A review of BROTHMAN'S activities from November, 1945 to May, 1947 made in an effort to establish identities of all of his contacts on the possibility that one of them is the unknown subject. Identification of some of these contacts made. BROTHMAN currently operates A. Brothman & Associates, Chemical Engineers, Long Island City, NY and resides at 4108 42nd St., Sunnyside, Long Island. Current surveillance photograph obtained, results of additional confidential sources obtained and set forth. Leads set out.

Confidential Informant T-21, of unknown reliability, advised that in 1944 and 1945, NADEL operated the Delton Products Corporation, 485 Fifth Avenue, New York City with himself as President and his wife as Vice-President and Captain JOSEPH SUTTON as Secretary-Treasurer. NADEL'S office is now located at 154 Nassau Street and he lives at 79 Schenck Avenue, Brooklyn. Confidential Informant T-22, of known reliability, advised that NADEL was born in 1896. His wife's name is ADELE. NADEL and his wife were members of the IWO, Lodge 600 in New York City in 1948 and 1949. (u)

VLADIMIR A. TVERIANOVICH

Confidential Informant T-23, of known reliability, advised that TVERIANOVICH, a Russian national, was born October 12, 1909 in Russia. He was employed as an engineer in the People's Commissariat of the Fishing Industry in Russia in 1942 - 1943. From March to February, 1943, he was employed as an engineer for the Soviet Government Purchasing Commission in the United States. In 1943 and 1944, he was Chief of the Technical Division at Vladivostock, Russia. He entered the United States at Portland, Oregon again on May 24, 1944 and departed from the United States on December 23, 1946. (u)

DR. ERNST BERGMAN

Inquiry at the Hotel Salisbury, 123 West 57th Street, New York revealed that one DR. ERNST BERGMAN had occupied a suite belonging to CHAIM WEIZMANN in December, 1946. Confidential Informant T-24, of known reliability, advised that BERGMAN was born October 18, 1903 at Karlsruhe, Germany. He entered the United States first on August 12, 1942. BERGMAN was coming to the United States for a temporary visit on business. His parents' names are Dr. J. and Mrs. HEDWIG BERGMAN of Jerusalem, Palestine. BERGMAN is engaged in chemical research and obtained a P.H.D. degree as a research chemist from Berlin University. Prior to the time, he had lived in Berlin from 1908 to 1933; London, England from June to December, 1933 and Palestine from January, 1934 to April, 1940. From 1940 to 1942, he listed his employment as an assistant to Dr. CHAIM WEIZMANN at the Grosner Laboratory, London, England. (u)

SYNOPSIS OF FACTS:

ADMINISTRATIVE

GERHARD NORVAL WOLLAN, upon interview at North Ga. College, Dahlonega, Ga. advised he was associated with A. BROTHMAN & ASSOCIATES from August 1944 to August 1946. First met BROTHMAN through one MORRIS SCHILLER, while unemployed. Information and descriptions concerning contacts and associates of BROTHMAN known to WOLLAN obtained and set out herein. At time A. BROTHMAN & ASSOCIATES was formed, BROTHMAN had secured retainers as consulting engineer from Bridgeport Brass; HEILIG Chemical Co., and GRAVER Tank. First contract after formation of firm was obtained by BROTHMAN through Y. O. TANG and C. S. WAN with the Chinese government purchasing commission, New York City. BROTHMAN met TANG and WAN through one SIMONS who had written standard books on plastics. One BERNARD PIDTO furnished financial backing for BROTHMAN. When first interviewed, WOLLAN stated that laboratory was initially set up with expenditure of approximately \$2000.00. All financial matters handled by BROTHMAN. Photograph of HARRY GOLD identified as person known as FRANK KEPPLER and HARRY GOLD, who worked for BROTHMAN in 1946. GOLD is chemist with possibly some chemical engineering experience but not a physicist. Photograph of ROSE WOLLAN obtained. WOLLAN denied knowing FUCES, or HEINEMAN, or ever having been in the states of Mass. or New Mexico. WOLLAN advised all partners of A. BROTHMAN & ASSOCIATES, including himself, friendly toward Soviet Union.

Dahlonega, Georgia, to VIRGINIA OGLESBY, 2233 Alston, Fort Worth, Texas, USA. This envelope bore BERG's return address at "Box 247, Dahlonega, Georgia (also USA)."

With reference to LOUIS E. BERG, the Minneapolis Office advised by letter dated March 3, 1950, that the files of that office reflect that the minutes of January 21, 1936, of the Student Affairs Committee of the DePau University reflect that BERG was a member of the American Student Union and apparently filed a petition signed by himself, together with forty-four additional students, and two faculty advisors, requesting that the Student Affairs Committee grant the organization known as the American Student Union official recognition as a campus organization.

Confidential Informant T-2, another Government Agency conducting intelligence investigations, advised that information had been received that one [REDACTED] a Professor of [REDACTED] at North Georgia College, Dahlonega, frequently digressed from the subject of [REDACTED] in his classes and favorably discussed the subject of Communism.

Passport files, State Department reflect ABRAHAM BROTHMAN issued Passport on 5/5/48 and MIRIAM MOSKOWITZ issued PP 5/6/48 for two months travel (together) to England, France, Switzerland and India on business. PP refusal notice dated 2/17/49 placed in BROTHMAN's file based on HCUA information. HCUA files reflect N. METT (BROTHMAN's wife is NAOMI METT) sent greetings to USSR on 10th Anniversary of Russian Revolution. A. BROTHMAN cited by ELIZABETH T. BENTLEY as involved in giving information to Soviet Govt. PP file on ZOLA GOTTHARD DEUTSCH reflects Paris address of Krebs and Co. BROTHMAN in proposed trip this year to Europe possibly may contact Dr. EDWARD KREBS, President, Krebs et Cie in Paris.

The passport file of ABRAHAM BROTHMAN at the Department of State reflects that on May 5, 1948, Passport 203104 was issued to him. In his application for this passport, BROTHMAN stated he proposed to travel abroad for two months to visit England, France, Switzerland and India and would be leaving on May 12, 1948 via airplane.

He listed his mother as ESSIE WINTER BROTHMAN, born July, 1892 on a boat traveling from Sochasczew, Poland (Russia) to New York where she has resided continuously. BROTHMAN listed his father as HARRY BROTHMAN, born

September, 1888 at Sochaszew, Poland and who emigrated to the United States in July, 1908 and who has resided in the U.S. continuously since then.

EROTHMAN stated in the application that he had had no previous passport; that he married NAOMI WEIT on May 31, 1937 and who was born in April 1909 at Kishinev, Russia. The passport application of BROTHMAN was witnessed by MIRIAM MOSKOWITZ.

The passport file of BROTHMAN contained a letter dated April 28, 1948 which was apparently typed by MIRIAM MOSKOWITZ as it had the initials "MM" in the lower left-hand corner and appeared to be similar to the letter under the same date which appeared in the files of MIRIAM MOSKOWITZ. The letter stated that BROTHMAN's purpose of visit to Switzerland was to conclude certain negotiations which had been conducted primarily through the mail with the Lonza Electrical and Chemical Works, Ltd. of Basel, Switzerland; further that the negotiations had to do with the sale of certain of BROTHMAN's chemical processes for the production of methyl methacrylate monomer and polymer forms and thioglycolic acid, the license rights and engineering services for which the Lonza Company has indicated to the BROTHMAN Company it wished to purchase.

The letter continued that the purpose of the London visit was to visit Dr. J.P. BATTER of the Imperial Chemical Industries, Ltd. of London, whom BROTHMAN met in New York and who indicated his company would be interested in the purchase of license rights and engineering services for the processes mentioned above.

The purpose of the visit to Bombay, India was to visit SESHASAYEE BROS. Ltd. whose representative, R.E. REMANI, had been in New York the then past six months and who had indicated to BROTHMAN it would be advisable to see the president of his company in order to close certain negotiations conducted in New York for the sale of license rights and engineering services for the production of various chemicals, namely DDT as well as other chlorine utilizing chemicals.

The purpose of the Paris visit was to contact chemical producing companies and to interest them in license rights and engineering services for the production of thioglycolic acid which is used in cosmetics.

The following is a description of ABRAHAM BROTHMAN as contained in the passport file:

The file also contains a photograph and birth certificate of the subject.

The passport file on BROTHMAN contains a refusal notice dated February 17, 1949 which is a form of passport stop and was placed in BROTHMAN's file on the basis of adverse information in the possession of the House Committee on Un-American Activities. The refusal notice indicates that a passport will not be issued until applications for same are brought to the attention of Mrs. RUTH B. SHIPLEY, Chief, Passport Division.

The files of the House Committee on Un-American Activities reflect that N. METT sent greetings to the USSR on a 10th Anniversary of the Russian Revolution and that the HCUA source of this information was the "Daily Worker" published November 10, 1927, page 4. It is to be noted that the wife of BROTHMAN is NAOMI METT.

Additional HCUA information reflects that ABRAHAM BROTHMAN, Republic Steel Co., Reserve Officer, U.S. Army, was mentioned by ELIZABETH T. BENTLEY in lists submitted to the Subcommittee of the Senate Judiciary Committee by orders dated May 13, 1949; further, that this list is headed, "List of People Involved in Giving Information to the Soviet Government".

HCUA files further reflect that BROTHMAN, a Reserve Army Officer, was cited by ELIZABETH T. BENTLEY for the Senate Judiciary Committee, according to the "Times Herald" newspaper, page 1, published June 6, 1949.

The passport file of ZOLA GOTTHARD DEUTSCH reflects that by letter dated April 11, 1947, DEUTSCH wrote the Joint Chiefs of Staff, U.S. Army and requested permission to visit Germany and Austria during June, July and August, 1947 and in this letter, he listed clients and factories he expected to visit and Paris addresses where he could be reached as:

In connection with DEUTSCH and the address Krebs and Co., it is to be noted that the New York office has advised that ABRAHAM BROTHMAN, in a proposed trip to Europe this year, is supposed to contact a Dr. EDUARD ~~KREBS~~, President, Krebs Et Cie in Paris, France.

The passport file of the State Department concerning MIRIAM MOSKOWITZ reflects she was issued Passport #203336 on May 6, 1948 and in her application for this passport, had stated she proposed to travel abroad for five weeks by TWA Airlines and would visit England, France, Switzerland and India on business. She listed her mother's name as ROSE ~~HERSHKOWITZ~~, 772 Boulevard, Bayonne, New Jersey. Her father was listed as SIGMUND J. MOSKOWITZ, born in Hungary, June 10, 1886 and who emigrated to the U.S. in June, 1902 and was naturalized at Jersey City, N.J. in approximately 1908. The witness on this application was ABRAHAM BROTHMAN, 41-08 42nd St., Long Island, N.Y.

The MOSKOWITZ passport file contained a letter dated April 28, 1948 to the Passport Division on the stationery of ABRAHAM BROTHMAN & ASSOCIATES. MOSKOWITZ, in the letter, stated she wished to make application for a passport to travel abroad and was to fly from New York to London, via the American Overseas Airlines on May 12, 1948 and make a three-day stop in London to proceed via British European Airways on May 15, 1948 to Geneva, Switzerland to make a two-week stop in Basel, Switzerland, to make air transit stops in Rome, Athens, Egypt, Saudi-Arabia and Iraq for final destination to Bombay, India on May 30, 1948 via TWA Airlines for a two-weeks stay in India and to return from Bombay to New York on June 14, 1948 via TWA.

MOSKOWITZ stated the purpose of her travel was to accompany BROTHMAN who was traveling on business and it was necessary for her to assist in certain negotiations to be conducted with companies which are the same as those listed in the BROTHMAN letter mentioned herein. MOSKOWITZ, in the letter, also stated that she wished to spend three days in France with BROTHMAN seeking additional business connections in the cosmetics chemicals field.

The MOSKOWITZ passport file reflected that in June, 1925, she had traveled with her mother, sister CLARA, and brother SYLVAN, to Germany and Czechoslovakia to visit relatives and the Carlsbad Baths. This travel in 1925 was accomplished when her mother's passport #93404 was issued on June 30, 1925.

There are no references to LEVINE or any of the foregoing in the indices of the Boston Office.

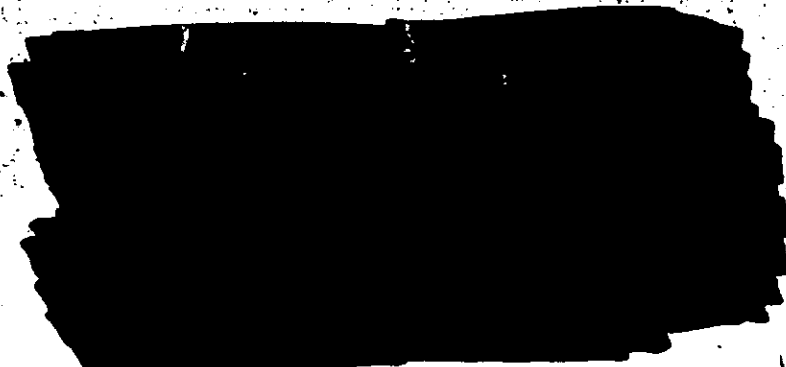

PURPOSE:

The purpose of this memorandum is to answer the inquiries by the New York Division concerning the possible interference of Gold's testimony as to his entire espionage activities in instant trial with present Bureau investigations and also to furnish advice as to the use of a photograph of Semen Semenov in connection with this trial.

DETAILS:

The New York Division by teletype of October 11, 1950, advised that Assistant United States Attorney Roy M. Cohn pointed out that it might be expected that when Harry Gold testifies in the Brothman case the entire story as to his complete espionage activities could be brought out; further, that he has made inquiry as to whether a publication of Gold's entire story would interfere with present Bureau investigations.

An analysis of the various statements made by Harry Gold and the information furnished by him since his confession to espionage activities reflects that his testimony relative to the Brothman - Gold relationship would bring out in court the following-named individuals who have likewise been subject to investigation by the Bureau:

Thomas Lessing Black
Semen Semenov (In France)
Jacob Golos (Deceased)
Elizabeth Terrill Bentley
Anatoli Yakovlev (In France)
Emil Julius Klaus Fuchs (In England).

It appears that any testimony furnished by Gold relative to the foregoing individuals would in no way interfere with any present investigative activity on the part of the Bureau. It is considered, however, that the Government in presenting its case should make every effort to limit the testimony of Gold to that pertaining to this Brothman - Gold relationship, and not go into Gold's other activities, as set forth hereafter.

However, conceding the possibility that in cross examination the defense attorneys might be in the position to open the door with respect to additional espionage activities on the part of Gold not involving Brothman,

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an analysis of the information furnished by him indicates that the following additional named individuals may be brought out in open court:

David Greenglass (Awaiting Trial)
Joseph Katz (In France)
Julius Rosenberg (Awaiting trial in New York City)
Alfred Dean Slack (Already sentenced to serve 15 years)
Unknown Russian No. 1.

In the event of a disclosure of Harry Gold's information relative to the aforementioned individuals, it is not considered that any serious interference with the Bureau's present investigative activities will result except in possibly two instances. In the first instance with regard to the case on Joseph Katz, a disclosure of our interest in him might interfere with our ultimate objective of securing his return to the United States. The second instance is with respect to Unknown Russian No. 1 who, as you are aware, was the last known Soviet superior to Harry Gold and with whom Gold had contact up to the latter part of 1949. The identity of this Unknown Russian No. 1 has not been effected to date and it is considered possible that he may be identical with the Soviet espionage superior of the Julius Rosenberg network. It is considered that a disclosure of the facts concerning this individual in open trial might interfere with our present investigation to determine his identity and would thus be objectionable. In view thereof, it is considered that the Government should make every effort to prevent the defense from drawing out from Gold such testimony, which would have no direct bearing on the Brothman - Gold relationship.

In any event, it is felt that the Bureau is in no position to place any limitations on the Department in the use of Gold as a witness inasmuch as no successful prosecution can be secured against Brothman without the testimony of Harry Gold.

In so far as the use of a photograph of Semen Semenov in instant trial is concerned, it is pointed out that at the present time only three such photographs are available. The first is that which was obtained from the State Department, which appeared on the PR-1 Form. b1

The third is a photograph obtained which latter photograph has recently been sent to Harry Gold for identification purposes. Of the three aforementioned photographs available, it is considered that the one appearing on the PR-1 Form would be the most desirable for use in this trial in the event release -

the State Department is willing to permit one of its representatives to produce this photograph along with such additional records as are available to establish Semenov's connection with Amtorg in New York City.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended, therefore, that the New York Division advise the United States Attorney that testimony by Harry Gold in instant trial would not seriously interfere or jeopardize any present Bureau investigations. However, it is suggested that he be requested to make all efforts to limit Gold's testimony in this trial to such information as Gold may be in the position to furnish relative to the Brothman - Gold relationship.

The Liaison Section has been instructed to contact an appropriate individual at the State Department to determine whether it will be agreeable to use the photograph on the PR-1 Form in connection with the trial in this case; further, that it be determined whether a representative of that Department would be made available to introduce this photograph and such other records which they might have reflecting that Semen Semenov was certified to them as being connected with Amtorg in New York City during this period. Inquiry is also being made of the State Department as to whether they have any official who was acquainted with Semenov and would be in a position to identify the photograph as Semen Semenov, who was employed at Amtorg in New York City.

FURTHER, STATE DEPARTMENT INDICATED THEY WILL SUPPLY A STATE DEPARTMENT REPRESENTATIVE TO INTRODUCE INSTANT PHOTOGRAPH INTO EVIDENCE AND TO IDENTIFY THE FORM FROM WHICH PHOTOGRAPH WAS OBTAINED BY THE OFFICIAL REGISTRATION OF SEMENOV AS AN OFFICIAL OF AMTORG TRADING CORPORATION. PURPOSE:

To request that appropriate inquiry be made at the State Department to determine whether the photograph of Semen Semenov appearing on PR-1 Form can be used in connection with the Brothman trial and whether a representative of the Department could be made available to produce same and testify from the records of the State Department as to Sobell's connection with Amtorg. DETAILS:

In connection with the trial of Abraham Brothman in New York City, which is set for October 30, 1950, it is necessary to introduce in evidence a photograph of Semen Semenov, who is known to have been connected with Amtorg in New York City. The New York Office has requested advice in behalf of the United States Attorney as to whether such photograph can be introduced in evidence in this case. (u)

J. A. LLOMPART and GEORGE J. SCHLADT, Ordnance Engineers, Ammunitions Branch, Ordnance Research and Development, Pentagon, upon interview advised that the Army Ordnance since 1945 has had a series of contracts with the GOLWYNNE CHEMICAL CORPORATION for the purpose of atomized magnesium - aluminum alloy and pure atomized magnesium. SCHLADT and LLOMPART both state HENRY A. GOLWYNNE, President of GOLWYNNE CHEMICAL CORPORATION, claims he owns patents for the atomized magnesium powder process and that there have been discussions about turning the patents over to the Government for a price. SCHLADT and LLOMPART both state that there were no restrictions on the GOLWYNNE contracts and that the Army does not manufacture magnesium and the GOLWYNNE contracts are not classified.

They further informed that the Army has had a contract for about four years with the DOW CHEMICAL COMPANY for the development of a new magnesium powder process. The original DOW contract was confidential; however, it is now in the process of being de-classified.

SCHLADT and LLOMPART stated that magnesium and magnesium aluminum alloy furnished by GOLWYNNE is used by the Army in "photo-flash type munitions" and particularly for the Air Force in order to give light upon explosion.

H. FLEISHER, Supervisor, Chemical Engineer, Research and Development, Bureau of Ships, Department of the Navy, produced the original "Report on Various Methods for the Field Filling of Aerosol Insecticide Bombs", dated March 1, 1944, and signed by A. BROTHMAN, A. P. WEBER, and E. Z. BARISH. FLEISHER said the report was apparently delivered personally to the Research and Standards Section by A. P. WEBER as WEBER's business card was stapled to the report in absence of a cover letter and outgoing letter of acknowledgement. FLEISHER and I. PORETZ, also of Research and Development state the report was never classified as confidential. FLEISHER said the report was too complicated and the Navy had better methods of filling equipment.

The Bureau of Ships files contain a letter dated May 2, 1944, on stationery of the Chemurgy Design Corporation and signed A. BROTHMAN, Vice President. This letter endorsed a supplement to the March 1, 1944 report which supplement explained certain changes. By letter dated May 6, 1944, I. PORETZ

On October 17, 1950, JOSEPH ZACK KORNFEDER was shown a 1933 picture of ABRAHAM BROTHMAN. KORNFEDER stated he was unable to positively identify the photograph of BROTHMAN as one of a group of young Communists he had organized in 1932 to conduct research for the Communist Party for the purpose of developing "stink bombs" and acids to be used in corroding machinery. KORNFEDER further advised upon the second interview that he doesn't recall where the names were obtained of the Communists and from whom they were obtained or who recommended them. He stated they were undoubtedly obtained through the Party and that meetings were held in the Grace Hutchins Building on the southwest corner of 11th and Broadway. He said he doesn't recall what floor nor the room number where these meetings were held with this group of young Communists.

KORNFEDER went on to say that although he is "fairly certain" that BROTHMAN was one of the young chemists he cannot positively identify this photograph. KORNFEDER also pointed out that at the end of 1932 he went to Ohio to continue activities there.

On November 2, 1950, the passport application of ABRAHAM BROTHMAN, which was obtained from the passport files, State Department, Washington, D. C. and which was apparently in BROTHMAN's own handwriting was delivered to the FBI Laboratory by Special Agent Hollis W. Bowers.

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H. FBI Laboratory Examination of Documents

The document pertaining to thermal diffusion which was photographed when it was made available to the Bureau through a highly confidential source has been examined by the FBI Laboratory and it was concluded that the typewriting thereon was prepared on the same typewriter as that used to prepare the similar document found in the possession of Harry Gold, the authorship of which document Gold has admitted. It was concluded that the handprinting appearing on the document made available by the highly confidential source was prepared by Harry Gold. It should be noted here that the original information concerning [REDACTED] b1

[REDACTED] and therefore from an (TS) evidentiary standpoint the importance of the results of the laboratory examinations is thereby limited.

The FBI Laboratory made an examination of the handprinting appearing on page three of the document entitled "Magnesium Powder Plant" but because of the variations which could not be accounted for on the basis of Brothman's available known handprinting no conclusion could be reached. (u)

I. State Department Passport Information

Investigation at the Department of State reflected that a passport, number 203104, was issued to Abraham Brothman on May 5, 1948. In his application Brothman stated he proposed to travel abroad for two months to visit England, France, Switzerland and India and would be leaving on May 12, 1948, by airplane. Brothman listed his mother as Essie Winter Brothman, born July, 1892; his father as Harry Brothman, born September, 1888, at Sochaszew, Poland, and that his father immigrated to the United States in July, 1908. Brothman also stated in this application that he had had no previous passport and that he married Naomi Mett on May 31, 1937, she having been born in April, 1909, at Kishinow, Russia. (u)

The passport application of Brothman was witnessed by Miriam Moskowitz. The files also contained a letter dated April 28, 1948, indicating the purpose of Brothman's visit to Switzerland was to conclude certain business negotiations dealing with the sale of chemical processes.

His visit to London, Paris and to India were also on business, according to this communication. The passport file contained a refusal notice dated February 17, 1949, which was placed in the file on the basis of adverse information in the possession of the House Committee on Un-American Activities. The files of the State Department also reflect that Miriam Moskowitz was issued passport number 203336 on May 6, 1948, for purposes of travel abroad with Brothman to assist him in certain business negotiations. (u)

The files of the House Committee on Un-American Activities reflect that N. Mett sent greetings to the USSR on the 10th anniversary of the Russian revolution. According to the file, the source of this information was the "Daily Worker" published on November 10, 1927. These files also reflected that Abraham Brothman was mentioned by Elizabeth T. Bentley in lists submitted to the Subcommittee of the Senate Judiciary Committee by orders dated May 13, 1949. The list was headed "List of People Involved in Giving Information to the Soviet Government." (u)

The records of the Veterans Administration Hospital, Bath, N.Y., reflect that [redacted] ASN 12131106, born October 17, 1900, entered the U.S. Armed Forces on August 14, 1942 at Buffalo, N.Y. and was discharged July 1, 1943 at Syracuse, N.Y. with a rank of Corporal in the 333rd Base Headquarters Air Base Squadron and also served in World War I July 15, 1918 to December 18, 1918. He was discharged from the Army at his own request because of his age.

The record reflects [redacted] has an arthritic condition and psychoneurosis (alcoholic). The file also reflects that the psychiatrist also noted the presence of grandiose ideas. Since his discharge from the U.S. Army, starting September 20, 1943, [redacted] has been in and out of the hospital at frequent intervals and has repeatedly sought to gain complete benefits from the Government as a result of this service. The file also has numerous letters in which he has reported activities of alleged racketeers in Buffalo and Batavia, N.Y. and it was noted that, on December 30, 1949, [redacted] wrote a letter to Judge Medina, New York, advising of international dope peddlers through Bermuda and, in the same letter, claimed there were "some thugs working Bath, Batavia and Buffalo".

During this period from 1943 [redacted] has been brought up on various charges, generally intoxication on the Base, for which he receives a hearing and receives punishment or confinement at the Base.

Assistant Veterans Administration Manager Major WILLIAM HANLEY who has held numerous courts in which [redacted] appeared, states he is entirely unreliable and has continually sought benefits to which he is not entitled.

In view of the facts developed, it is not anticipated that [redacted] will be interviewed by this office.

This Service is now reviewing testimony of Elizabeth Bentley and Whittaker Chambers relative to individuals identified by them as subversives with a view toward denaturalization and/or deportation.

As you know, the Department has expressed interest in this matter and has requested that expeditious action be given to ascertaining whether these subjects are amenable to Service proceedings. Accordingly, there is attached hereto for appropriate action Form G-59 covering the above-named subject who has been identified as a subversive by Elizabeth Bentley or Whittaker Chambers.

Central Office indices do not reflect any information concerning the subject. It would be of material help in determining Service jurisdiction if the Bureau would furnish any available information regarding the subject's date and place of birth and citizenship status.

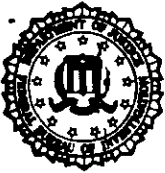

Files, Passport Office, Department of State, reviewed by a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation on August 30, 1963, disclose Abraham Brothman was issued passport D-634626 at Washington, D.C. on August 30, 1963, for proposed two months' travel to England, Switzerland, Germany and Israel for the purpose of business and to attend International Conference on Telemetering. In application dated July 19, 1963, at New York City, he stated his intention to depart from New York City by unnamed airline about July 27, 1963, not by organized tour. This passport was valid for three years' travel to all countries except Albania, Cuba and those portions of China, Korea and Viet-Nam under communist control.

Brothman stated that he was born on August 15, 1913, at New York City and the file reflects his birth certificate has been seen by passport authorities. He furnished his permanent residence as 17 Franklin Street, Dumont, New Jersey. He listed his parents as Harry Brothman and Esther Winter, born in Poland in 1898, both United States citizens. He stated he was last married on June 13, 1937, to Naomi Mett, born in Rumania on October 14, 1909, an American citizen. He requested that his wife be notified at the home address in the event of death or accident.

By letter dated July 31, 1963, Passport Office notified subject that his passport application was under consideration. On August 7, 1963, Mr. Leonard B. Boudin, New York City attorney, telephoned the Passport Office to inquire about the status of subject's passport application,

noting that subject was scheduled to deliver a paper before the International Telemetering Congress in London. Boudin was later informed the same day that it would take ten days to two weeks before a decision could be rendered in the case. By letter of August 12, 1963, Boudin again requested to be advised when the passport would be issued, noting that subject had to be in London in September. This letter was acknowledged on August 16, 1963, the Passport Office stating that every effort was being made to expedite the completion of the case. By letters dated August 23, 1963 and August 27, 1963, Boudin pressed for a reply concerning subject's passport, offering to come to Washington for a conference on the matter. On August 30, 1963, the Passport Office telephoned Boudin that subject's passport had been issued, on which occasion Boudin mentioned that subject would be leaving in one week and still had to get reservations and visas. Boudin also advised that subject had made his final payment of \$265 to the Office of the United States Attorney, New York City on his fine of \$10,000, the index number bring 114909, transcript of judgment 52678.
