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WRITTEN STATEMENT:

The audio statement I have given this 27th day of July 1996 is of my own free will and its contents are true to the best of my knowledge and belief.

RECORDED STATEMENT:

[REDACTED]: The time now is 8:40. You are requesting that the fact - if in fact we have a tape recorder, that this could be tape recorded and you agreed to that Richard?

RICHARD JEWELL (Anthony Davis Associates - Performance Security Guard): Oh yeah!

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Noted tape transmission problem. ????

[REDACTED] What took place tonight and all of the events?

RICHARD JEWELL: I will try to go over in the order that it happened. During the break between Jack Mack and the Heart Attacks, the band that was playing the second time tonight - when they break for the news, [REDACTED] who is working stage security was asked by one of the Chicago NBC reporters if he could assist him right in front of my tower which would be the East Sound and Light Tower, due to some intoxicated persons that were -- he was afraid was going to jump in front of the camera while he was broadcasting live. At that point, I saw -- I didn't know it at the time, but I saw [REDACTED] walking over toward the tower and he stopped up front and was watching and he was using his radio and so I flipped from channel 15, which is our channel, to 14 to hear what the stage was doing. And [REDACTED] was asking for another officer to come out to assist him with that and I just " (keyed) the mike and I said [REDACTED] I'm right here, I can catch it for you " and he turned around and I just waved at him and he said "come on down". So I walked down where I could still see my post and assist him on the other side of the corridor. At that time, the gentleman started broadcasting and there were seven white males sitting on the far -- if you're facing the tower, not the stage, if you're facing the tower from the front of the pavilion, the far left of the aluminum fenced in area that I had asked them to put up instead of just the regular fence they built an actual tin wall for it and uh, they were sitting on two benches that NBC had placed there for their reporters to sit when they were doing live shots because that tower right there is where the cable to their cameras -- that's where one of their live feed stations is. So there were seven males there and they were intoxicated, they were drinking, carrying on, -- uh -- disturbing some of the other people that were there, jumping around. I personally observed them doing shotguns which is when they pop the bottom of the beer and then turn it up and pop the top and it just all goes down your throat and I saw them do that a couple of times. And while I was standing there, I observed that they were taking the beer out of a green bag -- uh-- that was sitting to the right side of the bench where they were all - There were about four of them sitting and three of them standing. They were all cutting up like college kids would. About this time, one of them - they were staring me and [REDACTED] down - kind of like watching

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what we were doing and stuff and one of them walked over toward me and tried to get to the camera, between the camera man and the reporter and I just reached my arm out like that and I said "I'm sorry Sir, you will have to go around" and he kind of bumped into my arm and looked at me and said "man, I just want to be on TV" and I said "well that's fine, you can go down there and sit on that stone right there and be on TV from a distance. I can't let you jump in front of the camera. I'm sorry" — "Oh come on man, I want my mom to see me" or something to that effect and I just told him "Sir, please just go on" and he kind of pushed off of me and went on down and sat down and started running his mouth and yelling and one of the other guys that was over there went down there and kind of said "come on - get, get away from there", and uh - they started yelling a few things and I just told them, I said "listen, y'all need to just go on back over there, 'cause if y'all continue this, I'm going to have to call law enforcement. And so they went on over there and that was the end of that. The reporter quit reporting and the lights went out and then they quit trying even to come over there. I went on back to my post, [redacted] went back up to the stage-stage, and probably about five or ten minutes later, I usually walked inside my perimeter of the fence every couple of hours, I would walk inside just to make sure that nobody had jumped the fence and was laying down or anything like that. I just did it - I mean I just do that. And uh - when I walked around this time, I had had a vent cut on the front of the fence so that the TV guys could get their cables run into their box. Well these guys were pushing all of their beer cans in through there and they had thrown some of them over the top, like 10 or 15 beer cans inside the the - uh perimeter of the tower. And I was afraid that if they kept throwing them, they might actually throw one into the sound booth on the first floor and hit a knob or something while a concert was going on and cause a problem. So at that point, I took my foot and I pushed the cans out from under and back out in front and I immediately went out to my gate and flagged down the first trooper or the first uniformed officer I saw. He wound up being a GBI agent that I know [redacted] Uh - [redacted] I told [redacted] what I had and how they were acting and he said "don't worry Richard, I'll take care of it". He walked around to the front and I walked back into the perimeter of the tower to the far corner where I could look down. I went to the Techwood side where I could look down the tower and see what was going on so that if he needed some help - I mean I didn't actually walk up front with him. Well, as I walked over there to the Techwood side, I saw the subjects and they were almost on the sidewalk walking up toward Swatch. So I walked back out and back toward the front of the tower to let the officer know that they had already left and that never-mind about it. And he had already started walking toward me and said "they were already gone" and I said "well, they are walking up the hill right there if you want to talk to them cause of them a couple of them are under age or something and just to let them know that you were looking for them. He said "OK" so he started walking again and I said "hey - there was another green bag and it looked like an alicepack". I had seen both of them before and I had just assumed that they were both there, so I said "hey, they left one of their bags". And the officer said "Uh OK, I'll tell them". So he walked - he hollered at them and two of them stopped and the rest of them kept walking. He walked up to the two that stopped and said "is that y'all - did y'all leave a bag up there?" and they - from talking to him afterwards - they told him "no, that they did not leave a bag". So he walked back to me and said "they said it wasn't theirs" and I said "well, it wasn't

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here an hour and a half ago when I came 'cause I walked outside the tower also and it wasn't - I mean that was one of the things I looked for to make sure NBC didn't leave anything on the benches, or under the benches, or anything. And it wasn't there then. So some time between that time when I saw them when I was with the camera man and after - before that and after I had done that walk around, somebody put that bag there or those guys brought it with them and lied and said it wasn't theirs. So at this point, I told him, I said "well, how do you want to handle this?" I said, "I don't want to touch it". He said, "I don't want to touch it either". I said "well, we need to handle it then as a suspicious bag" I said and so we started asking about five or six people right in the general vicinity if they had seen the bag, who had put it there, uh - if it was theirs, nobody knew anything about it, so at that point, he called the ATF phone call team that was in the park; I called [redacted] who is my area supervisor, on my channel, and let him know I needed him at the tower immediately ...radio that we had a problem. I just wanted to get him up there as quickly as possible. I also switched down to [redacted] channel and I called him and said "I need you at the tower". And they both responded very quickly. I advised both of them what we had. Uh - In this time frame, myself, the trooper, and [redacted] went back to the stage to let his people know what was going on and he also advised - uh- contacted [redacted] I believe on the radio; I had flipped back to my channel with [redacted] Uh, myself [redacted] and the one GBI agent that was there cleared about a 25 foot zone so that when the ATF crew got there, they had a little area to play around in. We really didn't want to move a bunch of people yet 'cause we didn't want to cause a panic or anything. The band had already started playing again, and we really didn't know what we had. At this point, approximately two minutes later, the ATF team - two-member team arrived. They took control of the area; I had walked inside - back inside my tower and uh - at this point, a couple of other uniformed officers - police officers had arrived and [redacted] was coordinating that part of the front. I walked back into the tower and went to each floor and I told them that we had a situation, it was being investigated, that it had a suspicious package in front of the tower and that if I came back in and told them to get out, there would be no questions - that they would drop what they were doing, regardless and they would leave the tower. I went to each level and told each person that. Uh, they all just looked at me and I think they thought I was kidding at first, but I've worked there every day since they've been here and they know my background and I let them know I wasn't kidding. I mean uh - I thank God that they didn't think I was kidding 'cause it saved their lives. But uh, I got - went back out after I told everybody and made sure everybody was there and went up to the VIP level, cleared it and made sure nobody was there that should not be and made sure there were no VIPs there 'cause I was going to go ahead and get them to leave right then - to go ahead and ask them to ease on out. Thank God there wasn't anybody there but the staff. At that point, I went back out to the gate of the tower and by this time, there were probably 10 or 15 law enforcement officers there. I walked back up to the tower - in front of the tower - and talked to [redacted] and about that time, the ATF guys were actually looking in the package and they jumped up, cut off their radios, and grabbed a cell phone and ran to Techwood. And when that happened, I knew it was real. The other ATF agent ran over toward the troopers and started telling them to get everybody off of this hill and get them out of here. I immediately - as soon as I heard them say that, I ran back into the tower and started getting them out. I got everybody out; I went to every

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floor; the two spot guys didn't want to leave; I got them out of there and they were wanting to cut their spots out and stuff and I said "listen, get out of the tower". I literally grabbed one of them and pushed them down the stairs. I got down to video and the guy was wanting to grab his briefcase and he was putting his car keys or something in there and I grabbed him by the arm and I said "come on - let's get out of here". I got everybody out of the building. I was the last one out of the building; I ran out behind them, shut the little pull thing that I had and told them to go all the way to the middle. A couple of them sat down on the benches and I told them "No - I want y'all away until we find out what's going on. This is serious. Y'all get away." They started - I got some of them away and then once some of the other agents arrived, they had - I talked to one of the other troopers that I knew and that the DOD was on - the bomb disposal was on the way - and at that point, I just went back up to where my gate is going into the tower and stood right there next to the refreshment area to make sure that no one else - that I could guarantee that there was no one else in that tower. And I just stayed right there - just right about 10 feet from the tower until the bomb went off. And it threw me down on the ground and I jumped back up and while I was - it didn't really knock me down - I mean knock me over - I mean I really didn't get blown down, but the concussion of it knocked me over and as I was getting up, the couple of troopers that I had just been talking to about a minute before were still flying through the air. And uh - I jumped up and started running toward them to see if they were hurt 'cause there were still some people in front of them that wouldn't move and there was a camera crew right there that were laying on the ground and I ran up 'cause I'm the first responder and I was getting ready to start working on them and a couple of other troopers had already started working on them, and I turned around and looked and people were starting to go back in the tower. So I dropped - I just turned on my heels and ran back up there and yelled at them to "get out, get out, there might be another explosion. There's all that electricity in there, get out. Y'all don't need to go in." "Well I need my car keys" one of them said. I'll never forget that my whole life. I need my car keys. I grabbed him by the arm and pulled him out and I said "I-We will get you home later. Get over there - y'all run to Bud World and you know - stay there until I come to get you". That's all I remember. After that, it was mass confusion as far as - I just tried to keep people out of the area until there were enough law enforcement and medical people there and then the officer that I had first - me and the officer were first there - they grabbed us and took us off and started interviewing us immediately.

[redacted] You mentioned there were seven males?

RICHARD JEWELL: Yes sir.

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[redacted] Can you identify them?

RICHARD JEWELL: Yes sir. They are between the ages of 20 and 25 - uh - I could identify four of them if I saw them again. The other three were kind of off in the background a little bit and I really didn't - really didn't get a good look at those other than that they were white males, college student age (cough - excuse me). Uh - the other gentleman, uh, the one that actually bumped into my arm was a white male about 5'7";

had shoulder length hair, a little bit curly, dark brown, was wearing brown pants, excuse me he was wearing blue jeans, uh, and did not have a shirt on. He was well tanned and very muscular for his size and you could see the muscles in his abdomen and also his chest muscles. No facial hair; he was very intoxicated and he's the one that tried to jump on the camera. The second one was about 5'9", wearing brown pants and a maroon T-shirt, his hair was to the T-shirt's collar, uh - I'd say he was probably about 180 - 185 lbs. uh- and he was also intoxicated; he spoke with what I call "a drunken slur". Uh - the other two gentlemen that were standing right behind him when he came and got me, the first gentleman was probably about 5'11", 220 - 230 lbs., about my size or larger build. He was wearing blue jeans and a dark colored shirt and the fourth gentleman was wearing blue jeans, had brown hair and was wearing a white T-shirt with no sleeves, what you would call (What kind of T-shirt would you call that? Tank top. Thank you). He was wearing a tank top T-shirt, white color, and blue jeans. And I believe he's the only one I really looked at his feet, because he had pants that were kind of little bit up, but he had sandals on. That's the only shoe I can identify. Those four guys if I ever see them again, in ten years, I'll know everyone of them, 'cause after this happened, I mean it just - they're set in my mind. But the other three, I mean they were off in the background; they pretty much stayed over near the bench and everything and in the shadows and I never really got a good look at them. But those four guys - there were seven of them total - but those four guys I mean were the four that I can identify. And uh - they talked later about - they wanted me to go home and get some sleep and they said they would probably come by tomorrow and would want me to do it; They are going to bring a police sketch person in and wanted me to see what I could do.

You mentioned there were two bags. Can you describe the bags? The bag that was left.

RICHARD JEWELL: Yes sir, the bag that was left, both myself and the police officer that was there or the GBI agent - uh - I thought it looked like a military alice pack; I don't know if you're familiar - I've got - I was in the law enforcement here in Georgia for six years, and I did a lot of work with the GBI drug task force and the one cutting dope and stuff and I ordered a harness and machete and canteen holders for - 'cause we'll go out in the woods all day long out of one of these military catalogues, so I know what an alice pack looks like I've seen them before and I've also seen them like in Army-Navy stores. It looked just like an alice pack; it was about that long; I'd say about what two and a half - two feet long by a foot and a half wide and it was olive green in color and it had an opening on the top of it. It had a strap sticking out just barely on the side where the grass - shoulder strap on the one side of the grass and that is all that I saw. I didn't get any closer than probably three feet in front of it, so I didn't actually see the top of it if it had any pouches on it like an alice pack would have. But if I had to bet my last dollar, I would say that's what it was, the one that was left. The other one that they carried off was actually smaller, almost like a book bag, but it was a little bit bigger than that and I think what it possibly might be - I've seen those new bags that are coolers - that like you can throw on your back - it looked like one of those and that's the one that they were taking the beer out of, the one that they took with them. And it was the same color - an olive

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green - a greenish color. Uh - that's about it. We got as many people away from the hill as we could, I mean you saw me, I was hollering in peoples' ear telling them to get up - move to the middle please. Get up. You were standing right there. How far were you when it went off? You had to be pretty close yourself.

[] I had just went back in to see about evacuating the park at that time.

RICHARD JEWELL: Brother, I'm glad you went in and weren't standing where you were when it went off 'cause that's where about four of them were hit, right there brother.

[] Sure enough. You mentioned []

RICHARD JEWELL: Yeah. Real big muscular guy, short hair, he's one of your guys ADAs, the guys out of California. I can't - I don't remember his last name, but I know he's one of the stage crew supervisors, I believe.

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[] Is he the one with the blond hair?

RICHARD JEWELL: Yeah. Short blond hair. Yeah. That's him.

[] How tall is he?

RICHARD JEWELL: [] he's about my - actually he's maybe an inch or two shorter; he could pick me up and throw me somewhere if he wanted to. He's a pretty big fellow.

[] I know what you're talking about.

RICHARD JEWELL: Real soft spoken - got a real good intimidating look. I mean he's good at what he does. I've watched him, he's really good at what he does. You can tell he's been in the business for a while I think.

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[] Yeah!

/ RICHARD JEWELL: I just wish more of those people would have listened to us. Well.

[] Was there anyone else in that area that you know of?

RICHARD JEWELL: No sir. That area to me is a blind spot other than when I walk around and check the building. It's a blind area and uh - I mean - there are a couple of things that I did before the Olympics ever started up there - that I mean - probably a lot of people knew my name in the construction up there because I raised cain about a couple of things that I thought were imperative security-wise up there, and uh - got some things done, and if I hadn't had, he'd probably - they cut the hole where the cables went in too big. It was big enough for a man to crawl in and I went back and got one of the

construction guys to put two 2x4's in where only a hand can get in there - 'cause I was concerned - there's a big hole underneath the tower that if a concert was going on, a child could have crawled right through there and gone down in that hole. And secondly, I mean that's where all of the power is; I didn't want some man crawling in there and getting in with the power, so I had that corrected, and I also got that fence taken down that was up originally and had them - that was kind of my idea to put up that tin to build a wall; it was more secure and that way, we had one way in and one way out and there was no question about somebody coming with a knife and cutting those ties and walking in on the back side of the tower like they did several times. So I mean I was pleased that it was working really well; I mean they didn't get in the tower and they didn't get in one of our buildings. Still, I feel partly responsible I guess. I don't know. I walked around every couple of hours - I walked around. I don't know what more I could have done.

[redacted] It was truly commendable what you did, [redacted] and everybody feels that way. Definitely, more lives possibly could have been lost because of that if you hadn't reacted the way you reacted. [redacted] do you have some questions?

[redacted] Yeah. Just personal information so we know how to get in touch with you. You're employed by...?

RICHARD JEWELL: I'm with ADA right now.

[redacted] What's a good contact number?

RICHARD JEWELL: 404-320-7576. That's my home number.

[redacted] That's your home number?

RICHARD JEWELL: Yes sir. I don't have a pager or anything at this time.

[redacted] Do you live here in Atlanta?

RICHARD JEWELL: Yes sir I do.

[redacted] What's your address?

RICHARD JEWELL: 3649 Buford Highway, Apartment F-3, Atlanta 30329

[redacted] What's your last name?

RICHARD JEWELL: J E W E L L - like a piece of jewelry, but just with two "ls".

[redacted] Richard Jewell.

RICHARD JEWELL: Yes sir.

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[redacted] That's about it. Thank you very much. We certainly appreciate everything you did and a lot of people - more people would have gotten hurt if you hadn't cleared that area.

RICHARD JEWELL: Well, thank you sir. I was just doing what I was trained to do sir.

[redacted] You did a good job.

[redacted] Do you have any questions, [redacted]

[redacted] No, no I don't.

RICHARD JEWELL: If I can, can I get you guy's names on a piece of paper 'cause I've been ---- my number's published in the phone book and I'm sure when they find out about who I was down there, they are going to see reporters calling, and if y'all call, I want to be able to know who I'm talking to so that I don't say anything on the phone that I shouldn't. And what I will probably do even if y'all call, I'll ask to get a number and I'll call you right back. That way, I know who I'm talking to. I don't want somebody saying they are somebody. I've dealt with that before. Will that be alright with you guys?

[redacted] Yeah, sure.

[redacted] Stephens County Courthouse, Deputy Sheriff, work phone (706) 886-2514, home phone [redacted] (cellular), SSN [redacted] was advised of the identity of the interviewing agent and the purpose of the interview. He then provided the following information:

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[redacted] was a Demorest police officer [redacted] when he worked with RICHARD JEWELL. At the time JEWELL was a full-time Sheriff's Deputy in Habersham County and was a part-time police officer at the Demorest Police Department.

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[redacted] described JEWELL as a "glory hound" that tended to create situations to get attention. [redacted] further stated that JEWELL was overly aggressive and would make a problem materialize even if it was not "going anywhere." JEWELL was also extremely rough on cars, always drove very fast, and once wrecked [redacted] police car and never reported the incident.

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[redacted] stated in 1993 there were two phone booth bombings in Demorest, approximately 2 weeks apart. According to [redacted] the first explosion did little damage only breaking one section of window in the phone booth. The second explosion completely destroyed the phone booth. [redacted] stated the second bomb contained black powder, and was made of a plastic resembling a lime shaped, lime juice container available in any grocery store.

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[redacted] advised that many complaints were made regarding JEWELL during his time at both the Demorest Police Department (DPD), and Habersham County Sheriff's Department. [redacted] recommended contacting former DPD Chief, GREGORY ELLINGSON or Habersham County Sheriff HARRISON NIX for further information regarding JEWELL'S performance at these two agencies.

On 08/01/1996, SA [redacted] and SA [redacted] conducted the following investigation in Sautee, Georgia, as a follow up to a Georgia Bureau of Investigation (GBI) report that RICHARD JEWELL continues to receive mail at P.O. Box 305, Sautee, Georgia. The Post Office shows JEWELL's address to be at the [redacted] Sautee, Georgia.

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A drive by of the JEWELL address was conducted with the assistance of White County Deputy Sheriff [redacted]. The home is on a dirt road in [redacted] off of [redacted] in Sautee. It is located at [redacted] Sautee, Georgia [redacted].

The residence at [redacted] is a white pre-fab home and was well lit at 3:30 am. There was no visible activity.

In the driveway were three cars:

These three vehicles are registered to [redacted] Sautee, Georgia, [redacted].

RICHARD ALLENSWORTH JEWELL, date of birth 12/17/62, Social Security Account Number 257-06-3351, 3649 Buford Highway, Apartment F3, Atlanta, Georgia 30329, telephone (404)320-7576, was advised to the identity of the interviewing agents and the purpose of the interview. JEWELL was interviewed at AD:VENT.LA, 1159 Logan Circle, Atlanta, Georgia. JEWELL furnished the following information:

JEWELL is employed as a Security Guard by ANTHONY DAVIS ASSOCIATES SECURITY, and is contracted to AMERICAN TELEPHONE & TELEGRAPH (AT&T), to guard a tower in CENTENNIAL OLYMPIC PARK. His scheduled duty hours are 6:00 PM to 6:00 AM.

JEWELL stationed himself, at 6:00 PM, at the gate to the aluminum fence which surrounds the tower he was assigned to guard. JEWELL'S primary duty was to keep unauthorized individuals from accessing the tower. The tower contained sound and lighting equipment for the evening's entertainment.

From 6:00 PM until approximately 10:15 PM, JEWELL remained at the tower. During this time period, he was occasionally visited by various law enforcement officers, who would stop and get a drink of cold water, which JEWELL had made available to them. At approximately 10:15 PM JEWELL was relieved by [redacted] (last name unknown (LNU)), a roving Security Guard, so he could go to the bathroom. JEWELL came back at 10:20 PM and walked around the outside and inside of the tower. JEWELL saw nothing. In response to the question, had he looked under the benches, JEWELL was 100% sure that there was nothing under the benches when he walked by.

Between 11:30 PM and 12:00 AM, there was a break in the concert and a live camera crew began to set up forward of the left front corner of the tower. This was an NBC crew from either Los Angeles or Chicago and one of them was named [redacted] (LNU).

While the camera crew was setting up, JEWELL noticed an AT&T Security Guard walking from the stage area towards the tower, talking on a radio. JEWELL flipped his radio to another frequency and heard the Security Guard requesting assistance next to the live camera. JEWELL cut in and volunteered to help and moved to a position to the right of the camera crew.

As JEWELL positioned himself, he noticed seven (7) white males, four (4) sitting on the benches and three (3) standing next to the right front corner of the tower. The white males were drinking beer in a shotgun manner, by raising the cans over their mouths, punching a hole in the bottom of the cans and popping the tops to make all the beer rush out into their mouths.

JEWELL also noticed two (2) green bags next to the bench which the white males were sitting on. One (1) of the bags was on the ground, under the bench, by the feet of the white male sitting to the far left, as you look at the bench. The other was on the ground next to the right corner of the bench. JEWELL saw the individuals reaching into the bag at the right corner of the bench and pulling out beers. He never saw them go into the bag under the bench.

While JEWELL was standing next to the camera crew he saw the seven (7) white males talking about the news crew. One of the individuals, who was wearing jeans and no shirt, got up and tried to get in front of the camera. JEWELL exchanged words with him until one of the other white males came over and pulled his friend away. JEWELL suggested to them if they wanted to get into the picture they should go sit on the concrete leaves located just in front of the camera. The white male, wearing jeans and no shirt, went over and sat down on the concrete leaves. JEWELL suggested reviewing the news tapes to see if they contained a picture of the individual.

After the camera shot ended JEWELL walked the perimeter within the tower fence. Inside he found beer cans with puncture holes in the bottom of them. He kicked the cans towards the opening in the fence where the electric cables ran through and went after a law enforcement individual. As he walked out of the gate he met up with [REDACTED] GEORGIA BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION (GBI) and asked him to get the kids out. [REDACTED] left and went to the front of the tower. JEWELL went inside the tower fence and walked along the rear of the fence. When he looked over the

fence he noticed five (5) of the individuals leaving together and the other two (2) close behind. JEWELL went to the front of the tower and met with [REDACTED] JEWELL noticed that they had left one of the packs behind and told [REDACTED] went up to the last two individuals to ask if they had left a bag behind. When [REDACTED] came back he told JEWELL that the bag was not theirs. The seven (7) white males walked away down Techwood.

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JEWELL and [REDACTED] began asking people, approximately fifteen (15), if the bag was theirs. No one claimed the bag or saw an individual leave it behind.

JEWELL heard [REDACTED] call the package in as a, "27", a suspicious package, and began to move people back between fifteen (15) and twenty (20) feet away. JEWELL also went into the tower and told the people inside that there was a suspicious package outside and if he told them to get out to do as he says.

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When JEWELL went back to the front of the tower he saw an ATF Agent walking towards the package. The ATF Agent got down on his stomach and moved towards the package. He opened the package and looked inside. JEWELL noticed the ATF Agent freeze, reach around and turn off his radio and move away slowly. JEWELL knew it was a bomb from the agent's reaction, since JEWELL had some law enforcement training on the handling of bombs.

JEWELL heard the ATF Agent describe what he saw in the package as some metal pipe and some wires. JEWELL saw the ATF Agent take a cellular phone and move away from the tower. JEWELL then went into the tower and told the people they had one (1) minute to clear the tower.

Shortly after everyone had cleared the tower the bomb exploded. JEWELL was standing at the opposite corner of the tower from the detonation and heard a loud noise and felt the explosion push him from behind. JEWELL smelt what he described as black powder and saw grey smoke. His conclusion that he smelt black powder was based on his experience with black powder muzzle loaders, which smell similar when fired.

JEWELL described the package under the bench as a green, olive colored, military style, "alice pack" and the package at the corner of the bench with the beers in it, as a

newer style back pack, possibly with a liner for keeping items cold.

When JEWELL reflected on the incident he could not believe that the people in the vicinity of the package would not immediately move away when told to do so by law enforcement. JEWELL stated that he felt if the people had listened to the Officers trying to clear the area, no one would have been injured.

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Upon learning that the band was not going to perform, the black couple left the bench and [redacted] did not see them after that point. The group of males began picking up their beer cans and planned to exit the park. [redacted] estimated the time to be approximately 12:45 a.m. (July 27, 1996). [redacted] stated that it

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Upon exiting Centennial Park, the males stood on the corner of Techwood and International Streets, where they split up in two different directions. [REDACTED] decided to return home and [REDACTED] walked toward the House of Blues. [REDACTED] estimated it took approximately 20 minutes to walk to that establishment and it was here there that the friends stood debating as to whether or not to enter. [REDACTED] estimated that the time was approximately 1:20-1:25 a.m. It was then that he heard a loud noise. [REDACTED] advised that he did not realize what the source of that noise was until later that same day while watching the news.

On 8/1/1996, SA [redacted] conducted the following investigation in Atlanta, Georgia.

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In December 1993 there were two phone booth bombings in Demorest, Georgia. During the time of the explosions RICHARD JEWELL was employed as a full time Sheriff's Deputy in Habersham County, and was also a part time police officer for the city of Demorest.

According to Habersham County Sheriff's Office Incident report, dated 12/13/96 JEWELL, [redacted] were directed by the Sheriff's Office dispatcher to respond to the phone booth next to the Demorest Post Office.

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According to reports from the Georgia Bureau of Investigation (GBI), and/or the Habersham County Sheriff's Office (HCSO) there were two separate phone booth bombings in Demorest in December 1993. The first explosion did little damage — destroying the tray below the phone, and a section of window. The HCSO has no report on file for this bombing. The second bombing, on 12/13/1996 destroyed the entire phone booth. All 4 walls and the roof were blown apart.

The HCSO Case Number is 93121481. Two arrests were made for this bombing. [redacted] SSN [redacted] and [redacted] SSN [redacted] were arrested and charged with Criminal Damage to Property and Criminal Possession of an Incendiary.

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The HCSO Incident report, Radio and Message logs, Arrest reports, and GBI Assistance Rendered report have been put in a 1A envelope and entered into the main case file.

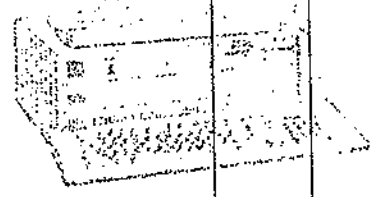
