



During World War II he wrote a number of Radio Appeals for the Red Cross and short dramas for blood donor drives. The publication observed that BRADBURY has written the following books, most of which are composed of a number of short stories:

The publication observed that ERADBURY has done much radio and motion picture writing and was a prime contributor to "Suspense" a Columbia Broadcasting System (CBS) production. MARTIN A. BERKELEY, 1336 North Benedict Canyon Road Los Angeles, California (4/10/59)

MARTIN A. BERKELEY, a self-admitted former member of the CP in New York City and Los Angeles, California, and who has previously testified under oath before the HCUA, on April 10, 1959, advised that BRADBURY was one of the more prominent writers of science fiction in the United States. He also felt BRADBURY was probably sympathetic with certain pro-Communist elements in the WGAW. He stated BRADBURY, during a meeting of Screen Writers Guild (SWG), now known as WGAW, entered into a discussion of a resolution propounded for the membership as to whether or not to keep CP members and those writers who had invoked the Fifth Amendment from becoming members of the SWG.

BERKELEY reported that BRADBURY, during the course of the discussion, rose to his feet and shouted. "Cowards and Mc Carthyites" when the resolution was discussed. BERKELEY stated it has been his observation that some of the writers suspected of having Communist backgrounds have been writing in the field of science fiction and it appears that science fiction may be a lucrative field for the introduction of Communist ideologies. He noted that some of BRADBURY's stories have been definitely slanted against the United States and its capitalistic form of Government.

Informant observed that Communists have found fertile opportunities for development; for spreading distrust and lack of confidence in America institutions in the area of science fiction writing. Informant declared that a number of science fiction writers have created illusions with regard to the impossibility of continuing world affairs in an organized manner now or in the future through the medium of futuristic stories concerned with the potentialities of science.

Informant advised that individuals such as RAY BRADBURY are in a position to special poison concerning political institutions in general are American institutions in particular. He noted that individuals such as BRADBURY have reached a large audience through their writings which are generally published in paper backed volumes in large quantities. Informant stated that the general aim of these science fiction writers is to frighten the people into a state of paralysis or psychological incompetence bordering on hysteria which would make it very possible to conduct a Third World War in which the American people would seriously believe could not be won since their morale had been seriously destroyed.

The informant observed that this appeal taken by the science fiction writers sympathetic to Communist ideology, is similar to the approach taken by a small number of scientists who hold that it is impossible to conceive of war without threatening the isolation of the Universe.

The Women for Legislative Action bulletin, polume 7, number 4, for December, 1958 disclosed that RAY BRADBURY had been a guest at the 7th annual WLA dinner which had been held at the Statler Hotel, Los Angeles, California, November 8, 1958.

"People's World" (PW); "Daily People's World" (until 1957)

The "Daily People's World" now known as the "People's World," became a weekly publication in February, 1957, and is a West Coast Communist newspaper.

The "Daily People's World": (11/13/52)

The "Daily People's World" on page seven as dated above, published an article which disclosed that RAY BRADBURY in a full page advertisement in the trade paper "Daily Variety" (previously identified) noted:

"'I have seen too much fear in a country that has no right to be afraid. I have seen too many campaigns in California, as well as in other states won on the issue of fear itself, and not on the facts. I do not want to hear any more of this claptrap and nonsense from you.

"'I will not welcome it from McCARTHY or McCARRAN, from Mr. NIXON, DONALD JACKSON or a man named SPARKMAN. I do not want any more lies, any more prejudice, any

more smears. I do not intimations, hearsay or rumor. I do not want unsigned letters or nameless telephone calls from either side, or from anyone.

PW: (9/6/58)

The PW on page three as dated above, published an article entitled "UnAmericans Stir Public Ire." The article observed that 100 eminent citizens among them scientists, college professors, legislators, religionists of many denominations, professional leaders and businessmen publicly proclaimed their objections to the abuses of the UnAmerican committee of congress in a notable document. The article noted that the pronouncement took the form of an ad published in the Los Angeles Times and the Los Angeles Mirror News (Large daily Los Angeles Metropolitan newspapers). The ad quoted the "opinion of the Board of Governors of the State Bar of California, that proceedings of the committee were improper and lacking in dignity...and such a character as to pose a threat...to proper independence of the bar!" Signers of the ad were; according to the PW article, "hailed as representing probably the broadist and most represented group yet to challenge the procedures of the UnAmericans." BRADBURY was named as one of the signers of this pronouncement.

LA T-11: (4/28/59)

Informant advised that BRADBURY appeared before a small group of people who had gathered at the La Positino Coffee-house, 19453 West Pacific Coast Highway, Malibu, California on April 19, 1959. BRADBURY told those present how he wrote his stories and he discussed in particular a short story entitled "The Fireman," He stated this story sold over 50,000 copies in Russia until it was banned by the Russian Government apparently since the Russian Government felt it slandered their type of government as well as many other countries.

Informants who have general knowledge of the CP and its activities in the area in which BRADBURY resides, advised he is unknown to them.

APPENDIX

AMERICAN CIVIL LIBERTIES UNION

The FBI has never conducted an investigation of the American Civil Liberties Union. It is noted that the Fifth Report of the California Senate Fact-Finding Committee on Un-American Activities (1949) notes the following: "American Civil Liberties Union: Cited as heavily infiltrated with Communists and fellow travelers and frequently following the Communist Party line and defending Communists, particularly in its Los Angeles unit. (California Committee on Un-American Activities Report, 1948, pages 108-12)"

In connection with the foregoing citation the following is noted: In January, 1955, an official of the California Senate Fact-Finding Committee on Un-American Activities advised that a representative of the American Civil Liberties Union contacted the Committee to discuss the above citation. At that time this individual advised that two members of the American Civil Liberties Union in Los Angeles had been expelled because of their pro-Communist sympathies. On May 27, 1955, a representative of the California Senate Fact-Finding Committee on Un-American Activities advised that the status of the American Civil Liberties Union, insofar as the Committee's evaluation is concerned, has not been changed and that the Committee's past characterizations of the American Civil Liberties Union remain the same.

In connection with the above, it is noted that the 34th Annual Report of the American Civil Liberties Union (for the year 1954) re-affirms the anti-Communist and anti-Fascist policy of the American Civil Liberties Union and maintains also that it will defend the civil liberties of all persons regardless of any political party, organization, denomination, race or nationality to which a person may belong.

On March 12, 1968, LA T-2 advised that Bradbury is an extremely active writer in the science fiction area and has produced some plays. LA T-2 further stated that Bradbury is active in opposing United States policy in Vletnam and has actively participated in local demonstrations for many causes. LA T-2 could furnish no information on the present activities or involvement of Bradbury.

On March 21, 1968, LA T-3 advised that Raymond Douglas Bradbury was a member of the Writers Guild of America, West and that he is currently residing at 10265 Cheviot Drive, Los Angeles, California. LA T-3 advised he was unable to furnish any information on the current activities of Bradbury.

On April 17, 1968, LA T-4 advised that Raymond Douglas Bradbury resides at 10265 Cheviot Drive, Los Angeles, California, telephone number VE 9-6530 (unlisted) and is married to Marguerite Bradbury, nee McClure. According to LA T-4 Bradbury was one of the founders of HELP (Help Establish Lasting Peace), a group formed in 1961 in the Los Angeles area with the purpose of demonstrating for peace.

As of 1964, LA T-4 stated that Bradbury was a member of the American Civil Liberties Union.

LA T-4 stated that Bradbury was active in the following groups, which were formed to participate and demonstrate against the war in Vietnam in the Los Angeles area:

In 1967, he was a sponsor for Assembly of Men and Women of the Arts concerned with the war in Vietnam; in 1966, he was a sponsor for the Westside Committee of Concern on Vietnam; in 1963, he was a sponsor for Southern California Council for a Sane Nuclear Policy; as of 1960 he was a member of Los Angeles Committee for a Sane Nuclear Policy.

LA T-4 stated that Bradbury was observed on October 27, 1962 as a protestor on a picket line sponsored by the Los Angeles Student Peace Union, a group formed to protest the blockade of Cuba. In 1963, Bradbury, according to LA T-4, was active with CORE, a civil rights organization, in planning strategy of demonstrations.

On September 29, 1962, LA T-4 stated that the "Daily People's World", a well known West Coast communist publication, contained an article on page 12 entitled "Opposition at Home and Abroad Rises Against U. S. Policy in Cuba." This article made reference to a public hearing by 44 prominent Americans against military intervention and an appeal for re-establishing relations with Cuba. This appeal appeared as an advertisement in the "New York Times" on September 16, 1962 and Bradbury was a signer.

On July 19, 1968, LA T-4 was recontacted and he

On May 13, 1968, the records of the Retail Merchants Credit Association, Los Angeles were reviewed and they reflected that Ray Douglas Bradbury and his wife, Marguerite, had a record since 1950. As of October 1959, his residence was 10265 Cheviot Drive, Los Angeles, California. The record showed the following inquiries: November 1, 1967, Chesterfield Music Shop; Docember 1966, Los Angeles Department of Water and Power; September 1966, Alfred Dunkill, 136 South Rodeo Drive, Beverly Hills (telephone CR 4-5351). His occupation is listed as a free lance writer and it shows he is a member in good standing of the Screen Writers Guild, Los Angeles, California,

On June 22, 1968 and July 7, 1968, sources of information familiar with some phases of Cuban activity in the Los Angeles area were contacted and they could furnish no information regarding the activities of Bradbury.

On May 28, 1968, the records of the Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD), Los Ingeles, California, reflected that Ray Douglas Bradbury was arrested on December 31, 1943 on suspicion of violation of a Selective Service and Training Act, 1940 and he was released on January 3, 1944, record number 62193, booking number 5874. The records of the LAPD contain no additional record concerning Bradbury.

On May 27, 1968, the records of the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Office (LASO), Los Angeles, California, were reviewed and they contained no information identifiable to Bradbury.
