She then advised that instead of the St. Clair Hotel as she first thought HUMPHREY gave as his address in Chicago, that her notes disclosed that it was the Drake Hotel, telephone number SU 7-2200, extension 609.

She advised further that on June 26, 1965, apparently the El Paso office of American Airlines called the Norman, Oklahoma number of JE 4-7545 to confirm the reservation made by HUMPHREY and the flight was refused by HUMPHREY himself in Norman who answered the phone or by someone acting in his behalf. This call was made at 10:00 a.m. El Paso time.

She said the passenger apparently had his own transportation between Chicago and Norman and did not know by what means he intended to travel or if in fact he had told her. The ticket, which was issued June 24, 1965, was for \$51.85 plus \$2.59 which totaled \$54.44. According to the central reservations office of American Airlines this flight was booked at 10:54 a.m. for the above reservation on Flight 794A. HUMPHREY paid for the ticket in cash and according to she would have had more identifying data on the passenger had he paid by check.

HUMPHREY had asked specifically for the jet flight which was number 332F and only accepted Flight 794A which is a piston plane flight when she could not get him on 332F.

She also recalled asking him how far Norman, Oklahoma, is from Oklahoma City to which he replied, "not far".

felt that HUMPHREY may have returned later that day, sometime between 1 and 3:00 p.m. for the purpose of seeing if he had been confirmed on Flight 332F, knowing that no one could reach him at extension 609 at the Drake Hotel since it is a non-existent number.

VI. ROYAL BLUE SPORT JACKET WORN BY HUMPHREYS WHEN APPREHENDED

MURRAY HUMPHREYS was apprehended on June 26, 1965, at Norman, Oklahoma, by SAs and These Agents advised that they recall that HUMPHREYS was wearing a royal blue sport coat of soft material with gold colored buttons at the time of his apprehension.

It is noted that, as set out above under the caption Attempt by FBI Agents to Serve Subpoena on HUMPHREYS, June 24, 1965, SAs and observed a royal blue sport jacket draped over a chair located in the apartment of HUMPHREYS at the time when they attempted service of the subpoena on HUMPHREYS on June 24, 1965. AUSA SCHIPPERS noted that this appears significant in that HUMPHREYS testified that he did not return to his apartment following his departure therefrom on the morning of June 24, 1965, until he was returned to Chicago by United States Marshals on June 28, 1965. AUSA SCHIPPERS noted that if HUMPHREYS was wearing the royal blue sport coat observed by SAs when apprehended, this would tend to indicate that he perjured himself when he testified that he was not in his apartment upon the arrival of SAs and (with the subpoena calling for his appearance before the FGJ on June 25, 1965.

On September 30, 1965, MARY CLEMMA BRENDLE HUMPHREYS was recontacted telephonically by SA Again she refused to agree to personal contact by a representative of the FBI. However, she telephonically advised she could not recall having called her former husband for any reason immediately prior to June 24, 1965, during which time she might have told him to come to Norman in an emergency or making any call to HUMPHREYS for any such purpose or any other.

In response to a specific question, she stated she may have been in error when she previously stated HUMPHREYS called her from the Santa Fe railroad depot on June 25, 1965, and asked her to come and get him, since she recalled seeing him get off the train, which indicated she knew of his coming. She now believes, on recollection, that someone, but not HUMPHREYS, called her from Chicago the night of June 24, 1965, and told her to meet the train to pick up HUMPHREYS. She stated she cannot recall the identity of that person.





Report Records There

Humphreys reportedly has this records in a closet of the 'apartment.

The apartment is wired with burglar alarms that Humphreys reportedly often touches off by mistake, alarming other Marina City residents.

The investigation that led to Humphrey's indictment - like the crime syndicate grand jury inquiry — was conducted by 'Asst. U.S. Attorneys David Schippers and Sam J. Betar.

Schippers is the chief of an organized crime prosecution unit.

Called Before Jury

The indictment charged Humphreys with perjury in his testimony about his flight from Chicago last June to avoid a grand jury appearance.

Humphreys fled from Chicago to Norman, Okla., apparently in fear that he might suffer the fate of the syndicate boss, Momo Salvatore (Moe) Giancana.

Giancana was jailed June 1 for defying the grand jury by refusing to testify after being granted immunity.

Humphreys Pulls A Gun On FBI In Marina City Fight

arrested June 26 by the FBI in Oklahoma.

Asked About Rackets

Humphreys was called before the grand jury again on Aug. 10 for questioning about syndicate rackets and his flight from Chicago in June.

Humphreys, who prides himself on his ability to steer a course around the law, elected to talk to the grand jury on Aug. 10, rather than refuse to answer questions like Giancana.

But the indictment voted by the grand jury Tuesday charged that Humphreys lied when he testified that:

1 He did not know, when he left Chicago in June, that the grand jury had summoned him again as a witness.

2 On June 24, he was not hiding from FBI agents seeking to serve him with the grand jury subpena.

3 He was not in his Marina case — in attempting to City apartment on June 24 phon his trip to Oklahoma. after he had purchased airline tickets for the trip to Oklahoma.

The indictment showed that the government would attempt to prove that Humphreys knew the grand jury had called him, and that he hid from FBI agents and was in his apartment after buying the airline tickets.

The Latest Pafall

If Humphreys is convicted on the perjury charge, he could be sent to prison for five years and fined \$2,000.

The perjury indictment was the latest pitfall for the 66year-old Humphreys, whose reputation as a fixer has been damaged in the government's investigation of the syndicate.


The grand jury inquiry resulted in the disclosure in federal court of the transcript of Humphreys' questioning before the jury.

Haggles With Jurors
Federal prosecutors requested that secrecy be lifted on the transcript to show that Humphreys had been attempting to parry the grand jury's questions and had been haggling with the jurors.

The questions in the transcript revealed that prosecutors Schippers and Betar had interrogated Humphreys about his alleged fixing of gangster prosecutions and his meetings with syndicate bosses.

To those questions, Humphreys consistently invoked the Fifth Amendment. claiming fear of self-incrimination.

But the perjury indictment disclosed that he had given the grand jury a lecture — thus snaring himself in the perjury case — in attempting to explain his trip to Oklahoma.

Gang Deals Disclosed by Thug's Data

By Sandy Smith

CHICAGO, Nov. 25 — Records of gangland deals were found in the safe of Murray (the camel) Humphreys, the crime syndicate fixer who died Tuesday, it has been learned.

Government officials said his records contained his notations of investments up to \$60,000, income tax deals in five-figure amounts, and the payments he received on loans of more than \$50,000.

Humphreys presumably made the loans to the gang's front men to gain secret interests in legitimate enterprises, the Federal sources reported.

The records kept by Humphreys were seized Tuesday by FBI agents. They were found in Humphreys' closet safe after the agents arrested the gangster in a struggle in his 51st-floor apartment in Marina City, a luxury development on the shore of Lake Michigan.

Accused of Perjury

Humphreys died of a heart attack a few hours after his battle with the agents, who arrested him on a warrant charging perjury before a Federal grand jury.

Seized by the agents along with Humphreys' records was \$22,600.

The records were filled with names of his associates in and out of the mob, as well as those of a state legislator and a multimillionaire real estate developer and insurance executive.

Why Humphreys had the name and address of the legislator was a mystery. Government sources said the legislator was a strong backer of antigrime bills opposed by



Humphreys.
IRS Investigation

At the time of Humphreys' death, the Internal Revenue Service was investigating a \$42,000 windfall he received in a stock deal engineered by the real estate developer. Humphreys had been assessed taxes and penalties of \$78,800 on the stock deal.

In the wake of Humphreys' death, there were the following developments:

• Federal officials disclosed that the crime syndicate had selected three gangsters to take over Humphreys' interests in labor rackets, the courts and the Illinois General Assembly. Humphreys' successors were identified by the Government officials as Gus (Slim) Alex, Ralph Pierce and Les (Killer Kane) Kruse.

U.S. Attorney Edward V.
 Hanrahan said FBI agents would have been justified in shooting Humphreys Tuesday when he brandished a gun and threatened to kill the agents.

Humphreys resisted arrest by biting one agent on the hand and kicking the others, Hanrahan said.

Humphreys was warned by the agents to drop his gun," said Hanrahan. "Finally, he did so. He would have been killed but for the extraordinary tolerance and excellent judgment of the FBI agents."

 An autopsy disclosed that Humphreys died of a heart attack. Coroner Andrew Toman delayed a decision on an inquest until completion of tests for traces of poisons or barbiturates.

The Federal investigations now aimed at Alex, Pierce and Kruse were the undoing of Humphreys as the fixer for the gang.

Humphreys' advice on legal strategy was unquestioned in the mob—until he blundered in the Federal grand jury investigation that resulted in the perjury case against him.

To avoid an appearance before the grand jury, Humphreys fled from Chicago last June. The FBI arrested him 48 hours later in Oklahoma. His explanation to the jury of why he left town produced the periury indictment against

Synopsis:

HUMPHREYS continues to maintain Apartment 5131, East Tower, Marina City, 300 North State Street, Chicago, Illinois. HUMPHREYS presently in excellent physical health and while in Hot Springs, Arkansas, during October, 1965, was able to play golf for first time in twenty years. Evidence has been presented to Federal Grand Jury, Northern District of Illinois, with view towards obtaining indictment of HUMPHREYS for perjury and/or contempt of grand jury. Evidence presented consists of testimony of four FBI Agents, maid of HUMPHREYS, three employees of Santa Fe Railroad who observed HUMPHREYS leave Chicago on evening 6/24/65, associate of HUMPHREYS who purchased railroad ticket for HUMPHREYS and paramour of this associate of HUMPHREYS. Seven current associates of HUMPHREYS identified herein. Five current hangouts and meeting places of HUMPHREYS identified. HUMPHREYS traveled to Hot Springs, Arkansas, in October, 1965. HUMPHREYS extremely upset with newspaper publicity re the Grand Jury investigation of HUMPHREYS.

DETAILS: AT CHICAGO, ILLINOIS

I. PERSONAL HISTORY AND BACKGROUND

Residence

has advised that MURRAY HUMPHREYS continues to maintain his residence in apartment 5131 East Tower, Marina City, 300 North State Street, Chicago Illinois.

II. PRYSICAL HEALTH OF MURRAY HUMPHREYS

advised that he has recently been in the company of MURRAY HUMPHREYS on almost a daily basis. He advised that it is his observation that MURRAY HUMPHREYS at the present time is in excellent physical condition. This informant advised that he was able to ascertain from HUMPHREYS that while HUMPHREYS was in Hot Springs, Arkansas, during middle and late October, 1965, HUMPHREYS was able to play golf for the first time in some twenty years.

Advised that this appeared to him to be an accurate indication of the present physical condition of HUMPHREYS.

III. PRESENTATION OF EVIDENCE BEFORE FEDERAL GRAND JURY, NORTHERN DISTRICT OF ILLINOIS, IN PERJURY CASE AGAINST HUMPHREYS

On October 25, 1965, SA and and SA served a subpoena upon EDWARD C. RYAN calling for his appearance before the Federal Grand Jury, Northern District of Illinois, on October 27, 1965. For information concerning RYAN see herein below under the caption "Associates of HUMPHREYS" and the sub-caption EDWARD C. RYAN. RYAN was served as he stood in the entrance way to Plato's Place Restaurant, Dearborn and Randolph, Chicago, Illinois.

On October 25, 1965,

was served a subpoena by SA and SA
as she arrived on the 51st floor of the East Tower of Marina
City preparatory to commencing her duties as the maid of
MURRAY HUMPHREYS. This subpoena called for the appearance
of Mrs. WILLIAMS before the Federal Grand Jury, Chicago, on
October 27, 1965.

On October 25, 1965, a subpoena was served by SA and SA on Miss PEARL EDDY while she stood on the sidewalk of Oak Street between Rush and Michigan in the company of EDWARD C. RYAN. This subpoena called for the appearance of Miss EDDY before the Federal Grand Jury in Chicago on October 27, 1965.

On October 27, 1965, SA testified before the Federal Grand Jury, Northern District of Illinois, concerning the fact that HUMPHREYS was observed entering his apartment at 2:20 p.m. on June 24, 1965, by SA SA then observed the apartment of HUMPHREYS while SA went to the Federal Building in Chicago to obtain a subpoena for HUMPHREYS. SA did not observe HUMPHREYS leave his apartment until the return of SA and SA and SA and SA they listened outs: they listened outside the door of HUMPHREYS' apartment while standing in the public corridor. Both SA and SA were able to hear the voices of two individuals conversing in HUMPHREYS' apartment.

was able to recognize one of the voices as that of HUMPHREYS, it being noted that SA has conversed with HUMPHREYS on two occasions and has been in the company of HUMPHREYS during the course of physical surveillances on several occasions. As a result, SA is able to identify and SA the voice of HUMPHREYS. SA testified that upon ringing the doorbell, the door to HUMPHREYS' apartment was opened by ERNEST HUMPHREYS, the brother of MURRAY HUMPHREYS. When ERNEST HUMPHREYS advised that his brother was then not present in his apartment, in a loud voice, informed ERNEST HUMPHREYS that he had a subpoena calling for the appearance of MURRAY HUMPHREYS before the Federal Grand Jury in Chicago on the following day, June 25, 1965, at 10:00 a.m. SA also testified that they were able to fully see a blue blazer with a gold button on the sleeve drapped over a straight chair in HUMPHREYS' apartment. They also testified that they were advised by ERNEST HUMPHREYS that his brother would be in his apartment at 7:00 p.m. pursuant to an appointment which ERNEST HUMPHREYS had with his brother. SA testified that although he appeared at the apartment of HUMPHREYS shortly before 7:00 p.m. on June 24, 1965, he was unable to locate HUMPHREYS.

a porter of the Pullman Company, testified on October 27, 1965, that a person who resembled the photograph of HUMPHREYS appeared in the lounge car of the "Texas Chief" of the Santa Fe Railroad at 6:45 p.m. central daylight time on June 24, 1965, and drank a Hennessey cognac. testified that this individual was then wearing a blue blazer.

a conductor for the Pullman Company, testified on November 9, 1965, that a person very closely resembling the photograph of HUMPHREYS traveled to Norman, Oklahoma, to Chicago, on the "Texas Chief", which left Chicago at 7:00 p.m. central daylight time on June 24, 1965. testified that this individual was wearing a blue blazer and that he was met in Norman, Oklahoma, by an elder woman and by a young boy.

(H)(7)(C)

On November 12, 1965, testified before the Federal Grand Jury that a person whom he has definitely identified from photographs of HUMPHREYS as being MURRAY HUMPHREYS was a passenger in Bedroom A of Car 156 of the "Texas Chief" which left Chicago at 7:00 p.m. central daylight time on June 24, 1965.

HUMPHREYS was met in Norman, Oklahoma, by a woman.

Mrs. JOHNNIE WILLIAMS testified before the Federal Grand Jury on October 27, 1965, that she is the maid of MURRAY HUMPHREYS. She testified that on June 24, 1965, she cleaned the apartment of MURRAY HUMPHREYS and left the apartment sometime between 1:00 p.m. and 1:30 p.m. on that date. She testified that at that time no blue blazer or any other clothing was draped over a straight chair in the apartment of HUMPHREYS. Mrs. WILLIAMS also testified that on June 28, 1965, she also arrived to clean the apartment of HUMPHREYS and that at that time she did not observe a blue blazer or any other clothing draped over straight chair in HUMPHREYS' apartment.

SA testified on October 27, 1965, that he was one of the FBI Agents who arrested MURRAY L. HUMPHREYS in Norman, Oklahoma, at 1:07 p.m., on June 26, 1965, SA testified that at the time of the apprehension of HUMPHREYS, HUMPHREYS was wearing a blue blazer with gold buttons.

Assistant United States Attorneys DAVID P. SCHIPPERS and SAM BETAR advised on November 12, 1965, that the appearance of Mr. above, on that date concluded their presentation of evidence against HUMPHREYS with a view towards obtaining an indictment of HUMPHREYS for perjury and/or contempt of the grand jury. Assistant United States Attorneys SCHIPPERS and BETAR advised that they will carefully draft an indictment against HUMPHREYS for presentation to the Federal Grand Jury, Northern District of Illinois, with a view towards obtaining a true bill against HUMPHREYS.



IV. COURT ASSOCIATES OF MURRAY HUMPHREYS

GUS ALEX

advised that on the morning of October 29, 1965, he observed in Marshall Field Department Store in the Loop area of Chicago. Sobserved make telephone calls and receive a third call at a bank of public telephones located in Marshall Field. This informant advised that after completing the calls left Marshall Field and walked to the corner of Randolph and Wabash Streets in Chicago where he was met by MURRAY HUMPHREYS. advised that almost immediately a black Pontiac driven by HY GODFREY pull to the curb and both and HUMPHREYS entered this car and were driven away.

has identified as being a very close associate of MURRAY HUMPHREYS in that both are associated in the leadership of organized crime in the Chicago area.

HY GODFREY

Attention is directed to the information set out immediately above under the sub-caption. It is noted that when GODFREY picked up and HUMPHREYS at Wabash and Randolph Streets he was driving a 1965 black Pontiac Sedan bearing 1965 Illinois license 556 364. This license number is listed to the Grand Leasing Company, known to be operated and owned by

chauffeur, bodyguard, errand boy and close associate of and MURRAY HUMPHREYS. This informant has also identified as being a close associate of and HUMPHREYS and as being an automobile dealer in Chicago from whom HY GODFREY and other Chicago hoodlums obtain their cars.

LESLIE KRUSE

(A)(7)(A)

advised that he understands that when HUMPHREYS traveled to Hot Springs, Arkansas, set out hereinafter in this report under the caption "Travel", he was in the company there of his close associate, LESLIE KRUSE. This informant advised that he understands that KRUSE stayed in the Arlington Hotel while HUMPHREYS stayed in the Majestic Hotel while in Hot Springs but that they frequently got together while in Hot Springs.

has identified LESLIE KRUSE as being a very close associate of MURRAY HUMPHREYS in that both are associated in the leadership of organized crime in the Chicago area.

RALPH PIERCE

PIERCE as being the former bodyguard of MURRAY HUMPHREYS who has now become one of the top leaders of organized crime in the Chicago area with particular responsibility for the affairs of oranized crime on the south side of Chicago. These informants have advised that PIERCE and HUMPHREYS are extremely close associates and have been so for perhaps twenty years.

located in the basement of the Pittsfield Building at
55 East Washington, at approximately 12:15 PM, on
September 15, 1965, RALPH PIERCE came into the restaurant
and upon observing the agents, asked permission to join
them. He thereupon had lunch with the agents and the
following conversation took place from 12:15 PM until
approximately 2:10 PM:

PIERCE advised that he is bothered by an acute arthritic condition, inasmuch as this affliction has settled in his spine with the result that he has extreme difficulty from time to time in straightening up. He has also advised that he has trouble with his sciatica nerve. He stated that previously he has had great difficulty with his fingers, in that he suffered from an arthritic condition, but that recently his condition has alleviated itself. He advised, however, that he is attempting to purchase a paraffin machine in order to provide home treatment for this condition. PIERCE also indicated that he has had bursitis in his shoulder and upper arm, but that this condition has recently improved. PIERCE indicated that he had been able to play golf at the Oak Hills Golf Course on 130th Street, in Chicago, until the arthritic condition in his spine flared up.

PIERCE also advised that his wife, DOROTHY, is in delicate health and that her physical problems have resulted in emotional problems with the result that she takes a great deal of his care and attention.

PIERCE also advised that on the previous weekend he had been in East Philadelphia, Ohio, where his brother, who had been caring for his hunting dogs, died and was buried. PIERCE indicated that although he

has made frequent trips to East Philadelphia, Ohio, in the last ten or twenty years, he has no more relatives living there and due to his condition has disposed of his dogs with the result that he does not foresee any further travel to this area.

PIERCE advised that he continues to be upset with the fact that Chicago newspapers link him with every bookmaking establishment, bookmaker and gambler on the south side of Chicago, and in the southern suburbs. He stated that the situation has developed to such an extent that everytime he hears there has been a gambling raid on the south side of Chicago, he expects that he will be linked with it. He stated this publicity usually concerns allegations that he is the "boss" of organized crime on the south side of Chicago. PIERCE claimed, however, that there has never been any attempt on the part of "those guys" to organize gambling on the south side of Chicago, and that since there has never been such an organization, there has never been a "boss" on the south side. When he was informed that it is difficult for onw to believe that the rest of the City of Chicago and the suburbs of Chicago have been organized and the south side has been left alone by the leaders of organized crime, PIERCE remained adamant that this was the situation. PIERCE was especially vehement that he has never had anything to do with the policy or numbers racket which flourishes among the Negro people on the south side. He claims that he knows nothing whatsoever about policy. PIERCE specifically denied that he has any control over the bookmaking activities, if any, of and When questioned about his association with PIERCE advised that he has never had any association with him and only knows him due to the fact that both frequent Jenny's Restaurant on South Stony Island Avenue, in Chicago. Whenquestioned concerning any association with PIERCE denied that he has associated in any capactiy with but does know Who formerly was associated with some of the older bookmakers in Chicago.

PIERCE readily admitted association with MURRAY HUMPHREYS, LESLIE KRUSE and He denied that he is a member of any organization which includes those individuals, however, and advised that his association with these people is strictly for "social" purposes. He also denied that he is associated with those three individuals for the purpose of ploting strategy which is used whenever a member of organized crime is under prosecution, or strategy to be used in the corruption of local law enforcement officers, members of the Judiciary, other public officers, or members of the Illinois General Assembly.

PIERCE admitted that he had just left the company of KRUSE when he arrived at the Pittsfield Building.

PIERCE advised that his most frequent hangouts are the Pittsfield Building Restaurant where he has lunch several times a week, and Jenny's Restaurant on South Stony Island Avenue. PIERCE indicated that he is very friendly with the owner of Jenny's Restaurant, and had been advised by that he had been interviewed concerning his relationship with PIERCE, by SAS

PIERCE also indicated that he and his associates are upset due to the fact that the Federal Government not only sent SAM GIANCANA to jail for "something nobody has ever been sent there before for", but that "you can't leave him alone even when he is in the can", and instead continually "stir things up" by conducting investigations to determine whether some one associated with the jail is providing comforts to GIANCANA. PIERCE indicated that he considers this cruel and unusual punishment since the incarceration of GIANCANA was under proceduce which is unprecedented and that the government "can't just be satisfied with this, you have to keep everything stired up so everybody is afraid to be nice to him there".

PIERCE also launched a discussion of the "treatment" of HUMPHREYS by the Federal Government. PIERCE advised that he knows that MURRAY HUMPHREYS left the Chicago area to visit Norman, Oklahoma, strictly to care for

and thathe had no ulterior motive in mind such as evading a subpoena. PIERCE also advised that he knows HUMPHREYS has great respect for certain agents of the PBI, and that had one of these agents attempted to communicate with him before a receipt of the subpoena in order to make arrangements so that HUMPHREYS would have been available later for the service of the subpoena, "none of this would have happened". Even so, PIERCE said, the thing that upset HUMPHREYS most about the entire situation was the fact that photographers were called.

PIERCE indicated that he had recently attended the wake in henor of the death of MERTON STONE, recently deceased former owner of the Stone Bonded Distributing Company. He identified STEON as being a life long friend of MURRAY HUMPHREYS and of HUMPHREYS' close associate

When questioned concerning the source of his current income, PIERCE claimed that he has no income at this time. He stated that until recently he has reported on his income tax returns, income from wagering on sporting events. However, he claimed, possibly in jest, he now intends to file returns "no income". PIERCE indicated on several occasions that he and his associates have become increasingly provoked by the recent writings of "Chicago Sun Times" reporter SANDY SMITH. PIERCE indicated that all of his associates are concerned with the way SMITH "goes out of his way" to attempt to ridicule and "smear" these people.

On several occasions PIERCE attempted to lead the conversation into plans which the government may have

for further proceedings before the Federal Grand Jury in Chicago, however, after some time he agreed that it was "useless" to attempt this topic of conversation.

At no time did PIERCE admit that he was a member of organized crime or that there was any organization of hoodlums or criminals in the Chicago area. The closest he came to this was when he attempted to explain thathe is not the "boss" of organized crime on the south side of Chicago, inasmuch as no effort has been made by "those guys" to organize crime on the south side in differentiation from the organizational activities which have taken place in other parts of Chicago, the west side in particular. Specifically, PIERCE conceeded that FIORE "FIFI" BUCCIERI may have organized books on a "fifty-fifty" basis on the west side of Chicago, but remained steadfast that no such attempt has been made to organize bookmakers on the south side of Chicago. He refused to discuss whether and have ever organized Negro policy operators on the south side of Chicago.

PIERCE emphatically denied that he has had any association or involvement whatsoever in the situation, or in the involvement of when he bribed members of the Seattle University basketball team to "shave points". He advised that he not only has never net but that he has never met who has been identified as a bookmaker for PIERCE admitted that he knows well, but denied that he is associated with any capacity.



RAY "BOOKIE" JONES

identified RAYMOND "BOOKIE" JONES as being an old associate of MURRAY HUMPHREYS. This informant indicated that HUMPHREYS and JONES were associated during the 1940s and 1950s in the operation of racewire service to Chicago area bookmakers. This informant also advised that he is aware that JONES has met with HUMPHREYS on infrequent occasions during the past two or three years.

On October 22, 1965, SA learned that JONES was now residing with a niece named at in Westchester, Illinois. On October 22, 1965, SA ROEMER attempted to conduct an interview of JONES concerning the nature of his association with HUMPHREYS. However, this interview was terminated after approximately two minutes when it was determined that JONES is almost totally blind, cannot control his movements, apparently is suffering from a stroke and appears to be senile. He also is constently attended by a private nurse.

advised that he has observed MURRAY HUMPHREYS enter the office building at 10 North LaSalle on several occasions during October and November, 1965. This informant advised that the last occasion was on November 2, 1965. This informant speculated that HUMPHREYS has been visiting the office of Chicago Attorney whom he identified as a Chicago Attorney formerly employed by the Regional Office of the Internal Revenue Service in Chicago. This informant was unable to furnish any reasons for the visits of HUMPHREYS to the office of

advised that he has observed that it is almost the daily custom of HUMPHREYS to go from his residence in Marina City to the Office of at 77 West Washington in Chicago. This informant advised that HUMPHREYS spends less than ten or fifteen minutes in office when he and almost daily then walk to Plato's Place Restaurant located on the northwest corner of Randolph and Dearborn in Chicago.

HUMPHREYS almost daily meets at Plato's Place. He advised that it is then the custom of HUMPHREYS, and to have breakfast at place around 10:00 a.m. At approximately 10:30 a.m. returns to his office while HUMPHREYS and frequently leave Plato's Place together and go elsewhere.

Attention is directed to the information set out above under the caption "Presentation of Evidence before the Federal Grand Jury in the Perjury Case Against HUMPHREYS" wherein it is described that and were subpoensed as witnesses before the rederal Grand Jury. appeared before the Federal Grand Jury on October 27, 1965, Both and invoked the first. fourth, fifth and nineth ammendments in refusing to answer any questions other than their name and address. It is noted was identified by HUMPHREYS when HUMPHREYS testified before the Grand Jury on August 10, 1965, as being the person who purchased a railroad ticket for HUMPHREYS on the "Texas Chief" of the Santa Fe Railroad which left Chicago enroute to Norman Oklahoma at 7:00 p.m. central daylight time on June 24, 1965. 🔳 has identified as being a Chicago entertainer whose affairs are managed by and who resides with at 65 East Oak Street.



V. CURRENT HANGOUT AND MEETING PLACES OF MURRAY HUMPHREYS

Hoe Kow Restaurant 73 East Lake Street Chicago, Illinois

Restaurant at 73 East Lake Street as being one of the favorite meeting places of MURRAY HUMPHREYS and his associates in organized crime, during the period 1959 through early 1965.

advised, however, that HUMPHREYS and his associates discontinued the use of this restaurant as a meeting place when they suspicioned that their meetings there were known to law enforcement agencies in Chicago.

SA advised that he observed MURRAY HUMPHREYS enter the rear entrance of the Hoe Kow Restaurant at 73 East Lake Street at 11:35 a.m., on November 8, 1965.

Chicago Title and Trust Company 111 West Washington Chicago, Illinois

has advised, and this information has been confirmed by SA that at the present time one of the favorite practices of MURRAY HUMPHREYS is to attempt to determine whether he is under physical surveillance by law enforcement agencies and in this regard one of his most used maneuvers is to enter the Washington Street entrance of the Chicago Title and Trust Company at 111 West Washington in the Loop area of Chicago. It is noted that there are seven entrances and exits to and from this building and that a person can enter the building on Washington Street and exit on Clark, LaSalle, or Madison Streets, and vice versa. also advised that there are several public phones located in the Chicago Title and Trust Company and that it is HUMPHRYES' practice to use these phones to make telephone calls and to receive telephone calls.

Attention is directed to the information appearing in several places in this report wherein it is reported that HUMPHREYS has a breakfast meeting with Chicago Attorney and with his close associate at Plato's Place Restaurant on almost a daily basis when he is in Chicago. Source of this information is the confirmed by SA on several occasions, by personal observation.

Randolph Towers 188 West Randolph Street Chicago, Illinois

advised that MURRAY HUMPHREYS is an infrequent visitor to the Randolph Towers Office Building located at 188 West Randolph Street in Chicago. This informant advised that although several of HUMPHREYS associates in organized crime visit the offices of Chicago Attorneys BIEBER and BRODKIN in that building and also frequent Postl's Health Club The Jocated in that building, HUMPHREYS appears there only on a very infrequent basis.



VI. TRAVEL OF MURRAY HUMPHREYS

Hot Springs, Arkansas

advised that MURRAY L. HUMPHREYS checked into the Hotel Majestic in Hot Springs, Arkansas, on October 10, 1965, as L. HUMPHREYS, 200 North State, Chicago, Illinois, and indicated that he would remain there until October 26, 1965.

advised that during the course of his stay in Hot Springs, Arkansas, HUMPHREYS resided in Room 793 of the Hotel Majestic and that although that room had two king-size beds, HUMPHREYS was the only individual occupying the room. This source advised that he did not observe HUMPHREYS in the presence of any other individuals in Hot Springs and that it appeared that he spent his entire time taking thermal baths and sitting in the Hotel Majestic lobby.

at the Arlington Hotel in Hot Springs. Arkansas. on October 7, 1965, with his wife.

contact with KRUSE on a daily basis during his stay in Hot Springs and that KRUSE spent most of his time each day playing golf and taking thermal baths. However, on no occasion observed KRUSE and HUMPHREYS together.

During casual conversation with the Conversation on October 27, 1965, indicated to SA the third that HUMPHREYS had returned to Chicago after a trip on October 24, 1965.

Reaction of HUMPHREYS to Publicity Regarding the Grand Jury Investigation of Him

On November 8, 1965. EDWARD C. RYAN, above, approached SA and SA in the Marshall Field Annex Building. During the course of conversation with these agents RYAN indicated that HUMPHREYS is extremely upset with the publicity which resulted following the appearance of RYAN and Miss PEARL EDDY before the Federal Grand Jury in Chicago on October 27, 1965. RYAN indicated that HUMPHREYS is particularly upset due to the fact that the way the newspaper articles were written indicated that HUMPHREYS and Miss EDDY are romantically attached and that HUMPHREYS has provided assistance to the career of Miss EDDY.

RYAN also indicated that he and HUMPHREYS are very upset due to the fact that an article written by "Chicago Sun-Times" newspaper reporter MAX SONDERBY and SANDY SMITH indicate that RYAN is a contactman between HUMPHREYS and FRANK "BUSTER" WORTMAN. That identified WORTMAN as being the leader of organized crime in the downstate Illinois area and as a close associate of HUMPHREYS.

has also advised that MURRAY HUMPHREYS is very upset and angered over the publicity which followed the appearance of EDWARD C. RYAN and PEARL EDDY before the Federal Grand Jury in Chicago on October 27, 1965. This informant advised that HUMPHREYS considers that the articles written concerning the appearance of RYAN and EDDY was very "unfair" in that it appeared to indicate that HUMPHREYS and Miss EDDY are "having an affair with each other".

It is noted that has advised that HUMPHREYS has no romantic interest in Miss EDDY and that Miss EDDY resides with RYAN, her business manager. has indicated, however, that HUMPHREYS has been interested in the advancement of the career of Miss EDDY as a favor to his associate, RYAN. It is also noted that has advised that HUMPHREYS has been in the company of Miss EDDY and RYAN on numerous occasions in recent years and that they are well known to each other.

As an indication of the newspaper articles which appeared following the appearance of EDWARD C. RYAN and PEARL EDDY before the Federal Grand Jury in Chicago, the following are set out.

The "Chicago Sun-Times" in its Four Star Final of October 28, 1965, contained an article entitled "U.S. Jury Summons Singer in New HUMPHREYS Probe". This article written by reporters MAX SONDERBY and SANDY SMITH is quoted herein below in its entirety:

"A brunet singer was among the first witnesses subpensed Wednesday in a new federal grand jury investigation of the crime syndicate's fixer, Murray Humphreys.

"Called before the jury amid tight secrecy was the slim chanteuse, Pearl Eddy, 33, who has appeared in Chicago night clubs.

"Aides of U.S. Atty. Edward V. Hanrahan refused to discuss her role in the probe of the affairs of the white-haired, 66-year-old Humphreys.

"The new inquiry reportedly involves possibly contempt of court and conspiracy to obstruct justice.

"It was said to have stemmed from Humphrey's efforts to escape a previous investigation of syndicate rackets.

"Two other witnesses also were summoned before the grand jury. It was learned that they were:

"Edward Ryan, a former night club impresario and associate of Humphreys. Ryan was identified as a contact man between Humphreys and Frank (Buster) Wortman, the Chicago mob's overseer of rackets in Downstate Illinois.

"Miss Johnnie Williams, 60, a maid in Humphreys' apartment high in the east tower of Marina City.

"Humphreys' flight from Chicago last June touched off Wednesday's grand jury inquiry, it was reported.

"He ducked out of town June 24, after he was subpensed to testify in the grand jury investigation that caused the jailing of the crime syndicate boss, Momo Salvatore (Moe) Giancana.

"Humphreys took off in the apparent fear that he would suffer the fate of Giancana, who was sent to jail for disobeying a court order to talk to the jury. Immunity from prosecution had beengiven to Giancana by the jury.

"Federal Bureau of Investigation agents seized Humphreys in Norman, Okla., less than 24 hours after he failed to show up as a witness.

"The subpena calling Ryan before the grand jury stirred reports that the new investigation touched on Humphreys' activities as a gang fixer in the courts and at the Illinois General Assembly."

The "Chicago American" in its Three-Five Star Final of October 28, 1965, carried an article entitled "Three Subpensed in Probe of Mob Here".

"Mystery surrounds the roles of three persons, including a woman pianist-singer, who have been subpensed in a new federal grand jury probe of crime syndicate activities.

"Also clothed in secrecy is the area of illegal activity and identity of syndicate gangsters who are targets of the investigation.

"Among the three first witnesses called in the probe is Pearl Eddy, 33, who has appeared here in night clubs and hotel cases for several years.

"The two other witnesses are the pianist-singer's manager, Edward Ryan, an associate of hoodlums, and Miss Johnnie Williams, 60, who has served as a maid for several hoodlums.

"More Subpenss Planned

"Aids of United States Atty. Edward V. Hanrahan declined to say how the three were linked to the investigation. They indicated that more witnesses would be subpensed before the grand jury is convened to hear testimony.

"Speculation was made that the three have been summoned in a renewed investigation into the crime syndicate's fixer, Murray (the Camel) Humphreys.

"Ryan a former night club impresario, is an associate of Humphreys. Ryan also has been identified by investigators as a contact man between Humphreys and Frank (Buster) Wortman, the crime syndicate's boss of rackets in downstate Illinois.

"Miss Williams currently is a maid in Humphreys' apartment in the east tower of Marina City.



"Disappears in June

"Humphreys disappeared from Chicago last June after he was subpensed to appear before the grand jury that brought about the jailing of crime syndicate boss Salvatore (Nomo) Giancana, who had refused to testify.

"FBI agents seized Humphreys in Norman, Okla., less than 24 hours after he failed to appear before the jury and returned him to Chicago. He was held in \$100,000 bond, but was freed after making another jury appearance.

"One of the main witnesses before the grand jury during the Giancana investigation was Giancana's girl friend, Phyllis McGuire, member of a sisters singing team."

It is noted that photographs of Miss EDDY accompanied the above two articles.


This is to advise that Murray L. Humphreys, one of Chicago's leading racketeers, was pronounced dead in his Chicago apartment between 9 and 10 p.m. on the evening of November 23, 1965, after he had been released on bond following his arrest by Agents of the Bureau during the afternoon____ of November 23, 1965.

On November 23, 1965, a Federal Grand Jury in Chicago returned an indictment charging Humphreys with perjury during his appearance before a Federal Grand Jury this past summer. This grand jury was inquiring into Chicago's organized crime. Agents of our Chicago Office went to Humphreys' Chicago apartment on the afternoon of November 23, 1965, to arrest Humphreys. Upon arrival at the apartment, the Agents thoroughly identified themselves on four occasions and announced that they were there to arrest Humphreys on a charge of perjury. After identifying themselves, as indicated above, Humphreys refused the Agents admission to his apartment. When the Agents made an initial effort to forcibly enter, Humphreys pulled the door open and stood in the doorway with a .38 caliber revolver in his right hand pointed at the Agents. Agents continued to identify themselves and ordered Humphreys to drop the gun. Humphreys' response indicated that he intended to shoot the Agents.

As a result of facing the Agents' guns, Humphreys finally lowered his weapon and was placed under arrest. He refused to cooperate in a search of his person and bit an Agent. He was permitted to call an attorney as a result of his request. Approximately \$25,000 and two weapons were located in his apartment during a search incidental to the arrest. Humphreys was photographed and fingerprinted and delivered to the United States Marshal's Office, where Humphreys' attorney indicated arrangements

would be made for Humphreys' immediate release on bond. It is to be noted that Humphreys stated to Agents in the United States Marshal's Office that he had never been in better health and that he had recently played golf for the first time in twenty years.

Humphreys was found in his Marina City apartment in Chicago, Illinois, by his brother, Jack Humphreys, at approximately 9 p.m. on November 23, 1965. Emergency ambulance equipment responded to Jack Humphreys' call for assistance. Humphreys, however, was pronounced dead of natural causes, possibly as a result of a heart attack.

The advised that the exact cause of death is not known at this time, however, it appears that Humphreys was stricken by a heart attack.

It is noted that Humphreys was arrested earlier today in Chicago by Bureau Agents based on a warrant charging him with perjury. At the time of his arrest, Humphreys refused to admit the Agents to his apartment and after properly identifying themselves as FBI Agents, gained entrance to the apartment by forcing open the door and effecting his arrest. At the time the Agents entered the apartment, Humphreys pointed a loaded revolver at the Agents, however the gun was taken away from him without any incident. According to Chicago Office, Humphreys was to have been indicted by a Special Federal Grand Jury on 11-26-65 for assaulting a Federal officer.

Mr. Wick and Assistant Director Gale were advised of the above.

His body was found on the living room floor of his Marina City apartment where earli-

er in the day he had brandished a gun at the G-men who arrested him on a perjury charge.

Humphrey's brother, Ernest, a gambling boss who uses the name of Jack Wright, found the body at 8:50 p.m.

Called Heart Attack

That was about four hours after Humphreys went free pn bail he posted at the U.S. Courthouse in the perjury case.

The death of Humphreys, the fixer for the Cosa Nostra crime syndicate, was attributed to a heart attack by Dr. Robert L. Robins.

The physician, who lives in Marina City, was called to the apartment by a fire department inhalator squad that worked over Humphreys for 25 minutes but was unable to revive him.

The inhalator squad had been summoned to the apartment by Ernest Humphreys, police said.

Police Lt. James Murphy said there was no evidence that Humphreys had been slain. Firemen reported that Humphreys had sprawled over a cocktail table and struck his head on a cabinet.

A vacuum cleaner was near Humphreys' body. His brother wold police that the hoodlum liked to vacuum his rug and probably was doing that when he was felled by the heart attack.

Dr. Robins said he had known Humphreys "as a neighbor for about a year. He had discussed with me that he had trouble with his heart."

The doctor said when he arrived in Humphreys' apert-

ment, "I examined him and he was obviously dead."

When Humphreys fell, he hit his head "on a piece of furniture and received a small laceration just below his right ear." The laceration "I'm sure had no effect" on his death, said the doctor.

He said the battle with F3I agents earlier in the day might have been "a factor in the precipitation of the heart attack."

The death was, "to me, obviously a coronary thrombosis—a heart attack. There was no reason to suspect any foul play," said the doctor.

A few hours before his death, The Sun-Times learned, Humphreys told government officials who approved his bond:

life. I was down in Hot Springs (Ark.) a few days ago, playing golf. It was the first time in the last 20 years that I was able to do that."

The arrest of Humphreys came after a guns-drawn show-down with Federal Bureau of Investigation agents in his 51s-floor apartment in the east ower of Marina City.

For almost a minute, after the agents crashed through the door of Humphreys' apartment with a warrant for his arrest, the gangster and the agents faced eash other with revolvers in their hands.

"Don't come in here or I'll kill you."

Finally; Humphreys lowered

his .38-caliber revolver and the agents wrested it from him.

Then he said:

"If you guys had been coppers, I would have killed you."

Bites Agent On Hand

Seconds later, angered by a search of his apartment, Humphreys attacked one of the agents and bit him on the hand.

Humphreys then attempted to get another .38-caliber revolver he had in a desk drawer.

In a brief struggle, the agents subdued and handcuffed him. He was arrested on a charge of perjury before a federal grand jury investigating the crime syndicate.

Agents found \$25,000 in search of Humphreys' apart-

The money had been put in closet safe by Humphrey, he mob's master fixer.

At the orders of federal prosecutors, the FBI agents seized the money, which was in \$20 and \$50 denominations.

Humphreys was charged with perjury in an indictment voted secretly Tuesday by a federal grand jury. The indictment was suppressed in U.S. District Court and a warrant was issued for the arrest of Humphreys.

Armed with the warrant, FBI agents went to Humphreys' apartment to arrest

him.

The agents knocked at the apartment door, but the gangster refused to open it, even after the agents identified themselves and told him they had a warrant for his arrest.

When Humphreys persisted in his refusal to let them in, the agents broke through the door to find Humphreys waving a gun at them.

Humphreys was believed to have put up a fight in an effort to forestall a search of his apartment, which is wired with burglar alarms.

It was reported that Humphreys often set off the llarms by mistake, sometimes

lousing other Marina City residents from their sleep.

The investigation that led to Humphreys' perjury indictment was conducted by Asst. U.S. Attorneys David Schippers and Sam J. Betar.

Schippers is chief of the orglinized crime prosecutions whit investigating the crime syndicate.

Humphreys had out-foxed himself.

-He fled from Chicago last June to avoid a grand jury subpena and was arrested in Oklahoma by the FBI.

Explaining that flight to a grand jury later, Humphreys involved himself in the perjury case.

Both of Humphreys' 38caliber revolvers were seized by FBI agents.

Humphreys was locked hip for more than two hours before he went free in \$4,500 bond on the perjury charge.

The swift arrest of Humphreys caught his lawyers and his bailbondsmen by surprise. No bondsman was available to put up his bail. His lawyers said they borrowed the bond fee of \$450—10 per cent of the bond—from a Loop restraurateur.

Humphreys was accused of perjury in his testimony about his flight from Chicago last une to avoid an appearance before the grand jury probing the crime syndicate.

Humphreys fled from Chicago to Norman, Okla., apparently in fear that he might suffer the fate of the syndicate boss, Momo Salvatore (Moe) Giancana.

Giancana was jailed June 1 for defying the grand jury by refusing to testify after being granted immunity.

On June 23, Humphreys was summoned to appear before the grand Jury. He was arrested June 26 by the FBJ in Oklahoma.

Asked About Rackets

Humphreys was called before the grand jury again on Aug. 10 for questioning about syndicate rackets and his flight from Chicago in June.

The indictment voted by the grand jury Tuesday charged that Humphreys lied when he testified that:

1 He did not know, when he left Chicago in June, that the grand jury had summoned him again as a witness.

2 On June 24, he was not hiding from FBI agents seeking to serve him with the grand fary subpena.

He was not in his Marina City apartment on June 24 after he had purchased airline cickets for the trip to Oklahoma.

The indictment showed that the government would attempt to prove that Humphreys knew the grand jury had called him, and that he hid from FBI agents and was in his apartment after buying the airline tickets.

Even before he threatened FBI agents with a gun, the disclosures in the federal investigation virtually had destroyed Humphrey's reputation as an adroit fixer.


At one point, federal attorneys obtained court permission be disclose Hurphreys' grand jury testimony to show that he had been haggling with the jurors.

A transcript of his grand jury interrogation revealed that the FBI, along with prosecutors Schippers an I Betar, knew all about some of Humphreys' fixing schemes.

The Fifth Amendment

To questions about fixing and his meetings with syndicate bosses, Humphreys consistently invoked the Fifth Amendment, claiming fear of self-incrimination.

But the perjury indictment disclosed that he had lectured the grand jury at length—thus sparing himself in the perjury clase—in attempting to explain his trip to Oklahoma.

Camel's Soft Life Plagued by 'Feds'

BY JERRY ACKERMAN

ALIVE, MURRAY [THE CAMEL] Humphreys traveled first class. This was expected of the man who inherited control of the crime syndicate from Al Capone.

In death, he rode the 51 floors from his Marina City apartment for the last time on a cot in an elevator, and was carried feet first out a back door.

Humphreys, 66, carried with him into death a master mind loaded with every detail on the workings of organized crime that anyone would want to know. He was the statesman, the diplomat, the political fixer, the "brains" of the mob here.

Humphreys was a corporate kind of mobster. He hadn't as much action in years as he did yesterday when Federal Bureau of Investigation agents confronted him with a warrant for his arrest on perjury charges. Perhaps the excitement was too much for him.

His life in recent years had been comfortable. With the skyscraper apartment for his office and a \$250,000 Key Biscayne, Fla. mansion for a retreat, Humphreys traveled a circuit that included Miami, New York City, Washington, Chicago, Hot Springs, Ark., and Las Vegas, Nev.

AS THE SYNDICATE'S roving ambassador of intelligence his mission was to call the shots, pay off the right people, say the right words when they counted, and plan strategy.

Monuments to his success include:

The title of Public Enemy No. 1, awarded him in 1933 after Capone turned over the syndicate's reins to Humphreys upon being imprisoned for income tax evasion. Richard B. Ogilvie, Cook county sheriff, tagged Humphreys as "the ambassador of the Chicago syndicate" and "the real brains of the outfit."

Red-carpet treatment by his contemporaries whereverhe went, from notorious restaurant hangouts here to congressional corridors in Washington, where he often was seen talking with a Chicago representative.

A contempt citation by the entire United States Senate, in 1952, for his refusal to answer questions in a rackets subcommittee investigation.


HUMPHREYS WAS BORN in a modest neighborhood on the near north side of Welsh parents—his given name was Llewelyn Morris Humphreys—and attended Haven Elementary school ,tho he did not finish.

Humphreys had his first entries in police records at 15, for burglary and petty larceny. He went on to muscle into the laundry, dry cleaning, and dairy businesses.

In 1929, he was arrested for a \$66,000 holdup of an Astorstreet doctor and his wife, and later he was captured in a gun battle as he ran from the home of a union leader who had just been robbed.

On election night, Nov. 4, 1930, he was among more than a dozen Capone lieutenants questioned and locked up after police broke into a victory party for Roland V. Liberati, then just elected a state representative, and found 10 pistols atop a piane Libonati was released without charge.

Humphreys was sentenced to prison only ones, when ne failed to report on his income tax return the \$50,000 he collected for kidnaping Robert G. Fitchie, president of the milk wagon drivers' union. He pleaded guilty and in 1934 was sent to Leavenworth penitentiary for 18 months.

Before going, Humphreys told reporters: "While I'm down there, I intend to study English and maybe a little geometry." Whether he took mathematics courses is unknown, but his English was impeccable, especially noticable in an underworld filled with lingual misfits.

both the knowledge and respect to take over as the syndicate's fixer. With scores of contacts among politicians, labor leaders, and business men, Humphreys knew whom to see to get things done.

His style of living was ever on the upgrade. He liked camel's-hair coats, but theories that this was how he got his nickname were debunked by insiders who said it evolved from his name—Humphreys, to "Hump," to "Camel."

He knew how to take care of himself and his friends. He was credited in federal court testimony with getting lony Act and his \$65,000-a-year beer salesman's job.

As control of the syndicate was quietly transferred to Momo Salvatore [Sam] Giancana, Humphreys came to relish his life as senior adviser. Neighbors around his Florida estate knew him and his second wife as "Mr. and Mrs. Louis Humphreys" and said they contributed heavily to charity.

It was, in part, the adviser role that tripped him up, and led to the confrontation that preceded his death by a matter of hours.

Humphreys' vast store of criminal knowledge was needed by a federal grand jury investigating the syndicate here. Last June 25, when the jurors wanted Humphreys to talk to them, he suddenly made a trip to Oklahoma.

WHEN HE TRIED later to explain to the jury why he didn't keep his appointment, government prosecutors decided he was lying and pressed for the perjury charges contained in the warrants he was served yesterday.

Describing later how the federal agents searched him and his apartment during the arrest, Humphreys said:

"They got everything they could get their hands on."

The only thing they couldn't get was his treasure of syndicate secrets. Death enforced the cardinal tenet of the mob's code—silence.



Except for That Garage Affair, More Might Mourn Humphreys

By GENE MILLER Herald Staff Writer

The Gentleman Farmer of Key Biscayne is dead and if Scarface Al Capone's boys hadn't lined up seven gangsters against a garage wall for what the world remembers as the St. Valentine's Day Massacre, a few more mourners might weep today.

For Murray (The Camel) Humphreys is gone, presumably to that great Mafia in the sky. Or elsewhere.

When he cultivated his garden and carefully pruned the rose bushes at his \$200,000 home at 210 Harbor Dr., before his divorced spouse took it as part of the settlement, Murray never looked the part of a Capone torpedo.

Yet he once was identified as one of the gunmen that cold February day in Chicago in the long ago of 1929.

A detective chief called him into his office.

"Get out of town. Your day is over and you had better recognize it."

At that moment Llewelyn Morris Humphreys, whose pals called him "Hump," a nickname which naturally evolved into the "Camel," had the distinction and title of Chicago's "Public Enemy No. 1."

There is no evidence Humphreys ever took the advice of the detective chief. To the contrary, there is great evidence the chief's judgment was premature.

Not until Tuesday, 32 years after the confrontation, did Humphrey's "day" come.

He died of a heart attack, seven hours after federal agents crashed down the door of his 51st floor Marina City apartment and encountered Humphreys pointing a loaded pistol at them.

"For Christ's sake, you know we've FBI agents," one man pleaded. "Put down the gun." Murray complied.

He was 66 years old and he first landed in jail nearly 50 years ago as a common thief.

He traced his mob lineage back to the old Al Capone gang, and as a grade school drop-out, he made his mark in the underworld by virtue of his quick wit and cool toughness.

Oddly, he spoke good English rather than the "dese, dem and doze" jargon of his colleagues.

Like the best of them, he served time only for theft and income tax evasion. He was considered a slick diplomat and oft times he rendered his services as a mediator between rival gangs.

He was far from retired, a myth he wished to perpetuate as "Mister Lew Hart," the shy Key Biscayne man who paid all his bills in cash and on time.

His share of mob income was calculated to be upwards of \$100,000 a year.

In the year's that followed his 14½ months in Leavenworth Penitentiary for income tax evasion in the mid 30s, Humphreys was accused of masterminding a \$2 million extortion racket from the motion picture industry.

Then there was court testimony that he had put his pal Anthony Accardo on the payroll of a beer company as a \$65,000 a year salesman.

His trips to Miami were more frequent perhaps than the local police cared to admit — or knew.

He could generally be counted on to deliver the "annual stipend" to Al Capone's widow here. When here, he avoided nearly all his hoodlum friends. He remained aloof.

And it was with considerable embarrassment he crossed a yellow traffic line in September, 1964, and had to subject his car to a sheriff search.

The police found a beer can opener, a dance favor and a broken trouser suspender

His last chapter came with the G-men Tuesday. The silver-haired Humphreys apparently saw himself heading for jail in the same fashi on as Sam (Moe) Giancana.

Giancana appeared before a federal grand jury and refused to testify about the

syndicate even though grant ed immunity.

A federal judge jailed him June 1 "for the duration of the grand jury — or until he chooses to answer." Moe, the reputed syndicate boss, is still behind bars.

Humphreys tried to dodge a grand jury for a while. But eventually, after being ar-



rested in Oklahoma, he testified. Carefully, he relief upon the Fifth Amendment.



Federal Grand Jury, Northern District of Illinois, returned indictment of HUMPHREYS for 3 counts of perjury 11/23/65. On basis of bench warrant issued same date, HUMPHREYS arrested in his residence at 2:37 p.m. HUMPHREYS refused to admit arresting agents to his apartment after they identified themselves and announced purpose. When agents effected forcible entry, HUMPHREYS confronted them with gun. After being disarmed, HUMPHREYS then attempted to prevent search of apartment. HUMPHREYS then admitted to bail. He died of heart attack later same evening in his apartment.



DETAILS: AT CHICAGO, ILLINOIS

On November 23, 1965, the Federal Grand Jury, Northern District of Illinois, returned an indictment of MURRAY L. HUMPHREYS charging that he committed perjury on August 10, 1965, before the Federal Grand Jury when he claimed not to know he was wanted before the Federal Grand Jury when he left Chicago on June 24, 1965; that he hid from FBI Agents on that date and that he did not return to his apartment on June 24, 1965, after he purchased an airline ticket.

Based on this indictment, a bench warrant calling for the arrest of HUMPHREYS was issued by the United States District Court at 2:30 p.m., on November 23, 1965.

MARSHALL E. RUTLAND and approached Apartment 5131, Marina Towers East, 300 North State Street, and rang the door bell to that apartment. After waiting approximately thirty seconds, SA announced, in a loud clear voice, that they were Agents of the FBI and that Mr. HUMPHREYS should open the door as there was a bench warrant outstanding for his arrest. This was immediately repeated on two additional occasions by while he knocked loudly on the apartment door. SA also announced in a loud and clear voice that if HUMPHREYS did not open the door the Agents would force entry. Following this, SA again knocked on the door and stated his identity as an Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

Since no answer was heard from the interior of HUMPHREYS' apartment, SA kicked the door without effecting entry. At this time SA noted a shadow pass across the "peep hole" located in the upper center of the door. SAS and RUTLAND then attempted to brook and RUTLAND then attempted to break the door in with their shoulders. SA RUTLAND then stated, "Mr. HUMPHREYS, this is the FBI. There is a warrant outstanding for your arrest. Open the door or we'll have to force our way in". Hearing no response, SA RUTLAND then kicked the door on two occasions. On the second kick, the door to HUMPHREYS' apartment gave, at the latch side, about 3/8 ths of one inch. It appeared that the next blow against the door would break it open. At that instant the door was flung open from the inside, and HUMPHREYS was observed standing in the doorway with a revolver in his right hand, pointed at the Agents.

SA RUTLAND shouted, "Look out, he's got a gun".

Agents instantly took appropriate cover, with SA
taking a position at the right edge of the door, SA
at the left edge of the door, and SA RUTLAND moving rapidly
to his left out of the line of fire. All Agents instantly
drew their weapons shouting their identity and ordering
HUMPHREYS to drop his gun. The Agents then shouted to
HUMPHREYS that they were coming in the door. SAS

and RUTLAND heard HUMPHREYS say, "Come in the door and I'll shoot". The Agents again stated they were coming through the door and for HUMPHREYS to drop the gun. SA RUTLAND shouted to HUMPHREYS. "You know me MURRAY, RUTLAND, FBI, now drop it". SA then pushed the door open, at which time all of the Agents could see that HUMPHREYS still had the gun in his hand. HUMPHREYS held the gun in a lowered position and as the Agents rushed through the door, HUMPHREYS dropped the gun to the floor. As the Agents entered the apartment, HUMPHREYS moved instantly toward a closet door on his right and was observed by SA RUTLAND to lock this closet door. HUMPHREYS was placed under physical arrest and taken to the living room of the apartment, where a preliminary search was made for weapons. At this time SAs RUTLAND and advised HUMPHREYS that he was under arrest on a charge of perjury and that he need make no statement. He was told by these Agents that he could have an attorney and that any statement he might make could be used against him in a court of law. At this time, HUMPHREYS interrupted the Agents and said that he wanted to call his attorney, MAURY WALSH. At the same time HUMPHREYS refused to surrender the contents of his pockets with the exception of some U. S. currency, which he threw on a table in the living room in the amount of \$2,530.85.

HUMPHREYS was asked if he had any other guns in the apartment. He said that he had three guns in all, one in the end table next to the sofa and one in the hall closet. He again refused to surrender the contents of his pockets. At that time he was allowed to make a phone call in which he asked to speak to Mr. WALSH. He then said, "Who's around?". Then he spoke to someone he called GEORGE. Following the conversation between HUMPHREYS and GEORGE, SA RUTLAND took the phone and spoke to a man identified by HUMPHREYS as attorney GEORGE CALLAGHAN. SA RUTLAND advised this individual that HUMPHREYS was under arrest on a charge of perjury and that the arresting Agents were in the process of making a search incidental to arrest. SA RUTLAND advised that HUMPHREYS had refused to allow the arresting Agents to search his person. SA RUTLAND suggested that Mr. CALLAGHAN advise his client, HUMPHREYS, to comply with this search in order to avoid the necessity of the use of force to effect this search. During this call, SA arrived at the apartment.

Upon completion of this call, HUMPHREYS again refused to submit to a search of his person and necessary force was used to effect the search. No additional weapons were located as the result of the search of HUMPHREYS' person, but he again indicated that he had three guns in the apartment. The second gun was located in the end table just west of the sofa by SA and HUMPHREYS said that the third gun was in the locked closet. A large ring of ten to fifteen keys was located in HUMPHREYS' hand, which he violently attempted to retain. HUMPHREYS said, "You'll have to kill me to get these keys".

During the course of the search, it was determined by SAs RUTLAND and that one of these keys opened the locked closet and another key opened a metal safe in this locked closet. SA RUTLAND observed a quantity of U. S. currency on the shelf of the left side of the closet. On the same shelf were 17 pieces of paper which bore written notations.

At 3:05 PM attorney GEORGE CALLAGHAN arrived at the HUMPHREYS' apartment and was permitted to speak to HUMPHREYS. HUMPHREYS directed CALLAGHAN to watch over the search of the closet. CALLAGHAN, upon entry to the apartment, was advised by SA that HUMPHREYS had been arrested on a bench warrant, charging him with perjury. After conferring with HUMPHREYS, CALLAGHAN inquired of SA whether this arrest had been made on a suppressed warrant. SA advised that he did not know.

and RUTLAND continued to search the closet and opened the safe with one of the keys found on HUMPHREYS' person. When the safe was opened, these Agents observed a large quantity of U. S. currency. SA RUTLAND immediately contacted Assistant United States Attorney DAVID P. SCHIPPERS by telephone and was advised to confiscate these and all other large quantities of money which might be located. The safe was searched by SAs RUTLAND and in the presence of attorney CALLAGHAN. SA took the large quantity of cash to the front room, where SA counted the money in the presence of HUMPHREYS. HUMPHREYS stated that this money was to pay his taxes and added that the bundle contained \$20,000.00. The count by SA verified that this figure was correct.

SA found two plain envelopes in the lock box, each of which contained \$1,000.00. In addition, he found a wallet containing. \$321.00.

At 3:35 PM an inventory receipt for the property seized was furnished to HUMPHREYS.

At 3:46 PM, HUMPHREYS was allowed to lock his apartment doors before being transported to the Chicago Office.

Prior to leaving the apartment, HUMPHREYS stated, "The fight is just started and I'm sure glad you weren't the cops because I would probably have shot you."

En route to the office in a Bureau car, HUMPHREYS stated, "You want me to wait to start my fight in court but you admire me for starting it right now". HUMPHREYS also stated that he had been seated at the table wrapping Christmas gifts when "I heard someone at the door". He said that he heard the knocking at the door and also said he heard the kicks on the door. RUTLAND commented that he tried to break the door down with his shoulder and HUMPHREYS said that he noticed this different sound and at that time went and got his gun. He denied having heard the Agents announcing their identity or the fact that a warrant existed calling for his arrest. He said to SA on arrival at the Chicago Office at 3:55 PM, "You guys are framing me, I've covered my tracks. It would take HOUDINI to catch me."

HUMPHREYS was fingerprinted and photographed at the Chicago Office between 3:55 PM and 4:20 PM, at which time he was taken to the United States Marshal by SAs

During the course of the search, SA found and seized the following revolvers:

(1) The Smith & Wesson .38 caliber snubnose revolver, Serial Number 371177, which was dropped by HUMPHREYS just inside the apartment door.

Being submitted under separate cover by registered mail are two .38 Special Smith and Wesson revolvers, which are further described below.

These revolvers were seized during the course of the arrest of HUMPHREYS, a Chicago top hoodlum, on November 23, 1965. When Bureau Agents attempted to place subject under arrest, HUMPHREYS confronted them with a loaded .38 Special, Five-Shot revolver, Smith and Wesson Model number, 36, serial number, 371177. Faced with the drawn guns of the three arresting Agents, HUMPHREYS dropped the above described revolver to the floor and surrendered.

During the course of a search of HUMPHREYS' apartment, incidental to the above arrest, a Smith and Wesson 338 Special, Five-Shot, model number, 49, serial number, 22797, was found in an end table drawer in subject's living room. This gun was also fully loaded.

It is requested that the serial numbers of both snub-nose revolvers be checked in the National Stolen Property File.

The FBI Laboratory is requested to conduct a ballistics examination of both revolvers in order to have this information on file at the Laboratory.


