MEMORANDUM FOR MR. NATHAN

While talking to Mr. Purvis concerning other matters, he indicated he had received a letter from the attorneys of George and Kathryn Kelly; the letter was sarcastic and referred to the "great Government" and further referred to the fact that the clothing and personal effects of George and Kathryn Kelly which had been found in their automobile were still being held in the Division. Purvis stated that this clothing was available in his office and inquired as to whether the clothing should be sent to the attorneys.

I suggested to wr. Purvis that Special Agent was to personally interview Kathryn Kelly during the coming week and I felt it would be preferable to have Special Agent determine from Kathryn Kelly what disposition should be made of her personal effects and for a Special Agent of the Kansas City office to determine from George Aelly similar information as to his personal belongings; that we had not received authorization from them to turn the goods over to an attorney and, in fact, the two prisoners might be more cooperative in the event the contact is made with them personally by our Special Agents.

Reference is made to your letter dated February 2, 1934, in which you request authorization for representatives of a private detective agency to interview ilfred Bates, a Federal prisoner now confined in the Leavenworth Penitentiary.

In view of the fact that the purpose of this interview, as shown by your commencation, is to obtain information relative to aikold-up of the feilway Express agency at facous, Washington, on March 26, 1932, you are advised that in the event the violation in question is one which relates to theft from interactic shipments of the express company and in the event the information is made known to the Special Agents of the Division of Investigations, United States Department of Justice, the Special Agents will conduct an official investigation of this matter, during which they will of necessity personally interview Bates.

This Department feels that it can not go beyond the limits of this provision with reference to an interview with this prisoner. The experience of the Department heretofore with reference to investigations of individuals who are confined in a penitentiary has shown that there are times when a prisoner already confined for a substantial period of time will assume responsibility for violations which he did not commit for the benefit of individuals who have not been convicted. Therefore, it will be necessary to adhere to the policy of the Department in this regard.

In the event you have information concerning a Federal violation which would serrant an interview with prisoner Bates by Special Agents of this Bepartment, you may semisalizate the basic information relative thereto to Mr. C. C. Spears, Special Agent in Charge, Division of Investigation, United States Department of Justice, 411 United States Court House Building, Portland, Oregon.

A review of the file in this case discloses the fact that one "L. E. Lang" and "Ed" are probably the same person, and that this person is probably Edward Doll with aliases. Doll's admissions in St. Petersburg, Florida, and his connection with Barnes and Bates indicates that he may be implicated in the instant case. Several telegrams are quoted for the information of the Kansas City office as material for a further interview with Doll.

REFERENCE: Letter from San Antonio office dated March 3, 1934; and reports of Special Agent Jacksonville, Florida, dated February 23, 1934 and February 24, 1934; all in the case of EDWARD DOLL with aliases, National Motor Vehicle Theft Act, Identification Order No. 1214, in which case the St. Louis office is the office of origin.

Mr. Urschel was consulted as to this matter and he stated that George Kelly addressed the younger person who guarded him as "Potatoes", and as it has been developed that Armon Shannon is the younger person who guarded him, Mr. Urschel feels sure that the only person who was called "Potatoes" in his presence is Armon Shennon, and it does not seem at all reasonable that the person called "Potatoes" in Mr. Urschel's hearing would be Homer Wilson who is referred to by Doll in his confession. Of course, Mr. Urschel was blindfolded, and he arrives at the conclusion mentioned above from deductive reasoning.

It is noted in the two reports of reference that Doll admits being very closely associated with George Kelly Barnes and Albert Bates in some kidnapings and bank robberies. It is further noted that he stated that he used the name of Lang several times when he registered at different hotels. There has been a complete review of the Urschel kidnaping file in the Oklahoma City office, and the following telegrams are quoted to show that Doll is, in all probability, the same person as "Ed" and as "L. E. Lang", and that he was very closely associated with both Bates and Kelly, which is further confirmation of his confession in this regard:

It is observed that the telegram Lang sent R. G. Shannon July 19, 1935 regarding "Details by airmail souvenirs by express at once", as reflected in a memorandum submitted by Special Agent dated August 2, 1933, shows that this telegram was sent June 19, 1935. It is also noted that it was sent from Chicago four minutes after the one which was sent by Lang to Shannon in which he said, "Waiting for call", and it is, therefore, thought that it is possible that this wire which was sent from Chicago at 11:59 A.M. and received at Paradise, Texas at 12:47 P.M. may have been sent June 19, 1935 instead of in July.

During the first part of the investigation in the Urschel case, it was thought that "L. E. Lang" was Bates, and later it was thought that he was probably Ed Bentz. An extensive investigation has been made by both the Chicago and Kansas City offices to establish the identity of Lang but without success. As stated above, Doll admits being closely associated with Kelly and Bates in the two reports of reference, and that he sometimes used the name of Lang. It is felt from the admissions made in these two reports of reference that he will likely admit that he is the person who sent and received these telegrams in the names of "Lang" and "Ed".

Attention is hereby called to the telegram dated April 2, 1935 to T. M. Coleman and signed "Ed", directing Coleman who, of course, is George Kelly Barnes to meet him at the Huckins Hotel in Oklahoma City Monday evening. From the records of the Huckins Hotel, we find that the next day, April 3, 1933, that "R. G. Shannon and wife, New Orleans, Louisiana," registered there at 10:48 P. M., occupying room 931. On that same date, at 11:56 A. M., "L. E. Lang, 114 Elm St., Dallas, Texas", registered at this same Hotel and occupied room 904. He either

sent or received a telegram for which he was charged sixty-three cents, on April 5. The next day, April 4, 1935, R. G. Shannon and wife who, of course, are George Kelly and wife checked out of the Huckins Hotel at 9:32 A. M. The same date, at exactly the same time, L. E. Lang checked out of this same Hotel. This will indicate almost conclusively that "Ed" is the same as "L. E. Lang".

On May 9, 1933, "G. L. Davis" registered at the Huckins Hotel, Oklahoma City, and it has been proved and admitted by him that this person was Albert Bates.

On May 19, 1933, "L. E. Lang, New Orleans, Louisiana" registered at the Huckins Hotel, Oklahoma City, occupied room 519 and departed on May 20, 1933. The handwriting of "L. E. Lang" is not the handwriting of "G. L. Davis" on the registration card. The handwriting of "L. E. Lang" on this registration card and also on the one mentioned above bears a striking resemblance to the name of "Edward Doll" on his Identification Order No. 1214 and also to the handwriting on the telegram sent by Lang from Chicago, Illinois to R. G. Shannon at Paradise, Texas, July 19, 1933, a photostat of which is in the Oklahoma City file.

This will show not only a confirmation of Doll's statements of his close association with Bates and George Kelly Barnes, but it is a logical conclusion that the persons mentioned in the telegrams quoted above as "Ed" and "L. E. Lang" are none other than Doll. The telegram sent from Chicago, Illinois to Kelly as "R. G. Shannon" at Paradise, Texas, July 19, 1935, indicates that Lang was extremely anxious to get in touch with Kelly. It will be remembered that Mr. Urschel was kidnaped on the evening of July 22, 1933, and it is reasonable to assume that George Kelly Barnes was devoting his sole efforts and attentions to the plans for this kidnaping. It, therefore, seems a reasonable conclusion that one of his close associates in drims who was so anxious to get in touch with him three days before this kidnaping was likely in on the kidnaping himself. It might be observed here that one of Doll's make-up may have been used as one of the "cover men" to follow the actual kidnapers out of town after Mr. Urschel was abducted. It might also be observed here that Mr. Kirkpatrick, who paid the \$200,000.00 ransom to Barnes on Linwood Boulevard in Kensas City, Missouri, observed several men sitting in two automobiles, and it is Kirkpatrick's opinion that they were covering that spot while the money was being turned over by Kirkpatrick. It is not definitely known the exact amount or the cut which Kelly and Bates received, but it has been generally felt that the money was not divided equally between them. The most definite information along this line is that about \$75,000,00 of this ransom money was found on Cass Coleman's farm in Texas, which was either Kelly's share or a part of his share of this ransom. It has been suggested that Doll and some others who may be implicated as "cover men" at different periods in this case, and who took much less chance of being identified as the kidnapers, may have received a comparatively small cut.

UNDEVELOPED LEADS:

DETROIT OFFICE will interview Katherine Thorne Kelly for all informe-

tion that it is able to obtain from her regarding the purpose of any or all of the above quoted telegrams; obtain information as to the positive identity of "Lang" and "Ed". Special effort should be made to ascertain why Lang was so anxious to contact Kelly July 19, 1933, three days before the Urschel kidnaping. A special effort should also be made to obtain from Mrs. Kelly whether or not Lang, or Doll, was implicated in this kidnaping.

KANSAS CITY OFFICE at Leavenworth, Kansas will interview Edward Doll and ascertain in a discreet manner if he is not the same person who sent the above telegrams to George Kelly Barnes under the aliases of Shannon and Coleman as "Lang" and "Ed". An effort should then be made to ascertain from Doll why he was so extremely anxious to contact Kelly July 19, 1935, three days before the Urschel kidnaping; obtain from Doll what, if any, connection he had with the Urschel kidnaping. It is noted in the two reports of reference that Special Agent obtained many of the admissions from Doll while he was incarcerated at St. Petersburg, Florida, and as a result of the confidential relationship and friendly feeling toward to be possible that Agent will be able to obtain from Doll an admission of the part he played in the Urschel kidnaping.







MEMORANDOM FOR MR. CLASS

I am queting the following from a letter which I have just received from Special Agent in Charge Jones of the San Antonio Offices

There just received Agent report from Jacksonville relative to statements made by Edward Dill. He neutions using the name of L. E. Long. I recall several telegrams we obtained in the Brachel case passing between Kelly, using the name of Shennon and L. E. Long. We were never able to identify Long. The seconges were indicative that Kelly and long had a meeting planned a few days before the Urschel kidnaping. I have written the Division a letter suggesting that the Urschel file be reviewed and that in any subsequent interview with Pall this be cleared up.

Matters of this kind very forcibly indicate that in any major matter such as a major kidnaping or the Kansas City shooting each Bureau office should be furnished with all detail reports. I have to refer to the Lang matter by memory as I do not have copies of the Urschel reports here. In following out leads in this district relative to the Karpis-Barker gang it is noticed references to other reports and letters which we do not have. I realise this suggestion would entail considerable clerical works however, in my opinion it would be well worth it, as in a major case, such as some I have mentioned, some office may have, or develop information at any time."

Will you please give the matters referred to in the above excerpts careful and close attention. In regard to the second suggestion which Er. Jones offers, namely, the furnishing of field offices with detailed reparts, I was of the impression that steps were being taken along this line. Will you please inform me as to this angle.



Eathryn Kelly, who was sentenced to life imprisonment in the Urschel kidnaping case and who has been denied the privileges usually extended to prisoners, has indicated a willingness to cooperate with this Division by submitting information concerning a number of criminals and their activities. She has submitted some very valuable information and has indicated that she might be able to submit further information to the Division in connection with the Kansas City massacre case, if she were placed in the same cell with the massacre case, if she were placed in the same cell with the massacre in Detroit, Michigan and who, it is known, was connected with the Kansas City killing.

All

I have hed this matter discussed with Mr. Bates and he has stated that he would have transferred to Milan, Michigan and placed in the same cell as Kathryn Kelly in order that Kathryn Kelly may obtain information from her concerning this case and them, in turn, give it to Agents of this Division. In view of Kathryn Kelly's sattitude of cooperation, I believe it advisable to allow her to correspond with her daughter and to enjoy the same radio privileges as other prisoners. It is entirely possible that, if these considerations are extended to Mrs. Kelly, she will be able and willing to assist the Fivision considerably in this and other major investigations.

This question was discussed with Mr. Bates who stated that these privileges had been denied Kathryn Kelly at your request but that he sould be glad to have them restored to her if such authority was granted by you. Accordingly, it is respectfully suggested, if you have no objections to doing so, that you authorise Mr. Bates to permit Kathryn Kelly to correspond with her daughter and to be given the same radio privileges as other prisoners.



MEMORANDOM FOR MR.

Agent in Charge Fay at New York advised me by telephone today that Walter Winchell called him and informed him of a letter he had received from an anonymous source, the substance being that a certain Mid-western Mayor had portions of the Urschel kidnaping money and had been unable to spend it.
