This is pursuant to your instruction to establish a position of Deputy Associate Director:

*W. MARK FELT*

If such a position is established, consideration must also be given to what will be the effect on any incumbent named thereto with regard to coverage under arrest authority, the right to bear firearms, and the liberalized retirement program.

*W. Mark Felt*

Title 18, U. S. Code, Section 3052, specifically grants arrest authority and right to bear firearms to those incumbents in positions titled Director, Associate Director, Assistant to the Director, Assistant Director, Inspector, and Special Agent. If we were to establish a position with the official title Deputy Associate Director, the incumbent would no longer have arrest authority and would not have right to bear firearms, and we would be obliged to place that position in a series other than the Criminal Investigation Series GS 1811, which would mean the incumbent would no longer have the benefits that currently accrue thereto under the Liberalized Retirement Act set forth in Section 8336 (c), Title 5, U. S. Code.

Should the Director desire, the title of such position could be made Inspector-Deputy Associate Director. The Director now has the authority to take this action and it would retain for the incumbent all the rights and authority enjoyed now by other Bureau officials. The incumbent's credential would show him as an Inspector; however, his in-house title would be Deputy Associate Director. If the position is placed in a supergrade, i. e. GS-16, 17 or 18, this action can all be accomplished within the Bureau.

Former Assistant to the Director Alan Belmont called me around 4:30 p. m. today and stated he had received a long distance telephone call from an individual who described himself as [redacted] (no first name) of the Washington Bureau of the New York Times. [redacted] said he wanted to talk to Belmont informally and off the record. Belmont told [redacted] he would listen to what he had to say but he was not sure whether he would answer all of his questions. [redacted] asked the following questions and Belmont gave the response indicated:

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Was Sullivan ever SAC of an FBI field office. Belmont responded that he did not recall that Sullivan was ever SAC of a field office but did recall that he served on SIS in rather important capacities during his Bureau career.

Was Sullivan the most experienced Bureau official in the fields of security and espionage. Belmont responded he did not agree that Sullivan enjoyed such a category, that there were many in the Bureau who had outstanding qualifications in the security and espionage field.

There was a liaison group in the FBI of ten Special Agents or so. The question was whether this liaison group had been cut down substantially in the recent past. Belmont responded he had no knowledge of any such internal reorganization in the FBI.

Manpower allegedly has been taken off security and espionage work and diverted to civil rights investigations - is this correct? Mr. Belmont stated he had no knowledge of any such reassignment of personnel as indicated.

Do you, Belmont, know Al Rosen. Belmont responded that he knew Al Rosen as a personal friend and as a Bureau official of many years standing and that he had a high regard for Al Rosen.

Does Al Rosen have any experience on security matters. Mr. Belmont responded that Al Rosen had a wide experience in Bureau investigative activities, had been Assistant Director of the General Investigative Division for many years and obviously had considerable contact and experience with security work.

Do you, Belmont, know Mark ~~Felt~~. Belmont said he responded by indicating that he knew Mark Felt and he gave a little background of Felt's Bureau experience indicating that at one time he was SAC at Kansas City, was Assistant Director in charge of the Inspection Division and had been recently assigned to some other official position at the Seat of Government; however, that he, Belmont, did not know of any current changes or assignments of personnel in the FBI at the present time.

Belmont said the whole tenor of the questions seemed to be is the Bureau paying sufficient attention to security and espionage matters. Belmont said in trying to answer [redacted] questions he made it a point to state that he has been away from the FBI for more than five years, that he has no knowledge of what is transpiring at the present time, that he is not acquainted with some of the current Bureau top personnel but that he does know Sullivan and has a high regard for him and that he also wanted [redacted] to specifically and definitely understand that he has a high regard for Mr. Hoover and the Bureau and for what Mr. Hoover and the Bureau are trying to do in so far as the welfare of this country is concerned.

# Idaho Native, W. Mark Felt, 58, Holds

## No. 3 Post in FBI

### Served 2 Years in Salt Lake City

WASHINGTON — A one-time Southern Idaho farm boy now holds down the important number three position in the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

He is 58-year-old W. Mark Felt, a native of Twin Falls who is the new assistant to the director and associate deputy director of the FBI.

Mr. Felt was hand picked by Director J. Edgar Hoover for this top position in his respected law enforcement agency, succeeding C. D. Deleach who resigned last year to become a vice president of Pepsico, the parent corporation of the Pepsi Cola soft drink company.

Third place in the FBI's chain of command means more than it would in most big organizations since Mr. Hoover is 76 years old and the FBI's number two man, associate director Clyde A. Tolson, is 71 and not in good health.

#### Select Successor?

His selection has quite naturally raised the question as to whether Mr. Hoover in elevating Mr. Felt may have settled on the man he would like to have succeed him.

Concerning this, Mr. Felt said, "I hope he (Mr. Hoover) never retires. Today he is just as alert and sharp as when I first met him 29 years ago."

In an interview with The Tribune, Mr. Felt declined to assess the meaning of his appointment, but he did say he regarded the new job as a real challenge and that he was honored to have been placed "third in the line of command."

Mr. Felt is the son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Mark Earl Felt, pioneer residents of Idaho who settled in the Magic Valley area in 1908 on some of the first irrigation lands opened for development. He was born at Twin Falls and lived in the Gem State until 1935.

#### Forestry Job

He recalled that his first summer non-farm job was made possible by the late Rep. Addison T. Smith, R-Idaho. It was with the Forest Service combatting blister rust which then was seriously attacking some Idaho white pine areas.

After graduating from high school in Twin Falls and getting a bachelor of arts degree from the University of Idaho at Moscow, Mr. Felt left for the nation's capital where he joined the staff of the late Sen. James Pope, D-Idaho. He also enrolled at George Washington University's Law School. When Sen. Pope was defeated in 1938, he went to work for Sen. D. Worth Clark, D-Idaho, and was his administrative assistant until 1940 when he finished law school and joined the legal staff of

the Federal Trade Commission.

He has fond memories of those years on Capitol Hill where he remembers Sen. Clark as "a real fine gentleman" and Sen. William E. Borah as "greatly respected — a senator who looked and acted very much like a statesman."

In 1942 Mr. Felt moved to the FBI as a special agent and his first assignments were in Texas, at the Houston and San Antonio bureaus. But before the end of the year he

was shifted to Washington where he spent the next four and a half years with the bureau's espionage division. At one time his title was superintendent of counter intelligence operations.

After World War II Mr. Felt was sent to Seattle where he spent nine years as a field supervisor. He came back to the nation's capital in 1954 to join the inspection staff which he was later to head.

After assignments in New Orleans and Los Angeles, Mr.

of the state he used a chartered plane which landed on the road the bank robber was helping to build.

The Felts have two grown children. Twenty-eight year-old Joan is an associate professor at the University of California at Santa Cruz and Mark Jr., 24, is a second lieutenant in the Air Force. He is now taking flight training at Lubbock, Tex.

According to the FBI publication "The Investigator," Mr. Felt has "diligently

Felt was sent to Salt Lake City in 1956 where for the first time he became the agent in charge of a bureau. He stayed there until March of 1958. Mr. Felt told this correspondent he still regards the Utah capital as "one of the nicest, cleanest places anywhere."

One of his most unusual Utah cases was the nabbing of an Alabama bank robber whom he was tipped off was working on a highway construction job west of Blanding. To get to this remote part



# High FBI Job To Mark Felt

New York Times News Service  
 Washington — J. Edgar Hoover has appointed W. Mark Felt, the head of the internal inspection division of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, to the number three spot in the agency. Felt was in charge of the FBI office in Kansas City from 1958 to 1962.

Since Hoover is 76 years old and his second-in-command, Clyde A. Tolson, the associate director, is 71 and reported to

be ill, the appointment of Felt, 58, has prompted much discussion within the agency and has raised speculation that Hoover has settled on the man he would like to replace him.

A spokesman for the FBI confirmed Felt's appointment, made about four weeks ago, and announced in an article in its employee magazine, "The Investigator." Workmen are preparing offices for Felt across the hall from Hoover.

Felt's new title is assistant director-deputy associate director. That places him, in the FBI hierarchy, between Tolson and two assistants to the director, John E. Mohr, 61, and William

C. Sullivan, 59. Felt has been replaced in the inspection division by Joseph Ponder of the New York office.

Felt's assistant will be William B. Soyars.

Felt has been with the FBI 29 years. He was born in Twin Falls, Idaho, and was graduated from the University of Idaho in 1935. From 1938 to 1941 Felt was administrative assistant to Sen. D. Worth Clark (D-Idaho). In 1940 he received a law degree from George Washington University here, and in 1941 he went to work for the Federal Trade Commission as lawyer.

He joined the FBI in 1942 working in counterintelligence operations. He went to Kansas City in 1958 from the Salt Lake City office, and took over the inspection division in 1962.

He lives with his wife and two children in Fairfax, Va.

IN KANSAS CITY, Felt was appointed special agent in charge of the office here March 5, 1958. He was transferred four years later to FBI headquarters in Washington.

He became widely known during his stay in Kansas City through hundreds of talks on law enforcement to civic, business and professional clubs.

He returned in 1966 to direct the investigation of the death of Sam Palma, who was under a federal grand jury indictment.

The Bellboy Service offered by the Chesapeake and Potomac Telephone Company, Washington, D. C., consists of a unit carried by the subscriber which is activated and emits a tone when the telephone number assigned to the unit is dialed. The unit does not provide communications with the person placing the call; it only alerts the user as to the fact someone is trying to reach him telephonically. The unit is effective in a range up to approximately 20 miles from Washington, D. C. The person using this service would then contact his office and check as to any messages for him. The unit is used in most instances by medical doctors so that their office can contact them in the event of an emergency.

The Telephone Company has advised that requests for Bellboy Service exceed the availability of the units. Mr. Felt and Mr. Miller desire to use this service on a trial basis in order to afford them the capability of being contacted by the FBI when they are not at either their residence or their office. The Telephone Company advised it is necessary that a justification letter be submitted in order that they can assign a priority to each request. They have assured us that upon receipt of a letter from the FBI our request will receive a priority "one" and the units will be available in approximately two weeks.




