Articles appearing in Tulsa newspapers during July, 1964, stated that charges had been filed against ROBERT DENTON BLUEJACKET (Bobby Bluejacket) and [redacted] in connection with charges of uttering a forged instrument. Four such charges had been filed and all involved the alleged use of a stolen credit card to purchase tires from Tulsa service stations. In an article in the July 20, 1964, issue of the Tulsa Tribune, it is stated that BLUEJACKET's bonds on all charges pending against him totaled \$42,500 and he has been able to post only \$27,500. It stated bail consisted of \$10,000 on a fugitive warrant from Minnesota, \$5000 on a charge of concealing stolen property, \$5000 on uttering a forged instrument, and \$7500 each on three other charges of uttering a forged instrument. The concealing stolen property charge involved a diamond and sapphire ring taken in a burglary in Tulsa. The July 23, 1964 issue of the Tulsa Daily World indicated he had pled guilty on July 22, 1964, to five separate charges, and sentencing had been set for July 24, 1964.

Subsequent articles stated that BLUEJACKET had been sentenced on July 24, 1964, to 15 years at the Oklahoma State Penitentiary.

On August 10, 1964, Sgt. [redacted], Tulsa County Jail, made available for review the file pertaining to ROBERT DENTON BLUEJACKET, Tulsa County Sheriff's Office No. 17835, FBI No. 4292385.

This file shows he was received at the jail on June 2, 1964, on a charge of Fugitive. He appeared in the Court of Common Pleas of Tulsa County (CPC), Case No. 139233, and bond was set in the amount of \$10,000. Preliminary Hearing was set for July 2, 1964.

He appeared in CPC on July 2, 1964, on a charge of Uttering a Forged Instrument, Case No. 139477, and on a charge of Receiving Stolen Property, Case No. 139474. Bond was set in each case at \$5000, and he was ordered held for appearance in CPC on July 8, 1964.

He made bond on July 2, 1964, in District Court Case No. 20709, Uttering a Forged Instrument, and District Court (DC) Case No. 20710, Knowingly Concealing Stolen Property.

On July 8, 1964, he appeared in CPC for Preliminary Examination in cases Nos. 139477 and 139474, and he was ordered held to answer the charges in DC. Bond was set at \$5000 in each case.

On July 21, 1964, he appeared in CPC on Case No. 139542, Uttering AFCF, and ordered held to answer this charge in DC. Bond was set in the amount of \$7500.

On July 22, 1964, he appeared in CPC on Case No. 139607, Uttering, AFCF, and he waived Preliminary Examination and he was ordered to appear to answer the charge in DC. Bond was set in the amount of \$7500. On the same date, he appeared in CPC on Case No. 139611, Uttering AFCF, and ordered held to answer in DC. Bond was set at \$7500.

On July 24, 1964, in DC of the 14th Judicial District of the State of Oklahoma, BBEUEJACKET pled guilty to a charge of Uttering a Forged Instrument, AFCF, Case No. 20759, and he was sentenced by Judge ROBERT D. SIMMS to 15 years in the Oklahoma State Penitentiary. This sentence was to run concurrent with sentences in cases numbered 20730, 20758, and 20757.

He also entered plea of guilty in the following cases and received the following sentences:

On August 6, 1964, BLUEJACKET was released to the Oklahoma State Penitentiary, McAlester, Oklahoma, to start serving his 15 year sentence.

On July 23, 1964, this case was being discussed with GENE MAXEY, Undersheriff, Tulsa County Sheriff's Office, at which time MAXEY said the earliest BLUEJACKET could be released to Minnesota authorities where armed robbery charges are pending would be 10 years and 9 months, after sentence.

Since the Subject is presently serving 15 years in the Oklahoma State Penitentiary, this case is being closed.

DETAILS:

The following investigation was conducted by SA [REDACTED] at Tulsa, Oklahoma:

On March 7, 1967, it was learned that BOBBY BLUEJACKET was employed by the Springer Tire Company, 1034½ North Lewis, Tulsa, Oklahoma. BLUEJACKET allegedly was a part owner of this establishment [REDACTED]

On March 30, 1967, while conducting investigation

on another matter, [redacted] was contacted by Special Agent [redacted] at [redacted]. It was learned that [redacted] is [redacted] BOBBY BLUEJACKET; [redacted] advised that BLUEJACKET resides [redacted] at [redacted] and that he [redacted]. [redacted] refused to answer any questions concerning the activities or associates of [redacted] except to state that he is in the used tire business and has not been in any trouble with the law since his release from the Oklahoma State Penitentiary.

On April 5, 1967, BOBBY BLUEJACKET telephonically contacted the Tulsa Resident Agency and inquired as to why two FBI Agents were inquiring about him approximately five days ago at [redacted] home. He stated at this time that he was in the tire business and that if anyone wanted to talk to him, he would be available at any time. He stated that his place of business was not established yet since his former used tire business in the 1000 Block of North Lewis Avenue was recently destroyed by a fire.

BLUEJACKET advised that [redacted]. He further claimed that he works every day and that he is "going straight" and doesn't want any trouble from anyone.

The following investigation was conducted on June 6, 1967, by Special Agent [redacted], at the Oklahoma State Penitentiary, McAlester, Oklahoma:

[redacted] advised that the subject, Oklahoma State Penitentiary No. 70575, was paroled on November 19, 1966. He had been committed August 6, 1964, to serve a fifteen year sentence for uttering a forged instrument and no clemency was recommended. His minimum release date was November 10, 1971. The Pardon and Parole Department of the State of Oklahoma recommended an early parole in a letter to the Governor dated June 2, 1966.

The recommendation for early parole was based on [redacted] who resided at [redacted] Oklahoma, and the fact that the subject was needed to [redacted] at that home. His parole employment was listed as [redacted] Oklahoma, as a house mover. His parole advisor is listed as [redacted]

In reviewing subject's file, it was noted that on July 23, 1964, GENE MAXEY, Undersheriff, Tulsa County Sheriff's Office, Tulsa, Oklahoma, advised that armed robbery charges against BOBBY BLUEJACKET were pending in Richfield, Minnesota. MAXEY stated that since charges had been filed against BLUEJACKET in Oklahoma, the earliest possible date that BLUEJACKET could be released to the Richfield, Minnesota, authorities would be ten years and nine months after his sentencing. The disposition of the armed robbery charges against BLUEJACKET have not been received to date.

On June 5, 1967, a [redacted] telephonically contacted the Tulsa, Oklahoma, Resident Agency advising that he was the parole officer of BOBBY BLUEJACKET. He advised that he occasionally gives permission to BLUEJACKET to travel out of the state of Oklahoma to obtain used tires in connection with BLUEJACKET's business. He explained that BLUEJACKET has orders to keep in contact with him while BLUEJACKET is gone. He added that these trips often last from three to five days.

[redacted] stated that the past week he understood BLUEJACKET traveled to an unknown location in Iowa but did not have permission to do so. He stated that he felt that BLUEJACKET might get into trouble during one of these trips out of state and he requested that he be notified by the FBI should any information be received concerning investigations or inquiries regarding BLUEJACKET. [redacted] stated that should the circumstances warrant it, he would recommend that BLUEJACKET's parole be revoked.

On July 27, 1967, [redacted] Tulsa Police Department, Tulsa, Oklahoma, advised that on March 1, 1967, [redacted] observed BOBBY BLUEJACKET with three unknown white males at the Silver Castle, a restaurant located at Admiral and Lewis Streets in Tulsa. The unknown males were observed in a [redacted] bearing 1967 Oklahoma License [redacted] and another [redacted] bearing 1967 Oklahoma License [redacted]

Details: [REDACTED] Minneapolis Division advised Captain [REDACTED] (NA), Richfield, Minnesota, Police Department, was contacted and furnished information concerning the release of BLUEJACKET from Oklahoma State Penitentiary, McAlester, Oklahoma, in December, 1966, after serving two years of a 15 year sentence. It had previously been noted that outstanding charges of Armed Robbery had been filed against BLUEJACKET by Richfield authorities; however, no disposition of these charges had been noted. [REDACTED] advised that he had contacted [REDACTED] regarding BLUEJACKET and was told that the State of Minnesota felt the case against BLUEJACKET was extremely weak.

On September 12, 1967, Sergeant [redacted],
[redacted], Tulsa Police Department,
caused a search of Master File Number 23289 regarding
BOBBY BLUEJACKET, which reflected that he had not been
arrested by the Tulsa Police Department since December 29,
1966. On this date, he had been arrested for prowling
but the case had been dismissed. In addition, [redacted]
advised that his department had received no inquiries
regarding BLUEJACKET from any other Police Department or
Sheriff's Office.

On September 25, 1967, [redacted]
[redacted], Tulsa Police Department, advised that in the recent
past, exact date unrecalled, he had heard that subject had
recently been arrested, he believed, in Minnesota.
In view of this information, an FD 9 was submitted to the
FBI Identification Division in an attempt to verify the
above information. However, the identification record
reflected that no such arrest had occurred and that the
last entry concerning an arrest for BLUEJACKET was the
arrest on December 29, 1966 by the Tulsa Police Department
for prowling. On this date, [redacted] explained that the
confidential files of his detail showed an entry that
BLUEJACKET had been seen in the company of [redacted]
[redacted]. He added that he believed that
subject was [redacted] however, this was
only a supposition on his part.

On October 6, 1967, [redacted] was again contacted
at which time he advised that he had spoken [redacted] with
BLUEJACKET who admitted that in early September, 1967,
he had been spending time with [redacted]; however, he denied
[redacted] BLUEJACKET stated that he had had some
domestic troubles and had [redacted] for
approximately two weeks. BLUEJACKET told [redacted] that he
was now residing [redacted] at [redacted]

[redacted] advised that BLUEJACKET explained that he, BLUEJACKET, was not causing any trouble of any kind since he had established his tire business and was doing quite well. He told [redacted] that he did not want to jeopardize his business by being arrested or harassed by the Tulsa Police Department. BLUEJACKET admitted to [redacted] that he travels occasionally to St. Paul, Minnesota, to conduct business with [redacted] and to Rochester, Minnesota to conduct business with RAY DELL WILSON. It is noted that [redacted] are also in the tire business and have been seen in the company of BLUEJACKET in Tulsa, Oklahoma. BLUEJACKET claimed that his trips to Minnesota to visit [redacted] were strictly legitimate and that these trips were not for the purpose of committing any crimes.

On November 7, 1967, Detective [redacted], [redacted], advised that Patrol Officers of the Tulsa Police Department, advised him that two vehicles bearing 1967 Oklahoma license tags [redacted] and [redacted] were recently observed at the residence of BOBBY BLUEJACKET; [redacted] stated he could not recall further descriptions of these vehicles.

On November 17, 1967, [redacted] advised that DONALD and RAY DELL WILSON from Minnesota, associates of BLUEJACKET, had stayed at the Tulsa Motel on East Eleventh Street on November 12, 1967, and were believed driving a Ford or Chevrolet bearing 1967 Oklahoma license [redacted]. [redacted] explained that the WILSON brothers are both ex-convicts and that they are apparently in the tire business with BLUEJACKET; the WILSONS operate a tire shop somewhere in Minnesota.

On November 22, 1967, Captain [redacted] (NA) [redacted] Tulsa Police Department, produced the confidential files of his detail which failed to reflect any current information concerning the activities or associates of BLUEJACKET. [redacted] stated that to his knowledge, BLUEJACKET is making an attempt to "go straight" and that he has been doing a good job of staying out of trouble.
