Paul Montauk, Organizer, Branch of the U.S. has 150, Mary Lou and their 2 children, ~~Richard and Jackie~~, age 13 and Paulie, age 12, accompanied by Richard Foki and Jackie Miller, age 12, arrived at Santa Anita, San Bernardino, California at approximately 2:00 p.m., 4/13/62, and we waited for the buses which were accompanied by the U.S. Marshals.

At 3:30 am, 4/14, Dr. F. Lewis spoke, "The 30's and the 60's - what can the 2 generations learn from each other." He outlined that the youth of today, men who resist the fate of the world, can "level" and realize what has been left undone" by avoiding errors committed by the socialists of the 30's and by learning from the positive experiences for those involved in the struggles of the 30's. At 3:30 pm, Dr. An Schuman, Chairman of the Berkeley Hall spoke on the current developments in the student movement and gave particular emphasis to what the students at the Univ. of Calif., Berkeley are doing in civil rights and peace movements. During his presentation, John, Paul and Mary Lou Montauk drove to Los Angeles and visited James P. Cannon and his wife Rose at 2401 Hyperion St. At 7:30 pm, Theo Lewis spoke of the Mexican labor today and its prospects.

4/15 at 9:30 am a symposium lead by Wendell Williams, "Struggle for Academic Freedom." One of the speakers was the speaker from the SF Bay Area, 1961, who related a student's view and that the student can do in this movement. At 3:30 pm, Hayden Perry, SF-1/P, spoke concerning present conditions in Yugoslavia which was documented by his recent visit there. 7:30 pm, Jack Golden spoke on morality and politics under capitalism.

4/16 at 9:30 am, lecture given by W. Lewis, "Democracy and its Development from the Ancient Greeks to Socialism." This was the first of six lectures given by Lewis on this subject. In this lecture he presented a scientific socialist concept of democracy as practiced in Ancient Greece. It differed somewhat from the usual pedantic bourgeois interpretation of Athenian democracy. Democracy existed only for one class, that is freeborn Athenians, for those who comprised a majority of total population.

4/17 at 9:30 am second lecture by Lewis on democracy. He summarized his concept on Ancient Greek democracy and concluded that democracy in Athens was a slave-democracy. At 3:30 pm, Dick McBride spoke concerning atrip he made to Monroe, P.C. At 7:30 pm, Eleanor Brady was introduced as a former CP member and she spoke on "Negro Struggle in America." Brady presented the historical development of slavery in this country and its impact on present day race relations.

On 4/18 at 7:30 pm Brady presented a 2nd lecture in which she discussed the present racial conflict here in America and how it serves the economic ends of the monopoly capitalists, in that it is providing a cheap source of wage slaves.

4/19/62, Wm. F. Lewis gave his fourth lecture on democracy at 9:30 am and at 7:30 pm his wife Evelyn Reed gave a lecture on capitalism and human psychology.

4/20 at 3:30 pm Les Evans, LP-YM Worker, spoke on "The Influence of Social Struggle and Art and Literature." At 7:30 pm Evelyn Reed spoke on a recent trip to Latin America. According to Reed, throughout the countries south of our border, there is unrest due to economic poverty created by the vested business interests of the U.S. The revolution in Cuba will probably be followed in other Latin American countries in spite of the severe economic sanctions being undertaken by both US military and economic of the active dictatorships.

4/21 at 9:30 am Lewis presented his last lecture, at which time he summarized the entire series--the democracy will exist only in a socialist state, now is of class struggle and conflict.

John Benquet ended the school.

Oscar Coover, Gene King and Sam Miller believed to be from the L. Area were observed in attendance.

The following was taken from the SF Bay Area letter to Mary Lou and Paul (last 4 lines), Marvin and Barbara Brown (last 4 lines), and a letter, Jan Green, and a letter, Carl Gordon, Mary Lou, La. Val, Bill and Virginia Stenell.

A source who was in attendance at the above described encampment furnished the following information on September 18, 1962.

PAUL MONTAUK, Organizer, Oakland-Berkeley Branch of the Socialist Workers Party (SWP), his wife, MARY LOU MONTAUK, and his three children, JACK, age 15, KENT, age 13, and PAULIE, age 8, accompanied by RICHARD AOKI and JACKIE MILLER, age 12, arrived at Camp Akela, Big Bear Lake, California at approximately 2:00 p.m., September 1, 1962, and registered for the West Coast Vacation School sponsored by the SWP.

At 9:30 a.m., September 2, 1962, WILLIAM F. WARDE spoke "The 30's and the 60's - What Can The Two Generations Learn From Each Other." WARDE explained that the youth of today, upon whom rests the fate of the world, can "develop and realize what has been left undone" by avoiding errors committed by the socialists of the 30's and by learning from the positive experiences of those involved in the struggles of the 30's. At 3:30 p.m., BRIAN SHANNON, Chairman of the Berkeley Young Socialist Alliance (YSA), spoke on the current developments in the student movement and gave particular emphasis to what the students at the University of California, Berkeley are doing in civil rights and peace movements. During SHANNON'S presentation, RICHARD AOKI, PAUL and MARY LOU MONTAUK drove to Los Angeles and visited JAMES P. CANNON and his wife ROSE at their residence, 2401 Hyperion Street. A third source advised on April 9, 1962, that the San Francisco Branch and the Oakland-Berkeley Branch of the SWP follow the policies and directives of the National SWP with whom they are affiliated.

YOUNG SOCIALIST ALLIANCE (Known in the San Francisco Bay Area as the Bay Area Young Socialist Alliance, aka The Bay Area Committee of the Young Socialist Alliance, Bay Area Committee for the Young Socialist)

A source advised on May 16, 1960, that the Bay Area Young Socialist Alliance (BAYSA) was formed in February, 1958, as the Bay Area Committee for the Young Socialist (BACYS). At a later stage in its development prior to adoption of the name BAYSA, the organization was known as the Bay Area Committee of the Young Socialist Alliance (BACYSA).

The source advised that as a result of a national convention held April 15-17, 1960, at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, the BAYSA became a branch of a national organization to be known as the Young Socialist Alliance (YSA) and will carry out in the Northern California area the policies of the YSA. The BAYSA is divided into two working units, the San Francisco YSA and Berkeley YSA.

The source advised that the BAYSA, although ostensibly an independent organization, is in reality controlled by the San Francisco Branch, Socialist Workers Party (SWP) and Oakland Branch SWP.

The source advised on April 17, 1962, that the BAYSA is currently active.

The SWP has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

YOUNG SOCIALIST ALLIANCE

The May 1960 issue of the "Young Socialist" (YS), page 1 column 3, disclosed that during April 15-17, 1960, a national organization entitled "The Young Socialist Alliance" (YSA), was established at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. This issue stated that this organization was formed by the nationwide supporter clubs of the publication YS.

The above issue, page 6, set forth the Founding Declaration of the YSA. This declaration stated that the YSA recognizes the Socialist Workers Party (SWP) as the only existing political leadership on class struggle principles, and that the supporters of the YS have come into basic political solidarity with the SWP on the principles of revolutionary socialism.

A source advised on May 10, 1962, that the original YSA was an organization formed during October 1957, in New York City, by youth of various left socialist tendencies, particularly members and followers of the SWP. The leaders of this group were the guiding forces in the establishment of the national organization.

The source further advised on May 10, 1962, that the YSA is dominated and controlled on a national basis by the SWP through having SWP members comprise, almost exclusively, the national leadership of the YSA. The YSA, in reality, is the youth section of the SWP and the main source of new SWP members.

The "Young Socialist", a monthly publication self-described in the April 1960 issue as the official organ of the YSA, discloses the headquarters of YSA as 10 East 23rd Street, New York City.

The SWP has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

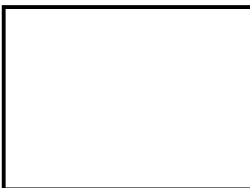

At time of interview with informant, he was questioned relative to money paid him for expenses. He indicated that his expenses exceeded the \$125 paid him, in view of the fact that his car broke down and he had extensive repairs.

SF 2496-S/ advised the writer on 7/30/62 that he attended
the SLATE conference at the University of California, Berkeley
7/27 - 29/62 and made the following observations:

7/27/62 Friday Evening, the movie TOMANGO, was not shown because
BRIAN SHANNON, Chairman of the Berkeley Chapter of the
YSA failed to secure the correct projector. There was
no program presented.

7/28/62, Saturday 1:00 p.m., a workshop entitled "Federal
Government and Civil Rights" was conducted with CARL
BLOICE and HOWARD JETER as narrators. BLOICE introduced
himself as the journalist from the PW newspaper. BLOICE
stated that the greatest hope for the Negro in America
today is their vote. He stated that President KENNEDY
is doing a great job and that the negro should cooperate
with him. BLOICE was inept and completely ineffective
in his presentation.

HOWARD JETER, a recently defeated candidate for U. S.
Congress, stated that the negro in America is a second
class citizen and therefore should not pay income tax,
serve in the Armed Forces and to raise the negro to first
class citizenship the government should drop the voting
age to 18 and give each Negro \$10,000 for the debt of
having been slaves.

60 per cent of the persons in attendance at this workshop were negroes. A second workshop on school integration was conducted and after observing the audience, it appeared that the YPSL was dominating the group. The informant departed and attended workshop in employment.

NATALIE MOORMAN from the "Sun Reporter" stated that the negroes should work harder to attain status and wealth in an effort to advance the negro people....."Earn the Right To be Heard". DON WARDEN Afro - American Association stated that the negro newspaper, less mistakes, look at the facts, look at their position in the United States today and our people are living in ghettos and they will continue to do so for the next few years at least. Therefore, lets clean up the ghettos make it a better place to live, teach the negro something of his heritage, something of his history so that he will understand his obligation to society, only then will the negro be sufficiently motivated to lift himself up.

JAMES HERNDON, President of the Negro American Labor Council in San Francisco stated that the negroes should train himself his position in the trade union, because there are skilled areas of labor where trade unions are shor four or five workers. In sizing up this workshop, informant stated that DON WARDEN made an excellent impression on the audience and was the only one that appeared to receive their acceptance.

7/29/62 Sunday, 1 to 2:00 p.m. question and answer period at the conclusion of the workshop entitled "Theory and Practice" during this question and answer period nothing of any importance took place.

3 to 5:00 p.m. CARL WORTHMAN, Social Worker and editor of "New University Thought", told of the work he is doing at Hunters Point in San Francisco. He explained something of the difficulties encountered by white man working in a negro movement. No one seemed to be interested in his presentation and one negro suggested that the white people interested in helping the negro could go back and work with the white people and try to influence them along these lines.

SF 2496-S advised on 10/1/62 that he has known BARBARA GARSON for more than one year as a member of the Berkeley YSA. During this time, GARSON has indicated that her primary interest in YSA and SWP stems from her husband MARVIN GARSON. Her parents are not sympathetic and have cut off their support because of their political leanings.

Informant doubts that parents are fully aware of the extent of GARSON's activities, but what they know they do not like and as a result have refused her and her husband financial support.

SF 2496-S, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised SA BURNLEY THREADGILL on 9/18/62 that he personally accompanied JANET BACON to the Greyhound Bus Station in Oakland, California, on 9/15/62, and she departed for Los Angeles, California. Informant explained that BACON attended the West Coast Vacation School, Big Bear Lake, California, which was sponsored by the SWP September 1 - 9, 1962, and at this school she made contacts with SWP members in Los Angeles and upon their encouragement decided to move to Los Angeles and secure employment there.

BACON is a recent member of the Oakland-Berkeley Branch, SWP, and has been active for some time in the Berkeley Young Socialist Alliance. In view of this activity, a summary report is being prepared in order that BACON might be placed on the Security Index.

The Young Socialist Alliance is founded in response to the need for a nation-wide youth organization capable of bringing revolutionary socialist ideas to a new generation. This is necessary for building a revolutionary movement which can lead the working class to socialism. The YSA bases itself on the traditions of Marxian socialism as developed by Lenin, Trotsky, Luxemburg and Liebknecht. We believe that socialism can be initiated only as the result of struggle, international in scope, of the working class against the capitalist class and its allies -- the struggle culminating in the creation of a new type of state, a workers' state. Socialism means that for the first time in history man will control his own creation -- society -- rather than be controlled by it. The dynamic of socialism is of a continual expansion of human freedom in all spheres: in politics, economics, culture and in every aspect of personal life.

- 6) As socialists, we know that capitalism has always meant war. We are opposed to the arms race and to all nuclear testing. As Americans, we are particularly opposed to American nuclear testing. Only the creation of a labor party can stop the drive toward atomic death.

In view of this factional fight, the Oakland - Berkeley Branch of the SWP is, in reality, two different branches. The argument used by the majority in opposing the minority is that their position will lead them to the same position as the YPSL and that they will become a liberal social group. According to the informant this factional dispute has manifested itself in the YSA and has caused a considerable amount of confusion because the majority of the youth fail to understand the basic differences and therefore are always shifting positions.

The YSA has also three factional positions; the majority and the minority as explained in the SWP and the 3rd position is referred to as State capitalist. This group is headed up by MARVIN and BARBARA GARSON and they take a position which, to a certain extent, parallels that of the minority in that they are anti-Party. In this position they feel that the YSA should be independent of SWP influence and direction.

It should be noted that the SWP and the YSA on a National level finds itself divided into the minority and majority positions and to further complicate matters the New York Headquarters of the SWP now has found that the minority position is split into two different factions.
