Muslim Says Islam Faith Is Panacea

TORONTO, Canada — The faith of Islam offers the world a solution to the racial crists. This is the view of Muslim leader Muhammad Tufail, of the largest mosque at Surrey, in England, who spoke before the Muslim society in Toronto recently.

Mr. Tufail, to Illustrate his point, cited Malcolm X, former chief lieutenant to Elijab Mulammad, prophet of the militint anti-white Black Muslims, who recently embraced orthodox Islam, which Mr. Tulfell states, "cuts across all racib boundaries."

"I found no trace of racial prejudice among Muslims," said Malcolm X during a recent pilgrimage to Mecca, the sacred city to all Muslims."

Characterization of the Muslim Mosque, Incorporated (MMI), Nation of Islam (NOI) and NOI Mosque # 7, New York City, are attached hereto and all sources therein have furnished reliable information in the past.

On September 10, 1924, a confidential source who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that a regular meeting of the Mil was held on the evening of September 9, 1984, at Wil Headquarters, Suite 123, Hotel Theresa, 2090 7th Avenue, New York City. The meeting was precided over by Brother Benjamin 2x Goodman, a former Mol assistant minister who joined with Malcolm X Little when the latter formed the WML.

Following the Islamic religious service at the meeting Brother Benjamin read a letter written by Malcolm X from Africa where he is on tour, which was addressed to an unknown African delegate to the Organization of African Unity conference in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia.

In the letter Malcolm X informed the delegate that if the latter needed recruits to join the rebel military forces in the Congo to aid in driving the white mercenary forces of Congo President Moise Tshombe out of the Congo, he (Malcolm X) could obtain 10,000 recruits in the Harlem section of New York City. Brother Benjamin stated that he was ready and willing to serve. There were 22 persons at the meeting.





Wallace apprised Malcolm X of the above information and his own feelings. Said Malcolm X told him of the above information quite some time ago. He said he could not recall the exact date but felt it could have been two to three years ago.

Malcolm X was appalled at the revelation of Muhaumad's extra marital activities. This information, coupled with the restrictions imposed by Muhaumad upon his cwn activities and responsibilities in the NOI during recent years, precipitated Malcolm X's break with Elijah Muhaumad.

CAIRO—Malcolm X, whom the Chinese Communists call the "chairman of the Airo-American unity organization," spent a considerable amount of his time in the presence of international Communist phopagandists here.

Not only did he endorse the rioting back home, but he publicly called for retaliation against the white community. He said the time had come to meet "violence with violence; an eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth."

He prepared a series of inflammatory anti-U.S. documents here on the pretext of presenting them to the recent meeting of the Organization of African Unity, and it was reported across the world that he attended the conference. This is nonsense. He did not get near the parley. He was

not accredited to it

Malcolm X was not at any of the conference sessions. I

was informed that it "is ridiculous" and "undignified" to
think for a moment that anyone such as Malcolm X would
think for a moment that anyone such as Malcolm X would
be heard by the African counterpart of the Organization of
American States.

Malcolm X's activity here was strictly a propaganda oberation which he set up at the Hotel Semiramis, where some newsmen gathered. He made certain that his vident apti-U.S. diatribes were put in the hands of the Chinese Communist correspondents planted here by the New China News Agency.



Malcolm X, a former leader of the Black Muslims, who now heads a Black Nationalist group, has expressed the view that Negro Americans would fare better if Senator Barry Gold-water were elected President than if President Johnson should be reelected.

Most Negro leaders and organizations are committed to President Johnson and have registered strong opposition to Senator Goldwater.

Malcolm X, writing in this week's Saturday Evening Post, said that the two candidates were quite similar, but that with Senator Goldwater "the with Senator Goldwater "the black people at least know what they are dealing with." He said Senator Goldwater was like a "wolf," and President Johnson was like a "fox." "Since these are the choices,

the black man in America, I think, only needs to pick which one he chooses to be eaten by, because both will eat him," he said. With the Senator, he noted, "they would at least know they were fighting an honestly growling wolf, rather than a fox who could have them in his stomach and have digested them before they even






Malcolm Losing Home



Malcolm X. Ordered To Vacate Home

Malcolm X, former Black Muslim leader, was ordered today to vacate his Queens home provided for him by a church te no longed serves.

Civil Court Judge Maurice Wahl ordered Malcolm X to move out of the house at 23-11 77th St., East Elmhurst by next Jan. 31 since he no longer represents the religious body known as the Muhammad Temple or Islam.

Malcolm X, the father of three daughters, broke with the Muslims last March 8. During a two-day trial that started June 15, he claimed the house had been given to him outright.

The temple said, however, that it was paying the mortigage and taxes on the 1½-story house and it agreed to allow Malcolm X use it only as long as he was a member of the sect.





ORGANIZATION OF AFRO-AMERICAN UNITY

On September 1, 1964, a confidential source furnished the following information:

A. ROBERT KAUFMAN of Baltimore, Maryland, during the latter part of August, 1964, had made arrangements to rent the Polytechnic High School Auditorium in Baltimore for September 12 and 13, 1964. KAUFMAN had told the Baltimore Board of Education officials that he planned to bring in a speaker from the Organization of Afro-American Unity (OAAU).

A second confidential source on June 30, 1961, identified ROBERT KAUFMAN as an Officer-at-large of the Maryland Chapter of the Fair Play for Cuba Committee, and on October 19, 1961, identified ROBERT KAUFMAN as the Chairman of the Young Socialist Alliance in Baltimore, Maryland.

KAUFMAN in contacting the Board of Education officials told them that the speaker (who was not named) was being brought in by the "Freedom Forum Committee" of Baltimore. The source knows that the "Freedom Forum Committee" has no real substance and is a fictitious organization created by KAUFMAN.

KAUFMAN, prior to written permission from the Board of Education, issued press releases under the name of the Freedom Forum Committee announcing that MALCOLM X, Chairman of the Organization of Afro-American Unity would speak at the Polytechnic Auditorium September 12, 1964, with the main topic to be recent conferences which MALCOLM X has had with leaders of the African Nations and the proposals he will make before the United Nations concerning racial violence in many American cities. MALCOLM X was also to explain his position of "self-defense" as opposed to "nonviolence."

On August 28, 1964, the officials of the Board of Education wrote to KAUFMAN revoking his permit to use the auditorium in view, among other things, of inadequate information about the Freedom Forum Committee.

FAIR PLAY FOR CUBA COMMITTEE

The April 6, 1960, edition of "The New York Times" newspaper contained a full-page advertisement captioned "What Is Really Happening In Cuba," placed by the Fair Play for Cuba Committee (FPCC). This advertisement announced the formation of the FPCC in New York City and declared the FPCC intended to promulgate "the truth about revolutionary Cuba" to neutralize the distorted American press.

"The New York Times" edition of January 11, 1961, reported that at a hearing conducted before the United States Senate Internal Security Subcommittee on January 10, 1961, Dr. Charles A. Santos-Buch identified himself and Robert Taber as organizers of the FPCC. He also testified he and Taber obtained funds from the Cuban Government which were applied toward the cost of the aforementioned advertisement.

On May 16, 1963, a source advised that during the first two years of the FPCC's existence there was a struggle between Communist Party (CP) and Socialist Workers Party (SWP) elements to exert their power within the FPCC and thereby influence FPCC policy. This source added that during the past year there had been a successful effort by FPCC leader—ship to minimize the role of these and other organizations in the FPCC so that their influence as of May, 1963, was negligible.

The SWP has been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

On May 20, 1963, a second source advised that Vincent "Ted" Lee, FPCC National Office Director, was then formulating FPCC policy and had indicated that he had no intention of permitting FPCC policy to be determined by any other organization. This source stated that Lee believed that the FPCC should advocate resumption of diplomatic relations between Cuba and the United States and should support the right of Cubans to manage their revolution without interference from other nations. Lee did not advocate supporting the Cuban revolution per se.

The November 23, 1963, edition of "The New York Times" reported that Senator Thomas J. Dodd of Connecticut had called FPCC "the chief public relations instrument of the Castro network in the United States." It is to be noted that Senator Dodd was a member of the Senate Internal Security Subcommittee which twice conducted hearings on the FPCC.



The December 27, 1963, edition of "The New York World Telegram and Sun" newspaper stated that the pro-Castro FPCC was seeking to go out of business and that its prime activity during its lifetime had been sponsorship of pro-Castro street rallies and mass picket lines, and the direction of an active propaganda mill highlighting illegal travel-to-Cuba campaigns. Its comparatively brief span of life was attributed to mounting anti-Castro American public opinion, the 1962 Congressional hearings which disclosed FPCC financing by Castro's United Nations Delegation, and ultimately, the bad publicity which the FPCC received from disclosure of activities on its behalf by suspected presidential assassin Lee H. Oswald.

On February 6, 1964, the previously mentioned second source advised that V. T. Lee had recently remarked that the FPCC was dead and that there were no plans to organize another similar organization.

On April 13, 1964, a third source advised that there had not been any FPCC activity in many months and that the FPCC had been dissolved.





YOUNG SOCIALIST ALLIANCE, BALTIMORE BRANCH

On July 16, 1962, a confidential source advised that the Baltimore Branch of the Young Socialist Alliance (YSA) was formed on August 23, 1960, and is affiliated with the national organization of the YSA to which it pays dues. The Baltimore Branch YSA adheres to the same aims and purposes as the national organization.

A second confidential source advised on February 20, 1964, that ROGER SHEPPARD, 1503 Park Avenue, Baltimore, Maryland, a member of the National Committee of the YSA, is the YSA organizer at Baltimore.

On May 25, 1964, a third confidential source advised that ROGER SHEPPARD still operates the Baltimore Branch of the YSA from his residence, 1503 Park Avenue, Baltimore, Maryland.

MALCOLM X ARTICLE FAVORS GOLDWATER

. Malcolm X, a former leader of the Black Muslims, who now heads a Black Nationalist group, has expressed the view that Negro Americans would fare better if Senator Barry Goldwater were elected President than if President Johnson should be reelected.

Most Negro leaders and organizations are committed to President Johnson and have reg-

President Johnson and have registered strong opposition to Senator Goldwater.

Malcolm X, writing in this week's Saturday Evening Post, said that the two candidates were quite similar, but that with Senator Goldwater "the black people at least know what they are dealing with." He said Senator Goldwater was like a Senator Goldwater was like a "wolf," and President Johnson was like a "fox."

"Since these are the choices, the black man in America, I

the black man in America, I think, only needs to pick which one he chooses to be eaten by, because both will eat him," he said. With the Senator, he noted, "they would at least know they were fighting an honestly growling wolf, rather than a fox who could have them in his stomach and have digested them before they even knew what is happening."

If Senator Goldwater became President, according to Mal-

President, according to Mal-colm, the Negro would know he had to fight harder and would be "more positive in his demands, more aggressive in his protests."






