I. Recommendation:

It is recommended that authority be continued to pay SF 2496-S at the rate of up to \$150.00 a month for services and up to \$45.00 a month for expenses actually incurred. Informant presently has limited contact with SWP members, due to the fact that he is working nights and attending school during the day. Until such time as he is able to resume full activities, he will be paid on a C.O.D. basis only for information of value that he furnishes. This amount is requested for a period of four months, effective 3/15/65.

II. RESIDENCE AND EMPLOYMENT:

Informant continues to reside at 1623 Stuart Street, Berkeley, California, and is employed by the California Ink Company, 711 Camelia Street, Berkeley, six days a week, from four p.m. until midnight. He is enrolled as an undergraduate student at Oakland City College, Oakland, California, which is now known as Merritt College.

III. CURRENT MEMBERSHIP IN SUBVERSIVE ORGANIZATIONS:

Informant is a member of the Oakland-Berkeley Branch of the Socialist Workers Party (OBBSWP). He is serving on the Executive Committee of the Socialist Discussion Club, a student organization at Merritt College, for the Spring Semester of 1965.

On or about 12/1/64, informant was confronted by several members of the Executive of the Berkeley Local of the Young Socialist Alliance (YSA). They explained to informant that they felt it was unfair to the other members

VII. REPORTS SUBMITTED:

Informant has submitted ten oral reports and no written reports.

VIII. APPROXIMATE NUMBER OF INDIVIDUALS
ON WHOM INFORMANT HAS REPORTED AND
THEIR IMPORTANCE:

Informant reports on approximately 55 security subjects in the San Francisco Bay Area. These subjects are members of the YSA and/or SWP, as well as individuals who are members of the W.E.B. DuBois Clubs and the Afro-American Student Association.

IX. INFORMATION FURNISHED OF UNUSUAL VALUE:

Not applicable in view of the fact that informant is unable to attend SWP or YSA meetings.

X. STEPS BEING TAKEN TO ADVANCE INFORMANT:

Due to informant's curtailed activities because of full-time employment six days a week, as well as his taking a full course as an undergraduate student at Merritt College, no steps have been taken to advance the informant. Every effort is being made on the part of informant to keep his membership in the OBBSWP, even though he is not able to attend meetings.

Informant feels that it will be necessary for him to continue his employment until May 1965. Informant has had to support himself for a number of years, and has had no family to turn to for any financial aid. He feels that his schooling should come first, because it is necessary for him to obtain a degree in order that he might look forward to elevating himself in the community. Informant is eager to maintain his relationship with the Bureau and to be of any service possible.

of YSA for him to enjoy membership in the Local, yet not attend meetings. Informant explained that for several months now he has been employed from four p.m. to midnight, six days a week, which has precluded him from attending meetings. YSA members stated that they were aware of this situation and the fact that he had continued to offer financial support, as well as paying his dues; however, they stated that it was the feeling among YSA members this was not enough; that if he were dedicated to the movement he would arrange somehow to attend meetings. A bitter dispute ensued, and the informant told the YSA Executive that he would resign from the YSA.

Informant has explained that he has been confronted with a similar situation by the executive members of the OBBSWP. He said that the Branch has put him on probation because he has not been attending meetings, and he is hoping that he will not be asked to resign, because he continues to pay dues and sustainers.

IV. SUMMARY OF INFORMATION FURNISHED:

Informant, even though he is not attending meetings of the OBBSWP, has maintained contact with SWP and YSA members, and has furnished information relative to individual employment and residence.

Through informant's contacts in the Socialist Discussion Club at Merritt College, he has been able to furnish information relative to the Afro-American Student Association, which is affiliated with the Revolutionary Action Movement (RAM), as well as the W.E.B. DuBois Club, Berkeley Chapter.

VI. TYPE AND NUMBER OF MEETINGS ATTENDED:

SF 2496-S has attended no YSA or SWP meetings during the period 10/20/64, to date.

Informant claims that he is saving a considerable amount of money, which he is earning at the present time, and after another semester at Merritt College he hopes to be able to enroll at the University of California (UC), Berkeley, for his last two years of schooling. Informant feels that once he is enrolled at UC he will be in a good position to assist the Bureau in its investigation of any subversive organizations with contacts and/or activities on the campus.

Informant stated that in the past few months the leadership in the YSA Berkeley Local has been taken over largely by DAN and MARY ALICE STYRON. The STYRONs favor the recruitment of students from UC, and are making every effort to eliminate the non-UC student member. They feel that the YSA in Berkeley should be a UC student movement, and that the non-student member is not helpful and is sometimes considered unattractive to students. Informant said that he feels fairly certain this is the reason that he was asked to resign from the YSA.

XI. STABILITY AND RELIABILITY:

Informant shows no sign of instability, and is believed to be completely reliable in exercising his responsibilities to the Bureau. He continues to exercise good judgment in order not to embarrass the Bureau, so far as his relationship with this organization is concerned. 1-

Informant is constantly reminded of his responsibility as an informant and the confidential nature of such a relationship. 2-

Informant has maintained contact with SWP and YSA members and has furnished information relative to their employments and residences.

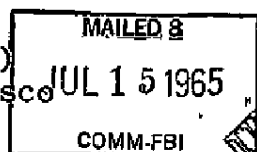

Neither of these organizations are campus-based groups. However, the Young Socialist Alliance does disseminate literature and sponsor forums and lectures on the University of California at Berkeley campus and this organization has registered with University officials. Because the informant is a student at the University, he is expected to take part in Young Socialist Alliance activities on the campus.

San Francisco has directed the activities of this informant since September, 1960, and he has always maintained his relationship with the Bureau in strict confidence. Since he is an officer of a basic revolutionary organization and is providing valuable coverage of subversive activities, San Francisco requests authority to continue contacts with this source.

In attending meetings of the BPPSD, SF 2496-S has worn a personally-owned .38 caliber revolver, as have the other members. Public exercise of their right to openly bear arms has been the most prominent "trademark" of the BPPSD.

On 5/2/67, at Sacramento, California, one WARREN TUCKER, a member of the BPPSD, was among the group arrested and charged with conspiracy to interfere with the state legislature. Informant advised that TUCKER had in his possession at the time of his arrest the personally-owned .38 caliber revolver of the informant. Informant had loaned this weapon to TUCKER. This weapon was confiscated by the Sacramento police and is being held as evidence. It is registered to one GROVER SALADO of El Cerrito, California, and is not directly traceable to the informant.

This matter is being closely followed in order to protect the Bureau's interest. The Bureau will be promptly notified of pertinent developments. *ff*

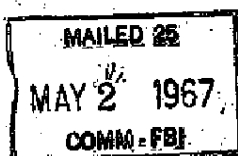

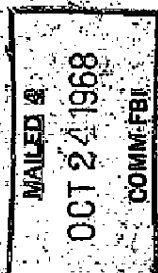

Informant has attended and reported on meetings and other activity related to the Third World Liberation Front and the strike staged by that organization at the University of California, Berkeley in January and February of 1969. Informant maintains contact with leaders and individual members of the Black Panther Party. Informant has recently been contacted by representatives of the Red Guard and it appears that he may be requested to serve as a liaison man operating between the Red Guard and the Black Panther Party.

Informant is scheduled to appear in Municipal Court at Berkeley, California on 7/14/69. This appearance stems from Informant's arrest on 2/18/69 during the student strike under the sponsorship of the Third World Liberation Front. Informant is charged with resisting arrest. He is to be represented by an attorney named KEN M. KAWAICHI. Informant has requested a jury trial and intends to plead not guilty.

Informant continues to furnish information of considerable value. However, his program of studies as a graduate student necessarily limits his time for activity in behalf of the Bureau.

The informant is in a position due to his race and former associations to move from the Third World area of student activity to the Caucasian area with ease and to be in a position to know of impending cooperative moves by these groups.

Informant is cognizant of the Bureau's interest in activities on campus being limited to those individuals and organizations whose activities are directed against the interests of the U. S.

SF 2496-R has furnished information concerning a U.S. visit by a representative of a radical and student organization in Japan known as the "Red Army." This representative contacted young radicals in the San Francisco Bay Area and on the East Coast of the United States in an effort to establish liaison between radical Asian-American and Japanese student groups. Source has identified Asian-Americans participating in the Venceremos Brigade (VB) traveling to Cuba. Source has furnished information on the activities, membership, and leadership of the Red Guard, a radical youth group active principally in the San Francisco area.

SF 2496-R has reported on liaison existing between the Red Guard and the Black Panther Party (BPP).

Miscellaneous: *(Furnish any change in residence and employment, steps being taken to advance informant, and any other pertinent information which should be brought to Bureau's attention.)*

SF 2496-R has just obtained a Master's Degree in Sociology at the University of California, Berkeley (UCB). He has been active in the formation of a new department of Asian Studies at UCB and expects to obtain employment by the University as an Assistant Program Coordinator for the new department and as a lecturer. Due to the demands of his academic pursuit the informant furnished little information subsequent to April 15, 1970, and consequently has not been reimbursed for services or expenses subsequent to that date. It is considered necessary and desirable to maintain regular contact with the informant and to retain Bureau authority to reimburse him for services and expenses. He will continue to be valuable as a source of information concerning radical and racial activity in the vicinity of the University whether or not his academic activities enable him to become a participant in radical and militant racial activity.

Informant continues to report on the Black Panther Party (BPP), the Red Guard, the Black Student Union (BSU), at Merritt College, the Venceremos Brigade (VB), Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), the Socialist Workers Party (SWP), and related groups active on each campus. Informant has advised that the Red Guard and the BPP in the San Francisco Bay Area were furnished wherewithal, possibly from Red China, to enable selective members to travel to North Korea. SF 2496-R furnished information concerning the recruitment of VB members among Asian-American students at the University of California, Berkeley (UCB) and their consequent travel. Informant advised that in July, 1970, MELVIN NEWTON, brother of HUEY P. NEWTON, was disgusted by the lack of black militancy at the Merritt College Campus and that NEWTON sought to reactivate the BSU on that campus and re-orientate it toward a pro-BPP point of view. Informant advised that BPP National Headquarters maintains liaison with the Asian-American student group at the UCB via the personnel in the Black Studies Program at UCB. Informant furnished information concerning the locations of some SDS Weatherman personnel in the East Bay Area. Informant furnished information concerning Asian-American activist groups in the San Francisco Chinatown area. (Cont'd page 3)

Miscellaneous: (Furnish any change in residence and employment, steps being taken to advance informant, and any other pertinent information which should be brought to Bureau's attention.)

An increase in the authorized payment is requested because SF 2496-R, as a university faculty member, is now very highly esteemed by all racial minority activists. Informant is now obtaining a more high level information concerning the BPP than has been the case in the past. The informant furnishes particularly good information concerning liaison between various racial minority groups. Informant is presently employed as a lecturer in the Asian Studies Programs at both Merritt College in Oakland at the UCB. He is enjoying an increased income from this employment. To adequately control and motivate the informant with his larger income and higher income tax liability, it is considered necessary to have the increased authorization. It would further facilitate the handling of this valuable informant if Bureau authority could be granted to withhold income tax from the amount paid for services. A separate letter requesting such authorization is being forwarded to the Bureau.

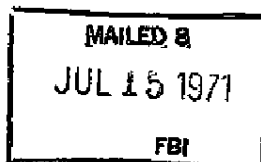

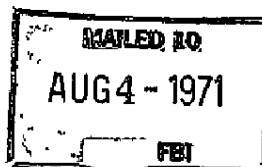

The following are specific examples of information furnished by informant during preceding six-month period:

As of November, 1970, Professor HERMAN BLAKE, University of California at Santa Cruz, was gathering material for the preparation of an "autobiography" of HUEY P. NEWTON.

In December, 1970, DOUG MIRANDA, acting on instructions of HUEY P. NEWTON, was seeking to gain control of the Black Student Union (BSU) at Merritt College, Oakland, California, in behalf of the Black Panther Party (BPP). An opposing faction backed by Trotskyites also sought the control of the Merritt College BSU.

In February, 1971, DOUG MIRANDA, as leader of the BPP faction, was the dominant leader of the BSU at Merritt College, which was then sponsoring a student strike at the college.

As of January, 1971, leaders of the San Francisco area Red Guard and the New York area I Wor Kuen had mutually rejected the idea of a merger but had agreed to maintain liaison.

In March, 1971, informant declined to accept the position of Minister of Defense of the Red Guard but agreed to serve in liaison between the Red Guard and the BPP. Leaders of the Red Guard were unable to agree on the merits of the factional dispute between ELDRIDGE CLEAVER and HUEY P. NEWTON of the BPP. Consequently, the Red Guard did not furnish security guards for a BPP public meeting on 3/5/71. HUEY P. NEWTON had requested the informant to provide such Asian security guards.

On 3/8/71, ELBERT "BIG MAN" HOWARD provided informant with a brief tour of BPP National Headquarters at 1046 Peralta Street, Oakland, California.

In April, 1971, HUEY NEWTON and JOHN SEALE personally visited the Merritt College campus in an informal manner for the purpose of creating a friendly relationship between the student body and the BPP. As of that time, the BSU at Merritt College was leaderless and inactive. The recent BSU sponsored student strike had been a failure from the activist point of view.

In May, 1971, HERMAN BLAKE continued to work in the preparation of a book on the life of HUEY P. NEWTON. BLAKE advised that publication of the book was at least a year away.

In June, 1971, the Red Guard had split into two groups and it was expected that each group would adopt a new name and that there would be no surviving organization bearing the name of Red Guard.

It was learned from BOBBY SEALE of the BPP on 6/10/71, that SEALE and his wife ARTIE were estranged and separated.

Informant visited and conferred with HERMAN BLAKE a black college professor who is preparing a biography on HUEY P. NEWTON. Informant reported on whereabouts of ROBERT RANDOLPH, a former CP member presently working as a college librarian. Informant reported on current activity of TOM SANDERS, a revolutionary individual and former SWP member. SF 2496-E reported on the whereabouts and activities of 2 Weatherman type activists. He reported on the status of the RNA Office in Berkeley, California; on a BPP sponsored revolutionary funeral; identified the membership of IWK at San Francisco and outlined the current program of the IWK. Informant reported on the status of all student activist groups at the Grove Street (Oakland) campus of Peralta Junior College District. Informant has reported on the defunct status of the Leway organization in San Francisco.

Miscellaneous: *(Furnish steps being taken to advance informant, and any other pertinent information which should be brought to Bureau's attention.)*

Informant's residence is unchanged. He is presently working full time by dividing his time between student counselling at the Grove Street campus of Peralta Junior College District and instructing in Asian studies at University of California at Berkeley. Informant is in an excellent position to report on all student activists at each campus as well as the Bay area in general. He maintains liaison with the BPP and IWK as organizations and with numerous individuals who are or have been connected with subversive groups such as CP, SWP, VB and Weatherman.

Coverage furnished by this informant is unique and not available from any other source. Many activist individuals seek informant's advice and counselling since informant is considered as a militant who has succeeded within the establishment without surrendering to it.

Captioned informant advised that he entered a plea of nolo contendere upon the advice of his attorney to a charge of violation of California Vehicle Code, Section 23102. This is a misdemeanor charge for one driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs. Informant has acknowledged that he was, in fact, under the influence of a tranquilizer prescribed by his personal physician. While driving in this condition, the informant's vehicle struck the rear of another car.

As a result of this plea, informant was awarded a fine of \$302, plus court probation for a period of one year. According to the terms of this sentence, the informant may apply to the court to have the conviction set aside under the provisions of Section 103.4 of the California Penal Code. The judge who awarded the sentence was Judge MARIO BARSOTTI of the Berkeley-Albany Municipal Court at Berkeley, California.

The above information is furnished for the Bureau's information. There is no reason to disbelieve the informant's assertion that the tranquilizing drug involved was taken pursuant to the instructions of his physician. Informant acknowledges that he used poor judgment in attempting to drive his automobile after having taken the drug. This informant does not demonstrate signs of instability, nor has he ever furnished any reason to suspect that he is in any way unreliable. This informant is believed to be valuable and in a position to furnish information of considerable value. It is recommended that informant's services be continued.

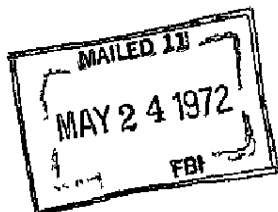

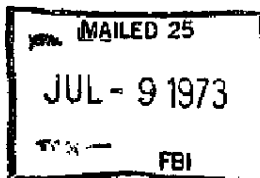

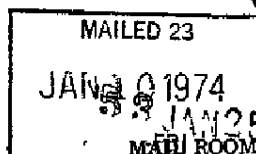

Informant reported that in 1971 HOOD had actively endeavored to recruit persons on the NPCC campus for travel to Cuba with the Venceremos Brigade. (HOOD is suspected of connections with the Symbionese Liberation Army.)

BPP member ORLANDO VAUGHN, with support from ELBERT HOWARD and JOHN SEALE, became the principal spokesman for the NPCC student government and President of the Student Council.

In March, 1974, former Berkeley Asian activist YUJI ICHIOKA was located at the University of California at Los Angeles.

DAVID DU BOIS, editor in chief of the "Black Panther" newspaper and lecturer at both NPCC and the University of California at Berkeley, moderated a conference sponsored by the journalism department of NPCC and held at the BPP's Community Learning Center in Oakland in February, 1974.

In March, 1974, a political alliance between HUEY P. NEWTON and Congressman RONALD DELLUMS was under consideration in connection with the re-election campaign of DELLUMS. In May, 1974, Congressman DELLUMS was seeking political support from the BPP for the June, 1974, primary election.

In April, 1974, former Socialist Workers Party activist TOM SANDERS planned to travel abroad to the Middle East to seek employment there.

In April, 1974, informant identified Symbionese Liberation Army suspects CINDY GARVEY, RUSSELL LITTLE, and CHRIS B. THOMPSON as having had past connections with a now defunct pro-Maoist college student group.

In June, 1974, the local leftist Filipino nationalists organization Kalayan was reportedly merging into a more centrist oriented national organization of Filipino nationalists.

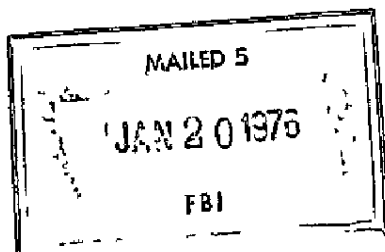

To date, informant has only been paid a total of \$40 on SAC authority. During pertinent period he submitted three reports with 75 percent of the information verified through other sources. San Francisco advised of informant's ambition to become a college professor and to stay clear of subversive connections in his public life; however, his contact with old friends and acquaintances produces information of current value.
