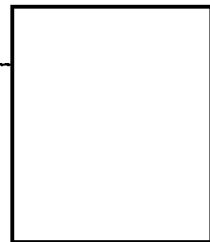

INITIAL INTERVIEWS OF 202 OFFICERS AT THE FOOTHILL DIVISION, LAPD, INDICATE THAT THE OFFICERS ARE DECLINING TO BE INTERVIEWED BY THE FBI, UNLESS THEY ARE REPRESENTED BY COUNSEL

AND SAID INTERVIEW IS CONDUCTED AT THE FOOTHILL DIVISION. POLICE OFFICERS' RESPONSE IS APPARENTLY BASED ON GUIDANCE PROVIDED BY THE LOS ANGELES POLICE PROTECTIVE LEAGUE (PPL).

AN ARTICLE APPEARED IN THE DAILY NEWS, SUNDAY MARCH 24, 1991, ENTITLED, "FBI TO PROBE FOOTHILL OFFICERS ON POSSIBLE CIVIL RIGHTS ABUSE" WHICH, IN SUMMARY, STATED THAT NEARLY 200 OFFICERS OF THE FOOTHILL DIVISION WOULD BE INTERVIEWED BY THE FBI TO DETERMINE WHETHER THERE HAS BEEN A PATTERN OF CIVIL RIGHTS ABUSE BY OFFICERS STATIONED THERE. THE DAILY NEWS STATED ITS SOURCES FOR THIS INFORMATION AS THE LAPD AND PPL OFFICIALS. OFFICERS HAVE BEEN TOLD BY THE PPL, THEY COULD BE FIRED FOR REFUSING TO ANSWER QUESTIONS FROM THE FBI.

THE PPL HAS ADVISED THE OFFICERS "THE SOLE PURPOSE OF THESE INTERVIEWS IS TO PROSECUTE POLICE OFFICERS" AND TOLD THEM TO READ THE FOLLOWING STATEMENT PRIOR TO QUESTIONING:

"I HAVE BEEN ORDERED TO GIVE YOU STATEMENTS AGAINST MY WILL, IN VIOLATION OF THE FIRST, FOURTH, FIFTH AND FOURTEENTH AMENDMENTS. I HAVE BEEN TOLD THAT IF I INVOKE MY FIFTH AMENDMENT RIGHT I WILL BE IN JEOPARDY OF HAVING MY EMPLOYMENT WITH THE CITY OF LOS ANGELES TERMINATED. UNDER THE DURESS OF DISCIPLINE, I AM COOPERATING WITH YOU."

THE ARTICLE ALSO STATES THAT "IF FBI AGENTS COME TO YOUR RESIDENCE, YOU MAY TELL THEM TO CONTACT YOU AT YOUR DIVISION OF ASSIGNMENT FOR AN INTERVIEW" AND TO CONTACT THE PPL IN ORDER TO ARRANGE THE PRESENCE OF AN ATTORNEY.

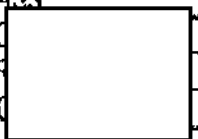

Dear FBI Director Wm. Sessions -

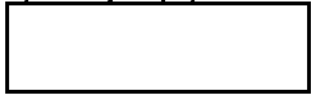

In addition to investigating allegations when they come to our attention, the FBI also provides civil rights and stress management training to law enforcement officers as part of our national police training program.

I can assure you that Director Sessions remains personally committed to civil rights for all Americans and understands the unique role of the FBI in ensuring that law enforcement is credible, evenhanded and fair in its treatment of criminal offenders.

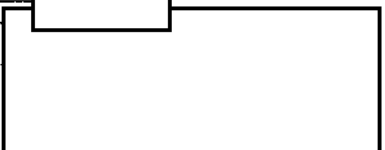

POWELL, TIMOTHY WING AND THEODORE BRISENO BY THE LOS ANGELES POLICE DEPARTMENT {LAPD} WERE PUBLISHED BY THE LOS ANGELES TIMES. STATEMENTS PROVIDED BY A PUBLIC EMPLOYEE WHICH HAVE BEEN SO COMPELLED CANNOT CONSTITUTIONALLY BE USED AGAINST THE EMPLOYEE IN A SUBSEQUENT CRIMINAL PROCEEDING, GARRITY V. NEW JERSEY, 385 U.S. 493, {1967}. LIKEWISE FRUITS OF THESE STATEMENTS ARE NOT ADMISSIBLE. ACCORDINGLY, IN ORDER TO AVOID ANY DEFENSE ARGUMENTS THAT CAPTIONED INVESTIGATION HAS BEEN TAINTED, LOS ANGELES {LA} IS INSTRUCTED TO IMPLEMENT THE FOLLOWING:

1. ALL EMPLOYEES OF THE LA FIELD OFFICE WHO ARE ASSIGNED TO CAPTIONED INVESTIGATION SHOULD {A} REFRAIN FROM READING THE ABOVE-DESCRIBED STATEMENTS PRINTED IN THE LA TIMES OR ANY OTHER PUBLICATION; {B} REFRAIN FROM READING ANY ARTICLE SUBSEQUENTLY PUBLISHED CONCERNING THE KING INCIDENT; {C} REFRAIN FROM VIEWING ANY TV BROADCAST CONCERNING THE KING INCIDENT; {D} REFRAIN FROM LISTENING TO ANY RADIO BROADCAST CONCERNING THE KING INCIDENT; {E} REFRAIN, IN GENERAL, FROM OBTAINING ANY KNOWLEDGE RE THE SUBSTANCE OF THESE COMPELLED STATEMENTS THROUGH DISCUSSIONS WITH FBI OR LAW ENFORCEMENT PERSONNEL OR FAMILY

MEMBERS.

2. ANY EMPLOYEE CURRENTLY ASSIGNED TO THE CAPTIONED MATTER WHO HAS READ THE COMPELLED STATEMENTS, OR WHO HAS IN ANY OTHER WAY OBTAINED KNOWLEDGE OF THE SUBSTANCE OF THESE STATEMENTS, SHOULD BE REMOVED FROM THE INVESTIGATION TEAM. LA IS ADVISED THAT THESE RESTRICTIONS APPLY NOT ONLY TO INVESTIGATIVE PERSONNEL, BUT ALSO TO ALL SUPERVISORY PERSONNEL INVOLVED IN ANY MANNER WITH THE MANAGEMENT OF CAPTIONED INVESTIGATION.

LA IS INSTRUCTED TO COMMUNICATE WITH AUSA TO OBTAIN FURTHER AND CONTINUING GUIDANCE RE GARRITY PRECAUTIONS. IN ADDITION, LA SHOULD CONTACT CIVIL RIGHTS UNIT, CHIEF , FTS 324-4272, REGARDING ANY QUESTIONS REGARDING IMPLEMENTATION OF THESE PROCEDURES.

[redacted] advised that in his opinion the problem with the LAPD in general is the fact that officers are both encouraged and applauded for their aggressiveness, even if the situation does not call for it. He said that a major part of the problem was caused by first-line supervisors not doing their jobs and not following LAPD guidelines in dealing with subordinates when they are physically abusive. He said that by not acting administratively against the abusive officers, they set the atmosphere for further abuse.

He advised that he felt that many of the so-called "red-neck officers'" aggressive behavior was due to their ignorance of minorities, in general, and of their cultural and value systems. He stated that it was as if these officers tried to impose their own values on the minorities they were dealing with. He said that these officers often responded to peer pressure by appearing arrogant, and many times this caused situations to escalate into confrontations resulting in physical altercation with minorities in street situations. He noted that [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] at LAPD Academy, only eight hours of race relations were taught. He said he felt that more time needed to be spent on this topic during training.

[REDACTED] advised that the RODNEY GLENN KING incident was not isolated but rather repeated throughout the different bureaus in the LAPD. He stated the only difference was that the KING incident was videotaped where others were not. He said that after viewing the KING video, he estimated that KING had been shocked eight times by the Taser and estimated that 400,000 volts had been used on KING. He said he based his conclusion on the fact that each time a person is shocked by a Taser, a 50,000 volt charge is sent through the wires into barbed darts lodged under the subject's skin. He was critical of the officers that struck KING in the head area, with their batons, inasmuch as this action was totally against LAPD policy. He advised the LAPD rules of engagement consist of the following:

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1. Verbal commands
2. Control holds
3. Tear gas/mace
4. Baton
5. Use of force

[REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] that the baton is to be limited to the striking of joints, with the neck, head and spine area strictly forbidden. He advised that a

We have just learned that the contents of the four defendants compelled statements have been printed in the Los Angeles Times. It is imperative that anyone working on the federal criminal civil rights investigation not be exposed to this information. We can anticipate that other newspapers, as well as TV and radio news reports, will also broadcast this information.

By separate memorandum, all Criminal Section personnel have been advised to avoid communicating about any of this information with any of the Criminal Section staff working on the investigation. We are requesting that the FBI take whatever measures are necessary to ensure that none of the agents working on the investigation -- in either a direct or supervisory manner -- have any exposure to the defendants' statements. In addition, it is requested that any management personnel at FBI Headquarters who expect to be engaged in making decisions about the course and conduct of this investigation, ensure that they are not exposed to any news accounts regarding these statements.

The FBI will not request the District Attorney's Office to furnish information obtained by the District Attorneys' Office after March 27, 1991.
3. The FBI will conduct no witness interviews other than as requested in the investigative requests of April 5 and April 12, 1991, without prior consultation with this Division and the Los Angeles USA's Office. The FBI will not conduct the investigation requested in this Division's investigative request of March 20, 1991, paragraph (b), unless and until requested to do so by this Division.
4. It is understood that the Los Angeles field office of the FBI has recently received four anonymous telephone calls purportedly from LAPD employees who have offered to provide information to the FBI, apparently concerning allegations of excessive force by LAPD officers not related to the King investigation.
