The former press secretary of Heavyweight Champion Muhammad Ali (Cassius Clay) told the Amsterdam News Tuesday that Malcolm X has been marked for death by his former Muslim associates.



REMARKS OF MALCOLM X ON LES CRANE SHOW ON WABC-TV, CHANNEL 7, 12/28/64

LES CRANE:

My next guest is Mr. Malcolm X, ladies and gentlemen.

LES CRANE:

Fine. This interview is going to be a little difficult for me to do because I know Malcolm. We have done shows together before. He has been a guest of mine on a couple of different occasions. We have had telephone conversations of length and of interest. And there is, so to get the story, I am going to make believe we have never met. O.K.?

MALCOLM X:

This is probably the best way.

LES CRANE:

O.K. Let's just, let's just start from the beginning. First of all, what is the

Black Muslim Movement?

MALCOLM X:

Well, as you know, I am not in the Black

Muslim Movement.

The Control of the Co

LES CRANE:

I know. I know that.

MALCOLM X:

The Black Muslim Movement is an organization in this country that is headed by Elijah Muhammed. LES CRANE:

That's all?

MALCOIM X:

It is an organization that is headed by Elijah Muhammed. It says it is a religious organization and that it's religion is Islam, but the people in the world of Islam don't accept it as an orthodox Islamic or a religious organization.

LES CRANE:

In other words, they claim to be a branch, an American branch, of the Mohammedan religion.

MALCOLM X:

No. Not the Mohammed. The real Muslim never refers to his religion as the Mohammedan religion. His religion is Islam.

LES CRANE:

Mohammed being a prophet of that

MALCOLM X:

Yes, Mohammed is one of the prophets

of that religion.

LES CRANE:

Right.

religion?

MALCOLM X:

The people who believe in that religion believe in all the prophets -- Moses, Abraham, Jesus, all of them. Like they believe in Mohammed Abdulah as the last of the prophets, and Elijah Muhammed in this country says that he is also teaching that religion, but that religion is a religion of brotherhood. It advocates the brotherhood of man. All men.

LES CRANE:

That's the Muslim religion?

MALCOLM X:

Yes. This is the, well, those who practice the religion of Islam call themselves Muslims.

LES CRANE:

Right.

MALCOLM X:

In this country they are referred to as

Moslems.

LES CRANE:

Now, you consider yourself to be a

Moslem in this country?

MALCOLM X:

Known as a Moslem?

LES CRANE:

Yes.

MALCOLM X:

I believe in the religion of Islam.

Elijah Muhammed that caused me to greatly question his ability as a man, much less as a religious leader, and based upon that doubt I went in search of an understanding of the religion of Islam. I made the hadj or the pilgrimage to Mecca. While I was at -- one of the things that Elijah Muhammed always taught us was that Islam is a religion of god. It was a religion in which no whites could participate, and he used to prove his point. he told us that Mecca was a forbidden city -- a city that was forbidden to non-Muslims, and since the white person cannot be a Muslim, in his teaching he said that no whites could enter Mecca. Well, I went to Mecca in May, rather in April, and everyone was there. In fact, one member of the Turkish Parliament, who had brought bus loads, several hundred bus loads from Turkey to make the pilgrimage, was standing with me on the steps of the hotel in (Minah or Menna), which is a short

distance from Mecca, and he pointed at that time that Mecca, during the hadj season or the pilgrimage season, would be an anthropoligist's paradise because every specimen of humanity is represented there. It is an absolute brotherhood. So that when I saw this with my own eyes and saw that people of all colors could practice brotherhood, it was at that point that I wrote back and pointed out that I believed in Islam as a religion of brotherhood. But this belief in brotherhood does not alter the fact that I am also an Afro-American or American Negro, as you wish, in a society which has very serious and severe race problems which no religion can blind me to.

LES CRANE:

the state of the s

Well, what's interesting to me, there were words that you never used to use in the past in our discussions. You never used to use the word "negro". That word offended you. You used to say "the so-called Negro".

LES CRANE:

I know that the word "integration" offends you. You do not believe in the use of that word. You prefer to think of it as brotherhood, which is, for the purposes of our discussion, going to be the same thing. But in the old days, you did not

MALCOLM X:

believe in brotherhood. You believed in pure, strict separation, didn't you? Whenever I opened my mouth, I always said that the Honorable Elijah Muhammed teaches us thus and so, and I spoke for him. I represented him. I represented an organization and organizational thinking. Many of my own views that I had from personal experience I kept to myself. I was faithful to that organization and to that man. Since things came about that made me doubt his integrity, I think for myself. I listen as much as I can to everyone and try to come up with a capsule opinion, a capsulized opinion. I believe that it is possible for brotherhood to be brought about among all people, but I do not delude myself into dreaming or falling for a dream that this exists before it exists. Some of the American, some of

the leaders of our people in this country always say that they, you know, they believe in this dream. But while they are dreaming, our people are having a nightmare, and I don't think that you can make a dream come true by pretending that that dream exists when it does not.

LES CRANE:

ि

You have been a critic of some of the Negro leadership in this country - Martin Luther King, Roy Wilkins, Abernathy and others. Have you changed in your feelings toward them of late?

MALCOLM X:

I think all of us should be critics of each other. Whenever you can't stand criticism, you can never grow. I don't think that it serves any purpose for the leaders of our people to waste their time fighting each other needlessly.

I think that we accomplish more when we sit down in private and iron out whatever

LES CRANE:

MALCOLM X:

differences that may exist and try and then do something constructive for the benefit of our people, but on the other hand, I don't think that we should be above citicism. I don't think that anyone should be above criticism. Violence or the threat of violence has always been surrounded, has always surrounded you. Speeches that you have made have been interpreted as being threats. You have made statements reported to the press about the Negroes should go out and arm themselves and form militias of their own. I read a thing once -- a statement that I believe you made. That every Negro should belong to the National Rifle Association. No. I said this. That in areas of this country where the government has proven either its inability or its unwillingness to protect the lives and property of our

And in situations like Mississippi, places like Mississippi where the government actually has proven its inability to protect us and it has been proven that ofttimes the police officers and sheriffs themselves are involved in the murder that takes place against our people, and I feel and I would say that anywhere that our people should start doing what is necessary to protect ourselves. This does not mean that we should fire rifles and go out and initiate attacks indiscriminately against whites. But it does mean that we should get whatever is necessary to protect ourselves in a country or in an area where the governmental ability to protect us has broken down.

LES CRANE:

Therefore, you do not agree with Dr.

King's Ghandian philosophy?

MALCOLM X:

My belief in brotherhood would never restrain me in any way from protecting myself in a society from a people whose disrespect for brotherhood makes them feel inclined to put my neck on a tree

at the end of a rope.

LES CRANE:

Well, it sounds as though you could be

preaching sort of an anarchy.

MALCOLM X:

No, no. I respect government and respect law, but does the government and the law respect us? If the FBI, which is what the people depend upon on a national scale to protect the morale and the property and the lives of people, can't do so when the property and lives of Negroes and whites who try to help Negroes are concerned, then I think that it is only fair to expect elements to do whatever is necessary to protect themselves.

and this is no departure from normal procedure because right here in New York City you have vigilante committees that have been set up by groups who see that their neighborhood and community is endangered and the law cannot do anything about it. So, and even their lives are at stake. So, but the fearless seems to come only into existence when someone says Negroes should form vigilante committees and protect their lives and their property. I am not advocating the breaking of any law, but I say that our people will never be respected as human beings until we react as other normal, intelligent human beings do. And this country came into existence by people who were tired of tyranny and oppression and exploitation and the brutality that was being inflicted upon

them by powers higher than them. And I think that it is only fair to expect us sooner or later to do likewise.

Yea. One last question. You do not preach separatism anymore, and I, I assume that you do not want to set up a Black African State in this country anymore. What is your main effort toward now?

Well, one of the organizations which
we have now formed - the Organization
of Afro-American Unity - has reached
the conclusion, after a careful analysis
of the problem, that approaching our
problem just on the level of civil
rights and keeping it within the jurisdiction of the United States will not
bring a solution. It is not a Negro
problem or an American problem any longer.
It is a world problem. It is a human
problem. And so, we are striving to
lift it from the level of civil rights
to the level of human rights, and at

that level, it is international.

We can bring it into the United Nations and discuss it in the same tone and in the same language as the problems of people in other parts of the world also is discussed.



Characterizations of the Organization of Afro-American Unity (OAAU), Muslim Mosuge, Incorporated (MMI) and the Nation of Islam (HOI) are attached hereto and all sources therein have furnished reliable information in the past.

On January 11, 1905, a confidential source who has furnished reliable information in the past advised as follows:

On January 10, 1955, the OAAU held a public relly at the Audubon Ballroom, Broadway and 166th Street, New York City, from 8:25 p.m. to 11:00 p.m. Approximately 250 persons were in attendance.

The rally was opened and conducted by CAAU and 1941 leader Malcolm X Little. The entire program consisted of the showing of movies taken by Malcolm X during his four month tour of Africa in 1964. Two files were shown, one strictly on the United Arab Republic (UAT.) and the second on several other African countries, chiefly Ethiopia. During the movies Malcolm X made explanatory comments with particular emphasis on the military might of the UAR whenever the film displayed UAR soldiers or military equipment. For example, a shot of a UAR soldier holding a rifle on his shoulder prompted Malcolm X to state that he (the soldier) had freedom on his shoulder. Halcolm X also remarked that the UAR was training and supplying "revolutionaries" to fight against the Congo regime of Moise Tshombe.

Following the movies, Malcolm X answered a few questions on the CAAU. He stated that the CAAU continues to hold a "Liberation School" each Saturday morning in Suite 126, Hotel Theresa, New York City, where Negro history and culture are taught. He also announced that the OAAU would hald a class on child care each Thursday evening at 7:30 p.m., in Suite 128 of

the Hotel Theresa, starting on January 14, 1965.





Referenced communications deal with the possible merger of the Muslim Mosque, Inc. (MMI), Afro-Descendant Upliftment Society (ADUS) and Muslim Brotherhood, USA (MBUSA) into the International Muslim Brotherhood (IMB), and the possible interview with the three leaders of these groups, namely MALCOLM X. LITTLE, WALLACE MUHAMMAD and TALIB AHMAD DAWUD.

The NYO agrees with Chicago in referenced airtel of 12/31/64, that Chicago should continue to contact WALLACE MUHAMMAD and HASSAN SHARRIEFF concerning this matter, particularly in view of the excellent rapport that has been established with these individuals.

The NYO also agrees with Chicago's comment in the same airtel that TALIB AHMAD DAWUD should not be interviewed at this time. In previous contacts with DAWUD by agents of the NYO, he has left the impression of being an opportunist with a grudge against ELIJAH MUHAMMAD and one who evidenced emotional instability. Also, the latest interview of WALLACE indicated no association with DAWUD.

In regard to an interview with MALCOLM X, the NYO continues to feel, as previously set out in New York airtels to the Bureau on 10/15/64 and 12/16/64, that a period of 60 to 90 days from the date of his return from Africa should be allowed to pass before an attempt is made to interview him. Since MALCOLM X returned from Africa on 11/24/64, the NYO contemplates requesting Bureau authority to interview him sometime after mid-February, 1965. This lapse of time will afford MALCOLM X the opportunity to put in effect his new alleged philosophical change if he in fact intends to do so while at the same time it will permit the Bureau to better assess him and his activities; thus enhancing the chances of a productive interview.

The NYO does not feel that this plan should be altered, even though the possibility of a merger between the MMI and ADUS exists, for the following reasons:

- 1. Although MALCOLM X was not antagonistic during a previous interview in 1964, he could not be classified as cooperative since he would furnish no information of merit.
- Current statements and remarks by MALCOLM X reflect no real change from the "anti-white" line he has expressed for years.
- 3. The merger of the MMI and ADUS appears to be currently in a "talking stage" with no real organization details or set up agreed on to date. It is interesting to note that when interviewed WALLACE stated he felt he could dominate and steady MALCOLM X (re CE airtel and LHM, 12/22/64) while MALCOLM X's assistant, JAMES 67X WARDEN in New York City, states that the new Islamic group will be headed by MALCOLM X with headquarters in NYC (re NY airtel and LHM, 12/24/64).
- 4. Chicago already has an established good relationship with WALLACE who is cooperating and appears willing to furnish information on the progress of any such merger.

Consequently, UACB, the NYO will not consider an interview with MALCOLM X at this time but will submit a request for authority to interview him after mid-February, 1965.

It was almost impossible to believe that Malcolm X was the only man in the Assembly Chamber yesterday afternoon who had ever come out firmly for anarchy. Everyone else seemed to be practicing it.

Malcolm X made the trip to Albany to watch his friend, Percy Sutton, installed as a freshman Assemblyman. Malcolm sat in the gallery and, for the first time in his life, saw the New York State Legislature in session. He survived, but the ordeal would be worse for the average citizen. Malcolm X prepared for the experience by observing the governments of emerging African nations. Without such preparation, a trip to Albany can be terribly unsettling.


At least the Africans know who their rulers are. The legislators here don't. When the first session of 1965 began at 12:15 p. m. yesterday, only 15 minutes behind schedule, the Democratic legislators had not yet picked a majority leader for the Senate or a speaker for the Assembly. They were still thinking about it. Their caution was perfectly understandable. After all, they have had only 30 years—since they last controlled both houses of the Legislature—to think about whom their leaders would be.

In the absence of a speaker, Ansley B. Borkowski, the Assembly clerk, called the session to order. He was the perfect choice. He is an ex-Republican Assemblyman, so he understands the responsibility of his position. He mumbled something about it behooving him to call the meeting to order, and one of the Assemblymen in the sudience leaned forward in his leather chair and yelled, "Can't hear you, Ansley."

"You're not supposed to," said Borkowski, cheerfully.
This set the dignified mood for most of the session.

#### PRIME QUALIFICATION

A prime qualification for membership in the Assembly seems to be the possession of a bad sense of humor. When the clerk announced the arrival in the Assembly of Lt. Gov. Malcolm Wilson, who presides over the Senate, Brooklyn Assemblyman Max Turshen shouted, loud and clear, "Never heard of him."

Turshen has sat in the Assembly every year since 1937, longer than anyone else, which helps explain his quick wit. He wasn't that funny when he first came to Albany, but the atmosphere grows on you.

Led by the Lieutenant Governor, the members of the Senate began filing into the Assembly Chamber to hear Gov. Rockefeller's state of the state address. As the Senators came in, Brooklyn Assemblyman Bertram Podell reinforced Brooklyn's reputation as the spawning ground of comics. He stage-whispered, "Watch your pocketbooks, fellows, they're coming in."

Assemblyman Podell is a close associate of Stanley Steingut, another Brooklyn Assemblyman, and Steingut is probably going to become Speaker of the Assembly, if there ever is a new Speaker of the Assembly. Podell sat light next to Steingut yesterday, but he thought of the gag all by himself.

#### DIGNIFIED SENATORS

Then the Governor got up and delivered his speech. Every member of the Legislature already had a copy of the speech, and you could tell the Governor knew it by the great amount of feeling he put into his words. The Senators, as guests of the Assemblymen, sat up front. They are the more dignified of the two houses; during the speech, they chatted only in groups of two. A few Democratic Senators practiced facial contortions to indicate their appreciation of the Governor's remarks. Rockefeller deserves a lot of credit for reading through to the end. He doesn't have to do this for a living.

When the Governor finished, the Assembly and the Senate recessed for the afternoon. The Democrats wanted to do some more thinking about potential leaders. Some one suggested they settle the whole problem by making Robert Wagner Senate Majority Leader and Robert Kennedy Speaker of the Assembly, but he was probably being facetious. Wagner and Kennedy weren't even in Albany yesterday, so obviously they do not care who gets the job.

The Democratic legislators have been doing their deliberating behind closed doors. The Legislative reporters have been doing their reporting on the other side of the doors. This is called journalistic endeavor, it is also called eavesdropping. The reporters hear phrases like, "Why, that's blackmail . ." and "You're stubborn ..." This is called the democratic process.

Despite the hazards, every citizen of the State of New York should, at some time in his life, take a trip to Albany and watch the Legislature in session. It is a necessary educational experience, like reading the life of Attila

During the showing of the movies Malcolm X commented that these movies were edited by MMI and CAMU member Earl Grant.

Following the movies, Malcolm X spoke briefly on Africa and denied that he was responsible for the present feelings of African United Nations (UN) diplomats against racism in America. He also commented that James Farmer, head of the Congress of Racial Equality, would learn a lot on his announced future visit to Africa.

Malcolm X also commented that the OAAU is reforming in order to function more effectively and they plan to form a pool of technically qualified Negroes who will go to Africa to work.

Malcolm X the introduced a UN delegate from Kenya, Okello Odongo, who spoke briefly on the history and independence of Kenya and endorsed the OAAU plan to form a pool of technicians since they are badly needed in Africa.

# MOSLEMS IN CITY BEGIN HOLY MONTH

Ramadan, Observed by Fast in Daytime, Starts at Mosque in Brooklyn

.

By PAUL L. MONTGOMERY

When it became impossible to distinguish a white thread from a black thread by the light of the waning sun yesterday, the holy month of Ramadan began for the Moslems of the city.

In the dimly lit mosque of the Islamic Mission on State Street, Brooklyn, Sheik Al-Hajh Dhoud Ahmed Faisal intoned the praise of Allah, proper to the start of the penitential sea-

For the next 28 days according to the lunar calendar, devout Moslems are obliged to abstain from eating, drinking and physical pleasures during the daylight hours. The fast is one of the five basic tenets of Islam. The others are the pilgrimage to Mecca, recitation of prayers, giving of alms and profession of faith.

In Moslem countries the month is exemplified by a slower pace of life and by strained tempers—except at night, when the prescriptions of Ramaya. Beeches at U.N. Shorter

At the Unite Nations, observers have noted that during Ramadan the tempo of work in Moslem delegations is slower and the speeches by Moslem delegates shorter. But, an attaché said yesterday, "if one abstains in the true sense, one should abstain from loss of stamina as well."

He added that many delegates, Moslem and non-Moslem alike, were disturbed by the threatened with-Irawal of Indonesia from the world body. "We are supposed to abstain from wicked thoughts during Ramadan too," he said, "but at this year's session it will be hard."

In addition to the services at the Islamic Mission, others were held last night at the Islamic Foundation of New York, 1 Riverside Drive; the International Muslim Brotherhood, 303 West 125th Street, and at a mosque at 104 Powers Street in Brookligh.

Malcolm X Holds Rally

The Powers Street mosque is something of an anomaly, since it is on the fringe of the Orthodox Jewish community in Williamsburg. Its atherents are primarily Eastern European Moslems who carns over in the same wave of immigration as the Jews.

Malcolm X, The Hlack Nationalist leader who is a recent convert to orthodox Islam, held a rally of his organization of Afro-American Unity last night to show movies of his recent visits to Islamic and African

leaders.

The Black Muslims, with whom Malcolm spit last year, also observe a kind of Ramadan but it is based on the Western calendar and takes places during the month of December.

The information available from the set 67 forth in letterhead memorandum was made available on 12/28429/64. The information indicated AKBAR was interviewed by a Major MOBINSON of the "Courier" upon his return to New York from Egypt and prior to his going to Chicago, Illinois, to see his father. This was in early November, 1964. Chicago reviewed the 12/26/64 and the 1/2/65 issues of the "Chicago Courier" and no article relating to AKBAR by a Major ROBINSON was noted in either issue. Chicago presumes this article must have appeared in the "New York Courier".

In this connection advised that MARK 61D CRAWFORD, apparently a representative of some type for "Life" magazine, made available the information regarding AKBAR to DICK DURNAM, the editor of "Muhammad Speaks" newspaper and DURNAM passed the same on to ELIJAH MUHAMMAD on 12/28/64. It would appear that the article would have been in a "New York Courier" issue which came out on or shortly before 12/28/64.


A confidential informant in late December, 1964, advised as follows:

Akbar Mohammed has stated, and already has, he is going to publish his opposition to Elijah Muhammad in a paper in Egypt and plans to attend a meeting of Moslem leaders scheduled to be held in early 1965 in Somaliland (the Republic of Somalia) to take up the matter with them.

Akbar also was interviewed by a newspaper in the United States on his return to this country prior to his coming to Chicago to see his father, Elijah Muhammad. During this interview Akbar made the following comments:

He had flown in from Egypt to have a showdown with his father as he differed with his father on most aspects of the Muslim philosophy. He had, after three years of study, opened his eyes to the true Muslim religion and it did not preach race of any kind but stressed the brotherhood of man no matter what his color. He regards his father's brand of "Muslim" as home made and one that is stifled by rules and regulations. He also disagrees with his father's claim that he is the Messenger of Allah. 
Malcolm Little and added he would never denounce Malcolm until his parents could show him that Malcolm was unworthy on the basis of Islamic theology. He has come to realize, since working on his Ph.D in Islamic Jurisprudence, that many of his father's teachings were wrong and he had made up his mind to split with his father as early as last August but he had wanted to come to Chicago first.

Elijah Muhammad was advised of the statements attributed to Akbar and stated he would not say any more about Akbar until he saw what Akbar had to say. He commented Akbar had already been classified as a hypocrite to his mission and to the God he "presches".

The "National Guardian", a weekly publication, New York City, dated December 26, 1964, page four, in an article, entitled, "Political Action Federation Outlines Steps At Conference", announced that preliminary steps were taken December 19 to establish a Negro power bloc in New York at the Federation for Independent Political Action's first conference on "The Black Revolution - A Struggle for Political Power."

"In a day-long discussion, leaders of New York's community-based Negro organizations approved a series of immediate moves to alleviate conditions in the ghettos and named an interim committee to formulate long-range goals and plans. The call to the conference stated its aim thus:

organized involvement of the man-in-the-street, the victims of ruthless slumlords, the unemployed and youth to change rotten conditions in the ghetto. Through struggle, political power can be built by the people for liberation from white-dominated political control and economic exploitation. With independent political power, the black revolution can bodly move forward in advancing the interests of the masses.

The conference was described as "all-black" even the press was asked to send Negro reporters and television crews, but none came, according to the article.

The article related that interim committee members named were: Isaiah Robinson, chairman of the Harlem Parents Committee and vice chairman of the Ad Hoc Committee to Support the Mississippi Freedom Democratic Party Challenge; Jesse Gray; Reverend Milton Galamison, school boycott leader and chairman of the Brooklyn Parents Workshop for Equality; Jim Haughton, director of the Harlem Unemployment Center; William Strickland, Northern Student Movement; Clarence Jones, attorney; John Henrik Clarke, an editor of Freedom: ays, and Malcom X.

Among specific actions supported is the scheduled February 3 shut-down of 31 junior high schools and 15 of the so-called "600" schools (for difficult pupils). The aims of the shut-down are (1) upgrading of 200 Negro and Puerto Rican teachers to supervisory and administrative positions; (2) establishment of a curriculum and screening of evaluation process for "600" schools; (3) the hiring of Negro custodians; (4) halting of school construction on present sites.





The federation also decided to support the drive for passage by the State Legislature of the "emergency repair bill" empowering the city to collect rents and make builting repairs five days after a complaint is filed. A delegation to Albany at the opening of the Legislature January 4 will demand passage of the bill.


Two themes were stressed by the speakers (1) Unity among all grassroots groups to form a political action movement; (2) house-by-house organization to fight for the needs and desires of the people.

In his keynote address, Jesse Gray stated that "a revolutionary movement is in the making." He said: "The lack of unified, organized black political power is one reason we are not yet a revolutionary movement. Another is that we require revolutionaries. Real revolutionaries are cut in the streets organizing people around their day-to-day problems."


The article further related that Victoria Gray, one of the three Freedom Democratic Party congresswomen from Mississippi, related the history of the attempt by the Mississippi Negroes to gain a voice in politics first through the regular Democratic Party - which almost totally bars Negro participation - and then through the formation of the FDP. Mrs. Gray asked conference delegates to support the party's challenge to the seating of the five "regular" Mississippi representatives in Congress next session.

The article noted that identification with Modern Africa and the American Negro's Cultural Heritage in Africa was apparent in the emblem of the Federation for Political Action (FIPA) - a stylized African lion.

## The Violent Ones

ROY WILKINS

Nothing in the civil rights situation engages the attention of white Americans more quickly than the suggestion that the long patient Negro is about to take up arms and wreak vengeance for past mistreatments.

The white public listens with only half an ear to the deadly statistics on Negro unemployment. It gives only part-time attention to the dilapidation, the rats, the filth, the robber rents and the crime of the slums. It yawns over demonstrably inferior schools is the Negro ghettoes.

But let someone, known or unknown, raise a cry about using guns in a shooting war with white folks and the white community is all ears.

Malcolm X, the split-off Black Muslim, has been garnering gobs of attention for himself by expounding the don't-turn-the-other-cheek philosophy. Not only don't turn it, advises Malcolm, but smack a cheek of your own—a white cheek.

Malcolm went to the Middle East some months ago where he confessed to the discovery that white people are people, too. Commentators hoped, rather wistfully, that white Americans hereafter might expect less cyanide and more of the milk of human kindness in his sermons. It was not to be. At year's end Malcolm made sure of their unease and their apprehension for 1965 by a Harlem speech calling for the formation of a Mau Mau Society

"If the language (of the oppressors) is a shotgun, get a shotgun," he said . . . "he who kills by the sword shall be killed by the sword." Pointing a finger at his audience of fewer than 500 he urged Negroes to "even the score" with whites.

Malcolm X is a persuasive debater and a rabble-rousing speaker in the Adam Clayton Powell class, which is to say, top grade. He also has grievances on his side—deep, callous, cruel grievances. The murderous Simon Legree policies of Mississippi and of areas in several other Deep South states are encouraged by the indifference of non-Southerners. The Malcolms, few though they be in number, have something going for them: the statistics, the history, the burnings, bombings, killings and perversions of justice in the courts.

But going against the Malcolms is the fact that they are probably too late. The forces under the banner of non-violence have at last aroused the nation. History has taken a turn in the years since World War II which has compelled the U. S. to act on its racial problem.

Even if the attendance figure was off by 200, this number out of 400,000 people in Harlem does not suggest overwhelming enthusiasm in that community for the Mau Mau approach. History reveals that Negro Americans, as a group, have never committed themselves to retaliatory violence as a policy.

If they did not reach for shotguns and rifles when lynchings were at a twice-a-week average and when segregation and discrimination were in humiliating flower, they are not about to immolate themselves now, when things are improving, especially when they consider the 3-to-1 numerical odds.

This is not to rule out violence here and there, nor to suggest that every one of the impatient and frustrated younger Negro generation will abide by historical trends. These are more bitterly aware of their imposed disabilities than they were before better education and better communication opened their eyes. Some may listen to the Malcolms, especially if mebs are egged on by police and if persecution goes unpurished.

But if the United States does not rest on plous declarations and on a law-on-the-books, but moves steadily to eliminate racial bias, the Man Man idea will sputter and dia.







in Mississippi.

The African move profoundly disturbed the American authorities, who gave the impression that they had been caught off. goard.

However, early last August the State Department and Jus-tice Department begun to take an interest in Malcolm's activiin North Africa.

Malcolm opened his campaign internationalize the American Negro problem at the second meeting of the 33 heads of independent African states in Cairo, which convened July 17. He submitted to the conference an eight-page memorandum demanding support for his campeign.

Re Chicago airtel of December 22, 1964, set forth the results of an interview of MUHAMMAD which was conducted on December 18, 1964, prior to receipt of re Bureau letter.

A review of this interview reflects it covered the points mentioned in paragraph three of re Bureau letter; namely, that he be questioned regarding a merger between himself and LITTLE, regarding control and leadership of the combined group, and regarding financial arrangements especially possible funds received from a foreign government. Chicago does not feel HASSAN SHARRIEFF should be interviewed in this connection at this time based primarily on the fact MUHANNAD continues to appear to be cooperative and at the time of the interview of him on December 18, 1964, had even stated he was considering calling the Agents to discuss the subject matter. It is felt an interview of SHARRIEFF is this specific regard at this time might well tend to alienate WALLACE MUHAWMAD and even SHARRIEFF as it could give the impression one was being set against the other. It is further noted SHARRIEFF is employed full time at present and did not journey with MUHANNAD to either Philadelphia or New York in early December, 1964. It is felt WALLACE MUHAMMAD is in a position to furnish more factual data while it is felt SHARRIEFF would only be able to furnish such data is WALLACK MUHAWWAD passed on to him.

Re Bureau letter instructs that no interviews are to be conducted in this matter without specific Bureau authority in advance for each interview. In view of the apparent cooperation as exhibited in the past by both MUHAMMAD and SHARRIEFF, Chicago desires to donduct future interviews of both, as it has done in the past, at such intervals of time as would avoid the possibility of alienating them. UACB Chicago will continue to interview both as it has been doing in the past. If information is developed indicating this should not be done, the Bureau will be promptly agvised. At present, Chicago anticipates interviewing both SHARRIEFF and MUHAMMAD in late January, 1965. WALLACE MURANNAD will be considered as the more important of the two. Both will be specifically questioned regarding points set forth earlier in this communication.

Re Chicago airtel of December 22, 1964, suggested New York give consideration to an interview of MALCOLM LITTLE and that Philadelphia give consideration to an interview of MASIE MHMAD of the International Muslim Brotherhood. Chicago still recommends consideration be given to these interviews. It is felt such interviews may assist in determining the various affiliations of LITTLE, MUHAMMAD and MASIE and may also assist in determining the location of headquarters and the leaders of these affiliations, the tenets thereof, and possible financial backing.

Re Bur eau letter of December 17, 1964, suggested consideration be given to interviewing HAJJI TALIB AHMAD DAVUD of the Muslim Brotherhood, USA in Philadelphia. Chicago does not feel an interview of DAVUD should be conducted based on the fact WALLACE MUHAMMAD on December 18, 1964, stated he was not associated with DAVUD or with his organization to his knowledge.

The Bureau, in its re letter, pointed out that DAWUD had been to several field offices. Among these field offices was Chicago.





Since working on his Ph.D. it Islamic jurisprudence, the younger Muhammad said he realized that many of his father's teachings were wrong such as advocating a segregated state for Negroes and instilling a hatred in his followers against the white man.

Ethel is married to Raymond Sharrieff, supreme chief of the FOI, and Lottle Muhammad, a teacher in their Muslim operated school system in Chicago.

Once known as the "angriest Black Muslim of them all," Malcom X was considered to be the successor to Mr. Muhammad when the latter stepped down from his ruler's throne. But since he was expelled the most likely person to succeed Mr. Muhammad is his son-in-law, Mr. Sharrieft."

It was not known if Akbar Milhammad had returned to Egypt following his conference, or what decision he had arrived at since talking with his father. Although he had promised to contact the Coprier, attempts to reach him at Muslim headquarers in Chicago, or at his father's Phoenic, Ariz' home were unsuccessful.





Characterizations of the Muslim Mosque, Incorporated (MMI), Organization of Afro-American Unity (OAAU) and the Nation of Islam (NOI) are attached hereto and all sources therein have furnished reliable information in the past.

On December 18, 1964, a confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, and is familiar with activity in New York City of the MMI and the OAAU, both of which are led my Malcolm X. Little, furnished the following information:

There has been no talk or mention at recent MMI meetings of any merger between the MMI and any other organization or group. However, at an MMI meeting held at 2395 Eighth Avenue, New York City, on December 16, 1964, MMI Secretary James 67% Warden talked in general terms of a new national Islamic religious organization to be formed in early 1965. This new organization will be strictly an orthodox Islamic religious body with headquarters in New York City and headed by Malcolm X. Little. Warden, during the course of his remarks, mentioned the "Muslim Brotherhood" but made no further comments about it. According to the source, Warden was specifically vague about this new organization indicating that more would be heard of it in the future. Warden did state that Shaykh Ahmad Hassoun, a teacher of Islam, from Sudan who is currently living in New York City with Malcolm X. Little, would figure prominently as a teacher in this new Islamic organization.

Other sources familiar with MMI, OAAU, NCI and racial matters in New York City were contacted during December, 1964, and they could furnish no information on the possible merger between the MMI and any other group or the formation of a new Islamic type group.
