This meeting was called by the YSA at headquarters, 1941 Oregon Street, Berkeley, in order to give BRIAN SHANNON and MATT WISE, both of whom have just returned from Los Angeles, an opportunity to brief the Berkeley people on the situation in Los Angeles regarding the HCUA hearings.

WISE spoke first and stated that the situation in Los Angeles is not good. The radical right is extremely strong and the Los Angeles Police Department is known to be extremely brutal when dealing with members of the left wing and peace organizations. He stated that there had been anti-CP schools in the Los Angeles area and that there are many book stores selling right wing literature calling themselves American Book Store, Liberty Book Store, etc. The American Nazi Party is also strong in that area. GERALD L. K. SMITH is also located in Los Angeles. The John Birchers are very strong and publish their paper, "The American Opinion." The right youth groups have broken up progressive meetings. There have been bombings. The American Legion is extremely active. All in all, the situation is bad. Very little of the information has been published because both newspapers are right wing and have ignored the situation. The Los Angeles Police Department is known to be anti-negro and has the lowest percentage of negroes on its force of any city of size in the United States. It is true that the CP is large in number but very inactive. The SWP is large and is extremely active. The Socialist Party is defunct. The YPSL has two members. However, the YSA at

Los Angeles City College and UCLA is considered strong and doing a good job in spite of all the opposition. They have approximately thirty members.

BRIAN SHANNON spoke. He stated that the Youth Action Committee in Los Angeles was organized by left wing groups who demonstrate against the HCUA in order that they might have the proper welcome. There were about 300 persons at the first meeting. However, this group is not well disciplined and it is impossible to coordinate their activities.

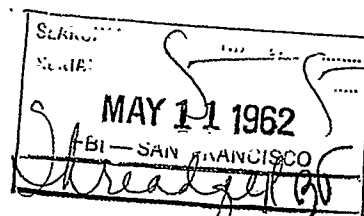

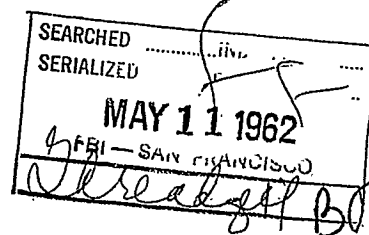

The persons identified above are known to me to be active in the Trotsky or Stalinist movements with the exception of JOHN LOWRY. The other persons in attendance were not identified but are believed to be persons genuinely concerned about civil rights and the civil libertarian movement in the South.

LOWRY spoke about his forthcoming trial in Monroe, North Carolina where he has been charged with kidnaping. He stated that his present nationwide tour is an effort to raise money for his trial which he hopes to appeal to the Supreme Court if necessary. ~~LOWRY stated that he was charged with kidnaping a white couple who were on their way to the South. LOWRY stated that he went to Monroe, North Carolina originally to talk with ROBERT WILLIAMS who has made national headlines as chairman of the NAACP, Monroe, North Carolina chapter which recommends ~~SEVERAL DEFENSE~~ necessary to pursue their program which has been opposed by Southern segregationists. LOWRY stated that while visiting WILLIAMS, they were disturbed by ~~a mob of white supremacists~~ mob. In order to avoid a disturbance, ~~LOWRY~~ helped a white couple escape from the mob and later was charged with kidnaping. He explained that this ^{RF} charge was a frameup and that he felt that if he was able to follow through with various appeals, he would be acquitted. LOWRY was going on the assumption that he would be convicted when his case comes to trial on May 7, 1962 in Monroe, North Carolina.

STEVE SALOF appears to be the spokesman for the Stalinist group around campus, UC, Berkeley.

The persons identified above are known to me to be active in the Trotsky or Stalinist movements with the exception of JOHN LOWRY. The other persons in attendance were not identified but are believed to be persons genuinely concerned about civil rights and the civil libertarian movement in the South.

LOWRY spoke about his forthcoming trial in Monroe, North Carolina where he has been charged with kidnaping. He stated that his present nationwide tour is an effort to raise money for his trial which he hopes to appeal to the Supreme Court if necessary.

LOWRY stated that he went to Monroe, North Carolina originally to talk with ROBERT WILLIAMS who has made national headlines as chairman of the NAACP, Monroe, North Carolina chapter which recommends self defense if necessary to pursue their program which has been opposed by Southern segregationists. LOWRY stated that while visiting WILLIAMS, they were disturbed by a frightened mob pursued them. In order to avoid a disturbance, Lowry helped a white couple escape from the mob and later was charged with kidnaping. He explained that this charge was a frameup and that he felt that if he was able to follow through with various appeals, he would be acquitted. LOWRY was going on the assumption that he would be convicted when his case comes to trial on May 7, 1962 in Monroe, North Carolina.

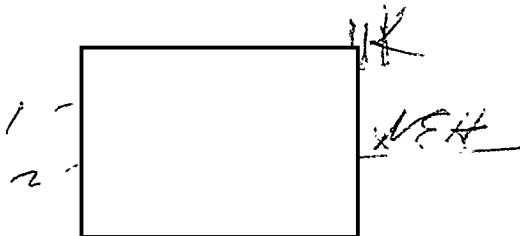

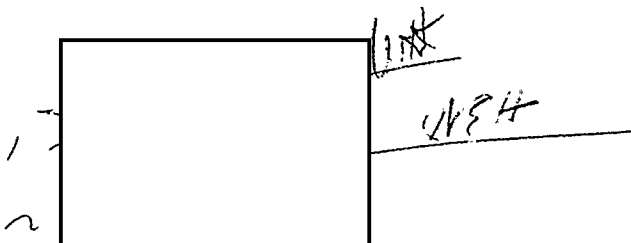

He stated that the Lowenthal book on the FBI is one of the best sources which has ever been published giving a good critical analysis of the FBI. He stated that HOOVER has been unsuccessful in suppressing this book and when he last checked at the UC Library, they did not even have a copy of the book available.

This report was discussed with informant who stated that the following business was discussed at the Executive Committee meeting:

1. Postcards were prepared to be sent out and advised members and other persons on the mailing list of YSA change of address - 2404 Dana Street, Berkeley, being the new location.
2. MARVIN GARSON and DICK GREENBERG agreed to draw up a leaflet containing the immediate political program of the YSA along with the Founding Declaration of the YSA. Copies of this leaflet are attached to this memorandum.
3. It was agreed that the YSA should conduct a conference for all persons interested in peace and Cuba. This would be a joint San Francisco and Berkeley YSA venture, emphasis to be placed on Tasks and Perspectives for the coming year.
4. The move to 2404 Dana Street must be made by the 17th of June and the Executive Committee should appoint a chairman in charge of the new headquarters who not only would arrange the move but who would be responsible for maintenance.
5. Plans for the summer conference sponsored by SLATE were discussed, and it was mentioned that civil rights would be the main emphasis.

The forum on 7/20/62 COWLEY told of the struggle for equality for women in industry and related this as part of the overall class struggle.

The forum on 8/3/62 was a tape made by ROBERT WILLIAMS in Cuba and sent to this country. It was broadcasted on KPFA-FM Berkeley, 7/4/62.
