ReBulet pointed out that KIRKPATRICK has extended some effort to get HARVEY BAILEY released on parole from Leavenworth Penitentiary. KIRKPATRICK has further stated that in his efforts he has the approval of Judge VAUGHT, who tried the case. CHARLES F. URSCHER and GUS JONES and [REDACTED] former FBI Agents who arrested BAILEY.

KIRKPATRICK did not elaborate to me on the reason for GUS JONES and [REDACTED] to feel that HARVEY BAILEY should be released from the penitentiary, nor did he explain why GUS JONES and [REDACTED] had apparently reversed their previous position in this regard.

Any further information concerning this matter will be brought to the attention of the Bureau.

Transmitted herewith is a copy of an airtel from Oklahoma City to Cincinnati dated 7/31/58, which is self-explanatory. It will be noted that Oklahoma City is anxious to locate a copy of transcript of testimony in the above case, which was tried in October, 1933.

An exhaustive search has been made of the records of the Cincinnati Office without locating such transcript or any reference thereto. At the time of the death of former Assistant Director E. J. CONNELLEY, Cincinnati was in possession of a number of personal papers, notes, etc., which Mr. CONNELLEY had accumulated during the period of time he was with the Bureau. Examination of the Cincinnati records failed to reflect any specific records as to the URSCHEL kidnaping case. However, there is indication that there may have been some miscellaneous papers among those left by Mr. CONNELLEY. The Bureau's attention is directed to Cilet to Bureau dated 7/26/57, captioned "EARL J. CONNELLEY, Deceased," wherein reference is made to these personal papers of Mr. CONNELLEY. The Bureau's attention is also directed to Cilet to Bureau dated 8/6/57, captioned the same, wherein all of Mr. CONNELLEY's papers were forwarded to the Bureau for review and disposition.

In reviewing correspondence, it is believed that perhaps New York may have some knowledge of the personal papers of Mr. CONNELLEY. Will the Bureau and New York please have the necessary research done to see if copy of the missing transcript can be located and furnished Oklahoma City? Due

This case occurred during 1933. GEORGE "MACHINE GUN" KELLY and his wife, KATHRYN THORNE KELLY, were tried during October, 1933, and sentenced to life imprisonment.

During June, 1953, KATHRYN T. KELLY and her mother, ORA L. SHANNON, filed motions under Section 2255 of Title 28, USC, to have their convictions and sentences set aside. At the hearings both were granted new trials and are presently on bond. The transcript of testimony in the KATHRYN THORNE KELLY and GEORGE KELLY BARNES trial was not available and an exhaustive investigation to locate a copy of it has to date met with negative results.

Information has been received from the Chicago Office that former Assistant Director E. J. CONNELLY maintained some personal files at the Cincinnati Office. It is not known whether these files would contain any information concerning this case or this transcript, but it is requested that if an index of such files is not available, that a search be made of these files to determine whether a copy of the missing transcript is in the files. This transcript is badly needed since the U. S. Attorney in Okla. City plans to appeal the ruling of the Court, and HARVEY J. BAILEY, another subject, has now filed for a similar hearing.

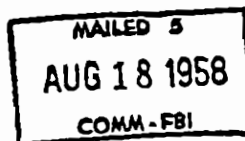

This is to advise of current developments in connection with the above-entitled matter.

RE: KATHRYN KELLY AND ORA SHANNON

United States Attorney Paul Cress, Oklahoma City, has advised that he has received a transcript of testimony in the hearing of Kelly and Shannon. The Solicitor General will determine whether the Government will appeal the decision of U. S. District Judge William R. Wallace, Oklahoma City, granting Kelly and Shannon a new trial.

RE: HARVEY BAILEY

United States Attorney Cress informed that he had visited with Judge Wallace in connection with the hearing scheduled for 9/30/58 on Bailey's motion to vacate his sentence. He advised the court that he planned to file a motion asking for a continuance in the hearing as he felt Bailey's hearing should not be held until after a decision is made concerning Kelly and Shannon. Judge Wallace indicated to Mr. Cress that he felt such a motion would be proper but requested that it not be filed until after Labor Day.

The Director noted that he could not understand the present position of Mr. E. E. Kirkpatrick, Mr. Urschel, Judge Vaughn who tried the case, and former Agents Gus Jones and [REDACTED] who had arrested Bailey, in now favoring parole for Harvey Bailey.

The Special Agent in Charge at Oklahoma City, who had originally received information from Kirkpatrick as to the position of these individuals, has advised that Kirkpatrick did not elaborate as to any reason why Gus Jones and [REDACTED] feel that Bailey should be released from confinement nor did Kirkpatrick explain why they apparently reversed their previous position in this regard. The Oklahoma City Division did not have further knowledge as to the reasons for these individuals to have taken the stand they have in favoring parole for Bailey.

COMPLAINT FOR DAMAGES - SLANDER

1. The plaintiff Kathryn Thorne Kelly is a citizen of the United States and at the present time confined in the Federal Reformatory for Women at Alderson, West Virginia.
2. The defendant Leonard Ballard is a citizen of the United States and a resident of the District of Columbia.
3. Plaintiff, although convicted of the crime of kidnaping, has steadfastly maintained her innocence and proceedings are now pending in the United States District Court for the Western District of Oklahoma to vacate and set aside the judgment of conviction and she believes she will be finally and completely vindicated.
4. On or about March 11, 1958, within the District of Columbia, the defendant made this statement: "Kathryn still has about \$65,000 of that ransom money stashed away somewhere".
5. This statement is false. The defendant gave publication to this false statement.
6. Defendant said further: "Machine Gun Kelly is dead, but Urschel isn't. Kathryn and her mother have been eligible for parole for 10 years, but every time it come up Urschel appears before the parole board and opposes it".
7. Plaintiff says that the publication of this slander by the defendant at various times and places has prevented the plaintiff from obtaining parole and plaintiff says further that although defendant has been called upon to make a full and complete retraction he has failed to do so.

WHEREFORE, plaintiff asks for judgment against the defendant in the amount of \$15,000, plus cost of this suit.

Reference is made to OC Airtel 8/12/58 which pertains to efforts of E. E. KIRKPATRICK to secure a parole for HARVEY BAILEY.

Report of SA [REDACTED], dated 8/11/58 at OC, pertains to motion filed by BAILEY under Title 28, Section 2255, the hearing for which had been set for September 30, 1958, at Oklahoma City.

USA PAUL CRESS on September 4, 1958, advised he was in receipt of a letter addressed to both he and Attorney JAMES J. LAUGHLIN from U. S. District Judge W. R. WALLACE, Oklahoma City, which indefinitely delays this hearing. Judge WALLACE, according to the Oklahoma City Times, dated 9/4/58, listed his reason as being the Court understands "the Pardon and Parole Board will consider the matter of paroling BAILEY at a meeting sometime in October". The newspaper article continues "Although the court is not now ruling that the action of the parole board will be in anyway determinative of the pending motion, none-the-less I do not want to go ahead with this matter until the parole board has fully considered BAILEY'S request".

Mr. CRESS advised on September 4, 1958 that he was in receipt of a letter from the Department in which it was stated the Department would handle the appeal of the KATHRYN T. KELLY, ORA L. SHANNON matter. Mr. CRESS does not know whether the letter means the Department means to actually appeal the case or whether the letter means the Department will handle the matter in the event the result of the hearing is appealed. [redacted] advised he is now retired, but [redacted] which firm is now operated by his sons. He was formerly a free lance photographer and made a newsreel type film with sound which pertained to the kidnaping of CHARLES F. URSCHEL. [redacted] advised his memory was rather hazy on many points, but he did recall that he, himself, actually made the photographs of the URSCHEL home as well as the photographs at the trial. Regarding the photographs at the trial, he was unable to state positively whether the photographs were made during recess or while court was in session, other than the pictures taken of the sentencing. He advised he was positive the actual sentencing was photographed and the sound recorded as it happened. He recalled the sentencing of "Machine Gun" KELLY, HARVEY BAILEY and either one or both of the elder SHANNONS. He stated he was not aware more than one trial had been involved. In addition, he stated he was under the impression the scenes of the SHANNON farm were photographed by someone other than himself.

[redacted] advised further, he personally made photographs pertaining to BONNIE PARKER, and along with the URSCHEL film, he included film pertaining to JOHN DILLINGER and possibly others, which he obtained elsewhere and which he worked into a feature item consisting of about five reels of film for leasing to theaters. He advised the film pertaining to the URSCHEL case alone was first entitled "Hot Money", but that the original negatives had long since deteriorated and were no longer available. He advised further the feature item had been leased a number of years ago to an individual named [redacted] for a period of five years, and he was unable to state if the film was still available. [redacted] advised he would attempt to contact [redacted] to determine if the film referred to above was still available. He also stated the soundman accompanying him at the trial of the URSCHEL kidnapers was [redacted] who was still employed by the Jamieson Film Company.

[redacted] when recontacted on September 5, 1958, advised he had contacted [redacted] and had received information

that a film entitled "Killers All" was believed to contain film pertaining to the trial of the URSCHEL kidnapers and was believed available through [REDACTED] of the Texas Theater Service, Dallas, Texas. During the recontact of [REDACTED] he advised he had talked to [REDACTED] and was now of the opinion that only the actual sentencing was photographed and recorded while court was in session and that the remainder of the shots of the court room were taken during recesses. [REDACTED] advised further at the time of the URSCHEL kidnaping, [REDACTED] was rather new and as he recalled, only he and one [REDACTED] were in possession of movie cameras. He stated [REDACTED] is from a prominent Oklahoma City family and is believed residing in Oklahoma City at the present time. [REDACTED] according to [REDACTED] can probably verify whether any photographing was done during the time court was actually in session.

[REDACTED] Dallas, Texas, who is employed by the [REDACTED] 325 Bryan, Dallas, advised he accompanied [REDACTED] as his soundman during the time the trial of the URSCHEL kidnapers was covered. He stated he was quite sure no photographing was allowed during the time court was actually in session because the Federal Judge, in whose court the trial was held, was of the opinion such photographing might affect the trial. [REDACTED] stated the judge allowed the actual sentencing to be photographed and the sound recorded. [REDACTED] recalled especially the sentencing of the SHANNON son, who received a sentence of ten years, which was suspended on his good behavior. He also recalled only one trial which pertained to the URSCHEL kidnapers.

On September 8, 1958, [REDACTED] Texas Theater Service, 2013 1/2 Young Street, advised the film, "Killers All", was presently under the control of Toddy Pictures, 148 Walton Street, N.W., Atlanta, Georgia, but that such film had been leased by him for exhibition to various theaters. He stated at the present time he was negotiating for the exhibition of this film in Tulsa, Oklahoma, and should have information in the near future as to whether he was successful and if so, he would furnish specific dates. He stated he also anticipated showing this film in other cities in the State of Oklahoma during September, 1958.

On September 9, 11, 12, 15, 1958, efforts were made to determine from [REDACTED] Texas Theater Service, 2013 1/2 Young Street, whether he had been successful in scheduling the film "Killers All".

On September 12, 1958, [REDACTED] stated he expected to have the desired information by either September 15 or 16, 1958.

On September 15, 1958, he advised he was proceeding to Oklahoma City on September 16, 1958, because he had been unable to book the film in Tulsa as previously anticipated. He advised he would contact the Dallas Office on his return about September 17, 1958.
