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

NEW YORK — Malcom X, just back from a four-month tour of Africal, will speak here on: "1965: The Prospects for Freedom." The meeting will be held Thursday night, Jan. 7, under the suspices of the Militant Labor Forum, at the Palm Gardens Ballroom, 310 West 52nd St., just west of Eighth Avenue.

Chairman of the Organization of Afro-American Unity, Malcolm X visited the African nations to tell them the truth about the plight of black Americans and to enlist their aid in the fight against U.S. racial oppression. He spoke on this subject before the Organization of African Unity which then adopted a resolution condemning U.S. racism,

In the course of his tour, he visited the United Arab Republic, Saudi Arabia, Lebanon, Ethiopia, Tanzania, Nigeria, Southern Rhodesia, Ghana, Guinee, Algeria and Kenya.

Harlem Rally Demands: 'Hands Off the Congo!'

NEW YORK, Dec. 14 — An overflow crowd of about 1,500 cheered Malcolm X, Dick Gregory and Shelk Abdul Rahman Muhammed Babu, a leader of the January revolution in Zanzibar, at a rally of the Organization of Afro-American Unity. The audience responded with rousing applause to a message of solidarity with his "brothers and sisters of Harlem" from Cuban leader Che Guevara. Speakers at the rally demanded: "Hands off the Consol"

Malcolm X began his remarks with an attack on the press. He pointed out that "the press is so powerful... it can make a crimal look like the victim... make you love the criminal and hate the victim." The Congo is a good example of what the press does, he explained. U.S.-supplied planes are dropping bombs on villages in the Congo — blowing up defenseless women and children — and the press makes "mass murder — cold-blooded murder — look like humanitarianism."

"The press is white . . and it's dangerous," said the black nationalist leader. Whenever they can't control someone they call him freesponcible or subversive, he declared, "We are living in a

... which has a very deceitful and tricky government." It was therefore necessary to form the habit of thinking and seeing for one's self.

Malcolm X attacked Tshombe as "the worst African ever born," a "cold-blooded murderer" who "murdered Lumumba." "He should never be allowed to set foot in this country... he should be afraid to."

Malcoim X pointed out that when Congolese were killed there was no outcry, but the press had aused a world outcry over the whites. Then he went on to read from an article in the Daily Express, a conservative British newspaper, describing the indiscriminate mass murder of Congolese by the Belgians and white methenaries in Stanleyville.

He labeled the anti-Chstro

Cuhan pilots flying in the Congo as the hired killers of the U.S. government, and Tshombe hired by the U.S. to rule the Congo.

Dick Gregory was introduced by Malcolm X as "one of the forw" most freedom fighters in this country." His pointed humor kept the audience roaring with laughter for over half an hour.

Gregory directed most of his fire at the FBI and J. Edgar Hoover, He explained his attitude toward the FBI with the following anecdote:

"I remember one time (in Mississippi) we were trapped in an alley with the Ku Klux Klan on one side and the FBI on the other, and we flipped a coin to decide which way to go."

Gregory remarked that he heard the FBI is infiltrating the Ku Klux Klan. "They're paying the Ku Klux Klan back," he explained, "because they infiltrated the FBI a long time ago." He also described how the FBI tapped his phone and followed him wherever he went.

Martin Luther King caught one of Gregory's barbs. Gregory described a photograph of the Birmingham demonstrations, which had been shown all over the world. In it, a Negro with a coke bottle in his hand was opposite a cop with a basooka — "and Martin Luther King standing in the middle saying 'cool it baby, we're winning."

In reading the message from Che Guevara to the Harlem audience, Malcolm X called Guevara "a good friend of mine." Guevara expressed his regrets that circumstances prevented him from being present. He ended his message of solidarity with: "United we will win." The audience applauded with great warmth.

Malcolm X was very pleased with the audience's reaction and said he was happy to see they didn't let the commercial pross make up their minds about who were their friends and who were their enemies.

"You don't see any anti-Castro Cubans around here," he continued, "We eat them up!"

Babu of Zansibar, was introduced by Malcolm X as a proven revolutionary and a man he was honored to call his friend, Babu praised Malcolm X as the only American leader who had taken the trouble to travel all over Africa and explain the troubles of the American people. "The struggle of the people suffering in Affrica and those suffering here is one and the same," he said. Malcolm X had spread the message throughout Africa that we must all unite, Babu reported. "This is a world problem — the oppressed against the oppressor... we must unite all of the people we can."

White Atrocities

Speaking of the Congo, he declared the atrocities there had not been committed by the Congolese, but by the Belgians and white mercenaries.

He went on to speak of the great strength of the Americans of African descent in the United States and all over Latin America. "We follow all your battles here in the United States... Your success will mean our success in Africa," he explained.

Babu predicted that "what has happened so far is only a ripple, but there is a coming tide" in the Congo, "You have to be prepared for it," he said referring to the propaganda against the Congolese fighting for their freedom.

Another rally of the OAAU will be held Sunday, Dec. 20, 8 p.m., at the Audubon Hall at 166 St. and Broadway. The discussion of the events in the Congo will continue, and the OAAU will spell out its program on how to best utilize political action.

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
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

Press Coverage and Reaction

The nominally independent but Government-owned Daily Graphic published a number of Malcolm's more extreme and incendiary statements while the Government-controlled Granaian Times treated the visit in a more moderate and subdued ranner. The official CFP newspaper, the Evening News, mentioned the visit only once and gave absolutely no account of Malcolm's speeches and public appearances. The lack of coverage by the Evening Move and the low-keyed treatment by the Ghanaian Times may be attributed to the fact that President Exrument was made aware of the controversial nature of Malcolm X before the visit.

After Milcolm's departure, an article by H. M. PASMER, the communistoriented Granden Times columnist, disputed Malcolm's theories on the causes
of racial injustics and put forth a typical Marxist explanation for raciss
(Enclosure 1). He stated that Malcolm had ignored the "economic retivation
and class function of all racial oppression." Fasner argued that Marx and
John Brown could not be regarded as human liberators, if Malcolm's theories
were accepted. As further justification for his thesis, Basner cited the
case of segregation in Alabama, which he claimed was initiated and supported
by the United States Steel Corporation in order to "split the working class,
fight trade unionism, and insure cheap labor." Basner did express admiration
for the passion which Malcolm X displayed. However, he concluded that a
willingness to die for freedom is essential but "useless without an understanding that freedom is indivisible—for all individuals or for none; for
all races or for none."

Resner's article elicted strong reaction from Julian MAYFIFLD and Shirley GRAHAN in the next issue of the Chancian Times (Enclosure 2). Mayfield said that Malcolm X did not deny the necessity of a socialist revolution to change the nature of American society and eliminate discrimination.

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However, Mayfield maintained that "no single factor so retarded the /civil rights/structle as the attempt to units with liberal whites." He criticized the Communist Party because it supported "moderate Afro-American leadership against the most militant and effective elements in the black community." Mayfield gave the AFI-CIO as an example of a supposedly liberal organization that remains extremely segregated. He said that black men do not suffer because they are workers but because they are black. Throughout his article, Mayfield exhibited his great distrust for all white men, whether socialist or capitalist. Entrey Graham, wife of the late W. E. B. Dubois, generally supported Mayfield's thesis, emphasizing the overriding importance of white oppression as a cause of racial injustice.

COMMENT:

Although the Chansians received Malcolm I sympathetically because of their natural interest in the problems of racial discrimination in America, their reaction to his ideas seemed somewhat reserved and sceptical. Malcolm I is a dynamic specier with an effective evangelisticatyle that enables him to excite his audience without regard to the content of his speeches. His lecture at the university was interrupted by repeated applicuse even though many students later expressed scepticism at some of his theories. Malcolm's characterization of the Christian religion as one of the chief instruments of Magro coppression seemed to displease a number of Christian Ghanaians, while the potential advantage of his claim to a Muslim religious tie was probably lessened by his failure to call on the leaders of the local Islands community.

The fact that Falcolm was not accorded an official welcome did not hinder his personal effectiveness, although the absence of an official endorsement may have narrowed his impact on the reading public. He had no difficulty in obtaining a number of speaking engagements, including an opportunity to address a large number of Hembers of Farliament informally.

Thile the net effect of Milcolm's visit was probably demaging to American interests, his views were hardly new or shocking to the Charmians who heard him. Similar enelyses of the American racial problem have appeared frequently, though less elegiently, in the Charmian press. Hany Charmians tend to discount such views as too extremist. All in all, Malcolm X created less of a stir than the Embassy had feared.

The disagreement between Pasner and Mayfield probably served to create additional doubts about the validity of Malcolm's views. In addition, it highlighted an important difference between the two writers. Pasner emphasizes the dominance of Marxisa over racial problems, while Mayfield—though still a Marxist—is most concerned with racial problems, and belongs to the school of those who have abandoned hope for any non-violent solution. Both men overlooked the point that Malcolm X showed no interest in socialism—and that the Black Maslims generally affect to the ideas of a free-enterprise, capitalist society.





Characterizations of the Organization of Afro-American Unity (OAAU), Muslim Mosque, Encorporated (MMI), Nation of Islam (NOI) and NOI Mosque #7, New York City are attached hereto and all sources therein have furnished reliable information in the past.

On December 14, 1964, two confidential sources who have furnished reliable information in the past, furnished the following information:

The OAAU sponsored a public meeting on December 13, 1964, from 8:45 p.m. to 11:00 p.m., at the Audubon Ballroom, Broadway and 166th Street, New York City. Attendance at the meeting was estimated at 500.

The featured speaker was OAAU Chairman and MMI leader Malcolm X. He devoted most of his speech to the Congo situation claiming that the United States is responsible for the situation there because of its support for Congo Premier Moise Tshombe. Malcolm X charged that it was the United States who was hiring white mercenary soldiers for Tshombe and these white mercenaries, described by Malcolm X as "hired killers", are the ones who are killing innocent Africans.

Malcolm X also spoke on Mississippi and indicated that the struggle for independence by Africans was synonymous with the struggle for freedom by Afro-Americans in the United States. Malcolm X also stated that the Federal Bureau of Investigation cannot stop the murders in Mississippi so "they" would have to take care of it. He did not elaborate further

After his speech Malcolm X introduced Negro comedian Dick Gregory who joked about 40 minutes chiefly concerning law enforcement and the racial situation in the South.

Malcolm X then introduced Babu (Abdul Rahmon Mohamed), a Minister in the office of the President of Tanzania. Babu spoke briefly on Africa and claimed that all black people were united in opposition to Tshombe in the Congo.

Malcolm X then introduced Shaykh Ahmed Hassoun of Sudan who spoke briefly on the Islamic religion.

Malcolm X then read a note of greetings sent to him by Cuban Minister of Industry Ernesto (Che) Guevara who indicated in the note that he was unable to attend the OAAU meeting. Guevara ended his note with the phrase "United we will win," which, when read by Malcolm X, received a big cheer from the audience. Guevara was in New York City to attend the United Nations General Assembly and had apparently been invited to this OAAU meeting by Malcolm X.

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
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

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
Malcolm X, former Black Muslim and now chairman of the "Organization of Afro-American unity," last night told an audience of 900 that the press, which is "white and dangerous," is making "the image of the black man as an ogre, a savage."

He spoke at the Audubon Ballroom, 166th St. and Broadway. He said the press by the "image" it presents "makes the killing of black women and children by white mercenaries in the Congo look all right." The press, he said, "makes the white mercenaries look all right" and portrays "the black Congo beople as cannibals."

"As long as blacks were being slaughtered," he said, "there was no outery. But when a few whites were held as hostages, there was an outery. And the hostages weren't killed by our brothers in Stanleyville until after the mercenaries landed."

Malcold X, the Black Nationelist leader, reverted to his hard-line approach yesterday, asserting that Negrous should be prepared "to use any means necessary" to secure civil rights.

II am in no way squeamist when it comes to making people who kill Negroes learn that killing is a two-way stiet, "said Malcolm, who broke with the Black Muslim movement and organized his own Black Nationalist group.

He predicted that before long every civil rights leader will abandon the doctrine of non-violence, epitomized by Dr. Martin Luther King jr. the 1964 Nobel Peace Prize winner.

he asked. `-

Malcolm made his comments in a talk to 300 persages at a seminar sponsored by Associated Community Trains, part of HARYOU-AiT the Harlem anti-poverty program. The seminar was one of a series for young man and women training for the Harlem Domestic Peace Cipps, a project undertaken by ACT under the Congresional act of 1963 creating what is officially called the National Service Corps. The seminar was held at ACT headquarters, 178 W: 1979.

Malcolm was on a tour of Africa and the Middle East, he was quoted in a letter as embracing the doctrine of the Brotherhood of man.

Some months before that he had been reported advocating the formation of rifle clubs by Negroes to defend hemselves. Last week, he hid reporters the FBI was too low in arresting 21. Mississippians accused of being in the murders of three civil rights workers.

Malcolm told those attend

ing the seminar that the trouble with many civil rights groups is that they seem to be "fighting a friend," and added: "No one who deprives the Negro of his rights is a friend."

The speaker said the Black Nationalists would work with other civil rights groups to obtain better housing and quality education for Nescota He said also that his irganization will try to bring the nation's civil rights problems before the United Nationa. The African nations are "deeply interested" in the rights movement here, he added.

Beaking of the African revolution, he said that "what is happening on the African continent is inseparable from what's happening, to us on this continent," and urged that American Negroes try to strengthen the bonds between themselves and the African constions.


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American Negro Leader Hails China's Ruclear Test

(NCNA-English, Accra, November 5, 1964)

Malcolm X, the American Negro leader now on a visit here, today hailed Chinn's successful explosion of its first atom bomb as "the greatest thing that. has ever happened in the 20th century to the black people.

In an interview with NCNA here he said that China's nuclear test helped not only the cause of the Afro-Americans but also that of all people of the world fighting ngainst the imperialists. 

He praised the Chinese government's proposal for a world summit conference to discuss the complete prohibition and thorough destruction of nuclear weapons. It was indeed "a very good suggestion," he said.

Referring to the present struggle of the American Negroes and the firm support given to this struggle by the Chinese people, he said that the U.S. imperialists would never loosen their grip on the 22 million colonized American Negroes before the peoples of Asia and Africa cast off the yoke of imperialism and became strong. "Bearing this in mind, we therefore appreciate the great strides that the Chinese people have made toward true independence and the unlimited contribution they are making to help the opprensed peoples in other parts of the world to throw off the chains of imperialism."

He termed the recent U.S. presidential elections as a "farce," which, he said, hardly had any significance to the American Negroes. "Both candidates do not seek the interests of the Afro-Americans," he declared.

There was no difference between Johnson and Goldwater, he continued, for both served the interests of U.S. monopoly capital. "The only difference between them is that while the one uses the method of a wolf, the other employs the approach of a But both of them are trying to eat us up," he added.

Johnson tried to represent himself as "peace-loving." But he was the very man who had ordered direct intervention in Leopoldville Congo, massacred the South Victnumeco people and committed atrocities in other parts of the world, he noted.

Commenting on the so-called "Civil Rights Bill" of which Johnson has made a great show, the American Negro leader said, "It is nothing but a farce designed to fool the Africans, to give them the false impression that the U.S. is different from South Africa and that the problems (of racial discrimination) in the U.S. are being solved." He drew attention to the fact that many Negroes in the United States were killed when the bill was adopted.



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



Controversial Muslim leader Malcolm X (Brother Malcolm) returning to the states last Tuesday after an absence of nearly five months, took a page out of Barry Goldwater's book when he declared: "Extremism in defense of freedom is no vice. Moderation in the pursuit of justice is no virtue."

THE "WELCOME" MAT was out last Tuesday evening for controversial Muslim leader Melcom X (Brother Melcom), as he arrived at New York's Kennedy Airport following an extensive tour of Asia and Africa, Melcolm was met by his wife, Betty (left); three children, and an enthusiastic group of placard carrying supporters. Returning from an 18-week visit to Asia and Africa, during which time he met with seven black heads of state, Malcolm was greeted at Kennedy Airport Tuesday evening, by his wife, Betty, their three children and by a number of followers and members of the Muslim Mosque, Inc., and the Organization of African Unity, which he heads.



Characterizations of the Muslim Mosque, Incorporated (MMI), Nation of Islam (NOI) and NOI Mosque #7, New York City, are attached hereto and all rources therein have furnished reliable information in the past.

During May, 1964, NY T-1 advised that Shaykh Muhammad Surur al-Sabban, former finance minister and now the President of the Muslim World League (MWL), Saudi Arabia, had expressed great concern about "Black Muslims" (NOI) in the United States. The MWL wanted to send a representative to the United States to investigate the controversial movement since the MWL is interested in helping Muslims everywhere and has the finances to do so. However, the MWL wants the recipients of their aid to be genuine Muslims and "not merchants of religion or distorters of the teachings of Islam."

According to NY T-1, the MWL chose Shaykh Ahmad Hassoun for this investigative mission to the United States and he was expected to go sometime in July, 1964. Hassoun is a Sudanese described by Sabban as "a man of culture who speaks English like a native". Hassoun's mission is to determine if the "Black Muslims" are true believers and if so, whether they deserve support from the Islamic world.

On December 4, 1964, NY T-2 advised that at an MMI meeting on December 2, 1964, held at 2395 8th Avenue, New York City, it was announced that a man from the Sudan referred to only as "Shaykh", was currently living with MMI leader Malcolm X. The "Shaykh" speaks English very well and plans to hold Islamic meetings in the New York City area. He will

also teach Arabic to MMI members and hold Islamic prayer services every Friday afternoon. The "Shaykh" cannot attend the regular evening meetings of the MMI inasmuch as he has to go to bed every evening at 7:00 p.m. since he must awaken at 4:00 a.m. to say his prayers.

On December 4, 1964, NY T-3 advised that Shaykh Ahmad Hassoun, an Orthodox Muslim, is currently living with Malcolm X at the latter's residence, 23-11 97th Street, East Elmhurst, Queens, New York.

NY T-3 further advised that on December 1, 1964, MMI secretary James 67X Warden notified Muhammad Surur al-Sabban of the MWL in Saudi Arabia, that the MMI would be unable to handle the expenses of Shaykh Ahmad Hassoun in the United States for at least six months. Warden signed the name of "Malcolm X" to this notification.

All sources mentioned in this memorandum have furnished reliable information in the past.

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



Characterisation of the Organisation of Afro-American Unity (OAAU), Muslim Mosque, Incorporated (MMI), Nation of Islam (NOI) and NOI Mosque Number 7, New York City, are attached hereto and all sources therein have furnished reliable information in the past.

On November 30, 1964, NY T-1 advised that the OAAU held a public reception for OAAU and MII leader Malcolm X, from 8:30 p.m. to 10:15 p.m., November 29, 1964, in the Audubon Ballroom, Broadway and 166th Street, New York City. Approximately 600 to 700 persons attended the reception.

NY T-1 advised that Malcolm X was the featured speaker and he spoke for about 45 minutes. He talked generally of his recently completed four-month tour of Africa and his contacts with various African leaders. He also stated that while in Africa he met with some of the "rebels" who subsequently fought in the Congo against the white mercenaries of Congo Premier Moise Tahombe. He referred to these "rebels" as "liberation. fighters",

NY T-1 stated that Malcolm X spoke at length on the current fighting in the Congo and severely criticised the United States and President Lyndon B. Johnson for siding Tshombe.

According to MY T-1, Malcolm X further stated that he has come home to the United States to "fight for his people". Malcolm X also stated that his religion was Islam and that he was a Muslin since Islam is a religion that believes in an "eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth.

### Jesse Gray

NY T-2 advised on November 28, 1960, that Jesse Gray is a former organizer of the Harlem Region of the Communist Party, United States of America, (CP, USA).

"The New York Times" of December 31, 1963, page 30, contained an article on Gray wherein he is described as the leader of the Marlem rent strikes and the head of the Community Council for Housing, 6 East 117th Street, New York City. The article states that after the 1963 rent strikes appeared to be gaining ground, annonymous postcards were sent to newspapers charging that Gray was a Communist. When asked about this, Gray "denied he was a Communist. He said he had been questioned by the House UN-American Activities Committee because he had supported the right of Benjamin J. Davis, state chairman of the CP, to run for State genator in 1958. He denied CP affiliation under path but took the Fifth Amendment, when the Committee asked him to give the names of Communists known to him.

On January 24, 1964, MY T-2 advised that according to William Patterson, Chairman of the New York State CP, Gray is no longer a CP member, but he is friendly to the CP.
