Assistant Chief M. B. PIERCE (National Academy), Jackson, Mississippi, Police Department, advised on July 22, 1964, that the victims made a complaint on that date to the Jackson Police Department that two unidentified white men assaulted them with night sticks while victims were walking on the sidewalk at approximately 4:00 PM, July 22, 1964, near Gallitan and Amite Streets, Jackson.

Victims, both white males, are volunteer workers with the Council of Federated Organizations (COFO), Jackson, and were walking with an unidentified Negro male who ran from the scene when the incident occurred and was not struck. One unknown subject struck at Victim SAVIO but did not land a blow. The other unknown subject struck Victim OSMAN on the wrist and arm.

Victims believe that the unknown subjects were driving a gray Chevrolet, possibly a 1957 model, bearing a blue tag with white numerals 50-1611. 1964 Mississippi license tags are white with red numerals.

The victims declined the offer by the Police Department of transportation to the hospital after the interview and returned to the COFO Office, Jackson.

Assistant Chief PIERCE advised that the Police Department is conducting investigation to attempt to identify and locate the unknown subjects.

This is the case in which two white Council of Federated Organizations (COFO) workers, accompanied by a young Negro, were chased by two club-wielding white men in Jackson, Mississippi, 7/22/64. One of the subjects caught victim Osman and struck him repeated with a club; however, he did not suffer serious injury. The other victim, Mario Robert Savio, was struck once or possibly twice a glancing blow on his left shoulder as he fled but suffered no permanent injury. Intensive Bureau investigation identified 29-year-old local Klansman, as being one of the

subjects, and the ruentification was confirmed when arrangements were made for Osman and the 16-year-old Negro who had been with the white boys at the time of attack, to observe vicinity of his home on 8/7/64.

One H. L. Holmes, who is also reported to be a Klansman and is an associate of was considered a prime suspect but when arrangements were made for the victims to observe Holmes late was considered a prime suspect but Saturday afternoon they stated Holmes is not a subject in this case,

This has been discussed with the Civil Rights Division of the Department and St. John Barrett has now advised that the case should be turned over to local authorities in lieu of Federal action; however, Barrett requested that we complete our own investigation at this time in view of the possibility that if local authorities fail to vigorously pursue the case the Department will again consider Federal prosecution.

Two COFO workers attacked by two men with wooden clubs. escaped injury, second Victim suffered scratches and bruises on right arm, wrist, back and knee. No remarks made by attackers. Complaints filed by Victims at Jackson Police Department. Neighborhood investigation negative.

#### DETAILS:

This preliminary investigation was predicated upon information furnished by Assistant Chief M. B. PIERCE, Jackson Police Department, Jackson, Mississippi, on July 22, 1964, regarding complaints filed by MARIO SAVIO and ROBERT OSMAN in connection with an attack made upon them by two unidentified white men.

This investigation was conducted jointly by Special Agents JOSEPH B. MC ALEER and HAROLD F. GOOD.

S. B. MARNES, Beputy Chief, Police Bepartment, Jackson, Mississippi, consulted his file: and advised that MARIO SAVIO and ROBERT MAVID COUNT were interviewed at Police Managuarters in the late afternoon of July 22, 1964. At approximately 4:00 PM on July 22, 1964 a call was received from the McMesson and Robbins Building located at the corner of Gallatin and Amite Streets which was answered by Officers FRED MARWICK and R. W. GEWERY, reporting a fight that had taken place about fifteen minutes earlier. COMMN had told the responding officers that he and SAVIO had been assembled by two white men who stopped their car and got out with clubs in their hands. One of the attackers struck COMAN while the other struck SAVIO but did not land a hard blow.

SAVIO and OSMAN reported that they had been in the company of a colored male, whose name they did not know, who ran off and left them when the assault took place. The officers brought SAVIO and OSMAN to Police Neadquarters where complaints were filed by the Victims against the two attackers.

OSMAN stated that he had come to Mississippi from Oxford, Ohio, about a month ago and was assigned by the Confederation of Federated Organizations (COFO) to work on the drive for voter registration in Holmas County. OSMAN came to Jackson, Mississippi around 12:30 PM, July 22, 1964 and after reporting at COFO headquarters they went to lunch at a church on North Farish Street where they were taken by ear.

After lunch they decided to walk back to COPO headquarters at 1017 Lynch Street since they had no means of transportation available. In the company of a Negro male whom they had met at the church, SAVIO and COMMN walked west on Amite Street and had crossed Gallatin Street and were walking on the sidewalk adjacent to the Makasson Robbins Building when a grey automobile, believed to be a Chevrolet, drove past them and stopped at the curb. Two white men with clubs got out of the ear and ran toward them. One assaulted ROBERT COMMN and the other attached SAVIO but did not land a blow. The Negro that was with them ran off and escaped. SAVIO stated he was able to get away completely from his assailant. COMMN was struck by his attacher with the club on his right arm and right wrist and elbow. OSMAN's elbow was skinned when he fell to the payment to avoid his attacher. COMMN had fallen down and put his

arms over his head to protect it and that is why his arm was struck instead of his head.

OSMAN and SAVIO were offered transportation to a hospital for treatment but both refused this offer and were transported to COFO Headquarters at 1017 Lynch Street.

SAVIO and OSMAN described the car as grey, possibly a 1957 Chevrolet, and SAVIO furnished the tag number as 50-1611 on white plates with blue numerals. The county was covered with a piece of metal.

The attackers were described by SAVIO and OSMAN as white males, in their early thirties, dressed in casual clothes without hats. They both had dirty blond hair.

ROBERT PAYED COMM was interviewed at the office of the Resident Agency of the NRI, United States Post Office, Jackson, Mississippi. The information he furnished was incorporated in a statement signed by COMM, which reads as follows:

> "At Jackson, Mississippi July 23, 1964

"I, RESERT RAYED COMMS, make the following statement voluntarily to Marold F. Good and Joseph B. Mr Alcer who have identified themselves to me as Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

"At approximately 3:40 P.M. on July 22, 1964 in the vicinity of Mc Messon and Robbins Company building near the intersection of Amite and Gallitin Streets, I was in the company of MARIO SAVIO and a negro male whose name I do not know, when a grey ear, the make and model I do not know, stepped in the street in front of us and two man get out of the car holding clube in their hands. The car was about two or three car-lengths from us. I was immediately aware that I was in serioud danger. The men ran toward us and the three of us turned and ran away from them.

"I ran through an area adjacent to the street covered with high grass into a delivery area which was about four feet below the level of the street. One of the men took another route and cut off my escape. At this time I realized that I was unable to escape. I am counitted to nonviolence and fell to the ground trying to protect myself as best I could. I made no attempt to do him any kind of physical harm.

"I covered my head with my arms to protect that even from attack. I was unable to observe the attack that was made upon me but I suffered hard, vicious blows from the club upon my right arm, right wrist, right knee, my ribs on my right side and the right side of my back. The next thing I rocall is bearing one of the men say "Lets get out of here". I believe it was the one who was attacking

me. I continued to protect myself until I felt that it was safe to look up. I could no longer see either man. I was unable to get up and from my position I was unable to see the car they had come in.

"I had noticed the car when the men first drove up had a license plate with a white background and blue numerals which I strongly believe to have been a Mississippi plate from the year 1963, since I have seen 1963 Mississippi tags on numerous occasions before.

"When the two men originally got out of the car I observed them and describe one man as follows:

Age about 30

Race White

Sex Male

Height 5'9" - 5'11"

Weight 155

Hair Dirty Blonde, cut short

Dress Old, worn, tannish, out-of-date

sport clothes.

"The second man was very similar in description to the first man.

"Both men had wooden clubs about a foot long and appeared to be manufactured rather than home-made.

"I was taken to a Doctor Turner in a car by Michael Kenney, where I was examined and sent to a hospital for X-Rays to be taken. I do not recall the location of the office of the doctor nor the name or location of the hospital. I was informed at the hospital that I had no broken bones.

"I had been advised that in case of attack it is better if one has the presence of mind to inform the assailant that I am working on voter registration which is protected by Federal laws. However, in the suddenness of the attack I did not have the presence of mind to do so. My companion Mario Savio, however, was wearing abutton about an inch and is in diameter bearing the inscription 'One man - one vote', the motto of the voter registration drive for the summer of 1964. I believe that the assailants identified us as civil rights workers through this button.

"July 23, 1964

"I MARIO ROBERT SAVIO hereby make the following voluntary statement to JOSEPH B. MC ALEER and HAROLD F. GOOD, both of whom have identified themselves as Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

"I arrived in Jackson Mississippi about 12:00 noon on July 22, 1964 having worked on the Voter Registration Drive in Holmes County, Miss. I was on my way to another part of Mississippi to continue this work. I had lunch at a church on Farish Street with ROBERT OSMAN, also a worker on the Voter Registration Drive, and we met a local Negro outside the church who said he would walk with us toward the Council of Federated Organizations (COFO) office because we did not know where it was located. We had just passed the intersection of Gallatin Street and Amite Street and were next to the Mc Kesson building at about 3:40 p.m. when a grey Chevrolet automobile in the early 1950s pulled ahead of us and stopped at the curb. It had, what appeared to me, 1963 Mississippi license plates with the county designation covered. It had light blue letters on a white background with numbers which I believe were 501611. Two white males sprang from the vehicle and both had brown wooden billyclubs. They came at us and we ran and they chased us. The Negro fellow, whose name I didn't know, and I ran back toward the

intersection. At the intersection he went left and I ran to the middle of the street in front of the Mc Kesson Building and stopped and looked back. If the Negro fellow was struck I didn't see it. I was struck once or possibly twice by the billyclub as I was running. I was hit on the rear part of my left shoulder but it was a glancing blow and I feel as though there is no permanent injury. There are no marks showing on the rear of my left shoulder and no swelling. I didn't hear the one who chased me say one word.

"When I turned around in the intersection of the street I could see ROBERT OSMAN being beaten on the back with a billy club. He was doubled up with his hands clasped over his heard. The one who chased me ran back in the direction of the car and very shortly thereafter both of them fled in the vehicle. We then went into the Mc Kesson building and called the police. About ten to fifteen minutes after the call two uniformed policemen arrived and questioned us in a general way about the incident. They then took us to the Police Department and we were interviewed separately by two plainclothesmen and thereafter one of the latter drove us back to the COFO headquarters. Since I didn't feel as though I was seriously injured I did not seek any medical assistance in any form. ROBERT OSMAN did ask to be brought to either a doctor or a hospital and the police said they were willing to take him.

"With regard to the man who chased me, if I saw him again, I would be able to say I think that is he. I could not identify the man who beat up ROBERT OSMAN. The man who chased me is described as follows:

#### FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION

1 Jackson. Mississippi, stated he met MARIO SAVIO and REBERT OSMAN on July 22, 1964 at the church on Farish Street where he had eaten his lunch. SAVIO and OSMAN did not know the way to the Council of Federated Organizations (COFO), 1017 Lynch Street, so he said he would show them the way.

He said they were walking along a street in Jackson near a viaduct and in the vicinity of a drug company. An examination of the neighborhood in which MARIO SAVIO and ROBERT DAVID OSMAN reported that they had been attacked was made by SAs JOSEPH B. MC ALKER and HAROLD F. GOOD. The street on which the alleged attackers first approached SAVIO and OSMAN was Amite Street and runs along the side of the McKesson and Robbins Building at the location of the truck platform. The place where OSMAN described as being the place where he had been attacked, the delivery area at the McKesson and Robbins Building, was concealed from the surrounding area because it was below the level of the street and grass was growing tall between the sidewalk and the delivery area.

Across the street from the McKesson and Robbins Building is the Ryan Supply Company, a warehouse for electronic equipment. On the corner diagonally across from McKesson's is an unoccupied two-story building. The remaining corner is occupied as a storage area for a lumber yard. Considerable traffic was seen to pass through this area. However, the possibility of people observing the attack from the surrounding buildings was practically non-existent.

JACK SLATER, Division Manager, McKesson and Robbins, Inc., North Gallatin and Amite Streets, Jackson, Mississippi, advised that on the afternoon of July 22, 1964 a tall band-haired young man came into his effice and asked if he may use the telephone to call the police to report a beating. He was granted permission and made the call. After completing the call, he asked permission to make another local call to advise his effice where he was located. He was granted permission to make this call.

Upon completing the tall, he went outside and assisted another young man who appeared to have an injured arm and came into the building and remained in the lounge until the police arrived. The police officers accompanied both young men out of the building and nothing more was heard or seen of them.

SLATER stated that he went outside and noticed that a truck of Mississippi Butane was in the driveway of his company and the driver was standing outside the truck. SLATER asked the driver what was going on. The driver told him that a young Negro fellow had just rum in front of his truck and to avoid hitting him, the driver had to turn the truck into the driveway. SLATER asked him if he saw anything that caused the man to run and driver told him that he saw nothing else in the area.

SLATER stated that the McKesson trucks would not be at the platform at the time the alleged attack took place but there may have been trucks making deliveries. This information would have to be secured from the shipping clerk.

### RECOMMENDATION FOR COMMENDATION

The purpose of this letter is to recommend commendation for SAs HAROLD F. GOOD and JOSEPH B. MC ALEER who through perseverance and hard work traced one of the attackers in captioned case which resulted in his prosecution in local court.

The trial of took place at the Municipal Court on Friday, 8/14/64, at 4 p.m., before Judge pro tem W. B. FONTAINE. JACK TRAVIS, the City Prosecuting Attorney, represented the City of Jackson and HUGH BAILEY represented the defendant.

MARIO SAVIO, ROBERT OSMAN and were the first three witnesses for the prosecution and testified to the attack upon them by two men with clubs on 7/22/64 on Amite Street near Gallatin and identified as one of the attackers.

Three members of the Jackson Police Department testified. Two officers responded to the call made by SAVIO at the time of the attack and transported SAVIO and OSMAN to Police Headquarters. One of these officers testified to this. Detective W. C. CHANCE testified that OSMAN and SAVIO furnished him with the information regarding the attack and the tag number of the car used by the attackers. CHANCE testified that the above information was furnished to the FBI.

The third member of the Jackson Police Department prepared to testify that he had arrested on a warrant but his testimony was waived by defense and the Judge excused him.

SA JOSEPH B. MC ALEER testified to the investigation conducted, tracing the ownership of the car used by the attackers identified by the license tag furnished by SAVIO. This testimony showed that the car at the time of the attack was the property of

Enclosed herewith are copies of documents we are authorized to release to you. The deletions which have been made were based on this Bureaus's interpretations of existing statutes and regulations of the Department of Justice pertaining to the Freedom of Information Act. In addition to the enclosed material, our central files mention you as an individual who attended the Mississippi Summer Project with the Council of Federated Organizations in Jackson, Mississippi, in 1964.

Other information which pertains to you is exempt from public disclosure pursuant to the provisions of the Freedom of Information Act, Title 5, United States Code, Section 552 (b) (1), (b) (2), (b) (5), (b) (7) (C), (D), and (E). Exemption (b) (1) allows the withholding of information which is classified pursuant to an Executive Order; (b) (2) allows the withholding of material related solely to the internal practices of an agency; (b) (5) exempts material in order to prevent the inhibitive effect disclosure would have upon devilopment of policy, guidance, and administrative direction; (b) (7) (C) exempts material the disclosure of which would constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy; (b) (7) (D) exempts information which would disclose the identity of and information furnished under circumstances of confidentiality; and (b) (7) (E) allows the withholding of material which would disclose investigative techniques and procedures.



The 12/10/64 Washington News Release advised Mario Savio, leader of student demonstrators, University of California, had begun cross-country speaking tour and was scheduled to appear at the University of Michigan, Columbia University, City College of New York, Queens College, and Harvard. He is accompanied by Bettina Aptheker, Suzanne Goldberg and Steve Weissman. It was stated the American Broadcasting Company was paying expenses of all to New York for appearance on the Les Crane Show. The Director noted "What do we know of Savio?"

Mario Savio is the leader of the recent lawless demonstration at the University of California at Berkeley which resulted in the arrest of 781 demonstrators on 12/3/64. Savio, 22 years of age, is also chief spokesman for the Free Speech Movement who has been engaged in a running disagreement with the University administration over political activities on campus in violation of University regulations. Investigation of Savio to date has not developed any information indicating affiliation on his part with a subversive group. However, he has been extremely close and in frequent company of Bettina Aptheker, a current active leader in the Communist Party in San Francisco. Savio was arrested 3/7/64 in connection with sit-in demonstrations staged at the Sheraton-Palace Hotel, San Francisco. He was charged with disturbing the peace, but was acquitted 5/12/64.

The San Francisco Office by teletype 12/10/64 advised purpose of speaking tour by Savio and companions is to raise money for the defense fund of 781 University of California students who were arrested 12/3/64.

In view of the close association of Bettina Aptheker (daughter of Herbert Aptheker, member of National Committee of the Communist Party, USA) with Savio, all offices have been instructed to intensify their coverage of the activities of Savio as well as the other individuals accompanying him on this tour and advise the Bureau of all pertinent information developed, particularly if there is any indication that Savio or his companions are in contact with subversive groups. It is noted that Savio is scheduled to return to San Francisco on 12/14/64 to appear in court as a result of the aforementioned arrest. Pertinent information developed to date concerning the demonstrations and/or participants therein have been disseminated to the Internal Security Division and Civil Rights Division of the Department, Secret Service, and military intelligence agencies.

The San Francisco Office by teletype dated 12/10/64 was authorized to furnish Governor Brown on a confidential basis public source information, lead information and general information concerning communist affiliations of participants in the aforementioned demonstrations. This action was taken pursuant to a personal request of Governor Brown of our San Francisco Office as he reportedly intends to call an emergency meeting of the University Regents to support the Administration of the University since the faculty adopted a resolution supporting the demonstrators which would tend to give the faculty authority over student discipline rather than the Administration.

The above is submitted pursuant to the Director's inquiry. This matter is being closely followed and all interested offices have been instructed to keep the Bureau advised of all activities on the part of these individuals and others involved in the demonstrations.

In a letter to the Director dated June 9, 1965, captioned individual referred to the Director's recent testimony before the Appropriations Committee. Specifically, he made reference to that part of the testimony concerning Mario Savio, the individual who led the campus demonstrations on the Berkeley campus of the University of California last year. he protested the Director's disclosure that Savio had attended Manhattan College before going to the University of California. He said that, if this was wrongly interpreted, it could create an adverse impression concerning the type of students to be found on the Manhattan College campus. The Director noted on the letter, "If sombody wants to read into my testimony something I didn't say that's his privilege."

In order to resolve this matter and set Brother Stephen straight, the New York Office was instructed to have Special Agent in Charge Roney contact him in person.

Roney advised that he contacted Brother Stephen on June 15, 1965, and orally acknowledged his letter. Roney pointed out to Brother Stephen that the Director's testimony was not intended to cast aspersions on Manhattan College or its students. Roney said, that, if such aspersions were derived from the testimony, it was because the reader chose to interpret them as such.

Brother Stephen acknowledged the validity of this state-He said his primary purpose in writing the letter was to assure the Director that Mario Savio was not indicative of the usual high caliber of students at Manhattan College. He emphasized that his letter was not written in a critical vein, because, as he said, he has the highest admiration for the Director and the Bureau He assured Roney that the Bureau would have his full and complete cooperation in any situation where he can be of assistance.

Dear Mr. Hoover:

In your testimony before the House Subcor fifter on Appropriations on March 4th, 1965, you stated concerning Mario Savio: "He attended Manhattan College in New York City until 1963 when he enrolled at the University of California at Berkeley."

According to our understanding of this young man's academic career your testimony was incomplete. Mr. Savio was enrolled at Manhattan College for his freshman year during 1960-61. He left Manhattan College to go to Queens College, Queens, N.Y. in September, 1961. After attending Queens College, he transferred to the University of California at Berkeley when his family moved to California. Mr. Savio left Manhattan College in good standing, While he was here he was well known to several members of the religious faculty. A young man of liberal tendencies, he did not manifest at Manhattan College those undesirable traits to which your testimony gives evidence.

While it is recognized that your testimony does not point a finger at Manhattan College, the intention of this letter is to correct the recorded statement which could, if wrongly interpreted, raise a question (and perhaps an eyebrow) concerning the type of student to be found on this campus.

I recognize that oral testimony may oftentimes be incomplete by reason of the circumstances within which it is rendered. However, the written record thereof admits of undesirable interpretation almost because it is the lifeless printed word. I trust your customary kindness will prompt you to interpret this letter in the spirit which moves its author to write it. 23

Mario Robert Savio was issued passport F343587 on June 17, 1965, at New York, New York, for proposed two years travel to England, Italy and France for the purpose of study. In his application dated June 15, 1965, at New York, New York, he stated that he intended to depart in September, 1965. This passport was valid for three years travel to all countries except Albania, Cuba and those portions of China, Korea and Viet-Nam under communist control.

Savio stated that he was born on December 8, 1942,666 at New York City He gave his permanent residence as 2127 Blake, Berkeley, California. He listed his father as Joseph Savio, born August 28, 1919, in Italy and his mother as Dora E. Berretti, born December 23, 1916, at New York City. He stated that he was last married on May 23, 1965, to Suzanne Marilyn Goldberg, who was born on June 6, 1939, at Brooklyn, New York. In the event of death or accident he requested that Joseph Savio, his father, be notified at 1216 East Northridge Avenue, Glendora, California. The following description appeared in his file:





# Jail Terms Go to Savio, Miss Aptheker

BERKELFY, Calif., June 30 (UPI)—Mario Savio and Bettina Aptheker Kurzweil, leaders of the Free Speech Movement at the University of California, went to jail today for their part in the 1964 Sproul Hall sit-ins.

Savio, 23, and Mrs. Kurzweil, 22, an avowed Communist, were ordered to serve their sentences immediately after Municipal Judge George Brunn denied a request by Mrs. Kurzweil's attorney to delay her imprisonment because she was pregnant.

Savio will serve 120 days at Santa Rita Prison Farm. Mrs. Kurzweil was sentenced to 45 days there.

Judge Brunn now has sentenced more than 400 of the 576 youths since the U.S. Suprer a Court rejected their final appeals earlier this month.

Of this group, the following are not on "Socurity Index: Calvert, Danuenberg, Halliwell, Pardun, Spiegel, and Egleson. The offices handling these individuals are instructed to immediately reopen their investigations concerning them and submit reports together with a recommendation commercing their Security Index status. When considering these individuals for the Security Index, particular attention should be placed to current Bureau instructions on page 45, Section 67D, of the Manual of Instructions concerning the Security Index criteria and especially Item (C).

Furthermore, an intensive investigation of each of the above-mentioned individuals should immediately be initiated with the objective of developing detailed and complete information regarding their day-to-day activities and future plans for staging demonstrations and disruptive acts directed against the Government. Recent events on college campuses illustrate the growing trend toward anarchy, which is evertaking the nation.

It is imperative that the Bureau, as a result of this evidence, redouble its efforts in penetrating those groups which have spearheaded these attacks on our established institutions and are currently calling for open revolution.

The captioned subject was designated in reBuaintel as a Key Activist as a result of his leadership activity in the New Left wovement.

A review of Savio's file has been completed at the Bureau and the following observations are noted bearing on your investigation of the subject.

No information was located in Bufiles to indicate that your investigation has been directed toward fully developing the subject's financial activity. This should be done and a close surveillance instituted in order to develop information regarding his financial status.

From information developed, to date, it would appear that the subject may be moving away from those New Left groups which have demonstrated their revolutionary bent and may be moving toward a more politically stable. posture, as revealed in his current candidacy on the Peace and Freedom ticket. is maturing politically and may no longer be classified as a Key Activist. However, the coming political campaign in California may serve to answer this question. You should, therefore, closely follow his speeches and writings during this campaign with a view toward resolving this question.

You should consider the use of telephone toll checks to determine the subject's contacts. A specific request for authority to make such checks should be made to the Bureau prior to conducting this phase of your investigation.

Relet instructed that a survey be made of the informant coverage available to you on the subject. Such a survey has not been received. You should, thereson, carefully review this investigation to determine the live, day-to-day informant coverage you have available. You should advise the Bureau of the results of this review of your coverage along with a frank evaluation, and your plans for its improvement, if needed.

Despite Savio's past activities, no recommendation has been received from you to include him on the Agitator Index. You should promptly consider the subject in this regard.

Some Key Activits, have traveled extensively both nationally and abroad, in the past. You should remain alert to this in order that you might promptly advise the Bureau of any travel planned by the subject. Information developed is to be furnished the Bureau and interested offices in a form suitable for dissemination.

In evaluating this case, you should bear in mind that one of the prime objectives should be to neutralize him in the new left movement. The Bureau will entertain recommendations of a counterintelligence nature to accomplish this end. You should, therefore, promptly

furnish the Bureau with your suggestions as to how this might be accomplished. Take no positive action, however, in this regard without specific Bureau approval.

You will be expected to pursue this investigation aggressively and with imagination. Delays in reporting important developments will not be tolerated.





A review at the Bureau has determined that the following persons have, at one time or another, contributed to disruption and violence on college and university campuses: Ernest Liandel (OO: NY); Gisela Mandel (OO: NY); Karl Dietrich Volff (OO: NY); Daniel Cohn-Bendit (OO: WFO); Mario Savio (OO: SF); and Bettina Aptheker Kurzweil (OO: SF).

The above offices of origin have been assigned for the purpose of handling Antiriot Law investigation. Cohn-Bendit has been assigned to Washington Field Office since it appears this individual has not as yet arrived in the United States but has applied for a visa since he has invitations to speak at several universities, including the University of California at Berkeley. Any office receiving information that Cohn-Bendit has arrived in the United States should immediately advise the Bureau and Washington Field Office.

Immediately review your intelligence file and prepare an Antiriot laws summary report containing all speeches made by subject on or after 4/11/68 on campuses throughout the United States as well as any other speeches and/or public statements wherein subject advocated or incited violence on a sampus or elsewhere in the nation. Include verbatim transcripts of such speeches, if available, and promptly set out leads to interview witnesses such as representatives of news media and authors of articles appearing in college publications in order to obtain as much detail as possible concerning specific statements advocating violence.

Verify all interstate travel and conduct logical investigation to obtain any statements made prior to interstate travel indicating the purpose of such travel was to incite a riot or civil disorder. Determine identity of persons extending invitations to speak in other than the resident state along with details concerning any financial arrangements. In event information is developed indicating a possible conspiracy among the above individuals, such information should be immediately furnished to the Bureau and the pertinent office of origin.

Predicate each speech with a documented summary of the status of any disorder already in progress at the location where subject spoke and follow with a documented summary of any violence which appears to have been a direct result of the speech delivered by subject. Witnesses of this nature would include interviews with top level university officials, campus security police, local authorities and interviews with informants having firsthand knowledge concerning the speeches and nature of disorders involved.

Include a succinct summary of background information concerning subject containing full description, arrest records complete with dispositions and organizational affiliations.

Assign case to an Agent with cuccessful criminal experience who should be accompanied on pertinent interviews with Agents familiar with security matters. Use criminal rules of reporting and limit reports to investigation directly aimed at establishing a violation of Title 18, Section 2101 which prohibits interstate travel or use of any facility of interstate or foreign commerce, including, but not limited to, the mail, telegraph, telephone, radio or television with intent to incite a riot, organize, promote or encourage a riot, commit any act of violence in furtherance of a riot. A new Antiriot Law case is to be opened under 176 classification.

Submit informant information in letterhead memorandum suitable for dissemination and general intelligence information under suitable caption. Furnish copies of reports to pertinent United States Attorneys. Logical interviews are to be conducted whether or not the

person to be interviewed is on the Security and/or Agitator Index or whether that individual can be expected to be cooperative. Students and faculty should be interviewed off campus.

Afford close supervision and aggressive, continuous attention. Submit first comprehensive report within fifteen days setting forth specific leads as to all remaining investigation and surep every fifteen days until all logical investigation is completed and reported.

This and cases involving all other subjects will be presented to the Criminal Division of the Department at the earliest possible date for prosecutive opinion.

If your initial review of the intelligence file fails to indicate any activity indicating a possible Antiriot Law violation on the part of the subject on or after 4/11/68, advise the Bureau by letter and conduct no further investigation.

NOTE: Separate cases have been opened on each subject to determine whether there is sufficient admissible evidence upon which the Department can proceed with Federal Antiriot Law prosecution. 4/11/68 is the effective date of Title 18, Section 2101 and it would appear that in the absence of a conspiracy that it would not be necessary to obtain speeches pror to this date.

Subject is a Key Activist because of his pas activities in the New Left Mevement. He was a spokesman and leaser for the Free Speech Movement at the University of California, Brkeley, California, during 1964 and 1965 at which time students were involved in a number of demonstrations in connection with their refusal to obey University rules and regulations. He has participated in numerous Civil Rights demonstrations and Anti-Vietnam War demonstrations and was a West Coast sponsor for the Student Mobilization Committee to End the War in Vietnam.



MARDER said, however, that he desired reasonable effort be made to identify and, then, interview the writer of the letter to admonish him and possibly reconsider for prosecutive purposes.

In extortion matters the FBI does not interview individuals for the purpose of admonishing them to cease and desist in their letter writing activities and any such admonishment rests with the USA. When such request is made, tactfully inform the USA that your office will not locate an individual for the purpose of admonishment.

It is noted Mr. Marder expressed the opinion the threat is not specifically directed against Fording or Mario Savio. However, it is pointed out that the language in the letter does advise the Chief to keep Savio "shut up" and reference to the need for a local undertaker would seem to carry connotation of a threat.

Concerning Mr. Marder's comment that he would possibly reconsider this matter for prosecutive purposes after a subject is identified and interviewed, indicates your office has not obtained a firm prosecutive opinion. You are reminded that it is the prerogative and responsibility of the USA to render prosecutive opinions; however, it is the sole responsibility and function of the FBI to determine the scope and extent of investigation to be conducted.

Because of the possibility of distortion and a lack of sufficient comparable wordings, a definite conclusion was not reached whether QI through Q4 were prepared by more than one person. However, differences in the questioned handwriting on Q1 and Q2 when compared with the questioned handwriting on Q3 and Q4 suggest that the two letters were written by two persons.



Two letters in this case have been examined by the FBI Laboratory and appear to be from separate sources. A third letter, received from the Berkeley, California, Police Department on 5/11/65, has been sent to the FBI Laboratory by separate communication. The third letter appears to be from a third source. All three letters are being handled in this one case, SF 9-1912, because they all appear to be directed toward MARIO SAVIO. Also, the third letter is being included with this report as an attachment because it contains language of an obscene and objectionable nature.

Arrangements were made with MARIO SAVIO for interview relative to the first two letters, at the Berkeley Resident Agency at 4:00 p.m., 5/11/65. cancelled that appointment. Advised of the third letter on 5/12/65, he agreed to an interview at 4:00p.m. the same date at the Berkeley Resident Agency. appeared for the interview accompanied by ALEXANDER PETER HOFFMAN. HOFFMAN, after evading several direct questions for his purpose at the interview, finally admitted that he was present in the capacity of an attorney for SAVIO. On entering the Berkeley Resident Agency SAVIO referred to the Bureau as the "Federal Bureau of Inquisition", maintained a contentious, peremptory manner, appeared unconcerned about the letters and attempted to propound matters not germane to the interview. Despite a careful explanation of the reasons for desiring the interview without the presence of HOFFMAN, SAVIO declined. The interview was terminated. HOFFMAN resides at 2136 Grant Street, Berkeley, California, and is employed as a Research Lawyer, Center for the Study of Law and Society, University of California, Berkeley, California. He signed the California State Loyalty Oath in connection with that employment. He has been reliably reported as active in the Labor Youth League and as a member prior to 1956.

Handwritten letter to ADDISON FORDING, Chief of Police, Berkeley, California, mentions MARIOSAVIO and seems to carry connotation of threat. A second letter to MARIO SAVIE implies a threat. FBI Laboratory unable to identify sender but examination suggests the two letters were written by two persons. AUSA, San Francisco, considers letter to FORDING to constitute a prosecutable violation. #### DETAILS:

Investigation in this case is predicated on the following:

Captain WILLIAM BEALL, Berkeley, California, Police Department, on March 15, 1965, advised that the following described letter was received at the Police Department on March 13, 1965, handwritten in ink: "Chief of Police, Berkeley, Calif. Dear Sir, Now that Mario Savio is back in Berkeley, and already started trouble on the campus, we the Committee of Twenty are giving you fair warning to keep him shut up or one of our local undertakers will have a customer. We are fed up over this socalled civil rights and its leaders. /s/Committee of Twenty, Fred (illegible, possibly Mohair), Secretary."

This document contains neither recommendations nor conclusions of the FBI. It is the property of the FBI and is loaned to your agency; it and its contents are not to be distributed outside your agency.

The envelope containing the letter is postmarked at Berkeley, California, March 12, 1965, in the afternoon but the actual time does not show.

MARIO SAVIO is the chief spokesman for the Free Speech Movement (FSM) at the University of California during the fall of 1964, which gained nationwide attention and notoriety. The FSM activity has declined but SAVIO continues as a leader in the civil rights demonstrations involving University of California students and non-students as well.

The aforementioned letter was obtained from Captain BEALL on March 17, 1965. On that date Captain BEALL furnished a second letter, which he said had been turned over to him on March 15, 1965, by MARIO SAVIO. The second letter is as follows:

"San Rafel

"I think you are a dirty Pig & a Fink & if you keep up your Dirty work I am coming after you. You are nothing But a big Sap.

"/s/Joe Blow

"P.S. Why dont you get out of My Country."

ROBERT S. MARDER, Assistant U. S. Attorney, San Francisco, California, on March 22, 1965, advised that prosecution would be declined because the letter in question is more in the nature of a "crank" type letter and further the threat is not specifically directed against either SAVIO or Chief of Police, Berkeley, California. On April 13, 1965, Mr. MARDER advised that on further consideration of the letters involved in this case it is his opinion that the letter to Chief of Police, Berkeley, California, does constitute a prosecutable violation of the Extortion Statute.

Under date of April 8, 1965, the FBI Laboratory advised as follows:

- Q3 Envelope postmarked "SAN FRANCISCO, CALIF. 2 AM 11 MAR 1965" bearing handwritten address "Maria Savie University of California Berkeley Calif."
- Sheet of paper bearing handwritten letter beginning "I think you are. . ." and ending "P.S. Why dont you get out of my country."

#### Result of examination:

Q1 through Q4 were compared with the appropriate section of the Anonymous Letter File without effecting an identification.

The physical characteristics of Ql through Q4 have been recorded for possible future use. No watermarks, indented writings, or other characteristics were noted in Ql through Q4 which would aid in determining the sources of the material.

Because of the possibility of distortion and a lack of sufficient comparable wordings, a definite conclusion was not reached whether Q1 through Q4 were prepared by more than one person. However, differences in the questioned handwriting on Q1 and Q2 when compared with the questioned handwriting on Q3 and Q4 suggest that the two letters were written by two persons.

Under date of April 12, 1965, the Latent Fingerprint Section, Identification Division, FBI, advised that no latent impressions of value were developed from Q1 and Q3, the two envelopes; or from Q2 and Q4, the two handwritten letters. SF 9-1912 HFH:dje

On May 11, 1965, Captain WILLIAM BEALL, Berkeley, California, Police Department, furnished an envelope containing a typewritten letter. He said the letter had been handed over to him on April 8, 1965, by MALCOIM BURNSTEIN. The envelope, postmarked April 5, 1965, at Oakland, California, was addressed to MALCOIM BURNSTEIN, Attorney at Law, 1440 Broadway, Oakland, California. Captain BEALL identified BURNSTEIN as the defense attorney representing MARIO SAVIO and others in a trial now in progress for a number of individuals arrested during a "sit-in" demonstration at the University of California on December 2, 1964. The letter is critical of BURNSTEIN for defending MARIO SAVIO, JACK WEINBERG, ARTHUR GOLDBERG and SUSANNE GOLDBERG. The letter, a copy of which is attached to this report, contains language of obscene and objectionable nature in threatening bodily harm to the males named and implies a threat of death for SAVIO. This letter has been submitted to the FBI Laboratory for appropriate examination.

MARIO SAVIO agreed to an interview at 4:00 p.m., Hay 11, 1965, relative to the first two letters. He cancelled that interview but said he would come for interview at a later time. Advised of the third letter on May 12, 1965, he agreed to an interview at 4:00 p.m. the same date. He appeared for the interview at the appointed time but was accompanied by ALEXANDER PETER HOFFMAN, who claimed to be an attorney for SAVIO. Advised of the confidential nature of the interview, SAVIO was requested to be interviewed alone. He refused this request, did not indicate any concern about the letters other than to say that he did not have any idea who may have written them. The interview was terminated.

Referenced report reveals that on 5/12/65 Mario Savio was interviewed concerning this matter at which time he made derogatory remarks concerning this Bureau, appeared unconcerned about the letters and in general demonstrated an extremely uncooperative attitude.

Review of this matter reveals that three letters containing implied threats are involved. The first of these letters addressed to the Chief of Police, Berkeley, California, contains implied threats against Savio. The second letter addressed to Savio and referred by him to the Berkeley Police Department, contained derogatory remarks and an implied threat against Savic. The third latter addressed to Malcolm Burnstein, attorney for Savio, and others, contains obscene, objectionable statements and threats of bodily harm to Savio and his associates.

It appears that statements in these letters which could possibly be considered threats are primarily directed against Savio in view of Savio's past activities at the University of California. Information available to the Bureau indicates that Savio is no longer connected with this university.

Inasmuch as Savio appears to be the primary target of the unknown subject or subjects, he would, of course, be an extremely vital witness in any successful Federal prosecution in the event subject and/or subjects are identified. Savio's uncooperative attitude and the fact that he will not be a favorable witness should be taken into consideration with reference to any further investigation by this Bureau.

With regard to the letter addressed to Malcolm Burnstein received by your office from the Berkeley Police Department on 5/11/65, it is noted that this letter was received by that department from Burnstein on 4/8/65. It appears that the Berkeley Police Department may have conducted investigation concerning this letter prior to referral to your office. In any event, a delay such as this in referring a matter of this type to this Bureau can normally be expected to adversely effect the outcome of the investigation.

A serious question arises as to whether this Bureau should be expending time and effort in this matter at this time. All factors should be brought to the attention of the U. S. Attorney now for his consideration as to whether any further action by FBI is warranted in this matter. Suairtel results of U. S. Attorney's opinion.

Movement which gained nation-wide notoriety on the Berkeley Campus of the University of California in the Fall of 1964. Information available to the Domestic Intelligence Division indicates Savio is no longer connected with this University. Savio's extremely uncooperative attitude and derogatory remarks concerning FBI would indicate he would not be a suitable witness for Federal prosecution. Inasmuchithreats are primarily directed against him, it appears U. S. Attorney should be made aware of his attitude to determine if further investigation warranted. In the event U. S. Attorney feels further investigation by this Bureau not warranted, San Francisco will be instructed to return the letters to the Berkeley Police Department.

Cochran - VICTIMS, EXTORTION"; with the typewriting on Q3 and Q4 in the case captioned "Unsub, Patricia Daoud-Agha - VIKEX"; and with the typewriting on material in the case entitled "Unsub, Anonymous Letter, PM 11-18-63, at San Francisco, California; Frank Ermey - VIKEX." This questioned typewriting, however, is too limited to definitely determine whether all the questioned specimens mentioned above were typed on one typewriter.

The typewriting on Q5 and Q6 most closely corresponds to a standard for Royal elite style of type spaced twelve letters to the inch.

This is to advise that by communication dated 7/12/65, the San Francisco Office advised that Assistant U. S. Attorney Robert S. Marder requested additional investigation. Facts indicate further FBI investigation is not warranted.

#### BACKGROUND:

Mario Savio was the spokesman for the student free speech movement at the University of California in the Fall of 1964, and as such was engaged in student demonstrations on the campus. In the past, Savio has associated with known communists. There is no indication Savio is presently connected with the University of California.

On 3/17/65, the Berkeley, California, Police Department furnished two anonymous letters containing implied threats against Savio to our San Francisco Office. The first of these was addressed to the Berkeley Police Department, received 3/13/65. The second was a letter received by Savio furnished to the Berkeley Police Department by him on 3/15/65. Investigation was instituted by San Francisco inasmuch as Assistant U. S. Attorney Marder felt letters constituted possible extortion violation.

By report dated 5/21/65, San Francisco advised that Savio had been interviewed on 5/11/65, at which time he was extremely uncooperative. and referred to FBI as the "Federal Bureau of Inquisition." As a result of his attitude and his insistence on being accompanied by his aftorney, the interview was immediately terminated. On 5/11/65, the Berkeley Police Department furnished a third anonymous threatening letter, which had been received by Malcolm Burnstein, Savio's attorney, and furnished by him to the Berkeley Police Department on \$/8/65.

Memorandum to Mr. Belmont Re: UNKNOWN SUBJECT, aka. COMMITTEE OF TWENTY

On 5/28/65, San Francisco was instructed to discuss this matter with the U. S. Attorney to determine if further investigation was warranted inasmuch as Savio's attitude indicated he would be an extremely hostile witness in any prosecution. San Francisco discussed this matter with Assistant U. S. Attorney Marder at the earliest opportunity and subsequently, after taking this matter under advisement, on 6/30/65, he stated that in his opinion the facts were not sufficient to decline prosecution. He pointed out that the third letter, the one to Burnstein, contained definite threats to Savio's life.

In view of Savio's extremely bad attitude and the fact that the only letter containing any real threat was held by the Berkeley Police Department over 30 days, it does not appear that we should conduct further investigation of this case. The Berkeley Police Department has concurrent jurisdiction in threatening letters of this type.

#### ACTION RECOMMENDED:

Attached is an airtel to our San Francisco Office instructing that all three letters be returned to the Berkeley, California, Police Department for any further action desired by that agency. San Francisco is also being instructed to advise the U. S. Attorney by letter that in view of Savio's attitude, delayed referral of the letter containing the threat, and the fact that local police have concurrent jurisdiction, the letters are being returned to the Berkeley Police Department, and no further action is being taken by this Bureau.
