Mr. Nathan called from Oklahoma City and stated that he had gone over the arrangements to guard Bailey, Bates and the Shannons. and that he felt that such arrangements were as complete as could be NOT RECORDED TON expected under the circumstances. He stated that the jail in which these prisoners are held is a two-story affair with only one cell block on the second floor in a sort of a semi-circular arrangement; that Bailey and Bates are in adjoining cells; that in front of these cells one Agent is stationed twenty-four hours of the day with a push button nearby to call for help in the event that help is needed at any time; that from his position he is able to observe all of the movements of Bailey and Bates at all times; that the two Shannons, father and son. are across the cell block and are together in one cell and they likewise can be observed; that Bailey and Bates are handcuffed at all times and there is a steel bar between the hands preventing a meeting of the hands at any time; that in addition both Bates and Bailey have leg shackles and are chained to the floor. Downstairs on the first floor there is stationed in a room facing the street and the entrance to the jail, a sort of an off-wing, in fact a cubby-hole, one Special Agent and a Deputy Sheriff armed with machine guns. This likewise is a twenty-four hour detail. In addition the regular Deputy Sheriff is on duty at the jail at all hours of the day and night. Mr. Nathan stated that outside of the jail and across the street are mounted two machine gums at strategic points covering the entrance to the jail. A third machine gun is in process of being mounted at the present time. Likewise there have been installed three flood lights which are placed so that they can flood the entire premises of the jail at any time. Arrangements have been made so that the jail will not be open at night to anyone - it will be closed and no one admitted. If anyone comes to the door the jailor will answer from the second floor window. Mrs. Shanna is downstairs in the women's ward. Bates, Bailey and the Shannons are searched daily.

Mr. Nathan states that he feels that the present arrangements are about as adequate as could possibly be made; that, of course, the jail is not equal to that in Dallas; in fact it is rather antiquated affair, but apparently with the precautions taken there should be no further difficulties or at least they will be prepared for any difficulties that may arise.

In addition to this, both Bailey and Bates have leg shackles and are chained to the floor. Downstairs on the first floor of the fail there is stationed in a room facing the street and the entrance to the fail one Special Agent and a deputy sheriff armed with machine guns. This, likewise, is a twenty-four-hour detail. In addition, the regular deputy sheriff is on duty at the fail at all hours of the day and night. Outside of the jail and across the street are mounted two machine guns at strategic points covering the entrance to the fail. There have also been installed three flood lights placed so they can flood the entire premises of the jail at any time. Arrangements have been made so that the jalk will not be open at night to anyone. Should anyone come to the door of the fail the failer enswers the call from the second floor window. Krs. Shannon, the wife of the elder Shannon, is kept in the women's ward on the first floor of the jail. Bates, Bailey and the Shannons are scarched daily.

It is believed that the above arrangements are all that can possibly be made at the present time. The fail is not equal to that in which Bailey was held in Dallas, Texas, as it is a rather antiquated affair, but apparently with the precautions we have taken there should be no further difficulties, or at least, if any difficulties arise we are thoroughly prepared to meet them.

I reside at 1234 Pine St. Dallas, Texas and have been employed as a Deputy Sheriff in the Dallas County Jail since 1/1/33; ever since that date I have worked in the capacity of Jailor from S PM until 10 PM each day, except every other Sunday, when I exchange days with

The last time I saw Harvey Bailey, a Tederal prisoner in the Dallas County Jail, was about 10:30 Sunday morning 9/5/35, at which time I went up to the death cell for the purpose of giving Harvey Bailey some water and signre. In this connection: after reaching the death cell I opened the door to the corridor and went to Bailey's cell f7; on entering same I got his bucket through the door of the said cell and filled it with water. On that visit, as well as all other visits prior thereto, when I called at Bailey's cell I made it my business to inspect the bars; and the last time I made such examination there was no indication that the bars of Bailey's cell had been tampered with (which was about 10:30 AM 9/3/33).

During my visits with Bailey I talked to him, asking him if he was getting snough to eat and enough to smoke, etc. On one occasion, when visited and talked with Bailey, told me that Harvey Bailey had an automobile and he had talked to Bailey about the automobile. After I talked to I read in the newspapers about Bailey having an automobile in his possession when he was arrested at Paradise, Texas by Federal officers. I was in need of an automobile so I talked to Bailey about him selling me his Ford Y-8 1935 model coach. I told Bailey I wanted first shot at buying the car and Bailey told me "you might as well have it as anyone else."

A few days later I came to see Special Igent in Charge F.J. Elake of the Division of Investigation, U.S. Department of Justice, at 420 Post Office Building, Dalles, Texas. After talking to Mr. Blake he told me it was all right to buy the ear. I went back to the jail and again went up to see Bailey and told him Mr. Blake eaid it would be all right for me to buy the ear. I tried to bargain with Bailey for the car. He wanted \$500.00 and I told him that was more than I could pay for the ear; and he then stated to try and sell the ear for him. I told him that I would see about it. I then returned to Mr. Blake's office and told Mr. Blake I could not buy the ear; that Bailey was aking too much money for it; that Bailey wanted \$500.00. When Harvey Bailey, Federal prisoner, first was committed to the County Fail he was assigned to cell 6-M located on the 62 floor known as solitary confinement. Subsequently Bailey was removed to the R death cells on the 10th floor. The R death cells are comprised of 3 cells, the middle cell has a toilet and a shower and the East and west cells have a toilet. The Fest cell known as \$7 is where Hervey Bailey was confined until he escaped this morning.

To enter these death cells there is a corridor surrounded by bars, on the outside of which is a run around. In order to gain access to the run around it is necessary to go through a blind iron door which spens from the outside. After this door is opened there is no way of looking it from the inside.

The four day watches on duty between 5 i.M. and 10 P.M. are not allowed to carry guns or revolvers. These day watches have keys and hooks; the keys are used for opening the calls and the corridors, and the hooks for opening the break box in order to get to the cell. The two men on night watch from 10 P.M. to 6 A.M. have access to a pistol and revolver. There is always one man on duty in the office on the 6th floor, and the pistol and revolver are within his reach. The other man makes his rounds of the jail but does not darry pistol or fifle; they remain in the office with the man on duty.

Federal prisoners, like other prisoners, are fed at 7 A.M., IZ noon, and 5 P.M. The custom is that a trusty carries a tray of food, with the guard, to a prisoner's cell. The food is passed into the cage door in the corridor, where the prisoner than has access to it.

The four day jail guards who visited R death cells where Harvey Bailey was confined carry keys and hooks and have access to the corridor in that death cell. The night jail guards do not carry a hook but carry only one key;

this key is used for the purpose of opening the blind door leading to the run around in the death cell where Bailey was confined, byt the night jailers are not allowed to enter the corridor inside where Bailey was confined in his cell.

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
About 7:10 A.M. This morning, 8/4/35, my attention was called to the fact that Harvey Belley had just gone down stairs on the elevator with a gun in his hand. I conducted a preliminary investigation, interviewing employees at the Jail in an effort to determine the caused the pistol and saws to be brought to Bailey's cell, but there was no one apparently knew anything about how Bailey obtained the pistol and saws and made his escape.

To my knowledge no one has been allowed to visit Harvey Bailey without passes from the U.S. Marshal's office; and in the event such visitors had such passes a guard always went with the visitor. The rules and regulations of the jail are that when watches are changed that one of the 2 jail guards going off duty must check the prisoners in all the cells with one of the jail guards soming on duty. Whether they strictly athere to these regulations I do not know.
