Subject: PAUL JOHN KNOWLES INQUIRY

This is a request for any background information including timelines, statements, receipts, vehicles, and confirmed sightings on PAUL JOHN KNOWLES, DOB 4/25/46. KNOWLES was arrested on or about November 17, 1974 and shot during a transport in Georgia on December 18, 1974. Prior to his death KNOWLES claimed to have committed thirty-five homicides across the country and had been definitively linked to twenty. On October 16, 1974 KNOWLES killed a mother and her daughter in their Connecticut home and within forty-eight hours drove over one thousand miles back to Macon, Georgia. The media reports that KNOWLES had driven through New York State following the homicide while returning to Georgia. From the Connecticut residence KNOWLES stole a reel-to-reel tape recorder that he used to tape a three-hour confession. On October 26, 1974 KNOWLES turned over to his attorney in Florida his recorded confession for safekeeping. According to media reports KNOWLES is next seen on the evening of November 6, 1974 in Macon, Georgia. KNOWLES is believed to be responsible for the deaths of a male and female who were last seen November 3, 1974 leaving a motel in Commerce, Georgia hitchhiking north to Love Valley, North Carolina. Their bodies were found a couple of days later south of Commerce in woods west of Macon, Georgia.

On November 2, 1974, 1:30 a.m., a first year student at the State University of New York @ Cobleskill was last seen walking from Main Street in the Village of Cobleskill toward the college campus. Cobleskill is an upstate village approximately forty-five minutes west of Albany, N.Y. just off I-88. Her body was found on November 29, 1974 partially nude with multiple pre and post mortem stab wounds on the upper body. Her body was located on the stonewall just off the roadway in a neighboring rural area. Check of the area found an empty pack of Kool cigarettes discarded along the roadside. Media reports have indicated that KNOWLES' choice of cigarettes was Kool brand.

At the time of the investigation into the murder of S.U.N.Y. Cobleskill student Katherine Kolodziej, DOB 12/07/56, Ronkonkoma (Long Island), N.Y. numerous leads and suspects were pursued with no arrest to date. At the time of KNOWLES' crime spree and arrest in Georgia numerous law enforcement agencies (including possibly the FBI) were involved. It is also possible the FBI's Behavioral Science Unit may have studied KNOWLES and his murder spree as a serial killer. I am requesting a check of the FBI's files and databases for any information on KNOWLES that may further our investigation and possibly rule him in or out as a possible suspect. 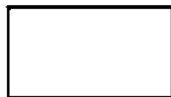
Synopsis: Request review of files and provide information to Albany.

Details: Albany is in receipt of a memorandum from New York State Police which requests the FBI review their files and provide any pertinent information regarding John Paul Knowles, date of birth 04/25/1946. This information is requested in order to further New York State Police investigation of the murder of a student at State University of New York at Cobleskill, 11/02/1974. The memorandum further indicates that FBI Behavioral Science Unit may have studied Knowles and his murder spree as a serial killer.

**Result of examination:**

Specimens Q17 through Q22, .38 Special caliber cartridge cases, were identified as having been fired in the same weapon.

Specimens Q1 and Q2 are .38 caliber bullets. Specimen Q2 was fired from a barrel rifled with five lands and grooves, right twist, and bears very limited marks which may be of possible value for identifying the weapon from which it was fired. Specimen Q1 was fired from a barrel with right twist rifling. However, due to mutilation, the complete rifling characteristics of the weapon from which Q1 was fired cannot be determined and there are no marks of value remaining in this bullet for identification or comparison purposes.

The gunpowder residue pattern around one of the holes in the Q23 towel was characteristic of a contact or near contact shot. Microscopic and chemical examinations of the area around the other hole in this towel revealed no gunpowder or gunpowder residues. However, it is noted that both holes in specimen Q23 could possibly have been caused by the passage of a single bullet. Microscopic examinations on specimens Q3, Q4, Q6, Q7, Q8 and Q9 revealed no gunpowder or gunpowder residues.

Among the weapons which produce rifling impressions like those in the Q2 bullet are Smith & Wesson, Ruger and numerous Spanish-made revolvers.

The K1 blood sample was grouped as "A." Group "A" human blood was identified on Q3, Q5, Q6 and Q23. Group "O" human blood was found on Q7 and Q8.

Grouping tests conducted on the human blood found on Q4 were inconclusive. Human blood, too limited in amount for grouping tests, was identified on Q9. Blood, too limited in amount for origin determination or grouping purposes, was found on Q12. No blood was found on Q11, Q13 through Q22 and Q25.



A small amount of material which had the appearance of tissue was found on Q10; however, this material was unsuitable for further serological testing due to insolubility. No semen was found on Q3 through Q9 and Q23.

Partial shoe prints were noted on the Q24 item. A herringbone design was noted in one of the partial shoe prints and a striated design was noted in a second partial shoe print. These designs are usually found in the soles and heels of shoes used for casual wear. Due to the limited and somewhat indistinct nature of these partial shoe prints, it appears unlikely that they could ever be specifically identified with a particular shoe or shoes.

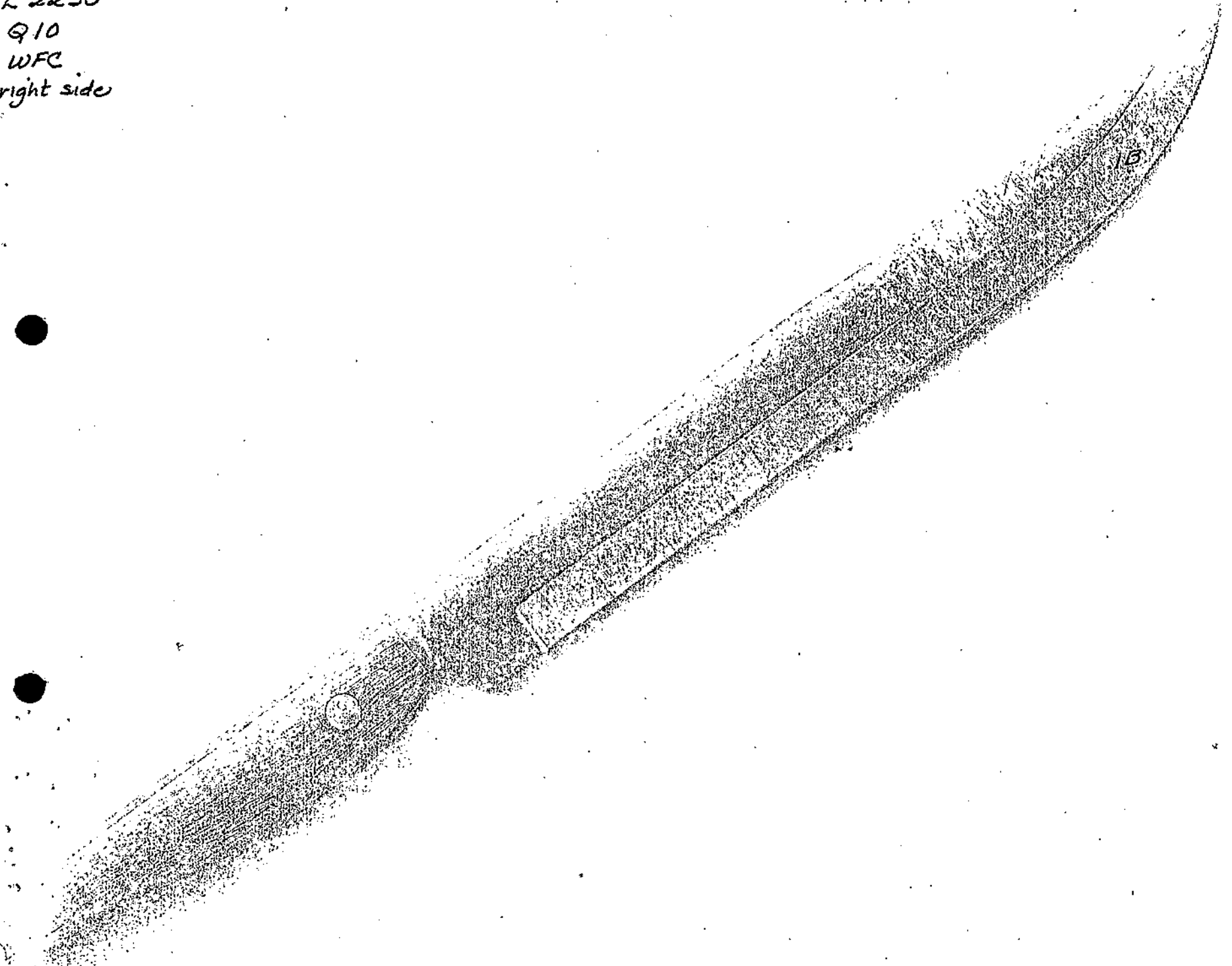

At about 10:30 a.m., 9/18/74, the Sheriff's office in Ely, Nevada received a call in regards to an abandoned vehicle at the Lake Valley rest area. A short time later a call was received that there was a dead man in the vehicle per Highway employee's call [redacted]

901 and Coroner [redacted] went to the area. Upon arrival 72-03 (NHP) informed us that he had responded to the call but was unable to get into the camper since the door was locked.

Vehicle was a 1969 GMC pickup with camper - also had a 'boot' between the cab and the camper. Calif. lic. #90344B. Vehicle was located 44.4 miles south of Ely on US 93., (Las Vegas highway)

901 picked open the door of the camper and observed one male subject on the right side\* of the camper in a half-sitting and half-lying position. Under the table, on the left side\* of camper on the floor was lying the body of a female subject, completely disrobed with a towel clutched in her hands. Both bodies were in very bad shape as they had been dead for several days and flies had been swarming over them for some time. \* (as seen from rear of camper)

Due to the stench and conditions of the bodies, 901 and mortician placed them into crash bags and they were transported to the Wilson-Bates Mortuary for examination. Vehicle was relocked and a wrecker was requested to tow it into Ely. Request was made that vehicle be stored and no one except law enforcement were to have access to it. 72-03 stayed for wrecker and to pass on instructions to driver.

901 and Coroner [redacted] returned to Ely and at 1:18 p.m. received a call that both parties had been shot. Each was shot in the head and both bullets were still in subjects.

Coroner [redacted] made arrangements for an autopsy on both subjects.

A preliminary search was made of vehicle to find the next of kin for notification and the Coroner finally called the Police Department in San Pedro, California where he

On 9/19/74, 901 made an investigation of the camper. It revealed that the inside of the camper had been wiped over so as to remove fingerprints - some partial prints were found and lifted from the table support in a 'missed area'. Complete clothing for female was found scattered on the floor, a blouse, shorts, pants and bra was found - the bra showed tear marks and one cup was found in another area. There also was some blood on female clothing. (sample of blood from both subjects will be sent in to lab with items so that they can be compared.

*ONLY FINGERPRINTS TO BE SENT*

Observation of gunshot wounds regarding location and path of bullet, indicate that both subjects were shot without struggle since both entries are behind the ear area. (Bullets were removed at the autopsy and will be submitted to lab for examination.)

With the removal of the vehicle, a crime search was made of the rest area and all trash containers for items. A blood soaked wiping rag was found in trash container; on the ground five (5) casings were found for .38 caliber pistol which could or could not be connected with homicides. (These will also be submitted to lab.) Also several hypo needles for insulin were found in the area and will also be submitted for examination. No other blood stains or items were found that seemed to be connected to the case. A search was made of all trash areas between Pioche and Ely (a distance of 108 miles) with negative results:

Items to be submitted will be marked for identification and for lab search for any and all information that would help the investigation.

Theory is that male subject was shot first since it would seem reasonable that he would have resisted any attempt to harm female. Male subject was wearing a wrist watch and female was wearing a set of diamond rings as well as another ring of value. Inside camper were several items of value: field glasses, cameras (2); gold pendant ladies watch, electric shavers (2), but a search failed to produce a purse or wallet. \$200.00 in Traveler's checks along with small change was also observed. Written records were maintained on a regular basis by female party and the last entry was made at noon on the 12th of September while enroute from Las Vegas. A record was also kept on the mileage and a check showed that the vehicle had traveled about 247 miles from Las Vegas, which is very close to correct. Call was received from Carl Arnoldus, Sheriff of Lincoln County, stating that the couple was stopped in Caliente at 1330 hours and given a warning ticket. Officer stated that Lois Johnson was driving and that Emmitt came out of camper at the stop. When they drove away, man was driving with woman in front seat with him (indicating nother party was traveling with them).

Male subject was an Emmitt Alexander Johnson, DOB 5/24/12, SS#561-10=1392, female subject was Lois Mildred Johnson, DOB 1/6/15, SS# 558-42-6242.

Date and approx. time of the deaths are set by another party that called the Highway Patrol about a screaming woman but gave the wrong rest area for investigation. Party did not give a name to Patrol dispatcher and an extensive radio, TV and teletype search is presently being conducted by the White Pine County Sheriff's office to attempt to locate party for information. Only clue is that they were driving a bright yellow pickup, towing a brown and white camp-trailer when they stopped to place callabout 25 miles south of Ely.

Bullets removed from bodies were marked with a cross by Sheriff Archie Robison.

Result of examination:

The resubmitted specimens Q1 and Q2 are .38 caliber bullets. Specimen Q1, which was fired from a barrel with right twist rifling, bears no marks of value for identification or comparison purposes due to mutilation. Specimen Q2 was fired from a barrel rifled with five lands and grooves, right twist, such as that of the K2 revolver and could have been fired from this weapon. However, because of the limited marks remaining in this bullet due to mutilation, specimen Q2 could not be identified as having been fired from the K2 revolver to the exclusion of all other weapons.

The resubmitted specimens Q17 through Q22 bear no marks which could have been produced by the K2 revolver in its present state of assembly and condition of wear.

Specimen K2 is being returned to the Chief of Police West Palm Beach, Florida, under separate cover by registered mail. Specimen K1 and the resubmitted specimens Q1, Q2 and Q17 through Q22 are being returned to the Sheriff, Ely, Nevada, under separate cover by registered mail.

Please advise us if this evidence compares with the case from Ely, Nevada. Your case is number PCL 2233 MZ and PCL 7241 MZ. These case numbers are from a double murder in Ely, Nevada. The victims were Emmett and Lois Johnson.

We recovered this evidence from a body in Bibb County, Georgia in November of 1974. We have evidence that the victim and [Redacted] were hitch hiking out of North Georgia a few days before the victim's body was found in Macon, Georgia. [Redacted] personal items have been found along with her clothing but [Redacted]. We also have evidence that John Paul Knowles was in Atlanta, Georgia when the victim and [Redacted] were hitch hiking south on I-75 and that John Paul Knowles did drive to Macon, Georgia from Atlanta on the day we believe the victim was killed.

As you know John Paul Knowles did commit the double murder in Ely, Nevada.
