

to the Park, officer [redacted] covered the park for the purpose of finding either Kelly or the party described by [redacted]. Agent [redacted] covered the outside vicinity of the Post Office for a like purpose and at the time [redacted] called for his mail officers [redacted] and [redacted] observed the various persons in the vicinity of the General Delivery Window and observed nothing unusual, in fact there was not more than one person in the immediate vicinity at the time he asked for the mail, this being a party who had also asked for mail.

[redacted] under surveillance, [redacted] remained in the park for approximately one hour or more. Later on the same date [redacted] was taken to the home of his parents, [redacted] and they verified his statement as to how he had spent the day, namely that he was to meet his father on the evening of this day and return home with him.

[redacted] indicated that when he called for the mail and finding none, he was then proceeding to West Indianapolis, for the purpose of contacting his father, who works for the Power and Light Company, driving a truck and drives into town every day in an automobile, in order that he could proceed home with him. The parents of this boy indicate that he has been more or less incorrigible, having been arrested on one occasion for playing cards and gambling on the street and released; also on one occasion, about thirty days ago, he remained away from home, sleeping out in the park in Indianapolis, until his father located him again downtown and caused him to return home.

During the time he was loafing around Indianapolis, away from home, on June 26, 1933 he, together with a boy named [redacted] age 19 Indianapolis made a hitch-hiking trip to Kansas City with another party by the name of [redacted] arriving in Kansas City on Sunday morning and returning that same evening to Indianapolis, that is [redacted] and [redacted] returned, but [redacted] obtained a job in the Walkathon, just outside of Indianapolis, later returning to Indianapolis and was seen also on this date by [redacted] he having taken a bus, from the City limits of Indianapolis, Indiana in order to return to his home at [redacted] Chicago, Illinois, hitch-hiking.

[redacted] further advised that after this party had asked him to call for his mail on Wednesday, August 16, he had stopped and talked to two boys, friends of his in the Park for approximately five to ten minutes, namely [redacted] and [redacted] both approximately 19 to 20 years of age, and who generally loaf around the Park with him. [redacted] and [redacted] are to be located for possible interview, however, the grandmother of [redacted] with whom he lives indicated he had left home recently and as a usual thing does not return for several days.

On August 15, 1933 Agent [redacted] together with [redacted] covered all parks and places where various parties congregate, as well as the downtown streets and all hotels, with the possibility of locating the party who had approached [redacted] on the previous day, without success.

At the time it was expected there was a possibility of picking up Kelly in the vicinity of University Park, the Indianapolis Police covered the vicinity of the Park for approximately four squares in all directions, however the car of Kelly was not noted, nor anyone answering his description and on the evening of this date, one of the newspapers there carried a story to the effect that a party had called for Kelly's mail at General Delivery and had been picked up and that we had failed to apprehend Kelly, a story undoubtedly emanating from some member of the Police Department assigned to the squads, who were covering the investigation in an endeavor to pick up the car of Kelly. It is possible that this publicity may reach Kelly and eliminate the possibility of his again calling at Indianapolis, if he were the party responsible for [redacted] calling for mail under the name of George Kelly.

During the above period, the Western Union and Postal Telegraph Companies checked all telegrams received at Indianapolis from outside the city, observing particularly those from St. Paul and Texas, without detecting any telegrams which might have been intended for Kelly and his wife under their true names or aliases. The above was checked confidentially by the telegraph companies through the Managers thereof and they will continue to cooperate with us.

Due to the publicity resulting from the Police assistance in this matter, on August 16, the Police were eliminated from further contact with the investigation being conducted by us.

On August 17, 1933 [redacted] indicated that possibly [redacted] Indianapolis, Indiana [redacted] and also a reputed confidence man, who has been involved in various shady transactions for many years might be the party whom Kelly would be contacting at Indianapolis.

[redacted] and through previous contact had with [redacted] and his wife, [redacted] in covering another fugitive whom we thought might be contacting [redacted] surveillance was maintained at his home and apparently the only person there at the present time is his wife, and occasionally the brother visits there, he driving a large black Sedan, with Ohio tags. No other persons were observed there, who could not be accounted for.

It was further learned that [redacted] is now at Dallas Texas with [redacted] and has been in Indianapolis for some time. It was indicated that [redacted] had property in the country, outside of Indianapolis, which might be a hang-out for these parties and after considerable difficulty, these two premises were located through the property records and it was ascertained that [redacted] and wife are living in the house owned by [redacted] located at Edgewood, outside of Indianapolis on Rural Route #6, near the corner of Laurel and Edgewood, practically across the street from this place, on the corner of Grimes and Edgewood is located the property owned by [redacted] and through confidential inquiry of [redacted] who lives on the property next to the place of [redacted] and practically directly opposite the place of [redacted] it having been determined that she should be relied upon it was ascertained that [redacted] had lived in this neighborhood for approximately 27 years and from conversation with her it was indicated that she is intimately aware of the various incidents happening in the lives of both [redacted] and [redacted]. She advised that [redacted] is living in the place owned by him, under the name of [redacted], which is the maiden name of his first wife, from whom he is divorced and who lives on this property with an adopted daughter. At the present time the first wife is in the Hospital and [redacted] is staying nights in the place, it being recalled that [redacted] was, approximately two years ago, married to a girl who had been raised by them from the time she was thirteen years of age; later this girl and [redacted] were held at Redbank, N. J., for killing a man in their home and during the past summer the woman was committed to the asylum. [redacted] advised that [redacted] is driving a large black Sedan, and that he was then at his place. It was observed that he has a large black Sedan, apparently a Peerless, bearing Ohio [redacted] [redacted] advised positively that there has been nobody visiting at either of these two places, who can not be accounted for; that she, being an old lady had been more or less familiar with what has happened in the family and while she does not care to be an intimate associate with them she keeps herself advised of what is going on in the neighborhood.

[redacted] has been a bootlegger and is undoubtedly engaged in this activity at the present time. The above would seem to indicate that neither Kelly nor his wife have been in contact with these parties.

The Antlers Hotel uses a card registration system and upon examination of several months records of the registration cards, there was located #40159 June 4, 1933 3:43 P.M. registration of Mr. and Mrs. R. G. Shannon and daughter, Park Lane Villa Hotel, Cleveland, Ohio, they occupying rooms 720-721, being registered in by Clerk Lewis and checked out on June 8 at 10:51 A.M., paying four days room bill at \$6.00 per day and having had two telephone calls. June 7, 1933 they called Riley 4311, this being Western Union, Inquiry Section for purposes other than sending a telegram. June 8, 1933 they called Talbot 5050. Inquiry of Western Union and examination of all telegrams and memoranda for the day indicated, failed to show anything

indicating that they had called Western Union.

Talbot 4040 is the telephone number of Gregg and Son, Inc., Dry Cleaners, 2804 N. Meridian St., Indianapolis, Indiana. On this date, at the time this telephone call was made, [redacted] was on duty, she being on duty each day here, and she could not recall a call from the Antlers Hotel, nor could she recall or identify either Kelly or his wife. An examination of all work handled by this company for June and the month previous failed to indicate anything which would indicate that they called this place, although it is possible that they may have left some article for cleaning, without leaving their name, there being a number of such items, which, of course, can not be accounted for.

[redacted] of the Antlers Hotel and [redacted] both were unable to identify pictures of Kelly and his wife, although undoubtedly they are the ones who stopped at the hotel here.

At Indianapolis, Indiana Agents [redacted] and [redacted] are continuing an observation of General Delivery and will also maintain contact several times each day with the Hotel in question with the possibility in mind that these parties may again register into the Antlers Hotel.

In this connection reference is made to my letter addressed to the New Orleans Office today, August 21, 1933 indicating that letter mailed by Kathryn C. Kelly, Madison, Wisconsin August 7, 1933 to Charlie Weber, General Delivery, Biloxi, Miss., has been returned to Indianapolis, Indiana General Delivery, for reason that it could not be delivered. Reference should be had to my letter for more detailed information as to the probable nature of the communication between Kathryn C. Kelly and Charlie Weber.

Reference is made to telephone conversation had with your office on August the 15th, 1933, wherein you advised this office that a telegram was sent to Cleveland, Ohio, addressed to R. G. Shannon, in care of the Cadillac Motor Sales Company, on August the 8th, 1933, advising that "The deal has fallen through, Jack and Tom have left town, Communicate with me Box 631, (Signed) George", and that the party sending this telegram may be George Bates or George Kelly; that it was possible that one [redacted] attorney at Minneapolis, may have sent the wire from that point; also, that [redacted] was in Chicago at that time and could be located at the Palmer House or Central Supply Company.

It was ascertained by an Agent from this office that [redacted] was registered at the Bismarck Hotel, where he was contacted and interviewed. [redacted] advised that he was in Chicago for the purpose of attending a convention of plumbing supply dealers and that he was accompanied by his wife, his brother and his son.

[redacted] further stated that the nature of his business in Minneapolis is that he operates a private credit bureau for plumbing supply dealers and that he also engages occasionally in the practice of law, but to a very limited extent only. He was questioned relative to any knowledge that he had of a telegram being sent to Cleveland, Ohio, addressed to R. G. Shannon, in care of the Cadillac Motor Sales Company. He stated that he cannot recall having wired anyone in Cleveland, Ohio, recently and that he is not acquainted with anyone by the name of R. G. Shannon or George Kelly. He also stated that the only telegrams that he sends out are in connection with his business and that he had not sent any telegrams for any client of his with reference to legal matters in quite awhile.

Photograph of George Kelly, who is known to use the alias of R. G. Shannon and who has also been identified in Cleveland as the party who purchased the Cadillac Sedan from the Cadillac Motor Sales Company, was shown to [REDACTED] who stated that the party is unknown to him.

[REDACTED] can be located either at his residence, [REDACTED] or at his office, located at [REDACTED] Minneapolis, and it is suggested that if deemed necessary an Agent from the St. Paul Office reinterview [REDACTED] in connection with this matter, since your office knows why [REDACTED] name was connected with the sending of this telegram.

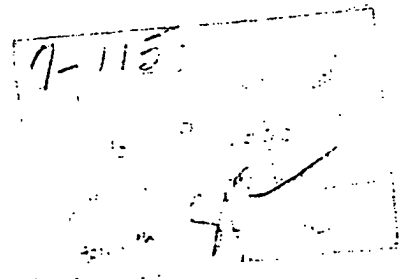

The Post Offices at St. Paul and Minneapolis have been checked with reference to Box 631, without any results, indicating that the Minneapolis Post Office Box 631 is not being used by anyone, and in St. Paul, no such box number exists.

It is requested that you conduct immediate inquiry in your city and ascertain the identity of the person or persons possessing or receiving communications through Post Office Box 631, in an effort to locate persons involved in the above matter. R. G. SHANNON is an alias of GEORGE KELLEY, who is sought in connection with the kidnaping and who has been identified as one of the kidnapers. He is described as follows:

With reference to the above entitled case, please be advised that Special Agent [REDACTED] has conducted investigation at Colfax, Washington, and made a thorough and complete review of the sheriff's file at Colfax in connection with the robbery of the First Savings & Trust Bank, Colfax, September 21, 1932. This office is in receipt of two letters from the Bureau dated August 13, 1933, one referring to George Bates with aliases, and one referring to George R. Kelly, with aliases, containing confidential information concerning these two individuals and advising of the fact that their apprehension is desired. While the sheriff's files at Colfax did not contain any particularly valuable information concerning George R. Kelly, an extensive investigation was conducted by the sheriff and it is possible that the information obtained may be of benefit in securing the location of Kelly. It is particularly noted in the letter pertaining to Bates that Kelly has been traveling with two unidentified men and one woman in a sixteen cylinder Cadillac Sedan.

Agent [REDACTED] is submitting a complete report as a result of his investigation and in the mean time the following is transmitted, same having been received by the writer over long distance telephone on the night of August 14th, and some of the more important facts telephoned the Oklahoma City office the same evening.

It appears that George R. Kelly was living with his purported wife in a fashionable apartment house at Tacoma, Washington, some time in 1932 and at this place he became acquainted, or at least associated, with one [REDACTED] with aliases, and possibly through [REDACTED] met George Bates. [REDACTED] was suspected of being the leader of quite a gang in the vicinity of Tacoma, Washington. It also appears

that Kelly and his wife left Tacoma shortly before September 21, 1932, robbed the bank at Colfax with Bentz, Bates, and an unknown individual, of \$500.00 in cash and \$60,800.00 in negotiable securities. After Kelly and his wife left Tacoma they were next heard of in Fort Worth, Texas, about November 1, 1932, and according to the sheriff at Colfax, the Fort Worth police have complete information concerning said Kelly and it was through the Fort Worth police that the sheriff at Colfax was able to identify Kelly as one of the robbers of the bank. While in Tacoma, Kelly was driving a Cadillac Coupe, of which there is no available description.

Information concerning [REDACTED] is being set out more or less in detail in view of the apparent close association between Bentz and Kelly and in view of the fact that [REDACTED] may be traveling with or know of Kelly's whereabouts. [REDACTED] is described as follows:

It appears that on September 14, 1932, [REDACTED] was arrested at Tacoma, Washington, with a gangster from San Francisco by the name of [REDACTED] San Francisco PD #47125. [REDACTED] it seems, is a well known San Francisco gangster, having been arrested with six others in possession of a quantity of arms and ammunition, including machine guns, at San Francisco a short time previously. [REDACTED] has a number of relatives who are known or suspected gangsters,

and of which the following facts are deemed pertinent:

[redacted] was arrested in November, 1932, with [redacted] at Dallas, Texas, and charged with bank robbery, [redacted] being arrested under the name of [redacted] his Dallas Police number being [redacted]. Apparently [redacted] furnished bond at Dallas, Texas, was later arrested at McKinney, Texas, where he also furnished bond, disappeared and has neither been seen nor heard from since. The sheriff at Colfax was unable to forward warrants to Texas in time to detain Bentz.

Chief Special Agent [redacted] Railway Express Agency, Seattle, Washington, has considerable information concerning the [redacted] gang and claims that [redacted] was the leader. For a time [redacted] was living at [redacted] Tacoma, Washington. Has a [redacted] also a member of the gang, and the following other members in 1932: [redacted] Seattle, PD [redacted] Seattle, PD [redacted] and [redacted] Seattle, PD [redacted] being a nephew of Ed Bentz.

[redacted] is the subject of a National Motor Vehicle Theft Act case in the Portland office, of which San Francisco, California, is the office of origin, it being noted that he has [redacted] Chicago, Illinois, and relatives at [redacted] San Francisco, California. It also appears that the Chicago office has a considerable file on said [redacted]. In the fall of 1932 [redacted] and [redacted] mentioned above, were known to be in Reno, Nevada, and [redacted] was arrested at Reno for the sheriff at Port Orchard, Washington, charged with bank robbery. [redacted] was returned to Port Orchard, furnished bond and has since disappeared.

Agent [redacted] also ascertained that the [redacted] brothers have a sister who usually goes by the name of [redacted] at one time was married to the above mentioned [redacted], but is now separated from him. [redacted] operated a beer parlor at San Francisco, California for a time, unknown address, went to Texas, later went to Seattle, Washington, where she occupied room 705, Georgian Annex Hotel. She also received mail at that place under the name of [redacted] and was last heard of at [redacted] San Francisco, California.

It should further be mentioned that the last known address for [redacted] was [redacted] Reno, Nevada, al-

though it is believed that the Auto Theft case mentioned above contains a later address and [redacted] can possibly be located through [redacted] Chicago.

It should also be stated that at the time [redacted] and [redacted] were arrested in Dallas, Texas, [redacted] drove to Texas in a 1931 Auburn Sedan bearing 1932 Washington license plates [redacted] registered in the name of [redacted] Seattle, Washington. [redacted] is alleged to have furnished the bonds for [redacted] and [redacted] at Dallas, it being rumored that the same amounted to about twenty five or thirty thousand dollars. [redacted] also furnished bond for the two at McKinney, Texas. It might be observed that [redacted] of the Tacoma, Washington Police Department is also thought to have considerable information, particularly concerning [redacted]

It was also learned at Colfax that the St. George Hotel in Chicago, Illinois is a known hangout of certain members of the alleged [redacted] gang.

With further reference to George Bates, at the time he was connected with the Tacoma gang he was supposed to be living with one [redacted]. [redacted] has a daughter [redacted] at Port Lewis, Washington, and a sister, name unknown, [redacted] Los Angeles, California, and a friend, [redacted] Chicago. [redacted] of the Lawrence Hotel, [redacted] for a time, it seems, maintained an apartment at the St. George Hotel in Chicago. He is well known at Denver, Colorado and undoubtedly, since he was recently apprehended at Denver, your office has obtained complete information concerning this angle.

Agent [redacted] advised that he found in the sheriff's file the following two addresses, but was unable to find any connection between the addresses and the suspects:

DEVELOPMENTS OF THE WEEK IN KIDNAPING CASES

Kidnaping of [REDACTED]

Three additional individuals were identified in the [REDACTED] kidnaping case. They are [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. Identification orders are being issued by the Division of Investigation in an effort to effect their apprehension. All of these individuals have criminal records, as reflected by the files of the Identification Unit of this Division.

Kidnaping of Charles F. Urschel

On August 12, 1933, in a farm house about six miles south of Paradise, Texas, the following individuals were apprehended and taken into custody in the Urschel case: Harvey J. Bailey, R. G. Shannon, Ora Shannon, Arman Shannon, Oleta Shannon and Earl Brown. The above named individuals were arrested by local police authorities working in conjunction with Special Agents of this Division. Earl Brown was subsequently released. A complete memorandum giving the details of the capture of these individuals has already been submitted.

George Bates was apprehended and arrested in Denver, Colorado, and identified by Agents of this Division. At the time of his arrest there were found upon his person thirty-three \$20 bills which were identified as being a part of the Urschel ransom money.
