The Board of Regents, University of California,
held a meeting on October 17 and 18, 1968, on the campus

California. On the second day of the meeting, at which
California Governor Ronald Reagan was present. a
student at UCSC Stevenson College, presented
three proposals to the Board of Regents. These proposals,
according to the October 18, 1968 edition of the "Santa
Cruz Sentinel", a newspaper published daily in Santa Cruz,
California, were concerned with support for a proposed
Malcolm X College at UCSC; that the Regents favor a boycott
of California table grapes on University of California campuses;
and a protest against earlier action by the Board of Regents
restricting the number of lectures by outside speakers on
University of California campuses.

According to Santa Cruz, California Chief of Police Geno J. Pini (NA), Governor Reagan held a press conference at the conclusion of the meeting, at which there were 200 to 300 demonstrators. He advised that the Governor was verbally attacked with insults and profanity and at one point was struck by an unknown person. He stated that the Governor immediately struck back, and when he was asked by Chief Pini if he needed

"I want to thank those who are responsible for inviting me down here. I want to thank Mickey Mouse Reagan and Donald Duck Rafferty for making it possible. Before I go any further I want to get into this by saying what some people don't want to hear and others do not mind: Fuck Ronald Reagan, Fuck Ronald Reagan.

"Here we have a grade B character actor, who swindled his way into the governor's mansion by very quietly and very beautifully parroting the scripts put before him by some criminal writers from Hollywood or Disneyland or somewhere funny like that.

"He wants everybody to know and to behave in the manner prescribed by our governor. Our governor, our lord, our master, our leader and teacher—oink.

"Students at the University of California, along with some faculty members, invited me to participate in a series of lectures. They asked me to deliver ten lectures. I wouldn't have to change what I had been saying, but perhaps structure it a little bit so that it could be moulded into a package that could be brought off of the streets and into the quiet, peaceful halls of higher education.

But they can't go on killing us and they won't be able to keep us in their jails if the people of this country would stand up and tell them: "No more, motherfucker, no more! We're not going to have it no more!"

"The McCarthyites and the Kennedyites and those who are not really off into the right-wing bag -I think they got the message in Chicago. Racist pig Daley, Mayor Daley the butcher, the murderer, released his pigs on the people who had come to express their political position, helping to insure that meathead Humphrey would still maintain his pig-like grasp on the reins of power in the Democratic party. So we want to make it very clear to all the inhabitants of Disneyland, Los Angeles, Chief Reddin's pigpen, snorty Yorty's pigpen. We want to make it clear that we recognize that the Black Panther party, Black people alone, cannot deal with this. That its going to take an 'awakening 'generation, a revolutionary generation of white people, young white people who are brave enough and willing to face "It's a neighborhood, its communications and transportation are up tight and everything is around the corner including the specter of genocide, which black people have their eyes on.

"We see what the racists in this country are cookin' up for us. We the challenges of the ruture, the challenges of the present—to get out of all of these bags that we've been in—to look beyond the eth-nocentrism, the xenophobia that we've all been indoctrinated with to recognize that the world is a neighborhood, a community, and then move to eradicate every obstacle in our way to make it that

way so we can have peace on this parth!

"It is a basic principle that every man, woman and child on, the face of the planet earth has an absolute right to the highest and the best standard of living that human knowledge and technology is capable of providing. Period. Every man, woman and child, I don't care what color he is, or what country he's in. It is enough that he is born into this world and therefore he has the right to live. It is the responsibility of the organized machinery of society to do everything that it can to insure and to guarantee that everybody gets their issue without no bullshit about it.

"And we are gonna have it that way. That's the way it's gonna be. Because the revolutionary people of the world are saying that we're gonna be part of the democratic destruction of the world or we're going to be part of the democratic regeneration of this burnt-out planet.

"There aint gonna be no two ways about it. It's gonna be us or it ain't gonna be nobody. It's gonna be us together, or it's gonna be chaos in Babylon all over the planet earth, and we've got to understand that. This is the last goround. Everybody is face-to-face with the enemy and toe-to-toe. We've got to learn to make distinctions and somehow manifest where we are, so we can know who is the enemy and who is not the enemy.

"We can start out right now with a song that I have written entitled: "Fuck Ronald Reagan." Cleaver admitted that he is not much of a choir director. Then he led six "Fuck Ronald Reagan" cheers in the UCLA basketball pavilion. By the sixth try the cheerleader had most of the crowd shouting with him. Then he went on talking about power, racism and politics.)

"All power to the people. Black power to Black people. Red power to Red people. Brown power to Brown people. Yellow power to Yellow people. White power to White people. That's not what you have now. You have pig power now. If you have White power you wouldn't have the pigs on the Board of Regents inflicting their will on you.

"The people are insulted now by public servants who have become so arrogant. Take Mickey Mouse Rafferty with his PhD in Physical Education, who has based his career on taking all mention of communism out of the textbooks. We already have a song and dance man in the Senate. Now we're going to have a volleyball coach to decide over our lives. They say the people get the rulers they deserve. I'll be goddamned if we deserve that.

"Every people and every ethnic group has an absolute right to be in control of its own destiny.

"It is not man's destiny to be an exploiter and butcher of the people. We want to bring the boys home, but we don't want to bring them home to put them on the police force. We're not going to bring them home to do to us what they do in Vietnam. The boys don't want to murder people, We've got to welcome them home because we need a people's militia.

"We have to break with the past. We are going to have to dance to a tune that does not insult the humanity of any one.

"It is possible for White people not to be racists. White supremacy is over. It is possible for everybody not to be a racist. It is possible to get along. It is possible for everyone on the same planet earth to live together without being at everybody's throats and if they don't believe they ought to give up. It's possible for me to get along with Ronald Reagan if he doesn't try to tell me what to do, where I can go and if he doesn't force me to watch his movies.

"If we don't have that faith we can just let go, take acid, get drunk and let the pigs have it."



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
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STATEMENT OF ASSEMBLYMAN JOHN STULL TO UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA BOARD OF REGENTS, BERKELEY, CALIFORNIA, FEBRUARY 20, 1969

RE: MARCUSE AND McGILL

Ladies and Gentlemen:

Thank you for granting me the privilege of appearing before you. My request to come was prompted by the crises brought about by UCSD Chancellor William McGill's decision to rehire Dr. Herbert Marcuse. Admittedly, I have come in the hope that some words I say will influence you to veto this decision and use your power to prevent like disasters from occuring in the future.

Now, disaster is a strong word but, in the context of the times in which we live, when the campus is being rapidly converted to a battleground, I doubt if the term is overdrawn. The world over, University campuses are being used as revolutionary launching pads. This is not merely the hysterical opinion of one Assemblyman. It is a grim fact of life attested to by every issue of every current newspaper and on every newscast. Within the year, in Mexico, students took to trenches around the National University; in France students started a sequence of events that nearly toppled the government; in Japan, students engaged in a pyrotechnic rampage of appalling proportions; and so on, around the globe.

Our own battlefields are well known--among others, Columbia, Duke, the University of Wisconsin, and, to our sorrow, California. In every case, demands (some legitimate, some not) are accompanied by intimidation and violence by those who are, as has been said, quick to claim 'rights,' yet refuse to grant them; who worship dissent, yet tolerate none; and who, by the weapon of mass interference, impose their own brand of censorship.

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Thus, events force us to look at this situation squarely and ask ourselves what are our responsibilities? What is your responsibility as Regents? What is my responsibility as a legislator? Our responsibility is the same. We must find out why the measures taken have not improved the campus situation. There is a simple answer, and I believe it is because they were not the right measures. Almost consistently, symptoms have received treatment, not the disease itself. Incredibly, the measures taken have first, generally ignored the fact that cause has effect (which, if you will pardon the expression, Emerson called "the chancellors of God"). Second, blithly sidestepped the notion that ideas can have consequences, and third, that somebody is responsible for actions. Again, if you will excuse the expression, there has been little or no "relating." The case of Marcuse is a prime example.

On the one hand, the so-called New Left worships Marcuse as part of its trinity. "Marx, Marcuse, and Mao" is the battle cry and wherever Marcuse goes, trouble follows. Marcuse is no man of mystery. He has made no secret of what he believes either in his writing or in his speeches. And, unfortunately, there are those who mistake this visibility for his being the less dangerous.

Late last year, Marcuse shared a New Left platform in New York with black revolutionary, H. Rap Brown; S.D.S. Leader Carl Ogilve; folk singer Pete Seeger; and William Rose, acting general manager of the national radical newspaper, <u>Guardian</u>. On this occasion, Marcuse called for the sabotage of U. S. society and told the leftists to develop political guerrilla forces. He said small local groups, operating independently of each other, can encourage political ferment and can associate themselves with restless students, racial

disorders and other disturbances to foster what he calls "true socialist traditions." These traditions, he said, are being built in Communist Cuba, Communist China, and in Vietnam.

During a panel discussion of Columbia University riots, Marcuse said his definition of democracy included the "forcible occupation of buildings and the invasion of private property as a part of the democratic process."

In a book called "A Critique of Pure Tolerance," Marcuse says that people confused about politics don't really know how to use freedom of speech correctly—turning such freedom into "an instrument for absolving servitude," so that "that which is radically evil now appears as good." They employ their freedom for improper purposes. Having established this premise, Marcuse recommends "the withdrawal of toleration of speech and assembly from groups and movements which promote aggressive policies, armament, chauvinism, racial and religious discrimination, or which oppose the extension of public services." He says that the correct political attitude is one of "intolerance against movements from the right and toleration of movements from the left." He proposes, in short, leftwing dictatorship.

And along these lines, he has made a case for what he terms "socially useful destructiveness." This thesis is expressed in his book, "One Dimensional Man." Here he abandons the proletariat as the medium for the desired social upheaval and instead, finds much promise in students and the "oppressed" minorities. And what would come after the revolution? Marcuse says it will be ruled by an elite and majority rule would be replaced by the "morality" of a

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presumably infallible minority. So it goes, almost endlessly.

All this notwithstanding, on the other hand, we are told by Chancellor McGill that Marcuse has been rehired because he is an eminent scholar, he is one of the leading philosophers in the world today, and "was not found to be subversive." With no comment on the possible criteria used in reaching these conclusions, we find a form of schizophrenia imposed on Marcuse. What they say he does on campus is separated from what he is.

The community is asked to believe that Marcuse's mere presence is not a revolutionary factor; that his clarion call to arms for the destruction of the Republic has no bearing on whether he is on the payroll of the state; that what he does in the classroom is not related to what he does out of it. I maintain that it is not possible to separate Marcuse the teacher from Marcuse the revolutionary. The weird reasoning that tries to separate him from what he is, is tantamount to saying Jack the Ripper makes a neat incision and this is more important than the fact he is a murderer. Ergo, the thing to consider in giving the Ripper a job is that he makes a neat incision.

Marcuse is a cause.

Campus violence is an effect.

It is nothing short of delusion to think otherwise and in this given situation, this is an expensive delusion.

Therefore, most seriously, I ask you not to renew Marcuse's And, because his action regarding rehiring Marcuse, makes him an accessory before the fact of further campus violence, I ask you to relieve William McGill as Chancellor of the University of California. At this point, we cannot tolerate those who advocate appungsann -

violence such as Marcuse nor those such as McGill who underwrite it.

None of this is occurring in a vacuum. Responsibility for disorder

can and must be fixed or it will never be eliminated.

The argument is advanced that a philosophical balance in the departments will eliminate the threat of Marcuse. I can only say that although balance is desirable and possible in some cases, Marcuse is a star and he cannot be balanced by the cast, whoever they are. I also maintain that the issues of academic freedom and freedom of speech do not apply here as no society is required to finance its own destruction.

Nothing less than the fate of the university itself is at stake because, obviously, it cannot long endure with this continuing pressure both from within and without. The increasing violence and disorder within will inevitably be met by a public without, who, one way or another, will simply choke off funds or resort to other drastic steps. Then, this magnificent university system which has been a hundred years a-building will wither and die. This in no sense is a threat. It is simply an obvious conclusion.

What Marcuse contemptuously calls "reactionary political pressure" is not otherwise than the will of the people of California. Make no mistake—the will of the people is not to employ persons who seek to replace this Republic with a dictatorship, such as Marcuse advocates. Nor do the people, as I said before, crave to finance their own destruction, even, if in some quarters, its architect, is considered an eminent philosopher. The people also know that what is happening on the campus today can spill out into all of our lives tomorrow and our way of life will be gone.

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
In a speech made by President Howard R. Bowen, president of my alma mater, the University of Iowa, he quoted recently, "When liberty destroys order, the hunger for order will destroy liberty." He continued, "The eventual outcome of our strife in the cities and on the campuses of the nation, if it does not abate, will be some form of facism."

A dictatorship is exactly what Marcuse wants. I do not.


I cannot support any blueprint for change which potentially includes bullets as a method. We have ballots for effecting change. I urge you to act to remove the threats I have enumerated from our system.

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have to find out what this mysterious outfit with the merging cadres is about, so, once more, I ask what the organization stands for.

Tuesday the 9th, answers the boy, was the date of Martin Luther King's death: "TNC symbolizes the death of nonviolence. We're mostly white, organized in cadres to fight racism."

With violence, I wonder, or with nonviolence?

"Depends who you're talking to," he says. "Like I'm interested in what we accomplish, not necessarily how we do what we have to do. Other people are hung up on the idea that you can only honor King's memory by honoring nonviolent means. And then we have guys who say nonviolence died with the man and only force is gonna work in the future. Hell, we get pretty confused but we're the biggest activist outfit on this campus. About 300 students."

The Personal Circus is UCSD's self-discovery outfit, started by students. Last year, sophomore Tuck Donnelly went up to the Esalen Institute at Big Sur and came back to Atlantis Hall with his psyche full of encounter groups and body awareness sessions and sensitivity marathons. He wanted to bring awareness techniques to the campus, as a way of showing other students that you find expanded consciousness in yourself and not in drugs.

Meanwhile, Donnelly's friends—Tom Peifer, Jim Miner and Barry Waynehad decided they were tired of talking politics and wanted to try other ways of understanding their world. "I was in this strong political bag," remembers mustached Jim Miner, sitting with his colleagues and me in an Atlantis lounge. "I wasn't getting anything out of it except tensions. Some brought on by the system, sure. But some tensions were really selfrepressions."

"Right," says blond Tom Peifer, who has the smile and the gestures of a cheerleader. "The trouble with overthrowing a political system is that you have to get into the same kind of organizations, meetings, dumb bureaucracy—the same kind of crap you're busy trying to overthrow."

The Personal Circus started informally, unofficially, with occasional encounter groups

in dorm lounges. This year, in order to accommodate more applicants and have a regular meeting place, the founders decided to register the Circus with the administration.

That's when the trouble started. The dean of students threw them out. Donnelly figures the dean thought Personal Circus was a fancy name for free love or free pot. Their application didn't do anything to reassure the authorities. Where the form said PURPOSE, Personal Circus leaders wrote, "Happiness in human feelings." Where the form called for ACTIVITIES, they filled in, "Varied."

"We really didn't know how to approach them," says Peifer. "One of our ideas was to get started as a language club—you know, nonverbal communication. But it's almost impossible to describe an awareness group."

"You have to be there," says Miner. "Otherwise you wind up talking about what we hope to avoid. We have a high rate of dropouts here and we have a high rate of drug use. There are people on this campus who drop out or take drugs to keep from having nervous breakdowns. The Circus was the only thing that helped the headache I had all last year."

"We're trying to offer a third alternative," says Barry Wayne. "Dropping out and drugs both come from stress. We figure this is a better way to relax and discover yourself within the pressures of the place."

Having failed once, the Personal Circus petitioned the administration with more than 100 signatures. Members promised not to play therapists and they went to the faculty for support and guidance. Along with the second effort came an implied threat: if the school would not register the Circus, then it would meet anyway, underground, without formal permission. The administration has agreed to send an observer to the next meeting.

"But can they really understand what we're trying to do?" asks one of the members.

"I dunno," answers Tom Peifer. "Look at the trouble we're having at our ages. It's pretty difficult to cure 18 years of mind screw."

"I know," says a boy in a cowboy hat. "Personal Circus replaces what people lose



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

secretary who calls Marcuse's secretary who promises to check with the professor himself. Back through the same chain comes the message: yes. But I will have to pick up a special pass at Marcuse's office first. The doors to the lecture 'hal! are monitored.

Marcuse's office is above the campus library, light and airy and staffed by an attractive blond secretary. No place to conduct conspiracies.


My pass is a green piece of paper with purple print, hand-lettered in blue. Lettered is my name and the underlined plarase. ONE-TIME UNITY. As I thank the secretary, in walks a slightly-stooped, gray-haired sparrow of a man who starts to pour himself a cup of coffee from an urn in the corner. The secretary smiles at me and nods at him, meaning Dr. Marcuse is among us. When he turns to face her with his coffee, she introduces me.

We shake hands, and he asks if I have any "devices" with me. I have no idea what he means but I open my briefcase so that he can look inside where there are only pads and pencils. He explains that he meant recording equipment. And then, in a soft, paternal voice he apologizes. He is embarrassed for having asked and I am embarrassed too.


His course called "The Present Age" meets in the basement of the Humanities Building. Indeed, there are graduate student guards at the doors of the 250-seat auditorium and I must flash my ONE-TIME ONLY pass at them to enter.

The room is fan-shaped and full. An American flag stands behind the lectern. The students are predominantly freshmen, mostly clean cutters by the lengths of hair and skirts. Dr. Marcuse comes in a few minutes after the hour and his first remark is a request: "Would you please not smoke in this room. There have been many complaints. So repress. Repress." He rolls his "R's" and the students giggle over repression while the philosopher wipes his glasses. The kids lean forward, expectantly.

Today's lecture is basic Freud, all about man's instinctive need for pleasure versus civilization's restraint and repression of pleasure. Marcuse walks as he talks, constantly taking off his glasses and wiping them. He is cordial enough but hardly rousing as he describes the primal horde and goes on to define ego, id and superego.


From time to time, says Marcuse, the primordial force breaks through the repressions of civilization; sons may band together, as in the primal horde, to revolt against the father. Witness the generation gap.

The pimpled boy next to me snickers. I scowl at him. He looks surprised and turns to his notes. At last I have intimidated a student.

Marcuse continues: man's basic drives are sex and aggression. Both are in constant antagonism. There is no such thing as a self-preservation instinct; the need for pleasure supercedes self-preservation. Then, still using the same mild tone, still wiping his glasses, Marcuse concludes, "Aggression in man must sooner or later destroy him—as we shall see next time."

The guru of the revolution is a gentle, repressed personality, I realize. Certainly less aggressive than his critics.

SAN DIEGO: SIGNS AND SOUNDS OF TODAY

The environment is one of pressure. It's primarily a science school and study loads are heavy. Most students live on campus, with uneasy La Jolla nearby. They communicate with signs, and search for purpose through chemicals, revolutionary thought, religion and something called the Personal Circus.

I walked onto the UC San Diego campus and immediately saw larger-than-life faces of folk celebrities staring down at me: Bob Dylan, W. C. Fields, Che Guevara, Sophia Loren. They were pasted on high-rise dormitory windows, sharing glass space with other posters, bumper strips, cutouts, collages and tempera paintings.

A nude in shocking pink was painted into a window as if she were sitting on its sill. A political message read: "Citizens for Boysenberry Jam." Another window said: "God bless the pill." An eloquent sign language flourishes all over the University of California, San Diego branch. It flashes from bulletin boards and kiosks. It shrieks between buildings.

The sign language permits Argo Hall for men to communicate with Blake Hall for womenthe facing windows of the two large dormitories are dressed in social comment instead of curtains.

I walked through the Argo-Blake message center onto the main campus plaza, an open space the size of a city block surrounded by massive modern architecture. There was a solid geometry of classroom buildings to the north and east; a big library-humanities building to the south, complete with ramps and concretelined moat; residence halls to the west. It was powerful and formal and, at mid-morning, almost completely empty. I felt like the only character in a modern version of Last Year at Marienbad-dwarfed by pattern and perspective.

I could hear high fidelity rock from several dormitory rooms at a time; it was louder-thanlife background music for the outsized faces in the windows. At six-story Argo, the Rolling

Stones played against the Jimi Hendrix Experience who played against the Mothers of Invention. There was one second-story window with Bach behind it, but you had to stand right underneath to hear it.

This campus seemed to live by signals, a giant stage full of audio-visual devices but hardly any live action. Other campuses deal in confronta-

I sat on a wood bench and waited for some activity. And just before noon, people began to appear—some of them hauling card tables and Bulletin boards into the plaza to recruit for various campus organizations. I wandered over to a board labeled TNC and read a cryptic. message: "Cadre J will meet Thursday, 7:15 in the Revelle dormitory parking lot-we are merging temporarily with Cadre D.'

'What does TNC stand for?" I asked a girl at the TNC table with a textbook in her hands.

She looked up, large blue eyes beneath a sheepdog hairdo. She said, "Tuesday Ninth Committee," and then went back to her book. "Oh," I said, "And what's that? What are the

cadres?'

"I'm sorry, I can't talk," she answered, this time keeping her eyes in her text. "I have a midterm. Maybe you can come back later when there's someone here."

I walked away thinking UCSD is a remarkable place, where you hardly see people and when you finally do, they say they're not really there.

I found other symbolic signs of campus life by going indoors. I almost stepped on a spaghettihaired boy at Atlantis, one of six low-rise residence halls behind Argo. He was sprawled on the floor of a student lounge. He was studying while connected to a large headset which was attached to a wire which led through a doorway to a phonograph playing in his room. The plugged-in man.

I apologized. "S'okay," he said. "I can't study if there's quiet."

I didn't see any residents in the De Anza Hall lounge but there were two notices on the blackboard: "Will the individual(s) who has (have) been terrorizing this bulletin board contact Don Betts in Rm. 406 before he contacts you?" Just under that threat, in a different handwriting, came a very lewd but very funny suggestion for Betts.

I looked up Dana Pippin at Argo Hall. He's a clear-eyed, clean-chinned freshman from Los Angeles whose parents are friends of mine. Pippin showed me his room, a cubicle hardly larger than a walk-in closet. Three beds crammed the walls, a single decker and a double-decker, with aisle-space in between. The lower bunk had drapes all-around it like a pullman berth.

"It's the school work," explained Pippin. "My roommate wants the privacy. I have another friend who's a biology major; he has to stay up all night every two nights just to keep up with the workload. This place is very tough and, as you can see, it's very crowded.'

I talked to some more students and heard them agree: UCSD is a place of pressure.

The environment is one pressure. This fiveyear-old university grows atop 1,000 acres across Torrey Pines Mesa, overlooking the Pacific and the town of La Jolla. The ocean is handy for surfing and sailing but the community -full of rich people and retired people—is sometimes hostile to students in its midst. "This neighborhood," complained one boy wearing surplus military clothing from three different services, "is upper rent, upper class and upper tight."

Before the school came to La Jolla, liberals were a tiny minority, Jews were a rarity and Negroes were servants. Slowly, and not without pain on both sides, that's changing. But students who might prefer to live in town can't afford the rentals, so the residence halls are packed more by necessity than choice.

The academic program is another pressure. Revelle College, the first of UCSD's undergraduate schools, has a science-oriented curriculum and the administration assumes Revelle students are preparing for graduate work. Muir College, the second campus, is more inclined toward the humanities but insists on year-long sequences in math and the sciences.

UCSD is primarily a male preserve because it is science-strong. Boys outnumber girls by about two to one. This produces yet another pressure, according to a student I met while both of us were studying "rides-wanted" notices on the bulletin board in the cafeteria lobby. I asked him about the social life and he told me about the drug life without first asking my

"Not much social life," said the boy whose sharp nose contrasted with his rococo sideburns. "I think we probably have more speed freaks (methedrine users) than most campuses because there's so goddam much work and so few girls. At 2 a.m., you can see people flying and freaking out on the plaza, after they've finished studying and don't know what else to do. You teach here?"

"No, I don't teach," L'told him. I said I was doing research and pointed out that drugs

'Sure they are," he continued, walking me through the cafeteria line, "but what you have to understand is that people around here are controlled. Even the freaking is controlled. We use drugs as tools now instead of letting drugs use us. A science school doesn't riot. It studies. For some guys, drugs may be like getting drunk on Friday night. For other guys, drugs are another way to do our research. We figure classes are only one place to learn; we're also studying things like life style, religion and revolution-kind of all at once." He stopped his tray. "Hey, if you're gonna get to know this place, you ought to hear Marcuse.'

I told him I intended to hear Marcuse. After lunch I crossed the Revelle Commons to notice another window message: "Don't spit in the soup—we've all got to eat."

This is the day Herbert Marcuse's undergraduate class meets. Marcuse is the most controversial philosopher in California, the synthesizer of Freud and Marx whose books have become working manuals for American student revolutionaries. Marcuse has been the target of the San Diego press, the American Legion, the La Jolla rightists and conservative politicians; they all want to have him fired. They all keep applying pressure on the UCSD administration and the Board of Regents.

So when I ask a UCSD information executive where to find this besieged celebrity, he hesitates. Then he reminds me that Marcuse has received death threats.

Dr. Mandler interrupts: "Well, if the basic values come from man, then is there any positive meaning to life?"

I sit there listening to the students bring a theological discussion right down to the level of their own confusions and I wonder how many parents have any idea these arguments cross their kids' skulls. And I wonder how many adults would want to grapple with themselves the same way.

A boy with huge horn-rim glasses complicates this seminar still further: "I think it was Kierkegaard who claimed dread is the possibility of freedom. Then dread could shove you away from faith toward suicide, when possibility and freedom and non-being kind of all become the same thing."

"The basic anxiety," suggests Dr. Mandler, "may be the awareness of non-being." She goes on to say that Freud thought neurotic people were more creative, while Tillich wrote that neurotic people tend to be narrow and timid.

"Well," says the basseteyed boy, "it's sort of both. When I feel everything is closing in on me, I'm under a neurotic pressure and I have to write something. But when

As this class ends I remember the window of Blake Hall which says, "Being is dying by loving." I suppose this means non-being is dying without loving and then I also remember Marcuse quoting Richard Wagner, "The only real fulfillment of love is death"

The Sociology of Everyday Life" convenes in a nearby hut and I wander over to see whether students can turn the everyday into the cosmic as quickly as they brought the cosmic down to everyday.

But this is an entirely different physical setup: larger classroom, ordered rows of chairs, some 50 students. This is a lecture. And although the subject is interesting enough and the instructor is lucid enough, there are four students sleeping before the class is 20 minutes old.

The lecturer pays no attention to them. He contrasts the middle and lower classes, saying that middle people tend to live interior lives in private settings, whereas poor people tend to take to the streets. For many lower-class kids, their neighborhood is their turf and their private preserve, which often leads to conflict with the police who think of a street as a public setting.

A girl in front of me sleeps with her head cradled in her arms and even as I try to concentrate on the lecture, I'm fascinated to see her back as a flag of four colors: hiked up green sweater, pale skin, pink underpants showing above a hiked down pair of brown slacks. Sleepers are themselves a distraction and I find myself beginning to agree with the students who scream for participation in the learning process.

The instructor winds up with a discussion of private morality versus public morality, marijuana being an example. Many people who smoke pot, says the lecturer, privately believe it to be harmless and pleasurable. But they play safe and smoke secretly because there's still a law against marijuana. So public morality, which is the law, often outlives its useful-

hut, across the old Marine base, over the pedestrian bridge above Gilman Drive, and into the Revelle campus -about 10 minutes walking time. While I eavesdrop, they discuss the chemical properties of pot compared to more dangerous drugs. It's interesting but beyond me. So I leave them in the lobby of the Undergraduate Sciences Building, where there's yet another sign of these college times: "Under graduates wanted to do dull tasks in psychological experiment-\$1.67 per hour."

The campus is quiet and quite beautiful at night. Lights warm the insides of the buildings and darkness softens the hard corners of their exteriors. On the grass next to the plaza, a boy and a girl wrestle with a collie and then wrestle, laughing, with each other while the dog barks. A steady stream, almost a processional, of other kids go into the library.

The added attractions for this night include an old herror meviorski campus Coffee Hut, a visiting radical speaker from UC lorkeley and a student-faculty discussion meeting.

I choose the student-faculty session in the Science Building and take a seat on the far aisle of a lecture hall. Student activist Mike Brown, an extremely bright boy who hides under a black floppy hat and black flowing beard,

has told me that sometimes as few as 15 people show up for these things. Usually almost half of them are faculty; professors, too, are curious about this student generation.

Nearly 50 people appear this time, making it a success, but causing immediate procedural confusion. There are 10 professors in the room and almost every one of them seems to have a suggestionon framing an agenda, on changing rooms, on breaking up into smaller groups.

A student complains that this is typical faculty decisiveness. Everybody laughs but the older men laugh more nervously.

The consensus is to split into sections of about 10 people, with at least two professors attached to each. I tag along behind a group that

decides to shop for an open lounge in Argo. We ride the elevator up the high-rise dormitory and I think back 20 years to when I used to have to wait to be invited to see a professor after regular school hours. Here the teachers are coming to the students, wanting to be wanted.

We find a lounge and most of the people, faculty included, sit on the floor. A student charges that the faculty is the most powerful population at a university and he wants toknow why the faculty hasn't used that power to push for change.

If that means power to move to the left, answers a professor, then that's what's happening. "The period of appeasing the Regents," he says, "seems to be at an end."

Then would the faculty strike, asks a student, if the situation here ever became as repressive as, say, San Francisco State?

"I suspect," answers a second professor, "that the more radical faculty members are the younger onestruther, the ones wi less to lose should the choices come to striking, quitting, or community by on the estab-lishment side, think there s something worth saving here at this campus, and I'd hateto see us ever reach an mpasse where this university loses its capacity for open inquiry because either repression or revolution has closed us down."

"Okay," answers a student, "but if the university really is a forum for open inquiry, then it seems that the worthwhile discussions and ideas happen outside the classroom. That's wrong. We want to use what we are learning and apply it to the community and ourselves."

The professors nod. And I realize that even under the pressures here the students are doing exactly that. They are doing their things and influencing our things and dragging all of us along with them.

The students are already changing this world. They talk about it while they do it and at UCSD they even post notices about it.

On the way off the campus I took one last look at the residence hall complex. There was a window I hadn't stared at before. "Sex before finals," it said. Just one more outside experiment before academic judgment day.

Mr. Herbert Ellingwood, who is a contact of our Sacramento both representatives of Governor Office, along wit Reagan's office, State of California, came by my office at 9:15 a.m. this morning.

Mr. Ellingwood stated that Governor Reagan has no opportunity to outright dismiss eight chancellors of state educational institutions who are more or less palliative in their handling of the Students for a Democratic Society and extremist elements. The Governor merely sits as one member of a 24-man Board of Regents governing these institutions. Consideration has been given to requesting the state legislature to pass bills calling for the dismissal of the eight chancellors, however, this is deemed politically unwise.

Mr. Ellingwood also indicated that the California State Supreme Court has been worse than the U. S. Supreme Court insofar as favoritism towards these groups is concerned. He pointed out that Chief Justice Trainor will retire early next year and Governor Reagan plans to appoint a conservative. Later on other retirements will occur which will cause a better balance towards conservatism in the State Supreme Court.

Mr. Ellingwood stated that Governor Reagan is dedicated to the destruction of disruptive elements on California college campuses. state government will attack these groups through several methods. (1) By hounding the groups as much as possible by bringing any form of violation available against them. He cited as an example that if any of these groups has a bookstore on campus they will bring building code violations against them. He also indicated that he hopes to bring to the attention of the Federal Government possible Federal violations. In this instance he cited the fact

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Athat U. S. Attorney Cecil Poole, San Francisco, is of no help whatsoever to the state government and, as a matter of fact, refuses to be of any cooperation in the fight against these groups. Mr. Ellingwood at this point also referred to the fact that he and Governor Reagan planned to call on Department of Justice officials today in the hope of having the Civil Rights Division move against those elements which disrupted the peaceful pursuit of studies by right-thinking (2) Mr. Ellingwood spoke of the possibility of referring tax violations both to the Internal Revenue Service of the State of California and to the Federal Internal Revenue Service. He asked if the FBI had referred such matters to Internal Revenue. I answered in the affirmative, stating that each time violations or potential violations came to our attention we naturally disseminated such information to the Internal Revenue Service. (3) A psychological warfare campaign. In this connection Mr. Ellingwood indicated that he plans to confer with Department of Defense officials today to get ideas from those individuals as to how to conduct campaigns of this nature. I told him that we were well aware of such potentials.

I outlined briefly for Mr. Ellingwood the type of investigations carried on by the FBI, the progress we had made in this field, and the tremendous accumulation of evidence we had furnished the Department of Justice.

Mr. Ellingwood told me he did not plan to confer with Secretary Finch of Health, Education and Welfare or with any officials of Health, Education and Welfare inasmuch as he considered this agency to be deplorable in its favoritism towards the Students for a Democratic Society and extremist elements. I told Mr. Ellingwood that we, of course, would have no comment concerning the handling of such matters by any Federal agency, however, we were dismayed last week when one of our officials had accepted an invitation to speak before the top-level executives of Health, Education and Welfare only to find that there were approximately 20 disruptive individuals attempting to break up this meeting. I stated these were summer employees of Health, Education and Welfare.

Mr. Ellingwood asked me regarding the possibility of Federal courts	
placing travel restrictions on leaders of the Students for a Democratic Society	
and extremist groups. I told him I would not be too encouraged in this regard

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Mr. Ellingwood asked if the FBI could be of any assistance in furnishing Governor Reagan items of intelligence so that assistance could be offered in the California fight against these groups. I told Mr. Ellingwood that we of course were bound by Executive Order insofar as dissemination of intelligence is concerned, however, in a number of instances Mr. Hoover had permitted our Special Agent in Charge, John Williams, Sacramento, to informally discuss matters with the Governor and his top assistants. I stated that we, of course, must consider each request on an individual basis and that when SAC Williams received a request for assistance from Governor Reagan, he would forward this request for consideration to FBI Headquarters in Washington, D. C. I told Mr. Ellingwood further that his request would of course be made known to the Director and if the Director had any different ideas, we would let him know.

Mr. Ellingwood was most commendatory concerning the Director and the FBI, and he spoke of Governor Reagan's admiration for the Director. Mr. Ellingwood left with me a "white paper" prepared by his office and submitted to Governor Reagan. This concerns the confrontation at the "People's Park" at Berkeley, California.



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

The memory of a man we hold in high esteem and for whom we have a great personal warmth and affection has brought us all together here tonight. At the groundbreaking for Eisenhower College, Bob Hope called the school a monument...a living monument to a monumental man. He said the General believed that education was something more than one of freedom's blessings——education was freedom...freedom of the mind to search for, and find, a better way of life for all mankind.

And, the General's great and good friend, Winston Churchill, said: "The destiny of man is not measured by material computation. When great forces are on the move in the world, we learn we are spirits, not animals. There is something going on in time and space—and beyond time and space—which, whether we like it or not, spells beauty." How appropriate these words are to this man we could refer to as President or General, but who is enshrined in all of our hearts, and so many millions more, as just "Ike."

His lifetime was devoted to duty. In expressing his pride in this college he said we must, all of us, have a sharper understanding of how we are to exercise the rights of citizenship, and to discharge its duties. He was trained in the science of war. But, he called it "man's greatest stupidity." And his dream for all mankind was a world at peace.

Still, he knew that his craft and his profession were absolutely necessary in this world. For there is a price on peace, and sometimes that price is more than free men can pay.

There is also one with us here tonight _the president who knows the weight of duty. He too knows that the price for an immediate peace could well be a thousand years of darkness for generations yet unborn.

There are parades held today in our streets in the name of peace. But, some who march in those parades carry the flag of a nation that has killed almost 40,000 of our young men. We have a right to suspect that at least some who organized those parades are less concerned with peace than they are with the welfare of the enemy.

Many of our universities who should be committed to learning and free inquiry will close down classes in what is called a "Vietnam Moratorium Day", and it is correctly named because there will be a moratorium on free discussion. There will be no legitimate debate of the alternatives facing this nation.

The decision has already been reached by the National Vietnam Day Committee. Those responsible for the safety and the security of this nation and it's people...those who have access to the facts and the information...will simply be told what their course shall be by the self-annointed.

And young Americans, living today, will die on some tomorrow because the enemy planned his strategy so as to add fuel to the demonstrations in American streets where he hopes to win that which he cannot win in the rice paddies and the jungles of Vietnam.

If I sound too harsh, it's because I know no other way to talk about those who would lend comfort and aid to the enemy. Those who protest would have the game without the name.

But today, no less than the Premier in Hanoi, Than Van Dong, made it plain that he does receive comfort and aid from this planned protest. His letter has been made public by the government in Hanoi. It is addressed to his 'dear American friends' and it is full of praise and gratitude for their efforts. It expresses the hope that together, with those friends in America, they can go forward to total victory. He signs it 'affectionately yours'.

Those entrusted with the awesome responsibility of the leadership of our nation deserve not only our support, but our rejection
of those in our midst who would arrogantly kibitz in a game where
they haven't even seen the cards with which the game is played.
They would like to attempt brain-surgery. But, they have gone only
so far as to read the directions on an aspirin bottle.

I know it is something of a cliche to draw a parallel between the rise and fall of Rome and the course of our own Republic.

Certainly this is true in academic circles. And yet, the parallel is there in such detail that it is frightening...almost eerie.

Dr. Robert Straus-Hauppe recently published a series of articles based on the observations of a number of historians; Spengler, DeReincourt, Ferraro, Gibbons and some others.

He told how Rome had known a pioneer beginning not unlike our own pioneer heritage, and then entered into two centuries of greatness reaching its pinnacle in the second of those centuries, going into the decline and collapse in the third. Yet, the signs of decay were becoming apparent in the latter years of that second century.

It is written that there were vast increases in the number of the idle rich, and the idle poor. The latter were put on a permanent dole, a welfare system not unlike our own. As this system became permanent, the recipients of public largesse increased in number. They organized into a political bloc with sizeable power. They were not hesitant about making their demands known. Nor was the government hesitant about agreeing to their demands...and with ever increasing frequency. Would-be emperors catered to them. The great, solid middle class—Rome's strength then as ours is today—was taxed more and more to support a bureacracy that kept growing larger, and ever more powerful. Surtaxes were imposed upon incomes to meet emergencies. The government engaged in deficit spending. The Denarius, a silver coin similar to our half dollar began to lose it's silvery hue. It took on a copper color as the government reduced the silver content.

Even then, Gresham's law was at work, because the real silver coin soon disappeared. It went into hiding.

Military service was an obligation highly honored by the Romans. Indeed, a foreigner could win Roman citizenship simply by volunteering for service in the legions of Rome. But, with increasing affluence and opulence, the young men of Rome began avoiding this service, finding excuses to remain in the soft and sordid life of the city.

They took to using cosmetics and wearing feminine-like hairdo's and garments, until it became difficult, the historians tell us, to tell the sexes apart.

Among the teachers and scholars was a group called the Cynics whose number let their hair and beards grow, and who wore slovenly clothes, and professed indifference to worldly goods as they heaped scorn on what they called "middle class values."

I'm still talking about Rome.

The morals declined. It became unsafe to walk in the countryside or the city streets. Rioting was commonplace and sometimes whole sections of towns and cities were burned.

And, all the time, the twin diseases of confiscatory taxation and creeping inflation were waiting to deliver the death blow.

Then finally, all these forces overcame the energy and ambition of the middle class.

Rome fell.

We are now approaching the end of our second century. It's been pointed out that the days of a democracy are numbered once the belly takes command of the head. When the less affluent feel an urge to break a commandment and begin to covet that which their more affluent meighbors possess they are tempted to use their votes to obtain instant satisfaction. Then equal opportunity at the starting line becomes an extended guarantee of at least a tie at the finish of the race.

Under the euphemism "the greatest good for the greatest number," we destroy a system which for two centuries has accomplished just that. The greatest good for the greatest number.

Demonstrations to force colleges to divorce themselves from participating in the defense of the nation take place. We've known riots in our streets. We no longer walk the countryside or the city streets without fear.

The jungle seems to be closing in on this little plot we have been trying to civilize for 5,000 years and all of us, I know, are disturbed at the virus that has infected the campus.

No doubt we could all top each other with frightening and unbelievable stories. One day on one of our campuses I listened to a tape recording of a so-called student meeting where they were planning a campus disruption. Explicit directions were given on how to start fires in college buildings. Subsequently, there were 50 fires started in those buildings in one day.

Continuing to listen, they outlined where the pickets would go and how they would parade and what they would do and how they would take over the college. We actually heard a voice say: "If, in the process, it becomes necessary to kill, you will kill."

We were gripped with an overwhelming sense of unreality.

Unreality that it is happening at all. But, even more frightening is how close we have come to accepting it as a normal way of life.

Dr. Spock's babies have grown up, which is probably more than we can say for the doctor. I confess I liked him better when his concerns were pablum and potty training.

In my state, two young people lie with mangled hands and sightless eyes. One 20-year-old girl was picking up the mail delivery in a college administration office when the bomb exploded. The other was a 19-year-old boy.

In the dark early morning hours, he was planting a bomb in a campus building when it exploded prematurely. The bomb was a symbol of his rage and his hatred. We wonder, when and how did this all begin?

It began the first time someone old enough to know better declared it is no crime to break a law in the name of social protest.

It started with those who proclaimed, in the name of academic freedom, that the campus was a sanctuary, immune to the laws and rules that govern the rest of us.

It began with those who, in the name of change and progress, decided we could scrap all the time tested wisdom man has accumulated in his climb from the swamp to the stars.

Simply call its constricting tradition and morality the dead hand of the past, and wipe out the discipline as no longer binding upon us.

Saint Thomas Aquinas warns teachers that they must never dig a ditch in front of a student that they fail to fill in.

To cleverly raise doubts, and ever seek, but never to find, is to discuss freely all sides of a question without values and, thus, to insure the creation of a generation of uninformed and talkative minds.

Our obligation is to help our young people find truth and purpose...to find identity and a goal.

I have talked to those already in rebellion, already with a torch and the club in their hands. Admittedly, they are a tiny few. A very few in number on all of our campuses.

But, there is a ferment on our campuses involving the great majority. They have complaints, and their complaints are legitimate. They want to invest their energy and their idealism in causes they can believe in. They refuse to become numbers in a computer. They want more than a four-year ride on an assembly line in some kind of a diploma mill. They want a re-ordering of the priorities.

The United States Department of Education, in taking a survey on 68 campuses, and questioning 7,500 professors, found this answer to the question: "What is the obligation of a University?" The professors said: "To protect the academic freedom of the faculty."

What has happened to teaching? It is time for all of us, especially those in charge of the institutions of learning, to revise and review the bidding.

Shouldn't the doctrine 'publish or perish', and even research, follow in the order of importance the need to teach our young people?

It is possible that even among the most radical protestors, there are those who have in reality been crying out for help. And, it is all the more poignant because the cries have gone unheard and unheeded.

One day I participated in a lecture series in a large midwestern university. It was opened to the public. There were about
4,000 adults on the main floor of the auditorium of the field house.
There were more than 10,000 students all the way to the ceiling in
the tiers of seats around the great oval. During a question and
answer period one question came to me and I don't remember exactly
what it was about. But, the questioner expressed concern that our
young people were rebelling against the moral standards and the
principles we have tried to teach them all of their lives.

In my answer I expressed a belief that they we had 't so much rebelling against the standards and the principles. They were rebelling because they don't believe that we are living up to those standards and principles.

There was a second of silence, and then 10,000 young people came to their feet with a roar I shall never forget.

Have they lost faith in the rules, or have they lost faith in us?

Do they doubt our willingness to practice what we preach?

Has there been a quiet drifting away...an erosion of our moral commitments?

Where were we when God was expelled from the classroom?

How often do they see us dismiss wrong-doing in public life with this sort of easy tolerance--"well that's just politics"?

The halls of government are the very temples of freedom and we should so consider them. What about us when the youngster comes home from the football field and tells us, with great pride, how he learned to get away with holding—without being caught—on a block. How many times have they been in a car with us and seen us look over our shoulder, then fudge on a stop—light because there wasn't any policeman in sight?

As the country parson once said, "The fellow who left the gate open is only slightly more guilty than the one who saw it open and didn't close it."

Is it possible that much of what frightens and disturbs us actually started with us?

With such a gradual and silent erosion of our own moral code, no government at any level and for any price can afford the police necessary to insure our freedom unless the overwhelming majority of us are guided by an inner personal code of morality—a code that makes us act when we are alone, the same as we do when the eyes of the crowd are upon us.

Some years ago, when Bud Wilkinson had those great national championship teams out in Oklahoma, toward the close of the season he took one of those great teams to play a very mediocre Texas—Christian team. That day, TCU rose to the heights as some times a beaten team will. In the closing seconds a receiver dived into the end zone to make a shoestring catch of what would have been the winning touchdown against the national champions. There was a huge upset in view. The crowd was going wild. But down in the end zone the kid stood up...walked over to the referee, and said: "No sir, it touched the ground before I caught it."

Now, what was your reaction? Was your first reaction...Now wait a minute---that's going too far? The referee didn't see it! He should have kept his mouth shut! Or, should he?

Someday, he may represent you in a statehouse, or in Congress or in the White House, And what then? Do you want him to keep his mouth shut if no one is looking? Do you want him to base his decisions on political expediency? Or, do you want him to base those decisions on the same kind of inner moral conviction that made him tell the truth to the referee without being asked?

And, who will teach them--by word and deed--that kind of morality if it isn't us?

On the deck of the tiny Arabella off the coast of Massachusetts, in 1630, John Winthrop gathered a little band of pilgrims together. He told them of the life they would have in this land that they had not yet seen. He said: "We shall be as a city upon a hill. The eyes of all people are upon us so that if we shall deal falsely with our God in this work we have undertaken and so cause Him to withdraw His present help from us, we shall be made a story and a byword through all the world." For you who have considered, "What can I do?" in this time of crisis in our world, I would suggest supporting Eisenhower College, and making it as a city upon a hill.

Without such schools, this shining dream of John Winthrop may well become a taste of ashes in our mouths.

These schools—like Eisenhower College—are educational whet—stones, serving to home the educational process, helping to improve the public tax—supported system, keeping it competitive in the drive for excellence. By their very competition, they help preserve the freedom of public institutions from political interference and guarantee a measure of academic freedom the public institutions could never attain by themselves.

General Eisenhower commended those who gave of their time and substance to bring this college into being, and to keep it alive. He knew that institutions such as Eisenhower College are essential to America. They provide leadership out of all proportion to their size.

America will be needing them more and more in the days ahead. Ladies and gentlemen of the world of commerce and industry and the professions, you can make no greater investment in freedom than by your contributions to independent schools and colleges, such as Eisenhower College.

I dare to hope that one day the federal government will grant tax-credits--not deductions, but tax credits--for a portion of the tuition fees made by parents sending their sons and daughters to such colleges. I even dare to hope that they will explore the possibility of extending federal aid, not through more bureacracy, but by creating tax credits for contributions to such schools and colleges, if we are to win the battle that is being fought today in the minds and hearts of our young people.

I pray that you will keep alive this dream of a man named Ike who left us these words: "We believe individual liberty, rooted in human dignity, is man's greatest treasure; that men, given free expression, will prefer freedom and self-dependence to dictatorship and collectivism."

And then he reminded us that freedom from fear, injustice and oppression will be ours only in the measure that men who value such freedom are ready to sustain its possession and defend it against every threat from within or without.

The college bearing his name is pledged to the preservation of his ideals, and the country he loved so much. I think we can do nothing less than to see that it becomes as a city upon a hill.

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

Sir:

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I am not writing this as a part of the radical, draft dodging dissident movement so prevalent in our country today, rather as a concerned citizen who happens to love and care what happens to a few people very close to her. This letter is meant to supplement the information on the request for discharge and to appeal to you as the Commander in Object of our armed forces to act upon this request. Night I suggest that before reading any further, that you take a moment to review the enclosed affidavits, as this letter will bring those statements up to date. Thank you.

A few of these affidavits were written about the time that had to return to base from his emergency leave, however, much more has happened since then to prompt me to take such drastic action as to impose our problems on you, Sir. Had it not been for the apathy and lock of concern I have faced in trying to get below. I would never have gone so far. Let me begin with

As was stated in the affidavits,

The started talking about how our country ought to

be taken over by the Communists because they would surely get us straightened out. He elso mentioned killing the President and possibly our rovernor, too. People were staring at him and I tried to quiet him. I told him he could go to jail for talking like that and I doubted that would be very broud of him if that happened. On April 7, 1970, Sergeant Intelligence Unit, Fresno Police Department, Fresno, California, advised as follows:

On the evening of April 6, 1970, Governor Ronald Reagan made a scheduled appearance at the Las Vegas Room of the Hacienda Motel, Clinton Avenue and Highway 99, Fresno, California. At about 7 p.m. a group of 50 to 60 males and females, principally of Mexican-American extraction, ranging in ages from about 18 to 30, entered the Hacienda Motel Lobby and proceeded to the entrance of the Las Vegas Room and began creating a disturbance by chanting "Viva La Raza" and various obscenities. The chief Security Officer for the motel asked the crowd to leave the premises but they refused and the intensity of the chanting increased as Fresno police reinforcements arrived. One individual, later identi-, spit on a police officer and as he was being apprehended, the crowd began throwing rocks Several windows were broken but there were no and bottles. injuries. A Fresno Police Sergeant declared the crowd and area an unlawful assembly and ordered dispersal several times



with the aid of a "bullhorn." The crowd still refused to disperse and six ring leaders of the group, including were then arrested. One of the six, was observed throwing a rock at a police officer. The crowd then dispersed.

At about this same time, another Fresno Police Sergeant observed three individuals on the Clinton Avenue overpass over Highway 99 just south of the Hacienda Motel. Upon checking the area after the three individuals had left, the sergeant found three "Molotov cocktails." The three bottles had been filled with what appeared to be gasoline and a detergent and rag wicks were affixed in the top of the bottles. There was no evidence to indicate any "Molotov" had been thrown in the vicinity of the Hacienda Motel.

The six individuals arrested and charged with trespassing and unlawful assembly in connection with the above described disturbance are as follows:



It was certainly nice talking with you yesterday and, following your telephone call, I determined that Governor Reagan was en route to San Diego, scheduled to arrive at 4:55 p.m., Pacific Southwest Airlines, with arrival at Lindbergh Field.

Arrangements were made so that I could talk to the Governor as soon as he arrived. Just as his plane had come to a stop on the apron for disembarking, there was an anonymous telephone call concerning a bomb threat which caused his aides to move him from Lindbergh Field as quickly as possible and, since he was staying at the Royal Inn Motel only five minutes from the airport, he was immediately ushered to that location.

As a matter of expediency, I followed the Governor to the Royal Inn Motel and, as soon as he left his limousine outside the motel, I contacted him and gave him your message. This was delivered at 5:08 p.m., Pacific Daylight Time.

In accordance with arrangements approved by the Director, Mr. Mardian conferred with Mr. Hoover in Mr. Hoover's Office this morning. At the outset of their meeting Mr. Hoover advised Mr. Mardian that the failure of the Internal Security Division of the Department of Justice to take action on numerous occasions where action was clearly indicated, based on the results of FBI reports, has been of deep concern to the Bureau. The Director noted that while prosecution is not the business of the FBI, that we are an investigative agency, nevertheless there have been instances where reports contained results of investigations that clearly called for prosecutive action, and none was had.

Mr. Hoover observed that the Internal Security Division of the Department of Justice was one sector of the Department that was in bad need of revitalizing. Mr. Mardian said that he was in total agreement with Mr. Hoover, and that he, Mardian, intended to take appropriate action in this regard.

The Director noted that he hoped that matters concerning the Black Panthers, Students for a Democratic Society and the Weathermen would eventually be the responsibility of Mr. Mardian's Internal Security Division. Mardian indicated that plans were going forward to do precisely this at the present time,

Mr. Mardian observed that he intended to resolve all doubts regarding prosecution of persons who have violated laws having 4 bearing on this country's internal security in favor of prosecution wherever and whenever possible.

In this regard Mr. Mardian advised that he intended to put together a Task Force to develop new strategy and ideas for prosecuting people who represent a threat to this country's internal security. He noted that he anticipated as the result of this Task Force new legislation would be recommended where present legislation is now inadequate, that efforts would be made to have prosecution where state laws.

Mr. Mardian stated the second matter which he wished to mention to the Director was the fact that he has also been commissioned by the White House to form a Task Force to decide what our Government's response will be should there ever be a kidnaping of a Government official such as there was in Canada recently. Mardian stated that it is his earnest hope that the Task Force, when it is formed and confers, will recommend no response be made to the demands of would be abductors and that this policy, if established, be given full disclosure in the press, in the hope that it will serve as a deterrent.

In response to a request by Mardian for the Director's opinion concerning this matter, the Director noted that he shared Mardian's views and felt that plans must be formulated in anticipation of possible kidnapings since it is not realistic to take the position they will not occur in this country.

Just prior to the conclusion of their talk, Mr. Mardian expressed concern over Frank Sinatra's recent association with Governor Ronald Reagan of California and advised Mr. Hoover that efforts on his, Mardian's, part and those of Lyn Nofziger, of the White House, to convince Reagan of Sinatra's unsavory background have been met by disbelief.

Mr. Hoover noted that he is well acquainted with Governor Reagan and that the next time he is in touch with him, he will brief him concerning Sinatra. Mardian stated that he appreciates Mr. Hoover's offer to do this since, while Reagan is not inclined to believe Mardian or Nofziger, even though they are close friends, he most certainly will believe Mr. Hoover.

Mardian said that he is of the opinion that Reagan has sought a relationship with Sinatra to dim his own image of being a right wing conservative. Mardian noted that one of Reagan's biggest financial supporters, Taft Schreiber, President of the Music Corporation of America, served as actor's agent to both Reagan and Sinatra several years back.

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



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EXCERPTS OF REMARKS BY GOVERNOR RONALD REAGAN
California Peace Officers Association
San Francisco
May 10, 1971

A senseless act of violence took place a few weeks ago on the campus of Stanford University, one of America's great private institutions of higher learning. An arsonist--sneaking through the dead of night--deliberately set a fire that destroyed the lounge of a dormitory. The flames and smoke drove 80 sleeping students from their beds.

After the fire was put out, one student remarked that this particular act of violence was--in his words--"far different from setting a truck or a motorcycle on fire. If one of us had not seen it, a lot of us would be dead. That is not vandalism; that is murder."

The student was right in one sense. If someone had been killed, it would have been murder. But setting a fire in a dormitory is no different from setting a truck or a motorcycle on fire. Vandalism, arson and murder are all illegal acts of violence. And they differ only in degree.

It is a tragic dilemma of our times that there are some on campus and elsewhere who do not always perceive that simple truth. When you are counting the casualties...the dead and injured...the needless property loss that results from such an act...it makes no difference what warped sense of values motivates the arsonist.

Crime cannot be divided into "just" and "unjust" categories. Violence cannot be justified, excused or explained by any real or imagined grievance.

Unfortunately, the crime at Stanford was not an isolated act.

I don't mean to single it out as any more deplorable than the scores of other similar violent acts which have taken place elsewhere before or since...at schools, banks, National Guard armories or business firms. But it does dramatize with chilling clarity the new challenge that confronts those of you whose task it is to protect society.

A new kind of crime threatens California and the United States... plotted and carried out by a new breed of criminal, the self-proclaimed revolutionary who directs senseless acts of violence against innocent bystanders. What makes these new criminals doubly dangerous, is their fanaticism which makes them perform with an almost religious zeal, as if they are ordained by a higher power to right all the ills of mankind.

4,443 bomb threats in California during the last 10 onths of 1970. There were 1,052 actual bomb incidents in which an explosive device was found and on some tragic occasions, these bombs exploded, killing or injuring innocent people. Fifteen police officers died in the line of duty in California last year, six under circumstances which can only be described as acts of cold-blooded murder.

The new type of so-called "revolutionary" crime is becoming one of America's most critical internal problems, at a time when certain other types of crime are slowly declining.

It isn't necessary to lay before you all the appalling statistical evidence. You know far better than I the corrosive effects of crime and violence on our society. The most tragic impact is the aura of fear and distrust it creates among us. A recent national survey disclosed that one-third of all Americans believe it is unsafe to walk alone at night in their own neighborhoods.

The threat of the mugger, the rapist, and now, the revolutionary whose rhetoric has escalated into violence, is a real threat. It cannot be ignored. And it cannot be excused or explained as legitimate political discontent...illegitimately expressed through illegal means.

There is a national concern, no, I would say, a national <u>demand</u> for public safety and public order.

But what kind of public safety? What kind of public order?

Our nation is built upon a system of legal values which provides
greater protection for the individual...for his right to speak and to
protest legitimate grievances...than any other society ever known. Those
of you who are gathered here today are dedicated guardians of those
rights; you represent society's first line of defense against crime and
anarchy.

In such a nation, how do we achieve order and bring to justice the lawless elements among us without sacrificing the individual liberty to which we are all dedicated?

One first step is to never lose sight of just who is threatening the peace or violating the rights of the law-abiding citizen. Those who set fires and plant bombs--who demonstrate violently in the name of non-violence--are not protecting the rights of others or preserving the legal system that makes possible peaceful protest. They are the outlaws.

Yet some of our citizens—who abhor violence—eee the enforcer of the law as a social outcast. They have accepted without question the steady, unrelenting campaign that is going on to discredit those whose job it is to preserve law and order in our society. Police are accused of "repression"—for putting down disorders that have been calculated to incite a confrontation.

But it is the rioter who supresses the rights of others, not the policeman called to restore order.

It is the criminal who violates the rights of others by stealing, mugging or other acts of violence. It is to the police officer the crime victim turns for help <u>after</u> such crimes have taken place or when criminal violence threatens him.

In carrying out their duties, our policemen are expected to be psychologists, constitutional lawyers, family counselors. They are expected to patiently endure insults while coping with hoodlums intent on injuring either innocent citizens or the policemen themselves and sometimes both.

They are expected to be perfect men in an imperfect world, and they come far closer than most to that goal.

Plutarch said if all the world were just, there would be no need of valor. But the world is not filled with all just men and we do need valor---we need the valor that you, our law enforcement officers, exhibit every day and every night.

I believe it is a tribute to your courage and dedication that those of you who wear the badge of authority have never lost sight of the real threat to liberty. The greatest threat to our liberties are those who seek to destroy the ability of law enforcement to assure that liberty. They use the word "repression" to describe any forceful response to lawlessness.

And they seek to defeat or inhibit effective law enforcement by spreading suspicion of the policeman and his motives, by seeking to cast the policeman in the role of villain rather than the criminal.

In recent months, one of America's greatest law enforcement officials has become the object of a bitter verbal assault by some who are in a position to know just how much J. Edgar Hoover has contributed to this country's safety.

It is no exaggeration to suggest that America might well owe its very survival to the effectiveness of the Federal Bureau of Investigation in rooting out subversion and fighting crime of all types.

Some critics make mockery of the facts by targesting that the FBI seeks to become some sort of secret police. J. Edgar Hoover's whole career has been devoted to resisting the efforts of others to turn the FBI into a national police force. He has worked to strengthen local and state law enforcement.

There is no doubt why the subversive and criminal elements would like to see the FBI downgraded and discredited. It was this agency which pioneered in most of the modern crime-fighting techniques we use today---fingerprinting, scientific collection of evidence, advanced training for law enforcement personnel, and now, a National Crime Information Center utilizing the computer to fight crime.

But these innovations have been used only to protect society against the threats posed against it by criminals and subversive elements.

Unlike some who criticize him, J. Edgar Hoover's entire career has been devoted to keeping government the servant of the people rather than making government the master. This same type of harassment has been directed against local and state law enforcement officers.

To respond to crime or riots with any degree of effective force is called "police brutality." Yet those who raise the charge say nothing about the "brutality" of the criminals who murdered 15 California law officers last year.

A few days ago a brave highway patrolman was killed as he investigated a traffic accident. He left a wife and four small children.

Where were the mass marches protesting this brutality? Where were the loud voices of protest? There was only silence as an eloquent testimony to the kind of hypocrisy with which you in law enforcement are all too familiar.

Every law-abiding citizen has a right to expect that government will insure his safety. Every parent has a right to expect government to protect his children from those who deal in and profit from pornography or narcotics. Every homeowner and every businessman has the right to expect his government to protect his property against the criminal, the arsonist, the rioter and the looter.

In return, I believe it is less than presumptuous to suggest that those who risk life and limb to defend society have a right to expect society to give them the support they need to carry on the war against crime.

As one small gesture of our respect, I am Caring, effective today, that every time a California peace officer is killed in the line of duty, that the flag at our State Capitol building be flown at half mast.

I have pledged to you before, and I repeat that pledge---we are trying to provide such support by attacking crime on several fronts. We have developed educational programs to acquaint our youngsters with the dangers of misusing drugs and we are funding dozens of experimental programs ranging from professional psychiatric counseling to the use of self-help programs to combat drug abuse. For the first time, we have a state office solely devoted to coordinating the state's anti-drug abuse efforts and to assist local communities.

Last year, we succeeded in adopting the nation's most comprehensive plan for intra-state control of restricted dangerous drugs. We intend to find out where all the pills on the illicit street market are coming from and to follow through with action to cut off the supply.

We have sponsored legislation to protect minors from the smut peddlers, to deal with campus disorder and to increase penalties for assaults on peace officers.

Despite these advances, we have suffered some defeats.

You and I know that one of the most necessary tools to fight organized crime is electronic surveillance. Contrary to what its opponents falsely claim, this authority is not an unreasonable invasion of privacy---it would be used only after a judge independently agreed there was good reason to believe a crime was being committed.

Our bills on electronic surveillance contained the strictest judicial safeguards to insure the individual's right of privacy, while giving law enforcement an effective weapon to use in the battle against sophisticated and well-financed criminals.

Electronic surveillance often is the only way to break through to the higher echelons of organized crime. And I think it is about time the legislature ends the legal imbalance that favors the criminal's rights against the right of society to be protected against the lawbreaker. We have tried for three years to do this and we will keep on trying until we succeed.

The tougher laws we managed to pass are not enough. We must do more. We must do more to protect the policemen who risk their lives to protect us.

I have asked the legislature to give priority attention this year to new laws that would: -5-

--Make the killing of a law enforcement off per while on duty first degree murder. The criminal who is armed in the commission of a crime and who uses that weapon to kill a policeman when apprehended is obviously acting with premeditation. He obviously carried the weapon to use it in just such an eventuality and that is plainly with premeditation and malice aforethought.

-- Make it a felony to specifically advocate killing or injuring law enforcement officers.

--Increase the amount of reward a governor may offer for information leading to the arrest and conviction of persons killing or injuring police officers.

We want to make the California Council on Criminal Justice more useful to local law enforcement. Local law enforcement agencies should have a greater voice in allocating the \$70 million of federal anti-crime funds California will spend next year to strengthen police and correctional agencies and the court system.

Our goal in public safety is to assure every citizen the right to a quick and efficient system of criminal justice.

To be effective as a deterrent, punishment must be swiftly administered.

Defendants in a criminal trial have a constitutional right to a speedy trial. In California, the law provides that trial must start within 60 days after arraignment.

I suggest that the public also has a right to a speedy trial---by carrying out the result of that trial swiftly and without endless and calculated legal manuevering designed to delay and obstruct justice.

We must examine court procedures to make certain we are doing all we can to make the constitutional promise of a speedy trial apply equally to the guilty defendant and to the society whose laws he has violated.

The judiciary and the organized bar must do their part with more effective enforcement of the ethics which govern the legal profession to see that lawyers and defendants who deliberately disrupt the courtroom are disciplined.

Those steps will help. But let no one pretend this is a lasting solution.

We are the most powerful nation in the history of the world. We have more sophisticated technology, more knowledge and probably more laws than any other society in history. And still we have problems. Someone once said we have 30,000 laws to help us keep the Ten Commandments. Many people wonder why.

values upon which we founded this great country of ours. Some of our citizens have simply lost a sense of moral responsibility...to themselves...to their children...to a cause.

You don't have to be a sociologist to know that there has been a massive breakdown of America's ethical standards. We are an affluent society to some and some of our citizens have deluded themselves that material prosperity and the pursuit of pleasure is an end in itself.

The alienation between parents and children which many call the generation gap is a tragic sympton of this moral decline. The pressures of urban living...the rootlessness of modern life...all these things contribute to what can only be described as a nation in which many citizens have simply lost their way.

How many parents believe their duty to their children is fulfilled by providing shelter, food and a generous allowance? How many parents sow the seeds of juvenile alienation by seeming never to care how late their sons or daughters stay out...or even if they return home at all?

It is a favorite past-time of the "kick America" crowd to sneer at the Puritan ethic...to denounce the moral code and the values which created this country...the sense of national purpose which held us together in times of great stress...through war and depression.

Have we lost all this?

In our zeal to fulfill personal desires...to seek personal pleasures...to satisfy material wants and everyone's desire to "do his own thing," can we forget that it was to unify this country we fought the bloodiest civil war in man's history? Can we forget our duty to honor our country and our own sense of morality?

Better prisons, speedier court trials, more federal funds...all of these things alone will not solve our crime problems. And all the laws and law enforcement in the world won't heal the rift and discord among our people.

With all our wealth, we cannot afford to be divided by animosity, suspicion and hate.

We will never recapture the vitality...the sense of national purpose that created our country...until every individual reaffirms a commitment to a personal moral code that holds each person accountable to his fellow man, to his community and to whatever religious code he lives by. Indeed, civilization cannot exist unless people voluntarily abide by rules that are actually unenforceable.

Churchill stirred the hopes of the world by proudl declaring his belief that "when great causes are on the move in the world, we learn that we are spirits, not animals, and that something is going on in space and time, which, whether we like it or not, spells duty."

America is not doomed to be consumed by disorder and decadence; our people are made of sterner stuff.

The principles of honor, respect, obedience to law and yes--of love for one's fellow man--have not been swept away by the turbulence of our times. These ideals still provide the inherent strength and power of our nation and our people.

They need only to be reawakened to provide the moral force and direction our country so desperately needs.

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

SUBJECT: 1967 ARMORED CAR

OMr. Edward V. Hickey, Jr., Director of Security for Governor, Ronald Reagan, came by to see me the other day accompanied by Mr. Michael K. Deaver, Assistant to the Governor and Director of Administration, for the purpose of discussing the possible acquisition of one of the Bureau's armored cars. Mr. Hickey, of course, is aware of the fact that we do have an armored vehicle in the Los Angeles Office and that we dispose of one each year since the Director made available his armored car in Los Angeles to Governor Reagan when he was visiting that area and proceeding into a ghetto area.

Mr. Hickey stated he was most concerned with the protection and safety of Governor Reagan and he, Hickey, is most anxious to secure an armored vehicle for the purpose of protecting the Governor. He pointed out that the Governor expects to be in office for three more years and does not intend to run for reelection and under the circumstances, it would be highly impossible to secure a new Cadillac armored for the protection of the Governor.

Mr. Hickey was informed that this matter would be presented to the Director for his consideration and for the purpose of determining whether it would be possible to sell or give an armored car to the State of California for the use of Governor Reagan.

The question of whether we can give or sell an armored vehicle to the State of California has been researched in conjunction with the Office of Legal Counsel. Under GSA Federal Property Management regulations, if the car could be given to the State of California by following the prescribed regulations, i.e. (1) declare the vehicle surplus to the Department proper; (2) request the Department to ask the Department of Health. Education and Welfare to permit the vehicle to be given to the State of California.

The GSA Federal Property Management regulations further require that used vehicles be disposed of only by sale, such as in this instance where we are replacing the vehicle with a new one.

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An examination of the statutes of the State of California, Section 2501, reflects that the Commissioner of the California Highway Patrol has the power to issue licenses for the private operation of armored cars; thus it is legally possible for an armored car to be privately owned and operated in the State of California.

In view of this, there could be competitive bidding on an armored car that might be offered for sale in that state and, of course, the State of California could be one of the qualified bidders.

The sale of the present 1967 Cadillac could be made with the proviso that it is subject to bidding by qualified bidders only and the further proviso that the Bureau retain authority to supervise the dearmoring of the vehicle before subsequent sale by the successful purchaser.

We have the 1967 armored car available in Los Angeles which we will be disposing of shortly. This car has approximately 30,000 miles on the speedometer and Mr. Hickey understands that in spite of the low mileage on the speedometer, the mileage on the motor is considerable. Mr. Hickey stated that any arrangement that we could make to make the car available for the Governor would be agreeable he was certain with the Governor and with his own office.

If the Director is agreeable, I will notify SAC Williams of the Sacramento Office, who maintains contact with Mr. Hickey, that the Director will make the 1967 armored car available through the regular procedure of securing bids for such vehicle. Normally we sell the dearmored vehicles to the highest bidder and we would do the same with the armored vehicle. There is very little likelihood that anyone else would bid on the car since there are only a limited number of firms in California who could qualify to own an armored vehicle. If for some reason the Governor's office was not the high bidder and the high bidder was somebody unacceptable to us, we of course could withdraw the vehicle from the bidding process and dispose of it after it has been dearmored.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that through SAC Williams of the Sacramento Office, arrangements be made for the sale of the 1967 armored vehicle to the State of California for the use of Governor Reagan.

At 2:28 P.M., August 12, 1971, an anonymous male telephonically contacted the Santa Ana Resident Agency of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), Santa Ana, California, and stated he was calling from Sacramento, California, to furnish information regarding a plot to kill California Governor Ronald Reagan.

The caller advised that Governor Reagan would be shot by a sniper's bullet as he arrived at the Capitol Building in Sacramento, California, at 10:00 A.M., Friday, August 13, 1971. The caller related that he heard of this plot at a bar but refused to identify the bar by name or location. He also refused to describe the individuals who were discussing this plot. He stated he had not called the FBI Office at Sacramento, nor had he advised any law enforcement agency at Sacramento. The caller did not have any discernible accent.





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It will be recalled, that on 4/5/74, Mr. Anthony Palumbo, who described himself as a "Special Assistant to Governor Reagan," requested to meet the Director at 2:30 p.m., Monday, 4/8/74, in order to extend an invitation for Mr. Kelley to speak before the Governor's National Conference on Standards and Goals for Criminal Justice," which is tentatively set for September, 1974. No more specific information regarding this conference was given. The Director has agreed to meet Mr. Palumbo.

Our Sacramento Office has advised that Mr. Palumbo (also known as Colonel Palumbo) is the Executive Director of the Office of Criminal Justice Planning for California. This Office disperses Federal grants under the Law Enforcement Assistance Administration. According to the Sacramento Office, Colonel Palumbo is very close to Governor Reagan and prior to his present position was on the Governor's Select Committee on Law Enforcement Problems. Nothing derogatory concerning Colonel Palumbo was contained in the indices of the Sacramento Office nor in Bufiles.

Bufiles indicate that by letter of 8/24/73, the Director acknowledged receipt of the Report of the Governor's Select Committee on Law Enforcement Problems, entitled "Controlling Crime in California," which Colonel Palumbo had sent. This Report was submitted to the California Legislature by Governor Reagan in August, 1973. Bufiles also reflect that in 1970 Colonel Palumbo was the subject of a favorable Departmental applicant investigation in relation to the position of Law Enforcement Program Specialist with LEAA.



BIOGRAPHICAL DATA

Governor Reagan was born on February 6, 1911, in Tampico, Illinois. His parents are John Edward and Nellie Wilson Reagan. He graduated from Eureka College, Eureka, Illinois, with an A.B. degree in 1932. Governor Reagan is well known as a former movie star. He was formerly married to the movie actress, Jane Wyman. They were divorced in 1948 after being married for eight years. He has been married to Nancy Davis since March. 1952. They have two children, Patricia and Ronald. and Mr. Reagan has two children, Maureen and Michael, by his former wife. From 1932 to 1937, Governor Reagan was a sports announcer for Radio Station WHO, Des Moines, Iowa, and a motion picture and television actor from 1937 to 1966. Since 1967, he has been the Governor of the State of California. He resides at the Executive Mansion, Sacramento, California,

RESULTS OF FILE REVIEW

Governor Reagan was the subject of an applicanttype investigation conducted in 1967, in connection with his position as a member of the Board of Regents of the University of California. Inasmuch as the Board of Regents had access to sensitive material from the Atomic Energy Commission, our investigation was requested by the Atomic Energy Commission. No derogatory information was developed during this investigation, except as follows:

Although Reagan has been extremely anticommunist since the latter part of the 1940's, he had previously been listed as a member of a committee and appeared in a play at a meeting called by the Hollywood Independent Citizens Committee of the Arts, Sciences and Professions, which later became known as the National Council of Arts, Sciences and Professions. The Southern California Committee of this organization has been cited as a communist dominated propaganda media.

Ronald Reagan

Reagan appeared on a radio program sponsored by the Mobilization for Democracy, produced with the cooperation of the Hollywood Writers Mobilization. The Mobilization for Democracy has been cited an a communist front by the California Un-American Activities Committee. Reagan was also, in 1946, listed as a sponsor and director of the Los Angeles Committee for a Democratic Far Eastern Policy and in 1947 was listed as a sponsor of a recital put on by the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee, both communist front organizations. In 1947, Reagan testified as a friendly witness before the House Committee on Un-American Activities and explained that he was duped through a telephone call to lend his name as sponsor of the recital of the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee.

In March, 1960, the FBI cooperated with Governor Reagan by making inquiries in Washington, D. C., concerning Maureen Reagan, daughter of Reagan and Jane Wyman, who was living with a married Metropolitan Police Officer in Washington, D. C.

appeared to confirm this situation, and the information was furnished on a confidential basis to then United States Senator George Murphy who originally contacted the Los Angeles Office in this matter. We also conducted an applicant-type investigation concerning Maureen Reagan when she contemplated working for the Immigration and Naturalization Service. That investigation was discontinued when she decided not to take the job. She has apparently married an individual by the last name of Sills and now resides in California.

In addition to the above, our files contain numerous references to Governor Reagan, but each reference contains either no derogatory or no pertinent data. PAGE FOUR SF 175-64

Legislation is now before the Congress which would end all — QUOTE — "political surveillance" and shut down the intelligence-gathering functions of the F.B.I. and the C.I.A. This legislation will prevent all covert gathering of foreign intelligence in peace time and keep the F.B.I. from collecting information on any person unless there is evidence that person has already committed a crime, or is about to commit one.

If such a law had existed in the years preceding World War II, the F.B.I. would have been prevented from infiltrating the German-American Bund. The record will show that the F.B.I. deserves most of the credit for the fact that not one major act of sabotage interrupted our war effort during the years from Pearl Harbor to V.J. Day.

As for the second point, how do we propose to halt the increasing wave of terrorist activities if we have to wait until the crime is committed? Or, how will we know someone is about to commit the crime? Our police intelligence forces - the F.B.I. and the C.I.A. - have for 40 years used tactics of surveillance, phone taps and, yes, mail openings when they had reason to believe there was a threat to the safety of our country and our people.

Using these techniques, an F.B.I. agent infiltrated the Ku Klux Klan, and found the murderers of three young civil rights workers a few years ago. I know of no government agency that can match the Federal Bureau of Investigation for its record of more than 40 years of dedication, effectiveness and freedom from scandal.

Now the Attorney General of the United States, evidently carrying out Department of Justice policy, will try to convict a 25 year veteran of the Bureau -- former agent and supervisor John Kearney, who retired in 1972. He will be charged with illegal phone taps and opening mail several years ago when these were normal operating procedures. The Attorney General admits that even if he is found Not Guilty, he will be ruined because the cost of defending himself will wipe out his life savings.

And, who was the object of Agent Kearney's attention when he did these things?
The "Weathermen", one of the groups that surfaced in the anti-war demonstrations several years ago. Members of the Weathermen traveled to communist countries, boasted of bombings they were responsible for and 26 of them were, at one time, on law enforcement's "most wanted" list.

There is no other way to protect against terrorism than to try to learn in advance what the terrorists are planning. I wish we could have known beforehand about the bomb that would arrive in a California college office, packaged as mail. A young bride of three weeks was blinded and had her hands mangled as she opened that package. A janitor, on another campus, was blown to eternity when he tried to remove a bomb in the faculty dining room.

I'm glad for the intelligence report, and I, frankly, don't care how it was obtained, that warned me -- when I was Governor of California -- of a plot to kidnap my wife and kill her if I wouldn't agree to free some imprisoned members of a terrorist group.

John Kearney is being prosecuted and persecuted for protecting his fellow citizens; for doing what the Congress, several Presidents and Attorney Generals had approved over a period of several decades.



ATOMIC ENERGY ACT - APPLICANT

This is to advise the Atomic Energy Commission (AEC) has requested a background investigation of Reagan, present Governor of California, As Governor he becomes a member of the Board of Regents of the University of California, which position has been classified "highly sensitive" by the AEC. Governor Reagan as a member of the Board of Regents will have access to highly sensitive restricted data. The Atomic Energy Act of 1954 requires the Bureau to conduct a full investigation where such access is involved.

As you will recall, the Bureau conducted a full background investigation concerning former Governor Edmund Gerald Brown in May, 1960, when he likewise became a member of the Board of Regents of the University of California.

Bureau files disclose that we have never investigated Governor Reagan; however, our files do contain numerous references to him, primarily concerning his anticommunist activities in various Hollywood, California, organizations. Reagan has spoken in various parts of the country on the evils of communism and was a friendly witness before the House Committee on Un-American Activities in October, 1947. Although he has been extremely anticommunist since the mid 1940's, he was reportedly a sponsor of the Committee for a Democratic Far Eastern Policy, which is listed in the "Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications" prepared by the House Committee on Un-American Activities. He was reportedly a member of Americans for Democratic Action and American Veterans Committee in the 1940's. In 1950 it was reported he had been active in the Hollywood Independent Citizens Committee of the Arts, Sciences, and Professions but got out in 1945 when the communists took over.

In March, 1960, we cooperated with Governor Reagan in making inquiries here in Washington, D. C., regarding his daughter, Maureen Reagan, who had been living with a married metropolitan

The field office will be specifically instructed not to conduct any interviews on the university campuses. Reagan Takes the Helm

Gov. Reagan charted a provocative new course for state government in his inaugural address.

There is much to applaud in the philosophy of his administration and the direction it intends to take in certain areas. Details must still be filled in, however, on many items in his program and it remains to be seen how they will, or if they can, be implemented.

Reagan devoted much of his message to the grave fiscal plight of the state, noting that a new budget held at the same level as the present one, plus "absolutely essential" property tax relief, could produce a \$750 million deficit.

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"The time has come," the governor said, "for us to decide whether collectively we can afford anything and everything we think of simply because we think of it. The time has come to run a check and see if all the services government provides are in a n s w e r to demands, or just goodies dreamed up for our supposed betterment. The time has come to match outgo to income, instead of always doing it the other way round.

"We are going to squeeze and cut and trim until we reduce the cost of government... and it will involve every department of government."

That is a laudable goal. But to all practical purposes, unless new legislation is enacted, the fact is that only about one-third of the budget is controllable. That one-third covers the University of California, state colleges, institutions and governmental operating costs. And that's where danger lies.

Although the governor did not mention it in his address, he is considering a 10% cut in university and state college budgets, plus \$400 tuition for the university and \$200 for state colleges.

That drastic change could gravely imperil the quality of higher education which Californians have come to expect. It does violence to the intent of the Master Plan for Higher Education. A 10% slash on top of heavy reductions already made by the Department of Firance could play havoc with operations. Tuition ought not to be used as an expedient for budget balancing, but if it is, then some way must be found to avoid penalizing deserving students who cannot afford the increased fees.

There is a strong possibility, moreover, that such a heavy tuition might force an increased load on junior colleges and thus materially boost local tax levels. This could vitiate the "absolutely essential" property tax relief Reagan calls for.

The proposal has a popular ring, but we suggest it has not been sufficiently thought out.

Despite such special reservations, The Times commends the general tone of the new governor's message.

The "Creative Society" he proposes would turn away from the idea that government and those who serve in it are omnipotent. Government would lead but not rule, listen but not lecture. The emphasis will be on seeing that government does not encroach on freedom or assume powwer beyond that freely granted by the people.

That in itself indicates a refreshing change in administrative direction.

Gov. Reagan was hanged in effigy Friday at San Fernando Valley State College, where 1,500 students rallied against the governor's proposed tuition and budget cutting plans.

A dummy labeled "Reegin" was placed near an outdoor podium shortly before the rally started, but it was quickly removed by order of Statewide College Affairs Dean Thomas H. McGrath, a scheduled speaker at the rally.

Many students wore printed cards reading, "Our position, no tuition," as they gathered to hear a series of speakers denounce Reagan's proposal to institute tuition in the heretofore free state college and university systems and to slash school budgets 10%.

Student body presidents from Cal State L.A., Long Beach State, Cal Poly, San Bernardino State, Dominguez Hills, UCLA and Pierce Junior College appeared with Valley State President John Cagle.

A student carrying the effigy of Reagan said he represented the Students for a Democratic Society, a "New Leftist" group which has a chapter on campus. Cagle said he thought it more likely that fraterity men Fau Con-

structed the dummy.

"We are opposed to this type of opposition," the student leader said.

As the crowd gathered, placards were seen with such slogans as "Keep Cal State Free" and "Recall Ronnie."

Officials speaking at the rally included Assemblyman Charles Warren (D-Los Angeles) head of the Democratic State Central Committee, and Mrs. Georgiana Hardy, a member of the Los Angeles Board of Education.

Warren said that if Reagan succeeds with his proposed 10% budget cuts for the 18 state colleges, he thinks the Legislature will be "compelled" to adopt thition.

On January 30, 1967, a review of the military service records on file at the Military Personnel Records Center, revealed that RONALD WILSON REAGAN, enlisted in the United States Army Enlisted Reserve Corps, inactive, on April 29, 1937, at Des Moines, Iowa. No enlisted serial number was shown for REAGAN in the records. He served on inactive status until June 17, 1937, when he was separated as a Private to accept an appointment as an officer.

He was appointed on May 25, 1937, as a Second Lieutenant, Serial Number 0-357 403, in the Officers Reserve Corps of the United States Army effective June 18, 1937, and entered on active duty on April 19, 1942, at Hollywood, California. He was honorably released from active duty on December 9, 1945, as a Captain, at Fort MacArthur, California, by reason of own request to return to essential industry. The records indicated he was on terminal leave from September 11, 1945 to December 9, 1945.

He served in the Officers Reserve Corps, inactive

status, from June 18, 1937 to April 18, 1942, and from December 10, 1945 to April 1, 1953, at which time he was honorably discharged by operation of law.

His military occupation was shown as Adjutant and civilian occupation as motion picture actor. He had no foreign service and is entitled to wear the World War Two Victory Medal and the American Campaign Medal.

His character and efficiency ratings ranged from Excellent to Superior, and there was no record of courts-martial or absence without official leave.

The following additional employment was indicated in the records: Summers, 1927 to 1932, Lowell Park, Dixon, Illinois, as Lifeguard.

The following relatives were listed: JOHN EDWARD REAGAN, also known as JACK REAGAN, father, deceased; NELLE C. REAGAN, mother, 107 Monroe Avenue, Dixon, Illinois (1935).

Files of Eureka Police Department, Woodford County Sheriff's Office at Eureka, and Credit Bureau of Greater Peoria, Peoria, Illinois, covering Woodford County, contained no references to REAGAN.

At Eureka and Peoria, Illinois

Investigation reported herein was conducted by SA MARCUS E. SHARPE on February 1, 1967. Records Clerk, in the Office of Mr. GEORGE HEARNE, Registrar, Eureka College, Eureka, Illinois, made available a record maintained in the Registrar's Office of Eureka College, in regard to a former student named RCNALD WILSON REAGAN. stated that this was the original transcript, and that there had never been a request for a transcript for this former student to be sent to any other university or college. made available the original transcript of records reflecting that RONALD WILSON REAGAN. of 226 Lincoln Way, Dixon, Illinois, was enrolled as a Freshman student in the Liberal Arts Courses offered by Eureka College, on September 14.1928. There was no indication of the date of this student's birth, nor was there an indication of the names of his parents.

There was an indication on the transcript that this student had graduated in 1928 from the North Dixon High School, Dixon, Illinois, and that he ranked in the middle third in his high school graduating class of among 70 students.

The transcript reveals that he had pursued a Liberal Arts Course for four years, majoring in Economics and Sociology, and by June 7, 1932, he had accumulated 129 semester hours of Liberal Arts credit with 173 grade

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points, or a 1.37 grade point over all average for the 129 semester hours.

stated that this would be a "C+" or almost a "B-" over all four year average for his academic achievement or somewhat better than an average academic achievement.

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stated that this record reveals that REAGAN was awarded an A.B. degree by Eureka College on June 7,1932.

She stated that there is no other record at the college regarding this former student, as to activities or as to his deportment stating that in the absence of any indication on his transcript, that he had been placed on any academic or other probation, and she could only conclude that this former student had never been the subject of any disciplinary action whatsoever.

Reference

Mr. SAMUEL G. HARROD, JR., Attorney at Law, who has offices at $106\frac{1}{2}$ East Center Street, Eureka, Illinois, advised that he has known Governor REAGAN since REAGAN entered Eureka College as a Freshman student in the Fall of 1928. He stated that he, himself was in the 8th or 9th grade, as he recalls, living across the street from the Tau Kappa Epsilon Fraternity House, when he became acquainted with REAGAN who had just moved into the "TKE" House, and lived there during the four years he attended college.

He stated that REAGAN was almost like a big brother to him, he taught him to swim, and helped him in many ways.

Mr. HARROD stated that he had maintained close contact with Governor REAGAN ever since, mostly by correspondence. He stated that he has visited his home in California on four or five occasions, and on these occasions, met some prominent movie people who were friends of Governor REAGAN, including PAT O'BRIEN, JAMES CAGNEY, GEORGE BURNS, EDDIE ALBERT, and BURL IVES.

He stated that he has closely followed Governor REAGAN's Career in the movie industry and recently in his political career. He stated that he received a handwritten note from Governor REAGAN, wherein he was invited to visit Governor REAGAN and attend his recent inauguration.

In correspondence and personal contacts, he knows Governor REAGAN had his "hands full" for about seven years when Governor REAGAN was the president of the Screen Actor's Guild.

Mr. HARROD could only state that he felt REAGAN was fighting certain individuals in the movie industry, not only actors, but writers and directors and others involved in the movie-making industry, who were apparently known or believed by Governor REAGAN to hold sympathies for other than the best interest of our American way of life.

Mr. HARROD stated that he could only presume that Governor REAGAN was fighting what he, HARROD, presumed to be Communist infiltration of the industry.

Mr. HARROD stated that there would never be any doubt in his mind as to the sincere and complete loyalty and patriotism of Governor REAGAN to our form of Government. He stated that Governor REAGAN has always been well thought of by those who know him, and that he has always enjoyed a reputation for excellent moral character, and good associations.

Mr. HARROD advised that he would highly recommend Governor REAGAN for a position of extreme trust and responsibility, in our Government.

Mr. HARROD concluded the interview by stating that he did want to mention that a very few months ago, a "long-haired" student from Antioch College, Yellow Springs, Ohio, was reportedly in Eureka, attempting to learn the participation of REAGAN, then a gubernatorial candidate, in an alleged "student strike" in Eureka College in 1928.

Mr. HARROD did not see this student, but only heard of the incident, and he did not know the identity of the student. He heard that the student was apparently attempting to go to all extremes in an effort to learn something of this.

Mr. HARROD stated that he could explain this to anyone.

He then said that when Governor REAGAN first entered Eureka College as a Freshman, being then probably only 17 or 18 years old, that at the very beginning of that school term, the then college president, President BERT WILSON, issued some proclamations which were almost 100 per cent disagreed with on the part of the faculty and students.

As he recalled, there were several proclamations, but that one of these was to the effect that there would be no social functions at the college, such as dances. Another thing that President WILSON also proclaimed, that he was changing the requirements for various academic courses which, if allowed to stand, would prohibit the then juniors and seniors from completing their Liberal Arts degree requirements as to majors and minors within the planned four years and that this would mean that the present juniors and seniors would not have earned their bachelors degrees within the planned four years providing

these changes would stand.

Mr. HARROD stated that there was then a general "student strike". This strike was against the president and his proclamations.

Mr. HARROD stated that this happened early in the Fall term of 1928, right after Governor REAGAN appeared on the campus as a Freshman student.

He recalled that all students then in this "student strike" refused to attend classes. He stated that Governor REAGAN would have participated to the extent that he was one of the students, and that there was a 100 per cent participation in the student strike, and that Governor REAGAN, as a Freshman student, would have done as the other students did.

He stated that faculty members, almost 100 per cent were against the proclamations of the then college president, and that they advised all students that they would hold classes in the homes of the faculty members, and that the students could carry on their studies in this manner.

Mr. HARROD recalls that a majority of the 24 member board of trustees of the Eureka College met or at least conferred regarding this "student strike" which was beginning to pick up national publicity. President BERT WILSON was fired.

Mr. HARROD's father, who was then the academic Dean of Eureka College, was appointed as acting president of Eureka College, and he held this position for several months until a new college president was chosen and installed several months later.

Mr. HARROD stated that there was nothing reprehensible about this on the part of any student, that there was no subversive activity involved whatsoever.

Mr. HARROD presumes that now, as this former student has achieved a position of some political prominence, there will be those who will attempt to dig in to history to learn of any derogatory information that could possibly be found regarding him.

Mr. HARROD stated that he knows of no derogatory information regarding Governor REAGAN, and that he knows Governor REAGAN to be a most loyal American citizen.

LOYET recommends REAGAN in all respects. Credit and Criminal checks reflect no information identifiable with REAGAN.

DETAILS:

EMPLOYMENT

Doctor DAVID PALMER. President of Central Broadcasting Company, WOC-AM-FM-TV, 800 Brady Street, and president of Palmer College of Chiropractic, 1000 Brady Street, Davenport, Iowa, advised on January 27, 1967, that he remembers RONALD REAGAN, whom he calls "DUTCH", very well. Doctor PALMER stated that the two of them used to double date together when REAGAN was employed at the radio station in Davenport, Iowa. Doctor PALMER stated that, in fact, he gave REAGAN his first job as an announcer when he first came to Davenport, in approximately 1932, fresh out of college at Eureka, Illinois. Doctor PALMER stated that to the best of his memory RONALD REAGAN, known to his friends as "DUTCH", first came to Davenport, in approximately 1932 right after he graduated from Eureka

College in Eureka, Illinois. He worked in Davenport as a sports announcer and then was transferred to WHO, Des Moines, Iowa, where he worked for approximately seven years. The two radio stations, WOC, in Davenport, and WHO, in Des Moines, were and still are operated by the same company. Doctor PALMER emplained that when REAGAN came to Davenport, and while he worked in Davenport and in Des Moines, he was single, and consequently he and Doctor PALMER had a close social acquaintance together, in that they would often go out together and double date together.

Doctor PALMER described REAGAN as a great American, clean both morally and physically. He stated that his character and loyalty to the country were beyond reproach, and that there was nothing in his background, social habits, or financial handling of his affairs to indicate anything but a very fine person and a sincere American.

Doctor PALMER explained that the only two persons that he knows of that were working for the radio station in Davenport, when REAGAN worked there, and who are still working at the radio station, are Mr. BILL WAGNER and Miss LUCILE MAUGET. He stated that REAGAN's associates while he was in Davenport, were mostly other persons at the radio station. He does not believe that there is anyone left in the Davenport area that was associated with RFAGAN while he worked at the radio station, with the exception of the above two persons. While REAGAN worked for WOC. in Davenport, he was a straight announcer. But after transferring to Des Moines, to WHO, he became a sports announcer. Doctor PALMER does not remember the exact period that REAGAN worked for the radio station, but believes he began work in about 1932 and continued for approximately ten years total, at the two radio stations.

Doctor PALMER remembers REAGAN belonging to no organizations while he was in Davenport, and knows of absolutely nothing that would reflect unfavorably upon his loyalty to the country.

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LUCILE MAUGET, Assistant Treasurer of Palmer Broadcasting Company, and secretary of Palmer College of Chiropractic, and Palmer Junior College, furnished the employment application for REAGAN reflecting the following information on January 30, 1967:

The application is titled "Application for Position, Central Broadcasting Company - Station WHO, Index number 480-07-7455, dated February 9, 1933." It is in the name of ROKALD WILSON RMAGAN, 400 Center Street, (no city or state given), date of birth The application February 6, 1911, at Tampico, Illinois. states that REAGAN resided in Des Moines, Iowa, for four years and in the state of Iowa for four years. religious affiliation was the Christian church, and his fraternity, TAU KAPPA EPSILAN. RHAGAN is listed as single with no dependents, six foot 3/4 inch, 170 pounds, brown hair, green eyes. He is listed as owning his car, and having completed grade school, high school, and received an A. B. in Economics and Sociology at Eureka College, Eureka, Illinois. No other employers are listed and no references are given.

The application further reflects that REAGAN began employment for the Central Broadcasting Company on February 10, 1933, and terminated employment on May 22, 1937. His starting salary was \$100.00 per month, as of February 10, 1933, and was making \$325.00 per month as of March 1, 1936, and when he terminated employment. He was employed with the company in the program department as a sports announcer.

Miss MAUGET explained that at this time, when REAGAN was working for the Central Broadcasting Company, she was the company's cashier. The company was owned and operated at that time by Palmer College.

Miss MAUGET explained that no permanent employment records were kept for the company prior to 1932, and consequently she does not know for sure if the period February 9, 1933 to May 22, 1937, covers the entire period that RONALD REAGAN worked for the Central Broadcasting Company, or just the period that he worked for WHO in Des Moines, Iowa. She stated that while RONALD REAGAN worked for the company his brother, J. NEIL REAGAN, also worked for the Central Broadcasting Company from 1934, through 1940, as a radio announcer. When RONALD REAGAN

first came to Davenport. and began employment with the Central Broadcasting Company, he had just completed his schooling at Eureka College, Eureka, Illinois. remembers RONALD REAGAN quite well, and remembers that everyone at the station called him "DUTCH". She stated that she does not remember him working for the radio station, WOC, in Davenport, very long. He was a good worker, and must have been a very good announcer, or he would have not been transferred to the Des Moines, radio station, which was the larger of the two stations at that time. While he was in Davenport, he associated mostly with the other persons at the radio station. Hiss MAUGET explained that there was a small crowd at WOC at that time, and everyone was very close and usually ran around together. She described REAGAN as an all-American boy type, very clean cut, and from a very good middle class family in Illinois. She stated that he always impressed her as being entremely honest and outward in his thoughts and actions. His character and loyalty to the country are unquestionable in her opinion. She stated that he never gave her or anyone else that she knows of any reason at all to question his loyalty to the country, while he worked for WOC in Daveaport. She knows of no organizations that he belonged to while in Davenport, except for his college frateraity. He was very interested in sports, and as far as she knows, dated no one in particular while he was in Davenport. MAUGET stated that she could think of absolutely nothing detrinental to say about RONALD REAGAN in any respect. She described him as a wonderful person and a fine American.

To the best of Miss MAUGET's knowledge, BILL MAGNER, who was auditor for the Central Broadcasting Company at the time RONALD REAGAN worked for the company, and Doctor DAVID PALMER, are the only persons in Davenport, outside of herself, who were employed at the radio station at the time REAGAN was employed. She stated that in addition to herself these two persons would probably the only people in the area who would know or remember him. Miss MAUGET remembers that while REAGAN worked for WOC in Davenport, he lived at the Perry Street apartments, now known as the Vale apartments, Fourth and Perry Street, Davenport, Iowa. She remembers that he used to kid a lot about the apartments, about the maid service, and about how the beds would fold out of the wall. She stated that

in fact he would joke and kid a lot with everyone about everything, and always seemed to be in very high spirits and full of life. She stated that he did have a roommate with him in the Perry Street apartment, but she has no idea who that was.

Miss MAUGET explained that after working for Central Broadcasting Company in Des Moines, for awhile, he was sent out to California, to cover the Chicago Cubs in spring training for the station. While out there, a girl from Des Moines, he knew who was in the movies got him a screen test for the movie studios. He passed it, and this ended his announcing career. Miss MAUGET did not know the name of the girl in the movies who got him this screen test.

Mr. WILLIAL D. WAGNER, Vice President and Secretary of Palmer Broadcasting Company, 800 Brady Street, Davenport, Iowa, advised on January 30, 1967, that he remembers RONALD WILSON REAGAN, very well when he worked for the Central Broadcasting Company in Davenport, and Des Moines, Iowa. Mr. WAGNER explained that he was auditor of the company at that time, and used to go out with REAGAN whom he called "DUTCH", after the night's work was finished. To the best of Mr. WAGNER's memory, REAGAN began work for the Central Broadcasting Company in Davenport, Iowa, in approximately 1932 or 1933, and left the employment in approximately 1936 or 1937. Mr. WAGNER explained that the Central Broadcasting Company was founded in 1929, and bought WOC in Davenport, and WHO in Des Moines. While the station was known as THO-WOC, "DUTCH" REAGAN was employed in Davenbort as a sports announcer. Then all the studio operations for the radio station were transferred to the Des Moines, Iowa, station, in May, 1933. At that time, REAGAN was also transferred to Des Moines, and became the sports announcer for the station. All operations closed up in Davenport, except for the accounting office. Mr. WAGNER stated that REAGAN worked in Davenport for the Central Broadcasting Company for less than a year. He was single the entire time he worked for Central Broadcasting Company in both Davenport and Des Moines, Iowa.

Mr. WAGNER described REAGAN as a very capable sports announcer, and pointed out that his brother, J. NEIL REAGAN, also worked for the station during the approximate same period. When RONALD REAGAN left the employment of the station, in approximately 1936, or 1937, he went to California, and entered the movies.

Mr. WAGNER described REAGAN as a very eager young man in his work, and was fresh out of Eureka College, when he first began work for the station in Davenport, Iowa. He knows of absolutely nothing derogatory about REAGAN, and stated that his character and loyalty to this country were beyond reproach and unquestionable. Mr. WAGNER pointed out that REAGAN's brother, J. NEIL, first went to work to put RONALD REAGAN through college, and then RONALD went to work to put his brother through college. He stated that they were close family from around Dixon, Illinois. Both RONALD and his brother graduated from Eureka College, Eureka, Illinois. During the entire time that REAGAN worked for the

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Central Broadcasting Company, Mr. WAGNER stated that he did nor said anything that would reflect unfavorably upon his character or his loyalty to his country.

REAGAN's close associates and friends were other person at the radio station. He was a very personable and well liked young man and consequently had no trouble in making friends with the other employees at the station. Mr. WAGNER knows of no organization that REAGAN belonged to while he worked for the company with the exception of the National Guard or Army Reserve. Mr. WAGNER believed that REAGAN was a member of either the National Guard or the Army Reserve, while he was employed with the station in Des Moines, Iowa.

Mr. WAGNER explained that in approximately 1936 or 1937, REAGAN went out to California to watch and cover the Chicago Cubs in spring training. While out there, some friends of REAGAN's who were in the movies, prevailed upon him to take a screen test. He did and passed the screen test, and this ended his announcing career.

CREDIT AND CRIMINAL

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Mr. PAUL LOYET, Vice President of Palmer Broadcasting Company with offices at WHO Radio, 1100 Walnut Street, Des Moines, Iowa, advised the employment files of WHO regarding RONALD WILSON REAGAN reflect the following

information:

EMPLOYMENT

REAGAN began employment with WHO Radio of Des Moines, Iowa, as a sport's announcer on February 10, 1933, and ended employment March 22, 1937, to accept a job with Warner Brothers. REAGAN's employment application dated February 9, 1933, revealed he was born February 6, 1911, and his permanent address was listed as 400 Center Street, Des Moines, Iowa. His employment record disclosed nothing derogatory.

Mr. PAUL LOYET, advised he knew REAGAN well when REAGAN was in the employ of WHO. He said the people who worked with REAGAN usually referred to him by the nickname "DUTCH".

LOYET stated, if his memory serves him correctly, REAGAN unofficially began his broadcasting career in 1929 or 1930 with station WOC in Davenport, Iowa. He said WOC is also a subsidiary of Palmer Broadcasting Company. LOYET stated reference is made to this on page 50 of the book, Where's the Rest of Me? The RONALD REAGAN Story, written by RICHARD C. HUBLER.

LOYET stated he knew REAGAN to be a man of the highest integrity, and he knew of no reason why REAGAN's character, loyalty, associates, or reputation, should be questioned. He said he knows of no subversive type activities in which REAGAN was a participant or of any organization of this nature of which he was a member.

Mr. LOYET was contacted on January 31, 1967.

following investigation was conducted by

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MARVIN WINGER, Assistant Frincipal, Dixon High School, advised he recalled the applicant and described him as a good student. He stated HMAGAN had good habits, good morals and a good reputation. WINGER advised he had no reason to question the loyalty of the applicant. WINGER advised that the applicant's mother had an excellent reputation, however, his father was known to do a little drinking."

WINGER advised he did not have first-hand knowledge of this fact and this came to his attention through rumor.

LUCILIE GCRHAM, beckleeper, leasey Hardware Store, Dixon, Illinois, advised she was a former teacher at the high school and was acquainted withthe applicant and his family at the time he attended the high school. She stated the applicant had good habits and an excellent reputation.

GCRHAM stated the applicant had very reputable associates and came from a very good family. She stated the applicant's mother sang in the cheir at the church, however, his father was known as a social drinker. GCRHAM advised she would recommend the applicant very highly for a position of trust, since she had no reason to question his loyalty.

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Employment

JACK KEEGAH, President, Park Board, City of Dixon, Illinois, advised that he had no records available, however, recalled that the applicant worked as a lifeguard at Lowell Park in Dixon for about three or four summers while he was attending high school ard college. KEEGAH described the applicant as honest, possessing a good reputation, and he had no reason to doubt his loyalty to the United States. KEEGAH advised he would recommend the applicant highly for a position of trust.

CURT RICE, Baliff, Circuit Court, Dixon, Illinois, advised he recalled the applicant and his family. He stated he recalled the applicant working as a lifeguard at Lovell Park in the summer during the time the applicant was attending high school and college. RICE advised the REAGAN family had an excellent reputation in Dixon, and he would recommend the applicant highly for any position of trust. He stated the applicant always had good associates.

Credit and Arrest

Clerk, Lee County Credit Bureau, Dixon, Illinois, advised that her records contained no uniavorable information concerning the applicant. She stated her records revealed the applicant's father to be JCHN E. REAGAN and his mother as NELLIE EXAGAN. She stated the family had an excellent credit rating, and there was no unfavorable information in her files concerning the REAGAN family.

Cffice, Dixon, Illinois, advised that the records of his department contained no information concerning the REAGAN family.

HARL KEICHNER, Chief of Police, Bixon, Illinois, advised his department had no record for the KEIGAN family. KEICHNER advised he recalled the family personally and they had an excellent reputation in Dixon. HELCHNER advised the applicant's father had an occasional social drink, however, his department never had any trouble with any of the members of the REAGAN family.

Officials of Batten, Barton, Durstine, and Osborne (BBDO), Inc., Los Angeles, state REAGAN employed through BBDO for General Electric Company which sponsored the television program "The General Electric Theatre." Officials recommend REAGAN highly as a man of excellent character and reputation and state that he was very successful in the performance of his duties in connection with the program for "The General Electric Theatre." REAGAN employed Universal City Studios, Universal City, California, from 6/26/60 through 6/26/62 and from 1/10/63 through 5/24/64. Universal officials describe REAGAN as a very high-type person and a man of honesty and integrity and a loyal American citizen. 10/1/64 through 9/30/66 REAGAN associated with Borax Corporation, Los Angeles. He was employed as master of ceremonies for the Borax Corporation, "Death Valley Days," and acted in some of the shows. He also traveled and made personal appearances on behalf of Borax Corporation. REAGAN, in 1946, mentioned as sponsor and director of the Los Angeles Committee for a Democratic Far Eastern Policy. in 1946, described as member of the American Veterans Committee. The "Daily People's World," 9/7/46, reflects RONALD REAGAN to star in a series produced in cooperation withHollywood Writers Mobilization.

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DETAILS:

The following investigation was conducted by SA RICHARD M. WOOLF:

EMPLOYMENT

Warner Brothers Pictures, Inc. 4000 Warner Boulevard Burbank, California

On January 25. 1967. and January 26. 1967, Warner Brothers Pictures, Inc., advised he had caused a search to be made of the records of this studio for the history of the applicant's employment by Warner Brothers and had determined the applicant initially was employed by this studio as an actor effective May 24, 1937. The applicant remained with the studio until April 18, 1942, when he entered military service. He returned from military service on September 12, 1945, and returned to the studio. His exclusive service contract with this studio terminated in April, 1949, but the applicant remained with the studio until March 15, 1952, under contract to perform in several motion pictures.


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said employment records indicate that in 1937 the applicant resided at 1326 Londonderry View, Hollywood, California. His date and place of birth are shown as February 6, 1911, Tampico, Illinois. His father is listed as JOHN EDWARD REAGAN and his mother as NELL REAGAN. His parents' address in 1937 was shown as 9031 Phyllis Avenue, Los Angeles, California. He also listed a brother, NEIL REAGAN, of the same address as his parents and noted that the brother was employed by Warner Brothers. The applicant's wife is listed as JANE WYMAN.

According to _______ the employment records further noted that the applicant graduated from college (name not indicated) in 1932 and that from February, 1933, until June, 1937, the applicant was employed as a Sports Announcer by the Central Broadcasting Company, Des Moines, Iowa. The applicant also noted he was a Second Lieutenant in the U.S. Cavalry Reserve. The records contained nothing unfavorable concerning the applicant and contained no additional pertinent information.

Mr. JACK L. WARNER, Chairman of the Board of Directors, Warner Brothers Pictures, Inc., advised on January 25, 1967, that he first heard of the applicant in 1937 when the applicant was a Sports Announcer in Des Moines, Iowa. He invited the applicant to Hollywood, California; was impressed with the applicant; and entered into a contract with the applicant under which the applicant was to act in motion pictures produced by this studio. said the applicant remained with the studio until World War II when the applicant entered military service. Mr. WARNER said his recollection of the contractual relationship the applicant had with the studio following the war years is hazy, but he recalled that the applicant performed in several motion pictures produced by this studio until about 1950.

Mr. WARNER said that in addition to knowing the applicant as an actor at Warner Brothers Studio that he developed a fairly close personal relationship with the applicant which has continued to the present date. the years they frequently have visited in each others homes.

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Mr. WARNER said that for many years the applicant was President of the Screen Actors Guild. He had the reputation for being a fair, responsible individual who had the respect of both motion picture actors and motion picture producers.

Mr. WARNER volunteered that he knew the applicant's former wife, JANE WYMAN, who also formerly was under contract as a motion picture actress at Warner Brothers Studios and he knows the applicant's present wife, NANCY. He said the applicant has always been known as a perfect gentleman and that he lived an open, clean life that would withstand any scrutiny..

Mr. WARNER volunteered that he did not know what goes on behind the closed doors in any man's home, but he could state that he had never heard any gossip concerning the applicant. He added that the applicant is a loyal American citizen of excellent character who associated with people of good reputation. Mr. WARNER said he would highly recommend the applicant for any position of trust and confidence.

Mr. MERVYN LEROY, Producer-Director, Warner Brothers Picture, Inc., advised on January 25, 1967, that he has been acquainted with the applicant since the applicant commenced his career as a motion picture actor. He said he had always held great personal esteem for the applicant and for the applicant's wife, NANCY, and has always identified himself as the "matchmaker" in introducing the applicant to NANCY REAGAN.

Mr. MERVYN LEROY said the applicant has always had the reputation as being a dedicated, loyal American citizen who keenly felt the responsibilities of citizenship. He said the applicant's character was above reproach and the applicant associated only with reputable individuals. Mr. LEROY said he would highly recommend the applicant for any position.

Mr. WILLIAM SCHAEFFER, Executive Assistant to Mr. J. L. WARNER, Warner Brothers Pictures, Inc., advised on January 25, 1967, that he has known the applicant since 1937 when the applicant originally signed a contract to act in motion pictures for this studio and had a fairly close relationship with the applicant until the time the applicant entered military service in about 1942. Mr. SCHAEFFER said that since World War II his duties did not require a close relationship with actors, and he has had only limited knowledge of the applicant since that time. Mr. SCHAEFFER said he knows the applicant is a loyal American citizen who would sacrifice his life for his country. He said he considers the applicant's reputation and character to be above reproach, and he believes that the applicant associated only with reputable individuals.

Batten, Barton, Durstine and Osborne (BBDO), Inc. Advertising Agency Los Angeles, California

BBDO, advised on January 26, 1967, that the contract
Mr. REAGAN had with this company was handled by the
company's New York City office; that the local office had
no record and no information concerning the contract;
and that personnel of the local office did not work with
Mr. REAGAN in connection with his duties under the contract.

BBDO, New York City, was currently in

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Los Angeles on business and would be in a position to furnish information concerning Mr. REAGAN's association with BBDO.

BBDO, New York City, was interviewed on January 26, 1967, at the Los Angeles Office of BBDO. advised that Mr. REAGAN was hired through the New York Office of this company in about 1952. BBDO held a contract with the General Electric Company under which the General Electric Company sponsored a television program entitled,

"The General Electric Theatre." The applicant was employed to be the program supervisor for this program; to perform as master of ceremonies for all of the shows; and to act in some of the shows. Mr. REAGAN was engaged under the contract to make personal appearances in various cities, principally those cities in which General Electric Company plants were located, and to give talks in these cities.

said the applicant was very successful in the performance of his duties under this contract. He believed Mr. REAGAN's political ambitions probably were developed during this period of appearing and talking before the American public.

said Mr. REAGAN's services were terminated when the General Electric Company decided to cancel "The General Electric Theatre" and to advertise in a different form. said he did not recall the date Mr. REAGAN's contract with BBDO terminated. He suggested that BBDO, New York City, would be in a position to provide an official record of the applicant's association with BBDO. added that "The General Electric Theatre" was filmed at Universal City Studios, Universal City, California, and that Mr. REAGAN's contract was handled through Mr. TAFT B. SCHREIBER of the Music Corporation of America (MCA). He suggested that Mr. SCHREIBER probably would have direct knowledge of Mr. REAGAN's association with BBDO.

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said he knew that Mr. REAGAN was a loyal, American citizen whose complete life was an open book. He said he knew the applicant's character and reputation were above reproach. He said he had never heard anything unfavorable concerning any of the applicant's associates.

Mr. TAFT B. SCHREIBER, President, Universal Television, Universal City, California, advised on January 26, 1967, that the Music Corporation of America (MCA) is the parent corporation of Universal City Studios and Universal Television. He said he was Vice President

of MCA and in that position handled Mr. REAGAN's contract with BBDO for about eight years under which contract Mr. REAGAN was program supervisor for "The General Electric Theatre." He said this television series was filmed at Universal City Studios, Universal City, California.

Mr. SCHREIBER said he has known Mr. REAGAN for the past twenty-nine or thirty years; has been involved with the applicant from 1938 to the present; and was active in Mr. REAGAN's political campaign for the position of Governor of the State of California.

Mr. SCHREIBER said that Mr. REAGAN has been conscious about government all his life and has had a continuing concern about the responsibility of individuals in society. As program supervisor for "The General Electric Theatre," Mr. REAGAN spoke in many cities in America on subject matters of his choice. In these speeches he began to talk about that which concerned him - the responsibility of government and the responsibility of the individual - and this evolved into Mr. REAGAN's present, deep political concern.

Mr. SCHREIBER said the applicant has a deep sense of moral responsibility to his country; that his character is above reproach; and that he has only the finest associates. He said Mr. REAGAN is eminently qualified for any position of trust and confidence.

Universal City Studios, Inc. Universal City, California

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Universal City Studios, advised on January 25, 1967, the records of this company indicate that effective January 4, 1955, an agreement was entered into between RONALD REAGAN and BBDO on behalf of BBDO's client the General Electric Company in which Mr. REAGAN was engaged for 39 telecasts. The contract included four consecutive options for 52 weeks (39 telecasts each 52 weeks). The original contract was scheduled for termination on June 27, 1954.

On April 21, 1955, the original agreement was renewed for 52 weeks commencing June 26, 1955, and ending June 23, 1956. The agreement was renewed on April 9, 1956, for 52 weeks commencing June 24, 1956, and ending June 16, 1957.

Said she could not locate an agreement for the year commencing in June, 1957, but apparently an agreement was renewed for that year. She added that the agreement was renewed on June 10, 1958, for 52 weeks commencing June 29, 1958, and ending June 21, 1959.

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On June 26, 1960, a loanout agreement was made with BBDO regarding RONALD REAGAN in "The General Electric Theater" television series for the 1960-1961 series consisting of 52 weeks commencing June 26, 1960. This agreement was extended for 13 weeks commencing June 24, 1962, and ending September 27, 1962.


On May 25, 1960, an employment contract was made between Revue Studios (now consolidated into Universal City Studios) and Mr. REAGAN with employment to commence June 26, 1960.

Under the terms of this contract, Mr. REAGAN exercised an option effective on June 26, 1961, for a second contract year. A third year option was not exercised.

On January 10, 1963, an additional employment agreement was made between Revue Studios and RONALD REAGAN under which employment was to commence on February 4, 1963, for 65 weeks to expire on May 3, 1964. This term was extended to May 24, 1964.

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said Mr. REAGAN also made some pictures for Universal quite a long time ago but the files for the contracts under which Mr. REAGAN's employment as an actor was obtained could not be located. added that the files contained no derogatory information concerning the applicant.



said Mr. REAGAN always enjoyed a most enviable reputation for honesty and integrity, that he possessed an excellent character, and that he associated only with responsible people. He added that Mr. REAGAN is one of the most patriotic, loyal American citizens he knows and that Mr. REAGAN was qualified for any position involving trust and confidence.

Mr. EDWARD MUHL, Vice President in Charge of Production, Universal City Studios, Inc., advised that he did not know the applicant personally but generally knew of the applicant's history as an actor and was aware that the applicant had worked at this studio in connection with the television series called, "The General Electric Theater," and as an actor in motion pictures. 

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
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Corporation, advised on January 31, 1967, that this company's contract with the applicant was handled under his supervision.

Mr. STABLER said the applicant functioned as host-narrator for all the shows and acted in a leading role in eight of the shows.

Mr. STABLER had no personal knowledge of the applicant prior to the applicant's contract with the Borax Corporation, but came to know the applicant fairly well as a result of their relationship in filming the series. The show primarily was filmed on location and the applicant and Mr. STABLER spent considerable time together.

Mr. STABLER said he found the applicant to be a man of great integrity and sincerity with a very deep interest and concern about the welfare of the country and the people in the country. He considers the applicant to be absolutely reliable with a reputation and character beyond reproach. He believes the applicant to be an outstanding patriot who is devoted to the principles of this country.

Mr. STABLER said he had no knowledge of the applicant's associates or associations but had never heard anything but favorable comments concerning the applicant or his associates. He highly recommends the applicant for any position of trust and confidence.

REFERENCE

On February 1, 1967, Mr. HOLMES TUTTLE, 637 South Hudson, Los Angeles, California, was interviewed by SA at his place of business located at 145 North La Brea, Los Angeles, California. He stated that he has known RONALD REAGAN since 1946. He said that he knows REAGAN to be a man of excellent character, integrity, and associates. He said that Mr. REAGAN was an "Horatio Alger" type of man who had worked his way up the ladder of success primarily through his own initiative and perseverance. Mr. TUTTLE pointed out that REAGAN was a fine dedicated American whose loyalty to the United States Government could not be questioned. He said that REAGAN was also a fine family man who was clean living and a man of good habits. He said that he would recommend him without reservation for any position of trust and confidence. MISCELLANEOUS

Records of the Los Angeles Superior Court, which were caused to be searched on January 25, 1967, by SE reflect the following information, under Docket No. D360058:

Complaint for Divorce was filed May 6, 1948, between JANE WYMAN REAGAN and RONALD W. REAGAN. The records indicate that they were married January 26, 1940, at Glendale, California, and separated May 2, 1948. The children who were born as a result of this marriage were MAUREEN ELIZABETH, age 7, and MICHAEL EDWARD, age 3. She alleged he inflicted grievous mental suffering upon her making it impossible for the parties to live happily together as husband and wife. They both signed a written property settlement agreement February 17, 1948, to divide their community property. She was granted an Interlocutory Divorce June 28, 1948, and received custody of the two children. She was to receive \$500.00 a month for child support. Final Judgment of Divorce was filed on July 18, 1949.

The December 4, 1945, issue of the "Daily People's World" carried an article on page three, dateline December 3rd at Los Angeles. The article stated that Southern California's first mass meeting on atomic energy was called by the Hollywood Independent Citizens Committee of the Arts, Sciences, and Professions for December 12 at the Hollywood Legion Stadium. The article stated that film star RONALD REAGAN would appear in NORMAN CORWIN's dramatic play "Set Your Clock at U-235."

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On December 17, 1945, LA T-1, who is not available for recontact or testimony, advised that one RONALD REAGAN was included in the program and on the Dinner Committee of a dinner given by the Hollywood Independent Citizens Committee of the Arts, Sciences, and Professions at the Beverly-Wilshire Hotel, Los Angeles, on the evening of December 10, 1945.

The report of the Senate Fact-Finding Committee on Un-American Activities to the 1951 Regular California Legislature states on page 268 that the organization originally known as the Independent Citizens Committee of the Arts, Sciences, and Professions later became known as the National Council of the Arts, Sciences and Professions. A characterization of the Southern California Chapter of the National Council of the Arts, Sciences, and Professions is contained on the appendix page attached hereto.

The "Hollywood Citizen News" published on September 6, 1947, carried an item entitled, "PAUL ROBESON RAPS 'Fascists'." The article related that ROBESON spoke and sang at a function at the Shrine Auditorium, Los Angeles, under the auspices of the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee. The article noted that among those listed on the announcement as the sponsoring committee was RONALD REAGAN. REAGAN was not further identified.

On October 23, 1947, RONALD REAGAN, motion picture actor, testified before the Committee on Un-American Activities. One page 215 of the record of these hearings conducted for the period of October 20 to October 30, 1947, REAGAN was questioned as to whether he had ever sponsored any function of the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee. Following is quoted his reply:

"I was called several weeks ago. There happened at the time in Hollywood to be a financial drive on to raise money to build a badly needed hospital in a certain section of town, called the All Nations Hospital. I think the purpose of the building is so obvious by the title that it has the support of most of the people of Hollywood--or, of Los Angeles, I should say. Certainly of most of the doctors, because it is very badly needed.

"Some time ago I was called to the telephone. A woman introduced herself by name. Knowing that I didn't know her I didn't make any particular note of her name and I couldn't give it now. She told me that there would be a recital held at which PAUL ROBESON would sing and she said that all the money for the tickets would go to the hospital and asked if she could use my name as one of the sponsors. I hesitated for a moment because I don't think that Mr. ROBESON's and my political views coincide at all and then I thought I was being a little stupid because, I thought, here is an occasion where Mr. ROBESON is perhaps appearing as an artist and certainly the object, raising money, is above any political consideration, it is a hospital supported by everyone. I have contributed money myself. I felt a little bit as if I had been stuffy for a minute and I said, certainly, you can use my name.

The Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee was cited by the Attorney General of the United States under the provisions of Executive Order 10450.

The "Daily People's World" a former daily west coast Communist Party publication.

The July 15, 1949, edition of the "Washington Times Herald," Washington, D.C., newspaper, carried an article entitled, "Probers Told ROBESON is a 'Veteran Red'." This article reflects that MANNING JOHNSON, an ex-Communist Party leader, told Congress on July 14, 1949, that PAUL ROBESON had been a member of the Communist Party for many years. JOHNSON said he met ROBESON frequently at the Communist Party headquarters in New York, where ROBESON held secret meetings with EARL BROWDER, WILLIAM Z. FOSTER, and J. PETERS.

The July 17, 1951, issue of the "Examiner," a Los Angeles daily newspaper, contained an item entitled "Filmland Fight on Reds Told." The item stated that RONALD REAGAN, actor and Screen Actor's Guild President, was one of three spokesmen who told how Hollywood anti-Communist organizations in "1946 beat the Reds at their own game of organizing cells, outstaying them at meetings, and using parliamentary procedure to further their aims."

The "Times," a Los Angeles daily newspaper, on June 10, 1957, carried an item regarding the awarding to RONALD REAGAN, screen and television star, of the honorary degree of Doctor of Humane Letters by his Alma Mater Eureka College, Eureka, Illinois. Among other things, the school cited the actor's understanding and courage in recognizing and exposing Communists and their influence during his term as President of the Screen Actor's Guild.

In April, 1946, Mr. HARVEY WOLF, a Communist Party member from 1933, to 1934, who died January 13, 1964, advised that RONALD REAGAN, screen actor, was listed as a sponsor and director of the Los Angeles Committee for a Democratic Far Eastern Policy.

The Committee for a Democratic Far Eastern Policy has been designated by the Attorney General pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

The "Los Angeles News" issue, April 29, 1946, contains an article concerning the California State Convention of the American Veterans Committee which was held April 26, 1946, through April 28, 1946. This article reflects that film actor RONALD REAGAN is a member of the American Veterans Committee and was a toastmaster at a luncheon session of the convention.

The Fourth Report of Un-American Activities in California which is a report of the Joint Fact Finding Committee to the 1948 Regular California Legislature, dated at Sacramento, 1948, on Page 43, lists among other organizations, the American Veterans Committee, which is typical of organizations "faced with consistent Communist disruption and confusion." The report states that the California Section of the American Veterans Committee falls into the Communist dominated class and is a vociferous, decadent minority in national AVC affairs."

The "Daily People's World" issue of September 7, 1946, on Page 3, contains an article stating that RONALD REAGAN was to star in "Operation Terror," first in a series of 13 weekly broadcasts entitled, "It's Happening Here," sponsored by the Mobilization for Democracy, on Monday night, September 9, 1946. It was announced that the program would be produced with the cooperation of the Hollywood Writers Mobilization.

The Mobilization for Democracy is cited as follows on Page 220 of the Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications prepared and released by the Committee on Un-American Activities, U. S. House of Representatives, Washington, D. C.

"1. 'One of the largest, and certainly one of the most potentially potent front organizations created by California Communists' since 1945. 'As an excuse for' its creation, the Communist Party seized upon the appearance of Gerald L. K. Smith in Los Angeles. It is 'a Communist-inspired and dominated organization, carefully window-dressed and directed' and 'engaged in inciting riots, racial hatred, and disrespect for law and order.' It is one of the 'key Communist fronts in California.'

"(California Joint Fact-Finding Committee on Un-American Activities, Report, 1947, pp. 48, 62, and 369.)"

The Hollywood Writers Mobilization for Defense is cited by the Attorney General pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

This is to advise that the background investigation of Reagan, the present Governor of California, requested by the Atomic Energy Commission (AEC) has been completed. the Governor of California, Reagan will be a member of the Board of Regents of the University of California, which position has been classified as "highly sensitive" by AEC. All persons interviewed during the investigation made highly favorable comments concerning Reagan's character, loyalty, and associates.

Although Reagan has been extremely anticommunist since the latter part of the 1940's, in 1945 he was listed as a member of the Dinner Committee and appeared in a play at a meeting called by the Hollywood Independent Citizen's Committee of the Arts, Sciences, and the Professions. organization later became known as the National Council of Arts, Sciences, and Professions. In 1946, Reagan starred in a radio program sponsored by the Mobilization for Democracy and produced with the cooperation of the Hollywood Writers Mobilization. The Southern California Committee of the National Council of Arts, Sciences, and Professions has been cited by the California Committee on Un-American Activities as a communist dominated propaganda media, and the Mobilization for Democracy has been cited by the California Joint Fact Finding Committee on Un-American Activities as a communist front. In 1946, Reagan was listed as a sponsor and director of the Los Angeles Committee for a Democratic Far Eastern Policy. 1947, Reagan was listed as a sponsor of a recital put on by the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee. The Committee for a Democratic Far Eastern Policy, the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee, and the Hollywood Writers Mobilization for Defense have been cited pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

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
