# Linked to Spying By Miss Bentley

WASHINGTON, June 5 (AP).—Elizabeth T. Bentley, former Red courier, today named six additional government employes as information suppliers for the Soviet government.

House spy hunters, meanwhile, let it be known they suspect that somebody in the government tipped wartime

Russian spies when G-men picked up their trails.

The suspicions are based part-ly on testimony Miss Bentley gave last year and partly on information obtained in a new case on which hearings will be held tomorrow.

Miss Bentley sent the new names, plus 31 she had men-tioned before, to the Senate Ju-diciary Committee. Neither she nor the committee said whether any of them still get paychecks from the Government. None of the six was widely known in the capital.

The newcomers whose names went into the committee's offi-

cial records were:
Peter Perazich of the United
Nations Relief and Rehabilitation Administration; Ruth Mykin, also of UNRRA; Bernice Levin, of the old War Production Board; Vladimir Kazakevich, teacher of Army courses at Cornell University: Peter Rhodes, broadcaster for the Army in Africa and Italy; and Abraham Brothman, reserve Army officer, also listed as an employe of Republic Steel Co.

#### Lists Others

Miss Bentley also had some new names of persons outside the government who she said were on the relay team that passed in-

These included Anatol Volkov, a courier; Hazen Size, Canadian film board, Canadian Legation, Washington; Cedric Belfrage, British intelligence service, New York; and Mrs. Robert Miller, Chinese Purchasing Commission.

Miss Bentley declared she was a courier for wartime Red apy rings which she says got secrets from government workers and passed them to Soviet agents and on to Moscow. She soured on Communism and told her story to the FBI and later to Congressional committees.

An immigration subcommittee of the Senate Judiciary Committee asked her on May 13 to sub-mit names of persons "who to her knowledge were involved it relaying information to the Soviet





It was noted in reviewing the applicant's personnel fift at the Bureau of the Budget that in 1911 she had named one FATTH WILLTANS, 2930 Chesapeake Street, N. W., as a reference. A sheck of the ffles of the Washington Field Office reflected that FAITH M. WILLIAMS, 2930 Chesapeake Street, N. W., was reported in the report of SA T. W. DANSEY dated March 18, 1941, entitled, "League of Women Shoppers, Washington, D. C., Internal Security - C.", as being a sponsor of the above organisation and since November 1937 had contributed sixteen dollars to it. This report further reflects that a forum of the League of Women Shoppers was held on December 15, 1910, at the Raleigh Hotel, Washington, D. C., and FAITH WILLIAMS described the extent of malnutrition among populations. In the report entitled, "Capital City Forum, Internal Security - C" by SA T. W. DAWSEY dated May 26, 1941, at Washington, D. C., FAITH WILLIAMS name appears as a member of the Capital City Forum which organisation is a known Communist front. The name of FAITH WILLIAMS also appears in the indices of the Washington Committee for Democratic Action which organization is a known Communist front.

It was also noted in the report of SA E. W. DOOLEY dated March 22, 1946, at New York City, that it was stated that certain correspondence of URSULA WASSERMAN was made available through a confidential source. I was not only enother number, enother convict at Atlanta in the above sense, I had further reasons for being ready to go along with the usual convict lore. Ly religious end cultural background made he ripe for a host of resentments against society and an affinity for my other "persecuted" fellow convicts. As they would say, "That a host of ronkeys on my back." I was cynical and skeptical of everything and---as I've said---had always thought it profitable to be that way. Fack of the offense that had sent me to !tlente was my basic failure as a law abiding rember of society.

Perhaps my friends in the old days had not been to fer wrong in feeling that my general revolt against failures in my life, ( built upon my own short-codings rather than on those of the day, the age and the world at large ) made me ripe for participation in their own little ONE WORLD of COLUMNISTE.

If this was not the case then, it certainly had become the state of effairs when I reached the rederal Penitentiary at Atlanta, Ca. I was ready to believe the tales the Top Cormies told me: tales of fantastic anti-senatic plots; stories of the manner in which aid to the State of Israel was being made into a recket. One of the atrongest factors, however, was the conviction and impending execution of Atom Spies Julia and Ethel Rosenberg. Abe Brothman is a brilliant wan. I understand him better than he ever understood se. Simply put, Abe was at Atlanta for telling Harry Cold not to squeal...and Harry Cold had good reason to obey his boss. But let's go back a few years.

Abe Brot men was a child prodicy, brilliant of mind and husky of body. He was playing football at Columbia when most boys his are were hoping to make the freshman squad in high school. Obviously he had had conflicts with Columbia University's famed coach, Lou Little. I suspect that the reason he described Little to be as a "Tescist" was because Little presented to mun the Columbia squad in his own manner, rather than Brothman's. In any case, Abe graduated from Columbia and soon emerged as a leading engineer. He claimed that it was he who perfected the system of color T.V. now used by C.B.S.

I did place together many other informative facts that give an insight into what arkes Prothran click. And click he did, in the industrial sense. The trajedy is that his background (as Judge Kaufman said at his trial) that his background...which I found so similar in many respects to my own...led him into Communicia and active participation in the Party. I felt that this passont was arrogent towards to because he knew that I had just been released from prison, and so I procooded to let whim know who Ray D. Eurray was. The bluff did not work and I became further enraged and just had to setisfy my feelings of inferiority. I left the bus and used a complaint to the ticket agent who gave me no satisfaction at a 11 . This promted se to go all out in an effort to satisfy myself. I called the I.C.C. in N.Y. C. and raised holy hannah with them. They took my none address and mature of my complaint and promised to look into the matter and told me to take a train or some other pages of transportation to N.WYC. I took another bus. I finally did manage to get to the city ax and once there I was in need of a place to sleep. I went to the YMCA Sloans House on 34th St. and whatetten red to get a room for the night. The deak clerk told me that

What a wonderful person she was this sister of mine. Never was there a time when I was in need of help that she refused me. I felt real good that afternoon at her home and as such decided to take her into my confidence and tell her about my "connections" that would but me on top of the pile in a short while. My sister told me to take things easy and to forget "my get rick quick" echemes. The best things in life are free she insisted, why gesble away the rest of your life ? This was no gamble I assured her, it was for sure that I would make the grade this time. She was rather frightened for me, in that I was getting involved with Communists and the like. I told her that there was nothing for me so fear but fear itself. " Go - Abead she said , but if you get into trouble again, don't expect any help from me, I have helped you for the last time". She tried to talk me into going to Cincinneti, Ohio where my wife and child were. Go there and get a job and work hard and show her that you mean what you say and I am sure that she will come back to you. I let it go in one sar and out the other. After all, what hid she know about high finence and the workings of the Communist Party and other things of this sort. She was a good kid in her place, but she had no place in Big Time Operations ! I left her home that evening and proceeded to Lanhattan where I got myself a room for the night, again at the ThiCA. I gave the desk clark a sob story and he went for it.

The next day efter having breakfast, I took myself off into a corner and took a look at my situation. The first thing I decided to do before contecting Brothman was to get hold of some money to purchase some new clother. I felt self-concious in my prison suit. I decided to get this much needed money from several people that owed the Doctor from Green Haven. Before I left he gave me the O.K. to collect these debts and collect them I did. It was not much but it allowed me a suit of clothes and a few dollars to operate with until I definately made up my mind as to which of the two deals I would take, the stamps or work for Brothman. "Ith new clothes and feeling better as a result I finally decided to let the stamps wait as an ace in the hole if smything went wrong with the Brothman deal. My next step was to call illiam L. Messing on the phone and tell him that I was free and anxious to contact Brothman. He said he would convey my message to Brothman and I was to call him the following day for further information. I called the next day and was told that Abe would meet meen 34th St.

The place of the meeting on 34th Street was in the office of an Optomertrist between 7th and 8th Ave. I waited until I finally felt that I was going to get the old brush off. I was getting angrier by the moment, when finally a voice said " hello Ray" and there spood Abe Brothmen. I actually felt a strange emotion of joy at seeing him again. There was something in this mans amile that made a fellow feel that he was the picture of innocence and sincerety. I supposed that many others had been fooled likewise by his smile and look of innocence. I checked my emotions and prepared syself for the battle of with that I knew was going to take place. And take place they did. He begen by acting as if the whole IBI was after his he kept staring over he shoulder so very often that I began to get nervous myself. Finally I told him about it. His reply was that he WAS being watched for because of the Tax situation he was involved in with the Government. He felt that the Government would send him away again just on general principles. I changed the subject feeling that he was merely sizing me up. He ordered a pair of Dark glasses and when this was over we went pround the corner on Pth ave, for lunch. In the resturant he again began acting as though the mirrors on the wills had eyes and ears. He told me that many of the things wer had talked about while in Atlanta would have to be forgotten for swhile es he was Hot, and as such had to be doubly careful. He tried to get off the hook regarding meny of the promises he had nade to me while we ere at Atlanta, but I held fast and played his weak spot, telling him that he owed me nothing, but that if he was the phony type that just wented to use a fellow it was O.K. with me, but not to beat aroun the bush. Tell me like a man and I'll be on my way, I said. This got hir and we were once more as of old. He gave me some money to tide me over until he could get more to me and. esid that he would arrange for me to go to work at Techniflex in Port Jervis, N.Y. He gave me his business card and phone number there and told me to give him a few days to get things organized. I agreed and wer left. I went along with him to the Eudson Tubes where he was to get a trian for New Jersey to seet kirism koscowitz and friends. We parted in the best of spirits and I was certain that things would work out fine for ma. Had be not kept the a pointment with me ??? hy else would he see me if he did not intend to help me or use merter This was the way I resected the situation and it eleted re. By next move now would depend upon his, so I played the waiting game.....

Thus it was while I was weiting for things to develop with Brothman that my wife who was in Cincinnati, Ohio answered my telegren. She wrote to me at my elaters home and during a phone call to my sister I was made sware of her letter. took off for my sisters home to bee the letter with my own eyes. Ixwas so dern excited ther. I was falling Ill over myself in to strempt to get there repidly. Finally I did I'll never forget the scene as long so I live. My sister was in bed due to a sold and her husband was hope too, likewise her young son. I went into the bedroom where my sieter has and she give me the letter. It read something like this. " Dear Ray I am very happy that you are free. I would like to see you and I pray that God guide you in anything you choose to do. Dontxurak write to se at my mothers home, you know why., write to me at the address below, a friends home. I were so wary happy that moment that I cried for joy, my tears brought tears to the eyes of my sister and her busband. In the excitement I said I am off to Cincinnati, Ohio not realizing that I did not have more than \$25.00 onmy person. My brother in-law God bless him, said "hold the phone where are you rushing to??" He then gove me \$50,000 saying this should hold you until you get a job and sarn your own money. He also gave me some under-clothes and other articles of wearing apparell and away I went to the Greyhound terminal in Manhattam where I got a bus to Cincinnati. I called from the station so that my sister and her husband would know I had taken off for Cincinnati instal of on a Binge. glorious moment I forgot all about Brothman and Dr. Rapport all I was concerned about was that my wife was still in love with me, and would allow me the chance to be husband and father. On the bus all sorts of thoughts entered my mind. Tas she merely being nice to me and allowing me to see the child ??? Wen she perhaps on the warge of marrying this fellow she had been going with for the past year and wished to talk to me about giving up my right to being my daughters father????? The 18 hours that I was on the bus was 18 hours of torture and promises to God to Please make everything be O.K. God how I loved my wife and how hard I would work to make up for all the heartache I had caused her. Just give me this last chence God. Finally the bus arrived in Cincinnat: end I was worn to a frazzla worrying about just where I stood in my wifes affection.

I chacked into the Metropole Hotel and proceeded to get myself in shape as best

Endowed with the spirit of love and feeling certain that all would work out well I took
the first step towards realizing the dream I had for 5 years, a home, a wife and the
recognition and love of my daughter. I felt that the wisest thing to do would be to
try and talk my former employer; from who I had stolen, and landed in Atlanta; into
taking me brok. I felt if I would swing this deal the people of "provincial and un-forgiving"
Ginakunati would welcome me back into their good graces by wirture of being reinstated
into kike Alberts..., Imagine my suprise when he offered me employment after I apologized
for rest acts and etc. I was to be employed as a saleanen at the strictly Cincinnati wage
of \$ 50.00 per week plus 6% corrisation. Being that it was Christmas season I knew that
this deal would be O.K. for awhile at any rate. So I took the job and went back to my
hotel and swaited the expected phone-call from my wife. Bone time later her call came

there was a phone call for me from William L. Messing from New York. I told my wife that

I got the Messing on the wire and he told me of Abe's anxiety as to why I had not called him at Port Jervis. I love you, you big dope for what you are, and you are the best, if only you would give yourself a chance. Stop trying to be a millionaire over might. She made he feel so very wonderful and secure with her love, that I would there and then, that I would be the man she thought I was

Ky job at Mike Albert's went slong fine during the Christmas rush, but came the New Year and rough sledding. Ky earnings were so smell that I could berely meet my own expenses. Ky wife was getting boly hanneh at home, for heving gone back to me. I in turn was punishing myself for her unhappy condition there. I went about trying to find other employment and finally located a job with the Cincinneti Post as a selemen. On the application I gave my correct name, my wife wanted it that way. I begen to work and was doing real good. However, the Arm soon fell when the CAL CRIM detective agency who investigated rost applicants for jobs in Cincinneti, told the Post that they would not approve me for bonding...Ex-Convict. This brought me to the price of Ermis Erram the mest, sirculation manager and though he disliked to do it.. I was fired...

I related the story to my wife verbatin and hed her believe that there was nothing to worry over as I would find other employment at more pay, and I did ... This time I was hired by a large downtown retail shoe company again as a salencen. The salery was a good one and likewise the commissions and had I been able to remain there I would have been able to support my family without any trouble at all, thats for sure ... But, again the Are fell and again "friend" Cal Cris. was the willian. . Nore determined than ever to best this miserable situation, I went and got still emother job, still using my correct neme. This time I found employment at the Cincinnati was and Light Co. I lested here about the same period of time as on the other jobs. By this time I was beginning to feel the effects of the Christian attitude of Cincinnati and their fun police state that was controlled by Cal Cris. At this point I asked my wife to give me her permission to leave Cincinnati, and go to dear old Cosmopolitan New York City, where the people did not core where you may have been nor what you may have been in the past, All they esked was that you give a good days work in return for a good days pay. My wife agreed that this was a wise decision and from the very small amount of money that she had she gave me \$ 20:00 to make the trip to New York City. And so approximately 50 days after I had arrived in Cin-cinnati, Ohio I was on my way to New York City, heart-sick and meary at having to leave the femily I just got back. Even the F.B.I. refused to help be in Cincinneti. 




A. Contemplated Interview With OSCAR VAGO

During the latter part of August, 1960, NY T-1 related that

HARRY GOLD, a confessed Soviet espionage agent, is presently in prison.

According to the informant.



On September 20 and 27, 1950, OSCAR JOHN VAGO appeared before the Federal Grand Jury, Southern District of New York, for questioning concerning his relationship with ABRAHAM BROTHMAN and HARRY GOLD. VAGO was subsequently indicted for perjury. VAGO waived jury trial and was found guilty by United States District Court Judge SYLVESTER J. RYAN on June 20, 1952. He was given a three-year suspended sentence and placed on three years probation.

"The Shameful Years; 30 Years of Soviet Espionage in the United States," prepared and released by the Committee on Un-American Activities, United States House of Representatives, Washington, D.C., December 30, 1951, stated that ABRAHAM BROTHMAN was arrested on July 29, 1950, by the FBI on charges of obstructing justice. Investigation had disclosed that in 1941, an employee of the Amtorg Trading Corporation, (ATC), a registered Russian trade agency in the United States, arranged a meeting between BROTHMAN and HARRY GOLD, at which time, the three discussed the type of information that both were to secure for the Soviets. GOLD later testified that a Russian official told him that BROTHMAN was performing for Russia what was equivalent to the efforts of at least one, and possibly more, Soviet Army Brigades. BROTHMAN was subsequently tried, found guilty, and sentenced to seven years in prison for obstruction of justice.

BETHE, Cornell University, Laboratory of Nuclear Studies Ithaca, New York January 19, 1961 First class

During a permissive search of the residence of ALFRED SARANT, Rural Delivery Number 1, Ithaca, New York, in connection with the investigation of the JULIUS ROSENBERG espionage network on July 21, 1950, SAS JOHN D. MAHONEY and PETER F. MAXSON located information reflecting that a gift had been received by SARANT and his wife upon the birth of their son, JEREMY, from Doctor HANS BETHE and his wife.

SARANT, who flid the United States, entering Mexico at Hermosillo on August 9, 1950, advised during an interview in July, 1950, that he had known HANS BETHE since July, 1946 when he, SARANT, was interested in entering Cornell University as a graduate student in physics. SARANT said he was unsuccessful in his attempts to enter the graduate school, but maintained a social acquaintanceship with Doctor BETHE, who was on the faculty.

On July 28, 1950, Doctor BETHE, who was instrumental in the development of the A-Bomb during World War II, advised SAs WILLIAM C. TOWER and ROBERT M. MAC NAMARA that he never discussed any confidential data with SARANT and further denied that he ever entertained SARANT in his home or was ever in SARANT's home.

He denied that any approach, in any manner, had ever been made to him on the part of any person to furnish information to an apparent espionage agent.

On February 14, 1950, after the arrest of EMIL JULIUS KLAUS FUCHS in England on charges of espionage activity on behalf of the Russian Government, BETHE was interviewed by SA MAXSON, at which time, he said he had been a close associate and friend of FUCHS, first meeting him in England in 1934. He said that in 1944, he, BETHE, was in charge of the division at Los Alamos which performed the calculations as to how the Atom Bomb was to be made and assembled and how it would work. During this time, FUCHS worked under BETHE from mid-1944 until January, 1946, when BETHE left.

He said FUCHS visited him at Schenectady, New York, where he, BETHE, worked for General Electric in June or July, 1946. He said he had seen FUCHS twice since then, once in England during the summer of 1948 and during the spring of 1948 or 1949 when FUCHS, at BETHE's invitation, visited him in Ithaca. BETHE said he never had any reason to suspect FUCHS of espionage or even consider him to be pro-Russian. He also considered FUCHS as absolutely loyal and trustworthy.

On July 2, 1951, DAVID GREENGLASS, a confessed Soviet espionage agent, advised SAS JOHN A. HARRINGTON and ROBERT F. ROYAL that he furnished the name of Doctor HANS BETHE, among others, to HARRY GOLD on June 4, 1945 as a possible Soviet espionage recruit. GREENGLASS said he had never mot BETHE, who was then (1945) connected with the Atomic Energy Commission project at Los Alamos, New Mexico.

HARRY GOLD has advised that he gave a list which included BETHE's name to ANATOLE A. YAKOVLEV, the Vice Consul of the Soviet Consulate in New York City.







SCHMEIR desired to interview HEINEMAN regarding his knowledge of the principals in the ROSENBERG case. He also expressed to HEINEMAN, at this time, his belief that the ROSENBERGs were unjustly convicted and his suspicion that HARRY GOLD was a pathological liar.

HEINEMAN informed SCHMEIR that he had no comment to make on the ROSEMBERG case and MAHAN has instructed HEINEMAN to decline comment in the event any future contact by SCHMEIR is made.

BROTHMAN and Associates of 114 East 32nd Street, New York City: ABRAHAM BROTHMAN, Chief Engineer of this firm, furnished, according to Washington T-3, an informant of known reliability and self-confessed courier of a Communist underground group in the late 1930's and early 1940's, industrial blueprints in 1940 to JACOB GOIOS, a Soviet agent who is now deceased. I was reviewed at this time for Resembing Reference is made to the report of SA FRANCIS J. GALLANT dated September 9, 1949 at New York City re ABRAHAM PROTHMAN, Security Matter-C(New ... York File 100-95068).

It is noted that ELIZABETH T. BENTLEY identified a photograph of BROTHMAN as the individual who was introduced to her by JACOB GOLOS in May 1940. BENTLEY further stated that she met BROTHMAN on approximately ten occasions during 1940 receiving various blueprints from him for GOLOS.

As further reflected in the same report on December 28, 1945, BROTH-MAN and one MARIAN MARKOWITZ met with an unknown man who was later identified as HARRY SLAVIN, 510 West 112th Street, New York City. Subsequent investigation has indicated that SLAVIN has been in further contact with BROTHMAN. It was also noted that a mail cover placed on BROTHMAN revealed that on January 4, 1946 he received a letter from H. SLAVIN, 510 West 112th Street, New York City.

As further reflected in SA GALLANT's report, BROTHMAN alleged that Agents of the Bureau questioned him as to his interest and activities in the Jewish Agency for Palestine and that in relation to this matter BROTHMAN was represented by one MACHIN SERNSTEIN, an attorney at 20 Pine Street, New York City. BERNSTEIN is probably identical with NAHUMA BERNSTEIN who is listed in MARTINDALE HUBBEL as a member of the firm of SILVER and BERNSTEIN, 20 Pine Street, New York City.

The following additional information concerning SLAVIN and his contacts with BROTHMAN is reflected in the report of SA JOHN T. HILSBOS dated August 16, 1946 at New York City and entitled GREGORY, Espionage - R.

has reported that on several occasions BROTHMAN was in contact with one HARRY SLAVIN and it was thought that SLAVIN was working for AMTORG or conducting negotiations with BROTHMAN for AMTORG. photograph of a letter dated July 19, 1946 was furnished which was addressed to Mr. SLAVIN, Apartment 8-A, 510 West 112th Street, New York City. This letter is unsigned and reflected that there was a bill from SYNTRON requesting \$18.60 and SLAVIN is kindly asked to forward his check so that payment could be made of it. It is possible that BROTHMAN sent that letter to SLAVIN inasmuch as it was furnished by a confidential source having access to BROTHMAN's office.





Re Syracuse teletype June 11, 1950, in instant matter, the New York files reflect the following information regarding JACOB GOLOS:

ELIZABETH TERRILL BENTLEY was introduced to JACOSXCELOS as TIM" in 1938-1939. COLOS was Secretary of WORLD TOURIST INC. as of 1940. According to RENTLEY, GOLOS operated as the head of an espionage group in Washington, p. C., from 1938 to 1943. GOLOS died in New York City on November 27, 1943.

GOLOS introduced ABE BROTHMAN to BENTLEY in May 1940. Selective Service records reveal that in 1940 BROTHMAN resided at 41-08 - 42nd Street, Long Island City, New York, telephone number Ironsides 6 - 7769. BROTHMAN is described as: Born August 15, 1913, New York City; 5' 82"; 165 lbs.; brown eyes; brown hair; light complexion; married, wife NAOMI.

In connection with the investigation of GAIK BY OVAKIMIAN, known Soviet espionage agent, a surveillance was instituted in December 1940. On January 18, 1941, OVAKIMIAN contacted a person identified as JACOB GOLOS. There were several subsequent contacts on the part of these two individuals until May 5, 1941, when OVAKIMIAN was arrested by Agents of the New York Office. They made no contacts after the arrest. OVAKINIAN departed from the United States on July 23, 1941.

BENTLEY advised that FRED ROSE, subject in the CORBY case, spent about ten days in New York City in 1943, shortly before GOLOS' death. Most of this time was spent with GOLOS.

The true name of GOLOS was JACOB MAISIN. He was known to WILLIAM REMINGTON and MARY PRICE as JOHN; and to ROBERT MILLER as JOHN FRIEDMAN. REMINGTON, PRICE, and MILLER figured in the investigation of the SILVERMASTER case. GCLOS was also known in 1922-1924 as "DAVIS". GOLOS was born in Russia and was 33 years of age in 1924. He was a printer by trade.

As per New York teletype of June 12, 1950, captioned "HARRY GOLD, was; ESPIONAGE - R", two photographs of OVAKIMIAN are attached for the Philadelphia Office to display to GOID.

There are attached for the Syracuse Resident Agency two photographs of COLOS and two photographs of OVAKIMIAN for possible use in the interview of SLACK.

It is to be noted that OVAKIMIAN has a Doctor of Chemistry degree. He was born in Russia; was 42 years of age in 1941; 5' 4"; 163 lbs.; medium to stocky build; brown or black hair, wavy, some gray; complexion, swarthy ruddy; eyes, brown or blue; nationality, Russian-Armenian; speech, thick, slightly broken.

Referenced New York teletype indicated that the possibility exists that OVAKINIAN recruited RICHARD MATERIGGS and ALFRED DEAN SLACK. In this connection, it is particularly noted that OVAKIMIAN is a Doctor of Chemistry and BRIGGS and SLACK were chemists.

It is to be noted further that OVAKIMIAN was employed at AMTORG TRADING CORPORATION at the same time as SEMEN/SEMENOV.

In an interview with GOLD and display of OVAKIMIAN'S photograph, the possibility of OVAKIMIAN being identical with unknown subject FRED" is to be considered. With the exception of the description of "FRED" as wearing a moustache, the descriptions of OVAKIMIAN and "FRED" are fairly similar.

Reference is also made to Albany letter dated June 12, 1950, re instant matter, wherein it is noted that COLD stated that PAVEL PETROVICH MIKHATIOV might be an individual to whom he turned over information in either Buffalo, Syracuse, or Rochester. Attached is a photograph of MIKHATIOV as requested.

Mr. HERNSTEIN advised that his client, in the interest of whose behalfs he appeared, was considerably disturbed by the activities in this regard. Subsequently, Special Agent In Charge, EDWARD SCHEIDT of the New York Office, contacted NACHIM BERNSTEIN, the attorney at 20 Pine Street, New York, New York, and advised him that at no time during the interview with ABRAHAM AROTHMAN had Special Agents of this Bureau, by implication or otherwise, indicated that they were investigating the Jewish Agency. Mr. BERNSTEIN at that time indicated that he appreciated having the record straightened out in this matter.

Began as reporter with "New York Globe"; connected with R.H. Macy and Company, 1910-1913; served US Navy as Ensign, 1917-1918; assistant editor "New York Globe", 1919-1920; member New York Senate. 1921-1926; former president NATHAN STRAUS-Duparquet Incorporated; administrator, United States Housing Authority in charge of \$200,000,000. public housing program, 1937-1942; president, Radio Station ACA.

Numerous references are contained in the files of this office to NATHAM STRAUS, inasmuch as it appears that he has been in public life for several years. However, there is no derogatory information concerning him, in the files.

HERBERT R. SIMONDS, listed above as a former employer of BOCKER, is a consulting engineer with offices at 551 Fifth Avenue, New York City.


ABRAHAU BROTHMAN, who was convicted in the Southern District of New York in 1950 for obstruction of justice, was interviewed on several occasions during May and June 1950. During the course of one of these interviews BROTHMAN stated that in 1943 he "ghosted" a section of a book entitled "Handbook of Plastics" for one HERBERT R SIMONS. BROTHMAN stated that SIMONDS at that time wanted BROTHMAN to develop a process known as "hotsetting" phenol-formaldehyde glues for the Chinese government. BROTHMAN stated that he completed the above work for SIMONDS and that it constituted a portion of the book "Handbook of Plastics".




Confidential Informant T-5, of known reliability, advised on December 28, 1945 that LAUCHLIN CERFIE had received a letter sometime during the preceding months from SIMONDS. AELIZABETH T. BENTLEY, self-confessed former Soviet espionage courier, has previously stated that she understood that CURRIE was associated with a group of Soviet espionage agents operating in Jashington, DC in the early 1940s.



It is interesting to note, that BOOKER probably took this action in requesting a new passport in order that German authorities would not be aware of her previous travel to Russia, and assuming that the statements of and GOLOS are correct, such a passport indicating previous travel in Russia would endanger BOOKER'S espionage activities in Germany.

With reference to derogatory information concerning NILTON YUSEM, it is noted that T-6, of known reliability, on June 28, 1952, advised that an anonymous letter, postmarked from New York City had been received and that this letter stated that NILTON YUSEM, had been received and that this letter stated that time employed by the former address New York City, who was at that time employed by the Westinghouse Electric Corporation at Pittsburgh, Pa., had openly Westinghouse Electric Corporation at Pittsburgh, was a Communist, bragged to the writer of the letter that he, YUSEM, was a Communist, and that YUSEM was very sympathetic to Communist ideas and very antagonistic to American ideas.

It is noted that in a Personnel Security Questionnaire executed by YUSEM in connection with possible employment with the Atomic Energy Commission, YUSEM listed employment by Erothman and Associates, Queens, New York, in 1945, as a chemist.

It will be noted that the records of this concern are no longer in existence and that ABRAHAN BROTHMAN, President of the

firm, has been convicted of conspiracy to obstruct justice and obstruction of justice.

JULES KORCHIEN, Pacific Palisades, California, has advised that he was former partner of BROTHMAN and that the name MILTON YUSEM seemed familiar to him. He recalled being requested at one time to appear before the Federation of Architects, Engineers, Chemists, and Technicians (FAECT) because of a complaint by YUSEM based on money matters.

It is noted that on page 151 of the book "A Story of the CIO" by BENJAMIN STOLBERG appears the following: "Only four CIO Unions are under complete control of STALINIST officials. They are the Federation of Architects, Engineers, Chemists, and Technicians

During the course of the trial of ABRAHAN EROTHMAN in the Southern District of New York, ELIZABETH FENTLEY, an admitted Soviet Agent, testified that she acted as a courier in receiving information from EROTHMAN and transmitted same to her Soviet espionage superior, JACOB GOLOS, during 1951.

Also during BROTHMAN's trial, HATRY GOLD, convicted espionage agent, testified that in about September, 1941, he received instructions from his Soviet espionage superior, SEMEN SEMENOV, to contact an individual in New York City to obtain information. Upon making this contact, GOLD learned that the individual he saw was AERAHAM this contact, GOLD stated that he subsequently received various information, much of which related to chemical processes from BROTHMAN.

HARRY GOLD has further advised that he first met MILTON YUSEN at BROTHMAN's laboratory in New York in the Summer of 1945. GOLD said that he could not prove that YUSEN is a Communist, but he is convinced that he is one.

According to GOLB, YUSEM was discharged from the Brothman organization, and subsequent thereto, BROTHMAN was called before the FAECT for a hearing. For some reason or other the matter was taken up by a Communist Party disciplinary committee and though GOLD was unable to say what transpired at this meeting, it was his understanding that BROTHMAN was required to pay some back salary to YUSEM. GOLD stated, however, that it was his impression that the committee considers matters only when the parties involved are all Communist.

GOLD stated that on one occasion, the circumstances of which he could not recall, either ABC BROTHMAN or MIRIAD MOSKOWITZ, both Communists, according to GOLD, told him that YUSEN was a Communist.

It is noted that the Communist Party has been cited by the Attorney General of the United States as an organization which aims to overthrow the Government of the United States by unconstitutional means, under Executive Order 9835.

On March 7, 1952 Confidential Informant T-4 advised that "TANIA" TADWA graduated in September, 1950 from a Western college or university, possibly the University of Minnesota. This same Informant noted that on October 8, 1951 "TANIA" PADWA registered a change of address from Woodstock, New York to 600 West 114th Street, New York City, c/o HEYWORTH.

It is noted that the files of the New York Office contain no record of TATIANA PADWA.

The New York City telephone directory lists EDWIN HEYWORTH as a resident at 600 West 114th Street, New York City, telephone number Monument 2-6875.

Confidential Informant T-8, of known reliability, advised in 1946 that "EDWIN HEYWORTH, MO 2-6875" was included in a list of contacts of JULES-KORCHIEN.

Confidential Informant T-9, of known reliability, furnished in 1946 a copy of the 1943 Communist Party Membership Book issued on December 1, 1942 to JULES KORCHIEN, New York, New York, from Branch C-11.

Confidential Informant T-10, of known reliability, in 1945 furnished an address book known to have been in the possession of ABRAHAM BROTHMAN. Included in this address book was "EDWIN HEYWORTH, Mon 2-6875".


With respect to ABRAHAM BROTHMAN, it is noted that in signed statements dated July 11, 12 and 13, 1950 furnished to SAS T. SCOTT MILLER and RICHARD E. BRENNAN, HARRY GOLD, a self-confessed Soviet espionage courier, advised that he first met ABRAHAM BROTHMAN on instructions from his Soviet espionage superior, SEMEN SEMENOV, in 1941. From then until sometime in 1944 BROTHMAN furnished GOLD with technical information for transmission to the Soviet Union.

On July 29, 1950 ABRAHAN BROTHMAN and MIRIAM MOSKOWITZ (a business associate of BROTHMAN) were indicted by the Federal Grand Jury of the Southern District of New York on a charge of

obstructing justice in that they, together with HARRY GOLD (who was not named as a defendant in the indictment), agreed upon a fictitious explanation of their association with each other and divers other persons for the furtherance of this conspiracy. BROTHMAN and GOLD appeared before the Federal Grand Jury in July, 1947. BROTHMAN and MOSKOWITZ were brought to trial in the Southern District of New York on November 8, 1950 and were found guilty.

It is noted that JULES KORCHIEN, previously mentioned, was also at one time a business associate of ABRAHAM BROTHMAN.



#### D. Residences

As previously noted, the subject arrived in the United States on November 4, 1932. At the time of his arrival the subject stated that his last permanent residence was in Berlin.

On April 14, 1933 he advised the Immigration and Naturalization Service that his residence abroad was 26 Lennuki, Tallinn, Estonia, and that his current address was 16 West 55th Street, New York City, where he lived with his wife, ALEKSANDRA.

As of October 20, 1933 and May 10, 1934 his residence is listed as being 246 West 73rd Street, New York City.

On March 21, 1935 ALEKSANDRA PADWA listed her address as being 246 West 73rd Street, New York City, Apartment 3-A.



INTERVIEW WITH HARRY GOLD, NO. 19312-NE, BY INVESTIGATORS FOR THE SENATE PERHAHENT SUB-COMMITTEE ON INVESTIGATIONS OF THE COMMITTEE ON GOVERNMENT OPERATIONS.

After a short intermission following their interview with Greenglass, the investigators started their talk with Harry Gold, No. 19312-RE, with the same parties present except Atturney C. John Rogge.

They advised Gold that they had been requested by Senator Jenner to get a statement from him (Gold) relative to his knowledge of one Shura Swan (also known as Alexander Swenjonski or venchenski) who had been dismissed from the United Mations, cleared by the U. N. Internal Security Committee and not re-hired by the Secretary-General of the U. N. It appears that Shura Swan is making a money claim of considerable proportions against the United States. Gold stated he would be glad to make a statement of his recollections of the man. He then dictated a statement, copy of which is attached. When he had finished he stated he was sure there was one more *occasion" but he could not recall the details. The interviewers were satisfied with the statement as given so he 65-61685-430 signed it and ande onth as to its trath.

He was asked if he had knowledge of the espionage activities in connection with the Fort Monmouth affair. He said he had not as he had no connection with or information on the group which was carrying on this work. The interviewers accepted this statement without question and seemed convinced of its truth from information already a matter of record.

The interviewers were allowed to take the statement

The interviewers were allowed to take the statement with them after copies had been made for our files. The total time consumed by this interview did not exceed fifteen to twenty minutes.

The following afternoon, Friday, October 30, 1953, Harry Gold red ested to see me. Upon being called for intertiew he said he now recalled the other "occasion" and would like to make a supplement to his statement of Thursday, October 29, 1953, setting it forth. He was allowed to do so, signed it and took oath to its truth. The original of this supplement was mailed to Mr. Roy Cohn in New York. A copy is attached hereto.

Statement by Harry Gold

October 29, 1953

Harry Gold being duly sworn states:

I heard of Shura Swan from a man called Abraham Bothman

Brothman was one of my sources of information for the Soviet Espionage Organization of which I was a courier. I met Brothman in Sept. of 1941. About a half year after that Brothman first mentioned Shura Swan. Brothman said that it was Shura Swan who had introduced him to Soviet Espionage work. At a somewhat later date Brothman complained to me of the base ingratitude of the Soviet Espionage set up-He said that during a slack period, Swan, who was working for Amtorg, had been laid off. On a third occasion Brothman told me that he had met Swan through his wife (Brothman's wife) Naomi.

Sometime in either 1942 or 1943 Abe Brothman asked me to request of my Sowiet Superior that a job be obtained at amtorg for Shura Swan; this man who was my "boss" at that time I knew only as blam" but I have since identified him as Semen Markovich Semenov, an employee of Amtorg and also an espionage agent. It old Sam of Brothman's request—the Russian flew into a rage and said: "Tell Brothman to keep his nose out of other peoples business! And as for you, you mind yours too! We know all about this Shura Swan".



JACK SOBLE is a known Soviet agent and the principal subject in the Mocase.





Atterney General J. Howard McGrath and J. Edgar Hoover, Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, announced the arrest today of Abraham Brothman, age 30, and Miriam Moskowitz, age 34, by FBI Agents, on charges of obstructing justice. The arrests were made in the vicinity of Cliffwood, New Jersey.

Mr. Hoover identified Brothman, a Chemical Engineer, as an associate of Harry Gold, arrested by the FBI on May 23, 1950, on charges of espionage. He said that, according to Gold, the two men first met in connection with Gold's espionage activities in 1:41. This mosting, which occurred on a New York street, was preurranged by Semen M. Semenou, an official of Amtorg Trading Corporation, them serving as head of this particular Soviet espionage network. Joid and Brothman later conferred with Semenou, known to Gold as "Sam," concerning information of value the men were to secure for the Loviet Government. later employed by Brothman as a chemist until June. 1948.

Both Brothman and Jold testified before the Federal Grand Jury in New York in July, 1947, that they met each other through Jacob Golos, a deceased Soviet espionage agent. Gold has said he testified to this meeting at the insistence of Brothman, who told Gold they must make their "stories" consistent. Prior to testifying, the two men painstakingly went over their prepared story time and again while walking the atreets in the neighborhood of Brothman's home one morning before down In June, 1948, at the time Gold severed his employment with the firm headed by Brothman, the latter admonished him, soid Gold to

"tell the same story you did before," whenever asked concerning their original meeting. Brothman had previously told Gold that the Soviet Union was the early country conducting a true fight against fascism. According to Gold, a Russian official in commending Brothman told him that his work for the Soviet Union was equal to the efforts of one or two brigades of men.

Abraham Brethman was born August 15, 1913, in New York City, attended De Witt Clinton high school and was graduated from Columbia University in 1933, after specializing in Accountancy and Chemical Engineering. He was married on June 15, 1947, and has two children. He resides at 41-08 42nd Street, Sunnyside, Long Island, New York.

Prior to 1942, Brothman operated the Republic Chemical Machinery Company, 114 East 32nd Street, New York City. He was associated thereafter with various firms engaged in design work until August, 1944, when he established his own firm, Abraham Brothman and Associates, Consulting Engineers, now located at 29-28 41st Avenue, Long Island City, New York. The company maintains a laboratory at 85-03 57th Avenue, Elmhurst, Long Island, New York. It was at this laboratory Harry Gold was employed subsequent to February, 1946.

Miss Moskowitz was bern June 10, 1916, at Bayonne, New Jersey. She graduated from the City College of New York in 1942, and from 1942 until 1944 was employed by the Far Men Power Commission in New York City. She occupied the position of Secretary to Abraham Brothman for a number of years and was later associated as a partner with Brothman's firm.

The arrest of Brothman was based upon a bench warrant tosued by the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York following the return of a scaled indictment charging Brothman and Miss Moskowitz with violation of Section 241, Title 18, 1946 Edition, V. S. Code (Obstruction of Justice)

In accordance with Bureau instructions, BERNARD SCHUSTER was reinterviewed on 5/5/53 by SA ALBERT J. KLEIN and SA ARNOLD E. BRANDT, who Feonducted the initial interview with the subject on 3/23/53 concerning which on the Bureau was advised by referenced New York letter of 3/30/53.

At 4:20 pm on 5/5/53, the above-mentioned Agents waited for SCHUSTER at the intersection of Berry and North 7th Streets, Brooklyn, New York, which is on the subject's regular route from his place of employment to the BMT subway station at Bedford Avenue and North 7th Street. As the subject approached the waiting Agents, he recognized them and, smiling wryly, shook his head in a negative manner. He immediately stated that he had no desire to speak to the Agents and that as he recognized them, his first impulse was to brush by them without saying anything, but he decided that such behavior would not be "polite," which was his only reason for stopping.

The state of the s He was advised that the Agents were interested in determining if he had considered the points brought up in the previous discussion and had changed his attitude. SCHUSTER declared that he had not changed his mind about furnishing any information to the Bureau.

SCHUSTER reiterated his assertion that if he had any information involving the security of this country, he would willingly give it to the FBI. However, he had no such information, and stated that he did not consider . information concerning his prior activities in the Communist Party as affecting this country's security.

SCHUSTER was advised that during the previous interview, he had been questioned about persons the FBI was interested in about whom he could recall nothing. It was suggested that perhaps photographs would refresh his

SCHUSTER expressed willingness to view the photographs, whereupon a picture of ABRAHAM BROTHMAN was exhibited to him. SCHUSTER studied the picture carefully, but denied recognizing it. He was then advised that this was ABRAHAM BROTHMAN'S picture, but the subject denied having met or recalling that he had ever even heard of BROTHMAN.

A picture of JULIUS ROSENBERG was then exhibited. After looking at this picture briefly, SCHUSTER stated that he recognized the picture as JULIUS ROSENBERG from having seen the ROSENBERGS' photographs in the newspapers. He denied any recollection of having met or heard of ROSENBERG except in the news.

It was pointed out that in his Communist Party functions in connection with finances, SCHUSTER collected the dues of so-called "members at large," which were persons who were members of the Communist Party but who were not assigned to any branch or section. SCHUSTER was specifically asked if ROSENBERG could have been such a "member at large" and could have paid dues to SCHUSTER. SCHUSTER admitted that he had collected dues of "members at large," but insisted that he did not necessarily contact such people personally. He said it was customary for someone to give him a sum of money and to tell him that this money was the dues of so many "members at large" and SCHUSTER would execute a receipt to "Cash." In some cases, the names were mentioned, but SCHUSTER dould not recall any names. The subject implied that there was a remote possibility that ROSENBERG could have paid dues in this manner, but that if it were so, SCHUSTER could not recall it and certainly did not know anything about any Party members who were involved in espionage.

The matter of ELIZABETH BENTLEY'S accusations concerning the subject was then brought up. The brief mention of "BERNEY SHUSTER" which appears on page 272 of Miss BENTLEY'S book, "Out of Bondage," was discussed in detail. In this passage Miss BENTLEY tells of meeting the subject on 13th Street near Communist Party Headquarters and says that he appeared nervous and upset and complained about the manner in which the American Communists he had turned over for spy work were being returned to the Communist Party as nervous wrecks.

SCHUSTER denied that this incident ever occurred and scoffed at the idea that he had ever appeared nervous, stating that he was not an "hysterical" person. He admitted that he knew BENTLEY slightly and had visited the World Tourist Office operated by JACOB GOLOS, pointing out that his trip to France in 1938 had been arranged through GOLOS' agency. He said that he wished to point out that he had no present knowledge of any activities he felt would be of interest to the Government, and that in any case he would not speak of any of his prior associates or acquaintances since it was against his principles.

The subject was asked if he knew ABRAHAM BROTHMAN. SCHUSTER denied that he had ever even heard of this individual.

It is noted that according to Confidential Informant T-7, of known reliability, ABE BROTHMAN was a Communist Party member at large", responsible to SCHUSTER during the war years. (BROTHMAN was convicted on November 22, 1950 in the USDC, SDNY, for obstruction of justice in furnishing false information as to his relationship with HARRY GOLD, self-confessed Soviet espionage agent).

Further, with regard to BROTHMAN, T-7 advised that in 1948, BROTHMAN, in a speech had attacked the Party leadership and had defended EARL BROWDER, deposed general secretary, as a result of which he found himself in trouble with the Communist Party. In the spring, 1949 JULES KORCHWIN, a former business associate of BROTHMAN, and

asked the subject to intercede on behalf of

SCHUSTER explained to the informant his willingness to intercede on behalf of BROTHMAN because BROTHMAN was one of the top plastic chemists in the United States, and that he had contributed substantially to the Communist Party. The informant further recalled that SCHUSTER told him that BROTHMAN was jittery all the time and cited an incident which occurred in 1944 or 1945 when a photographic bulb went off in a restaurant during the course of a meeting between SCHUSTER and BROTHMAN,

at which meeting SCHUSTER had received something from BROTHMAN. According to the informant, SCHUSTER said that BROTHMAN was very worried that the meeting had been photographed.

The subject was asked if he knew NATHAN GREGORY SILVERMASTER or JOSEPH KATZ. The subject refused to comment specifically, pointing out that he would not affirm or deny any knowledge concerning any names mentioned, since he had previously indicated that it was against his principles.

SCHUSTER was then asked if he would affirm or deny association with JACOB BOLOS, inasmuch as ELIZABETH T. BENTLEY (self-confessed Soviet espionage agent), had mentioned such an association in her book; "Out of Bondage."

SCHUSTER replied that of course he knew GOLOS, in connection with Communist Party activities, since GOLOS was on a higher committee at the "National Level" while he operated in a similar capacity at the "State Level,"

The subject would not elaborate on this further, except to say that at about this time he, SCHUSTER, was "Membership Director" and that sometimes GOLOS would ask for breakdowns of the makeup of the membership in nationality groups and other such statistical matters. The subject categorically denied any espionage connection with GOLOS or any knowledge of alleged espionage activity on the part of GOLOS. He further stated that he had read Miss BENTLEY's book wherein he was mentioned.

This reference appears on page 272 of "Out of Bondage" and mentions BENTLEY's meeting with the subject and his statement to her that he was disturbed over the way the espionage contacts he had turned over were being returned to the Party,

SCHUSTER scoffed at Miss BENTLEY's allegations, denied having furnished Communist Party personnel for espionage, said that Miss BENTLEY was confused on the part involving him, and reiterated his denial of knowledge of GOLOS' espionage activities.

The matter of the subject's association with JOSEPH KATZ was again brought up and it was pointed out to the subject that KATZ' wife, as BESSIE BOGORAD, had appeared as a witness on his 1938 passport application. The subject passed this off with the remark that on passport applications one used "whoever was available" and "whoever had the time."

It is noted that JOSEPH KATZ has been identified by ELIZABETH T. BENTLEY, HARRY GOLD, and THOMAS J. BLACK, all admitted former Soviet espionage agents, as a Soviet agent.

The subject was then asked to explain various enterprises with which he had been involved. He claimed that all of his business ventures were just exactly that, were entirely legitimate and had no connection with the Communist Party. He was asked if that statement included the National Mercantile and Trading Company, and what had happened to that firm. He said that this was a legitimate export business; that he had not been successful in it; that all the money in it was his own, and that in view of a lack of success he had dissolved it. He was then asked about his association with Screenmakers, Inc. He inisisted that his interest in this concern was very small and not more than three or four hundred dollars, and that it was in the nature of an investment of his own funds.

On May 5, 1953, the subject was again inter-viewed by SA ALBERT J. KLEIN and the writer while walking along the street in the vicinity of his employment. this occasion the subject advised that his first impulse upon recognizing the agents was to brush by them without saying anything, but he decided that such behavior would not be "polite", which was his only reason for stopping. He was advised that the agents were interested in determining if he had considered the points brought up in the previous discussion, and had changed his attitude. SCHUSTER declared that he had not changed his mind about furnishing any information to the Bureau. He reiterated his assertion that 1f he had any information involving the security of this country, he would willingly give it to the FBI, however, he had no such information, and stated that he would not consider information concerning his prior activities in the Communist Party as effecting this country's security.

SCHUSTER was advised that during the previous interview, he had been questioned about persons in whom the FBI was interested, and about whom he could recall nothing. It was suggested that perhaps photographs would refresh his recollection.

SCHUSTER expressed willingness to view these photographs, whereupon a picture of ABRAHAM BROTHMAN was exhibited to him. The subject studied the picture carefully, but denied recognizing same. He was then advised that this was ABRAHAM BROTHMAN's picture, but the subject denied having met, or recalling that he had even heard of BROTHMAN.

It was pointed out to the subject that in his Communist Party functions in connection with finances SCHUSTER collected the dues of so-called "members at large", made up of persons who were members of the Communist Party, but who were not assigned to any branch or section. SCHUSTER admitted that he had collected dues of "members at large" but insisted that he did not necessarily contact such people personally. He said that it was customary


### Mrs. CLARA LEET

In 1950 in the Southern District Federal Court of New York ABRAHAM BROTHMAN was convicted on a charge of obstruction of justice in connection with the investigation of HARRY GCLD, self-admitted Soviet espionage agent. In December, 1950, during supplementary proceedings relative to his arguments for release on bail pending his appeal, BROTHMAN furnished information along with a list of names of persons who had contributed to his bail fund. This list reflected that ABRAHAM RESIKA had contributed \$500 to BROTHMAN's bail fund.

RESIKA was interviewed by Bureau Agents during the investigation of this bail fund. On the occasion of this interview RESIKA advised that he had loaned \$500 to CLARA LEET, 161 East 96th Street, New York City, which he stated he under-

stood as to be turned over to NAOMI BROTHMAN, wife of ABRA-HAM HOTHMAN. RESIKA exhibited a note dated August 30, 1950, MY. signed by CLARA LEET in the amount of 500.

CLARA LEET, upon interview, stated that NAOMI BROTH-MAN, who is her close relative, had asked for a loan of 500 for her husband's bail fund. MILTON YUSEM

The above individual was born on April 14, 1918, at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. He is employed by Westinghouse at Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, and the request for his clearance was withdrawn on October 5, 1951.

In his PSQ, YUSEM lists employment by Brothman & Associates, Queens, New York, in 1945 as a chemist. It will be noted that the records of this concern are no longer in existence, and that ABRAHAM AROTHMAN, president of the firm, has been convicted of conspiracy to estruct justice and obstruction of justice.

JULES MORCHIEN, Pacific Palisades, California, has advised that he was a former partner of BROTHMAN and that the name MILTON YUSEN seemed familiar to him. He recalled being requested at one time to appear before

the Federation of Architects, Engineers, Chemists, and Technicians (FAECT) because of a complaint by YUSEM based on money matters. During the course of the trial of AERAHAM EROTHMAN in the Southern District of New York, ELIZABETH BENTLEY, an admitted Soviet espionage agent, testified that she acted as a courier in receiving information from BROTHMAN and transmitted same to her Soviet espionage superior, JACOB GOLOS, during 1941.

Also during BROTHMAN's trial, HARRY GOLD, convicted espionage agent, testified that in about September 19h1, he received instructions from his Soviet espionage superior, SEMENISEMENOV, to contact an individual in New York City to obtain information. Upon making this contact, GOLD learned that the individual he saw was ABRAHAM EROTHMAN. GOLD stated that subsequently he received various information, much of which related to chemical processes, from BROTHMAN.

HARRY GOLD has further advised that he first met MILTON YUSEM at EROTHMAN's laboratory in New York in the summer of 1945. GOLD said that he could not prove that YUSEN is a Communist but he is convinced that he is one.

After YUSEM was discharged from the BROTHMAN organization, BROTHMAN was called before the FAECT for a hearing. For some reason or other, the matter was taken up by a Communist Party disciplinary committee. GOLD was unable to say what transpired at this meeting although it was his understanding that BROTHMAN was required to pay some back salary. GOLD said, however, that it was his impression that the committee considers matters only when the parties involved are all Communists. GOLD stated that of one occasion the circumstances of which he could not recall, either ABE BROTHMAN or MIRIAM MOSKOWITZ, both Communists, according to GOLD, told him that YUSEM was a Communist.

San Francisco T-193, of known reliability, has advised that the Communist Party disciplinary committee considers matters only when all parties involved are Communist Party members.

San Francisco T-19h, of unknown reliability, stated that he had seen the "Daily Worker" with YUSEM's name stenciled on it, indicating that he was on the paper's mailing list. He said that YUSEM had expressed to him his agreement with various articles which appeared in this newspaper.

San Francisco T-195, of known reliability, advised in 1949 that YUSEM's car was parked at the "Deluxe Camp for Adults" at Chestertown, New York, on August 13 and 20, 1949. This camp is also called Crystal Take Lodge and has been known to have been a frequent meeting place for members of the Communist Party.

The "Pittsburgh Courier", dated March 22, 1947, in the column "Horizon" by P. L.\PRATTIS, reflected that during conversations between PRATTIS and the subject, HINDUS said that Russian-American diplomatic relations were haunted by three ghosts; namely, the atomic bomb, the fear of war between the two nations and the conflict between state ownership as fostered by Russia and free enterprise as fostered by the United States. PRATTIS stated "Mr. HINDUS expresses the conviction that most of the unrest in the would could be quieted by putting land in the hands of the small people, that whenever the people have no hold on the land there is unrest and confusion."

Confidential Informant T-25, of known reliability, advised on May 23, 1947 that JULES KORCHIEN conferred with ABRAHAM BROTHMAN who was reported by Confidential Informant T-26, of known reliability, to have been in the Communist espionage apparatus in 1940. Confidential Informant T-25 stated that during the conversation, KORCHIEN requested BROTHMAN to prepare a statement concerning his business and the manufacture of plastics. KORCHIEN informed BROTHMAN that the subject could take this statement to Prague, Czechoslovakia.

was contacted. Confidential Informant T-1 subsequently advised that he had determined from an unimpeachable source that ALEXANDER SVENCHANSKY is identical with SHURA SWAN.


In interviews conducted with HARRY GOLD on August 2, 3, 1950, by Agents of the New York Office, GOLD advised that he first heard the name of SHURA SWAN when ABRAHAM BROTHMAN mentioned that name to him in late March 1942 in New York City. He explained the circumstances surrounding this conversation with BROTHMAN by saying that both of them had registered at the Hotel New Yorker, New York City. He said that as near as he could recall he registered under the name of FRANK KESSLER while BROTHMAN presumably registered under his own name. He said both of them had worked all night to finish a report on Buna-S. He and BROTHMAN were talking and relaxing about 6:00 or 7:00 A.M. the next morning in their hotel.

At this time, according to GOLD, BROTHMAN mentioned that his friend SHURA SWAN, who worked for the Soviet Union, had recently been laid off by them. BROTHMAN gave GOLD the idea at this time that SWAN worked for Amtorg, and also that he was the man who first introduced BROTHMAN to another Amtorg man, not further identified, to engage in industrial espionage. BROTHMAN asked GOLD to see what, if anything, he could do to get SWAN'S job back at Amtorg. GOLD said he told BROTHMAN he would do what he could in this respect.

GOLD recalled that BROTHMAN next mentioned SWAN in late 1942 or early 1943, but BROTHMAN merely mentioned the name with no additional identifiable information concerning him.

GOLD also advised that SWAN'S name next arose in a conversation in about June of 1946 at which time BROTHMAN was berating various Soviet officials in this country for the way they treated Americans working for them. In bringing out this point, BROTHMAN again referred to SWAN'S case. This time BROTHMAN mentioned that SWAN had been "kicked out on his ear" by Amtorg on at least two occasions.

GOLD advised that he got the impression from BROTHMAN at this time that SWAN was definitely a man who was then about 40 years of age, was a naturalized American citizen of Russian extraction, and had been employed at Amtorg but had been released by that organization. GOLD was also positive that BROTHMAN referred to SWAN in all cases by the first name of SHURA, although GOLD was unable to furnish any information as to whether or not SWAN'S first name of SHURA was a nickname or a shorter version of a longer name.



GOLD advised that he never saw SWAN and can recall no further references to SWAN by BROTHMAN other then those set out immediately above.

ALEXANDER SVENCHANSKY was interviewed by the writer and SA JOHN M. 6. COLLINS at his home, 144-58 Village Road, Parkway Village, Jamaica, New York, after efforts to have him come to the New York Office for an interview were unsuccessful. SVENCHANSKY insisted that this interview be conducted in the presence of his attorney, JOSEPH SPENCER, 545 Fifth Avenue, New York City.

After questioning him regarding his background, SVENCHANSKY was asked if he knew BROTHMAN. He immediately stated that he refused to answer this question on the grounds that he did not wish to incriminate himself or anyone else. At this point SPENCER stated that he had advised SVENCHANSKY to give this answer considering his position at the United Nations and since it, therefore, might be incriminating for SVENCHANSKY to admit knowing someone under indictment. SPENCER, however, stated that he would have to consider this question further as to whether he would also give the same advice to SVENCHANSKY if SVENCHANSKY was employed in private industry. SPENCER also said that he assumed the F.B.I. was questioning all the present and past employees of Amtorg to learn of the activities of that organization. It was then pointed out to SPENCER and SVENCHANSKY that this particular interview was only concerned with obtaining information on BROTHMAN from SVENCHANSKY. SPENCER stated that under these circumstances he would like to confer with his client in another room.

After the conference, however, SVENCHANSKY said that he did not desire to change his answer. SVENCHANSKY readily admitted in the interview that he was known to his intimates as SHURA SWAN.

This matter was discussed with IRVING H. SAYPOL, United States Attorney, Southern District of New York, who advised that he would issue a trial suppoens which would be returnable at the start of BROTHMAN'S trial on November 8, 1950.

It is pointed out ABRAHAM BROTHMAN was convicted on Movember 22, 1950, on two counts of an indictment charging BROTHMAN with conspiracy to obstruct justice. MIRIAM MOSKOWITZ was convicted at the same time on one count of an indictment charging her to obstruct justice.


This matter was discussed with IRVING H. SAYPOL, United States Attorney, Southern District of New York, who issued a subpoena calling for the appearance of ALEXANDER SVENCHANSKY in court on November 8, 1950, at the beginning of BROTHMAN'S trial. The subpoena was served on SVENCHANSKY by the United States Marshal on November 8, 1950. In answer to this subpoena, SPENCER contacted Assistant United States Attorney ROY M. COHN, Southern District of New York, and told him that SVENCHANSKY desired to furnish all information in his possession regarding BROTHMAN. Accordingly, arrangements were made with SVENCHANSKY and he was interviewed by SA COLLINS and the writer on November 10, 1950.

In this interview he advised that he first met BROTHMAN in 1937 or 1938 through NAOM BROTHMAN whom he has known for about twenty years. He stated that he met with BROTHMAN and his wife socially about two or three times a year during 1941. He claimed to have had no contact with BROTHMAN or Mrs. BROTHMAN until August, 1950, at which time Mrs. BROTHMAN asked him to contribute to BROTHMAN'S bail fund. SVENCHANSKY stated that he contributed \$500.00 which he borrowed.

According to SVENCHANSKY, after BROTHMAN'S release on bail on September 1, 1950, he contacted SVENCHANSKY and told him that as his defense he wanted to prove that Russia already had what he was supposed to have given them. BROTHMAN asked SVENCHANSKY to translate certain articles for him that appeared in a Russian publication in 1940. According to SVENCHANSKY, this material was on atomic energy. SVENCHANSKY stated that he examined the material at the New York Public Library but only kept the titles of the articles since the articles themselves were very lengthy and technical. He said that he intended to confer further with BROTHMAN on what articles he wanted translated. He claimed that BROTHMAN did not contact him further and that he still had the titles of the articles in his home. He promised to turn this material over to the New York Office.

In this interview, he admitted that he met JACOB GOLOS at Werld Tourist in about 1937 when he bought a ticket for Russia. He denied, however, that he introduced BROTHMAN into Russian espionage. He stated that he did not know that BROTHMAN was a Soviet agent. Further he claimed that he is not at the present time a member of the Communist Party but refused to answer whether he had been a member.





The subpoena was continued by the United States Attorney until November 13, 1950.

On that date SPENCER appeared in court at BROTHMAN'S trial with a doctor's certificate for ALEXANDER SVENCHANSKY from Dr. JOSEPH SHAPIRO, 39-73 47th Street, Sunnyside, New York. According to this certificate, SVENCHANSKY was suffering from pneumonia. This certificate was made an exhibit by the Government.

On this date also Judge IRVING R. KAUFMAN appointed Dr. CHARLES K. FRIEDBERG, 1088 Park Avenue, New York City, to examine SVENCHANSKY. Dr. FRIEDBERG did not substantiate the diagnosis of Dr. SHAPIRO. According to Dr. FRIEDBERG, SVENCHANSKY was merely suffering from a heavy cold and should be available within a few days.

On November 13, 1950, SPENCER furnished the office with the list of articles promised by SVENCHANSKY and mentioned above. These articles originally appeared in a publication entitled "Bulletin De L'Academie Des Science De L'USSR Serie Pysique" published in Moscow in 1940.

Assistant United States Attorney COHN subsequently requested a reinterview with SVENCHANSKY concerning his association with BROTHMAN and his connection with the articles on atomic energy.

SVENCHANSKY was reinterviewed on November 16, 1950, by SA RAYMOND P. WIRTH and the writer in the presence of his wife with the permission of his physician, JOSEPH SHAPIRO.

SVENCHANSKY advised that he was contacted at his place of employment at the United Nations by ABRAHAM BROTHMAN and that they met at a sea food restaurant on 34th Street, across from Pennsylvania Station. He advised that at this meetings BROTHMAN'S wife, NAOMI, and an individual he identified as "a Hindu" were present. SVENCHANSKY advised that he was introduced to the "Hindu" but does not recall his name. SVENCHANSKY reiterated that he had had no contact with BROTHMAN for several years previous to this contact. The "Hindu" is identical with R. V. RAMANI, a chemist employed by Ulster Chemical Company, Cliffwood, New Jersey.

At this meeting BROTHMAN requested SVENCHANSKY to translate the articles and told him what they were about. He gave SVENCHANSKY the range of dates during which these articles appeared as between



1938 and 1941. He advised that BROTHMAN was not specific as to the articles on atomic energy, but merely stated that such articles existed and were published by the Academy of Science on Russian research in atomic energy. He gave SVENCHANSKY no indication as to how he knew of atomic energy. He gave SVENCHANSKY no indication as to how he knew of their existence, and he merely asked SVENCHANSKY as a friend to translate their existence, and made no offer of payment for this work.

SVENCHANSKY advised that he was not subsequently contacted by either ABRAHAM BROTHMAN or his attorney. SVENCHANSKY at this point stated that he "pledged" BROTHMAN never gave him any indication he gave atomic energy information to the U.S.S.R.

DETAILS: At New York City:

The above reference Bureau letter stated that one HANS FREEMAN had recently furnished a letter to URSULA IRENE WASSERMAN, subject in the case entitled, "NATHAN GREGORY SILVERMASTER, was., ET AL; ESPIONAGE - R*, introducing her to CREGORI STEPANIAN, TASS representative in Montevideo, Uruguay. This letter was given to WASSERMAN apparently in February 1946 shortly prior to her departure for Buenos Aires, Argentina. The Bureau letter further stated that HANS FREEMAN of TASS NEWS AGENCY, who furnished this letter of introduction, was probably identical with the subject HARRY FREEMAN, and the Bureau requested that it be definitely established if he were identical.

A review of the case entitled, "NATHAN GREGORY SILVERMASTER, was., ET AL; ESPIONAGE - R", reflects that the letter of introduction referred to above was obtained from a highly confidential source at the time of URSULA WASSERMAN'S departure from the United States on March 1, 1946. The letter was dated February 16, 1946 and was addressed to URSULA WASSERMAN, 110 Christopher Street, New York, New York, and read: "Dear Ursula, Here is that letter of introduction I promised to send you. Unfor tunately I do not know Stepanian's address in Montevideo, but I'm sure that you'll have no trouble locating him. Alth best wishes, " (signed either Hans Freeman or Harry Freeman).

The signature on the above letter, which apparently was interpreted as HANS FREEMAN in the investigation of URSULA WASSERMAN, is undoubtedly the subject, HARRY FREEMAN. This is substantiated by the fact that copies of HARRY FREEMAN's income tax returns in 1941, 1942, and 1943, contained in the New York file, bore signatures which are apparently the same as the signature on the above letter.

A photographic copy of the letter addressed to URSUIA WASSERMAN is being submitted to the FBI laboratory with a request that the laboratory compare the signature on the letter with the known handwriting of HARRY FREEMAN, which was previously submitted to the Bureau for inclusion in the by letter dated August 9, 1944.

A further indication that the subject, HARRY FREEMAN, definitely wrote a letter of introduction for URSULA WASSERMAN, is the fact that a review of the SILVERMASTER case also discloses that Confidential Informant T-1 advised that on April 25, 1946, JULES KORCHIEN, now living in WASSERMAN's apartment, and an associate of ABETROTHMAN, subject in SILVERMASTER case, contacted MARRY FREEMAN and told FREEMAN that the letter he had given to the TASS fellow in Uruguay had been returned by URSULA because of some kind of "fuss" with Custo at Trinidad and KORCHIEN requested FREEMAN to please forward another letter introduction to URSULA at her Montevideo address. FREEMAN told KORCHIEN he would write another letter for URSULA.



Mrs. IRENE DODAL, 781 Eighth Avenue New York City

These typewritten pages were made available to T-7 in the apartment of URSULA WASSERMAN, 110 Christopher Street, New York City.

A photographic copy of a letter was also made available to T-7 which letter was written to JULES KORCHIEN from URSULA WISSERMAN and was dated April 5, 1946. Pertinent parts of the letter are set out below:

"I am sorry about the office difficulties on the various jobs. Will you be able to get someone to take BOB'S place? Say hello to ABE (this is believed to be ABE BROTHMIN) and tell him that I think he is a damn fool if he doesn't accept the Kaiser offer. Couldn't he get a contract that would permit him to keep the current jobs? Is for the other boys (it is possible that WISSERMIN is referring to the Russian sources who previously received BROTHMIN'S information) in the long run he can possibly be more useful to them once he is with Kaiser then he is now. What do you think he should do?"



Confidential Informant T-6 advised that JULES KORCHIEN was a member of the Communist Party, USA and the holder of membership book number 9262-1943.

It should be noted further that JULES KORCHIEN was formerly an associate of ABRIHIM BROTHMIN with Abe Brothman Associates, Inc., 11h East 32 Street, New York City.



It should be noted that one of the permanent addresses listed by DOD.L on Immigration and Naturalization Service records was that of 29 East 11 Street, New York City.

JACOB RONOFF was at that time a business associate of ARTHUR LDLMS. This latter information was obtained from the New York County Clerk's Office which revealed that Business Certificate 11174 was filed on September 24, 1940 by JACOB PROCHES ARONOFF which certificate indicated that he and one ARTHUR DAMS were conducting business under the name of Technological Laboratories, Inc.

ARTHUR DAMS is a suspected aspionage agent who disappeared from the United States during the course of a Bureau espionage investigation and who was the subject of a featured series of articles on espionage running in the "New York Journal" newspaper in November and December of 1945.





on May 16 and 17, 1950, by SAS HAROLD F. BODGE
and GILMER G. ROBINSON during the course of
another investigation conducted by the FBI,
was explained to KORCHIEN that SAS DODGE and
ROBINSON, in connection with an investigation
concerning EMIL JULIUS KLAUS FUCHS, convicted British
scientist, desired to discuss with him the Abraham
Brothman and Associates, Incorporated, 114 East
32nd Street, New York City, the operation of its
laboratory and the personnel associated with that
concern.

KORCHIEN revealed that he first met ABRAHAM BROTHMAN, a well-known chemical engineer, in 1942 in connection with work BROTHMAN and KORCHIEN were performing for the Rufert Chemical Company, Seymour, Connecticut. Approximately one year thereafter, BROTHMAN, KORCHIEN and others set up their own firm, Abraham Brothman and Associates, Incorporated; KORCHIEN's association with BROTHMAN continued on a professional and social basis until KORCHIEN terminated his association with Abraham Brothman and Associates.

Since that time, continued KORCHIEN, he had talked and visited with BROTHMAN at infrequent intervals. KORCHIEN claimed that he had no knowledge of BROTHMAN or any of BROTHMAN's associates engaging in espionage activity; too, during the time he had known BROTHMAN, he had no reason to be suspicious of BROTHMAN and possessed no knowledge of CP membership on the part of ABRAHAM BROTHMAN.

The purpose of this corporation, according to KORCHIEN, was to organize a group of engineers in various chemical fields which would offer manufacturers a well-rounded engineering service and to be in a position to design, equip and operate a chemical manufacturing business.

Concerning his own affiliation with Abraham Brothman and Associates, 114 East 32nd Street, New York City, KORCHIEN said that he did no work for that organization, never received salary, and, throughout his association with the firm, he merely occupied office space on that organization's premises in which he did work of his own; his only benefit had resulted from small payments received for everhead expenses in connection with his office space at 114 East 32nd Street, New York City. In late 1944 or early 11945, when his corporation moved to Queens, New York, he, KORCHIEN, ceased active participation with the business altogether; however, he continued to maintain his office space at the 114 East 32nd Street location and paid the rent for this space, possibly in the name of the corporation rather than in his own name.

HARRY GOLD, an admitted and convicted Soviet espionage agent, advised in 1950 that he was acquainted with JULES KORCHIEN while he, GOLD, and KORCHIEN were with Abraham Brothman and Associates, 114 East 32nd Street, New York City, in about 1946. HARRY GOLD added that ABRAHAM BROTHMAN was engaged in Soviet espinage activities during the early and middle 1940's.

On June 20, 1950, JULES KORCHIEN, 16560 Chattanooga Place, Pacific Palisades, California, advised SAS ROBINSON and DODGE that he did not recall being introduced to HARRY GOLD and that he had no knowledge regarding GOLD or GOLD's activities while associated with Abraham Brothman and Associates or elsewhere. On July 11, 1950, the previously mentioned MARRY BOLD furnished a signed statement to SAS T. SCOTT MILLER and RICHARD E. BRENNAN in which he related the met ABRAHAN BROTHMAN in 1941 at the direction of SEAMEN SEMENOV, his Soviet espionage superior. GOLD said that early in 1942, BROTHMAN furnished to him certain scientific information and some of his own inventions for transmission to the Soviets.

In another signed statement on February 11, 1950, GOLD stated that; at the Bidding of BROTHMAN, he, GOLD, told an untrue story to the FBI and the Federal Grand Jury, New York City, in the summer of 1947, concerning his initial meeting and association with BROTHMAN.

On November 22, 1950, in the United States District Court (USDC), Southern District of New York (SDNY), ABRAHAM BROTHMAN was found guilty of conspiracy to obstruct justice and intimidation of a government witness. On November 28, 1950, he was sentenced to five years imprisonment and a \$5,000 fine on the count charging intimidation of a government witness and two years imprisonment and a \$10,000 fine on the charge of conspiracy to obstruct justice. On July 26, 3, 1951, the United States Court of Appeals, Second District, affirmed the conviction on the conspiracy count but reversed the conviction on the count charging intimidation of a government witness. 

# Gold Names Russian as Spy Chief

By HOWARD RUSHMORE

Semen H. Semenov, a Russian trade representative here under diplomatic immunity while Russia posed as a "war time ally," headed a Soviet spy network which sought to obtain atomic and other military secrets.


Brothman, 37, of 42-08 42d st., Sunnyside, Queens, and Miriam Moskowitz, 34, of 151 8th ave., are being tried before Federal Judge Irving H. Kaufman and a jury of five women and seven men on charges of obstructing justice in a grand jury inquiry of Russian spying.

Although Gold, a 39-year-old Philadelphia chemist, did not reveal the name of his "Soviet superior" whom he said was known to him only as "Sam," the N. Y. Journal-American learned it was Semenov.

### TELLS OF CONTACTS.

Quiet and self-assured, the confessed spy, who will be sentenced for his crimes Dec. 7, told U. S. Attorney Irving S. Saypol and the jury that:

- 1. Brothman was "happy" that a trained scientist (Gold) was to be his new contact in the spy network and promised to funnel "more adequately" information to the Soviets;
- 2. Brothman identified as his former contacts with Semenov two Soviet agents known to Brothman only as, "John" and "Helen"—testimony that supported that of Elizabeth Bentley's. She said yesterday she and Jacob Golos using the same "cover" names were Brothman's contacts.

LOUIS F. BUDENZ has identified JESSICA SMITH, Editor of "New World Review," formerly known as "Soviet Russia Today," as a member of the Communist Party.

It is to be noted that "Soviet Russia Today" has been cited as a Communist front by the Special Committee on Un-American Activities, Reports, June 25, 1942 and March 29, 1944;

The "New York Herald Tribune," a New York daily newspaper, issue of July 15, 1952, carried an article which dentified ELIZABETH MOOS as the one-time mother-in-law of WILLIAM REMINGTON:

It is to be noted further that ELIZABETH MOOS was the former director of the Peace Information Center and along with others was indicted by a Federal grand jury in Washington, D. C. on February 9, 1951 on a charge of failing to register the Peace Information Center as an agent of a foreign principal.

ABRAHAM BROTHMAN was convicted on a charge of obstruction of justice in connection with the investigation of HARRY GOLD, self-admitted Soviet espionage agent; In December 1950, during supplementary proceedings relative to his arguments for release on bail pending his appeal, BROTHMAN furnished information along with a list of names of persons who had contributed to his bail fund; This list reflected that ABRAHAM RESIKA had contributed \$500 to BROTHMAN'S bail fund and RESIKA was interviewed by Bureau agents during the investigation of the sources of this bail fund. 
of this interview RESIKA advised that he had loaned \$500 to CLARA LEET, 161 East 96th Street, New York City, which he understood was to be turned over to NAOMI BROTHMAN, wife of ABRAHAM BROTHMAN. RESIKA exhibited a note dated August 30, 1950 signed by CLARA LEET in the amount of \$500.

CLARA LEET, upon interview in this matter, stated that NAOMI BROTHMAN, who is her close relative, had asked for a loan of \$500 for ABRAHAM BROTHMAN'S bail fund. Mrs. LEET stated that she then borrowed this money from ABRAHAM RESIKA and turned it over to NAOMI BROTHMAN.
