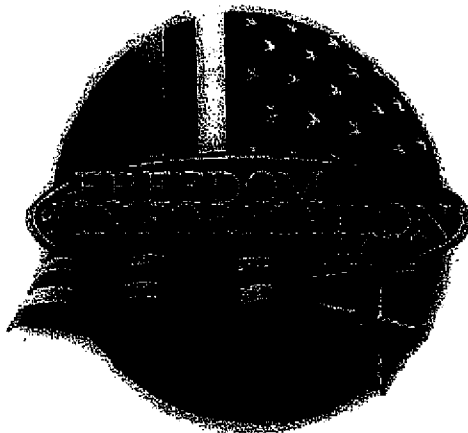

In a special birthday tribute to El Hajj Malik El Shabazz (Malcolm X) several schools in Manhattan honored the late great Black leader on May 19.

#### Need of Love

The Arthur A. Schomburg Intermediate School 201, their theme being "What The World Needs Now Is Love," honored the Black leader with songs and dance depicting African history.

Eight schools in the Ocean Hill-Brownsville section of Brooklyn closed in his honor.

Although the Board of Education was unable to verify the school closings, or to give any information as to what schools participated in the tribute to Malcolm X, it was rumored that schools in Manhattan held small parades, memorial services and special assembly's in his honor.

"For Harlem is where he worked and where he struggled and fought. His home of homes, where his heart was and where his people are, and it is therefore most fitting that we meet once again in Harlem, to share these last moments with him."

Although it has been five years since the death of Malcolm X, Black children are still aware of his presence, and Black educators consider it their duty not to revile him or to flee even from the presence of his memory, as Ossie Davis stated. In spite of the history of our turbulent times, the great leader will go down in Black history.

All schools in Ocean Hill-Brownsville were closed during the day, and many others although open were virtually abandoned by students.

### BLACK MUSLIMS LOSE ON MURDER APPEAL

Special to The New York Times

ALBANY, April 16—The Court of Appeals rejected today an appeal of three Black Muslims sentenced to life in prison for the murder of Malcolm X, leader of the Organization of Afro-American Unity.

In a unanimous opinion, the state's highest court ruled there was no reversible error in the first-degree murder conviction of Thomas Hagan, Norman 3X Butler and Thomas 15X Johnson.

The appeal asked the reversal of the conviction because the press and public were barred from the courtroom during the testimony of two witnesses. This act, the three claimed, denied them their constitutional right to a public trial.

That contention was rejected, said Associate Judge Francis Bergan, who wrote the opinion, because:

"In the balancing of policy and of interests if, for a good reason related directly to the management of the trial, the judge closes the court room as to the testimony of a witness and otherwise keeps it open to the press and public, a defendant is not necessarily deprived of a 'public' trial."

The judge had closed the

court when the attorney for one witness said the life of his witness had been threatened and he feared for his life if he testified. Related testimony by an agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation was also taken in private.

Malcolm X was murdered Feb. 21, 1965, while addressing an audience in the Audubon Ballroom in New York City.

# Project of Bill of Malcolm X

Albany, April 16 (UPI)—The Court of Appeals upheld today the conviction of three black Muslims for the slaying of Malcolm X, who was gunned down while he was preparing to speak to 400 followers in a Manhattan ballroom on Feb. 21, 1965.

In a unanimous opinion, the state's highest court ruled that the conviction was not voided in the assassination of Malcolm X is admitted. All three had received sentences of life imprisonment.

### Part of Section Sent

The defendants, Thomas Hayes, Norman B. Butler, and Clarence Johnson, all of New York City and 20 other Muslims, are considered that they intended to murder Malcolm X during a public meeting of the group held in the ballroom.

The opinion, written by Associate Justice Francis Bergon, cited several cases where the press and public had been excluded from trials and this did not infringe on the defendants' rights. The court cited part of the Malcolm X trial when a witness said he feared that his life would be endangered if he testified and that he had been threatened.

### Killed by Shotgun

Malcolm X was standing in the Audubon Ballroom when a blast from a 12-gauge shotgun felled him. About the same time, a smoke bomb was set off in the rear of the hall.

Two men then ran up and emptied about 16 shots from a Luger and a .32-caliber revolver into his body. Police believe that the slaying stemmed from his rivalry with a Chicago-based sect of black Muslims.

The above-mentioned article indicates that two film companies in Hollywood are currently preparing to start production on two separate films on the life of subject, now deceased, who is better known as Malcolm X. Columbia Pictures, which owns the movie rights to the book "The Autobiography of Malcolm X," will produce one of the movies to be released under that title. The script is being written by James Baldwin. The second movie is being produced by 20th Century-Fox and will be entitled "Malcolm X." The script for the latter is being written by Louis Lomax. All offices have previously been alerted under the "Nation of Islam, IS - NOI" caption to a possible movie on the life of Malcolm X since it is anticipated that such a film could be detrimental to the Nation of Islam and its leader, Elijah Muhammad.

Los Angeles is requested to discreetly contact sources at the above two studios to confirm the information in the article and to determine details relative to these two films. Los Angeles should be particularly alert for indications that the Bureau will be mentioned or portrayed in either movie. Los Angeles should obtain advanced copies of these scripts in order that the interest of the Bureau may be protected. Handle promptly and furnish the results in a form suitable for dissemination to the Bureau and all interested offices.

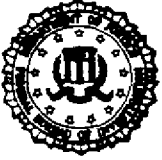

This leaflet, according to the source, was captioned, "Black Peoples Convention - Black Power - Black Politics - Black Revolution."

This source advised the leaflet furnished information concerning the Black Peoples Convention (BPC) scheduled for the period of September 1-4, 1967, in Chicago, Illinois. Source advised the first event to occur was a Black Liberation Rally to take place on September 1, 1967, at the Hyde Park Methodist Church, 1451 East 54th Street, Chicago, Illinois, to commence at 7 p.m. Speakers for this rally were to include H. Rap Brown, Floyd McKissick, leader of the Congress of Racial Equality (CORE), Lincoln Lynch, Vice-Chairman of CORE, together with other speakers. This leaflet further indicated that over the period of September 2-4, 1967, BPC workshops would be held at times and places to be announced later.

This source also provided a "Black Power Convention Position Paper" obtained at the NCNP Convention at the Palmer House Hotel in Chicago, Illinois, which is as follows:

On September 2, 1967, [REDACTED] advised that the BPC held an open rally on September 1, 1967, at the Hyde Park Methodist Church, 1451 East 54th Street, Chicago, Illinois, from 7:30 p.m. to 12:30 a.m. on September 2, 1967. A standing-room-only crowd was present at this rally, estimated at approximately 800 persons. Some white individuals were present prior to the beginning of this rally; however, "whites and crackers" were requested to leave as soon as the rally commenced.

Speakers at this rally included Dick Gregory, Chicago comedian and civil rights activist; Floyd McKissick, Chairman of CORE; James Forman, former SNCC Chairman; Russell Means, Chicago West Side militant Negro; representatives of African student groups; and others.

Dick Gregory's comments included numerous vulgarities and was generally militant in nature. He stated racism and capitalism are synonymous and must go out together, by revolutionary means, if necessary, not just in the United States but also in Asia, Africa, and Latin America. He stated "Whitey" knows violence will come, but does not know where or when. He stated speakers for the Negroes would talk "over and under" so that "Whitey" will have no information of value. He urged Negroes to unite in order to show "Crackers" their power as a "Cracker Power" was about to reach an end. He commented that Negro soldiers returning from overseas and black youths will not take what "old folks" have taken in the past.

These sources further advised that prior to Gregory's speech, the rally was opened with a prayer for Malcolm X, and speeches of H. Rap Brown were distributed, including one speech Brown made recently in Detroit, Michigan.

Malcolm X Little is fully described in the attached characterizations.

Lawrence Landry and James Harvey, leader of the AASA, were introduced at the rally but did not speak. Many people present at this rally were dressed in African costumes.

Source advised further that it was announced at this rally that the BPC would reconvene on September 2, 1967, at 10 a.m., at the Christ Methodist Church, 6401 South Sangamon Avenue, Chicago, Illinois, in workshop-type sessions. Individuals present were advised further that details concerning the BPC agenda would be available at that time. No plans were

announced for any subsequent rally of the type presented during the remainder of the BPC. During the rally, no incidents or disorders were observed to occur and the rally appeared to be generally well organized.

[REDACTED] advised that at approximately 12:15 p.m. on September 2, 1967, the BPC reconvened at the Christ Methodist Church, 6401 South Sangamon Avenue, Chicago, Illinois. Approximately 175 individuals were present at this meeting, consisting entirely of Negroes.

The meeting opened with a speech by James Cage, Chicago West Side CORE Chairman, who served as Master of Ceremonies. The principal speaker was one McGrey (phonetic), who reportedly was from New York and who spent a considerable amount of time explaining background developments concerning the BPC from Black caucuses held during the past several days at the NCNP Convention being held in the Palmer House Hotel in Chicago. McGrey referred to 13 resolutions or demands made upon the NCNP by Black Delegates who had not so far walked out of the NCNP, and the possibility of more of these delegates joining the BPC.

Source advised that individuals present at this BPC then split into four workshops, including (1) Economics, (2) Evolution of the Black Man, (3) Political Activities, and (4) Additional workshop for professional people, such as teachers and artists. The workshop on Economics was chaired by James Cage and Lawrence Landry, who is also Chairman of Chicago's ACT. The workshop on Politics was chaired by Odis Hyde, and one Kamato (phonetic), of New York, chaired the workshop on the Evolution of the Black Man.

APPENDIX

NATIONAL SOCIALIST WHITE PEOPLE'S PARTY, AND THE AMERICAN NAZI PARTY, CHICAGO, ILLINOIS

A source advised on November 14, 1960, that on that date a meeting was held in Chicago, Illinois, for the purpose of organizing a Chicago Unit of the American Nazi Party (ANP) which maintains headquarters in Arlington, Virginia. GEORGE LINCOLN ROCKWELL, National Commander, ANP, took charge of this meeting.

On May 22, 1966, [REDACTED] ANP, Chicago, advised that the ANP in Chicago is to a degree autonomous although it remains subject to the final authority of GEORGE LINCOLN ROCKWELL and ANP National Headquarters. b7c

A second source advised on August 17, 1966, that the Chicago Branch of the ANP is currently located at 1314 West Ohio Street, Chicago, Illinois.

A third and fourth source have advised in December, 1966, that a directive was received from National Headquarters in Arlington, Virginia, by the Chicago Unit of the ANP, 1314 West Ohio Street, during December, 1966, advising that the official name of the organization beginning January, 1967, would be National Socialist White People's Party.

These latter two sources have advised that since January 1, 1967, the Chicago Unit of the ANP has mailed out official pamphlets and appeals under the heading of the National Socialist White People's Party, 1314 West Ohio Street, Chicago, Illinois (American Nazi Party).

In his book, "This Time the World," copyrighted in 1961, GEORGE LINCOLN ROCKWELL identified himself as Commander, American Nazi Party of the World Union of Free Enterprise National Socialists (ANP - WUFENS), Arlington, Virginia.

The April 4, 1963, issue of "The Richmond News Leader," a Richmond, Virginia, daily newspaper, reported that GEORGE LINCOLN ROCKWELL had, on the previous day, again applied for the American Nazi Party to be chartered in the State of Virginia, but this request was turned down by the Virginia State Corporation Commission. This action was taken pursuant to an act of the 1962 Virginia Assembly which prohibits use of "Nazi" or "Nationalism Socialism" in a Virginia charter. This article further pointed out that ROCKWELL's Party is presently chartered in the State of Virginia as the George Lincoln Rockwell Party.

On August 14, 1964, a source advised that ANP-WUFENS was organized by GEORGE LINCOLN ROCKWELL at his residence in Arlington, Virginia, on February 26, 1956, as an international "National Socialist" movement based on the German Nazi Party headed by Adolf Hitler. He added that ROCKWELL is the dominant force and personality in this Party; that he is espousing a "line" of hatred against the Jews and Negroes; and that he is seeking, through speeches, distribution of literature and picketing, to establish a cohesive and dominant political party in the United States and in foreign countries.

According to the "Stormtrooper's Manual," an official publication of the ANP, the phases of ANP struggle for power are fourfold, namely, first "to make ourselves known to the masses"; second, "the dissemination of our program and truth about the Party"; third, "organizing the people who have been converted to our propaganda"; and fourth, "the attainment of power through the votes of the newly-won masses."

On August 19, 1966, the source advised that GEORGE LINCOLN ROCKWELL presently believes that he has completed the first two phases in his struggle for power and is well into the third stage, to wit, "the organizing of the people who have been converted to our propaganda." The source added that ROCKWELL had previously believed that he would be elected Governor of Virginia in November, 1965, and when defeated, he made the statement that he was not ready for stage four.

On December 27, 1966, the source advised that ROCKWELL mailed a communication to all members of the ANP entitled, "National Directive from the Commander, Effective 1/1/67." This communication reflected that the formal name of the Party would be "National Socialist White People's Party" and they would still be known as the "American Nazi Party" and "American Nazis" for short.

1APPENDIXREVOLUTIONARY ACTION MOVEMENT

On November 3, 1964, a source made available a document entitled, "The Revolutionary Action Movement Manifesto", the document having been obtained by the source from an individual known to be a member of the Revolutionary Action Movement. (RAM).

This document stated, in part, that RAM was officially organized in the winter of 1963 by Afro-Americans who support the revolutionary objectives of ROBERT F. WILLIAMS, then residing in Cuba, and his concept of organized violence to achieve the liberation of the Afro-American people in the United States. This Manifesto disclosed that RAM had oriented its program to one of education and political revolution and the organization of a "black" political party with revolutionary objectives, having recognized the need for a "black revolution" that could and would seize power. RAM philosophy is described in this document as one of revolutionary nationalism, that is, one involving the struggles of the non-white races of the world against exploitation and enslavement by the white capitalist and imperialist nations.

Regarding WILLIAMS, it should be noted that on August 28, 1961, a Federal warrant was issued at Charlotte, North Carolina, charging him with Unlawful Flight to Avoid Prosecution for the crime of kidnaping. Subsequent to the issuance of this warrant, WILLIAMS fled the United States to Cuba, where he published a monthly newsletter entitled, "The Crusader" from Havana. As of December, 1966, WILLIAMS was residing in Peking, China.

This source, in September, 1964, advised RAM is dedicated to the overthrow of the capitalist system in the United States, by violence, if necessary, and to its replacement by a socialistic system oriented toward the Chinese Communist interpretation of Marxism-Leninism. RAM is entirely non-white in membership, clandestine in nature, and owes its primary allegiance to the "Bandung World", that is, the non-white races of the world rather than to any national entity, as such.

On November 16, 1964, a second source advised he learned recently from a RAM member that the organization began in Detroit, Michigan, largely under the impetus of DON FREEMAN, described as the "Father" of RAM and referred to as RAM's "Black Stalin". FREEMAN served as RAM Chairman, with MAXWELL STANFORD (now of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania) serving as RAM Field Chairman.

On May 12, 1967, a third source advised that the RAM still remains active; however, there is no formal headquarters, as such, for the RAM. The source advised that MAXWELL STANFORD of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, is considered the leader of RAM and if a RAM headquarters ever existed, it will most likely be where STANFORD resides.

On May 19, 1967, a Confidential Source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that approximately 50 people left the residence of Ella Collins, 224 West 139th Street, New York, New York, at about 11:30 a.m., on May 19, 1967, to travel to the Ferncliff Cemetery, where Malcolm X is buried. Among those who left were Mrs. Ella Collins, Willie Starks, Chester Gresham, Arthur Grant, Louise Jeffers, Toni Ardelle, Dennis Brogdon, all of the Organization of Afro-American Unity (OAAU), and Charles 37X Morris, of the Black Nationalist Mau Mau Organization. Approximately 15 other Mau Mau members also attended. Charles 37X Morris and his group were dressed in black uniforms, helmets with "Mau Mau" written on them and combat boots.

This group arrived at the Ferncliff Cemetery at approximately 1:30 p.m. on May 19, 1967. Charles 37X and his followers served as honorary guardsmen at the cemetery. During the ceremony, a Malcolm X flag was unrolled and placed on the gravesite. The flag was then presented to Ella Collins and then the group returned to Collins' residence in Harlem, New York.

On May 19, 1967, [redacted] advised Special Agent [redacted] that nine automobiles, carrying individuals in the Pilgrimage to Ferncliff Cemetery, Greenburgh, New York, arrived at approximately 1:30 p.m. About 40 people attended the ceremony in honor of Malcolm X at the cemetery. [redacted] reported that some automobiles bore red, green and black flags. The group left the area at 2:30 p.m. No incidents or arrests took place.

On May 20, 1967, a second Confidential Source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that on that date, the OAAU sponsored a rally at "Malcolm Square" located at 125th Street and 7th Avenue, New York, New York, which began at 3:30 p.m. and terminated at 6:30 p.m. It was estimated that approximately 250 people were on hand at the rally. This rally was held to commemorate the birth of Malcolm X. Charles 37X, the Head of the Black Nationalist Mau Mau Organization, was one of the speakers. He stated that the Negro people should sit down in the streets of Harlem until a bust of Malcolm X is erected in Harlem. He also stated that places like Harlem should be burned down and rebuilt.

Paul Boutelle of the Socialist Workers Party (SWP), spoke about the colonization of Africa and the white man's exploitation of the black man. He mentioned the same thing is taking place in the United States. He also stated that the war in Vietnam was an unjust one.

This source also stated that Ella Collins, Head of the OAAU, spoke on how she loved Malcolm X and how Malcolm's so-called friends betrayed him. She talked about the pilgrimage to the cemetery on May 19, 1967, and stated that some 4,000 students in California, refused to go to school on Malcolm's birthday. She mentioned that this should be done in Harlem since Malcolm was a part of Harlem.

The SWP has been designated pursuant to  
Executive Order 10450.

On May 21, 1967, a third Confidential Source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that on that date, a Memorial Tribute to Malcolm X was held at the residence of Ella Collins, 224 West 139th Street, New York, New York. The meeting began at 6:30 p.m. and ended at about 9:15 p.m. with approximately 40 people in attendance. Among the speakers were the following:

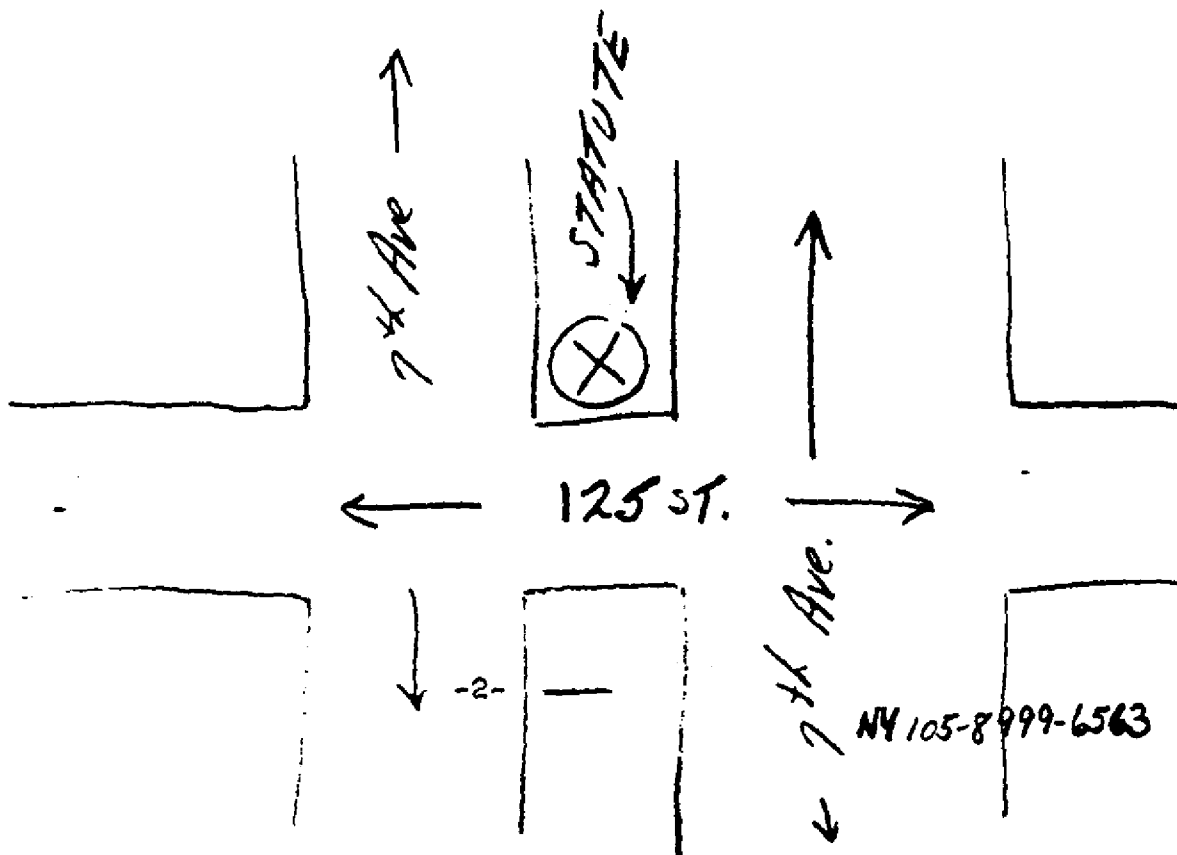

# Armed Negro Guards For Malcolm X Widow

A four-day conference on the issues facing the Negroes of America began here today in the Bayview Community Center.

Considering problems of the urban ghetto, welfare, urban renewal, education, and prisons as well as economics of the black community and black politics, it appeared to be a quiet meeting.

But its preliminaries, and the man in whose name the conference was held, attracted their share of attention yesterday.

Two years ago Malcolm X, the spiritual leader if not the titular leader of the Black Muslims, was assassinated in a public meeting in Harlem.

On the anniversary of his death yesterday the white community, and a good part of the black community, had forgotten.

## ARMED MEN

But the anniversary was forcefully brought home when a group of 20 armed Negroes appeared at the South Terminal of San Francisco International Airport and took up stations at the American Airlines pier.

Carrying pistols, rifles, and shotguns, they were awaiting Mrs. Betty Shabazz, widow of the slain Muslim leader.

Alarmed San Mateo County Sheriff's deputies were told that Mrs. Shabazz' life had been threatened and the bodyguards were merely there to protect her.

"My men investigated and found no violations," said Sheriff's Captain Eugene Stewart. "Some of them had sidearms strapped to their waists and others carried rifles and shotguns." But none of the weapons were concealed.

The group departed in a

caravan immediately for the Broadway office of Ramparts magazine, where San Francisco police responded to calls of armed men appearing on the street.

## CALLS TO POLICE

The bodyguard accompanied the widow to the office for an interview. The scene was peaceful until a television reporter attempted to barge in.

While Mrs. Shabazz went into seclusion last night, the program ground on. A black hearse carrying a symbolic coffin, departed Fillmore and McAllister streets shortly after 7 p.m. followed by four automobiles filled with symbolic mourners and proceeded to the Bayview Center at Third and Oakdale streets.

At the center, keynote ceremonies began after the hearse arrived and the hall

was cleared. Those attending, Negro and Caucasian alike, were carefully searched before they were readmitted to the hall.

## NEWSMEN OUT

After introductory speeches by Don King, chairman of the Black Students Union of San Francisco State College, and Roy Ballard, West Coast Coordinator of the "Black Panther Party," the hall was cleared of reporters and Mrs. Shabazz was ushered in through a side door.

Outside stood members of her bodyguard, clad in black berets and short jackets and still carrying their weapons.

Heading the conference is Hakim A. Jama, who lists himself as founder of the Malcolm X organization of Afro-American Unity, a Black Nationalist organization.

# Frightening 'Army' Hits The Airport

A bodyguard of 20 Negroes defied security officers at San Francisco International Airport yesterday by displaying shotguns and pistols while ringing themselves around the wife of the late Malcolm X as she stepped off an American Airlines jet.

The bodyguard in black berets and wearing waist-length leather jackets — all members of the Black Panther party here — walked into the airport lobby at 3:05 p.m. to await Betty X, wife of the former Black Muslim leader slain in 1965.

They were confronted by airport security chief George Nessel and a group of armed deputies.

## REFUSAL

"I told them to stay outside the building except for three or four," said Nessel. "I told them we would protect her, but they refused outright."

Nessel, who said the men formed ranks two deep and marched with precision to American's gate 47, added the group "was quite hip on the law."

"The only law there is — is against carrying concealed weapons, and there wasn't anything concealed," he said. "Of course, they were on private property — American leases it — and could have been arrested for trespassing, but I didn't want to inflame them and create a scene and scare a lot of innocent people."

## 'VIGILANTES'

A throng of waiting passengers and those waiting to greet the jet were obviously frightened anyway.

"It was like a scene out of a Western — you know, this group of armed vigilantes," said one witness. "Why, each one, like clockwork, set themselves up at various stations at the arrival gate and waited, rifles in hand."

Eight of Nessel's deputies kept the party under surveillance as the jet, carrying Malcolm X's widow, taxied into the passenger unloading zone.

There were no incidents as

the armed reception committee — with the widow in tow — left the airport lobby and departed in six cars parked outside.

Later, at the Ramparts Magazine office in North Beach where Betty X arrived for an interview, things were not quite as subdued even though her bodyguard had dwindled to five.

## 'SCUFFLE'

Robert Scheer, the monthly's managing editor, said "everybody was very calm and relaxed" until a reporter for KGO-TV tried to "push his way into the exclusive interview and got into a scuffle with the bodyguards."

The bodyguards didn't use their arms and no one was hurt. Police were called but made no arrests.

Roy Ballard, a Black Panther spokesman, reported later that "the cops asked us what we were doing with guns and we told them, 'We're exercising our constitutional rights and we're not going to take any bull... What you want to do to us, do it now. We're tired of not standing for rights.'"

It was only after the bodyguard left Ramparts that officers discovered they could arrest any Black Panther caught carrying loaded rifles or shotguns.

"It is a misdemeanor under Section 2006 of the State Fish and Game Code," said Regis Swetmann, Assistant District Attorney, "to carry these weapons if they are loaded."

He added that under law, however, anyone in California can carry a pistol — loaded or not — as long as it is openly displayed. The Code does not apply to pistols.

Later, police issued a description of the men and the cars they arrived in, adding that arrests would be made if ammunition was found in their rifles or shotguns.

The slain leader's widow was guest of honor last night in the opening of a three-day memorial program entitled "Malcolm X Lives for Black People for Black Unity," to be held through tomorrow at the Bayview Community Center.

More than 300 persons showed up for last night's program — commemorating the assassination of Malcolm X on February 21, 1965. All were searched as they entered.

## EULOGY

Ballard, a coordinator of the memorial, declared of Malcolm X: "Here was a man who represented the future, a common Joe Blow from nowhere and he was a king. We have his queen with us. We recognize she is the queen of the black nation. We don't want to get into a dispute with the Black Muslims. We just want the blacks to have equal rights with the whites."

The press was asked to leave before the widow arrived for what Ballard said were "security reasons." He said the widow was in "much danger."

In addition to the economic and social oppression there is official police suppression in Lowndes County. The Negro population have decided to have a say and have formed the Lowndes County Freedom Organization (LCFO) in order to assure that the people can come together democratically to elect their candidates.

LCFO is known informally as the "Black Panther Party" because of its symbol, which stands for courage, determination and freedom.

"RAMPARTS" MAGAZINE

"Ramparts" is a monthly magazine with editorial offices at 301 Broadway, San Francisco, California. It was founded by [REDACTED], a Catholic layman, in 1962 when it contained criticisms of the hierarchy of the Roman Catholic Church in America. "Ramparts" has expanded its criticism of organized religion to provide commentary on politics and

[REDACTED] About 8:30 P.M., the assembly hall of the BCC was filled with about 400 people. The Master of Ceremonies opened the meeting by saying black unity and power were needed. He blamed the CIA for the murder of Malcolm X. The widow of Malcolm X arrived during the third speech-- the audience gave her a standing welcome. She spoke about three or four minutes urging black unity. One speaker introduced as Barbara Auther declared there was no excuse for black people fighting in the Vietnam war. She referred to 22 concentration camps in this country that were training blacks for when it was time to strike.

H. A. Jamal introduced as the Director of the Organization of Afro-American Unity in California, criticized those who had rioted in San Francisco and Watts for backing down after a few concessions had been made and declared that only the armed men in the room were really ready. He stated that black men needed to unify under one leader and that black and white men could never live together.

Other sources who attended this meeting, which they stated was public for black people only, reported similarly as to the general remarks made at the meeting, except in regard to Barbara Auther. None of them reported information concerning training camps for black men, however when specifically questioned on this point they advised as follows:

b2, b7D Source [REDACTED] advised on February 23, 1967, he did not hear Barbara Auther say anything about training camps to train blacks but heard her refer to concentration camps in the United States for people like her who knew the true facts.

b2, b7D Source [REDACTED] advised on February 23, 1967, he heard a speaker named Barbara mention concentration camps in the United States but understood she referred to them as places for persons who did not want to enter the Army.

Two of the sources who heard the statement made by Auther indicating that there were training camps for Negroes in the United States advised that they did not believe this information to be true. They both pointed out that Auther had made very provocative statements, and that they personally did not believe she was truthful.

The San Francisco Office has not received any information from any source indicating that the statements made by Auther regarding training camps for Negroes is true.

San Francisco Bay Area Police Departments have not furnished any information indicating that the statements made by Auther about the camps are true.

On February 9, 1965, a source advised that on that date at Oakland Direct Action Committee (ODAC) headquarters, 8512 East 14th Street, Oakland, California, MARK EVERETT COMFORT, Chairman of ODAC, held a press conference. COMFORT stated that the objective of ODAC was to organize the Negro community, particularly in the eastern section of Oakland, commonly known as East Oakland. He said that ODAC would make demands for equal housing, equal job opportunities and living conditions and would educate the Negro community to realize that "things are not as good as they seem." COMFORT said that ODAC, in contrast to existing civil rights organizations, would strongly emphasize police brutality.

The January 25, 1964 issue of the People's World" (PW), page 3, contains an invitation to the 26th anniversary celebration of the PW, to be held on February 1, 1964, in San Francisco, California. This invitation lists MARK COMFORT as one of four special guests to be honored at this celebration.

The PW is a West Coast Communist newspaper.

A source advised on April 20, 1965, that the Progressive Labor Party (PLP), formerly known as the Progressive Labor Movement (PLM), held its first national convention April 15-18, 1965, at New York City, to organize the PLM into a PLP. The PLP will have as its ultimate objective the establishment of a militant working class movement based on Marxism-Leninism.

The "New York Times" City Edition, Tuesday, April 20, 1965, page 27, reported that a new party of "revolutionary socialism" was formally founded on April 18, 1965, under the name of the PLP. The PLP was described as an outgrowth of the PLM. Its officers were identified as MILTON ROSEN, New York, President, and WILLIAM EPTON of New York, and MORT SCHEER of San Francisco, Vice Presidents. A 20-member National Committee was elected to direct the party until the next convention.

According to the article, "The Progressive Labor Movement was founded in 1962 by Mr. ROSEN and Mr. SCHEER after they were expelled from the Communist Party of the United States for assertedly following the Chinese Communist line".

The PLP publishes "Progressive Labor", a bi-monthly magazine, "Challenge," a bi-weekly New York City newspaper, and "Spark," a West Coast newspaper.

The June 1, 1965, issue of "Challenge," page 6, states that "this paper is dedicated to fight for a new way of life where the working men and women own and control their homes, factories, the police, courts, and the entire government on every level."

The source advised that the PLP utilizes the address of General Post Office Box 808, Brooklyn 1, New York, but also utilizes an office in Room 622, 132 Nassau Street, New York City, where PLP publications are prepared.

W. E. B. DU BOIS CLUBS OF AMERICA (DCA)

A source has advised that on October 26-27, 1963, a conference of members of the Communist Party (CP), including national functionaries, met in Chicago, Illinois, for the purpose of setting in motion forces for the establishment of a new national Marxist-oriented youth organization which would hunt for the most peaceful transition to socialism. The delegates were told that it would be reasonable to assume that the young socialists attracted into this new organization would eventually pass into the CP itself.

A second source has advised that the founding convention for the new youth organization was held from June 19-21, 1964, at 150 Golden Gate Avenue, San Francisco, California, at which time the W. E. B. DuBois Clubs of America (DCA) was adopted. Approximately 500 delegates from throughout the United States attended this convention. The aims of this organization, as set forth in the preamble to the constitution, are: "It is our belief that this nation can best solve its problems in an atmosphere of peaceful coexistence, complete disarmament and true freedom for all peoples of the world, and that these solutions will be reached mainly through the united efforts of all democratic elements in our country, composed essentially of the working people allied in the unity of Negroes and other minorities with whites. We further fully recognize that the greatest threat to American democracy comes from the racist and right wing forces in coalition with the most reactionary sections of the economic power structure, using the tool of anti-Communism to divide and destroy the unified struggle of the working people."

Over the Labor Day weekend, 1965, the DCA held a conference in Chicago, Illinois, and a new slate of officers was elected to the National Executive Committee (NEC) of the DCA. Since Labor Day, 1965, identities of those serving on the NEC has varied;

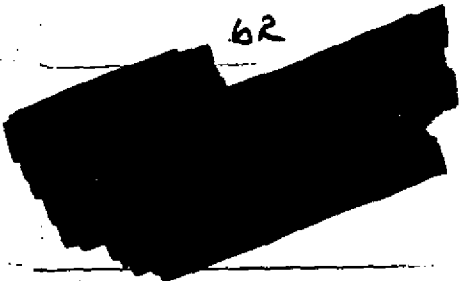
