in and around the County Administration Building in Martinez was shattered Thursday morning when four carloads of Negroes, some of them armed, pulled up and demanded to see Sheriff WALTER YOUNG. "Group spokesman, ELDRIDGE CLEAVER, Chairman of the Black House of San Francisco, told the 'Times' that the group wanted to discuss the hardnosed attitude of police in the Negro areas of the County, especially in the North Richmond area. "The group consisted of members of the Black House, the Black Panther Party for Self-Defense of Oakland, and relatives of a 22-year-old man who was shot and killed by a Sheriff's Deputy following a liquor store burglary in North Richmond, April 1, 1967." According to the article, the group wanted to discuss this incident with Sheriff YOUNG. "Several of them were armed with shotguns, rifles, and sidearms."

The May 3, 1967, issue of the "San Francisco Chronicle", page 1, continued on page 16, carried an article entitled, "Black Panthers Disrupt Assembly." The article stated that some 40 Negroes, "all armed with loaded rifles, shotguns, and pistols, and all members of the militantly anti-white Black Panther Party, stalked through the Capitol at noon yesterday." The article went on to say that a handfull walked into the Assembly Chamber while the house was in session, scuffled briefly with the Sergeant-at-Arms, and were hustled outside into the arms of the Capitol Police. They were reportedly demonstrating against "racist Oakland police" and protesting pending legislation limiting their right to bear arms.

The article stated that five juveniles and nine-teen young acults were taken to the Sacramento Police Station and charged with conspiracy to invade the Assembly Chambers, a felony. According to the article, Sacramento Police stated two other men were booked, one of whom was ELDRIDGE CLEAVER, 31, of 301 Broadway, San Francisco, "enroute to Parole Officer."

Department of Corrections, San Francisco, stated that Subject was arrested with the above-described group and charged with conspiracy to intimidate the Legislature, a felony. He stated that today, CLEAVER appeared in the Sacramento Municipal Court, where the charge against him was dropped.

On May 1, 1967, the Department of Corrections was contacted by "Ramparts" requesting permission for Subject to attend the meeting of the Legislature on May 2, 1967, as a reporter to cover the discussion on police and community relations. Early on May 2, Subject was granted this permission.

Upon the arrest of Subject, the attorneys for "Ramparts" charged that Subject was not a participant of this affair, was an observer with white reporters when he was arrested, the only one who had his camera broken, was

insulted by the police when he showed his press card, and discriminated against because he was a Negro. It is believed that "Ramparts" officials knew in advance that the Black Panthers planned to disrupt the Legislature on May 2, 1967.

On April 3, 1966, a source advised that Muhammad's Temple of Islam No. 26 was first established in the San Francisco - Oakland. California. Bay Area in late 1956.

The source reported that Temple No. 26, also known as Muhammad's Mosque No. 26, is the official headquarters of the Nation of Islam in Northern California and has, since its inception in 1956, been affiliated with the National Headquarters of the Nation of Islam in Chicago, Illinois, under ELIJAH MUHAMMAD.

APPENDIX

MUSLIM MOSQUE, INCORPORATED (MMI)

The March 13, 1964, edition of "The New York Times," a daily newspaper published in New York, New York, contained an article on page 20 which indicated that MALCOLM X (LITTLE), former national official of the Nation of Islam (NOI) who broke with the NOI on March 8, 1964, publicly announced in New York City on March 12, 1964, that he had formed the Muslim Mosque, Incorporated (MMI). The MMI, according to the article, would be a broadly based politically oriented black nationalist movement for Negroes, only, financed by voluntary contributions. In this public statement, MALCOLM X urged Negroes to abandon the doctrine of non-violence when it is necessary to defend themselves in the civil rights struggle, and he also suggested that Negroes form rifle clubs to protect their lives and property in time of emergencies in areas where the government is unable or unwilling to protect them.

Incorporation papers of the MMI filed on March 16, 1964, with the Business Section, Clerk of Courts, New York County, New York, reflect that the MMI was incorporated under the Religious Corporation Law of the State of New York to work for the imparting of the Islamic Faith and Islamic Religion in accordance with "accepted Islamic principals." The principal place of worship to be located in the Borough of Manhattan, New York, New York.

The May 23, 1964, edition of the "New York Amsterdam News", a weekly Negro newspaper published in New York City, contained an article by columnist JAMES BOOKER in which he indicated that he had heard that the visit by MALCOLM X with Muslim leaders during his African tour has changed him to become soft in his anti-white feelings and to become more religious.

On October 6, 1964, a confidential source advised that the MMI is apparently affiliated with the true orthodox Islamic Religion through its affiliation with the Islamic Foundation (of New York), 1 Riverside Drive, New York City. The only teachings of the MMI are on the Islamic Religion.

APPENDIX

This confidential source advised on May 17, 1965, that the headquarters of the MMI are located in Suite 128, Hotel Theresa, 2090 Seventh Avenue, New York, New York, where they were established on March 16, 1964. These headquarters are shared with the Organization of Afro-American Unity, Incorporated (OAAU) which was also headed by MALCOLM X.

MALCOLM X was assassinated on February 21, 1965, while addressing an OAAU rally at the Audubon Ballroom, Broadway and 166th Street, New York City.

This same confidential source advised on September 8, 1965, that the activities of the MMI following the death of MALCOLM X were limited to the teaching of classes in the Islamic religion and a class in judo for self-protection. These classes were held regularly until the latter part of July, 1965, when they were discontinued. Since then, the MMI has held no meetings and there has been absolutely no activity by the MMI which appears to be completely "dead."

NATION OF ISLAM, Formerly referred to as the MuSlim Cult of Islam, also known as Muhammad's Temples of Islam

In January, 1957, a source advised ELIJAH MUHAMMAD has described his organization on a nationwide basis as the "Nation of Islam" and "Muhammad's Temples of Islam."

On April 29, 1966, a second source advised ELIJAH MUHAMMAD is the national leader of the Nation of Islam (NOI); Muhammad's Temple of Islam No. 2, 5335 South Greenwood Avenue, Chicago, Illinois, is the national headquarters of the NOI; and in mid-1960 MUHAMMAD and other NOI officials, when referring to MUHAMMAD's organization on a nationwide basis, commenced using either "Mosque" or "Temple" when mentioning one of "Muhammad's Temples of Islam."

The NOI is an all-Negro organization which was originally organized in 1930 in Detroit, Michigan. MUHAMMAD claims to have been selected by Allah, the Supreme Being, to lead the so-called Negro race out of slavery in the wilderness of North America by establishing an independent black nation in the United States. Members following MUHAMMAD's teachings and his interpretation of the "Koran" believe there is no such thing as a Negro; that the so-called Negroes are slaves of the white race, referred to as "white devils," in the United States; and that the white race, because of its exploitation of the so-called Negroes, must and will be destroyed in the approaching "War of Armageddon."

In the past, officials and members of the NOI, including MUHAMMAD, have refused to register under the provisions of the Selective Service Acts and have declared that members owe no allegiance to the United States.

On May 5, 1958, the first source advised MUHAMMAD had, upon advice of legal counsel, tempered his personal statements and instructions to his ministers concerning the principles of his organization in order to avoid possible prosecution by the United States Government; however, he did not indicate any fundamental changes in the teachings of his organization.

On May 2, 1966, a third source advised MUHAMMAD had, early in July, 1958, decided to de-emphasize the religious aspects of the teachings of Islam and to stress the economic benefits to be derived by those Negroes who joined the NOI. This policy change, according to MUHAMMAD, would help him acquire additional followers and create more interest in his programs.

"NATIONAL GUARDIAN"

The Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications, revised and published December 1, 1961, prepared and released by the Committee on Un-American Activities, United States House of Representatives, contains the following on Page 193 concerning "National Guardian:"

1. "established by the American Labor Party in 1947 as a 'progressive' weekly ***. Although it denies having any affiliation with the Communist Party, it has manifested itself from the beginning as a virtual official propaganda arm of Soviet Russia."

(Committee on Un_American Activities, Report, Trial by Treason: The National Committee to Secure Justice for the Rosenbergs and Morton Sobell, August 25, 1956, p. 12.)

ORGANIZATION OF AFRO-AMERICAN UNITY, INCORPORATED (OAAU)

On June 28, 1964, MALCOLM X LITTLE, founder and leader of the Muslim Mosque, Incorporated (MMI), publicly announced the formation of a new, all Negro, militant civil rights action group to be known as the Organization of Afro-American Unity (OAAU), with himself as Chairman. This announcement was made at a public rally held by the MMI in the Audubon Ballroom, Broadway and 166th Street, New York City.

A printed and published statement of basic OAAU aims read by MALCOLM X at this meeting indicates that it shall include "all" people of African descent in the Western Hemisphere, as well as "our" brothers and sisters on the African continent. It is patterned after the "letter and spirit" of the Organization of African Unity established (by African heads of States) at Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, in May, 1963.

A recording of the remarks of MALCOLM X at this meeting indicates that the aim of the OAAU is to eliminate differences between Negroes so they can work together for "human rights," while the initial objective is to "internationalize" the American civil rights movement by taking it to the United Nations. LITTLE condemned the non-violent civil rights movement and claims that Negroes should be taught to protect themselves, when and if necessary. The OAAU will sponsor a program for Negroes of education, politics, culture, economics and social reform.

MALCOLM X was assassinated on February 21, 1965, while addressing an OAAU rally at the Audubon Ballroom, New York City.

On February 28, 1966, a confidential source advised that the president and head of the OAAU is ELLA COLLINS, a half-sister of the late MALCOLM X, who resides in Boston, Massachusetts.

On April 12, 1966, the same confidential source advised that the headquarters of the OAAU are located in Suite 128, Hotel Theresa, 2090 Seventh Avenue, New York City.

On April 13, 1965, a second confidential source advised that on March 26, 1965, the OAAU filed a Certificate of Incorporation with the Department of State, State of New York, Albany, New York, and henceforth the organization's true name will be Organization of Afro-American Unity, Incorporated.

PROGRESSIVE LABOR PARTY

A source advised on April 20, 1965, that the Progressive Labor Party (PLP), formerly known as the Progressive Labor Movement (PLM), held its first national convention April 15-18, 1965, at New York City, to organize the PLM into a PLP. The PLP will have as its ultimate objective the establishment of a militant working class movement based on Marxism-Leninism.

The "New York Times" City Edition, Tuesday, April 20, 1965, page 27, reported that a new party of "revolutionary socialism" was formally founded on April 18, 1965, under the name of the PLP. The PLP was described as an outgrowth of the FLM. Its officers were identified as MILTON ROSEN, New York, President, and WILLIAM EPTON of New York, and MORT SCHEER of San Francisco, Vice Presidents. A 20-member National Committee was elected to direct the party until the next convention.

According to the article, "The Progressive Labor Movement was founded in 1962 by Mr. ROSEN and Mr. SCHEER after they were expelled from the Communist Party of the United States for assertedly following the Chinese Communist line".

The PLP publishes "Progressive Labor", a bi-monthly magazine, "Challenge," a bi-weekly New York City newspaper, and "Spark," a West Coast newspaper.

The June 1, 1965, issue of "Challenge," page 6, states that "this paper is dedicated to fight for a new way of life where the working men and women own and control their homes, factories, the police, courts, and the entire government on every level."

The source advised that the PLP utilizes the address of General Post Office Box 808, Brooklyn 1, New York, but also utilizes an office in Room 622, 132 Nassau Street, New York City, where PLP publications are prepared.

STUDENTS FOR A DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY

The Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), as it is known today, came into being at a founding convention held at Port Huron, Michigan, in June, 1962. The SDS is an association of young people on the left and has a current program of protesting the draft, promoting a campaign for youth to develop a conscientious objector status, denouncing United States intervention in the war in Vietnam and to "radically transform" the university community, and provide for its complete control by students. Gus Hall, General Secretary, Communist Party, USA, when interviewed by a representative of United Press International in San Francisco, California, on May 14, 1965, described the SDS as a part of the "responsible left" which the Party has "going for us". At the June, 1965, SDS National Convention, an anticommunist proviso was removed from the SDS constitution. In the October 7, 1966, issue of "New Left Notes," the official publication of SDS, an SDS spokesman stated that there are some communists in SDS and they are welcome. national headquarters of this organization as of April 18, 1967, was located in Room 206, 1608 West Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois.



SUBJECT: Black Nationalist Movement in the United States; Racial Matters ((BPPSD)

Reference is made to your teletype of February 18, 1968, containing information concerning the BPPSD rally at Oakland, Californta, on February 17th. Your teletype noted that Leroy Eldridge Cleaver announced a merger of the BPPSD and the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee (SNCC). Your teletype also stated that various individuals made a number of statements as follows:

> JAMES FORMAN, International Director of SNCC, said reprisals must be taken for the assassination of any black leader.

ROBERT AVAKIAN, a representative of the Peace and Freedom Party, expressed support for the Negro revolution in the United States.

H. RAP BROWN, newly appointed Minister of Justice of EPPSD, and Chairman of SNCC, stated that black warfare inside this country would answer the problem of Negro unemployment.

BOBBY GEORGE SEALE, Chairman of BPPSD, urged all Negro families to have shotguns in their homes to remove and nullify the occupying army of police officers in the black communities.

STOKELY CARMICHAEL, presented as the Prime Minister of the Afro-America to all Africans throughout the world asserted that all blacks must unite socially, economically and militarily in order to avoid extermination by Whites.

Reference is also made to your teletype of February 19, 1968, containing information concerning the Black Congress program at Los Angeles on February 18th. This teletype also

advised that various statements were made by a number of individuals as follows:

JAMES FORMAN said every Negro should be armed due to the eventual revolution of black people.

BOBBY GEORGE SEALE urged all Negro families to have shotguns in their homes and stated that black power is gun and force which will be used in the next Civil War.

RONALD EVERETT McKINLEY, aka RON KARENGA, Chairman, Black Nationalist Organization "US" said "the Whites are our enemy and we must organize to overcome them."

H. RAP BROWN stated that there would be a Negro revolution in the United States and that is not a "political revolution." He allegedly predicted a battle similar to the Civil War within the next few years.

STOKELY CARMICHAEL reiterated his remark that all blacks must unite socially, economically and militarily.

Sections 2383, 2384 and 2385, respectively, of Title 18, United States Code, proscribe the crimes of rebellion or insurrection, seditious conspiracy and advocating the violent overthrow of the United States Government or the government of any political subdivision thereof. While the statements attributed to the foregoing speakers ostensibly are aimed at uniting Negroes for the purpose of obtaining their rights, the violation of one or more of the mentioned statutes is implicit in these statements. We would therefore appreciate receiving, on a continuing basis, all information indicating a conspiracy on the part of the named individuals and organizations to violate one or more of these statutes.

Reference is made to San Francisco, California memorandum dated March 15, 1968.

Copies of this memorandum are being furnished to the Army, Navy, OSI, Secret Service, and the United States Attorney's Office.

The March 20, 1968, issue of the "San Francisco Chronicle," San Francisco, California, daily newspaper, page 3, columns 5-7, contains an article captioned, "Panther's New Gun Build-Up," which states in part as follows:

"The militant Black Panther Party for Self Defense is forming an extensive arsenal and recently acquired 65 pistols from a Reno store, police officers charged yesterday....

"In addition, police said, there has been a sharp increase in the number of rifles and shotguns - which do not need to be registered - throughout the East Bay."

at 5:00 p.m. on that date, Bobby George Seale, Chairman of the Black Panther Party, also known as Black Panther Party for Self-Defense, held a press conference at the St. Augustine's Episcopal Church, 27th and West Streets, Oakland, California. At this press conference, Seale denied that the BPP is building arsenals of weapons but readily admitted that the BPP was distributing weapons to black people so that they could have these in their homes for the defense against attacks by racists. Seale further stated that he could not understand why there was such an uproar about Negroes possessing guns while members of the white community were allowed to possess guns without any protests being made.

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At the March 16, 1968, session of the Peace and Freedom Party State Convention, held at the Richmond Auditorium, Richmond, California, Eldridge Cleaver, Minister of Information, BPP, gave a speech inwhich he read from a document entitled, "Black Paper - Revolution in the White Mother Country and National Liberation in the Black Colony." Excerpts from his speech are set forth as follows:

"The Black Panther Party believes that the era in which we now struggle can be characterized as the Age of Showdown - between Oppressed People Everywhere and the Racist Imperial Power Structure. The era can be further defined as that in which significant sectors of the exploiters have turned away from the system, have declared war upon the system that has warped their lives and tainted their existence at the same time that it was doing the same thing and worse to those whom it oppresses. We recognize these alienated people as allies or potential allies in a struggle against a common enemy.

"We start with the basic definition: that black people in America are a colonized people in every sense of the term and that white America is an organized

imperialist force holding black people in colonial bondage. From this definition, our task becomes clearer: what we need is a revolution in the white mother contry and national liberation for the black colony....

"Ideally, we need a revolutionary organization that is able to, guided by revolutionary ideology and comprehending the necessity involved, move in two directions at the same time....

"The Black Panther Party and the Peace and Freedom Party in the Bay Area (San Francisco, Alameda, and Contra Costa Counties, California) have been experimenting over the past few months with a very narrow coalition around a very broad subject. The focal point of the coalition is now, and always been, the case of Huey P. Newton, Minister of Defense, Creator and Leader of the Black Panther Party. Although the coalition has been narrow and limited, tentative and viewed with mutual suspicion, it has in fact unleashed political forces with explosive local impact and national implications....

"We have offered our leader, Minister of Defense Huey P. Newton, as a candidate for the 7th Congressional District of Alameda County, and we have offered our Chairman, Bobby Seale, as a candidate for the 17th Assembly District. In San Francisco, we have offered our communications secretary, Kathleen Cleaver, for a candidate in the 18th Assembly District. The advantages in doing this are manifold. First and foremost, we are interested in setting Huey P. Newton free."

Also at this session of the Peace and Freedom Party Convention, Richmond, California, Eldridge Cleaver presented specific proposals which were adopted. These included the following:

"That the Peace and Freedom Party join with the Black Panther Party and the 'Stop the Draft Week' Organizers and participate in the 'Stop the Draft Week"demonstrations, April 26-30, 1968, to focus attention and to supply pressure on the demands that the troops of the power structure be withdrawn from Vietnam and from the Black Colony.

"That the Peace and Freedom Party support the Black Community's demand that those who police the Black Communities must live in the Black Communities."

The Peace and Freedom Party also adopted the motions on the free Huey P. Newton issue from the Minority Liberation Workshop, but amended the motion, "Huey Newton must be set free by any means necessary," to read to the effect that Huey Newton must be set free by any means best suited for the cause of Negro liberation.

Also at the March 16, 1968, session of the Peace and Freedom Convention, Bobby George Seale, in the capacity of Chairman of the BPP, gave a short talk in which he stated that the BPP was acting independently but was interested in supporting the Peace and Freedom Party on a coalition basis for the purpose of providing Negro liberation. He stressed the fact that the BPP will always concentrate their efforts on their own problems.

At the Peace and Freedom Convention, Richmond, California, Robert Avakian presented a proposal entitled, "Support the April Days" which was prepared by Avakian and Steve Hamilton of the Peace and Freedom Movement Radical Caucus, Contra Costa County, California. This proposal, which was passed by the convention, reads in part as follows:

"The next proposed 'Stop the Draft Week,' April 26-30, provides the Peace and Freedom Movement with a very important opportunity to involve itself in serious, radical action against the draft and Vietnam war and the military (police) occupation of the Black Community. Members of PFM are already working with STDW and have urged that the April demonstrations adopt a duel political focus: end the draft, withdraw the troops from Vietnam; free Huey, and the occupation of the ghettoes. This means

that not just the induction center (and perhaps the Oakland Army Terminal) but the City Hall, the Oakland Police Station, and the Alameda County Courthouse would be targets for the demonstrations. The object will be to raise 1,000 or more people at the entrance to these buildings with the intention of closing them down for the day since the operations inside are criminal. (The courthouse, for example, is where Huey Newton and the leaders of the last STDW were indicted by a stacked grand jury; Huey is still held prisoner in the courthouse jail.) Selection of several targets all in downtown Oakland, but far enough apart to prevent the police from concentrating their force in one central area - will automatically spread out the police, thin their lines of attack and greatly increase the problems of coordination and communication for them....

"Already, there are very strong indications from Panthers themselves that if support for black liberation and free Huey is raised as an equal demand with self determination for the Vietnamese and resistance to the draft, they will organize the black people from all over the Bay Area to actively participate in the April demonstrations."

At this convention, Eldridge Cleaver indicated that BPP would conduct demonstrations at the Alameda County Courthouse, Oakland, and at the Oakland Police Department during the April 26-30, 1968, "Stop the Draft Week" demonstrations, but would not actively participate at the Oakland induction center.

A characterization of the Black Panther Party for Self-Defense is included in the appendix pages attached hereto.

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BLACK PANTHER PARTY FOR SELF-DEFENSE (BPPSD)

A source advised that the Black Panther Party For Self-Defense (BPPSD) was formed by HUEY PERCY NEWTON, Minister of Defense, and BOBBY GEORGE SEALE, Chairman, in Oakland, California, in December, 1966, as a militant black nationalist political organization to combat "police brutality," to unite militant black youth, to determine the destiny of black communities, and to educate black people in African history. The political philosophy of the organization was taken from the writings of MAO TSE-TUNG of Communist China and black militant writers.

The official BPPSD publication "The Black Panther - Black Community News Service" indicates the leadership of the BPPSD advocates the use of guns and guerilla tactics in the violent revolutionary program to end oppression and to oppose the drafting of black men to fight in Vietnam.

A second source advised that in early 1967, SEALE, NEWTON, and their associates carried carbine rifles and holstered pistols in plain view on the streets of Oakland and elsewhere while on "defense patrols."

BOBBY GEORGE SEALE was one of the persons arrested by the Sacramento, 'California Police Department on May 2, 1967, when members of the BPPSD invaded the California State Legislative Assembly in Sacramento while in session, carrying loaded guns to protest restrictions on the carrying of guns.

A Grand Jury of Alameda County, California, Oakland, California, on November 13, 1967, indicted HUEY PERCY NEWTON on charge of murder of an Oakland, California police officer on October 28, 1967, in Oakland, California.

The first source advised that the headquarters office of the BPPSD at 5624 Grove Street, Oakland, California, is closed and that no membership meetings have been held since August, 1967.

The November 4, 1967, issue of "The Sun Reporter," a San Francisco, California Negro community newspaper, states that a HUEY PERCY NEWTON defense fund has been established and that the Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee (SNCC) and the Congress on Racial Equality (CORE) through the national offices have pledged their complete and continuous support to the defense of HUEY PERCY NEWTON.

This information is desired for investigative leads. Cleaver is Minister of Information of the Black Panther Party, a black nationalist extremist organization, in Oakland, California. He has gained recent notoriety as the author of a book, "Soul on Ice," which expresses his antiwhite, black nationalist views. Cleaver was released from prison in 12/66 after serving eight years of a fourteen-year sentence for assault with intent to murder. He became a staff writer for "Ramparts" magazine and became active in the Black Panther Party. He is presently in jail and is charged with violation of parole and attempted murder, a result of a gun battle between Black Panther Party members and the Oakland, California, police on 4/27/68. In connection with our intensive investigations of black nationalist leaders, we are attempting to determine their sources of income. If the returns show payments from the Black Panther Party to these leaders, it may assist in determining the funds which have been available to the Black Panther Party. We anticipate that because of the irresponsibility of these leaders, some will not have filed income tax returns, or may have falsified them, in which event we will, of course, see that prosecution for any such violation is pushed, which will serve to have an adverse affect on their activities. Judge Tells State to Free Cleaver

Eldridge Cleaver, minister of information of the Black Panther party, was ordered released from prison yesterday by a judge who said he was being held because of his "political activities."

Cleaver, a 33-year-old hindering attorneys' preparawriter and militant black leader, has been in custody since April 6 at the California Medical Facility in on parole from an earlier asvacaville.

He was charged with violation of parole and taken to the facility after an hourslong gun battle between Panthers, including Cleaver, and a squad of Oakland police officers.

WOUNDED

Cleaver was wounded in the battle.

Before he can actually, be freed, however, Cleaver, must post \$50,000 in bail or an assault charge stemming from the April 6 Oakland shootout.

His attorney, Charles Garry, said efforts were being made by the Black Panthers to raise the bail, and that it was possible Cleaver might be released today.

ORDER

The order for Cleaver's release came from Superior Court Judge Raymond J. Sherwin of Solano county, and it followed a four-hour hearing Monday on a petition for release through writ of habeas corpus.

The petition was filed by Garry, who contended that Cleaver was being held because of his association with the militant Panthers. Garry further contended that imprisonment of Cleaver was hindering attorneys' preparation for the assault trial.

The California Adult Authority maintained that Cleaver, on parole from an earlier assault conviction, had violated his parole by possessing a gun, by associating with individuals of bad reputation, and by failing to cooperate with his parole officer.

In ruling for Cleaver, Judge Sherwin said:

status stemmed from no failwe of personal rehabilitation, but from his undue eloquence in pursuing his political goals, goals which were offensive to many of his contemporaries.

"Not only was there absence of cause for cancellation of the parole, it was the product of a type of pressure unbecoming, to say the least, to the law enforcement of this state."

During the Monday inquiry, Deputy Attorney General Edward O'Brien argued that the State had a right to hold Cleaver simply on the report of violation until a final hearing on revocation could take place.

OBrien said that an appeal of Judge Sherwin's decision would be made with the state District Court of Appeals.

Cleaver is the author of "Soul on Ice", an account of his life and prison experiences. During his stay at Vacaville, Cleaver announced that he would seek the Peace and Freedom party's nomination to run for the presidency.

His wife, Kathleen, was a write-in candidate for the Assembly in the June 4 primary election.

The June 13, 1968, four star final issue of "The San Francisco Chronicle," a newspaper published daily in San Francisco, California, bears headline which reads, "Top Panther Freed." The article which follows the headline is captioned "See-Saw Battle to Free Cleaver" and velates essentially the same information concerning the background of Cleaver's case as the article included above. In addition, it reports the results of a press conference given by CLEAVER in his San Francisco attorney's office at 5:00 p.m. on June 12, 1968.

The article reads in part as follows:

"Asked about the fued between the Black Panthers and the Oakland Police, Cleaver said:

"'I expect to see the Oakland police department ... cave in any day now.'

"He said he failed to understand how a community that large and diverse could continue to tolerate such a 'brutal' police chief as Chief Charles Gain.

"Nor, said Cleaver, could be understand how the community could tolerate such a 'racist' police department as Oakland's.

"'I expect to see them kick him (Chief Gain) out. That has to happen,' Cleaver said.

"Cleaver told representatives of the mass media gathered in Garry's book-lined library that he doesn't intend to hide and that he will stand up for his rights if he is bothered by police.

"He was asked about the April 6 shoot-out and his part in it.

"'My part in that, he replied without hesitation, was ducking police bullets.'"

The article continues stating: "Yesterday, Judge Sherwin told The Chronicle he set the bail on the parole

It is being recommended that information concerning the subject and a speech he gave on 6/14/68 before a clergymen's conference in Stockton, California, be furnished to the Crime/ Records Division for possible referral to a news contact.

BACKGROUND:

The subject is a convicted rapist who was released on parole in 1966 after serving eight years of a 14 year sentence in California penitentiaries. He became a leader of the Black Panther Party of Oakland, California, the most violent black nationalist extremist group in the United States. His parole was revoked after his arrest on 4/6/68 when he participated in a 90 minute gun battle between Black Panther members and the Oakland, California police, during which he was wounded. He was freed on 6/12/68 by a California judge who claimed Cleaver's parole had been revoked because of "political activities." He is free under \$50,000 bond on a charge of assault to commit murder arising from the 4/6/68 gun battle.

DETAILS:

On 6/14/68 Cleaver was paid \$500 to speak at a conference on urban unrest held during the annual Northern California-Nevada conference of the United Methodist Church at the University of the Pacific, Stockton, California. replaced U. Cleaver is reported to have used profanity during his speech to the ministers and spoke about the necessity for violence. He described the police as "an occupying army." A police department source said the ministers gave Cleaver a standing ovation at the conclusion of his speech.

Cleaver shared the platform with Dr. Grover Bagby, Associate General Secretary of the Methodist Board of Social Concerns in Washington, D. C., who was quoted as stating, "America is in for revolution of its entire social fabricor destruction," and "There is all too heavy an infiltration of racist and authoritarian elements into police forces." He hit at the lack of outside authority to look into police operations.

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OBSERVATIONS:

The complete inappropriateness of using a person as disreputable as Cleaver to speak at a religious gathering, the shocking example of ministers applauding his statements, and the verbal attack on the police by Bagby are matters which should be referred to a friendly news source for appropriate editorial comment.

RLDRIEGE CLEAVER

The June 14, 1968, issue of the "Stockton Record," a daily newspaper of general circulation, Stockton, California, contained an article setting forth that on the evening of June 14, 1968, Eldridge Cleaver would address a symposium on urban unrest at the University of the Pacific (UOP), sponsored by the Northern California - Nevada Conference of the United Methodist Church. The article described him as the Minister of Education for the Black Panther Party and further stated he would share the platform with Grover Bagby of Washington, D. C., Associate General Secretary of the Methodist Board of Social Concerns. Cleaver was to be the replacement for another speaker who had canceled his speech due to illness. The article further stated that Reverend Cecil Williams, a Negro Minister of Glide Methodist Church, San Francisco, California, helped arrange Cleaver's appearance.

The UOP administration reportedly was not aware that Cleaver was to speak on campus until the morning of June 14, 1968. His speech was a last minute arrangement made by the Methodist Conference. It is understood that Cleaver was to be paid \$500 for the appearance.

A member of the audience advised that Cleaver used some profanity in one portion of his speech and spoke about the necessity of violence. He stated the ministers attending the speech gave Cleaver a standing ovation at the conclusion of his speech.

The June 15, 1968, issue of the "Stockton Record" contained an article pertaining to Cleaver's speech. article says Cleaver told the assembly that the black men would use any means to get their share of America's affluence and further stated his organization would be going to Stockton. The newspaper stated further that:

"The theme of 'police brutality' dominated his talk. Other speakers on the discussion of urban unrest also voiced concern over law enforcement as it exists today.

"At the close of the program Cleaver said the Black Panthers, a militant Oakland Negro power group, will establish a chapter in Stockton.

"Cleaver described police in the United States as 'an occupying army, controlled from the white suburbs."

"The first step in getting equality for black people is to expel this army, he said.

"'We are not going to accept any fast shuffles or undue delays,' Cleaver said.

"'If we can't have it, you can't either,' he told the predominantly white audience.

"Cleaver repeatedly raised the specter of violence by black people in getting their objectives, but drew applause when he said at one point:

"'We must stop killing black people; we must stop killing brown people; we must stop killing yellow people; we must stop killing people.'

"Dr. Grover Bagby, associate general secretary of the Methodist Board of Social Concerns in Washington, D. C., said that "America is in for revolution of its entire social fabric-or destruction."

"There is all too heavy an infiltration of racist and authoritarian elements into police forces, Dr. Bagby said.

CLEAVER resides at 2500 Filbert Street, San Francisco, California, and is employed as a senior editor for "Ramparts" at 301 Broadway, San Francisco, California. He was

He has held positions of "Editor" and San Francisco Branch Captain of the Black Panther Party (BPP) and is presently Minister of Information of that organization. He has attended at least seven meetings and numerous public rallies of the BPP in period from 6/8/67 to 2/25/68, several at which he spoke. He spoke as a representative of the BPP at several YSA-SWP sponsored forums. Since his parole on 12/12/66, from an assault to commit murder conviction, he has been arrested on two occasions; once on 5/2/67 when several members of the BPP were arrested as a result of an armed appearance in the California State Legislature at Sacramento, California (charge later dismissed) and once on 4/6/68, for assault with intent to commit murder when he and several members of the BPP had a shoot-out with the Oakland Police Department, Oakland, California. His parole was revoked on 4/7/68, but the revocation was adjudged without merit and he was ordered released on 6/11/68. CLEAVER then posted \$50,000 bail on the 4/6/68 shoot-out charge and trial on this charge is pending. Statements attributable to him by the press and other sources are set out. In view of Subject's arrest in Oakland, California on 4/6/68 as a result of a shoot-out with the Oakland Police Department, SUBJECT SHOULD BE CONSIDERED ARMED AND DANGEROUS.

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DETAILS:

I. BACKGROUND

A. Residence and Employment

The Subject resides at 2500 Filbert Street, San Francisco, California and is employed as a Senior Editor for "Ramparts" at 301 Broadway, San Francisco, California.

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"RAMPARTS"

"Ramparts" is a monthly magazine with editorial offices in San Francisco, California. The January, 1968, issue listed WARREN HINCKLE, III, as Editor, and ROBERT SCHEER as Managing Editor. It stated that the press run for that issue was 279,000.

The September 10, 1967, issue of the "Denver Post" contained an article on "Ramparts," based upon an interview of its staff by EARL SHORIS, author of the article. This article captioned, "Ramparts: An expression of the 'New Left,'" read in part as follows:

"HINCKLE calls Ramparts 'radical in style and politics.' It belongs to the left, if not the new left....

"The editors of Ramparts are confident of their own virtue, so confident they are able to dispense with objectivity.... Editor HINCKLE said, 'I don't believe in this "on the other hand" stuff. People write in and ask us to print the other side. We tell them no we are not a debating society....'

"Ramparts has been crass and commercial. It has often been more exhortative than informative, but it has also produced some exciting reporting on Vietnam, the city of Oakland, and conservation or the lack of it in America. The magazine joined every other publication in America in belaboring the Warren Report, but SOL STERN's uncloaking of the CIA was brilliant, effective reporting. If Ramparts may have overstated the number of children who have been casualities in Vietnam, it is small criticism; children have been burned and killed.

"The financial problems that have plagued Ramparts for most of its five years may be coming to an end. With 120,000 subscribers and as many newsstand sales, the cost of printing has dropped...."

C. Appearances as a Representative of the BPP

A flyer captioned "Socialist Calendar", distributed by the Young Socialist Alliance (YSA) during May of 1967, announced the Subject would speak on May 4, 1967, on "The Last Year of Malcolm X" at 55 Colton Street, San Francisco, California, under auspices of the YSA.

A characterization of the YSA and Socialist Workers Party (SWP) appear in the Appendix.

MALCOLM X is characterized in the Appendix section under the caption of Organization of Afro-American Unity, Incorporated, and Muslim Mosque, Incorporated. Characterizations of those organizations and the Nation of Islam are included in the Appendix.

An article appearing in the May 22, 1967, issue of "The Militant", the weekly newspaper of the SWP captioned "S.F. Symposium on Malcolm Book" reads in part as follows:

"The development of the ideas of Malcolm X was the subject of a Militant Labor Forum held here on Thursday, May 4.

"The speakers were George Novack, Marxist scholar, and Eldridge Cleaver. Cleaver is a staff writer for 'Ramparts' magazine, and chairman of the Black House, a center for militant Afro-Americans in San Francisco.

"The discussion centered around 'The Last Year of Malcolm X: The Evolution of a Revolutionary,' the recently published book by George Breitman.


"Cleaver praised the book for taking a vast amount of material--speeches, statements, interviews--and organizing it so as to clarify the development of Malcolm's ideas... While in prison, Cleaver had gone along with the Malcolm faction at the time of the split (with Nation of Islam).

"'Waiting on salvation paralyzes, Cleaver said.
'The Black Muslims captured a lot of energy—
the energy of black militants—but they
focused it in the hereafter. Malcolm's
break focused that energy in the here and now.
He no longer carried the message
down the pipeline from Allah to Elijah
Muhammad to himself.'"

Militant Labor Forum is the name used by the YSA and SWP to sponsor its public meetings.

ELIJAH MUHAMMAD is the leader of the Nation of Islam (NOI) a characterization of which appears in the Appendix.

The Subject spoke at a YSA sponsored public forum at 55 Colton Street, San Francisco, California on May 4, 1967. He discussed the arrest of BPP members who had made an armed appearance at the California State Capitol in Sacramento, California on May 2, 1967, and appealed for funds to be used for the legal defense of those arrested. He stated that he was unable to speak well on his scheduled topic "The Last Year of Malcolm X" due to his recent arrest in Sacramento and his inability to prepare.




Subject is scheduled to speak at noon on the lower plaza at the University of California, Berkeley, California on May 10, 1967, as a representative of the BPP. This appearance is sponsored by the YSA.

Subject and BOBBY SEALE appeared as BPP representatives and spoke at a YSA forum held at 2338 Market Street, San Francisco, California on January 5, 1968. At this forum the Subject said that a person cannot support TROTSKY or LENIN and support HUEY NEWTON. He said the black people are in colonies within a mother country. When asked what form he would like to see this country in, he could not answer and appeared to have no program for actual change.



The Subject appeared and spoke as a representative of the BPP at a Militant Labor Forum at 2338 Market Street, San Francisco, California, on January 5, 1968. The Subject told of how when he got out of jail he searched for an organization to identify himself with. He checked into many, but when he found the BPP he knew he had found the ultimate and that there was no place to go from there. He stated that he regarded both NEWTON and SEALE as completely unselfish people and mentioned that he had been a great admirer of MALCOLM X who he said rightly abandoned praying to Allah to pick up the gun. He referred to STOKELY CARMICHAEL as their international ambassador. He also spoke of the oppression of the black people and of how they built this country so that the white man could live well.



on January 11, 1968, also reported the Subject's appearance at the Militant Labor Forum on January 5, 1968.

An article captioned "Panthers to Defend Newton in Noon Rally" appeared in the January 23, 1968, issue of "The Pioneer", The California State College at Hayward school newspaper. This article reads in part as follows:

SF 100-55520 FL:JL "Who is Huey P. Newton? "Two officials of the Black Panther Society for Self-Defense will answer that question Thursday noon in MA 1055. "Bobby Seale, Chairman of the party, and Eldridge Cleaver, Minister of Information, will speak on the topic of Huey Newton, Panther Defense Minister, who is presently being tried for the murder of an Oakland policeman... "The Thursday event is being sponsored jointly by Students for a Democratic Society and the Black Student Union." A characterization of Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) appears in the Appendix. The Black Student Union (BSU) is a militant black nationalist organization formed on numerous college campuses throughout the country. An article appearing in the March 1, 1968, issue of the "San Francisco Sunday Examiner" and "Chronicle" captioned "Berkeley Professors Seek to Block Pro-Viet Cong Rally" reads in part as follows: "A number of irate University of California professors are preparing to seek a court injunction tomorrow morning to head off a pro-Viet Cong rally scheduled for Pauley Ballroom on the Berkeley campus tomorrow night... - 11 -

"The announced program included 'songs and music from revolutionary Vietnam' and features a number of speakers, some with Communist or militant backgrounds.

"They include. . . Eldridge Cleaver and Bobby Seale, leaders in the militant Black Panther movement."

D. Other BPP Activities

Alameda County Sheriff's Office, Oakland, California, advised that HUEY NEWTON, Minister of Defense of the BPP is presently incarcerated as a result of an indictment returned on November 13, 1967, by a Grand Jury for murder of an Oakland Police Officer on October 28, 1967.

B. Arrest in Sacramento, California on May 2, 1967

At approximately twelve noon on May 2, 1967, a group of twenty-four Negro males who identified themselves as

members of the BPP made a protest march and appearance at the California State Capitol, Sacramento, California. The purpose of their appearance was to protest an assembly bill being introduced on that date by Assemblyman DON MULFORD. The bill being introduced by Assemblyman MULFORD prohibited the instruction in the use of firearms for the commission of the crime of riot. It further prohibited the carrying of a loaded firearm on one's person in a public street or in a public place within any city.

On arriving at the Capitol, one group remained on the main floor of the Capitol Building, while a second group composed of approximately twelve men went to the Assemby Chambers on the second floor of the building. This group was armed with rifles, shotguns and handguns. The group forced its way past two sergeants-at-arms and entered the floor of the Assembly Chamber. They were subsequently removed by members of the State Police and the Sergeant-at-Arms. At that point the entire group left the Capitol grounds and entered five vehicles which had been used for their trip to Sacramento.

Shortly after leaving the Capitol Building the group congregated at a service station located on the corner of 15th and "L" Streets which is on the northeast corner of the State Capitol grounds. Officers of the Sacramento Police Department arrived at the scene and observed the group with the guns in their possession standing at the The entire group consisting of 24 Negro men intersection. were arrested by the officers and twelve firearms consisting of four handguns, five rifles and three shotguns were confiscated. The group was taken to the Sacramento City Jail and each individual was charged with violation of Section 182.1 of the California Penal Code, which is conspiracy, the specific charge being to disturb the State Assemby while in session. The Subject was charged with violation of Section 3056 of the California Penal Code (Parole Violation).

On May 1, 1967, "Ramparts" contacted a parole officer in the Department of Corrections in San Francisco, requesting permission for the Subject, then a staff writer for the magazine, to attend the session of the California State Legislature on May 2, 1967, which would be concerned that day

with police and community relations. Early on May 2, 1967, the Subject received the permission requested. Subsequent to the Subject's arrest at Sacramento a "Ramparts" attorney protested that CLEAVER was with a group of white reporters on the scene and that no white reporter was arrested, that he presented his press card to the arresting officers who disregarded it with an insult, that he was mistreated by the police and discriminated against because he was a Negro. The attorney claimed to have several white witnesses to back up his statement and succeeded in getting the charge against the Subject reduced from a felony to a misdemeanor.

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On May 4, 1967, the Subject appeared in Superior Court, Sacramento County, Sacramento, California, at which time charges were dismissed and Subject remained on parole.

C. Arrest in Oakland, California April 6, 1968

On April 6, 1968, at approximately 10:30 p.m., the Subject, along with seven other men tentatively identified as Black Panthers were arrested in Oakland, California by officers of the Oakland Police Department. The arrest came after 90 minutes of gun battle in which two police officers were wounded, one suspect BOBBY JAMES HUTTON was killed, and two suspects were wounded. The Subject was one of the wounded.

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SF 100-55520 FL:jl pending. The Subject was removed to a Department of Corrections facility for detainment. Special action was taken by the Adult Authority on April 7, 1968, to cancel his parole. BOBBY HUTTON was treasurer of b2 the BPP at the time of his death. b6 b7C b7D On April 10, 1968, Oakland Police Department, Oakland, California, advised that investigation by the Oakland Police Department subsequent to the April 6, 1968, arrest of the Subject as a result of the shoot-out with the Oakland Police Department has disclosed the following facts: Early on Saturday evening, April 6, 1968, LEROY ELDRIDGE CLEAVER, better known as ELDRIDGE CLEAVER, Minister of Information, BPP, gathered members and leaders of the BPP together at BPP Headquarters, 4421 Grove Street, Oakland, California, and told them that he received alarming information from a source considered by him to be reliable and in a position to know. He said he had been told that the Oakland Police Department was planning genocide against the BPP. Then he stated, "We'll take care of that. √ We'll get them first." b6 b7C About fifteen BPP members, including CLEAVER and DAVID HILLIARD, National Captain of the BPP, proceeded in three Oakland, California, cars to a house located at where they gathered up numerous weapons, including rifles and shotguns. At this location CLEAVER stated that they would cruise around North Oakland to look for a policeman to kill. They then proceeded to North Oakland and spotted two police officers as they were getting out of their patrol car. The BPP members got out of their cars unnoticed by the officers. By jumping fences and going through backyards they endeavored - 17 -

to maneuver themselves into a position to shoot at the officers. Before they could get set up, the officers were back in their car and departed. No shots were fired and the officers never became aware of the presence of the BPP members. The officers had responded to a missing persons complaint and had only remained at the location of the complaint for a short time because they were informed upon arrival that the missing person had returned home.

After previously cruising around North Oakland, the BPP members decided to rendezvous in the vicinity of 30th and Union Streets, Oakland. Shortly after they arrived in that location, the aforementioned shooting incident took place.

The April 11, 1968, issue of the "San Francisco Chronicle", San Francisco daily newspaper, on Page 3, Paragraph 5, contains an article captioned "Panthers Plead Not Guilty", which states in part as follows:

"Black Panther Eldridge Cleaver was brought in a heavily guarded ambulance from the Vacaville Medical Facility to make an Oakland court appearance with six co-defendants yesterday. . .

"More than one-half of the spectators in court were Black Panthers, and they gave Cleaver and the other defendants the clenched fist salute of the militant Negro organization. Some chanted 'Black Power' at the end of the hearing.

"Cleaver and the others entered pleas of not guilty to charges of assault with intent to commit murder arising from a gun battle in West Oakland last weekend . . ."

An article appearing in the April 26, 1968, issue of the "San Francisco Chronicle", San Francisco, California, captioned "Exclusive Talk with Cleaver" reads in part as follows: SF 100-55520 FL:jl "A Black Panther official shot during the 90-minute gun battle with Oakland Police on April 6 called the 'official' version of that incident a 'tissue of lies' yesterday. "In an exclusive interview in the Alameda County Jail, Eldridge Cleaver, 32, party Minister of Information, said: "Bobby Hutton, 17, killed by police bullets, was 'told to run for a squad car' and, while his hands were raised, and he was unarmed, officers shot him down. "The Panthers, in three cars, were out collecting food for a picnic for the following day when a squad car abruptly pulled up 'and suddenly a gun exploded right in my face.' "With one or two possible exceptions, the arsenal that police claim was confiscated at the scene of the shoot-out --near 1228 - 28th street-- was actually taken from a parked Panther car's locked trunk, miles away and hours later. "Following the 'police ambush' of some eight Panthers, officers made no attempt to immediately allow Cleaver and Hutton out of the house they were 'holed up in' but, instead, poured a fusillade of bullets in through its walls. "Cleaver spoke shortly before the Grand Jury transcript was released and was thus unable to speculate on the testimony of fellow Panthers who told police that the group had been looking for trouble before the shooting started. - 19 -

"He is being held in lieu of \$75,000 bail on charges stemming from the incident.

"In an interview room, Cleaver, the articulate author of 'Soul on Ice' who served nine years in prison for assault with a deadly weapon, maintained trouble was the furthest thing from the Panthers' minds the night the shooting started.

"'I was never armed,' he said,
'because Huey P. Newton (party founder)
had laid down orders that, as a parolee,
I should not be armed.'

"Cleaver admitted that young Hutton had a rifle in the house. After police began firing, he said Hutton exchanged shots with police.

"'But before we came out of the house I took Bobby's gun and threw it out and the police saw me throw it out,' Cleaver said.

"The trouble began about 9:30 p.m., when, Cleaver said, a squad car pulled up alongside three Panther cars parked on 28th street.

"'We had been gathering provisions for the sisters (women members) and were on our way for a load of potatoes.'

"Cleaver said he saw a policeman get out of a squad car, which had suddenly pulled up, 'heard some loud talk' from a policeman, and then the shooting began."

E. Action Taken To Gain Cleaver's Release

A flyer captioned "Release Eldridge Cleaver! An Appeal For Letters Demanding Justice From the California

Adult Authority" written and distributed by Mrs. KATHLEEN CLEAVER reads in part as follows:

"Eldridge Cleaver, Minister of Information for the Black Panther Party, author of the best-seller 'Sout on Ice,' staff writer for Ramparts Magazine, and member of the State Steering Committee of the Peace and Freedom Movement, is now being held a political prisoner at the State prison hospital at Vacaville, California. In a massive attack by 50 police on a group of Black Panthers in West Oakland on the night of April 6, Eldridge Cleaver and Bobby Hutton were trapped in the basement of a house that was bombarded with machine guns, tear gas, and finally set afire. Seventeen-year-old Bobby Hutton was murdered by the police while surrendering. Eldridge Cleaver was shot in the leg . . .

"After serving ten years of a 1-14 year sentence in California prisons, Eldridge was released on parole for four years. He had been consistently denied parole by the Adult Authority during his imprisonment as punishment for his political activities while in prison. . .

"The clearly calculated attempt to liquidate the leadership of the Black Panther Party, starting in October with the attempt to murder Huey P. Newton, Minister of Defense, in the streets, followed by the frame-up of Bobby Seale, Chairman, in February . . . culminating in the attempt to murder Eldridge Cleaver, Minister of Information . . . as intensified as the political power and organizational strength of the Party has grown. This, coupled with the flagrant irregularities in the arrest and charging of Eldridge Cleaver, the generalized harassment of the Black Panther Party, and the recent move to bring a Grand Jury indictment against the Panthers involved in the shoot-out. . . reveals a planned and consistent attempt to destroy our organization."

The flyer goes on to request that everyone write a letter or send a telegram to the Chairman of the California Adult Authority in Sacramento, California, demanding the re-instatement of Eldridge Cleaver's parole and condemns their collusion with the Oakland Police Department and its attempt to liquidate the leadership of the BPP. The flyer also asked for contributions to the BPP Defense Fund.

An article appearing in the May 21, 1968, issue of the "San Francisco Chronicle" captioned "New Legal Bid to Free Cleaver" reads in part as follows:

"Attorneys for Black Panther leader Eldridge Cleaver filed a petition in Fairfield yesterday for a writ of habeas corpus to release their client.

"Charles Garry charged that his client, arrested in the April 6 Oakland shoot-out, is being unlawfully held because his parole -- Cleaver is an ex-felon--was 'unlawfully canceled.'

"Cleaver has denied he carried guns the night of the shooting. The California Adult Authority summarily revoked his parole on April 7, though Cleaver has not yet been tried on the gun charges.

"Garry also attacked the Authority's parole revocation on other grounds dealing with his association with Panthers, whom the State termed 'individuals of bad reputation,' plus a third charge that Cleaver failed 'to co-operate with his parole agent.'"

As of May 19, 1968, the California Adult Authority, who is responsible for passing on the Subject's parole or revocation thereof, had received over 384 letters seeking the release of the Subject. The correspondence included many educators, professionals and prominent citizens from all over the country.

An article appearing in the June 1, 1968, issue of the "San Francisco Chronicle", San Francisco, California, captioned "Panthers' Fiery Rally For Cleaver" reads in part as follows:

"The Black Panthers staged a fiery, hour-long rally here yesterday afternoon to whip up support for the release of their jailed minister of information, Eldridge Cleaver.

"More than 200 persons showed up for the event, in front of the office of the California Department of Corrections . . . at 71 Eleventh Street.

"The speakers were Kathleen Cleaver, wife of the jailed Panther Party chairman Bobby Seale, and Stokely Carmichael black power leader and former head of the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee.

"Mrs. Cleaver and Seale made bitter attacks against 'pigs (police) and racists' and vowed that they and other Panthers would arm themselves to keep from being exterminated. . .

"Carmichael spoke briefly and sardonically:

"'Well, we're just here to support Eldridge Cleaver and Huey Newton to free them. Demonstrations won't do it. We know what'll do it, and we're gonna take care of business. That's all.'"

An article appearing in the June 13, 1968, issue of the "San Francisco Examiner" captioned "Judge Blocks Protest, Cleaver Free on Bail" reads in part as follows:

"Solano County Superior Judge Raymond J. Sherwin, declared Tuesday that Cleaver, 33, was being unjustly held as a 'political prisoner' in the State Medical Facility at Vacaville. . .

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"California Adult Authority had canceled Cleavers parole on an earlier conviction because of his alleged participation in the April gun battle. . .

"Judge Sherwin ordered his release saying the evidence failed to support the Adult Authority's action.

"'The peril of his parole status stemmed from no failure of personal rehabilitation, but from his undue eloquence in pursuing his political goals--goals which were offensive to many of his contemporaries.

"'Not only was there absence of cause for cancellation of the parole, it was a product of a type of pressure unbecoming, to say the least, to the law enforcement of this state,' said the judge."

IV. STATEMENTS ATTRIBUTABLE TO CLEAVER

A. Articles Written by Cleaver

An editorial captioned "Huey Must Be Set Free!" appearing in the November 23, 1967, issue of "The Black Panther--Black Community News Service," which bears the words "Minister of Information, Black Panther Party" as the writer, reads in part as follows:

"Huey Newton, Minister of Defense of the Black Panther Party for Self Defense, lies in the hospital at San Quentin State Prison, with a gunshot wound in his stomach, inflicted by an Oakland cop. An Oakland cop is dead and buried and a second cop lies somewhere in some hospital with three bullet wounds in his body. Huey has been charged with the murder of the first cop and the shooting of the second.

> "The shooting occured in the heart of Oakland's black ghetto. Huey is a black man, a resident of Oakland's black ghetto, and the two cops were white and lived in the white suburbs. On the night that the shooting occurred, there were 400 years of oppression of black people by white people focused and manifested in the incident. We are at that crossroads in history where black people are determined to bring down the final curtain on the drama of their struggle to free themselves from the boot of the white man that is on their collective neck. Huey Newton knew that the chief instrument of oppression of black people in America is the police departments of the cities. murder, brutality, and the terror of their image, the police of America have kept black people intimidated, locked in a mortal fear, and paralyzed in their bid for freedom. He knew that the power of the police over black people has to be broken if we are to be liberated from our bondage. These gestapo dogs are not holy, they are not angels, and there is no more mystery surrounding them. They are brutal beasts who have been gunning down black people and getting away with it. They call this 'justifiable homicide' carried out by an officer of the law in the line of duty. Black people understand that this is very true--but not in the way that the lying mass media would have people believe.

> "The 'duty' that these wretched jackels are carrying out is to keep the niggers in check; the peace that they are charged with keeping is the peace of the power structure, the peace of the Bank of America and General Motors. To perform their duty, they must necessarily disturb the peace of black people. In fact, black people have had no peace since the first day they sat foot on this bloody Babylonian soil called America. Peace is what black people seek, what they are determined to have. Peace is what is being witheld from black people.

> "Every week, from every corner of America, we hear the reports of how some cop has shot and killed some black man, woman or child. We are sick and tired of hearing such news and we don't want to hear any more. The only way that is can be from now on is that there will be no more reports of black people being massacred or we want to hear more reports about more dead cops shot down by black men. There can be no two ways about it, there can no longer be a double standard, one for black people and one for white people, one for cops with guns and one for black men with guns. Either human life is sacred or it is not. If human life is sacred then we must demand that black life also be considered sacred.

"The racist dog Oakland cops say that this dead cop is the first one who has been killed 'in the line of duty' in twenty eyars. Yet that same Oakland police force has shot and killed scores of black men and women in that same period. What about them? Don't they count? Who is keeping the statistics about them? And what are we supposed to do about that? Are we supposed to just sit back calmly and add another digit to the statistics everytime another black person is killed by an Oakland cop? We know that that is what they want us to do -- but we are here to say that those days are gone! Does everybody understand that? THOSE DAY ARE GONE! THE DAY WHEN A COP CAN SHOOT A BLACK MAN, WOMAN, OR CHILD DOWN IN COLD BLOOD AND HAVE IT RULED JUSTIFIABLE HOMICIDE IS GONE FOREVER. FROM b2 NOW ON WE SAY: ONE MAN, ONE LIFE!" b7D

On May 16, 1968 Campus Police,
San Francisco State College, San Francisco, California, provided
a copy of a flyer which was released on the campus by the
Black Student Union. This flyer is captioned "Credo for
Riotors and Looters" and indicates it was written by Eldridge
Cleaver, Minister of Information for the Black Panther Party.

"Upwards to 20,000,000 Black people, knowing you for the rotten, racist, murdering nation of white thievish hypocrites that you are, are no longer interested in explaining anything to you, America. Indeed. We understand that you already know all about it. We know that your investigations into the disorders are just a bunch of bullshit manuvers designed to but give you time while you multiply and perfect your machinery of repression which you have already unleashed upon us. In fact, your investigators themselves are amongst your chief and shrewdist criminals.

"Black people have already judged you, America, and have condemned you to death. And we also know that history has selected us, your slaves and chief victims, to be your executioner, the instrument of your destruction.

"What a laugh! America the beautiful. Home of the Brave. Friend of the underdog. You once had a beautiful dream-- but even then, while you dreamed that dream, you were foul and corrupt and rotten in your heart, but you were a minor league brigand then and when you compared yourself to the other tyrannies of the world, you looked innocent by contrast to their greater evil. innocent blood they had shed was a vast and ancient ocean, and yours was a fresh new stream. But now your little stream has become vaster than the sky and your evil dwarfs everthing that has gone before. Now you stand naked before the world, before yourself, a predatory, genocidal Dorian Grey, stripped of all egalitarian democratic makeup.

"Is it any wonder that we burn you, that we loot you--you who have burned and looted the world? Who are you to judge? You have no say in the matter. In the councils of the oppressed, the oppressor has no vote. The oppressor has no right which the oppressed are bound to respect."

B. Statements Attributed to Cleaver In Newspaper Articles

An article appearing in the May 22, 1967, issue of "The Militant" weekly newspaper of the SWP captioned "San Francisco Symposium on Malcolm X" reads in part as follows:

"Eldridge Cleaver blamed the police for the near hysterical reactions against the Black Panthers.'If they had known the law', said Cleaver, 'it never would have happened. We have no choice but to fight this out to the bitter end and the only end is the complete exoneration of all of those who protested and participated in the exercise of their rights.'"

An article captioned "Black Panthers To Use Violence" which appeared in the November 28, 1967, issue of "The Daily Californian", the University of California at Berkeley newspaper reads in part as follows:

"'There will be no more rocks and bottles. Now it's hand grenades, dynamite, and machine guns.'

"That was the essence of a recent interview with the Minister of Information of Oakland's Black Panther Party for Self-Defense, a radical Black organization.

"Speaking anonymously, 'for reasons of compelling security,' the Minister said, 'It's going to be a blood bath.'

"He was referring to the building confrontation between whites and militant blacks in the nation's ghettos--particularly in Oakland.

SF 100-55520 FL:jl "Explaining the Panther view of the racial situation, he said, 'The police are viewed as the occupying army in a colonial situation.' "The basic demand is 'withdraw or be driven out. . .' "'The incident occurred in the Black community. The cops are mercenaries who must be driven out, the Information Minister said. . . ' "Concerning the possibility of a violent upheaval in Oakland, he said, 'It's inevitable.' "'Black people have traveled the whole spectrum of protest from marches to sit-ins to stones and bricks and nothing has worked. "'We have made a great effort to tell the people in Oakland that rocks and bottles won't do anything. It's going to be guns,' he warned. "The Minister offered many reasons for the violent nature of the predicted upheaval. "He said the 'Oakland cops are savage and brutal --worse than anyone else maybe excepting Mississippi cops. Where the occupying army is the most brutal is where the response will be most implaccable.' "'It will be a blood bath,' he reaffirmed." An article captioned "Panther Warns Negroes" which appeared in the "Berkeley Daily Gazette" of Berkeley, California, on March 2, 1968, indicates that CLEAVER delivered an anti-police--pro-student talk to the University of California on Sproul Hall steps in which he advised students to bring pressure on local city councils and school - 29 -

boards to bring about a peaceful resolution to civil rights tensions. The article indicates he had harsh words for Negroes who corroborated with police and advised Panthers to greet police officers with a shotgun if any should seek entry to their residence.

An article captioned "Panther Leader Asks Ballot on Separation" appeared in the March 25, 1968, issue of "The Militant". This article indicates that CLEAVER called for a plebiscite to be held in black communities throughout the nation to decide whether "they want to be separated into a sovereign nation of their own."

CLEAVER stated that in this black colony only

CLEAVER stated that in this black colony only black colonial subjects would be allowed to participate in determining their national destiny.

An article captioned "Panther Philosophy Outlined" which appeared in the March 15, 1968, issue of "The Advocate" the Contra Costa College Newspaper, San Pablo, California, quoted CLEAVER as having said that if HUEY NEWTON, Defense Minister of the BPP, who is accused of killing an Oakland policeman is killed, there will be a civil war in the United States.

C. Speeches Made

At the BPP meeting held at St. Philip's Church in Oakland, on January 21, 1968, CLEAVER spoke for about 20 minutes stressing the importance of raising funds for the defense of HUEY NEWTON and concerning this he stated the Black Panther Party members "should feel justified to rob, steal, and if necessary, to kill in order to get what they need for the support of their organization."

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At the Black Panther Party meeting held at St. Philip's Church in Oakland, on February 11, 1968, CLEAVER gave a 20 minute talk. The theme of his talk was that the BPP

SF 100-55520 FL:jl is a revolutionary political organization and the members of the Party should feel justified in stealing, robbing or carrying anything they need from "the man" because white people have for 400 years cheated and stolen from the black race. b2 b7D At the March 16, 1968, session of the Peace and Freedom Party State Convention, held at the Richmond Auditorium, Richmond, California, ELDRIDGE CLEAVER, Minister of Information, BPP, gave a speech in which he read from a document entitled, "Black Paper - Revolution in the White Mother Country and National Liberation in the Black Colony." Excerpts from his speech are set forth as follows: "The Black Panther Party believes that the era in which we now struggle can be characterized as the Age of Showdown - between Oppressed People Everywhere and the Racist Imperial Power Structure. The era can be further defined as that in which significant sectors of the exploiters have turned away from the system, have declared war upon the system that has warped their lives and tainted their existence at the same time that it was doing the same thing and worse to those whom it oppresses. We recognize these alienated people as allies or potential allies in a struggle against a common enemy. "We start with the basic definition: that black people in America are a colonized people in every sense of the term and that white America is an organized imperialist force holding black people in colonial bondage. From this definition, out task becomes clearer: what we need is a revolution in the white mother country and national liberation for the black colony . . . "Ideally, we need a revolutionary organization that is able to, guided by revolutionary ideology and comprehending the necessity involved, move in two directions at the same time . . . - 31 -

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"The Black Panther Party and the Peace and Freedom Party in the Bay Area (San Francisco, Alameda, and Contra Costa Counties, California) have been experimenting over the past few months with a very narrow coalition around a very broad subject. The focal point of the coalition is now, and always been, the case of Huey P. Newton, Minister of Defense, Creator and Leader of the Black Panther Party. Although the coalition has been narrow and limited, tentative and viewed with mutual suspicion, it has in fact unleashed political forces with explosive local impact and national implications . . .

"We have offered our leader, Minister of
Defense Huey P. Newton, as a candidate for the
7th Congressional District of Alameda County,
and we have offered our Chairman, Bobby Seale, as
a candidate for the 17th Assembly District.
In San Francisco, we have offered our communications
secretary, Kathleen Cleaver, for a candidate
in the 18th Assembly District. The advantages
in doing this are manifold. First and foremost,
we are interested in setting Huey P. Newton free."

On March 22, 1968, the California Adult Authority authorized the Subject to travel to New York City.

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Four Black Panther Party members, including the Subject, were in New York City during March, 1968, primarily to arrange matters relating to a book recently written by one of the BPP members. While these individuals were in

The Subject had an introductory subscription to "The Militant". An article captioned "Cleaver Running for President" appearing in the May 14, 1968, edition of the "San Francisco Chronicle" reads in part as follows: "Eldridge Cleaver, the imprisoned Black Panther leader, announced his candidacy yesterday for the presidency of the United States. "Cleaver will run against Comedian Dick Gregory for the nomination next July of the Peace and Freedom Party, which is on the ballot in California, New York and three other states." An article captioned "Panthers Run Cleaver For President" appearing in the May 18, 1968, issue of the "People's World" reads in part as follows: "The Black Panther Party also announced May 13, the candidacy of Cleaver, the party's minister of information and author of 'Soul on Ice,' for the U.S. presidency. - 33 -

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"Cleaver's candidacy, said Mrs. Kathleen Cleaver at a San Francisco press conference May 13, was in response to the 'bullets, bombs and bullshit' with which America's rulers have met the mounting fight for national liberation here and around the world."

BLACK PANTHER PARTY, aka Black Panther Party for Self Defense

A source advised that the Black Panther Party for Self Defense (BPPSD) was formed by HUEY PERCY NEWTON, Minister of Defense, and BOBBY GEORGE SEALE, Chairman, in December, 1966, as a militant black nationalist political organization to combat police brutality, to unite militant black youth, and to determine the destiny of black communities. The political philosophy was taken from writings of Chairman MAO Tse-tung of Communist China and black militant writers.

In March, 1968, the name of the organization was changed to Black Panther Party (BPP).

The official BPP publication, "The Black Panther Party - Black Community News Service," states that the BPP advocates use of guns and guerrilla tactics in their violent revolutionary program to end oppression of black people.

On February 17, 1968, ELDRIDGE CLEAVER, Minister of Information, announced merger of the BPP and Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee (SNCC) and bestowed title of Minister of Justice, BPP, upon H. RAP BROWN, Chairman of SNCC.

SNCC is a militant Megro organization which preaches black supremacy.

NEWTON, aforementioned, is incarcerated in the Alameda County Jail, Oakland, California, awaiting trial on charge of murder of an Oakland police officer.

Headquarters of BPP and Huey P. Newton Defense Fund are located at 4421 Grove Street, Oakland, California.

MUSLIM MOSQUE, INCORPORATED (MMI)

The March 13, 1964, edition of "The New York Times," a daily newspaper published in New York, New York, contained an article on page 20 which indicated that MALCOLM X (LITTLE), former national official of the Nation of Islam (NOI) who broke with the NOI on March 8, 1964, publicly announced in New York City on March 12, 1964, that he had formed the Muslim Mosque, Incorporated (MMI). The MMI, according to the article, would be a broadly based politically oriented black nationalist movement for Negroes, only, financed by voluntary contributions. In this public statement, MALCOLM X urged Negroes to abandon the doctrine of non-violence when it is necessary to defend themselves in the civil rights struggle, and he also suggested that Negroes form rifle clubs to protect their lives and property in time of emergencies in areas where the government is unable or unwilling to protect them.

Incorporation papers of the MMI filed on March 16, 1964, with the Business Section, Clerk of Courts, New York County, New York, reflect that the MMI was incorporated under the Religious Corporation Law of the State of New York to work for the imparting of the Islamic Faith and Islamic Religion in accordance with "accepted Islamic principals." The principal place of worship to be located in the Borough of Manhattan, New York, New York.

The May 23, 1964, edition of the "New York Amsterdam News", a weekly Negro newspaper published in New York City, contained an article by columnist JAMES BOOKER in which he indicated that he had heard that the visit by MALCOLM X with Muslim leaders during his African tour has changed him to become soft in his anti-white feelings and to become more religious.

On October 6, 1964, a confidential source advised that the MMI is apparently affiliated with the true orthodox Islamic Religion through its affiliation with the Islamic Foundation (of New York), 1 Riverside Drive, New York City. The only teachings of the MMI are on the Islamic Religion.

This confidential source advised on May 17, 1965, the adquarters of the MMI are located in Suite 128, Hotel

This confidential source advised on May 17, 1965, that the headquarters of the MMI are located in Suite 128, Hotel Theresa, 2090 Seventh Avenue, New York, New York, where they were established on March 16, 1964. These headquarters are shared with the Organization of Afro-American Unity, Incorporated (OAAU) which was also headed by MALCOLM X.

MALCOLM X was assassinated on February 21, 1965, while addressing an OAAU rally at the Audubon Ballroom, Broadway and 166th Street, New York City.

This same confidential source advised on September 8, 1965, that the activities of the MMI following the death of MALCOLM X were limited to the teaching of classes in the Islamic religion and a class in judo for self-protection. These classes were held regularly until the latter part of July, 1965, when they were discontinued. Since then, the MMI has held no meetings and there has been absolutely no activity by the MMI which appears to be completely "dead."

NATION OF ISLAM, Formerly referred to as the Muslim Cult of Islam, also known as Muhammad's Temples of Islam

In January, 1957, a source advised ELIJAH MUHAMMAD has described his organization on a nationwide basis as the "Nation of Islam" and "Muhammad's Temples of Islam."

On May 5, 1967, a second source advised ELIJAH MUHAMMAD is the national leader of the Nation of Islam (NOI); Muhammad's Temple of Islam No. 2, 5335 South Greenwood Avenue, Chicago, Illinois, is the national headquarters of the NOI; and in mid-1960 MUHAMMAD and other NOI officials, when referring to MUHAMMAD's organization on a nationwide basis, commenced using either "Mosque" or "Temple" when mentioning one of "Muhammad's Temples of Islam."

The NOI is an all-Negro organization which was originally organized in 1930 in Detroit, Michigan. MUHAMMAD claims to have been selected by Allah, the Supreme Being, to lead the so-called Negro race out of slavery in the wilderness of North America by establishing an independent black nation in the United States. Members following MUHAMMAD's teachings and his interpretation of the "Koran" believe there is no such thing as a Negro; that the so-called Negroes are slaves of the white race, referred to as "white devils," in the United States; and that the white race, because of its exploitation of the so-called Negroes, must and will be destroyed in the approaching "War of Armageddon."

In the past, officials and members of the NOI, including MUHAMMAD, have refused to register under the provisions of the Selective Service Acts and have declared that members owe no allegiance to the United States.

On May 5, 1958, the first source advised MUHAMMAD had, upon advice of legal counsel, tempered his personal statements and instructions to his ministers concerning the principles of his organization in order to avoid possible prosecution by the United States government; however, he did not indicate any fundamental changes in the teachings of his organization.

On May 2, 1966, a third source advised MUHAMMAD had, early in July, 1958, decided to de-emphasize the religious aspects of the teachings of Islam and to stress the economic benefits to be derived by those Negroes who joined the NOI. This policy change, according to MUHAMMAD, would help him acquire additional followers and create more interest in his program.

ORGANIZATION OF AFRO-AMERICAN UNITY, INCORPORATED (OAAU)

On June 28, 1964, MALCOLM X LITTLE, founder and leader of the Muslim Mosque, Incorporated (MMI), publicly announced the formation of a new, all Negro, militant civil rights action group to be known as the Organization of Afro-American Unity (OAAU), with himself as Chairman. This announcement was made at a public rally held by the MMI in the Audubon Ballroom, Broadway and 166th Street, New York City.

1.

A printed and published statement of basic OAAU aims read by MALCOLM X at this meeting indicates that it shall include "all" people of African descent in the Western Hemisphere, as well as "our" brothers and sisters on the African continent. It is patterned after the "letter and spirit" of the Organization of African Unity established (by African heads of States) at Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, in May, 1963.

A recording of the remarks of MALCOLM X at this meeting indicates that the aim of the OAAU is to eliminate differences between Negroes so they can work together for "human rights", while the initial objective is to "internationalize" the American civil rights movement by taking it to the United Nations. LITTLE condemned the non-violent civil rights movement and claims that Negroes should be taught to protect themselves, when and if necessary. The OAAU will sponsor a program for Negroes in education, politics, culture, economics, and social reform.

MALCOLM X was assassinated on February 21, 1965, while addressing an OAAU rally at the Audubon Ballroom, New York City.

On April 13, 1965, a confidential source advised that on March 26, 1965, the OAAU filed a Certificate of Incorporation with the Department of State, State of New York, Albany, New York, and henceforth, the organization's true name will be Organization of Afro-American Unity, Incorporated.

ORGANIZATION OF AFRO-AMERICAN UNITY, INCORPORATED (OAAU)

On February 28, 1966, a second confidential source advised that the president and head of the OAAU is ELLA COLLINS, a half-sister of the late MALCOLM X, who resides in Harlem, New York.

On May 8, 1967, the first confidential source advised the the headquarters of the OAAU is located at 224 West 139th Street, New York, New York, which is the residence of ELLA COLLINS.

REVOLUTIONARY ACTION MOVEMENT

1.

On November 3, 1964, a source made available a document entitled, "The Revolutionary Action Movement Manifesto", the document having been obtained by the source from an individual known to be a member of the Revolutionary Action Movement (RAM).

This document stated, in part, that RAM was officially organized in the Winter of 1963 by Afro-Americans who support the revolutionary objectives of ROBERT F. WILLIAMS, then residing in Cuba, and his concept of organized violence to achieve the liberation of the Afro-American people in the United States. This Manifesto disclosed that RAM had oriented its program to one of education and political revolution and the organization of a "black" political party with revolutionary objectives, having recognized the need for a "black revolution" that could and would seize power. RAM philosophy is described in this document as one of revolutionary nationalism, that is, one involving the struggles of the non-white races of the world against exploitation and enslavement by the white capitalist and imperialist nations.

Regarding WILLIAMS, it should be noted that on August 28, 1961, a Federal warrant was issued at Charlotte, North Carolina, charging him with Unlawful Flight to Avoid Prosecution for the crime of kidnaping. Subsequent to the issuance of this warrant, WILLIAMS fled the United States to Cuba, where he published a monthly newsletter entitled, "The Crusader" from Havana. As of December, 1966, WILLIAMS was residing in Peking, China.

This source, in September, 1964, advised RAM is dedicated to the overthrow of the capitalist system in the United States, by violence, if necessary, and to its replacement by a socialistic system oriented toward the Chinese Communist interpretation of Marxism-Leninism. RAM is entirely non-white in membership, clandestine in nature, and owes its primary allegiance to the "Bandung World", that is, the non-white races of the world rather than to any national entity, as such.

REVOLUTIONARY ACTION MOVEMENT (CONTINUED)

On November 16, 1964, a second source advised he learned recently from a RAM member that the organization began in Detroit, Michigan, largely under the impetus of DON FREEMAN, described as the "Father" of RAM and referred to as RAM's "Black Stalin". FREEMAN served as RAM Chairman, with MAXWELL STANFORD (now of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania) serving as RAM Field Chairman.

2.

On May 12, 1967, a third source advised that the RAM still remains active; however, there is no formal headquarters, as such, for the RAM. The source advised that MAXWELL STANFORD of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, is considered the leader of RAM and if a RAM headquarters ever existed, it will most likely be where STANFORD resides.

SOCIALIST WORKERS PARTY SAN FRANCISCO DIVISION

A source advised on August 1, 1960, that the San Francisco Branch of the Socialist Workers Party (SWP) was formed approximately in the early part of 1938, and the Oakland Branch of the SWP was formed in the latter part of 1938.

A second source advised on October 26, 1959, that the name of the Oakland Branch of the SWP was changed to the Oakland-Berkeley Branch of the SWP.

A third source advised on May 1, 1967, that the San Francisco Branch and the Oakland-Berkeley Branch of the SWP follow the policies and directives of the National SWP with which they are affiliated.

The SWP has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

STUDENTS FOR A DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY

The Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), as it is known today, came into being at a founding convention held at Port Huron, Michigan, in June, 1962. The SDS is an association of young people on the left and has a current program of protesting the draft, promoting a campaign for youth to develop a conscientious objector status, denouncing United States intervention in the war in Vietnam and to "radically transform" the university community, and provide for its complete control by students. GUS HALL, General Secretary, Communist Party, USA, when interviewed by a representative of United Press International in San Francisco, California, on May 14, 1965, described the SDS as a part of the "responsible left" which the Party has "going for us." At the June, 1965 SDS National Convention, an anti-communist proviso was removed from the SDS constitution. In the October 7, 1966 issue of "New Left Notes," the official publication of SDS, an SDS spokesman stated that there are some communists in SDS and they are welcome. The National Headquarters of this organization as of April 18,1967, was located in Room 206, 1608 West Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois.

STUDENT NONVIOLENT COORDINATING COMMITTEE

Literature distributed by the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee (SNCC), headquartered at 360 - 362 Nelson Street, S.W., Atlanta, Georgia, describes itself as not being a membership organization, but rather an agency attempting to stimulate and foster the growth of local protest movements. SNCC was born out of the sit-in movement which erupted across the South beginning on February 1, 1960. A conference at Raleigh, North Carolina, that Spring, brought together many of the demonstrating Southern students in a loose network of militant youth which was officially named SNCC in October, 1960.

A source has advised that in May, 1966, STOKELY CARMICHAEL was elected National Chairman by the Central Committee. In May, 1967, CARMICHAEL was replaced as Chairman by H. RAP BROWN, with CARMICHAEL assuming the position of Recruiter and Organizer for the SNCC. In August, 1967, at the invitation of FIDEL CASTRO, CARMICHAEL participated in the Organization of Latin American Solidarity Conference which was held in Havana, Cuba. Subsequent thereto, CARMICHAEL traveled to Hanoi and other sections of North Vietnam. He returned to the United States in December, 1967, at which time his passport was picked up because of travel to unauthorized countries.

A source advised that when CARMICHAEL was elected Chairman of SNCC, the organization embarked on a program of eliminating Caucasians from its ranks. With the election of H. RAP BROWN as Chairman in 1967, it embarked on a world-wide struggle for human rights and to take a firm stand against violations of these rights by the American Government and to strengthen its programs of opposition to the draft and to the United States involvement in Vietnam.

Literature distributed in February, 1968, identifies SNCC as an organization in the revolutionary vanguard. It advocates that to be successful it is necessary to develop a revolutionary ideology and revolutionary program.

On August 13, 1967, while addressing a group in the Watts area of Los Angeles, California, H. RAP BROWN said, "You better shape up America, or we'll burn you down." Later in February, 1968, in a publicized note BROWN wrote, "America, if it takes my death to organize my people to revolt against you and to organize your jails to revolt against you and to organize your children, your God, your poor, your country, and to organize mankind to rejoice in your destruction and ruin, then here's my life."

YOUNG SOCIALIST ALLIANCE (known in the San Francisco Bay Area as the Bay Area Young Socialist Alliance, aka the Bay Area Committee of the Young Socialist Alliance, Bay Area Committee for the Young Socialist)

A source advised on May 16, 1960, that the Bay Area Young Socialist Alliance (BAYSA) was formed in February, 1958, as the Bay Area Committee for the Young Socialist (BACYS). At a later stage in its development prior to adoption of the name BAYSA, the organization was known as the Bay Area Committee of the Young Socialist Alliance (BACYSA).

The source advised that as a result of a national convention held April 15-17, 1960, at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, the BAYSA became a branch of the national organization to be known as the Young Socialist Alliance (YSA) and will carry out in the Northern California area the policies of the YSA.

A second source advised May 1, 1967, that the BAYSA is currently active and is composed of two locals: The San Francisco YSA and the Berkeley YSA.

The first source advised on May 1, 1967, that the BAYSA, although ostensibly an independent organization, is in reality controlled by the San Francisco Branch, Socialist Workers Party (SWP) and the Oakland Branch, SWP.

The SWP has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

YOUNG SOCIALIST ALLIANCE

The May, 1960 issue of the "Young Socialist" (YS), page 1, column 3, disclosed that during April 15-17, 1960, a national organization entitled "The Young Socialist Alliance" (YSA) was established at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania This issue stated that this organization was formed by the nationwide supporter clubs of the publication YS.


The above issue, page 6, set forth the Founding Declaration of the YSA. This declaration stated that the YSA recognizes the Socialist Workers Party (SPW) as the only existing political leadership on class struggle principles of revolutionary socialism.

On March 10, 1967, a source advised that the YSA was formed during 1957, by youth of various left socialist tendencies, particularly members and followers of the SWP. The source further advised that the YSA has recently become more open about admitting that it is the youth group of the SWP and that an SWP representative has publicly stated that the YSA is the SWP's youth group.

The headquarters of the YSA are located in Rooms 532-536, 41 Union Square West, New York City.

The SWP has been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

A characterization of "Young Socialist" is set out separately.



On February 17, 1968, LeRoy Eldridge Cleaver was publicly identified at the Huey Newton Defense Fund rally at the Black Panther PartyFor Self Defense (BPPSD) held at the Oakland Municipal Auditorium, Oakland, California, as the Minister of Information of the BPPSD.

The November 23, 1967 issue of "The Black Panther Party - Black Community News Service," official publication of BPPSD, listed Kathleen Neal as the assistant editor of that publication and listed the editor of that publication as Minister of Information (Underground).

The January 25, 1958 issue of the "Daily Californian," University of California at Berkeley student newspaper, on page 3, column 1, identified Kathleen Cleaver as the Communications Secretary of the BPPSD.

BLACK PANTHER PARTY FOR SELF-DEFENSE (BPPSD)

A source advised that the Black Panther Party For Self-Defense (BPPSD) was formed by HUEY PERCY NEWTON, Minister of Defense, and BOBBY GEORGE SEALE, Chairman, in Oakland, California, in December, 1966, as a militant black nationalist political organization to combat "police brutality" to unite militant black youth, to determine the destiny of black communities, and to educate black people in African history. The political philosophy of the organization was taken from the writings of MAO Tse-tung of Communist China and black militant writers.

The official BPPSD publication "The Black Panther - Black Community News Service" indicates the leadership of the BPPSD advocates the use of gun and guerilla tactics in the violent revolutionary program to end oppression and to oppose the drafting of black men to fight in Vietnam.

A second source advised that in early 1967, SEALE, NEWTON, and their associates carried carbine rifles and holstered pistols in plain view on the streets of Oakland and elsewhere while on "defense patrols."

BOBBY GEORGE SEALE was one of the persons arrested by the Sacramento, California Police Department on May 2, 1967, when members of the BPPSD invaded the California State Legislative Assembly in Sacramento while in session, carrying loaded guns to protest restrictions on the carrying of guns.

A Grand Jury of Alameda County, California, Oakland, California, on November 13, 1967, indicted HUEY PERCY NEWTON on charge of murder of an Oakland, California police officer on October 28, 1967, in Oakland, California.

The first source advised that the headquarters office of the BPPSD at 5624 Grove Street, Oakland, California, is closed and that no membership meetings have been held since August, 1967.

The November 4, 1967 issue of "The Sun Reporter," a San Francisco, California Negro community newspaper, states that a HUEY PERCY NEWTON defense fund has been established and that the Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee (SNCC) and the Congress on Racial Equality (CORE) through the national offices have pledged their complete and continuous support to the defense of HUEY PERCY NEWTON.

Page 10 of the report shows that the subject was scheduled to speak on 3-25-68 at California State College at Hayward and at a pro-Viet Cong rally on 3-2-68. information was set out as to whether or not he appeared. Clarify in the next report.

On page 23 reference is made to a rally for the subject held in San Francisco on 5-31-68. This information is attributed to the "San Francisco Chronicle." It seems unlikely that a public demonstration of this kind would not have been covered by any source of your office and, if it was, the information should have been attributed to that source. When reporting such an occurrence which was not covered by any source of your office or any police source, it would be useful to include a statement to that effect in the cover page of the report to show that the use of a newspaper account, rather than a report from an informant or a source, was justified.

The same observations are pertinent with regard to the report of a speech made by the subject at the University of California on or about 3-2-68.

You should continue to obtain details concerning the subject's arrests, it being noted that he had narcotic and burglary arrests in Los Angeles between 1950 and 1954,

LEROY ELDRIDGE CLEAVER

A source advised on July 22, 1968, that Leroy Eldridge Cleaver, a leader of the Black Panther Party (BPP), in San Francisco, California, was scheduled to speak that evening at a rally on the Boston Common, Boston, Massachusetts at 7:30 p.m. According to the source, the rally was being sponsored by the BPP, the Student Non Violent Coordinating Committee (SNCC) and the Peace and Freedom Party (PFP) and Cleaver was to speak in behalf of the Huey P. Newton Defense Fund.

Huey P. Newton is currently incarcerated in the Alameda County Jail, Oakland, California awaiting trial on the charge of murder of an Oakland police officer.

The source further advised that Cleaver also planned to speak in Roxbury, Massachusetts at 7:00 p.m., that evening in the hope of attracting a large amount of Negro support for the Common rally.

Later on July 22, 1968, the source advised that Cleaver did not appear on the Boston Common as scheduled. Rumors circulated among the crowd that an airplane containing Cleaver was circling Boston but would not land for some unexplainable reason. According to the source, approximately 500 people, mostly white, gathered on the Boston Common and listened to Boston local Negro leaders speak about black power generally. The source advised that although there were about 2,000 people in the area of the rally, only about 500 seemed to be sitting down and attentive to the speakers.

Among Boston's local Negro leaders who addressed the rally were Leroy Boston, who represented the Boston chapter of SNCC and Reverend Verney Carter, a local churchman and civil rights advocate. Both of these speakers talked about black power, emphasizing the need for black self help and urged control of the black communities by blacks.

The rally broke up at approximately 9:45 p.m., without incidents or arrests.

On July 23, 1968, a source advised that he had later learned that the rally was also addressed by Bobby Seale, a PPP official from Oakland, California who advocated in his speech that people should carry guns for self-defense against their oppressors. Seale also stated that power for people comes out of the barrel of a gun and that a bloody revolution is the only way to get a new government to the people.

It is noted that Bobby George Seale is further described in the characterization of the Black Panther Party field for Self Defense which is attached hereto.

Also attached hereto are characterizations of the SNCC and the Peace and Freedom Party.

BLACK PANTHER PARTY FOR SELF-DEFENSE (BPPSD)

A source advised that the Black Panther Party For Self-Defense (BPPSD) was formed by HUEY PERCY NEWTON, Minister of Defense, and BOBBY GEORGE SEALE, Chairman, in Oakland, California, in December, 1966, as a militant black nationalist political organization to combat "police brutality," to unite militant black youth, to determine the destiny of black communities, and to educate black people in African history. The political philosophy of the organization was taken from the writings of MAO TSE-TUNG of Communist China and black militant writers.

The official BPPSD publication "The Black Panther - Black Community News Service" indicates the leadership of the BPPSD advocates the use of guns and guerilla tactics in the violent revolutionary program to end oppression and to oppose the drafting of black men to fight in Vietnam.

A second source advised that in early 1967, SEALE, NEWTON, and their associates carried carbine rifles and holstered pistols in plain view on the streets of Oakland and elsewhere while on "defense patrols."

BOBBY GEORGE SEALE was one of the persons arrested by the Sacramento, 'California Police Department on May 2, 1967, when members of the BPPSD invaded the California State Legislative Assembly in Sacramento while in session, carrying loaded guns to protest restrictions on the carrying of guns.

A Grand Jury of Alameda County, California, Oakland, California, on November 13, 1967, indicted HUEY PERCY NEWTON on charge of murder of an Oakland, California police officer on October 28, 1967, in Oakland, California.

The first source advised that the headquarters office of the BPPSD at 5624 Grove Street, Oakland, California, is closed and that no membership meetings have been held since August, 1967.

The November 4, 1967, issue of "The Sun Reporter," a San Francisco, California Negro community newspaper, states that a HUEY PERCY NEWTON defense fund has been established and that the Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee (SNCC) and the Congress on Racial Equality (CORE) through the national offices have pledged their complete and continuous support to the defense of HUEY PERCY NEWTON.

PEACE AND FREEDOM PARTY

On March 21, 1968, a source furnished a document captioned "A Brief History of the Peace and Freedom Party." This document states as follows:

The history of the Peace and Freedom Party would be a lot easier to write if it had started at a certain place on a certain date and grown according to a strategy determined by certain people in some central office. Then it would only be necessary to fill in names and dates. But in fact the Party has pretty much grown up by itself all over the state in different counties at different times, without any central planning and certainly without any central source of funds.

The Peace and Freedom Party has been able to spring up like wild flowers because the peace and freedom MOVEMENT is something much bigger than any organization. The movement has consisted of student free-speech fights, civil rights actions, black power organizing, and a broad wave of protest against the war ranging from circulating of petitions to draft resistance.

In 1966 outspoken peace candidates contested the Democratic primaries in six different Congressional Districts in California and in many other places throughout the nation. These candidates did not expect to win; their purpose was to crack open the war "concensus." They made encouraging showings ranging from 40 per cent to 48 per cent of the vote. This first electoral expression of the peace and freedom movement went under the name of New Politics. These campaigns left behind ongoing organizations in some areas, and informal lines of communication between "New Politics" activists in others.

In September, 1966, these groups called a statewide conference on Power and Politics in Los Angeles, which passed a resolution against supporting either Brown or Reagen for Governor. While of little practical significance it showed evidence of a new mood - to work for political independence rather than forever choosing between "lesser" and "greater" evils.


PEACE AND FREEDOM PARTY

By the summer of 1967, some New Politics people wanted to keep running contests inside Democratic primaries, and others wanted to run independent candidates. Those interested in independent campaigns checked the laws and found that there were only two ways to do it at a state-wide level; either by collecting 670,000 petition signatures or by registering 67,000 voters into a new party. At a meeting in September, about 125 people attended and voted to launch a re-registration drive to create a Peace and Freedom Party and qualify it for the ballot.

This September meeting, held in San Luis Obispo, passed a resolution for immediate U.S. withdrawal from Vietnam and in support of the Black Power movement. This resolution was intended to establish the general political orientation of the Peace and Freedom registration drive, for it was understood that a specific platform could only be worked out at a broad, representative convention of the party.

It was impossible at the San Luis Obispo meeting to set up a state-wide office for central coordination of the drive. The participants went back to their respective counties and organized registration drives there, raising funds and publishing literature as individual counties. By the end of November, registration drives were going on in 19 different counties; 25,000 Californians had registered Peace and Freedom; and the groundwork had been laid for a big December push. On December 3, representatives from 15 counties met to report on progress, exchange advice, and set February 22-25 at the dates for a statewide Peace and Freedom Party Convention. This is the history of the Party in California.

The Peace and Freedom Party, growing out of the anti-war movement as it does, takes the position that the U.S. never had any legitimate business in Vietnam, has no legitimate business there now, and ought to get out forthwith.

STUDENT NONVIOLENT COORDINATING COMMITTEE


Literature distributed by the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee (SNCC), headquartered at 360-362 Nelson Street, S.W., Atlanta, Georgia, described itself as not being a membership organization, but rather an agency attempting to stimulate and foster the growth of local protest movements. SNCC was born out of the sit-in movement which erupted across the South beginning on February 1, 1960. A conference at Raleigh, North Carolina, that Spring, brought together many of the demonstrating Southern students in a loose network of militant youth which was officially named SNCC in October, 1960.

A source has advised that in May, 1966, Stokely Carmichael was elected National Chairman by the Central Committee. In May, 1967, Carmichael was replaced as Chairman by H. Rap Brown, with Carmichael assuming the position of Recruiter and Organizer for the SNCC. In August, 1967, at the invitation of Fidel Castro, Carmichael participated in the Organization of Latin American Solidarity Conference which was held in Havana, Cuba. Subsequent thereto, Carmichael traveled to Hanoi and other sections of North Vietnam. He returned to the United States in December, 1967, at which time his passport was picked up because of travel to unauthorized countries.

A source advised that when Carmichael was elected Chairman of SNCC, the organization embarked on a program of eliminating Caucasians from its ranks. With the election of H. Rap Brown as Chairman in 1967, it embarked on a world-wide struggle for human rights and to take a firm stand against violations of these rights by the American Government and to strengthen its programs of opposition to the draft and to the United States involvement in Vietnam.

Literature distributed in February, 1968, identifies SNCC as an organization in the revolutionary vanguard. It advocates that to be successful it is necessary to develop a revolutionary ideology and revolutionary program.

On August 13, 1967, while addressing a group in the Watts area of Los Angeles, California, H. Rap Brown said "You better shape up America, or we'll burn you down." Later in February, 1968, in a publicized note Brown wrote, "America, if it takes my death to organize my people to revolt against you and to organize your children, your God, your poor, your country, and to organize mankind to rejoice in your destruction and ruin, then here's my life."





On July 26, 1968, a confidential cource who has furnished reliable information in the past related that arrangements had been made for the appearance of ELDRIDGE CLEAVER as principal speaker at the Peace and Freedom Rally to be held at the Central Technical High School, Lincoln Auditorium, Syracuse, New York, at 3:30 p.m., on July 27, 1968. CLEAVER, who is Minister of Information for the Black Panther Party (BPP) is the presidential candidate for the Peace and Freedom Party (PFP).

The BPP is characterized on the appendix page.

Source observed that according to the participants coming out of the auditorium, the sponsoring group was the Syracuse University Committee on Equality (SUCE). Source noted that this is a student approved organization and was acceptable to the Board of Education as a legitimate sponsoring organization. He noted, however,

On July 26, 1968, a second Confidential Source who has furnished reliable information in the past, related that an advance contingent of CLEAVER's supporters had arrived in Syracuse on that date to make necessary preparations and effect necessary security prior to CLEAVER's arrival. Source identified the group as consisting of six persons. Three were Negroes and presumably were BPP guards, one was a white female described as being in her early 20's and having blond hair, one was a Puerto Rican and one was a white male, further descriptive data not known. Arrangements had been made for the advance party to stay at the residence of

stated that CLEAVER was scheduled to appear in Rochester, New York, on July 26, 1968.

On July 27, 1968, a third Confidential Source, who has furnished reliable information in the past stated that CLEAVER and six other persons departed Rochester, New York, at about 11:00 a.m., destined for Syracuse, New York, on July 27, 1968, in a 1963 blue Chevrolet sedan, bearing a current New Jersey license number

On July 27, 1968, a fourth Confidential Source, who had furnished reliable information in the past, reported that a blue Chevrolet sedan, bearing New Jersey license was seen parked in front of the residence of Syracuse, New York, on the evening of July 26, 1968. Several Negroes, who were occupants of the car were observed entering the residence.

On July 27, 1968, a fifth Confidential Source who has furnished reliable information in the past, related that CLEAVER and his wife, KATHLEEN appeared as speakers

at the Central Technical High School on the afternoon of July 27, 1968. CLEAVER, announced candidate for President on the Peace and Freedom Party ticket addressed a group of about 200 persons for about one hour. He called for a widening of this coalition of the BPP and the PFP. CLEAVER denounced the police in vehement and obscene language. The majority of his speech was directed to the efforts of the BPP and its supporters to achieve the release of HUEY P. NEWTON, Minister of Defense, BPP, who is presently incarcerated in Oakland, California, on a charge of the murder of an Oakland police officer.

BLACK PANTHER PARTY, aka Black Panther Party for Self Defense

A source advised that the Black Panther Party for Self Defense (BPPSD) was formed by HUEY PERCY NEWTON, Minister of Defense, and BOBBY GEORGE SEALE, Chairman, in December, 1966, as a militant black nationalist political organization to combat police brutality, to unite militant black youth, and to determine the destiny of black communities. The political philosophy was taken from writings of Chairman MAO Tse-tung of Communist China and black militant writers.

In March, 1968, the name of the organization was changed to Black Panther Party (BPP).

The official BPP publication, The Black Panther Party - Black Community News Service, states that the BPP advocates use of guns and guerrilla tactics in their violent revolutionary program to end oppression of black people.

On February 17, 1968, ELDRILGE CLEAVER, Minister of Information, announced merger of the BPP and Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee (SNCC) and bestowed title of Minister of Justice, BPP, upon H. RAP BROWN, Chairman of SNCC.

SNCC is a militant Negro organization which preaches black supremacy.

NEWTON, aforementioned, is incarcerated in the Alameda County Jail, Oakland, California, awaiting trial on charge of murder of an Oakland police officer.

Headquarters of BPP and Huey P. Newton Defense Fund are located at 4421 Grove Street, Oakland, California.

SUUDENTS FOR A DAMOCRATIC SOCIETY

The Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) as it is known today, came into being at a founding convention hald at Fort Muron, Michigan, in June, 1962. The SDS is an association of young people on the left and has a current program of protesting the draft, promoting a campaign for youth to develop a conscientious objector status, denouncing United States intervention in the war in Vietnam and to "radically transform" the university community, and provide for its complete control by students. GUS HALL, General Secretary, Communist Party, USA, described the SDS as a part of the "responsible left" which the Party has "going for us." At the June, 1965, SDS National Convention, an anticommunist proviso was removed from the SDS constitution. October 7, 1966, issue of "New Left Notes," the official publication of SDS, an SDS spokesman stated that there are some communists in SDS and they are welcome. The national headquarters of this organization as of April 18, 1967, was located in Room 206, 1608 West Madison St., Chicago, Illinois.

The subject is author of a reported best-selling book./"Soul On Ice" (McGraw-Hill, 1968), a review of is set out below.

BACKGROUND:

Cleaver is Minister of Information of the Black Panther Party, a black extremist group with headquarters in Oakland, California. He is also reported to be employed by "Ramparts" magazine. He was released from prison in California in 1966 after serving eight years of a fourteenyear sentence on a charge of assault with a deadly weapon which grew out of an attempted rape. He became involved in a gun battle with Oakland police in April, 1968, and his parole was revoked but he was released when a California judge ruled that the state had not shown failure of rehabilitation and that the revocation of his parole was actually based on his "political activities."

BOOK REVIEW:

"Soul On Ice" is a series of essays written by Eldridge Cleaver while in prison. Cleaver explained he became a rapist "consciously, deliberately, willfully, and methodically" and assaulted white women as an "insurrectionary act."

Cleaver educated himself while in prison. He read and liked Karl Marx because Marx supported Cleaver's hatred for American capitalism. He went through a variety of religious experiences and eventually settled on the Nation of Islam (NOI).

Much of the book is the usual extremist diatribe against the white race. Cleaver calls the "central event of our era" the racial liberation movement abroad and the Negro revolution at home. He refers to American Negroes as the "black Trojan Horse" and prophesied impending doom for the white imperialists.

The Bureau is referred to on page 87 as follows: "Robert F. Williams was forced to flee to Cuba with the combined terrors of the FBI and the minions of Southern justice snapping at his heels." The Director is referred to on page 113 as follows: "FBI's J. Edgar Hoover, America's flattest foot, periodically issues grave reminders that the left-wingers, having mastered deceit, are almost succeeding in subverting this, and are busily boring from within to take over that."

The book has little value from a racial intelligence standpoint.

The Peace and Freedom Party of San Diego sponsored LEROY ELDRIDGE CLEAVER, Minister of Information of the Black Panther Party for Self-Defense (BPP) of the San Francisco-Oakland area and Peace and Freedom Party Presidential candidate, to speak at San Diego State College on July 29, 1968, at 8:30 PM.

A characterization of the BPP is contained in the appendix attached hereto.

Mr. CLEAVER arrived in San Diego aboard a commercial plane and was met by an unidentified member of the Peace and Freedom Party. This individual brought CLEAVER to Station KFMB, Channel 8 Television, at 1405 Fifth Avenue, for an interview with HAROLD KEEN. This interview is as follows:

Mr. KEEN:

There have been threats, either open or implied, that if HUEY NEWTON is found guilty of murdering a white police officer at his trial which is now underway in Oakland, that the Black Panthers might stage some sort of violence. What is your reaction to that?

Mr. CLEAVER:

Well, my reaction to any inquiries of that type is that it would be absurd to discuss that if we in fact have some planned violence, because one of the things we're not interested in and that is committing suicide.

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Do you have faith in the American trial system?

Mr. CLEAVER:

No I don't have any faith in the American trial system as constituted. Some of the principles of jurisprudence of this country I could accept them as being valid, but we have to deal with racism involved in the whole judicial process so that it becomes a little more complicated.

Mr. KEEN:

Is separation from the whites rather than the old civil rights cry of integration the new demand of the black militants?

Mr. CLEAVER:

I don't think that this is the united demands of the black militants. There have been some black militants who have always had this particular sposition, and there are all kinds of positions taken by black militants, but the Black Panther Party takes the position on that question that the only way to solve that is to have a U. N. (United Nations) supervised plebiscite to be held throughout the black communities of the country to allow black people to go in and cast their ballots, to determine whether or not they want to be integrated into this country or whether or not they want to be separated. feel that in the past there have been too many organizations, too many people coming along speaking in the name of black people, saying that black people want to be integrated, black people want to be separated, without ever in fact consulting black people. So we feel that the only logical way to deal with this is to allow black people themselves to state for themselves what they would like their future to be.

Mr. KEEN:

If the black people vote in such a plebiscite for separation, would this mean a separate nation within the United States or some other place?

Mr. CLEAVER:

Well, it depends on what was placed on the ballot, if it was worded that way, then that was to be what they would be voting for.

Mr. KEEN:

What are the Black Panthers advocating in that connection? Do they have the...

Mr. CLEAVER:

The Black Panther Party advocates U. N. supervised plebiscite. We feel that it would be our responsibility to create conditions where such a plebiscite could be held. For that reason we went to the United Nations recently and discussed this problem amongst others with friendly members of the United Nations. One of the other very important things that we want to have U. N. observer teams stationed throughout the large cities and some of the rural areas of this country to observe the aggression of the racist police departments against the black communities, because we feel that the situation in this country constitutes a threat to world peace, because it's very likely that a civil war or a race war could develop in this country, and I feel that we're on the brink of that, and it seems to me that the power structure wants that, because they're certainly doing everything to provoke it.

Mr. KEEN:

Some black nationalist leaders have advised their people to get guns, have advocated a violent revolution, have urged the burning and shooting-type of approach. What do the Black Panthers stand for in that connection?

Mr. CLEAVER:

Well, we certainly do advocate self-defense for black people. We urge every black family to have in his house guns, and we tell them the most effective type of guns, shotguns, rifles, pistols, of particular calibers, that they can use to defend themselves and also to arm the black community, because we feel that the racist power structure is going to continue to keep this occupying army of police in the community to continue to assault the community and bully the black community, and that the only way that we're going to be able to deal with the situation is to arm the black community to such an extent that the difference between 20 million unarmed black people and 20 million armed black people could be used to force the power structure to grant black people their desires and needs, or else to face the political consequences.

Mr. KEEN:

Then you are opposed to any gun control laws such as are now being considered?

Mr. CLEAVER:

No, no, but I think it's kind of absurd to talk about gun controls in the present context. I would be in favor with the destruction and ridding from the planet earth of all weapons made to kill men, but in the situation that we face today when the police departments are escalating their numbers in the black communities, they're being armed with tanks, armored cars and all type of atrocious weapons to be used against us, it seems to me to be stupid to be in favor of any legislation that would leave the black community unarmed while the racist oppressors are arming themselves to the teeth. I would be in favor of gun

control if it would systematically provide security for all...

Mr. KEEN:

Have you given up hope on any form of cooperation between the black community and the white community to establish peace between them in this country and for the blacks to have equal opportunity?

Mr. CLEAVER:

Well, I've given up hope on certain elements within the white communities. There are certain elements within the white communities that I have total respect for and particularly people in the Peace and Freedom Party, some of the people like in the SDS, young students, and so forth. We have working relationships with these people. We respect them and we feel that their fate is bound up with ours and they feel the same way, so it's not a question of the black community and the white community. We have enemies within the black community and we have enemies within the white community. The black community is subjected to what we call community imperialism, which means that certain elements within the white community, like the businessmen who extort the black community and the political leaders who manipulate the political power of the black community, hold all levers of power and money, all wealth, in their hands, and so that the black community has been turned into a market at this time with a large amount of unemployment within the black community, and without any political power, without any control over the police departments, without any control over the political process or the economic process, then we're just at the mercy of certain elements within the white community. These elements we oppose and we're very glad to have allies within the white

A characterization of the Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) is contained in the appendix attached hereto.

A portion of HAROLD KEEN's interview with LEROY ELDRIDGE CLEAVER was shown on TV Channel 8 in San Diego at 6:25 PM on July 30, 1968.

Approximately 325 people, 75% of them white, and 25% of them Negroes, attended CLEAVER's talk at San Diego State College. all connected with "The Resistance"

this speech. Also attending were

CLEAVER spoke on how the black community must arm Themselves and predicted a war between the black and the whites in the United States. He continually referred to the white power as "pigs" and to anyone having command over Negroes as being "pigs," including police officers, city administrators, and the average white man on the street. Mr. CLEAVER remarked that he feels the Peace and Freedom Party and the Students for a Democratic Society are friends in their movement. CLEAVER let it be known that a BPP group was being formed in San Diego.

A second source stated that approximately 575 people attended CLEAVER's talk in Room 300, Life Science Building, San Diego State College, on July 29, 1968. source said CLEAVER talked about forming a coalition between the BPP and the Peace and Freedom Party to achieve a national unification and recognition important to his campaign for President of the United States. He stated that he had not been invited by President JOHNSON to a briefing session for major Presidential candidates.

pointed out that ROCKEFELLER, NIXON, and other major Presidential candidates had been invited, and that he bad not. In a question and answer session following the speech by CLEAVER, CLEAVER made a statement that HUEY NEWTON, imprisoned Black Panther at Oakland, Florida, must be freed from jail. Someone in the audience asked him, "By any means possible?" To this question, CLEAVER answered, "Yes," and reiterated that in the event that HUEY NEWTON is sentenced to die, he would be removed from the jail by force.

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This second source stated that CLEAVER stayed at the home of ______ (phonetic), who lives in the vicinity of San Diego ______ after his speech at the college. _______ told this second source that CLEAVER was staying with her and her husband because he was afraid he would be arrested by the San Diego Police Department if anyone knew where he was staying.

The following newspaper article appeared in "The Daily Californian," an El Cajon, California daily newspaper, on July 30, 1968:

SAN DIEGO—Eldridge Cleaver for President?

It sounds like a put-on equal to comedian Pat Paulsen's campaign for the presidency.

But Cleaver isn't a comedian. He is minister of information for the Black Panthers, a group of militant Negro nationalists, and he is that organization's candidate for President of the United States.

The Black Panther Party has not qualified for the ballot, so Cleaver's political base is narrow. He is not overly optimistic about being the voters' choice this November.

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"I know they are not ready for me," Cleaver said. "I'm not ready for them. I'm not ready to cater to their opinions."

But Cleaver, wearing a blue turtle-neck sweater and liberally sprinkling his speech with obscenities, was at San Diego State College Monday night trying to broaden his support.

He appealed for a coalition between his Black Panthers and the Peace and Freedom Party, a left-wing organization which succeeded in qualifying for the ballot last spring by getting the required number of signatures.

"What we want to do is to destroy the Republican party," Cleaver said. "We want to destroy the Democratic party be cause it is a conspiracy against the people."

His favorite word for describing the people he doesn't like is

"If there is not going to be freedom for the black people in this country, there will be no freedom for anybody," Cleaver said. "If the black people are going to be destroyed, let every body be destroyed."

The Black Panther Party platform, in addition to asking for full employment, decent housing and education, calls for exempting all black men from military service and releasing all Negroes held in jail or prisons.

Its cause celebre at the moment is the trial of Huey Newton, an Oakland leader of the Black Panthers who is accused of murdering a policeman.

Many of those in the audience, which spilled over from a large lecture room to sidewalks outside, wore "Free Huey" buttons.

"Whether America goes to the right or to the left is the question that is going to decide what happens in the world," Cleaver said. "We want it to go to the left."

Cleaver added, "We do not want to be part of a situation that would deliver us to the Gestapo's gas chambers.

"We want to get into the position where this country cannot move against us without destroying itself."

One of the Black Panther party's platform planks strongly emphasizes arming its members to "protect ourselves from the force and violence of the racist police and the racist military, by whatever means necessary."

Cleaver, author of a best-selling book, "Soul on Ice," denied that the Black Panther party is a racist organization.

"We are not a racist society," he said. "We will not stoop to the level of the KKK (Ku Klux Klan) because it is much too low. But there are some things worse than the KKK and that's HHH (Hubert Horatio Humphrey)."

In the question and answer period, Eldridge fielded questions about Vietnam and possible coalition partners, but he was stumped when somebody asked him what he would do about the Mideast problem.

"I do not know what the solution to that problem is," Cleaver said.

He described the Vietnam War as an "escape mechanism" for the Establishment.

"They want to make a stand for freedom but not here," he said.

Outside the lecture room, petitions were being signed to recall Gov. Ronald Reagan. That drive ends Wednesday.

If Cleaver gets the Peace and Freedom party nomination, he may have some difficulty conducting a campaign. A convicted rapist who has been released from prison, he has to get permission from his parole officer to travel.

APPENDIX

BLACK PANTHER PARTY, also known as Black Panther Party for Self Defense

A source advised that the Black Panther Party for Self Defense (BPPSD) was formed by HUEY PERCY NEWTON, Minister of Defense, and BOBBY GEORGE SEALE, Chairman, in December, 1966, as a militant black nationalist political organization to combat "police brutality," to unite militant black youth, and to determine the destiny of black communities. The political philosophy was taken from writings of Chariman MAO Tse-tung of Communist China and black militant writers.

In March, 1968, the name of the organization was changed to Black Panther Party (BPP).

The official BPP publication, "The Black Panther Party - Black Community News Service," states that the BPP advocates use of guns and guerrilla tactics in their violent revolutionary program to end oppression of black people.

On February 17, 1968, ELDRIDGE CLEAVER, Minister of Information, announced merger of the BPP and Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee (SNCC) and bestowed title of Minister of Justice, BPP, upon H. RAP BROWN, Chairman of SNCC.

SNCC is a militant Negro organization which preaches black supremacy.

NEWTON, aforementioned, is incarcerated in the Alameda County Jail, Oakland, California, awaiting trial on charge of murder of an Oakland police officer.

Headquarters of BPP and Huey P. Newton Defense Fund are located at 4421 Grove Street, Oakland, California.

STUDENTS FOR A DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY

The Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), as it is known today, came into being at a founding convention held at Port Huron, Michigan, in June, 1962. The SDS is an association of young people on the left and has a current program of protesting the draft, promoting a campaign for youth to develop a conscientious objector status, denouncing United States intervention in the war in Vietnam and to "radically transform" the university community, and provide for its complete control by students. Gus Hall, General Secretary, Communist Party, USA, when interviewed by a representative of United Press International in San Francisco, California, on May 14, 1965, described the SDS as a part of the "responsible left" which the Party has "going for us." At the June, 1965, SDS National Convention, an anticommunist proviso was removed from SDS constitution. In the October 7, 1966, issue of "New Left Notes," the official publication of SDS. an SDS spokesman stated that there are some communists in SDS and they are welcome. The national headquarters of this organization as of April 18, 1967, was located in Room 206, 1608 West Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois.

A characterization of the Black Panther Party (BPP) is contained in the attached appendix.

The individuals mentioned below are described as follows:

Eldridge Cleaver, the BPP Minister of Information, is a Federal fugitive residing in Algeria.

David Hilliard, is the BPP Chief of Staff.

Huey Newton, is the BPP Minister of Defense, presently serving a sentence for manslaughter of an Oakland Police Officer.

On June 19, 1970, Eldridge Cleaver was interviewed by Hilly Rose, of KABC radio Los Angeles. The results of this interview were recorded from the radio show by a representative of the FBI. The interview is as follows:

ROSE: Eldridge, today in Washington, D. C. on the steps of the Lincoln Memorial Dave Hilliard made a speech saying they were going to have a new constitutional convention on Labor Day in Philadelphia. I understand thats your basic idea. Can you tell me something about it?

CLEAVER: Well, we take the position that given the history of our people in the struggling and suffering we've done, it is very clear that there is nothing available inside of the American system to give us the type of security and protection that we want and need and it is absolutely clear that the Constitution of the United States which is supposed to be the basic law of the land, it well may be the basic law of the land but it doesn't help, us out. It doesn't subscribe to our best interests against the things that have come up.

ROSE: What do you expect to happen from this new...?

CLEAVER: In view of the system as a whole and particulary against this little trick bag, they let down on us about where we live, and things of that sort. You know what I am talking about.?

ROSE: Yes, Eldridge! What do you expect to happen from this convention? What will happen after the new constitution is written?

CLEAVER: Well, you see there, it's my opinion that the convention will be held after the victory of the people over the pigs who have usurped the power of government in Babylon. I don't want to see people retreating to a contradictable position as though it were just a little novelty or something that they can go and visit.

ROSE: That's what I am trying to find out Eldridge. What specifically is going to happen once this new constitution is written? How are you going to implement it?

CLEAVER: I say that you have to understand we're not talking about having a meeting and making thinkers and everybody gives their little heat off their chest and going back about your business. We are talking about a convention that will have the power to implement any resolution or decisions passed at the convention themselves but it can only be a revolutionary people constitutional convention. It has to be set up in spite, in spite of the attitude of the pigs. I'd say that it is very likely that will happen.

ROSE: Well, what specifically do you think will happen then? Do you think there will be an armed uprising as there was in the 1700's. (Question repeated).

CLEAVER: I think that if it is absolutely necessary for the people to rise up and take the power into their own hands. And the manner in which they rise up always depends

BLACK PANTHER PARTY upon how the enemy is moving against them at a given time. You know? If the enemy advises them, and allows them to go around and to present grievances without any type of problems then I am quite sure that the prothers and sisters would like that, would prefer that. You know? ROSE: Rather than violence? CLEAVER: Murdering people and kidnaping people and just outright framing people up. I would be the very last one to say that the people in the party would not rise up and as a result of that and get other people to rise up along with them. I would be the last to say that won't happen because I will hope that it does happen. Eldridge, there was a report put out by the ROSE: United States Census Bureau showing that while black people are eleven per cent of the population they got twenty-eight per cent of the new craftsman and operative openings in the last decade. Doesn't that show progress to you? Do you really think that black people are that oppressed? CLEAVER: Well, I'm unable to recognize anything saying that degrees of progress under these circumstances. don't recognize any progress. I recognize that our people are still being refused and subversively held as slaves for your bourgeoise. ROSE: Eldridge, do you plan to be here in Philadelphia on September 7th for the new constitution? CLEAVER: My plan is to get back home just as soon as I am able. It is my plan at this particular time depending upon the out come of the situation in court with Huey Newton.

ROSE: Well, I'm not sure I understand. Huey is going to be tried once again. Huey is going to be tried once again for manslaughter and thats going to take quite a bit of time, so Huey won't probably go on trial for another year or more. Does that mean you won't come back for a year or more?

CLEAVER: I don't have to wait until he has a trial. Huey, its a possibility he may get out on bail before Labor Day, right?

ROSE: That's a possibility, yes.

CLEAVER: So, I think it's only natural for me to wait to see how this situation developes before I will know absolutely what I would do, see? Cause if I did go, say to some other country and be far away and then Huey would get out then I would never be able to forgive myself for that.

ROSE: Eldridge what are you doing in Algeria now? Are you writing?

CLEAVER: Of course!

ROSE: What are you writing?

CLEAVER: Well, I don't think we should go into it. You know? Because it's not complete and as things are finished they will be made public and I think thats more then enough. You know?

ROSE: What, I've heard a great deal about the fact at least its been reported here in the United States that you've been taking guerrilla training under the Algerians, is that true?

CLEAVER: Well, you know if it is true then it's good for us. You know?

ROSE: Well, how do you spend your time in Algeria?

CLEAVER: Oh, in various ways. You know? Working and playing, resting and getting tired. You know?

ROSE: Do you see any hope at all, Eldridge, for America to save itself from your point of view?

CLEAVER: Great hope for particularly amongst the young American people. I think that if they always move conventionally the people will move to guarantee their survival, to guarantee their best interests. You see? I think they will, will not be a put on, before the American people are able to not only understand the whole international nature of the problems that we have. To also understand the local manifestations of their problems and I think that they will move decisively to put an end to a lot of what right now we say, we'll never hear or it'll take such a terribly long time. I think the people will supply everybody and move very strongly to protect their humanity.

ROSE: Eldridge, just this week a black man became mayor of Newark, New Jersey. A black man announced he was running for Governor of Arkansas. A black man is running for Senator in South Carolina. Doesn't this give you some hope that maybe the black man has finally emerged into the political stream?

CLEAVER: It tells me that the government of the United States recognizes that it is in the best interest of the ruling class of the United States to develop a little more their relationships with the black bourgeoise so to me it's nothing but a local, an American brand of neo-colonialism developing, for the American ruling class realizes that in order to maintain and control over black people they are going to have to have the active cooperation and help of the black, ah, the black bourgeoise in manipulating and maintaining this control. Now lets give you an example; Mayor Stokes in Cleveland and the man who has become the head of the police department there is General Davis, straight from the Pentagon, so I don't think the position of black people will be improved at all if all that we end up with is a black elected official to have one of these well trained Pentagonpigs for the chief of police. Far from meaning that our situation will have improved, I think that our situation will have come even more cruel and intense as it is right now so electing a

few of these pansies, boot-licking Uncle Toms to a few jive positions in the lower echelons of the government, this does not impress me at all. At all!

ROSE: Well Eldridge, if this new constitution is written this fall when do you think it might take affect in the United States?

CLEAVER: Well, that's one problem that I think needs to be worked out. I don't see how any kind of constitution that the people can draw up under the present circumstances can be enforced or can be anything more than the paper its written on. You understand? My own position on that is that constitutional convention is the message authorized by a precedent in American history, we're dealing with changes of this caliber in a constitutional situation. think that the proper procedure that we must relate to is a procedure of a constitutional convention. Now when you do that it all depends upon when you're in a position to implement the results of the convention. It's absolutely absurd to call a convention to pass resolutions or adapt constitutions that you're in no position to enforce. So, unless that situation is expected to change radically between now and the time of Labor Day, then I don't see what relevance a constitutional convention would have at this time.

ROSE: Alright we have a very bad connection Eldridge, and I think we've covered the subject, thank you very much for talking with us.

BLACK PANTHER PARTY, Also Known As Black Panther Party for Self-Defense

According to its official newspaper, the Black Panther Party (BPP) was started during December 1966, in Oakland, California, to organize black people so they can take control of the life, politics and the destiny of the black community. It was organized by BOBBY SEALE, BPP Chairman, and HUEY P. NEWTON, BPP Minister of Defense. NEWTON was sentenced in 1968 to serve 2 to 15 years after being convicted of manslaughter in connection with the killing of an Oakland police officer.

The official newspaper, "The Black Panther", which further describes itself as the "Black Community News Service", states that the BPP advocates the use of guns and guerrilla tactics in its revolutionary program to end oppression of the black people. Residents of the black community are urged to arm themselves against the police who are consistently referred to in the publication as "pigs" who should be killed.

"The Black Panther" issue of September 7, 1968, contains an editorial by BPP Minister of Education, GEORGE MASON MURRAY, which ends with the following:

"Black men. Black people, colored persons of America, revolt everywhere! Arm yourselves. The only culture worth keeping is a revolutionary culture. Change. Freedom everywhere. Dynamite! Black Power. Use the gun. Kill the pigs everywhere."

Included in the introduction to an article appearing in the October 5, 1968, edition of "The Black Panther" is the statement"...we will not dissent from American Government. We will overthrow it."

Issues of "The Black Panther" regularly contain quotations from the writings of Chairman MAO Tse-tung of the People's Republic of China and feature MAO's statement that "political power grows out of the barrel of a gun."

The national headquarters of the BPP is located at 3106 Shattuck Avenue, Berkeley, California. Branches have been established at various locations throughout the United States.

Enclosed herewith for the Bureau are 12 copies of a letterhead memorandum (IHM), dated and captioned as above which relate to the appearance of LERCY ELDRIDGE CLEAVER, Black Panther Party leader from Oakland, California, who appeared at the Xerox Corporation, Rochester, New York, on 7/26/68, and addressed a group of 190 Negro youth in connection with a public training and educational project sponsore by this corporation and called the "Earn and Learn Program. Incorporated in the IHM is a verbatim transcript of the speed of CLEAVER consisting of 25 pages, obtained from a tape recording furnished by Xerox Corporation. The Bureau will readily note from this transcript that CLEAVER was not only crude but his intentions were clearly to motivate his audience toward militant and criminal activity.

He not only referred to members of the white race as "pigs" and in particular applied this epithet to law enforcement in general and the President of the United States

but he encouraged his young audience to join with the Black Panther Party to burn down or blow up the Xerox Corporation (page 21). In addition, he assured his audience that the Negroes were going to arm themselves, teach the technique of making bombs and to secure dynamite to be used against "the pigs in the power structure," (page 23). Another example of his rabble rousing is his statement "If you all got together, look here, if you all got together, got yourselves together, joined the Black Panther Party and all these niggers across this country got together and joined the Black Panter Party and got themselves some guns, people would all listen..... so if we got ourselves together and we walked on any Army base and take one (hydrogen bomb) because as long as he has a hydrogen bomb pointed at us, we got to have one pointed at him and say 'Well push it, (obscene) 'cause I'm pushing mine.'" (page 26).

The Buffalo Office feels that the inflammatory nature of CLEAVER's speech is such as to bring him possibly within the scope of the recently enacted Anti-Riot Laws as outlined by the Bureau in airtel to all offices, dated 5/13/68, captioned "Anti-Riot Laws." Subject's performance could possibly bring him within the scope of Chapter 102, Title 18, USC, Section 2101 in that subject CLEAVER travelled in interstate commerce to commit an overt act to incite a riot. It is to be noted, however, that no riot actually occurred as a result of CLEAVER's appearance in Rochester, New York, nor was one taking place while he was present.

The Bureau is requested to consider the advisability of consulting with the Department for an opinion as to possible prosecution.

The tape recording of CIEAVER's address on 7/26/68. was furnished to the Buffalo Office by

This pamphlet appears to be campaign material for CLEAVER's presidential campaign, as it solicits campaign workers, volunteers to work for his nomination and financial contributions. It will be noted that CLEAVER is the Presidential candidate of the Peace and Freedom Party.

No leads are being set forth in connection with this pamphlet, but rather are being left to the discretion of the office of origin as Buffalo is not aware if the Post Office Box and the telephone numbers listed thereon are known to San Francisco.

The New York State Police and the Rochester Police Department were advised of subject's visit to Rochester, prior to his arrival and the liaison was maintained with both agencies during his stay in Rochester, New York.

No lead is being set forth for the Newark Division to identify New Jersey License Number mentioned in

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attached LHM, since this lead has previously been set out.

No specific lead is being set forth for New York concerning both mentioned in attached LHM. However, in view of their involvement in engaging CLEAVER to address the members of the Earn and Learn Program of the Xerox Corporation, Rochester, New York, may be desirous of developing background information concerning both of these individuals and making an assessment based on the information developed.

Buffalo will remain alert through a liaison with racial and police sources for any indication that the Black Panther Party is attempting to organize.

LEROY ELDRIDGE CLEAVER BLACK PANTHER PARTY RACIAL MATTERS

The characterization of the Black Panther Party (BPP) is contained in the Appendix pages of this communication.

The "New York Times," a daily newspaper, published in New York City, on page 36m reported in its August 19, 1968, edition that ELDRIDGE CLEAVER, author, parolee and leader in the Black Panther movement in Oakland, California, was nominated on August 18, 1968, for the Presidency of the United States by the new and radical Peace and Freedom Party (PFP). CLEAVER, in addressing the convention of this Party on the University of Michigan campus, Ann Arbor, Michigan, reportedly spoke of uniting the dispossessed, the alienated, the angry, the insane and the prison inmates. He said "We want to gather all the madmen together, because we have to confront madmen." CLEAVER was identified in the article as minister of information of the Black Panther's, a militant group that sometimes considers arms and talks of using guns in self defense to protect the Black community from the police.

100 of the under-privileged youths during the Summer of 1968. Xerox agreed to comply; however, at their own initiative, they decided to double the number to 200 youths whom they would attempt to assist.

As a result of this, the Earn and Learn Program was designed by Xerox and contact was established with the Rochester School System, which was requested to furnish the names of 200 potential dropouts, who could be helped if given an opportunity to work and learn.

191 youths have been employed full time by Xerox for the period July 1, 1968, through August 30, 1968, receiving \$1.80 per hour for five days a week. They actually work four and one half days, six hours per day, two hours each day and four hours on Friday are devoted to the educational phase of the program.

The educational phase of this program does not include scholastic subjects, but rather is an attempt by the Xerox Corporation to familiarize these youths with the opportunities available to them in the business world, if they were to continue their formal education and graduate from high school and possibly go on to college. It is an attempt by Xerox to motivate and stimulate these individuals to help themselves and obtain a better way of life.

According to ______ Xerox is of the opinion the program has been unsuccessful and that Xerox intends to offer full time employment to those members of the group who have already graduated from high school, but at this time are unable to continue on to college. He further advised that Xerox will offer employment to approximately loo of these individuals.

She pointed out that the assurances gained by the American Revolution, the Constitution and the Declaration of Independence are beautiful principles but they have never been property applied to the Black people. Her remarks were on a less militant plain than those of her husband and are not being set forth herein.


"Xerox Corp. yesterday announced its education division is transferring responsibility for developing and marketing products for the formal school market from New York City to Ginn and Co., Boston-based textbook publishing house acquired last month by Xerox.

"The consolidation, according to Robert W. Haight, Xerox group vice president who heads the division, means 'we will be reducing our staff in New York City by about 80 people which represents some two per cent of the total employes in the education division.' Haigh said each of the employes has been notified and all will be given assistance in finding new employment.

"Haigh said, 'the consolidation of curriculum development and marketing efforts in the with the known Ginn organization should enable us to provide more effective service to schools across the country.'

"Some of the products to be shifted are 'Science - A Process Approach,' an elementary science program which was developed in conjunction with the American Association for the Advancement of Science; 'The Way It Is, a reading series designed for use with inner-city teenagers, and the Consumer Education Program,' a series of programmed instruction booklets aimed at improving the shopping skills of the poor."

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APPENDIX

BLACK PANTHER PARTY, Also Known As Black Panther Party for Self Defense

A source advised that the Black Panther Party for Self Defense (BPPSD) was formed by HUEY PERCY NEWTON, Minister of Defense, and BOBBY GEORGE SEALE, Chairman, in December, 1966, as a militant Black Nationalist political organization to combat "police brutality," to unite militant Black youth, and to determine the destiny of Black communities. The political philosophy was taken from writings of Chairman Mao TSE-TUNG of Communist China and Black militant writers.

In March, 1968, the name of the organization was changed to Black Panther Party (BPP).

The official BPP publication, "The Black Panther Party - Black Community News Service," states that the BPP advocates use of guns and guerrilla tactics in their violent revolutionary program to end oppression of Black people.

On February 17, 1968, ELDRIDGE CLEAVER, Minister of Information, announced merger of the BPP and Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee (SNCC) and bestowed title of Minister of Justice, BPP, upon H. RAP BROWN, Chairman of SNCC.

SNCC is a militant Negro organization which preaches Black supremacy.

NEWTON, aforementioned, is incarcerated in the Alameda County Jail, Oakland, California, awaiting trial on charge of murder of an Oakland Police Officer.

Headquarters of BPP and Huey P. Newton Defense Fund are located at 4421 Grove Street, Oakland, California.

Female: (Cont'd) "a system of organizing, how you make a living, and who you go to school, and how you do anything is to serve your own interests and once it becomes something outside of us, a corporation, a Federal government, and a war machine and all this with too many who don't have a say in that, who can't even touch it, who can't even relate to it, who don't even now the names of the people who run it and don't know the budget, can't find it out, don't have no way as to ...okay...they gonna spend several million dollars a day to kill Vietnamese. What could we do if we had several millions dollars a day and we decided to kill with it...like that?

"I think I've talked long enough. I'll let my husband talk, and thank you.

Applause.

LEROY ELDRIDGE

CLEAVER:

"When I start talking I like to say, 'all power to the people and black power to black people.

Audience:

Applause and cheering.

Male:

"Because power is what we've got to have. saw people outside on my way in who looked like FBI Agents. I don't know if they really were but if they were, I want to tell them,

'Welcome, pigs.'

Audience:

Applause and cheering.

Male:

"I'm glad that you're here because it's better, it's better for you to get your information... that's not the FBI...

Audience:

Loud laughter.

"It's better for you to get your information straight from the panther's mouth than to get it second hand so that we say you really don't have to snoop on the panthers...all you have to do is listen because we don't have anything to hide and we try to tell everything in the open because we feel that the truth can stand on its own merits; it doesn't have to be hid; it doesn't have to be defended because it will defend itself. Now the truth of this situation here is rather, rather complicated. On the one hand, we have Xerox Corporation finally spending money to have a program and project for people so they can have something to do, so they can learn some-Now when I see an audience of this size with all these black people in it, my primary concern is to recruit them for the Black Panther Party because I believe that every black person should become a member of the Black Panther Party. Those who don't sign up, we're gonna draft.

Audience:

Laughter and applause.

Male:

"We're gonna draft; we're gonna sent you a letter that says: 'Greetings, Brother.'

Audience:

Laughter.

Male:

"But it's gonna come from the black house not from the White House (more laughter and applause). If you don't, if you don't, if you don't respond to that draft, then we're gonna sent our police after you (more laughter) and you gotta answer the same way you would have to answer if that other pig, LBJ, (laughter) would send you one and you didn't come. We're dealing with a very complicated situation. I read an article about Xerox magazine, Xerox

"Corporation. I've always liked Xerox because those little machines are very functional. We don't have one and we can't afford one but we'll learn to steal one.

Audience:

Laughter.

Male:

"I mean we got to have one see because we have black propaganda that we have to get out and it's like...

Audience:

Laughter.

Male:

"...So all you brothers and sisters here, you have to recognize, you have to recognize that you too can play a part in the revolution... that you might liberate one of those machines and give it to the Black Panther Party.

Audience:

Laughter and applause.

Male:

"But you got to be careful, you got to be careful because they're sitting here, they've heard this, and they're gonna be counting, they'll have their inventories going so be careful but get us, get us one of those great big ones. Get us one of the great big ones because it can almost function like a human being, you can put your paper in there, walk away, press a button, and come back and get your stuff. Don't come with one of those little ones, you know, like one, two, three, because we got to move fast because time is running out. running out and a lot of time is being wasted; I think that our primary concern must be that when we get involved with the programs, our time is not being wasted. I asked the brother who organized this program what the age group of the people who were part of the program was

"and he said 16, 17 and some 18. Well when BOB (unintelligible) and HUEY NEWTON organized the Black Panther Party, the first brother who joined the party was 16 years old; I think he was 15 years old at that time, BOBBY HUTTON. He was murdered on April 6 by the Oakland Police Department but it's significant that BOBBY HUTTON at that young age had himself together enough that he was able to hear, he was able to respond, so that we can't sell young people short. am sure that there are a lot of brothers and sisters here in the audience who are going to make a great contribution to the black revolution. You're gonna have to attempt to make it because you're gonna be forced to do Xerox Corporation, if it's not providing you with real skills and with adequate compensation, it's wasting your time. know that they might consider it inhospitable or rude for me to come here after being invited here and to talk about them but white races of America have been rude to black people and one of the first things that we've got to do is to learn and to understand that we have a right to stand up anywhere and discuss our problems and whoever doesn't like it can make it, can split, because we've got to get an understanding about our problems and how to deal with them. It would be a very beautiful thing if black people had the whole tradition, the educational ability, to invent a Xerox machine ... if they had millions of dollars to finance production of Xerox machines but we don't have that. We come here, born into a wretched situation, inadequate resources, in a society that's based on dog eat dog and we call that competition, free enterprise, and they tell you that every man, every child that's born, starts off even and

"that he can be what he wants to be in this Well, we say, that's true...that you, even though you were born into a white racist society, even though you were born without resources, you can see your star in the sky, you can achieve that; but you're not going to do it by going through the channels that the white racist society has set up to essentially keep you out. It's a very sad situation but every time the white folks do something for us on a large scale, we got to be careful about it because nine times out of nine or maybe out of ten, there's some trick in the game somewhere and it's very clear to me that this society is trying to trick us They say that we were emancipated 100 years ago, that we were let out of slavery, and that we were supposed to receive 40 acres and a mule...Brother HUEY always says 40 acres and two mules...but it's very clear that we didn't get that, that we got cooled out on another level. We got let out of slave pens and we got cooped up in segregated areas so that we have to be very careful in this day and time not to let history repeat itself again on us because this is the last go around, brothers and sisters, and I want to say something to the young white people here: the young white people in this country are the only white people that I can really dig because a lot of the old white people are so ossified, so corrupt with racism, that even though they know they're racists, they have patterns of behavior that just won't let them act right. (Slight laughter.) Thev don't know how to act right even when they want to act right ... sometime even if they're insulting you, you know, and if there's anything that's stimulating the revolution in the black community of this country it's the daily insults

"that we have to confront." Is that right? (Murmured agreement by audience.) insulted and injured...we hold those little insults in contempt maybe to a greater extent than we hold some of the more flagrant abusives because we know the flagrant abusives for what they are; and the people who are heap these flagrant abusives upon us have to know that too but in the little petty ways, they have become blind to that; they we blind to what they're doing to you sometimes and when you react to it, they're surprised, they're shocked, and they feel you're out there and that I bent over backwards for this nigger and look how he's acting.

Laughter.

Male:

"So that when black people in this day and time are going out on to the streets, burning, blowing things up, taking guns, and shooting pigs dead, they say that you're acting crazy, that you're not playing fair.

Audience:

Laughter.

Male:

"That's what they say, that's what they say, that's what they mean and LBJ, himself, says that we should overcome (laughter); he says we will overcome but what he was doing was saying that we're going to overcome my way and his way, you dig, is to like drop bombs on people, to escalate the finances for the police department, and we know that these police departments are nothing but occupied armies, that they control and patrol our communities like a standing army in a foreign country and the Xerox Corporation is really interested in the welfare of black people because it must pay a heavy amount

"of taxes because it's making big money.
Everybody wants one of those machines they got, you dig?

Audience:

Laughter.

Male:

"And they don't want to sell them to people, they rent them...see, they got a monopoly on that. Well, they have some competitors now that are messing up their game. I mean, that's part of capitalism; they can't be mad about that because they endorse capi-Someone else snuck around and saw talism. what the patent was all about, made a few changes, and got them a machine out there is good too but like Xerox is Theirs what people think about. So Xerox pays a lot of taxes and those taxes go to pay the salaries of pigs; those taxes go to pay for the guns and the tanks, the flame throwers, the stoner rifles, and all this shit that they're bringing into our communities to continue oppressing us and to keep us cor-So the Xerox Corporation doesn't only have a responsibility of providing some functional relationship to the economy to the people by hooking them in, letting them have jobs, letting they get some training...don't come to us with your left hand, your right hand out offering us some peanuts and with your left hand behind your back giving up heavy bread to the pigs because we're hip to that and we're gonna do something about that and the whole history of black people culminates to this point, that we've gone through the sit-ins, we've gone through the freedom rides, we've gone through tons and tons of litigations in the courts and that all we have to show for it are summer projects and a escalation of pigs who occupy

"our community but we have to recognize today is that there is a new spirit in the world, that the black people that they have to deal with today are not the same black people that they had to deal with a few years ago because I know that sitting in this room we have young lawyers and we have sisters who can dig that and we have these young white cats who can relate to that. Is that right?

Audience:

"That's right. That's right.

Male:

"Do you recognize the difference between these young white people and these old funky racists? Do you?

Audience:

Applause and laughter.

Male:

"So see the pigs have been trying to destroy the Black Panther Party and one of the chief means that they try to use against us was to say that we were a racist organization but we found out that there was an organization in the white community called the Peace and Freedom Party that we could work with. don't have to change any of our program. still relate to the fundamental tool of liberation, which is the gun, but we recognize that white people have a functionary role to play in the revolution so we made an alliance with them, we made a coalition with them, and so now when the pigs tell lies and like say the Black Panther Party is a racist organization, we don't even answer that anymore. We tell these white cats to deal with that and they eat those old racists up; they eat them up because they recognize that these old people have created a situation where their very future's in doubt. The old people who have control of this country have put the whole

"world on a death rope. All these big corporations are the chief culprits. The corporations in this country are the ones who control this country. The man who controls Xerox Corporation can tell LBJ what to do. LBJ might not do it because he is a fool, you dig? (Laughter.) He listens to some angel in the sky; I don't know who he is listening to; or some angel beneath the earth but he don't listen to reasonable people. He's a very unreasonable man; he's doing unreasonable things to people...but Xerox Corporation has power; it has power because it controls money; money because it controls some machinery that can produce a machine that can be sold, not sold, can be rented and that can provide income and what do we have that we can rent to get income? That's all we got...our muscles...and the trick they're putting us in today is that they're inventing machines to take the place of our muscles and because some of us don't even think too much at all, they're inventing machines. that can do the little thinking that we were doing (loud laughter) so I mean this is a, this is a dangerous situation. When machines become obsolete, they get rid of them and the pigs are so vicious that when people become obsolete, they get rid of them too and black people in this country have become obsolete as far as the capitalists are concerned; they don't need us anymore. They got machines to take our place, and the reason they could have this attitude is not because there is any conflict between us and the machines but because there is conflict between us and how those machines are controlled; how the income from those machines is distributed; how those machines are owned. Deeds of trust...pieces of paper...they could put out say like say I own that mountain of iron because I have a piece

"of paper here that my father left me that says that I own it. (Laughter.) Well, he's a liar, he's a thief because he came out of his mammy's womb naked. He didn't have nothing when he came here but a naked ass (laughter) ... just like the rest of us; just like the rest of us. come here the same way but we find that at the beginning, we have to deal with a whole lot of stuff, that we have been organized into poverty, and that these rich white boys have been organized into wealth and into power so what we're saying to do is we're gonna break that up; we're gonna step outside the rules of this game; we're gonna mess up your summer projects and any other projects that you come up with until our people receive some justice and until they receive justice there ain't gonna be no peace and you can lie back and scheme and think that you've come up with a brand new game to play on black people but you're a fool if you think that, you're a liar because we're not gonna have it. cessary, we'll come down here to Xerox and burn it down (Cheers from audience)...we'll blow Xerox up (more cheers)...that's right. Wait a minute, wait a minute, wait a minute...we'll come, we'll come down here to Xerox and get one of these fools to kick into his rump and blow it up.

Applause and laughter.

Male:

"Now we know, we know, wait a minute, we know that he has pigs here to protect him and knowing that he has pigs here to protect him, we're gonna come here prepared to deal with those pigs because what we're saying today, that this is the last time around, and black people are gonna get their share or there ain't gonna be no share for anybody.

Applause and cheers.

Male: (Cont'd)

"That's the way it is. They say that, they say that every man, woman, and child on the face of the planet Earth has a right to the best living that technology is able to provide period. I don't mean every white child, every white man, every white woman, I said every man, woman, and child on the face of the planet Earth has a right to the best living the best of everything that technology is able to produce...red man, yellow man, brown man, black man, white man. And we're gonna have it or we gonna (obscene).

Audience:

Applause and laughter.

Male:

"Listen, listen, this is, this is where we are today, this is where we are today, you see, we say that every, every young growing person has a right to an education because an education is nothing but passing on to the people the hazards of the human race, passing on to you what you need to cope with your environment...that if you were living in an economy, in a society where your people earned a living and survived through like fishing and hunting, that's not so complicated so that your father could teach you how to fish, your father could teach you how to hunt and you could take care of that business; but in a complex society, in a complex economy where everything is specialized, where one man does this, another man does this, and another man does something altogether different, it requires specialized skills and the way that they've done us is that they've but us on the side lines and we didn't get any skills but we learned how to take because we had to take in order to survive. We learned how to destroy because most of the things around us didn't belong to us so we did it on account,

"we did it for kicks. Whatever we did it for, we knew how to do it; and this society has not provided us with our heritage. This society has not instilled in us the skills and the knowledge that is necessary to cope with this complex situation so now they're trying to make it up in a (unintelligible word) manner. No... you're gonna make it up in a very realistic manner; you're gonna make it up all the way because anytime you try to sell us short, we're gonna mess that up. Everything you try to give us...a summer program...you're gonna find out we have to have a winter program because as soon as the summer's over and were not involved in this program, we're gonna get off into that That's the only way it's gonna be; the again. only way the black people of this country, the only way the black people of this country are gonna get what they have to have in order to survive, to live a good life is by using the only power we have and that is the power to disrupt this system, the power to destroy if gonna organize black if we don't get it. We people from one end of this big, raggedy, greasy, racist, beastly, (word unintelligible) system, we gonna organize them; we're gonna make sure that they have guns; we're gonna make sure that they know how to make bombs; we're gonna make sure that they know how to get dynamite; we're gonna make sure that they can get everything that's out there to take care of business and we're gonna tell the pigs in the power structure, 'Give it up, (obscene).'

Audience:

Laughter and applause and cheers.

Male:

"...and we're gonna do this. Wait a minute, wait a minute, wait a minutes (laughter). Hold tight, hold tight, hold tight. Okay, okay, okay. Hey, wait a minute; hey, wait a minute. What's wrong? Hey, say, what's

"wrong with you niggers? What's wrong with you niggers? Don't you know the white man don't want you acting like that? (Laughter.)

You don't care what he thinks?

Audience:

Amidst laughter, "No."

Male:

"Right on, right on. That's what I said.
You ain't got nothing to hide and if he don't like it, ask him why, why you don't

like it pig?'

Audience:

Laughter, cheering, applause.

Male:

"I know, see, some of them don't like it because they get paid not to like it. Some of them don't like it because it don't look right Some of them don't like it because they're nude. (Laughter.) They got all kinds of reasons for not liking it and it upsets them to see that you really dig it. They say like, 'What's wrong with these niggers?' (Laughter.) That man was standing there talking about blowing up Xerox and them niggers out there on the Xerox program was applauding. (Laughter.) this can be interpreted that what it means is that you understand that you have Xerox up tight; that Xerox ain't giving you nothing because it loves you, because it things it's humanitarian. Xerox is giving you this because Xerox is a progressive organization and it looks to the future, you dig?

Audience:

Laughter and applause.

Male:

"Wait a minute, wait a minute...compare, compare Xerox with Coca Cola (Laughter). Compare Xerox with some of these other corporations who better not go around talking about giving me a summer project...we're turning dogs loose on you like

"they did (word unintelligible). (Laughter.) So I'm not, I'm not saying nice things about Xerox because the man from Xerox has promised one of those machines for the Black Panther Party (Laughter). No. I'm gonna get me one of those machines; I'm gonna liberate one. (Laughter.) I'm gonna take one, I'm gonna take one just for kicks, I know where one is right now. (Laughter and applause.) Listen now, you live, you people live in this community here?

Audience:

Varied simultaneous answers. Laughter.

Male:

"You don't live around here?

Audience:

"No.

Male:

"...and how you gonna get these machines; these machines, do you make them?

Audience:

(Unintelligible).

Male:

"Well, why don't you bring some tents, go out and stake out those grounds and say I'm taking this. Say, I'm taking this from you like you took it from the Indians. I'm staking my claim and I got a gun like you have and I'm gonna defend it like you would. aint got no bow and arrows! (Laughter.) These fools, these fools got hydrogen bombs and they're trying to pass on this gun control legislation; they don't want us to have no pistols. They got hydrogen bombs, they got machine guns, they got airplanes, and tanks, and submarines...and they don't want us to have no guns at all. Understand? They must be crazy or they must think we're crazy because we have to say take your old gun control legislation...

Audience:

Laughter, cheers, and howls of approval.

Male:

"Because not only do we welcome guns, not only do we welcome guns; but as long as other people on the face of this planet Earth have hydrogen bombs, we want one too. That's right. We want a black finger on the nuclear trigger (laughter) and because we don't have time to be building laboratories and trying to develop scientists to make one, we know that you, Mr. White Man, have a lot of them and we're gonna take one from you.

Audience:

"Right.

Male:

"That's right and I'm not just saying that; I'm not just saying that; I'm saying this: that when we get our shit together now, yeah, if you all got together, look here, if you all got together, got yourselves together, joined the Black Panther Party and all these niggers across this country got together and joined the Black Panther Party and got themselves some guns, people would all listen. There's a world of difference between 25 or 30 million unarmed black people and 25 or 30 million niggers armed to the gills (applause). So if we got ourselves together and we walk on any Army base and take one (laughter) because as long as he has a hydrogen bomb pointed at us, we got to have one pointed at him and say, 'Well push it, (obscene) 'cause I'm pushing mine.

Audience:

Laughter and applause.

Male:

"Listen here, wait a minute, wait a minute, just wait a minute...it seems the white folks have programmed us; they have programmed us

"where we're not supposed to act like that, you see? I mean, they have programmed us to believe that it's good and proper for us to cut each other up and kick sisters in the rump, you dig? ...and for sisters to be (phrase unintelligible) on us after (obscene) over them. (Laughter.) I mean, all that, all that's supposed to be all right but he has programmed us so we don't even think in terms of getting in his ass. See? But we know, we can deal with them (word unintelligible), can't we brothers?

Audience:

"Yeah.

Male:

"I remember when I was going to school; I just couldn't believe that no white boy could kick my ass. Just, I mean, just to be truthful about it, to be truthful about it, there was some who could do that. I ran into some rough white boys, you dig? I was in a reform school because I started (obscene) up when I was young. I've always been crazy (laughter) and I tell you, I mean, I just ... if I wanted something and I didn't have it... I didn't want no job; look, I didn't (phrase unintelligible) that would have crammed my style. Look, I wanted to be cool. to be somewhere loaded and coasting and just cooling it. You know. So when I needed something, what I'd do, I'd go out there and just rip it off and at first, I thought that was a cool thing to do because they were busting me, sending me to the reform school, was keeping me for a few months and cutting me loose and I said, well, if I had stayed out here and had been working eight hours a day, eight times five, you know, that's forty, times four, times a whole year, times...shit... that's about how much time I spent in jail.

"(Laughter.) So I figured, I figured that I would do it this other way and I'd just take what I wanted and go up there and rest and come back and take some more (applause and laughter) but see, they don't play fair because what they do, you see, after you get a certain age, they increase that shit, you dig? (Laughter.) So the last time they sent me up, they kept me in there nine years and I said, shit. I couldn't relate to that so I have to change my game. I still want what I I'm gonna have to get another way of getting it. So I had to start thinking about what the whole thing was about and it boiled down to politics; it boiled down to the way that society's organized because in the first place, here I was; here was all the stuff that I read about in magazines and saw on TV; all these things I wanted, you know, and some how they had me organized where I couldn't dig it. I mean I just couldn't go for these changes; I still don't go for these changes. Punching those time clocks for some fool like the fool who owns this place here. Punching his time? No, the only way I would punch a time clock here is if the people owned it. If the people who have a revolution expropriate property of these gentlemen sitting right here today, expropriate it (laughter), take it; if they don't like it, lock 'em up. If they don't stay locked up, (unintelligible) (laughter and applause). You know, I mean that is, we are actually (unintelligible) (laughter). Listen, listen, the only reason that people who have come together in an organized society is there to facilitate survival. People don't come together to organize social units in order to let a few peewees exploit the rest of them. They don't come together in an organized situation in order to be slaves. They don't come together in order

to be put on a (unintelligible) summer project. People come together in a social organization so that a more efficient means can be organized to increase and assure survival on a higher level, because if it doesn't do that, it ain't worth nothing. might as well go out on your own and survive on your own. So that here we have a, I started to say civilization, but there is no civilization here in Babylon (laughter). Here this society stretches from the Atlantic to the Pacific and from the Gulf of Mexico to the Canadian border, we have 180, 190, 200 million people. All of these people living together in a huge social conglomorate; but the way this here is organized, it's not functional for the people because we have pigs on the top, talking about, we all know this and we all work for us, but we been working for 'em, but we done took a count, and we said eenie meenie miny moe. You dig? There's more of us. (laughter) There are more people in this country that are pigs and we feel that the people can do without the pigs. We don't need the pigs. We don't need blood-sucking exploiters. We don't need 'em. These doctors, these technicians who are here, these instructors, I say go on back. That man there, look at him, tears all broke out ...

Audience:

Howls of laughter.

Male:
 (Cont'd)

Wait a minute. Wait a minute. Look here. Wait a minute. Wait a minute, that wasn't fair. The man, he may have been thinking about how serious this here is. (laughter) But, I can't read his mind. I don't know what he was thinking, but I saw a brother over here that said "ah, you shouldn't have said that." I get more up tight about a fool like that than I would about a pig.

Audience:

Agreement and laughter.

Because one of the first things we have to do is to get rid of these (unintelligible), get rid of these Uncle Toms and snitchers because, see, if we could get rid of the snitchers, we could really be up tight. I mean, we could get together and we could know everybody that was snooping on us because if all the black people together and all the snitchers and Uncle Toms and the rats could be weeded out, the only way he gonna be able to sneak up on us is with his eawsdropping devices, tap tapping on the telephone and things; and didn't they just pass a law that calls these things illegal? They did that and did that because they see that these niggers is getting together and they know, they anticipate, that we will weed out these Uncle Toms and get rid of these (unintelligible) and these snitchers and these rats and these punks. You see, and so they wanted to be prepared in advance so that they could steal a snoor on us long distance. You dig? So what we have to do is get hip with them to learn how to jam their shit. (laughter) Now, we don't know how to jam it because you see they can play the samething on us and we can't sneak up on them because we black and when they see us coming, they change the subject. I know that where I was working, maybe where I'm working now, I don't want to sav because they might tell my hoss and I don't give a damn because he don't do nothing about it, but I'm going to say it. But, once upon a time, I was working at a certain place and I was on the staff, you dig, so I was entitled to attend the staff meetings and what those fools did, they used to hold two staff meetings.

Audience:

Laughter.

They'd hold one while I was there, and a certain thing would be decided and agreed upon, passed resolutions. I'd go away because I'd know what to do. I'd look around and something else was being done that I haven't had nothing to do with. Alright, so I just kept on doing what I was doing anyway 'cause I know they wasn't going to play fair. You see, they have two meetings on me. (several phrases unintelligible) We got to have it and we gonna get it...

Audience:

Several comments of agreement.

Male: (Cont'd)

... by any means necessary. If you don't want to talk about it and negotiate it, if you don't want to do it in a reasonable manner, we're perfectly willing to be reasonable because we don't want to get involved in a whole lot of shit. I mean, that's not, you know, that ain't cool. That ain't our style. You dig? A pig shot me in my leg, ORVILLE shot my foot off. But he was a fool, he was scared, he couldn't shoot straight. (laughter) He thought my head was where my feet are, you see. But I'm glad he couldn't do that because I don't want to be hopping around in a wheel chair or on a pair of crutches. I can't complete that statement 'cause I'm married now. I was going to say because I can't chase the chicks fast enough. (laughter) But I still don't want one leg because there are other things, being married, that I wouldn't be able to do right. You dig? You see? (laughter) And that's serious; I don't want that; so I'll be perfectly willing to negotiate the situation. But how can you negotiate with pigs who are so blind and so stupid that they think that they can continue playing a game on the people until all eternity. They have an old saying that a ruling class never learns anything from the history, that they repeat all the mistakes of

the past; and if they are blind, if they persist until the people come in there with a long twisted sword and cut

his (obscene) head off.

Audience:

Laughter and applause.

Male:

Cut it right off. Because if he don't listen to reason, we gonna have to do it in such a way that he get the point. So, I guess I have been rattling my mouth

enough.

Audience:

Shouts of disagreement.

Male:

Well, it ain't no point. You all ain't

going to act right.

Audience:

Disagreement.

Male:

You, sister right here, what you gonna do sister? You gonna join the Panthers?

Where you live at?

Female in Audience:

Where do I live?

Male:

Yeah.

Female:

(answer unintelligible)

Male:

Where's that? Harlem?

Female:

Oh know, that's in Rochester. You know? We don't have Harlem.

Audience:

Laughter.

Female:

Third Ward, Seventh Ward and Eleventh

Ward. We call it a ghetto.

Male:

Well, see they got some Black Panthers in Harlem now, you dig? We had a rally.

We had a rally.. Pardon?

Male in Audience:

When are they getting in Rochester?

Female in

Gaulement: You ain't

You ain't got nobody (unintelligible).

Male:

Wait a minute. You don't insult these

brothers. Wait a minute.

Audience:

Various remarks and comments.

Male:

No, No, No. Wait a minute. Wait a minute, brothers. You don't do that. You don't tell me that all these sol-

diers I see here are scared.

Female in Audience:

They are. Your're right.

Male:

No, No, No. The only thing (laughter). Wait a minute. See, when you start talking like that I'm gonna give it to brother because I take that shit all the time. See? Because if it was left up to these sisters, boy, we'd be in the middle of this shit right now.

Audience:

Some applause and some disagreement.

Nale:

No, No. Wait a minute. I'm not saying that you wrong; you right. I say this sister, all you sisters here, you get together and have a meeting, you dig? You get together and find out who gonna stick with you, which sisters gonna stick together; those that ain't gonna stick together, tell them to go split. Those that will stick together, tell the brothers to go away, don't call you on the telephone, don't come around talking about giving you some sugar (laughter) until they get themselves together. You dig?

get themselves together. You dig?

Audience:

Various remarks and comments.

Male: (Cont'd)

Tell them to get themselves together. Tell them to get themselves together. Tell them to have a meeting down hare, say for the Black Panthers. (phrase unintelligible) BROTHER FORD, that brother about 18 years old. He is out of sight. I'm gonna see him tomorrow. I'm gonna tell him about this and we gonna do something about it. If anybody else wants to deal with that, give me your address and your phone number and I'm gonna tell BROTHER FORD to come 'round here and put this shit together. You see? But you brothers, you brothers, you brothers, I'm with you brothers because I know you gonna get together because you got to get together cause I done told on you, see?

Audience:

Laughter.

Male:

So when you get together, when you get yourselves together, if these sisters get together, you tell them. Hah. Well, that might not work, huh?

Audience:

Laughter and various comments.

Male:

Think of some way to run around them, brothers. See, a pretty little sister like that, she could mess up the revolution all by herself. (laughter) You dig? But we not gonna do that, we not gonna do that because we realize, you and I, we can't afford to do that. So we gonna put it together. We gonna organize black people all across this country. We gonna get us freedom, justice and equality. We gonna get the security. We gonna get so as we gonna get to sleep at night knowing, knowing that we gonná wake up in the morning not in a concentration camp.

Female in Audience:

They got them already.

Male: (Cont'd)

That's right; they got them right now. We know it, and we can't go to sleep at night waking up knowing what is going to be going on tomorrow. You've been in You haven't been listening to the news. You don't know what's going on. Rochester might be burning down there right now. You dig? They might be doing that, but this is something that you have to understand; that there are ways of doing thing that are better than others. Like the Black Panther Party was organized because BROTHER HUEY NEWTON and BROTHER BOBBY SILL, who liv' in Oakland, California, were sitting back checking the shit out when Watts went up. They made the statistics and they saw that all those black people got killed; and then they read the statistics from all these other places, you see, and here there were some niggers running around out in the streets throwing some fuel bombs and rocks at pigs, knowing full well that those pigs blow all the way. So that's not an intelligent thing to do, you see. You don't do that. You don't take care of your (unintelligible) that way. People only do that when they don't have another alternative. People in that position don't know what to do, and they're so fed up with the situation that they want to do something so they just go out and say (obscene) and throw a brick at a pig, and the pig right away say (obscene), I'm gone.

Audience:

Laughter.

I mean, that's no good because we want to use the strategic method. (unintelligible). We have enough to survive, you dig? We have enough to survive. So that what you do, you invite the Black Panther Party down here and we will organize black people in this community. We create a machine in this community that will be able to deal with this system and try to minimize casualties. You see? Because we relate to the situation from the top to the bottom, from politics all the way down to what happens on the street. And we say that if we organize black people and put all that strength together, get all that unity, then we will be able to send our representative to Washington, D.C. and say "I have been instructed by my people to give you this list of demands and I have been instructed to inform you that if these demands are not fulfilled by a certain amount of time, that you will recognize that a political consequence has been inflicted upon you." (discussion within the audience) It says, ELDRIDGE's program will be until 4:30.

Audience:

Quarter to five.

Male:

Buses are ready. Rides have.... (several phrases unintelligible) Wait a minute now, I rode it (làughter and applause) (phrase unintelligible) Only, uh, Black Panthers and friends have to be back by 5:00 PM.

Audience:

Shouts of disagreement.

Male:

It's 4:20 right now. I got ten more minutes.

May I ask if there are any questions or

demands? Yeah, o.k.

Audience:

Several comments and remarks.

Now, do we have any questions or

demands?

Audience:

Several comments.

Male:

(Phrase unintelligible) The only thing we have to do is learn to defend each other. (phrase unintelligible). Now I'm going to cut out of here so pay attention, see. Alright? These fools, these children, these descendants of the kidnappers who brought my forefathers over here, who put them through all those changes and who ended up on one side of the table and me on the other side of the table, think that they have a right to tell me what to do. So, although I'm not in a position to tell them just what (unintelligible), but I'm not able to make him act like I want him to act so in order to continue around I kind of have to go along with him. I have to go to him to get permission any time I want to go to Rochester. I want to go to Rochester, New York, because I have been invited by Xerox Corporation to talk to a summer project. So he says "o.k., you can go;" and I say "thank you, (obscene)."

Audience:

Howls of laughter.
