In connection with the forthcoming visit of the President to the Pacific Area, I thought he would be interested to know that the program under which foreign. police officials receive training at the FBI National Academy should prove of particular assistance in making the necessary arrangements for his stops at the foreign capitals. National Academy graduates are located in all the points he is scheduled to visit with the exception of Australia and Samoa.

There are twelve graduates currently active in aw enforcement in Manila, eight in Bangkok, four in Kuala umpur, and one each in Seoul and Wellington. Each of hese men holds high rank in his agency and can be expected o be fully cooperative with my representatives who will be stationed in the various cities. They have been trained in United States law enforcement techniques and policies and may be expected to be of invaluable assistance in connection with the important mission at hand. In addition, each area except Samoa is regularly visited by FBI liaison representatives stationed abroad, who have built up a reservoir of good will in the police agencies involved. 3862-111200

I feel it is particularly interesting that the President, who has done so much to improve law enforcement in less fortunate countries, should now be able to receive an unanticipated direct benefit from this phase of our foreign assistance program.

Special Agent Supervisor Robert Haynes, who is coordinating the above project called from Manila at 12 noon today. He desired to furnish a status report in connection with this project.

Haynes indicated he has established liaison with Mildred Stegall, who is supervising work in the President's temporary office in Manila. She has been very cooperative.

Haynes indicated that all FBI representatives are now in their places in the countries to be visited. He reported that there have been no problems. The press in New Zealand and Australia are emphasizing the heavy security precautions involved in this trip. There has been no mention of the FBI to date.

Haynes has set up a meeting between Secret Service and FBI representatives tomorrow morning, October 11, 1966. Secret Service is fully aware of the fact that our responsibilities largely concern intelligence matters.

Haynes brought up the problem of "leap frogging" of personnel. He explained that after the President departs one country, the Secret Service representatives established in that country will immediately fly to the next point of arrival in order to enlarge the force in that place. Haynes stated he did not feel this was necessary for our Agents to do. I told him he was right in his assumption and unless advised to the contrary, the FBI representatives, following departure of the President, should attempt to secure military transportation back to the United States. I stated, of course, if Moyers, Watson, the President or Mrs. Stegall personally indicated apprehension over unruly demonstrations or threats, then Haynes should get in touch with us to ascertain if those Agents whose assignments had been completed should be used in other countries. 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

On October 11, 1966, HN T-1 advised that members of the Committee to Stop the War in Vietnam (CSWV) meeting the previous night at the Church of the Crossroads in Honolulu had agreed to picket President Lyndon B. Johnson at the Konolulu International Airport on his arrival October 17, 1966. group also decided they would have a picket line at the site of President Johnson's major address to be given in Honolulu, time and place not as yet announced.

The group also voted in favor of picketing President Johnson on his departure from Honolulu on October 18, 1966.

The same date HN T-2 further advised that the CSWV had decided not to distribute leaflets during the time they picketed President Johnson but would make every attempt to utilize a portable loud speaker system. The group was advised that no attempt would be made to picket President Johnson if he arrived at Hickam Air Force Base instead of the Honolulu International Airport. The group has scheduled a meeting at Crawford Hall, University of Hawaii, at 10 a.m. on October 16, 1966, in order that members may be supplied with details for the picketing of the President the following two days.

CSWV-was organized in Honolulu in 1965 who formerly resided in Honolulu The CSWV has sponsored rallies, meetings and others. marches protesting U. S. intervention in Vietnam.

SUBJECT: TRAVEL OF THE PRESIDENT

My attached memorandum 10-7-66 reported a White House linquiry as to whether three of our Agents might proceed from Manila by commercial plane in order to avoid special Air Force flights. It was noted that five Agents had previously been rerouted via Manila, presumably by commercial flight. Director inquired as to who would foot the cost and indicated his feeling that our Agents were being treated shabbily.

Based on the facts available at the time, the Director's comments were certainly well taken, and it appeared that our people were being pushed aside in favor of people from other agencies. Special Agent Haynes, who is making the full round trip with the first Air Force plane to coordinate our cooperation with the White House, telephoned last night from Manila by White House direct line and furnished facts which throw a different light on the situation, however. Haynes reported that there are, in fact, several hundred people from the White House, Secret Service, State, and other agencies traveling from the United States to take up posts at the cities to be visited by the President; and since no one plane could transport them all, it has been necessary to use all possible means of transportation in an effort to get them to their destinations as quickly as possible. Haynes said that only two of our Agents have actually traveled by commercial plane, and these were Agents Lewis and O'Malley who made a direct flight from Manila, to Bangkok and Kuala Lumpur, respectively, together with a number of other Government employees going to the same posts. The rest of our Agents were transported on Air Force flights which were arranged out of Honolulu and Manila but which were still insufficient to carry all the personnel involved.

As you know, seven of the Special Agents who are being assigned to Pacific points to be visited by the President did not leave last night with the first Air Force plane but are scheduled to depart at 9 a.m. Saturday, 10-8-66, on a second plane. who is coordinating the transportation for the President's tour, called Mr. DeLoach from the White House this afternoon to ask whether the three Special Agents in the second group who are assigned to Bangkok. Thailand; Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia; and Seoul, South Korea, could proceed by commercial plane to their final destinations from Manila, Philippines. He pointed out that the Air Force plane, which is carrying a number of persons to the other points on the President's itinerary, would have to make a special trip involving many thousand miles just to deliver our three Agents to their three widely scattered destinations.

This request appears in line with the way in which the first group was handled. We were informed this morning from Honolulu that the five Agents destined for the Philippines and the three points above named were being rerouted via Manila to their destinations, presumably by commercial flight.

With respect to the departure from Washington, when ten of our men left 10-6 on the first plane with the remainder leaving 10-8 on subsequent flights, Haynes explained that tenn Secret Service men had been removed from the first plane in order to make room for our people; and they had been chosen so that at least one of our men would arrive at each point to be visited by the President, on that flight. Haynes said a practically complete White House office has been established in Manila and smaller versions are being set up at the other points. He said that he and the other FBI Agents have received splendid treatment from all involved, and the people in charge have repeatedly expressed their appreciation for the Director's cooperation in making men available at such short notice. said that he would forward a more complete report by cable within the next twenty-four hours.

OBSERVATION:

In the confusion and constantly changing schedules for transporting such a huge number of persons to so many scattered points in the Pacific, it appears that the White House staff was unable to forecast accurately the transportation available onward from Manila and referred to commercial flights because they did not know how much Air Force transportation would be available; and, as it turned out, only two of our men actually flew via commercial plane. While we do not yet know the exact cost of this flight, we believe it to be nominal considering the distance involved. In response to the Director's question, we have paid for the travel of these two men from Manila to Bangkok and Kuala Lumpur. Should the Director desire, however, we could explore with the White House the question of possible reimbursement. We believe this would be premature at this point because we do not know the exact cost nor do we know what plans have been made for the return trips following the President's visit.

ACTION:

If approved, we will make no inquiry at the White House at this time regarding reimbursement for part of the Me pos travel of two of our men.



I thought you would be interested in the following information concerning an expedite name check request received from the Naval Investigative Service (NIS) and the expedite handling furnished by the Name Check Section.

At approximately 9:30 a.m., Tuesday, October 11, I received a telephone call from the Liaison Section that the NIS had advised they had approximately 45 name checks regarding members of the Marine Corps scheduled to depart the United States by plane at 6 p.m. the same day, October 11. These Marines were scheduled to go overseas to assist in the protection of the President on his proposed trip to the Philippines, etc.

NIS requested these checks to be handled as soon as possible and arrangements were made to deliver the requests directly to the Name Searching Unit, which was alerted to the fact they would be received. It was necessary for NIS to prepare copies of the identifying data on the individuals prior to submission to Name Searching.

At 11:30 a.m. NIS advised the courier was en route to the Name Searching Unit with 42 name check requests. Name Searching Unit, upon receipt, gave these checks immediate attention and upon completion forwarded them directly to the Name Check Section. 40 of the 42 requests had been completed by 3:10 p.m. and NIS was telephonically advised of the results. The remaining two were completed at 3:45 p.m. but the individual handling the matter at NIS was unavailable until 4:15 p.m., at which time the results of the remaining two requests were telephonically furnished NIS: 04 maure

Both the Name Searching Unit and the Name Check Section gave this matter top priority in order to comply with NIS' deadline.



Legat, Manila has furnished the following ad comments relative to preparations being made in connec the forthcoming visit of the President to the Pacific Area:

Bureau Agents in contact with Legat, Manila have advised that without exception they have received considerate and equal treatment with White House and other members of the President's party in every respect. Arrangements have been made with Embassy, Manila for commercial air transportation and lodging costs to be borne by Embassy.

First conference with Secret Service was held on 10/11/66 and relations are completely cooperative. During the conference, Secret Service was orally advised of the following observations of Legat, Manila:

Philippine law enforcement is corrupt and does not enjoy public confidence or respect; local police are untrained for protective work and cannot perform independently without close supervision; many civilians possess and carry firearms; armed dissidents currently violate peace and order in central Luzon with several recent assassination attempts on mayors; mainland Communist Chinese have easy access to and are currently in Philippines; and President Marcos suffered minor injuries from direct crowd contact upon recent return due to inefficient police handling.

Foregoing observations orally given Secret Service and White House contingent and will be confirmed by letterhead memorandum. Legat suggested contact of | Public Safety, Agency for International Development, Washington, D.C., who has just completed a comprehensive survey of police conditions in the Philippines. report i completed. We do not feel that contact with report is not yet t within our primary responsibility but are advising Secret Service headquarters of the fact that he may have additional pertinent data. 



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For information of the Bureau, in varying degree, this office is the only one in the entire Embassy taking the position that the security problem in connection with the President's visit is a serious one requiring more than complete dependence on the Filipinos to accomplish and provide adequate protection. The attitude of Embassy officials seems to be that of hoping that the Filipinos will be on good behavior; that police will somehow be able to do the job which is their responsibility; and that the President will not expose himself more than absolutely necessary.

Even though suggestions have been solicited of this office for how security can be accomplished, none have been given other than to suggest that exposure of the President be held to a minimum. Any other suggestions which might be offered are not feasible or practical such as a quick training program for the police or the bringing in of military (U.S.) personnel which are in the Philippines in sufficient number to handle the job. The latter is unthinkable for political and diplomatic reasons.

Files of this office are being closely reviewed for material which could be of assistance to SS in the handling of their responsibilities in the Philippines.

For information of the Bureau, it is Legat's opinion that while a threat and hazard exists in all the countries the President will visit, particularly from persons or groups which take exception to U. S. involvement in Vietnam, all countries being visited, except the Philippines, have police acceptably trained and equipped to do a job on which a reasonable person would gamble.

On April 11, 1966 he came again, and after considerable discussion, which included his bringing out his secret "call name" written on the handle of his razor, he was escorted out of the Embassy. Presumably, he will attempt to come back again. So far, he has not been violent, but this possibility would appear to exist.

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

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
