THE USAO SHOULD BE REQUESTED TO CONTACT THE LA COUNTY DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S OFFICE TO DETERMINE THE PARAMETER'S OF ITS INVESTIGATION, AND TO ENSURE IT DOES NOT GRANT IMMUNITIES TO ANY INDIVIDUALS WHICH COULD INTERFERE WITH THE FEDERAL INVESTIGATION.

9. IDENTIFY AND CONDUCT THOROUGH AND DETAILED INTERVIEWS OF ALL POLICE OFFICERS INVOLVED IN THIS INCIDENT. THESE INTERVIEWS SHOULD BE CONDUCTED AFTER ALL WITNESS INTERVIEWS HAVE BEEN COMPLETED. INASMUCH AS ALL OFFICERS INVOLVED ARE POTENTIAL SUBJECTS EACH SHOULD BE SPECIFICALLY ADVISED THAT THE INVESTIGATION BY THE FBI IS CRIMINAL IN NATURE, AND THE INTERVIEWEES ARE UNDER NO COMPULSION TO PROVIDE INFORMATION. IF IT CAN BE DETERMINED THAT ONE OR MORE OFFICERS ATTEMPTED TO STOP THE BEATING OF KING, IT IS SUGGESTED THAT THESE OFFICERS BE INTERVIEWED FIRST. DOJ WILL PROVIDE A GARRITY WAIVER TO BE PROVIDED ANY OFFICER WILLING TO PERMIT THE FBI ACCESS TO ANY

COMPELLED STATEMENT.

AS LA IS AWARE, THIS MATTER HAS RECEIVED EXTENSIVE MEDIA COVERAGE. BOTH THE ATTORNEY GENERAL AND THE DIRECTOR HAVE TAKEN AN ACUTE PERSONAL INTEREST IN THIS MATTER DUE TO THE EGREGIOUS CONDUCT INVOLVED. LA IS REQUESTED TO AGGRESSIVELY AND COMPLETELY ADDRESS THIS MATTER. LA IS ALSO REQUESTED TO EXPEDITIOUSLY PROVIDE RELEVANT AND PROBATIVE INFORMATION TO FBIHQ, CRU, AS IT IS OBTAINED IN ORDER TO KEEP THE ATTORNEY GENERAL AND THE DIRECTOR ADVISED CONCERNING THIS MOST SENSITIVE AND SERIOUS INVESTIGATION.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE DEPUTY ATTORNEY GENERAL

Re: In Re Rodney King; Los Angeles, California

I have just learned that the contents of the compelled administrative statements of the four defendants in the Rodney King beating case have been printed in the Los Angeles Times. It is imperative that anyone involved in the federal criminal civil rights investigation not be exposed to these statements. Pursuant to the Supreme Court's decision in Garrity v. New Jersey, 385 U.S.493 (1967), these statements must be regarded as immunized statements for purposes of any criminal prosecution.

Accordingly, I have taken measures to ensure that appropriate personnel in the Criminal Section of this Division, as well as FBI personnel assigned to the investigation, insulate themselves from all media reports on the case that may refer to the statements. They have been instructed not to read any press articles about the case that have not been previously reviewed and references to the compelled statements excised. We can anticipate that every major newspaper will print some reference to the officers' statements. In addition, all personnel have been asked to be extremely careful when listening to any TV or radio reports about the case and to immediately turn off any report about the King case.

Since I am responsible for the conduct of the criminal civil rights investigation I will myself be following these same procedures. I am requesting that any personnel in your office, or in the Office of the Attorney General, who expect to be reviewing the course and conduct of this prosecution, also take immediate steps to insulate themselves from any exposure to the defendants' compelled statements. I would appreciate your advising me of who these individuals will be.



RODNEY GLENN KING, Booking Number 2381162, was interviewed at his place of incarceration, the LOS ANGELES COUNTY CENTRAL JAIL. KING was advised that he was being interviewed since a videotape of his arrest by Los Angeles Police Officers on March 3rd last, which had been shown by local and national news media, indicated that he might have been the victim of police brutality. KING consented to be interviewed and provided the following information. Present during this interview were KING's attorneys, [REDACTED]

On Saturday evening, March 2, 1991, KING, in his wife's car, drove over to the home of a [REDACTED] in Alta Dena. He arrived at approximately 7:00 p.m. He subsequently left [REDACTED] house, went to a store, bought some beer and returned to [REDACTED] house. KING drank a bottle of beer, which he did not finish, and subsequently spoke by telephone with another [REDACTED] who asked KING to come over and pick him up. KING drove to [REDACTED] picked him up, and the two returned to [REDACTED] house where they stayed until approximately 9:00 p.m.

KING stated that he does not recall the names of [REDACTED] nor does he know their addresses. He stated that, when he is released, he will obtain this information and provide it to the FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION (FBI).

The three men left [REDACTED] about 9:15 p.m. to "take a ride". They subsequently decided to drive to Hanson Dam, which is a park area.

KING was driving the car, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] KING exited the freeway at Osborne Road and, a couple of blocks after leaving the freeway, [REDACTED] drew his attention to the fact that a police car was following KING. KING also heard one of the police officers calling to him on a loudspeaker to "pull the car over". KING immediately moved to the slow lane and then to the right side of the roadway, coming to a stop near a park where some new apartments had been constructed across the street.

KING stated that his maximum speed on the freeway was between 65 and 80 miles per hour, certainly no more than 80, and his speed along Osborne, after leaving the freeway, was probably between 45 and 50. He stated that he did not attempt to evade

police officers through high speed and reckless driving and, in fact, immediately pulled over as soon as he was aware that he was being stopped by the police.

After stopping, a male police officer called to him to place his hands where they could be seen, on top of the steering wheel. He was then commanded to place his hands higher, in front of the windshield. He was commanded to open the car door with his left hand, get out of the car and lay down on the ground. He complied with all of these demands.

After laying down on the ground, a female police officer ordered him to spread his arms and legs and he complied. He was also ordered, several times, to put his face down on the ground.

As he lay face down on the ground, he was handcuffed with his hands behind his back, his feet were tied together and his feet were tied to his handcuffs. After he had been thus secured, he was approached by a white male officer who bent down and pushed something into his right shoulder. KING then received an electrical shock from this instrument which felt as though he were being touched by a live spark plug wire but the shocking was sustained rather than instantaneous. After being shocked for four or five seconds, the instrument was removed from his shoulder and KING was struck on the head by some object. The instrument was then applied to KING's left shoulder and he was again shocked for a few seconds.

The officers then began beating KING and he received blows over most of his body. During the beating, he recalls going into a dazed condition where he did not feel pain from the blows. Sometime during the beating he heard one of the officers ordering [] to turn around and heard [] reply something to the effect of, "Okay, okay."

KING next recalls waking up in the back seat of a police car which was parked in front of a police station. He was still bound hands and feet. Two white male police officers were with him. One of them went into the station while the other stayed in the back seat with KING. He recalls that the officer who remained with him had "pretty blue eyes" and seemed to be very worried over what had befallen KING. When the other police officer came out of the station, KING passed out again.

He next recalls being placed onto a stretcher and put into an ambulance. His next recollection is waking up in a hospital and hearing a police officer telling a doctor that KING had been smoking acid. KING spoke up and denied this allegation.

KING was treated and x-rayed at the hospital, the LOS ANGELES COUNTY HOSPITAL, and remained there for two days before being taken to the CENTRAL JAIL.

At the time of this interview, KING was being housed in the medical module of the jail, was seated in a wheelchair and his right lower leg was in a cast. Numerous bruises were visible on KING's body, especially his right upper arm which was badly bruised and apparently swollen. The area of his right eye was swollen and he complained that the vision in his right eye was not normal. He also complained of soreness along his spine, his ribs, arms, legs and lower abdomen. He stated that some of his teeth were chipped and he had missing fillings. He stated that he had been coughing up blood the night before and had a possible fracture of his right cheekbone and possibly problems with his jaw joint. KING signed FBI Form FD-465, Authority to Release Medical Information.

KING was unable to state exactly how many police officers were on the scene of his arrest. He stated that there were at least five and that he "saw stripes on one of them." He stated that he might be able to identify some of the officers who were on the scene but did not believe he would be able to identify which officers committed which specific acts.

KING denied that he was under the influence of any drug or alcohol at the time of this incident. He denied having taken any drugs, contending that the partial bottle of beer which he consumed earlier in the evening was the only alcohol he had consumed.

He also denied fighting with the officers or resisting them in any way, maintaining that he followed their commands and instructions in all ways.

The following description and background information on KING was obtained through observation and interview:

leading around." The police officers were repeatedly beating KING in the legs, buttocks, head, back, whatever area of KING's body was exposed.

Two police officers, in particular, were particularly violent. It seems as though they were hitting with all their might. A few others got in a few good kicks. Also, it looked like his eye was about to pop out.

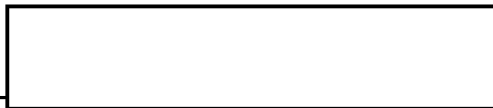

commenced hitting him again with their batons. He stated that the beating lasted approximately five to six minutes, at which time KING was hog-tied. KING laid there for about thirty seconds to a minute and didn't move. From her viewpoint, it looked like KING had all his senses, like he was well aware of his surroundings.

Then about 10 to 12 LAPD police officers came over to where KING laid and made an irregular circle around KING. A few other police officers were standing by their vehicles and a couple of police officers were standing by the Hyundai. With up to 12 LAPD police officers around KING, and one police officer standing on the left side of KING, KING was very still and made no erratic movements (at this point the police officers had not touched KING or searched him). Then the police officer on the left side of KING made a downward, swinging motion with his right hand. She does not recall what was in this policeman's hand, but whatever it was it made a very distinct sound like that of "glass striking concrete."

Right after hearing that sound, the police officer (who made the downward motion with his arm) started to hit KING with a nightstick and other police officers joined in. They were hitting KING with nightsticks and kicking him. KING is getting hit in the face and in the back. She also saw other police officers hit KING. It seemed like they (the police officers) were hitting KING everywhere. They must of hit him at least 30 times. They were hitting him "like sharks trying to get a piece of him."

KING's initial reaction was to stand up, to get away from the nightsticks and all the forceful blows coming his way. KING stood up and ran blindly and dazed it seemed. He took two or three steps and a police officer holding a nightstick like a baseball bat swung at him and knocked KING back down to his knees by a blow to his face. KING was hit in the face quite a bit the first time he stood up. He was hit mostly in the face and head at this point. When KING went back down in the prone position, the police officer that instigated the beating delivered fierce blows with his nightstick to KING's back and legs. "He just hit him and hit him, you know, like when you hit a rug to get the dust out." And other police officers hit KING simultaneously in other parts of the body as well. KING was mostly hit in the back by the police officer who instigated the beating. So KING turned over and sat up so they (especially the police officer who was

hitting him in the backside) wouldn't hit him there anymore.

Only, KING received more fierce hitting and kicking. He was still hit whether he sat up or laid down. At this point, an unidentified sound was heard when KING was sitting up. There was a lot of commotion. She could see something attached to KING's neck and it looked like a chain. The police officers continued to hit KING. Again, the police officer who instigated the beating kept "pummelling him with all his might." Blows were landing mostly in the rear area of the back and legs. When she saw what appeared to be a chain around KING's neck, she said to her husband, "they've got a chain around his neck." A police officer stepped back and she saw what she believed to be a chain. At this point KING fell flat to the ground. They continued to hit him. "I can't describe all the times they hit him, it was too many." Her attention was then diverted momentarily because she . Then she turned her attention back to KING to notice him being handcuffed.

After he was handcuffed, the police officers stepped away and a couple of the police officers grabbed KING and dragged him closer to the curb. She saw other police officers walk up to KING. They were yelling something at him. She couldn't hear exactly what they said to KING.

After the beating, the police officers were milling around. They then took out out of the Hyundai and took to the east side of the street to a waiting police vehicle.

So, KING was just lying there motionless. She kept watching him to see if he would move. Also, from where she was standing she could see the police officers congratulating themselves.

A fire truck and the paramedics eventually arrived at the scene. When the paramedics arrived they got KING and put him on the stretcher with his hands bound and tied to his ankles. "Hogtied" is what it's called. They closed the doors and the ambulance drove off.

Two police cars escorted the ambulance from the area. She didn't see the paramedics check him at the scene or give KING

These police officials furnished the following information concerning their handling of allegations of brutality by police officers against RODNEY GLENN KING.

On Monday night, March 4, 1991, the Internal Affairs Division began gathering documentation, such as arrest reports. On Tuesday morning, Chief GATES instructed that the investigation should be bifurcated with a criminal investigation being run by the Robbery Homicide Division and internal investigation by the Internal Affairs Division. The internal investigation was subsequently suspended except to assist Robbery Homicide by gathering documents and other such records.

Investigators attempted to interview one of the officers who refused to waive his Miranda Rights and, because he had retained an attorney at that point, no interviews were conducted of that officer. Two additional officers refused to waive their Miranda Rights and were directed to provide statements for administrative purposes.

The department has been very careful to prevent the contamination of the criminal investigation by any statements made to internal investigators or any information which might present "Garrity" problems.

[redacted] stated that it was the intention of his department to cooperate as fully as possible with any federal investigation but that the matter was complicated by the fact that the County Grand Jury was currently receiving testimony and that his department needed to proceed carefully.

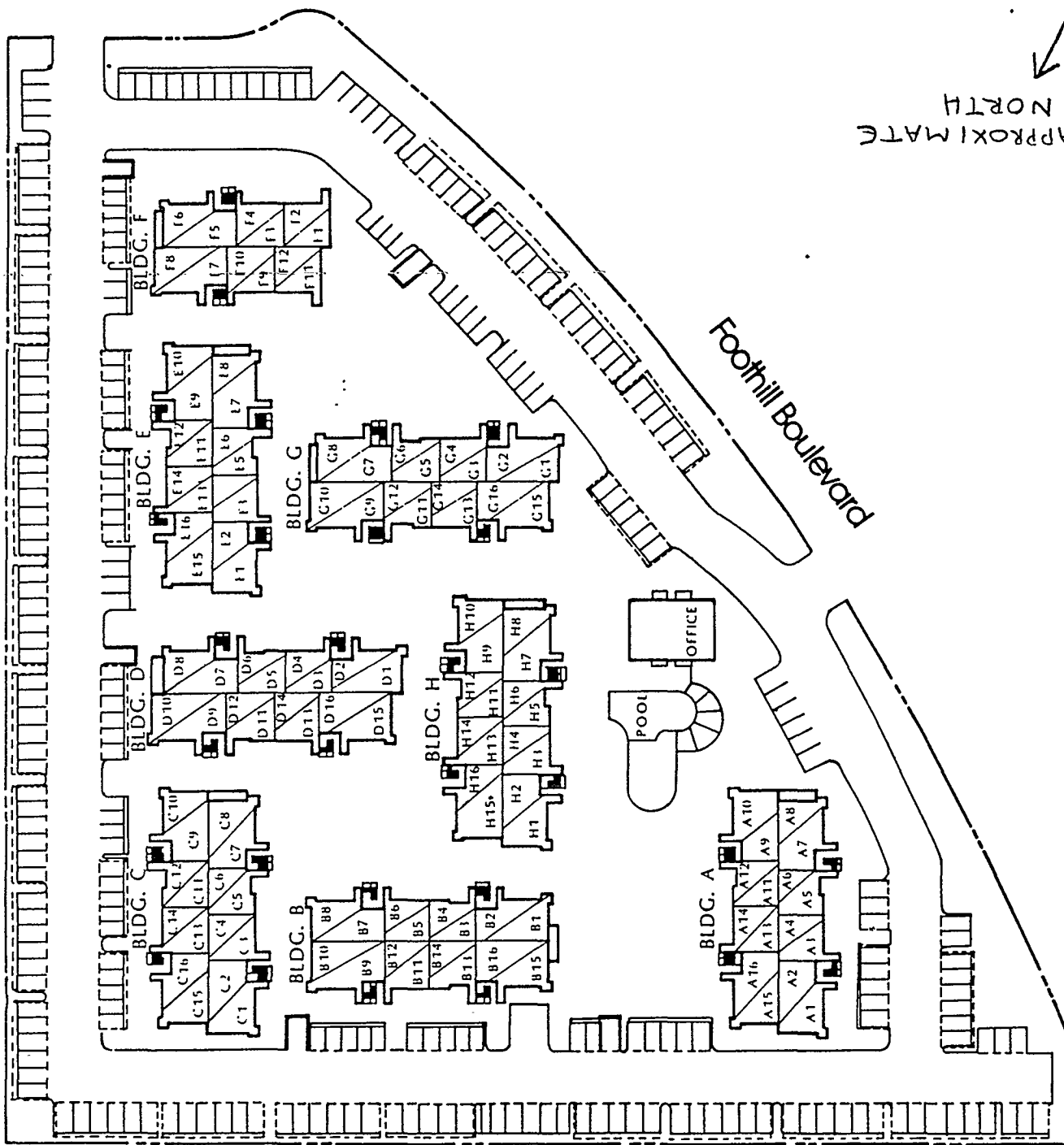

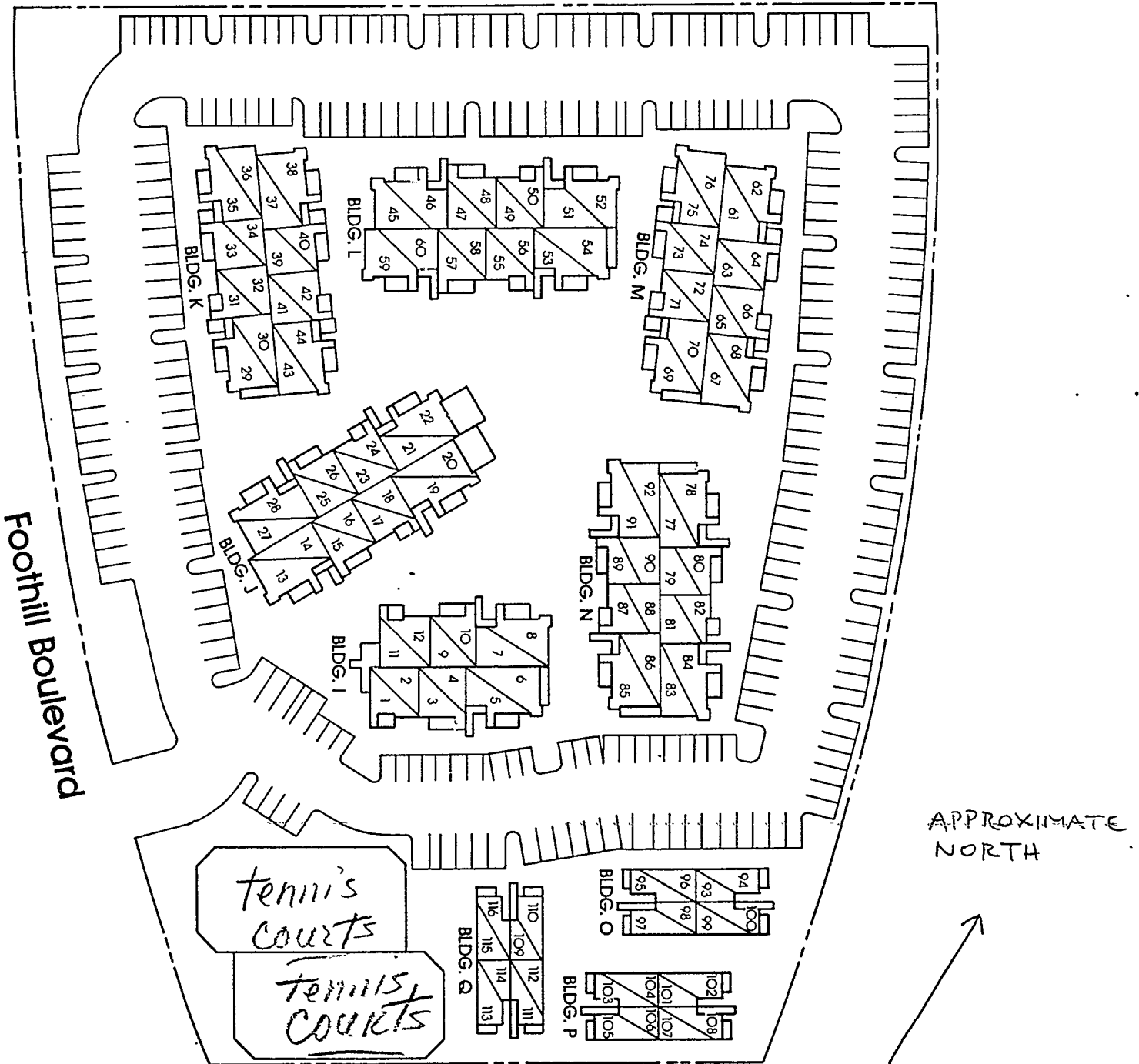
APPROXIMATE NORTH

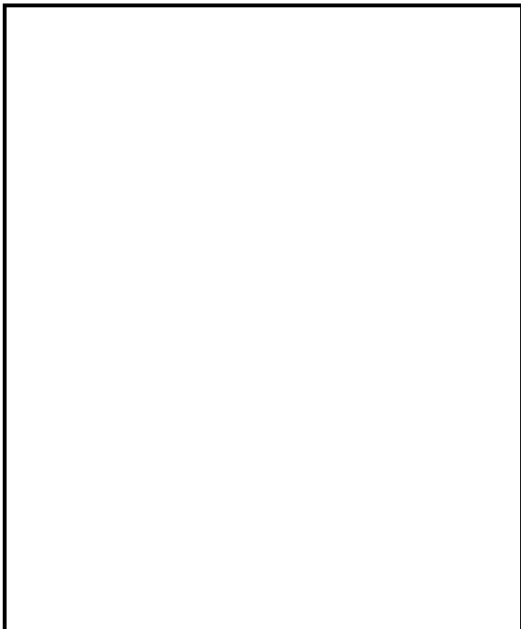

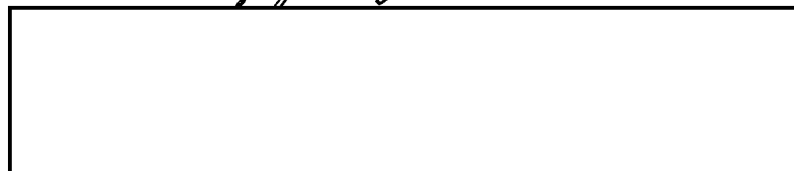
