The Los Angeles Office, by airtel dated 6-16-64, enclosed a copy of captioned book, which is a paperback publication of the Pere Marquette Press of Alton, Illinois, which has as a subcaption, "the inside story of how American Presidents are chosen." It was left without permission by an unknown person at the residence of SA Carl R. Schlatter, 1832 South Cordova Street, Alhambra, California, who is assigned to the Los Angeles Office (EOD 1-6-47, GS-13). Los Angeles advised its indices are negative regarding the book, the author and the printer. The book was furnished the Bureau for information and need not be returned to Los Angeles.

## REVIEW OF BOOK:

This is a purely political booklet allegedly written to expose to the general members of the Republican Party, the behind-the-scenes maneuvering of the "kingmakers" in the Republican Party. The theme expressed in the book is that these "kingmakers" actually choose the Presidential candidates of the Republican Party through their manipulation of convention delegates rather than the choice being made by regular Republicans through their voting in the primaries. Mrs. Schlafly claims that these power politicians are not concerned with the retention of the two Party system or of furthering the principals of the Republican Party but seek only to serve their own interests and move in and out of the two Parties as their interests dictate.

*Phyllis* *U.S.*  
Mrs. Schlafly identifies the most influential of these "kingmakers" as Nelson Rockefeller, Harold Stassen, Dean Acheson, and the columnist, Walter Lippmann.

The only mention of the FBI in this book concerns a reference on Page 103 to an alleged secret meeting held at the King and Prince Hotel, St. Simon's Island, Georgia, in February, 1957. The author claims that the "kingmakers" were gathered at this meeting formulating political plans for the 1960 Presidential campaign. The book states that, "The hotel was closed to all other patrons. NATO and FBI guards in plain clothes kept constant surveillance on the hotel itself." This reference to the FBI is,

of course, a complete fabrication and is indicative of the flights of fancy and fuzzy thinking which afflict the author throughout the book.

Mrs. Schlafly states that the obvious nominee of the Republicans for 1964 is Senator Barry Goldwater, as he represents independence of thought and a refusal to bow to the dictates of the "kingmakers." This, of course, strikes at the real reason for Mrs. Schlafly's writing this book, as it is an out-and-out political pitch for Senator Goldwater's nomination as the Republican Presidential nominee.

INFORMATION IN BUFILES:

Bufiles indicate that we have had limited cordial correspondence with Mrs. Schlafly in which she has inquired about communist activities in this country. She has expressed support and admiration for the Bureau and the Director. The Pere Marquette Press is not identifiable in Bufiles.

NOTE: Schlafly's book has been previously reviewed by the Crime Records Division. The book is strongly pro-Goldwater, claiming that he is the only presidential aspirant in the Republican Party who is independent of the "king makers" in the GOP. The only reference to the FBI in the book is the absurd statement that "FBI guards" were used at a meeting of the "king makers" in Georgia in 1957. Former SAC Hood EOD on 9-24-34, and resigned 7-17-53. He is known to Mr. Hoover on a first-name basis, and is on the Special Correspondents' List.

On 7-8-64, RICHARD B. HOOD, former SAC and presently an SAC Contact of the Pittsburgh Office, furnished a copy of the above captioned publication, a cheaply printed pocket-book published by Pere Marquette Press, Alton, Illinois.

*P.O. Box 313*  
HOOD described the book as a Pro-Goldwater book which attempts to show how the eastern financial interests are the supposed "Secret King Makers" of the Republican Party.

On Page 103 the author is describing an alleged secret meeting held on St. Simons Island, Georgia, in February, 1957. The author relates that rigid security checks were made, etc., etc., and "NATO and FBI guards in plain clothes kept constant surveillance on the hotel itself."

Mr. HOOD advised that he is, of course, well aware that whatever else is true in the book this portion is not true that FBI guards in plain clothes kept a surveillance of the hotel.

He said he was calling it to the Bureau's attention for whatever action was deemed appropriate. He said he, himself, would be delighted to direct a letter either to the author or to the publisher or both, protesting this improper use of the FBI name.

The Bureau is requested to advise whether any action is desired by Mr. HOOD.

Dear Mr. Hoover:

With the greatest delight, I again extend to you congratulations on the 45th year, now ending, in your job. The outstanding manner in which you have conducted yourself will never be matched in history. No matter who might try to follow you, he would be a poor second.

Evidently your health is good as usual or you might be forced to consider relaxing your work schedule somewhat. For this I am glad.

There are so many "causes" I would like to write letters about but my energy prevents this. I have a wonderful family, "grand" grandchildren and a comfortable apartment, so I do not complain.

One of the things I am exorcised about is the Otepka case. I did get up enough steam to write the President about this. I compared it to the Dreyfus case, in which there are many parallels. I waited for an answer, although I don't usually expect this, because of my great interest. Then in about three weeks Pres. Nixon appointed him to his new post and I was on cloud nine. That man has suffered enough for his PATRIOTISM. Then on the radio last night I heard that Sen. Kennedy and some of his liberal cohorts are trying to stop this appointment. Haven't those Kennedys done enough harm? They are going to investigate the John Birch Society to see if he is a member. I have read that he is not and never has been. The poor JBS is the goat. known that we are at all times ready for war."

America cannot be protected by weapons which are on the drawing board — only by weapons which we actually have. At the time of Pearl Harbor, the Pentagon knew that in three or four years we would build a better airplane than the B-17 and B-24. The improved and larger B-29 actually went into action in 1945. But meanwhile, the war had to be fought with the B-17 and the B-24. If we had waited for the B-29, we might have lost World War II.

In the case of a nuclear attack, we will not have any time to reopen plants and build weapons — as we did after Pearl Harbor. In the nuclear age, the only weapons which count are those which are on alert at the moment of attack.

**False Argument No. 8:** "Our best hope for peace lies in

signing more treaties with the Soviets."

**Answer:** "The delusion that America can be defended by treaties instead of by weapons is the most persistent and pernicious of all the liberal fallacies. For example, William C. Foster said on "Meet the Press" that he believes that a treaty with the Soviets is "better than any anti-ballistic system." Well, most Americans don't. We cannot put our hope for peace in treaties with the Communists who have broken their pledged word to every country with which they signed a major agreement. Just as a confirmed alcoholic is not cured by being invited to take one more drink, so a confirmed treaty-breaker is not cured by being invited to sign one more treaty.

When the Soviets invaded Czechoslovakia in August, 1968, they violated 17 treaties, one of which was only 17 days

old. Those who failed to learn the lessons of Teheran, Yalta, Potsdam, Panmunjom, Geneva, Budapest, and Vietnam should learn from the invasion of Czechoslovakia that the Communists still follow Lenin's dictum: "Promises are, like piccrusts, made to be broken."

# America needs the ABM

By David Schickel

Editor's note: Phyllis Ketchum is an expert on nuclear defense. Her books on the subject, co-authored by Admiral Chester Ward, have sold more than three million copies. The mother of six children, she considers it disastrous to put our faith in Soviet good will. She is an ardent advocate of the classic military strategy of peace through strength. In accordance with Pope Paul's remarks at the United Nations: "As long as man remains as he is, defensive arms, unfortunately, will be necessary."

For the past several weeks the news has been filled with controversy and agitation over whether or not to build the Safeguard anti-missile missile defense system (the ABM) proposed by President Kennedy in his "The Day After Tomorrow" speech.

The ABM is a fantastic achievement of American scientific and electronic genius which, according to the manufacturer, will be capable of intercepting and destroying incoming Soviet missiles at speeds up to 28,000 miles per hour. In a matter of seconds, the ABM can not only detect incoming warheads from a distance of 100 miles, and then destroy the enemy warheads before they can destroy us with their rockets or bombs. The ABM has only one job: to intercept and destroy incoming Soviet missiles and weapons against enemy attack.

The ABM is made up of three parts: the multi-function radar, which is the radar-computer complex that identifies and tracks the attacking missile; the Spartan, which is the long-range anti-missile that destroys attacking missiles hundreds of miles out; and the Sprint, which is the short-range anti-missile that destroys attacking missiles in the final moments of their attack.

must protect itself against the nuclear power of the men in the Kremlin who have vowed to "bury" us in a "rainstorm" of missiles.

Secretary of Defense Melvin Laird testified before the Senate Armed Services Committee in March 1960 that:

- 1) the Soviets "are going for a first-strike capability, and there is no question about it";
- 2) the Soviets now have more than 200 "accurate" missiles of 20 to 25 megatons (which are 20 to 25 times the size of 93 percent of U.S. missiles);
- 3) the Soviets have caught up with and passed the U.S. in numbers of land-based nuclear missiles, and are continuing to deploy more at a rapid rate;
- 4) in slightly more than two years, the Soviet nuclear

missile force has increased more than threefold, while the size of the U.S. nuclear missile force has been frozen;

5) the Soviets have "deployed" and "launched" orbital bombs (the FOSS), and they might be equipped with nuclear warheads;

6) at the present time, the U.S. has absolutely no installed anti-missile defense, but the Soviets have been deploying their anti-missile system for the last three years;

7) the Soviets are "going forward" with the deployment of Polaris-type nuclear submarines at the rate of seven per year, and they will be "comparable" to our Polaris fleet by 1971-74;

8) our Polaris-Poseidon submarines will be vulnerable to a Soviet attack in about three years because of Soviet weapons advances.

Yet, in the face of such enemy power, we are treated to emotional outbursts from liberal Congressmen and pacifist scientists against a weapon whose sole purpose is to

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protect our country. Let us examine the false arguments being made against the Safeguard ABM.

**False Argument No. 1:** "The anti-missile costs too much and those billions should be spent on urban problems, etc."

**Answer:** If we fail to repel or deter a nuclear attack, most Americans won't be alive to enjoy any money spent on other projects. Our most urgent objective must be to enable America to survive as a nation. The ABM could be the cheapest life and property insurance you ever bought. It costs only \$4 per person per year. Isn't your life worth \$4?

It is significant that those who now cry so loudly about the cost of the ABM never raised their voices against the \$10 billion which went down the drain on the TFX plane (the flying Edsel), or the \$5 billion every year which is spent on foreign aid.

**FORMER** Secretary of Defense McNamara used to give a more sophisticated version of this argument. He alleged that it isn't "cost-effective" because it costs the United States more to build an ABM system than it costs the Soviets to build additional offensive nuclear missiles. This is just like saying that we should not spend money for fire departments because it costs us more to build and maintain them than it costs the arsonist to buy matches and gasoline. Most people recognize that we must spend money to protect our lives and property from the damage criminals may do.

Actually, it is no longer true that an ABM system would cost us more than additional offensive weapons would cost the Soviets. The Center for the Study of Democratic Institutions (which is opposed to the ABM) has conceded that "offensive and defensive cost factors have been balanced out, at least for the past four years."

**False Argument No. 2:** "The anti-missile is provocative."

**Answer:** This argument is just mischievous doubletalk originated by Jerome Wiesner and Roswell Leavitt Gilpatric. A weapon such as a rifle can be offensive or defensive depending on how it is used. But an ABM system is purely defensive; it cannot kill a single Russian or Chinese.

There is nothing any more "provocative" about an ABM system than there is about a burglar alarm system. The only one who thinks the burglar alarm system is "provocative" is the burglar. A burglar alarm system is purely defensive, and never goes into action until and until the burglar is on your premises. Likewise, the ABM would never go into action until enemy missiles were already streaking toward America.

General Austin Betts, the man who conducted the long series of tests which proved that the ABM is reliable, stated that an ABM system is no more provocative than putting seat belts in your automobile. Just because you have seat belts installed does not mean that you intend to drive down the highway and crash into another car. They are a sensible safety precaution which may save your life. So is the ABM.

**False Argument No. 3:** "The U.S. ABM system will escalate the arms race."

**Answer:** It is utterly ridiculous to say that the U.S. will "escalate" the arms race by building an ABM system — when for the past three years the Soviets have been deploying their own ABM system!

Secretary of Defense Melvin Laird gave the figures to demolish this myth when he appeared on "Face the Nation" on February 9. He said that the Soviets are presently spending \$370 on defensive nuclear weapons for every \$1 the U.S. is spending. He went on to say that since the national product of the Soviet Union is only half that of the U.S., the Soviets are thus devoting seven times more of their national product to defensive nuclear weapons than the U.S.

These figures make it completely obvious which nation is "escalating" the arms race. Secretary Laird added that, in offensive nuclear weapons, the Soviets are outspending us at the ratio of \$3 to \$2.

**THE MYTH** persists among some people that, if the U.S. would just "show our good faith" by disarming, or by not building additional weapons, the Soviets would reciprocate with some kind of nuclear "noblesse oblige." The upper-echelon liberals refer to this as U.S. "unilateral initiative" followed by Soviet "reciprocal action."

The 1967 Report of the House Armed Services Committee called "The Changing Strategic Military Balance, U.S.A. vs. U.S.S.R." proves that since 1962 the U.S. has engaged in "unilateral initiative" to the extent of increasing 50 per cent of our nuclear striking power. During this same period, the Soviet "reciprocated" by increasing their nuclear arsenal 500 per cent. The Soviets are "showing" the good faith of "balancing" the arms race by increasing their nuclear arsenal 500 per cent while the U.S. has increased its nuclear arsenal only 50 per cent.

**False Argument No. 1:** "The anti-missile may not work."

**Answer:** Secretary of Defense Clark Clifford, in his last Statement to Congress before leaving the Pentagon, gave a complete answer to this argument. He said that 23 million Americans would be killed by a nuclear attack from Red China; but if we have the ABM in operation, 22 of those 23 million Americans would be saved, or 95 per cent.

During World War II, anti-aircraft weapons were considered valuable and necessary even though they were able to shoot down less than 10 per cent of the attacking enemy planes. A defensive weapon which is 95 per cent effective must be the best defensive weapon ever invented, and we should waste no time in building it.

**False Argument No. 5:** "The ABM is unnecessary because the Soviets are deterred from attacking us by the assured destruction capability of our offensive nuclear forces."

**Answer:** Since the Soviets already have an ABM system, we have no "assured destruction capability" against the U.S.S.R. But, so long as we have no ABM system, the Soviets definitely do have an "assured destruction capability" against us. In an official statement to Congress, former Secretary McNamara conceded that the Soviets are capable of killing 160 million Americans in a nuclear attack. Doesn't it make good sense to deprive the Soviets of their capability to destroy us?

**False Argument No. 6:** "The ABM is a danger to the people living in the area of the installations."

**Answer:** The danger from accidental explosion of the anti-missile is non-existent. Secretary of Defense Melvin Laird pointed out on February 13 that, in handling about 15,000 nuclear weapons all over the world, the United States has never experienced an accident which resulted in a nuclear explosion. In mid-February, the Pentagon also disclosed that it had atomic warheads on Nike-Hercules anti-aircraft missiles stationed around 85 metropolitan areas from 1955 to 1968 — and there was never a single accident or near-accident.

**False Argument No. 7:** "It would be a waste of money to build the anti-missile because we might have something better in ten years."

**Answer:** If anyone can look into a crystal ball and tell us the precise moment when the Soviets or Chinese Reds will attack, then we could build weapons for exactly that date and not waste earlier preparations. In the absence of such precise knowledge of the future, the only sensible policy is to follow the advice of President George Washington who said: "If we desire to secure peace . . . it must be

By memorandum dated 6/1/64, the Central Research Unit reviewed the above-captioned book. In this review, it was pointed out that the book is a right wing indictment of certain American leaders who, according to Stormer, have shaped American national and international policy in such a way as to be advantageous to the Soviet Union. The book states that all who oppose the trend toward communism are subjected to ridicule and ruin.

You may be interested to know that The New York Times, Sunday, 10/4/64, carried a very lengthy article dealing with the book, its author, and two other books, namely "A Texan Looks at Lyndon" by J. Evetts Haley and "A Choice Not An Echo," by Phyllis Schlafly. According to the article, these paperbacks are being sold by the millions as campaign ammunition at Goldwater-For-President headquarters in many sections of the country and are being pushed by members of the John Birch Society. The distribution according to the article, is unprecedented. A total of 7.3 million copies of "None Dare Call It Treason" have been printed since February. The article alleges that Stormer and Haley both published their own books. Stormer allegedly created his own publishing company, Liberty Bell Press, and has expended some \$600,000.

The New York Times states that Stormer's book, studied by the National Committee for Civic Responsibility, described as a committee formed last year at Cleveland as a nonpartisan citizens group "to encourage responsible debate and to expose the use of calumny and deception," was evaluated as being "at best an incredibly poor job of research and documentation and at worst a deliberate hoax and a fraud."

# Extremist Book Sales Soar Despite Criticism in G.O.P.

## Paperbacks Pushed by Goldwater Camp in Many Areas

HOUSTON, Oct. 3—Stacked high on tables and in showcases in southwest Houston's super-market-sized Republican campaign headquarters are copies of J. Everett Haley's controversial paperback book, "A Texan Looks at Lyndon."

On order, said Mrs. Donald Mayo, are John A. Stormer's "None Dare Call It Treason" and Phyllis Schlafly's "A Choice Not an Echo."

The three right-wing paperbacks also are being sold as campaign ammunition at other Goldwater-For-President headquarters in many sections of the country.

More than 16 million copies of the book have been printed, including 7.3 million each of the Haley and Stormer books. All were published this year, between February and June.

Never before, trade sources say, have paperback books of any category been printed and distributed in such volume in so short a time. Never before has such literature been used to such an extent in a Presidential campaign.

### Johnson Is Target

All three books are written by ultraconservatives. They purport to offer documentation to show that the Johnson Administration is "soft on Communism" and that the President is a man of little principle.

Avid Goldwater partisans express high hopes that the books, disavowed as "smut" and right-wing propaganda by some Republican leaders, will swing close states to the Republican banner.

Democrats concede that the books are being widely discussed, but hope exposure to analysis will win back by Election Day any voter who had strayed.

Among the first organizations to buy, distribute and promote the books was the John Birch Society.

They also have been purchased by the hundreds of thousands by individual Goldwater supporters and mailed free to friends and strangers alike.

### Some End Up in Trash

Much of the circulation is duplicated and ineffective, however. Many voters have received a number of copies in the mail. Some Goldwater partisans pass them on. Others say they toss them into the waste basket.

Free mailings and cut-rate sales at campaign headquarters are continuing, but a more recent development that has heartened backers of the Republican candidate is the brisk sale of single copies at full retail prices throughout the country.

No longer are these paperbacks offered only at right-wing bookshops or in a flood of giveaway mailings. They are now stocked and prominently displayed at general bookstores from coast to coast.

Frequently they are best sellers in these shops and department stores, drug store chains, supermarkets and newsstands.

In some cases right-wing pressure was applied to get stores to stock the books.

Troy Harper, a downtown paperback outlet in San Francisco, ordered the Haley book only after repeated demands for it in which the callers asked why it was not offered and whether the store was "Communist."

### Given to Drugstores

Goldwater partisans got some chain drugstores in the Los Angeles area started by giving them large lots of the books free.

In Cleveland, Klein News, distributor of the books for the area, is supplied by the local outlet of the Birch Society for 20 cents a copy with the unlimited right to return unsold copies. Retail prices are 75 cents and \$1.

Despite a hands-off policy on the part of the Republican National Committee, Goldwater campaign headquarters in many parts of the country have jumped into the effort to put the books in the hands of as many voters as possible.

This is true, for example, in St. Louis, Denver, Salt Lake City, Nashville, Miami, Cincinnati and Houston.

Even regular Republican headquarters are selling the books in some counties, such as Dade in Florida.

"If we could get everyone to read it we would have it made," said Marcus Kyle, the Dade County Republican chairman. He was speaking of "None Dare Call It Treason."

Lloyd Waring, state chairman of the Massachusetts Goldwater Committee, says it is good politics to make use of the books. Others hedge.

The regular Harris County

Republican Headquarters here, unlike the party's campaign headquarters for the Southwest District of Houston, does not sell the books. But it refers inquiries to one of its volunteer workers in the building, who keeps a supply in her car outside.

The books were placed on sale in Republican headquarters in Salt Lake City three weeks ago after considerable soul-searching.

After receiving "a vast number of inquiries," State Chairman Ray Child sounded out Republican leaders and the books were stocked despite the strong opposition of Thomas Judd, a Republican candidate for Congress.

Gov. Robert E. Smylie of Idaho, chairman of the Republican Governors Conference, has termed "A Texan Looks at Lyndon" and similar books "smut" and urged that they not be used in the campaign.

Colorado's Republican chairman, Paul W. Wolf, said his office would "try to produce votes by entirely different methods."

Charles Percy, Republican candidate for Governor of Illinois, said he could use "only a straight-forward issues approach, without any personal attacks."

Gov. John Anderson Jr. of Kansas, immediate past-chairman of the National Conference of Governors, called use of the paperbacks "dirty politics."

But he added that "there are a lot of people circulating and reading them and they're going to show their mud." He went on:

"People are saying, 'It must be true or Johnson would sue.'"

Sources close to the President in Washington take the position that the attacks in the Haley book are incredible and will be accepted only by those who want to believe them anyway.

Lee Edwards, deputy director of information for the Republican National Committee, said "the official policy of the committee is not to recommend or endorse publications prepared outside the committee."

But Mr. Edwards added that "we have no way of controlling people out in the field."

## Attacks on President Assailed as 'Smut' and Scurrilous

### Most Popular Items

At its headquarters two blocks away in Washington the Citizens For Goldwater Committee refers the thousands of inquiries it gets for the right wing books to the Adelphi Distributing Corporation in Houston. The corporation is owned by Mrs. Eloise Liles a member of the Birch Society.

Mrs. Liles also has two retail bookstores. Because of interest in the election she said the three controversial books are her best sellers. They are prominently displayed along with Goldwater pop soap buttons and other campaign paraphernalia.

Like bookstores everywhere she also offers several biographies including competent critical biographies of the candidates books of general interest and sharply anti-Goldwater books such as Barry Goldwater Extremist on the Right by Fred J. Cook.

The Democratic National Committee has sold more than 50,000 copies of the Cook paper back. It receives a commission from the publisher for each sale.

Sale and distribution of anti-Goldwater books has been small compared with that of the right wing's big three.

A total of 73 million copies of None Dare Call It Treason have been produced since February by the W. B. Ewing Printing Company of Chicago, largest paperback printer in the world at a cost to Mr. Stormer the author of some \$600,000.

The 73 million mark was reached last month by A Texan Looks at Lyndon, which came out last June.

In both cases the author published his own book creating a company for the purpose. Mr. Stormer's is the Liberty Bell Press. It was housed first in his home in Florissant, a suburb of St. Louis. Now it shares a small building on the same street with a beauty parlor.

Mr. Haley's publishing house is the Palo Duro Press. Palo duro or hard wood is the name of a nearby canyon. The office is in Mr. Haley's modest home in Canyon, Tex.

Both authors started with small press runs. The Birch Society placed large orders for its 200 American Opinion book stores and the authors increased orders for new printings to half a million copies at a time.

The loan became too much for the small Stephens Printing Corporation of Sandusky, Ohio, which got Mr. Haley's first order. It farmed out some of the job to the J. W. Clement Company of Cleveland, the country's second largest printer of paperbacks.

The two Ohio companies have also shared the job of printing two million copies of A Choice Not an Echo. Mrs. Schlafly set up the Pere Marquette Press in Alton, Ill., where she lives as the publisher. Like the others, it is simply a small order taking office.

To keep up with the demand for his book Mr. Haley soon added two more printers, Hall and a company in the mid-South, he said he preferred not to name.

The tall, blunt author publisher rancher has had to turn his entire home into an office. Telephones and typewriters and two secretaries have been installed in the kitchen and a spare room to keep up with the orders.

Sales from Canyon and other

distribution points, the 63-year-old Texan said, are averaging 50,000 copies a day.

The Canyon post office has had a Christmas rush since June, said B. E. McCormick in charge of the distribution operation.

A Texan Looks at Lyndon sells for a dollar or 30 cents a copy in lots of 1,000 or more. The other two books are priced at 75 cents each and 20 cents in bulk.

Trade sources estimated that printing, storage, sales and shipping costs of the Stormer book handled in its present volume would be about 10 cents a copy even at the bulk rate or more than \$700,000 so far.

At his middle-class ranch home in Florissant, he denied reports that the Birch Society had subsidized publication of None Dare Call It Treason, his first book.

Mr. Stormer left his last job as editor of an electrical trade magazine in 1962 to work on the book. He said he had saved enough money to support his family and stand the expense of publishing a book.

### Born in Pennsylvania

The 36-year-old native of Pennsylvania said he was not a member of the Birch Society but that his wife was. He is chairman of his Congressional District's Goldwater Committee and until recently was chairman of the Missouri Federation of Young Republicans.

His book is described on the cover as the carefully documented story of America's retreat from victory. Its theme is the familiar right wing message that the nation is perilously close to total subjugation because of its leader's conspiratorial failure to deal effectively with Communism.

Many readers express awe at the book's elaborate documentation, but few of them have apparently seen a recent study on None Dare Call It Treason by the National Committee for Civic Responsibility.

The committee was formed last year in Cleveland as a non-partisan citizens group to encourage responsible debate and to expose the use of calumny and deception.

Since this book contains 818 references, supposedly substantiating the material contained therein, the committee reported it gives the appearance of being the well-documented study it claims to be. Nothing could be further from the truth.

The committee concludes that the Stormer book is at best an incredibly poor job of research and documentation and at worst a deliberate hoax and a fraud.

After receiving the committee's report, the American Legion in Cleveland canceled plans to distribute the book as part of a fund-raising activity.

A Texan Looks at Lyndon has been as sharply criticized as the Stormer book largely because of the author's reliance on rumor.

The book subtitled A Study in Illegitimate Power is laced with such phrases as Johnson's reported to have been and many persons believe.

Mr. Haley, author of a dozen books and booklets on Texas, handled history conceded in an interview in his book-lined study that he had made liberal use of rumor but contended that rumor is a psychological phenomenon in the public mind, the existence of which is a historical fact.

He said he expected his book to stand as critical history.

Mr. Haley ran for Governor in 196 on a platform of racial segregation and states rights.

Mr. Haley, a blunt but courteous former cowboy, is chairman of Texans for America, an ultra-conservative group that scrutinizes textbooks to make sure they promote free enter-

prise sufficiently. He said he had compiled files on Mr. Johnson ever since he "stole" the 1948 election from the candidate favored by the rancher.

A. C. Greene, editor of the editorial page of The Dallas Times Herald, wrote recently that Haley is a historian with some excellent writing to his credit, but he deserts historical principles and takes up personal hatred as his guide for "A Texan Looks at Lyndon."

"A Choice Not an Echo," Mrs. Schlafly's first book, is a slim volume that was aimed at helping Senator Goldwater to the Republican Presidential nomination.

The theme is that a small group of secret king makers, in the liberal Eastern wing of the party, has selected the Republican nominee since 1936. Hundreds of thousands of copies were distributed in California before the crucial primary election and the national convention there.

The next book for the Pere Marquette Press of Alton is Mrs. Schlafly's second book.

It is called "The Gravediggers" and subtitled "Who is Really Risking Nuclear War?"

Robert A. W. Welch Jr., founder of the Birch Society, has written that Mrs. Schlafly is a very loyal member of the Birch Society.

Other right wing paperbacks and tracts aimed at electing Senator Goldwater also are appearing at bookstores, on newsstands, and at Goldwater campaign headquarters throughout the country.

Most popular, next to the big three, is a 25-cent tabloid on newsprint called "L. B. J., a Political Biography." The right wing "Liberty Lobby" of Washington, D. C., has published a million copies.

### Books Sold in New York

Books making extreme attacks on President Johnson, which are being pushed around the country by groups supporting Senator Barry Goldwater, are being sold in book outlets of the New York City area but not in such numbers as reported in regions of the West.

Executives in the book trade agree that commercial distribution of the books is limited somewhat by amateurish sales methods of the publishers of the political tracts. Free distribution of the books by political action groups also limits sales.

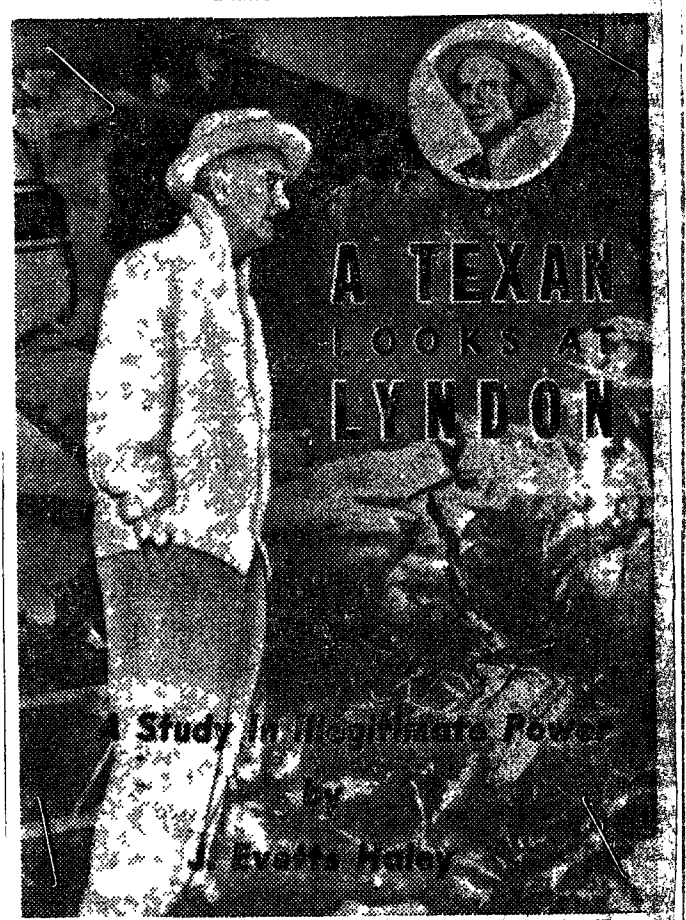
Doubleday & Company reports that in its 32 bookstores 11 of which are in the New York area the most popular of these books is A Texan Looks at Lyndon Total sales have been somewhere between 3 000 and 5 000 it is estimated

None Dare Call It Treason and A Choice Not an Echo have had less but somewhat comparable sales

The head of the book branch of a New York department store said none of these titles were on sale simply because of the insistence of the publishers that cash be paid in advance for their books Such payment is against the store's policy

Arnold Swenson manager of the Columbia University Book Store said none of the three titles were on his list for the reason that no salesman had ever approached him with an offer to deliver the books

Charles Anderson who operates the Anderson Book Store in Larchmont N Y reported he had all three books on sale and prominently displayed even though I consider them contemptible

Dear Sir:

Our agency is investigating the tampering of U.S. Mail and possible food tampering. A copy of the police report regarding this incident is enclosed.

Apparently a box of candy that had been mailed to political activist and syndicated newspaper columnist Phyllis Schlafly had been open before arriving at her residence.

Mrs. Schlafly has been an outspoken critic of the Equal Rights Amendment and is a Pro-Life Advocate. Because of this, it is suspected by her assistant that the candy may have been tampered with in some manner.

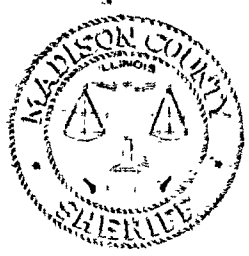

Boxes inspected at retail facilities on May 8th were decorated with plastic flowers for Mother's Day; contrary to the incoming letter, no boxes of Godiva Chocolates were covered in cellophane.
