ADMINISTRATIVE CONT'D

Of significance in this case, were statements by NEEDLEMAN reflecting that during 1946, when NEEDLEMAN was General Counsel for the Amtorg Trading Corporation (ATC), HARRY GOLD and the subject contacted him regarding an advertisement they had read announcing the arrival in the US of a "Soviet commissioner" interested in recruiting chemists to construct a "vitamin producing plant". NEEDLEMAN stated that HARRY GOLD and the subject claimed, at the time of their initial contact with him, that they had designed a vitamin producing plant in India and wanted to offer their services in that capacity to the Soviets through the ATC. (u)

NEEDLEMAN recalled that BROTHMAN had stated that he had received some kind of scientific award in Moscow, USSR, to which statement NEEDLEMAN commented at the time, that BROTHMAN should offer his services to the Soviets directly and that he (NEEDLEMAN) did not want to know anything about dealings BROTHMAN and GOLD may have had with the Russians. (u)

The above information was not reported in instant report in view of the delicate nature of the source, which furnished the information, and particularly since information furnished by the source reflected verbatim conversations of individuals involved. (u)

Release said: "He worked initially in the chemical field, being associated with Blaw Knox Inc. and Hendrick Manufacturing Co. as well as owning his own engineering firm. A specialist in the plastics and resins field, Brothman is credited with the development of the original aerosol bomb dispenser

"He has made major contributions to the development of color tube television tubes, digital computers and digital data transmission systems. As an author, Brothman has had published some 45 technical papers on mathematics, physics, chemical engineering, electronic instrument and control systems and digital telemetering techniques."

Brothman bitterly opposed issuance of this release, for good reasons.

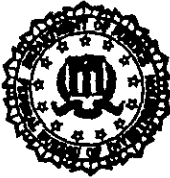

On September 10, 1962, a source advised that Abraham Brothman resides at 17 Franklin Street, Dumont, New Jersey, with his wife Naomi and daughter Elsa. He was of the opinion that the subject had one other child, a boy, but he was not certain of this. (u) ~~ABROTHMAN~~

The source stated that Abraham Brothman has been in Russia for approximately one month. He has sent letters home, approximately one per day, bearing the return address Hotel Leningrad, Moscow. He stated that he had no knowledge concerning the purpose of his trip, but his wife and daughter during the past month have indicated a desire to be in daily contact with him.

[REDACTED] a former Communist Party (CP) member for over 20 years, stated Abraham Brothman in approximately 1948 made a speech at a meeting of the Hetti Lapatine Club of the CP. Brothman was interviewed in May, 1947, at which time he admitted membership in the Young Communist League (YCL) while a student at Columbia University. He, on numerous occasions in 1940, gave blueprints to Elizabeth T. Bentley, an admitted former Soviet courier. He was an associate of Harry Gold, a self-admitted Soviet espionage agent. On November 22, 1950, Trial Jury, Southern District of New York, found subject guilty of Conspiracy to Obstruct Justice and Intimidation of a Government Witness. On November 28, 1950, he was sentenced to five years imprisonment and \$5,000 fine on count charging Intimidation of a Government Witness and two years imprisonment and \$10,000 fine on charge of Conspiracy to Obstruct Justice. On July 26, 1951, the United States Court of Appeals, Second District, affirmed the conviction of Abraham Brothman on the Conspiracy count but reversed

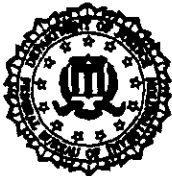

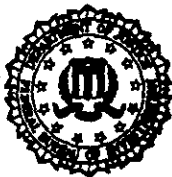

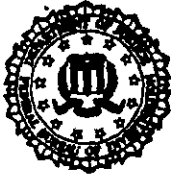

[REDACTED] also related that he had been reading a book entitled, "The Secret War," author not recalled, which contains stories concerning the ROSENBERGS, DAVID GREENGLASS, GARY POWERS, HARRY GOLD and BROTHMAN. He said Basler makes parts for nuclear reactors in submarines, which he, [REDACTED] sells to the Westinghouse Electric Corporation, East Pittsburgh, Pa. He said he did not desire to jeopardize in any way the account he has with Basler in supplying parts to Westinghouse. He said he felt that possibly the Office of Naval Intelligence as well as the FBI might become interested in BROTHMAN again and as a result of his association with Transitel his name might be drawn into any investigation of BROTHMAN. He is employed by the Transitel International Corporation, 615 Winters Avenue, Paramus, N.J., as Manager of Research and Development and Head Engineer for the Jersey Machine Company in Newark, N.J. Both organizations are subsidiaries of the Baldwin Lima Hamilton Corporation of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, and the Industrial Processing Corporation in Newark, N.J. (u)

The subject was identified by ELIZABETH BENTLEY, admitted Soviet agent, as an individual who turned over to her during 1940 and 1941 blueprints for delivery to her Soviet superior. Information also was received that he was in contact with another Soviet agent at that time, HARRY GOLD. He was convicted on 11/22/50 of conspiracy to obstruct justice for persuading HARRY GOLD to testify falsely before a Federal Grand Jury in 1947. He served a term of two years and was released in 1952. (u)

Subject on occasions of previous interviews by Bureau agents failed to express a willingness to discuss circumstances of his known past activities as a Soviet espionage agent and there is no information available to indicate that he has adopted a cooperative attitude toward the Bureau. (u)

RECOMMENDATION

[REDACTED] of the Sangamo Electric Company of Springfield, Illinois, telephonically advised a representative of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), of the following:

The Sangamo Electric Company is considering purchasing ~~Transitel Corporation~~ Paramus, New Jersey, of which Abraham Brothman is president. Transitel is engaged in manufacturing products used by public utility companies, and has developed an electric meter that would obviate the necessity of electricity suppliers hiring meter readers. If Sangamo purchases Transitel, the plan is to continue Brothman's position with the company because of his personal engineering ability. (u)

Sangamo holds classified contracts with the National Aeronautic and Space Agency (NASA), Atomic Energy Commission (AEC), and the Department of Defense (DOD). (u) b7C

[REDACTED] to know if Sangamo needed any kind of clearance or approval from the FBI in order to purchase this company, as company officials were "aware of Brothman's connections with Elizabeth Bentley and Harry Gold, and the fact that Brothman had gone to jail." (u) b7C

[REDACTED] he planned to discuss the contemplated purchase of Transitel by Sangamo with appropriate officials in all of the defense agencies with whom Sangamo has contracts to determine if such purchase would in any way prejudice Sangamo as a classified contract holder with these various agencies. Brothman would be given no access to divisions of Sangamo handling classified contracts, and would in fact be ~~many miles~~ removed from locations where classified contracts were being fulfilled. [REDACTED] a former Communist Party (CP) member for over twenty years, stated Abraham Brothman in approximately 1948, made a speech at a meeting of the Hetti Lapatine Club of the CP. Brothman was interviewed in May, 1947, at which time he admitted membership in the Young Communist League (YCL), while a student at Columbia University. He, on numerous occasions in 1940, gave blueprints to Elizabeth T. Bentley, an admitted former Soviet courier. He was an associate of Harry Gold, a self-admitted Soviet espionage agent. On November 22, 1950, Trial Jury, Southern District of New York, found subject guilty of Conspiracy to Obstruct Justice and Intimidation of a Government Witness. On November 28, 1950, he was sentenced to five years imprisonment and \$5,000 fine on count charging Intimidation of a Government Witness and two years imprisonment and \$10,000 fine on charge of Conspiracy to Obstruct Justice. On July 26, 1951, the United States Court of Appeals, Second District, affirmed the conviction of Abraham Brothman on the Conspiracy count but reversed conviction on the count charging Intimidation of a Government Witness, because of venue. He was confined to United States Penitentiary, Atlanta,

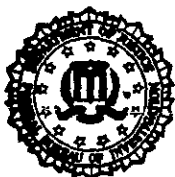

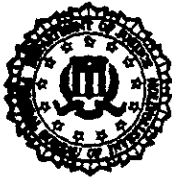

Subject on occasions of previous interviews by Bureau Agents, failed to express a willingness to discuss circumstances of his known past activities as a Soviet espionage agent, and there is no information available to indicate that he has adopted a cooperative attitude toward the Bureau. (u)

RECOMMENDATION:
