Information furnished by EDWARD W.S. HULL, Associate Editor, "Missiles and Rockets" magazine, American Aviation Publications, Inc., 1001 Vermont Avenue, N.W., regarding the subject was volunteered by HULL during the course of an interview with SA THOMAS W. LEAVITT. An interview was being held with HULL concerning [redacted]

[redacted] Prior to furnishing the information regarding the subject, HULL related that he realized that FBI records were confidential but inquired if he could be advised if the FBI had any information regarding CARR. HULL was advised that inasmuch as he is aware that FBI records are confidential that he must realize that the contents of FBI files could not be divulged to him under any circumstances.

A pretext call to Station WTTG, Washington, D.C., on 2/28/58, by SA LEAVITT reflected that KENYON L. EDWARDS was an employee of that station.

WFO indices indicate that EDWARDS may be identical to KENYON LEIGH EDWARDS, Bufile 123-11005. Information concerning HULL is contained in [redacted] in WFO report dated 3/16/54, in case entitled [redacted]

Information contained in enclosed letterhead memo is being furnished the Bureau inasmuch as they may desire to disseminate the information contained therein to the Department of Defense.

The Baltimore Office is being furnished a copy for their information inasmuch as the subject ~~apparently resides~~ within the Baltimore Division.

The Baltimore Office is requested to search its indices regarding subject and furnish ~~any information~~ obtained to the Bureau.

On February 28, 1958, Mr. Edward W.S. Hull, Associate Editor, "Missiles and Rockets" magazine, American Aviation Publications, Incorporated, 1001 Vermont Avenue, N.W., furnished the following information to a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) regarding OTIS T. Carr and OTC Enterprises, Incorporated, Baltimore, Maryland:

BALTIMORE MD

Hull advised that the above company has reportedly developed a device which is capable of "picking up and utilizing free space energy", such as light. Hull stated that such a development would be of tremendous importance in the field of rocket development inasmuch as it would solve the fuel problem for rockets. He advised that with such a development as that created by Carr a rocket could derive its energy from the space surrounding it as it proceeded on its flight.

KENYON L. EDWARDS

Hull stated that information concerning Carr's development had been furnished him by one Ken Edwards, a news commentator with Station WTTG, Washington, D.C., who had reportedly obtained this information from a third party unknown to Hull.

He further advised that Edwards had informed him that Carr had recently attempted to run a full page advertisement in the "Baltimore Sun", the details of which were unknown to Hull, but he assumed that it was concerning his, Carr's, development. Edwards reportedly informed Hull that this advertisement was refused by the "Baltimore Sun". He advised that according to Edwards, Carr's device has been tested and found workable by "Electromactions, Incorporated", a Los Angeles, California, concern.

Information in relet indicates the "free energy mechanism" and "gravity motor" being developed or promoted by OTC Enterprises are without scientific value. However, the promoters of this company have apparently made it sound sufficiently plausible to attract the attention of an associate editor of "Missiles and Rockets" magazine and also of at least one potential investor. It is possible, therefore, that it might also attract the interest of the Soviets and that it might be used as build-up material in one of your double agent operations. In the event you think this situation might be used to advantage in any way, you should so advise the Bureau under appropriate caption making reference to this letter.

Copies of the letterhead memoranda submitted by you and the Baltimore Office have been disseminated to ONI, OSI and ACSI. Information concerning stock sales by captioned company has not been disseminated to SEC since there has been no allegation that such sales have been in violation of any Federal securities regulations. In the event such information concerning possible violations is received, you should be alert to the interests of SEC.

NOTE: Information concerning the subject organization, located in Baltimore, and its alleged inventions was furnished to the Washington Field Office by Edward W. S. Hall, associate editor of "Missiles and Rockets." Baltimore is in receipt of previous information about this outfit from a girl who was considering employment with the subject company. The Bunco Squad, Baltimore Police Department, has advised Carr and an associate are interested in a perpetual motion device. Carr was formerly a hotel manager. He is associated with Norman Evans Colton who was dismissed from employment at Aberdeen Proving Grounds for poor credit rating and alleged falsification of records; he has been the subject of an impersonation investigation by the Bureau resulting from the cashing of bad checks and also of a Fraud Against the Government investigation based on alleged influence he had used in the awarding of Government contracts and also from an alleged fraudulent expense vouchers submitted by him while he was employed by the Army. Prosecution in both cases was declined.

Enclosed herewith for the Bureau are five copies of a letterhead memorandum, captioned as above, one copy of which is enclosed for the Washington Field Office for information purposes.

In addition to the information set out in the letterhead memorandum, Baltimore Indices reflect that one NORMAN EVANS COLTON was the subject of a Baltimore FAG - IMPERSONATION investigation (BA file 47-1727) and a Baltimore FAG - ~~IMPERSONATION~~ investigation (BA file 46-800) (BU file 46-19591).

In connection with the Impersonation violation, NORMAN EVANS COLTON, was., Norman Eli Cohen, Norman Cohen, who may be identical with CARR's associate, cashed a \$50.00, insufficient funds, true name check dated 9/21/53 at the May Company in Baltimore, Maryland, and a similar \$30.00 check at the Hotel Tudor, New York City, on 9/11/53. In both instances, checks were drawn on the First National Bank of Aberdeen, Maryland, and COLTON used a War Department Pass, which had been issued to him when he was employed as a GS-14, at Aberdeen Proving Ground, Aberdeen, Maryland, as identification when cashing the checks.

COLTON had been dismissed from the Aberdeen Proving Ground on 7/22/53, for reasons including poor credit rating and alleged falsification of records. COLTON, at one time, also published a small newspaper, the first issue of which was devoted mainly to vitriolic attacks against military authorities in general, the Army in particular.

In connection with the above, the Bureau, by letter dated 5/7/54 to MR. GEORGE J. GOULD, Director, Security Division, Office of the Secretary of Defense, The Pentagon, Washington, D.C., advised that a review of an issue of the newspaper, "The United States Citizen", published by COLTON and which had been furnished the Bureau by the Pentagon, was not believed to contain information indicative of a violation of Federal criminal statutes within the primary investigative jurisdiction of the Bureau.

The Defense Department was also advised at the time, that prosecution of COLTON for the alleged Fraud Against the Government violation (Personal History Statement reflected certain false information) and for the alleged impersonation violation involving the checks cashed in Baltimore and New York City was declined. Prosecution was declined in Baltimore, in view of contemplated local police action and at New York City, due to lack of evidence that COLTON, at the time he cashed the check in New York City, had actually represented himself as a Government employee.

In connection with the Fraud Against the Government violation (BU file 46-19591), the Bureau, by memo dated 5/7/54, to Assistant Attorney General WARREN OLNEY, III, advised that COLTON, who in April and May of 1953, while an employee of the Department of the Army, engaged in editing "PS" Magazine for Preventive Maintenance Division, Office of Chief of Ordnance, Aberdeen Proving Ground, Maryland, allegedly had used influence in the awarding of contract number 30-069-ORD-908, on June 30, 1952, to the highest bidder, Will Eisner Productions, New York City, predecessor of a company with which COLTON was previously connected. This investigation also concerned alleged fraudulent expense vouchers submitted by COLTON during the time he was employed by the Department of the Army.

Prosecution in this matter was declined by the United States Attorney at Baltimore on 5/14/53, inasmuch as the awarding of the contract to Will Eisner Productions was the decision of Brigadier General J. H. HINRICHS, who said he was not influenced by COLTON.

Additional investigation was conducted in this matter when an anonymous letter directed to the Director, Bureau of the Budget, a copy of which was received at the Bureau in December, 1956, alleging that COLTON had used influence in obtaining

a contract for WILL and JULIAN EISNER, for the printing of the "PS" Magazine. The anonymous letter pointed out that certain individuals, who were not interviewed during the course of the investigation in 1953, would have knowledge that "graft" and "forgery" were used to obtain the contract for the printing of the "PS" Magazine. Upon completion of investigation in this matter, the facts of the case were again discussed with an Assistant United States Attorney in Baltimore, and prosecution was declined. RUC .

On October 18, 1957, Miss FLORA LURIA, [redacted] telephoned [redacted] the Baltimore Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation and furnished the following information:

OTIS T. CARR, who is white, male, in his 50's, operates OTC Enterprises, Inc., at 2502 North Calvert Street, Baltimore, Maryland. NORMAN EVANS COLTON, white, male, in his 40's, is Director of Sales Engineering for OTC Enterprises, Inc. Miss LURIA had made application for employment by OTC Enterprises, Inc., and she stated she questioned whether OTC Enterprises is a legitimate concern. She had met both CARR and COLTON; however, she dealt primarily with COLTON.

COLTON and CARR told her that CARR is engaged in the development of "Free Energy Mechanism" and a "Gravity Motor". She described COLTON as being very impressive individual and stated he had recently obtained a very elaborate and attractive brochure concerning OTC Enterprises. It was not clear to Miss LURIA as to what her employment would be with the company; however, she received the impression that her duties would involve general office work and the office handling of stock sales. She said that OTC Enterprises was attempting to sell stock, and she was asked by COLTON to solicit her friends to invest in the company.

Miss LURIA's brother had become quite fascinated with the enterprise and was apparently willing to invest what little money he had in the enterprise. She stated that CARR had told her that if he had had the backing, he could have sent the Satellite into outer space two years ago. He claimed that he was furnishing the government with the information concerning his inventions, that if the government was not interested in the inventions, he intended to arrange to have them developed through private industry. Miss LURIA said she was attempting to determine the legitimacy of the concern before accepting any employment.

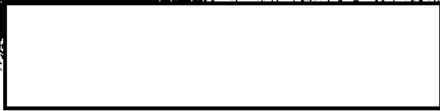

Dear Mr. Tucker:

We have just reviewed your very interesting letter of June 21. We have been extremely busy here, so we have not had an opportunity until now to really get down to the specifics in your letter. We were interested to know that it was a relative of yours who produced the Tucker car, and we felt at the time that he probably had a correct idea which, unfortunately for him and the public, was somewhat ahead of its time. We wonder if he is still planning to market his product. It would seem that there might be opportunity to do so in this new Space Age.

It is quite true that there will be many, many free-energy devices produced by individuals and organizations during coming years, and although the competition promises to be lively, still there will doubtless be opportunities for all as soon as the pioneering days are over. It is always the pioneers who have a rugged road to carve out as they go, but the challenge is a stimulating one.

Mr. Carr, accompanied by Major Wayne Aho, (ret.) are now on a national lecture tour. They will speak at the spacecraft convention at Pleasanton, California on August 23-24, and will then carry their story to dozens of other lecture audiences, not only in the spacecraft field of thought, but among business groups throughout the nation. We feel it is important at this time to permit the public to know what is available to keep them informed. An informed public is a vocal public which is in a position to demand new inventions which will improve their living conditions.

Mr. Carr will tell his audiences of his plans to launch a 10-foot demonstration model spacecraft late in September. This will be unmanned, can be sent into space, brought back, and sent into orbit around the globe. This is only a demonstration model, but will be of vast interest to manufacturers all over the world who can then license the Carr devices to power any

products from hearing aids to aircraft, ocean liners, trains, power plants, factories or homes, automobiles or any other product requiring power.

On their lecture tour Mr. Carr and Major Aho will also speak of their forthcoming trip to the moon and return. This will be made in the standard 45-foot spacecraft which will be fabricated at Space, Maryland, at the new Space Research Institute there. Mr. Carr, accompanied by Major Aho, will leave the planet Earth on December 7, 1959, and return after a week spent on the moon.

We hope that you and your friends will have a chance to drop in to see us at some time if you are in this area. The development of our devices has now reached a point where those, like yourself, who are interested in making an investment, either large or small, can take advantage of our partnership-option plan. These options are given on a dollar per share basis. They will be offered only until the date on which the demonstration model spacecraft is launched, or prior to the public stock offering.

This public stock offering of twenty million dollars in shares in Utron accumulator and Carrotto gravity motor, subsidiaries of OTC Enterprises, will be made on a \$10 per share basis. It will be handled through regular brokerage channels, and will be offered the day after the demonstration model is launched. ~~At the same time manufacturers will be licensed to use the Utron and Carrotto devices to power their products.~~

The stock shares are expected to advance rapidly in value, as many manufacturers are already waiting to use the devices as soon as licensing is granted. On the day of the public offering, those individuals who hold the dollar partnership options may transfer them for \$10 stock shares -- that is, one dollar option will be equal to one ten dollar share. Or they may leave the options in the parent corporations, OTC Enterprises, Inc., which will participate in all earnings by Utron and Carrotto, the subsidiaries.

We would like to hear from you about this participation plan. What do you think of it? We have had so many requests from our friends who want to find some way to share in these new Space Age developments, and we felt that this opportunity to invest a dollar or thousands of dollars would appeal to all. The material rewards should be very considerable and the opportunity to help to usher in the Space Age should have wide acceptance.

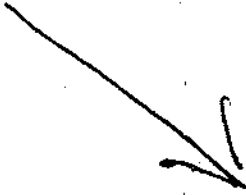

Dear Mr. Haber. . .

Thank you so very much for your thoughtful letter of October 12. We are happy to know that you enjoyed the lecture by Mr. Otis T. Carr, and also our OTC literature.

Mr. Carr has just returned to the office and expects to be very busy here now with the rapid development of his inventions. You are correct in your estimate of free energy devices as being revolutionary in nature, and the vast program ahead calls for most concentrated activity.

We do not plan to mass-produce any machines ourselves, but we will build prototype applications of all kinds, and then license manufacturers the world over to use the Utron accumulator and the Carrotto gravity motor. These devices will provide free energy for anything requiring power -- including trains, ocean liners, automobiles, airplanes, factory and household equipment of all kinds, lawn mowers, electric razors, hearing aids, and thousands of other items.

Plans have been completed for Space Research Institute at Space, Maryland, and the buildings there will be started this year. The Institute will have facilities for research and the building of prototypes, so licensing should start sometime next year for certain products.

You have mentioned the possibility of investment, and we wish to advise you that we had partnership options available at one dollar each until October 15. However, we are granting a thirty-day grace period, because we have had so many last minute requests that we have not been able to notify everyone of the withdrawal of the dollar options, which have now been offered for several months.

These are being withdrawn because we will soon offer a public stock issue of twenty million dollars which will be handled through regular brokerage channels. This public stock offering in Utron accumulator and Carrotto gravity motor, subsidiaries of OTC Enterprises, will be made on a \$10 per share basis. Shortly after that, manufacturers will be licensed to use the Utron and Carrotto devices to power their products.

The date: 1958. The place: Space City, Md., a community not yet on the map. The event: A 1.5 million dollar saucer shaped space ship is taking off with a three man crew for a seven day round trip to the moon.

That's the picture 300 Chicanos meeting at 32 W. Randolph st. got Saturday night from Otis T. Carr, who described the yet-to-be-finished expedition as "the culmination of 20 years of research" by himself and his followers.

Good Timing

Carr, a Baltimore man who heads OTC Enterprises, a firm "specializing in space travel," set the Dec. 7 date because of its historical link with "the last great world conflagration" (World War II) and because it also happens to fall on "our [his] birthday."

He will pilot and navigate his craft, the OTC-XI, and will take along Maj. Wayne S. Aho, whose pre-occupation the last few years has been tracking down flying saucers.

Model on Hand, Too

On display was a model of the craft, 8 feet in diameter, complete with removable top so the 300 who paid to hear Carr talk could see its inner workings. The model was a bit crude, but Carr assured his listeners that detailed plans are ready.

The whole thing still remains to be financed, tho. The government is interested, but has committed itself to the

obsolete rocket idea, so no funds can come from that source, Carr's aids said, and maybe private contributions will be necessary. Besides 1.5 million dollars for the moon ship, the program to build the city at Space Md., would cost 20 millions.

One woman, much impressed, said, "Why, I'd really like to go, it all sounds so thrilling. If necessary, I'll beg money to help out."

[redacted] telephonically contacted the Pittsburgh Office and advised SA JOHN S. PORTELLA that certain facts had come to his attention which he thought this Bureau should know about because he could not make up his own mind whether or not they constituted a complete hoax or confidence scheme or whether there was actually anything to the whole story.

[redacted] stated that on Thursday, 2/19/59, he was invited to attend a meeting held at the office of Dr. JENKINS, a chiropractor, at 308 East Eighth Avenue, Homestead, Pa.

[redacted] said he was invited to this meeting by FRAN KACSMIR of the Camera-Radio Company of Pittsburgh, who had told the KQV radio engineers about the O. T. Carr Enterprises and the engineers expressed an interest in the whole thing.

[redacted] said that there were about twenty people present at the meeting and the persons there were professional and industrial people all of whom seemed to be very interested in what one (FNU) REPOLTI had to say about the O. T. Carr Enterprises of Baltimore, Maryland. In essence REPOLTI pointed out that this group had a huge space ship ready to shoot into orbit with a man aboard that had sufficient rocket power to travel to the moon and back with the man aboard safely. The purpose of the meeting

[redacted] said was to raise funds to purchase a franchise from the enterprise group for the State of Pennsylvania. [redacted] understood that similar type meetings were being held in 39 other states in the United States for the same purpose and that those people fortunate enough to have been invited to the meeting would be able to purchase a share of the franchise, the total cost of which would be \$30,000.

REPOLTI told the assemblage that the O. T. Carr Enterprises would be ready to launch their space ship to the moon on 12/7/59 from Frontier City, Oklahoma, and that they had plans for a publicity kickoff date, to go off 3/15/59. REPOLTI told the group that the O. T. Carr Enterprises had a small prototype of the huge space ship already perfected and that they were attempting to raise funds and interest throughout the country which would enable them to privately build a factory in Baltimore where the huge motors for the huge space ship would be built and later assembled.

REPOLTI also told the group that O. T. Carr representatives were to be in New York on 2/21/59 and that they were to release some publicity on this matter by 11 o'clock a.m. [redacted] stated that he attended the meeting strictly on the basis that he might have a news story and after hearing the above facts he decided to talk to Newscaster JOHN DAILY of ABC, New York, and DAILY returned his call and advised that he had made some confidential inquiries and had determined that the National Space Agency had not heard of CARR and COLTON but the U. S. Army authorities had heard of them. DAILY told [redacted] that CARR had appeared before representatives of the U. S. Army and requested \$20,000,000 in order to perfect their plans and build the space ship that would travel to the moon and back with a man aboard. He said the Army authorities told CARR and COLTON that they would be glad to discuss their plans in more detail if they could produce a prototype of the vessel they intended to build and also produce blueprints, plans and other specifications. DAILY said he also learned that sometime after CARR and COLTON left the U. S. Army representatives a lawyer representing both CARR and COLTON, advised the Army authorities that CARR and COLTON had neither plans, specifications nor prototype that they could offer.

[redacted] stated that REPOLTI advised him that as soon as CARR and COLTON were finished with their publicity kickoff in New York City they planned to come to Pittsburgh, Pa., in order to be interviewed by [redacted] stated that he intends to interview both men and to try to put the interview on tape.

[redacted] stated that when he attended the meeting on Thursday, 2/19/59, he acquired a pile of literature and brochures and photographs about the O. T. Carr Enterprises together with photographs of both CARR and COLTON and he would be glad to make this literature and these photographs available at any time for examination.

On February 21, 1959, [redacted] newscaster for [redacted]

[redacted] telephonically contacted the Pittsburgh Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation and advised that certain facts had come to his attention which he thought this Bureau should know about because he could not make up his own mind whether or not they constituted a complete hoax or confidence scheme or whether there was actually anything to the whole story.

[redacted] stated that on Thursday, February 19, 1959, he was invited to attend a meeting held at the office of Dr. JENKINS, a chiropractor, at 308 East Eighth Avenue, Homestead, Pa. [redacted] said he was invited to this meeting by FRAN KACSMIR of the Cameradio Company of Pittsburgh, who had told the KQV radio engineers about the O. T. Carr Enterprises and the engineers expressed an interest in the whole thing. [redacted] said that there were about twenty people present at the meeting and the persons there were professional and industrial people, all of whom seemed to be very interested in what one (FNU) REPOLTI had to say about the O. T. Carr Enterprises of Baltimore, Maryland. In essence REPOLTI pointed out that this group had a huge space ship ready to shoot into orbit with a man aboard that had sufficient rocket power to travel to the moon and back with the man aboard safely. The purpose of the meeting [redacted] said was to raise funds to purchase a franchise from the Carr group for the State of Pennsylvania. [redacted] understood that similar type meetings were being held in 39 other states in the United States for the same purpose and that those people fortunate enough to have been invited to the meeting would be able to purchase a share of the franchise, the total cost of which would be \$30,000.

REPOLTI told those assembled that the O. T. Carr Enterprises would be ready to launch their space ship to the moon on December 7, 1959, from Frontier City, Oklahoma, and that they had plans for a publicity kickoff date, to go off March 15, 1959. REPOLTI told the group that the O. T. Carr Enterprises had a small prototype of the huge space ship already perfected and that they were attempting to raise funds and interest throughout the country which would enable them to privately build a factory in Baltimore where the huge motors for the huge space ship would be built and later assembled.

REPOLTI also told the group that O. T. Carr representatives were to be in New York on February 21, 1959, and that they were to release some publicity on this matter by 11 o'clock a.m. [redacted] stated that he attended the meeting strictly on the basis that he might have a news story and after hearing the above facts he decided to talk to Newscaster JOHN DALY of ABC, New York, and DALY returned his call and advised that he had made some confidential inquiries and had determined that the National Space Agency had not heard of CARR and COLTON but the U. S. Army authorities had heard of them. DALY told [redacted] that CARR had appeared before representatives of the U. S. Army and requested \$20,000,000 in order to perfect their plans and build the space ship that would travel to the moon and back with a man aboard. He said the Army authorities told CARR and COLTON that they would be glad to discuss their plans in more detail if they could produce a prototype of the vessel they intended to build and also produce blueprints, plans and other specifications. DALY said he also learned that sometime after CARR and COLTON left the U. S. Army representatives a lawyer representing both CARR and COLTON advised the Army authorities that CARR and COLTON had neither plans, specifications nor prototype that they could offer.

[redacted] stated that REPOLTI advised him that as soon as CARR and COLTON were finished with their publicity kickoff in New York City they planned to come to Pittsburgh, Pa., in order to be interviewed by [redacted] stated that he intends to interview both men and to try to put the interview on tape.

[redacted] on March 16, 1959, advised that neither CARR nor COLTON came to Pittsburgh on February 21, 1959, to be interviewed; but he had received telephone calls from COLTON, who was in New York City, and he was still talking about coming to Pittsburgh.

[redacted] described POLTERI as white, male, young, good speaker. [redacted] said he also learned that SCHWARTZ (FNU), a Pittsburgh broker, is also interested in this affair.

On March 7, 1960, a source, which maintains credit and financial information concerning business organizations, furnished information indicating that OTC Enterprises, Inc., 308 East 8th Ave., Homestead, Pa., was a branch of OTC Enterprises, Inc., Baltimore, Md., under the management of ~~NORMAN E. KOLTON~~. In March, 1959, KOLTON advised this source that the Homestead Office of this corporation was mainly for the purpose of handling public and press relations; that a franchised dealership to sell "energizing machines" in Western Pennsylvania would be established at this address under the management of ~~DENNIS RAPOLTI~~; and that this dealership would be separately incorporated and operated independently of OTC Enterprises in Baltimore, Md. This source advised that as of August, 1959, OTC Enterprises, 308 East 8th Avenue, Homestead, Pa. had not been incorporated in the state of Pennsylvania.

On March 17, 1960, MRS. DOROTHY DUDA, Secretary, Chamber of Commerce, Ann St., Homestead, Pa., made available an illustrated brochure published by OTC Enterprises and a business card showing that DENNIS RAPOLTI was the Pennsylvania representative of this organization. MRS. DUDA advised that the Chamber of Commerce had received some inquiries concerning OTC Enterprises. According to DUDA, RAPOLTI or some other representative of this organization caused a disturbance at the public library in Homestead by demanding that the library remove certain science books from the shelves and replace them with books supplied by OTC Enterprises. It was claimed that the library's books were inaccurate and did not contain the true facts concerning atomic science and space travel. MRS. DUDA also advised that OTC Enterprises allegedly was promoting the sale of a "do-it-yourself space rocket" to be used for space travel. MRS. DUDA also stated that she had learned through the Better Business Bureau of Pittsburgh that OTC Enterprises had been involved in court proceedings in Oklahoma.

The brochure furnished by MRS. DUDA illustrated the theories of OTIS T. CARR and contained drawings of vehicles allegedly for space travel and a description of "The World's First Industrial Complex To Be Run by Universal Free Energy" to be constructed near Baltimore, Md. This brochure claimed that

"The efforts of OTC Enterprises, Inc., are directed toward the peaceful uses of atomic energy" and described "the Carrotto Gravity Motor," "the utilization of solar energy," "the Proton Gun," and "the Fourth Dimensional Space Vehicle - OTC-X1, a circular foil space craft." This brochure contained the following statements:

"In the face of incredulity, we are able to state with full authority and responsibility that we have tapped an universal supply of energy in the form of gravity, and we have been able to harness the pressure energy of this force to motion with the result that we have built and put into operation a machine that produces power continuously and absolutely free of dissipation."

"Beginning from the working pilot models, which we have achieved in prototype, our broad researches are aimed at commercial atomic-power applications to every conceivable device from hearing aids and portable television sets, to space cruisers that will without the slightest doubt be carrying parties of explorers to the moon within the next few years of our lifetime."

On March 18, 1960, W. G. MC MORRAN, Manager, Financial Division, Better Business Bureau of Pittsburgh, Inc., 411 - 7th Avenue, Pittsburgh, Pa., advised that he had conducted considerable investigation of OTC Enterprises in the Pittsburgh area. MC MORRAN stated that he learned that a meeting of this organization, whose main headquarters are at 2502 N. Calvert St., Baltimore 18, Md., was held on June 2, 1959, at the Penn-McKee Hotel in McKeesport, Pa., and that a MISS DANA HOWARD, "noted author," attempted to explain the operations of OTC Enterprises. MC MORRAN stated that MISS HOWARD was unable to answer technical questions and that certain engineers who attended this meeting described the events which took place at this meeting as "electronic gobbledygook." According to MC MORRAN, OTC Enterprises claimed that they had a space vehicle which would be launched in a mid-western state on December 7, 1959, for a trip to the moon and return.

MC MORRAN also advised that his records indicated that on May 29, 1959, a U. S. District Court in Oklahoma City issued a temporary restraining order directed against OTC Enterprises on the petition of the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC).

OTC Enterprises, Inc.

The SEC claimed that OTC Enterprises had engaged in practices in violation of the Securities Act of 1933 in that, since November, 1955, they had been selling options and rights to purchase and deposit receipts for shares of OTC capital stock. SEC charged that OTC Enterprises had been using the U. S. Mails and interstate communications to sell stock which had not been registered with the SEC. On August 15, 1959, in Oklahoma City, OTIS T. CARR and associates, who claimed to have designed a flying saucer which would fly to the moon on "electro-magnetic energy" and had been selling saucer plans and space literature at \$5.00 per copy, pleaded not guilty to charges of selling non-registered stock in Oklahoma. CARR and associates were released on \$1,000 bonds.

MC MORRAN also advised that DENNIS RAPOLTI, local representative of OTC Enterprises, had been described to him as "a screwball" and as being "very unstable" and that a DR. HARRY D. JENKINS, a chiropractor, 618 Market St., McKeesport, Pa., and his wife, ADA, nee RIBAR, were also connected with OTC Enterprises at 308 East 8th Ave., Homestead, Pa.

Records of Credit Bureau, Inc., 635 Smithfield St., Pittsburgh, as of March 18, 1960, contained a credit report dated December 1, 1959, which indicated that DENNIS RAPOLTI, a salesman for OTC Enterprises, 308 East 8th Avenue, Homestead, resided with his parents at 20 D. Midway Drive, Whitaker, Pa.; that his wife and one child resided in Daytona Beach, Fla.; that he was 22 years of age; and that he was formerly employed by the May-Sterns Company in Pittsburgh. This report indicated that RAPOLTI was slow in paying his accounts and that one account had been charged off as uncollectible while another had been placed in the hands of an attorney for collection.

The above records also reflected that DR. HARRY D. JENKINS and wife, ADA, resided at 619 Woodside Road, Pittsburgh 21, Pa., and that JENKINS was self-employed as a chiropractor at 2215 Ardmore Boulevard, Pittsburgh 21, Pa. The records indicated that MRS. ADA JENKINS, nee RIBAR, was also a chiropractor and that she and her husband also maintained offices in Homestead and McKeesport, Pa. No credit record was listed for DR. JENKINS or his wife.

As of March 21, 1960, DENNIS RAPOLTI had no record with the Pittsburgh Police Department, the Homestead, Pa., Police Department, or the Allegheny County Detective Bureau, Pittsburgh.

As of March 21, 1960, DR. HARRY D. JENKINS and his wife had no record with the Homestead, McKeesport and Pittsburgh Police Departments or the Allegheny County Detective, Bureau, Pittsburgh.

Saucer-to-Moon Co. Gets In New Trouble

**N. Y. Attorney General to Probe Firm;
Says \$50,000 Worth of Stock Sold**

A company which failed to stir up much interest here last summer in its plan to send a manned saucer to the moon and back got into new trouble yesterday.

Otis T. Carr and his O. T. C. Enterprises, was announced as the topic of an investigation by New York State's attorney general, Louis

J. Lefkowitz. The attorney general said the company sold \$50,000 worth of stock over the last two years for a saucer with a motor that was to have perpetual energy.

The company previously was restrained by a Federal Court in Oklahoma City from selling stock before it opened a branch office in June, 1959, on East Eighth Avenue in Homestead.

Two Public Meetings

The Carr representative here, Norman E. Colton, held two public meetings, one in McKeesport and one at the Penn. Sheraton Hotel. They were attended by local scientists and engineers who left the meetings convinced the project would never get off the ground.

The New York attorney general set September 26 for questioning of the firm's officials. The company has its head-

quarters in Baltimore. Since Mr. Lefkowitz has no jurisdiction outside New York, it was questionable whether persons sought for questioning would appear.

His New York State Supreme Court order named Mr. Carr and a number of employees, including Margaret Storm, of Route 2, Fayetteville, Franklin County, who was not otherwise identified.

Sold for \$5

Carr's office here sold packages of plans for the space ship for \$5. They were described as valuable also as wall decorations.

The space craft was to have made a one-week flight to the moon beginning last December 7.

The New York State Supreme Court has finally stepped in to protect gullible New Yorkers from the enticements of a "flying saucer" firm known as O. T. C. Enterprises, Incorporated. What will be done with the \$50,000 already collected for production of the OTC-XI, a "space ship capable of excursions to the moon," was not explained. All the Court did was order the firm's promoters to quit selling their stock in the State of New York. (The New York Times, 9/22/61, p. C-22)

Fingerprint Device

Otis T. Carr, president and founder of O. T. C. enterprises, is presently serving a jail term in Oklahoma City for selling unregistered stock. Reportedly, he is working off a \$5,000 fine at the rate of \$1 a day. Bureau files reveal that, in 1939, an Otis T. Carr, of New York City, tried to interest the Bureau in a fingerprint device which he described as "most emphatically of scientific importance in the field of fingerprint work." Examination of the device by a Bureau representative showed that it was a simple piece of prismatic glass, through which a person's fingerprints could be viewed and/or photographed. The "highly developed chemical liquid" inside the prism was determined to be simple corn syrup. (62-105105; 32-15382-93,96; The New York Times, 9/22/61, p. C-22)


O. T. C. Enterprises has been in business since at least 1958, and by 1959 its promoters had reportedly canvassed prospective investors in 39 states. The Securities and Exchange Commission claims that a number of the firm's practices are in violation of the Securities Act of 1933. O. T. C. representatives announced in 1959 that a six-foot prototype of the OTC-XI would be tested at Frontier City, Oklahoma, but the test was abruptly canceled when the firm charged that the Federal Government was planning to seize the prototype and classify all information about the project. (62-105105; The New York Times, 9/22/61, p. C-22)

Bureau Investigations

Norman E. Colton, of Baltimore, Maryland, has been variously described as Director of Public Education Control and Director of Sales Engineering for O. T. C. Enterprises. Bureau files reveal that Colton was dismissed from the Aberdeen Proving Grounds in 1953 for alleged falsification of records. In 1953, Colton was also the subject of a Bureau Impersonation investigation resulting from the cashing of bad checks and of a Fraud Against the Government investigation based on allegedly fraudulent expense vouchers submitted by him while he was employed by the Army. Prosecution in both cases was declined by the United States Attorney. (62-105105)

RECOMMENDATION:

For the information of the Director. No dissemination is being recommended in view of the fact that the Securities and Exchange Commission is already familiar with the activities of Carr and his firm.

Carr was at that time serving a jail term in Oklahoma for selling unregistered stock.




Dear Mr. Haber:

Mrs. Schmit called today and mentioned several subject matters to me. She is eccentric, to put it mildly, and calls me from time to time concerning matters she believes of interest to the Bureau.

She discussed at length efforts which she is engaged in to oppose a slaughter bill which is pending on the Hill. She also discussed her interest in flying saucers and other space vehicles. She belongs to a flying saucer club and will attend, this summer, a convention of flying saucer representatives in Michigan. She also said that in connection with her flying saucer activities she had learned that one Otis T. Carr, President of Otis Enterprises, Inc., 2502 North Calvert Street, Baltimore 18, Maryland, who is an electronics expert, is manufacturing a spaceship which he claims will travel 5000 miles per hour.

She asked if it would be all right if she contacted the Russian Embassy. I told her that was a matter which she, herself, must decide and that we could not give her any advice. She said that she had already called the Russian Embassy and had asked for an appointment with the Russian Ambassador and she wanted us to know that she had made such a request. She said she would advise me at some future date whether she was successful in meeting the Ambassador. She said the reason she was attempting to contact the Russian Embassy was that she wanted to impress upon the Russians that it was futile for them to develop and plan equipment that would blow up the earth as the forces from outer space were such that the Russians could themselves be obliterated. She then made reference to the "red snow" which she said fell on Minnesota some years ago and that she recalls walking in the "red snow." She said this was brought to the earth by Martians for the purpose of fertilizing otherwise rather unproductive farmland. *el*

Supervisor Oberndorf, WFO, was advised of her efforts to contact the Russian Ambassador.
