JIM PETRAS stated that he was recently in contact with Doctor A. E. PERRY of the Committee to Aid the Monroe Defendant, and passed out a statement on the ROBERT WILLIAMS case. Copies have been secured and will be attached for ROBERT WILLIAMS' file and Fair Play for Cuba.

It was hoped that those participating in the Wednesday afternoon panel discussions would prepare position papers which could be distributed to the membership at large on Wed. evening. The Constitutional amendments are those proposed by Paul Kagan on Sept. 20, mentioned on p. 2 of the last Slate Newsletter.

The CoCom decided to hold General Assemblies normally every other Wednesday, with CoComs every week. The next CoCom meeting will be Sat., Oct. 7, at 11 a.m. at 2404 Dana (the Slate office). All are welcome to this meeting.

There will probably be a Slate party this next weekend. Watch the Daily Cal and posters for time and place.

Proceedings of the Slate General Assembly, Wed., Sept. 27, 7.30 p.m.
at Hillel Foundation.

At least 80 people attended the second GA of this semester, which, considering that publicity had been skimpy and the meeting-place changed at the last minute, was not bad. The agenda was adopted after a motion to postpone the elections for one more week had failed.

Announcements included a plea for support of the picketing of the AEC building on Bancroft near Fulton (further details elsewhere in this newsletter); announcement of a meeting of the Slate Peace Committee; announcement of a SCLU meeting and a YSA forum. (The next SCLU meeting, concerned with the SCLU position on the new Kerr directive, will be Tuesday evening at Stiles. Watch your Daily Cal.)

The following motion was passed and added to the bylaws:

"Article III. Dues shall be \$2.00 per semester. All members at the time of passage of this by-law shall be required to pay the difference between what they have already paid for the current semester, and \$2, in order to remain in good standing."

It was ruled that the by-law would be in effect after the meeting at which it was passed; all members are reminded, therefore, that they must have paid a total of \$2 this semester before they can vote in future meetings.

This was followed by debate on a proposed Constitutional Amendment which had been proposed the previous week by Dave Wallis, that membership in the ASUC Ex Com (which entitles the member to a vote on Slate CoCom) shall not exclude any Slate member from holding office in Slate. The Chair, Mr. Fallenbaum, was asked to rule whether the present Constitution debars a member of Ex Com from holding office in Slate: his ruling, that it did not, was upheld on appeal by the General Assembly. The proposed amendment was therefore withdrawn as redundant.

Later a motion was passed to send a representative from CoCom to a gathering of peace groups on Oct. 1. (CoCom named Rich Fallenbaum). The rest of the evening was taken up with elections: each candidate gave a short speech, after which he was questioned from the floor. A full tally-sheet will be published after this week's elections; ballots are available for the inspection of any member up until 1 week after the elections are completed. Candidates elected so far:

NOTE FOR NARCISSISTS: Extract from "The Mirage of College Politics", in October Harper's Magazine, p. 160:

"Anything approaching serious and controversial politics runs the danger of being considered 'off-campus' and not sterile enough for student participation. An excellent case in point recently occurred at the University of California when a student organization called 'SLATE' was banned by the administration for calling itself a 'political party'. This group of several hundred students was involved in the San Francisco demonstrations against the HUAC in 1960. Since then it has been trying to consolidate itself as a continuing force on Berkeley campus. In banning it, Prof. (later Chancellor) Strong, ... said that a univ. must be 'entirely independent of all political and sectarian influences' — a perfect statement of the hygienic concept of the campus that dominates the minds of our college administrators."

AEC Protests: reprinted from the SF Chronicle, Sept. 30:

"6 opponents of nuclear testing were sentenced yesterday in the Berkeley-Albany Municipal Court for blocking a public passageway. Most of the sentences given out by Judge Redmond C. Staats were suspended provided the defendants do not wilfully violate any law for the next two years. One of the demonstrators, Michael O'Quin, 22, told the judge that 'I don't plan on doing this again in the foreseeable future but I may.' The others cautiously voiced similar sentiments. (Followed a listing of the sentences, ranging from 6 mo. in the County Jail, with 4 mo. suspended, to 90 days, suspended). . . . They were arrested after protesting nuclear testing resumption at the SF Operations Office of the AEC in Berkeley. Just before appearing before Judge Staats for sentencing yesterday the group appeared once again before the AEC offices with picket signs."

PURPOSE OF THE NEWSLETTER: (1) To keep the Slate membership and mailing list informed of events in Slate and other groups of interest, including reports of General Assembly meetings, CoCom meetings, ASUC ExCom meetings, Slate Committee meetings. FUND RAISING: A letter will be passed out at the Wed. GA to be used in soliciting funds for Slate. Give Joan Haebele any suggestions for possible sources. Particularly if we hope to resurrect the Cal Reporter (see Don Rainman if you want to work on this) we will need MONEY.

Some members of Slate will know of Mike Miller's suggestion of what "Slate" could stand for—Student League Accused of Trying to Exist—voted down by acclamation at a CoCom meeting this summer. Tocsin, Students Associated Against Totalitarianism party journal, has come up with its own version: Student Leftists Against Enemy.

WILLIAMS IS NOW IN CUBA, GRANTED POLITICAL ASYLUM, ACC. TO KPEA
THE SITUATION IN MONROE, N.C.— Jim Petras has a few copies of a four-page pamphlet with this title, published by the Committee to Aid the Monroe Defendants, Suite 1117, 114 Broadway, New York 6, N.Y. Excerpts:

"A N.Y. freedom rider and two Negro residents of Monroe, N.C., are in prison on charges of kidnapping. Indictments on the same charge have been brought against Robert F. Williams, militant Negro leader of that city, who is president of the Union County branch of the NAACP, and against Mae Mallory, a N.Y. supporter of Williams' newsletter, The Crusader, who was visiting him in Monroe. The penalty for kidnapping in N.C. is life imprisonment. The FBI, on the presumption that Williams and Mallory have left the state, are conducting a nation-wide manhunt on federal warrants of fleeing across state lines to escape prosecution.

"All indications are that the kidnap charges, as well as lesser charges brought against the Freedom Riders, members of the Monroe Non-Violent Action Committee, as well as unaffiliated colored residents of Monroe, are frame-ups. (A long account of the events of Aug. 27, almost completely ignored in the Bay Area press, follows)...."

"Although it is well known that Williams does not believe in pacifism but rather in self-defense when necessary, he invited the Freedom Riders to Monroe. He was not in any way connected with the Monroe Non-Violent Action Committee which the Freedom Riders formed with local residents. He did not attend its meetings nor participate in its picket lines. During the week of their picketing he refrained from going downtown lest his presence serve as an excuse for violence. He urged people to respect the non-violent action and to co-operate with the pickets by observing their rules and regulations...."

ASUC Ex Com Meeting: Last Tuesday's Ex Com meeting (Sept. 26) was enlivened by a continuance of the hassle over executive session. Under the ASUC Constitution, it requires 12 votes to go into executive (secret) session. ExCom failed, by a 9-4 vote, to gather the necessary number— Cloke, Tigar, Hollander, and Nakano voted against. Cloke pointed out what he considered the fallacy in Frank Jeans' Daily Cal editorial, which maintained that personalities should not be brought out in public (executive session is mainly used for appointments): Cloke did not consider that the kind of hatcheting that occasionally goes on behind closed doors in Ex Com not only should not be brought out in public, but should not occur at all. Open session would be a good way of assuring this. The decision was given point by ExCom's consideration of appointing a replacement for Newfarmer as rep-at-large— one of the few occasions when appointments are not a matter of routine approval, anyway. Jerry Berman, who ran for 1st Vice-Pres. on the Slate ticket last semester, is one of the three finalists, but John Grissom, who took over Publications Board after the Daily Cal staff resigned last year, will probably be chosen. Voting on the replacement was deferred till this week, in the hope that the minority might be persuaded to allow Ex Com to go into executive session.

In an extraordinarily autocratic action, Frank Jeans fired two reporters of the DC when they refused to leave the room during the discussion of appointments, but later decided only to suspend them for one day. This was what was behind his very misleading "Birds of a Feather" editorial.

The above report was discussed with the informant who had the following to add:

TED MELLOR announced that the fund drive was not going too well, that many of the persons who pledged have failed to fulfill their obligations. He stated that the deadline for the fund drive is 11/15/61. There is an urgent need for funds at the New York Headquarters to help with publishing the newspaper and also so that the National Convention might be held in the near future.

JIM PETRAS in reporting on campus activities stated that there is a battle going on in SLATE between the Stalinists and the Trotskyites. He stated that the Stalinists are not progressive enough and "have a tendency to let things slide." LARRY SCHUM in his report on the Fair Play for Cuba Committee stated that the committee is planning a social in about two weeks and would furnish details at a later date.

The chairman for the evening, TED MELLOR, introduced 7 members of the San Francisco YSA who are visiting in order to hear the educational. AL _____ and RAY VALDEZ were the only two San Francisco members known to the informant. KAREN RAVICH stated that there is an urgent need for money by the local chapter so that they might secure more books for the library which is being set up at headquarters. LOUIS COBET stated that up to now the peace movement in the United States has not considered political and economic questions, that it must take up these questions and look for the causes of war in order to be effective. It is no accident that the two contending powers in the cold war are the United States and the Soviet Union. The United States economy is in a crisis. It cannot afford to let the colonial revolution develop in the Soviet Union, China and Eastern European countries because our investments abroad would perish. The Soviet economy is stable in that it has no foreign investments to protect and, except for the robbery of Eastern Europe after World War II, no imperialism. He concluded by stating that the peace movement must recognize these inherent war drives in capitalism, that the peace movement must be anti-capitalist to be successful, to end war.

C., who are fighting for freedom and survival.

CHARLES LARSON and BRIAN presented the in-service educational. CHARLES LARSON told about his service in the Army and that he was recently interviewed by CIC. He related the details of this interview and how he conducted himself. He stated that he made many mistakes and was relating this to the group so that they could profit by his experience. At this time BRIAN continued the educational by explaining how LARSON should have conducted himself and that YSA members should not cooperate in any way with CIC and furnish no information unless it is on advice of counsel.

Informant stated that LARRY SCHUM and JACK YOHAY are roommates but he does not know their address. He also stated that BARBARA and MARVIN are residing at YSA Headquarters, 1941 Oregon Street, Berkeley.

This Executive Committee meeting was held in order that YSA policy be formulated concerning actions the YSA will take while President JOHN F. KENNEDY is a visitor on the campus of the University of California, Berkeley, 3/23/62. President KENNEDY will be the main speaker at Charter Day exercises and will be given an honorary Doctorate Degree by the University of California. The YSA feels that this would be an excellent opportunity for them to unite various peace groups on the campus such as Fair Play for Cuba Committee, Student Peace Union and Young People's Socialist Alliance. It was recommended that MARVIN GARSON be designated as the YSA member responsible to promote this work and to try and coordinate it through SLATE. It was suggested that if SLATE would not sponsor this type of action, then MARVIN GARSON should form an ad Hoc committee of SALTE to sponsor this program. The program suggested is that the students picket and publicize their grievances against the KENNEDY administration clearly indicating that President KENNEDY has not made good his campaign promises regarding Civil Rights and peace. Also they feel that his actions against Cuba are intolerable. It was mentioned that PAM TIGAR who was recently elected an officer in SLATE for the Spring semester of 1962 at University of California, would be a good person to assist GARSON in that it was felt that she would be sympathetic, though she is not a member of the YSA. Informant stated that these plans are in the early stages and exactly how they will materialize is not known at this time. However, the informant will keep the writer advised of any pertinent developments.

A source who has furnished reliable information in the past advised on February 21, 1962, that at a meeting of the Executive Committee of the Berkeley Young Socialist Alliance held on February 20, 1962, at 1941 Oregon Street, Berkeley, California, plans were discussed for the formation of a picket line to demonstrate during the appearance of President JOHN KENNEDY at the University of California at Berkeley, scheduled for March 23, 1962. The Berkeley Young Socialist Alliance hopes, through its members in SLATE, University of California off-campus student political group, to have SLATE or an ad hoc committee of SLATE sponsor the demonstration and hopes to obtain participation in the picket line by representatives of all liberal student groups at the University of California.

The picketing is to be predicated on the basis that President KENNEDY has not lived up to campaign promises on the question of civil rights, efforts to achieve peace, and U. S. relations with Cuba.

A source advised on May 16, 1960, that the Bay Area Young Socialist Alliance (BAYSA) was formed in February 1958 as the Bay Area Committee for the Young Socialist (BACYS). At a later stage in its development prior to adoption of the name BAYSA, the organization was known as the Bay Area Committee of the Young Socialist Alliance (BACYSA).

The source advised that as a result of a national convention held April 15-17, 1960, at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, the BAYSA became a branch of a national organization to be known as the Young Socialist Alliance (YSA) and will carry out in the Northern California area the policies of the YSA. The BAYSA is divided into two working units, the San Francisco YSA and Berkeley YSA.

The source advised that the BAYSA, although ostensibly an independent organization, is in reality controlled by the San Francisco Branch, Socialist Workers Party (SWP) and Oakland Branch SWP.

The source advised on May 1, 1961, that the BAYSA is currently active.

The May, 1960, issue of the "Young Socialist" (YS), page 1, column 3, disclosed that during April 15-17, 1960, a national organization entitled "The Young Socialist Alliance" (YSA) was established at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. This issue stated that this organization was formed by the nationwide supporter clubs of the publication YS.

The above issue, page 6, set forth the Founding Declaration of the YSA. This declaration stated that the YSA recognizes the Socialist Workers Party (SWP) as the only existing political leadership on class struggle principles, and that the supporters of the YS have come into basic political solidarity with the SWP. on the principles of revolutionary Socialism.

A confidential source advised on May 11, 1960, that the original YSA was an organization formed during October, 1957, in New York City, by youth of various left socialist tendencies, particularly members and followers of the SWP. The leaders of this group were the guiding forces in the establishment of the national organization.

The source further advised that the YSA is dominated and controlled in its leadership and ranks by members of the SWP. The source added that the SWP considers the YSA as the leading force in the radical youth field and its current and future hope in regard to recruits and the promulgation of the SWP movement throughout the United States.

The headquarters of the YSA are located at 10 East 23rd Street, New York City.

The YS is a monthly publication, self-described in the December, 1960, issue, as the official organ of the YSA.

The SWP has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

On 3/11/62 the "Ad Hoc Committee for 3/23/62" met at 1840 Adison Street, Berkeley. There were approximately 20 to 30 persons in attendance and a general discussion was held concerning the demonstrations planned for 3/23/62 at the University of California, Berkeley.

On 3/16/62, Poster Painting Party for the "Ad Hoc Committee for 3/23/62" held at 1941 Oregon Street, Berkeley. No program was held, but 35 - 40 persons were there preparing signs for the demonstration.

On April 6, 1962, the YSA planned a dance at Stiles Hall, Berkeley, for this evening, however, such a small number of persons appeared that it was called off.

On April 13, 1962, the YSA sponsored a social at 1941 Oregon Street, Berkeley. There were between 70 and 90 persons in attendance and approximately \$40 was raised for the YSA.

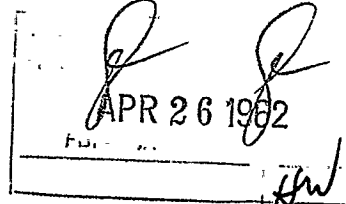
