MICKEY MANTIE, New York Yankee Baseball player, was interviewed in the locker room at the Cleveland Municipal Stadium prior to the night baseball game. MANTIE stated that he received the threatening letter at the Stadium on the previous day and, after reading it, he turned it over to

that he does not have any suspects as to the sender of the letter and, as far as he can recall, he does not have any acquaintances in Tonawanda, New York. He stated that this is the first threatening letter that he has ever received and he is quite concerned about it. NANTIE stated that he has been thinking about the letter and about getting shot by some crank and, in his opinion, if he were to get shot it would be in Yankee Stadium, as some person could stand on the rooftop on one of the buildings surrounding Yankee Stadium and take a shot at him. MANTIE stated that he does receive a lot of fan mail, both laudgtory and critical, but this is the first really bad or disturbing letter which he has ever received.

On July 20, 1960, CASEY STENGEL, Manager, New York Yankees Baseball Club, was interviewed at the Cleveland Municipal Stadium by SA and SA STENGEL advised that MANTLE had advised him on the previous day of the receipt of the threatening letter. He stated that he, himself, has received a number of crank letters. In fact, he receives numerous crank letters all of the time in that the senders of these letters are complaining about how he runs the Yankees ball club. STENGEL related that he has not received any threatening letters, and he has no suspects as to the person who may have sent MANTLE the letter.

On the same date.

contacted concerning the threatening letter, which was received by MANTLE, and all of the stadium police were alerted before the beginning of the night game, and they were all cautioned to keep this investigation confidential.



MICKEY MANTLE - LIMITUM THE

Mickey Mantle, former well-known baseball player of the New York Yankees, has not been the subject of an investigation by the FBL. However, our files reveal that information received in June, 1956, indicated that Mickey Mantle was 'blackmailed' for \$15,000 after being found in a compromising situation with a married woman. Mr. Mantle subsequently denied ever having been caught in a compromising situation.

Mr. Mantle readily admitted that he had "shacked up" with many girls in New York City, but stated that he has never been caught. (139-243)

A confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised in June, 1957, that a very prominent Washington, D. C., area gambler and bookmaker arranged dates for members of the New York Yankees baseball club at a Washington, D. C., house of prostitution. Allegedly, Mr. Mantle was one of the members of the team who was entertained at this house of prostitution. (62-9-53-31, p. 34)

In February, 1962, it was alleged that an individual, described as a Dallas, Texas, playboy, night club operator and former boy friend of a notorious Dallas stripper, was purchasing the University Club, Dallas, Texas, from a former Dallas gambler. It was further noted that the University Club was a private night club, and that Mickey Mantle of the New York Yankees was one of the individuals financially backing this purchase. (62-9-12-294)

In January, 1963, a confidential source, of unknown reliability, advised that a well-known Dallas, Texas, gambler, who frequently made "heavy bets" on professional football games and other athletic contests, would make a number of telephone calls


