The enclosed request for assistance from a foreign agency must be complied with promptly, and the Bureau advised of all action taken.

Instructions for handling this inquiry are found in Section 103 of the Manual of Instructions. Refer to and follow them carefully.

Submit the results of your inquiry in a letterhead memorandum, observing the following points in its preparation:

1. Sources and techniques must be fully protected.
2. The names of Special Agents are to be omitted. They must be deleted also from any signed statements submitted.
3. Provide a security classification, if warranted, but omit declassification markings.
4. Omit the property statement, unless special reasons exist for its inclusion. Explain any such reasons in the cover communication.
5. Secure authority to disseminate to the interested foreign government any information which was obtained from other agencies. Your cover communication must state this was done.

The established reputation of the Bureau within foreign agencies is a valuable asset. The manner in which this type of case is handled will largely determine the cooperation which we receive in turn from them. It is imperative, therefore, that these investigations and the reporting thereof meet the highest standards of the Bureau.

The New York Times, April 10, 1976, Page 30, Columns 1, 2, 3, 4 carried an article entitled, "Phil Ochs a Suicide At 35; Singer of Peace Movement." The article stated that Ochs, a folk singer, committed suicide by hanging in his sister's apartment in Queens, New York.

The article reported that Ochs' music had provided a strong protest to the Vietnam War. He was born in El Paso, Texas, and was a graduate of Staunton Military Academy and had attended Ohio State University for three years. He was survived by a daughter, [redacted] his mother, brother [redacted] and sister [redacted]. He was divorced from [redacted] mother and resided with his sister [redacted].

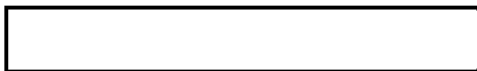

A review of the files of the New York Office (NYO) of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) has been completed pursuant to your request. Your request has been considered in light of the provisions of the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) (Title 5, United States Code, Section 552). This review was based on a search of the FBI's Central Records System as maintained by the NYO.

Philip David Ochs was referenced in two documents consisting of six pages.

Enclosed is a copy of six pages from our files which contain information identifiable with your request. Exisions have been made from these pages in order to protect materials which are exempted from disclosure by the following sub-sections of Title 5, United States Code, Section 552.

The information released will include documentation from the investigation in New York.

You have 30 days from receipt of this letter to appeal to the Attorney General (AG) for any denial contained herein. The appeal should be directed in writing to the AG (Attention: Freedom of Information Appeals Unit), Washington, D.C. 20530. The envelope and the letter should be clearly marked "Freedom of Information Appeal".
