The purpose of this memorandum is to show the results of investigation made to date on the basis of a signed statement dated November 30, 1945, executed by Elisabeth Terrill Bentley, who, for a period of several years, acted as a courier for the Soviet espionage system in the United States. All investigation has been directed toward establishing the truth or felsity of this statement.

ORIGIN OF CASE AND SUMMARY OF INVESTIGATION

On the evening of November 7, 1945, Elizabeth Terrill Bentley called at the New York Office of this Bureau and made disclosures regarding her activities for a branch of the Soviet espionage system in the United States. Her membership in the Communist Party dates back to March of 1935, when she became a regular member of Unit Number 1, Harlem Section, Communist Party-USA. Her reasons for dissidence at this time are somewhat nebulous but appear to center in the fact that in her operations for the Soviet espionage system she was originally responsible to Earl Browder, former National Chairman of the Communist Party, and later her contacts were taken over by Russians so that neither she nor Browder had any further relationships with them. Secondly, she was being threatened by William Weiner and Lement U. Harris, prominent national figures in the Communist Party, who were demanding from her \$15,000 originally invested by the Communist Party through the good offices of Earl Browder in the company being operated by Colonel John H. Reynolds and Bentley, namely, the United States Service and Shipping Corporation, a cover firm for Soviet, activity outwardly engaged in sending food packages to Europe. Thirdly, she is ostensibly afraid of the Soviet representatives with whom she is presently dealing and whose true identities she professes not to know. Fourthly, Bentley, prior to her turnabout, had been associating and possibly had an emotional interest in an individual by the name of Peter F. Heller, Heller, through investigation, was determined to be an individual of no political significance who has no connection with this case. However, his glibness apparently left the impression with Bentley that he was in some way associated with an intelligence organiza tion which probably influenced her in some small way to attempt an anticipation of trouble through him.

Following the appearance of Bentley at the New York Office of this Bureau, she was interviewed in great detail, executing a signed statement of 112 pages on November 30, 1945. To brief this statement set forth her

The New York Office has narrowed its investigation to date down to the following named individuals:

1. Abe Brothman, Consulting Engineer.

2. Laughlin Currie of the International Developing Company,
19 Rector Street, New York City, formerly Administrative
Assistant to President Roosevelt.

Ray Elson, wife of Joseph Elson, recently released from the United States Army.

4. Alexander Koral, Board of Education, Brooklyn, New York.

5. Dr. Abraham Benedict Weinstein, Dentist.

Abe Brothman was mentioned prominently in the Bentley statement as having furnished blueprints of commercial kettles to Golos. He is the head of Abe Brothman and Associates, Consulting Engineers, with offices at 114 East 32nd Street, New York City. Investigation to date has not developed any contacts by Brothman with the other subjects in this case.

Laughlin Currie, formerly Administrative Assistant to President Roosevelt, was mentioned prominently in the Bentley statement as being helpful to those engaged in Soviet intelligence whom she knew. Investigation has revealed that he was used as a reference by several individuals more actively engaged in the gathering of information and actually interceded to bring about no action in the Hatch Act investigation of Silvermaster. He has had no contacts with other individuals mentioned by Bentley during the course of this investigation. He is presently making plans to leave the United States for England in the near future.

Ray Elson is the individual through whom Bentley made arrangements for her contact with "Al", later identified as Anatole Gromov. She also succeeded Bentley in the United States Service and Shipping Corporation. Elson arranged the contact with "Al" which was covered by physical surveillance by Bureau Agents on November 21, 1945. Both she and her husband are in contact with known Communists.

Alexander Koral was not mentioned in the Bentley statement but entered the case as a result of a surveillance on Silvermaster in Washington, D. C. Silvermaster picked Koral up in his automobile from a busy corner and took a long ride with him on December 1, 1945. This would be a typical method of contact, according to Bentley.

An additional technical surveillance has been authorized on Michael Greenberg.
It should be noted that in the making of the instant investigation, no coverage whatsoever has been made or will be attempted at any time in the Government offices occupied by any of the persons under investigation or on telephones within these offices.

RE: ABRAHAM BROTHMAN, with alias Abe Brothman

ALLEGATIONS OF INFORMANT

"In about May of 1940 Golos introduced me to one Abe Brothman, who at that time resided in Nassau County, New York, and who was employed at the Republic Steel Company, New York, New York, as I recall, as an engineer. After I met this individual he told me he wanted me to have some blue prints copied and give the copies to Golos. I recall that from early summer, 1940 until sometime in the fall of 1940 I met Abe approximately ten times. Sometimes Golos would meet Abe to obtain these blue prints, but whenever he could not make these appointments I would do it. Most of these meetings took place in front of the Mosler Safe Company at 32nd Street and Fifth Avenue, New York City. Abe would meet me and we would usually go to dinner and during the course of the meal or later in the evening he would turn over to me these blue prints. I do not know how many separate prints there were as they would come in an envelope. I remember that on a great number of occasions the prints that he gave me were copies that Abe had made. However, on several occasions it would be necessary for me to take the originals and have copies made, which I would give to Golos, and I would return the originals to Abe at some future date. Abe never told me that it was imperative that I have these copied and the originals returned to him in the immediate future.

"Sometime during these happenings I learned from either Abe or Golos that these blue prints were of commercial kettles, which I understand to be some type of commercial vat. However, I am not sure of this deduction. Whenever I had to have copies made I would take them to one of the numerous stores that do this work on Cortlandt Street, New York City. I cannot recall the names of any of these shops.

"Along toward the fall of 1940 Golos told me he was becoming somewhat discouraged with his dealings with Abe and told me he was going to turn him over to someone else. I never did learn from Golos or anyone else to whom Golos directed Abe."

Re: ABRAHAM BROTHMAN, with alias Abe Brothman

BACKGROUND

Abraham Brothman is actively engaged in the consulting engineering firm of A. Brothman and Associates, a partnership with offices in Room 1606, 114 East 32nd Street, New York City. This partnership began operation on August 15, 1944, and is composed of Abraham Brothman, Gerhart Wollan, Oscar J. Vago and Jules Korchien. Brothman resides at 41-08 - 42nd Street, Sunnyside, Long Island, New York.

The records of Local Draft Board #245 located at 30-97 Steinway Street, Long Island City, New York, reflect that Brothman was born on August 15, 1913, at New York City and married Naomi Mett on June 15, 1937. They have one child, Elsa Harriet Brothman, who was born on July 27, 1941, at New York City. He listed education at the John Winthrop Elementary School, DeWitt Clinton High School, Columbia College - accounting, Columbia University-chemical engineering.

On April 3, 1945, a letter was sent to the Local Board by Oscar J. Vago of A. Brothman and Associates setting forth an appeal on behalf of Abraham Brothman, chief engineer, and showing the work of A. Brothman and Associates to be that of consulting engineers to the following concerns:

Bridgeport Brass Company, Bridgeport, Connecticut - manufacturers of aerosol bombs for protective measures against disease to the Armed Forces of the United States;

Graver Tank and Manufacturing Company, Inc. - manufacturers of D.D.T., water treating, etc., for Army, Nevy and Maritime Commission of the United States;

Palestine Potash, Ltd., D.D.T. plant in the near East; and

Commission of Aeronautical Affairs of the Republic of China - setting up plants for the production of plywood glues and bomber noses, turrets, and domes.

A letter dated November 16, 1940 from the Hendrick Manufacturing Company of Carbondale, Pennsylvania, indicated that Brothman was employed at that time by that concern and that his employment was vital to the company. This letter further stated that he was the inventor of many features and equipment for the production of aviation gas, artificial rubber, plastics and general processing.

It is to be noted that Jules Korchien is considered by the New York Field Division to be a key figure in the Communist Party and that he is the International Vice President of the Federation of Architects, Engineers, Chemists and Technicians, a Communist-dominated union, a delegate in 1945 to the Greater New York CIO Industrial Union Council and a member of the Architect Committee of the National Council for American-Soviet Friendship. Oscar Vago is known to be a member of the Communist Party in Queens, New York, and Gerhart Wollan is a member of the Communist Party of Brooklyn, New York.

Brothman is known to the Bureau as a signer of the Communist Party Nominating Petition at New York City in 1943 and that he interests himself in such reading matter as the April, 1945 issue of "Political Affairs," a text book of Dialectical Materialism; "Economics of Barbarism" by J. Kuczynsky and M. Witt; "300,000,000 Slaves and Serfs," by Kuczynsky and the May, 1945 issue of "American Review of the Soviet Union," a quarterly published by the American-Russian Institute, New York City.



RESULTS OF INVESTIGATION

An inspection in November, 1945, of the hotel registry at 41-08 42nd Street, Sunnyside, Long Island, reflected that A. Brothman-Mett occupied Apartment 5F at that address. An investigation reflected that the telephone number of A. Brothman and associates at 114 East 32nd Street, New York City, is Murray Hill 3-9670.

A physical surveillance was instituted on A. Brothman on November 28, 1945, and was continued for several days. However, the results of this surveillance were negative as far as the instant investigation was concerned. Likewise, an examination of the bank account of A. Brothman and associates failed to reflect any activities pertinent to the instant investigation.

On December 4, 1945, a photograph of Abraham Brothman was displayed to Elizabeth Terrill Bentley, and she identified it immediately as the same individual who was known to her as Brothman. Her identification was positive, and her only further comment was that the photograph made Brothman look considerably younger than he was when she knew him.

SCHUSTER was very active in setting up various concerns during the middle 1940's which may have been used as cover organizations for espionage and/or CP underground activities, or may have been used to secure income for the CP. Associated in these activities with SCHUSTER were SAN BROOKS, GRORGE HADLOWATILLETT, and his sons, LESLIE and JAMES TILLETT. Each W of these individuals are subjects of separate investigations in which this office is origin. This office has recently inaugurated an investigation on MAX FRIEDMAN (NY 105-4364).

While information concerning DANIEL FRIEDMAN will. of course, be developed and reported in connection with the inquiry concerning his brother, MAX, it is believed that it would be desirable to open a separate case on DANIEL FRIEDMAN to avoid confusion. The Bureau's views on this point are requested.

It has previously been reported that through physical surveillances conducted in the PHILIP MORTON FIELD case, during the spring of 1947, it was determined that SCHUSTER was in attendance at a series of Wedne sday-night meetings, held principally at the home of MITCHELL-FEIN at 237 East 81st Street, NYC. Concerning Mrs. MARIO OTTOLENGHI, the New York files reflect the following:

A mail cover on the office of ABRAHAM BROTHMAN in 1947 revealed that he had received correspondence from Dr. MARIO L. OTTOLENGHI, 183 Brown Street, Providence, Rhode Island.

It is to be noted that ABRAHAM BROTHMAN was convicted November, 1950 and sentenced to seven years imprisonment for obstruction of justice in that he influenced HARRY GOLD, confessed Soviet espionage agent, to give false information before the Federal Grand Jury in 1947 concerning the activities between BROTHMAN and GOLD.

On November 22, 1950, Trial Jury, Southern District of New York, found subject guilty of Conspiracy to Obstruct Justice and Intimidation of a Government Witness. On November 28, 1950 he was sentenced to five years imprisonment and \$5,000 fine on count charging Intimidation of a Government Witness and of Conspiracy to Obstruct Justice. On July 26, 1958 the United States Court of Appeals, Second District, affirmed the conviction of ABRAHAM BROTHMAN on the Conspiracy count, but reversed conviction on the count charging Intimidation of a Government Witness, because of venue. He was confined to United States Penitentiary, Atlanta, Georgia, August 28, 1951 to November 5, 1952. He was released from prison on November 5, 1952.



HILSBOS will testify that on February 27, 1947, MARY JANE KEENEY visited New York City and at approximately 7:10 g.m. walked from 379 Bleecker Street, the residence of LOUIS LIRNER, Executive Secretary of the Jefferson School of Social Science, carrying a suitcase directly to 10 Downing Street, then the residence of URSULA WASSERMAN. At 12:05 a.m. on February 28, 1947, JULES KORCHIEN departed from 10 Downing Street and proceeded to 110 Christopher Street, at that time his residence.

The records of the Immigration and Naturalization Service, New York City, reflect that URSULA ASSERMAN was born March 10, 1915 at Hamburg, Germany. She arrived in the United States on February 23, 1939, aboard the QUEEN MARY from Southampton, England, and was naturalized August 1, 1944 in the United States District Court, Southern District of New York.

HARRY GOLD, self-confessed and convicted Soviet espionage agent who originally furnished the information in a signed statement to SAS T. SCOTT MILLER and RICHARD E. BRENNAN on July 11, 1950, advised that from September 1941 to 1944 at the direction of his Soviet superior, he received miscellaneous technical information from ABRAHAM BROTHMAN.

He advised concerning JULES KORCHIEN that KORCHIEN was an architect and a friend of ABRAHAM BROTHMAN who in 1944 got together with BROTHMAN and others to form A. Brothman and Associates.

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

Reference is made to the report of SA JOHN A. HARRINGTON, the original and four copies of which are enclosed herewith.

It is brought to the Bureau's attention that Security Informant has been advising the New York Office of his efforts to contact HERMAN GOLDFARB and to obtain from him the \$1,000 that BROTHMAN is supposed to have given to GOLDFARB.

On October 2, 1951, the informant advised that EMANUEL BLOCH told him that it was very important that he get in touch with GOLDFARB so that they could obtain the \$1,000. The informant has advised that BLOCH is very anxious to collect this \$1,000 and any other funds that may become available.

In view of the Bureau letter dated September 10, 1951, Bureau file 100-380609, which is the informant's Bureau file, it is the belief of the New York Office that the informant should be advised not to continue further in his efforts to contact GOLDFARB. New York takes this position in view of the third and fourth paragraphs of referenced Bureau letter, which deal with the informant's assistance to BLOCH in preparing and financing the ROSENBERG appeal, and which the Bureau points out may be "undesirable from a possible technical stand-point."

In view of the fact that Security Informant advised that "Retort" will not be published and in view of the fact that this investigation was instituted on the basis that the subject would be one of the distributors of "Retort," it is believed that the character of this case should be changed from Internal Security - R to Security Matter - C. It is requested that the Bureau advise New York of its opinion in this regard.

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

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

He stated that no one had ever approached him to serve on the "National Committee to Secure Justice for the ROSENBERGS" or any other committee or group that was to be formed to assist the ROSENBERGS in any manner.

He stated that he had never been a journalist and had no ability in writing for any kind of magazine nor had anyone ever approached him and asked him to help in the distribution of any magazine or periodicals or literature on behalf of the ROSENBERGS.

He advised that he had been employed by the Process Chemical Company at 33 North First Street in Brooklyn and worked on chemical paint processes. He stated he was dissatisfied with this job and that someone in the plant told him of a plant owned by ABRAHAM BROTHMAN at Matawan, New Jersey.

He stated he got in touch with BROTHMAN's attorney, MESSING, and through him met BROTHMAN in the Federal House of Detention where he was awaiting the outcome of his appeal after having been convicted of obstructing justice.

Matawan was engaged in creating chemicals for cosmetics, but was having difficulty in making it in large quantities and in controlling the process. He stated that while he had been in the Army he taught chemistry at Fort Belvoir, Virginia, specializing on problems of water purification.

He stated he saw BROTHMAN at the Federal House of Detention about ten times in all and discussed with him plastics, the work of the plant and a valve that BROTHMAN had designed. He advised that he looked up BROTHMAN's record and found that he was well known in both mathematical and chemical circles and was an authority on plastics.

He stated that BROTHMAN designed a valve to be used in a chemical process control and that he, GOLDFARB, contacted an attorney about having the valve patented.

He stated that when BROTHMAN is released from prison he intends to work with BROTHMAN in the field of plastics. He advised that he is Chief Engineer of Techniflex and a Vice President of Remotrol, a corporation wholly owned by Techniflex and engaged in research work chiefly in producing items to be manufactured and distributed by Techniflex.

He stated that he has been sending NAOMI BROTHMAN, wife of ABRAHAN ROTHMAN, about \$100 a week, which is in compensation for the use by Techniflex Corporation of the valve designed by ABRAHAM BROTHMAN. He stated that in the beginning the checks were made out to him and he endorsed them or gave the cash to NAOMI BROTHMAN, but that now the checks are made out to him as trustee and, thereafter, he turns the funds over to NAOMI. He stated this is the result of an arrangement between the Techniflex Corporation and NAOMI BROTHMAN and he does not know the details of it.

He stated that during his association with EROTHMAN and while he was working for EROTHMAN in the latter's plant at Matawan, he did not receive any money, but that he believed that BROTHMAN or his attorney gave him approximately \$30 for the three or four months that he worked in the plant. He stated he considered it a privilege to have worked in BROTHMAN's plant and though he received no money worked in BROTHMAN's plant and though he received. He for it he believed he gained in valuable experience. He stated that BROTHMAN never gave him any money to hold or to give to anyone else.

He stated that he had never been approached by anyone associated with the "National Guardian" a newspaper published in New York City to assist in any endeavors to free the ROSENBERGS, but admitted that he read the "National Guardian" on occasion, the last being about eight months ago.

He stated that he had been angry with Judge KAUFMAN for having sentenced the ROSENBERGS to death because it was his opinion as an engineer that no one person

could know all about the atom bomb. He stated thus DAVID GREENGLASS was not in a position to turn over to JULIUS ROSENBERG the intimate details of the atom bomb. He was advised that the ROSENBERGS were convicted of a conspiracy to commit espionage and had not been charged with turning over the atom bomb to the Russians.

At the end of the interview, he stated that it was his belief that no one should defy the laws of the United States by doing something that Congress did not desire to do. He stated he did not believe as has been stated in the National Guardian" that the ROSENBERGS were being persecuted because they were Jews and because of their political beliefs.

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



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

ABRAHAM BROTHMAN and MIRIAM MOSKOWITZ were convicted of obstruction of justice in the United States District Court, Southern District of New York, in 1950.

It is noteworthy that DAVID GREENGLASS, convicted Soviet espionage agent, has identified PHILLIP SALOFF as a contact in 1949 of JULIUS ROSENBERG, convicted Soviet espionage agent.

During an interview by SAS JOHN A. HARRINGTON and NORMAN E. BLISS on 2/15/52, SALOFF admitted knowing ROSENBERG since about 1936, when SALOFF was organizer for the Federation of Architects, Engineers, Chemists and Technicians. SALOFF further stated that he met JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG during world War II at a party while he, SALOFF, was working for the Audio Manufacturing Company, Glenbrook, Connecticut. Later in about 1948, SALOFF said, JULIUS ROSENBERG contacted him in an effort to get some business with the Pitt Machine Products Company which was operated by ROSENBERG and GREENGLASS. SALOFF said that he decided Pitt was not set up to do the high caliber of work required by Audio, and so no business came from this contract.

During this interview, SALOFF admitted having been a member of the International Workers Order for its insurance coverage since about 1940, but denied ever having been a member of the Communist Party or having any knowledge that the Communist Party exercised any control over the Federation of Architects, Engineers, Chemists and Technicians, and SALOFF specifically denied any knowledge of espionage activities on the part of JULIUS ROSENBERG.

It is to be noted that the International Workers Order has been declared by the Attorney General as coming within the purview of Executive Order #9835.



Informant stated that subject did not believe BROTHMAN was a Communist and that from discussions with BROTHMAN and BILL RUBIN, a writer, subject was of the opinion that BROTHMAN was unjustly convicted of Obstruction of Justice. Informant stated subject denied that he was a Communist.

ABRAHAM BROTHMAN was convicted on Movember 22, 1950 in the United States District Court, Southern District of New York, for Obstruction of Justice in furnishing false information as to his relationship with HARRY GOLD, self confessed Soviet espionage agent.



According to the "New York Daily News" and the "New York World Telegram", New York City newspapers, in issues dated April 7, 1949, FREIDUS and his stepfather, SAMUEL E. AARON of 1437 40th Street, Brooklyn, New York, were indicted on charges of having evaded payment of \$216,926.68 in income tass on transactions during 1942 and 1943 in their machinery business, the Aaron Machinery Company, Incorporated.

FREIDUS was indicted on October 17, 1952 by a Federal Grand Jury on charges of lying to the Reconstruction Finance Corporation regarding the financial condition of the Starrett Television Company in New York City and subsequently he was found guilty and sentenced to three years in prison and a fine of \$10,000.00.

In regard to BILL RIBIN, it is noted that one REPER was the author of mumerous articles appearing in the "Mational Guardian" from Movember 15. 1948 to at least April 9, 1952.



T-4, of known reliability, recalled that about a year ago subject's loyalty was questioned by a number of people at Port Jervis, New York, because there was considerable publicity in the newspapers relative to subject hiring ABRAHAM BROTHMAN, a Communist. He pointed out that subject has been active in a number of local civic organizations and he has established a good reputation in these organizations as well as in his position as president of the Techniflex Corporation. It was his understanding that JACOB FREIDUS, the owner of Techniflex Corporation, told subject to hire EROTHMAN and to arrange for his, EROTHMAN'S transportation to Port Jervis, New York, from the penitentiary at Atlanta, Georgia. 

inion desette, stated that in Rovember, 1952 subject sentages car to Atlanta, Georgia, be pick to ARRAHAM BROTHMAN and bring him to Port Jervis, New York, so that HROTHMAN could be employed at the Technifler Corporation, He stated he had no knowledge that subject was involved in Communist or Soviet espionage activities but he was unable to understand the reason why subject brought EROTHMAN to Port Jervis, New York, when BROTHMAN was convicted of Obstruction of Justice. He stated that since November, 1952, subject has been closely associated with HROTHMAN and during the latter part of 1953, subject made a deposit on a home at 80 Kingston Avenue, Port Jervis, New York, and this home and property was purchased for \$19,000.00. He stated that during the early part of 1954, EROTHMAN moved from 67 Ball Street to 80 Kingston Avenue, Port Jervis, New York, although it was understood that subject intended to move to this address.

He stated that subject and MROTHMAE were ushers at a wedding of DORIS C FAREER and WILLIAM J FRICHARDS on Pebruary 15, 1954. He stated that the bride and groom were employed at the Techniflex Corporation and WILLIAM J. RICHARDS resided at 67 Ball Street, Port Jervis, New York, with BROTHMAN for several months.



ABRAHAM BROTHMAN was convicted on November 22, 1950 in the United States District Court, Southern District of New

York, for Obstruction of Justice in furnishing false information as to the relationship with HARRY GOLD, self confessed Soviet espionage agent.

He stated that he has observed that subject has been very friendly with AHRAHAM BROTHMAN.

T-1, of known reliability, stated that although subject's loyalty was questioned by a number of people because of subject's association with AHRAHAM BROTHMAN, he stated he had no reason to question subject's loyalty and there was no indication that subject was involved in Communist activities.

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

VII. INTERVIEWS WITH HARRY GOLD

At Lewisburg, Pa.

On June 24, 1958, HARRY GOLD, inmate, U.S. Penitentiary, a convicted espionage agent, was interviewed by SA THOMAS E. SAUNDERS.

GOLD was exhibited all available photographs of the subject, one of which was believed to be current as of January 1957.

Concerning this photograph, GOLD stated that the individual picture was exactly as he imagined his former Soviet contact of 1935-1936 would look at the present time. He stated that his former Soviet a contact, known to him as PAUL SMITH, had the same general characteristics of JOSEPH GRENBERG; however, he could not positively state that GRENBERG is identical with the former contact. He said that it is possible, but he doubted that they were identical and would not say so until such time that he can make a positive identification. GOLD stated he is still sure that if he were to observe a photograph of SMITH as he appeared during the period that he had contact with him that he could still, at this date, effect a positive identification and is most anxious to do so.

GOLD stated that he never knew a person named YETTA SPIGLER and could not associate that name with any of his former acquaintances in the Philadelphia area. He stated that he never met anyone by the name of EMANUEL KLINE. He explained that a DANIEL KLINE of Philadelphia was a former classmate in high school of his brother, JOSEPH GOLD, and through DANIEL KLINE's visits at the GOLD home, he learned that DANIEL's father's name was EMANUEL, that he was a real estate dealer in the South Philadelphia area, and that he was now deceased.

GOLD advised that to his knowledge there was no relationship between YETTA SPIGLER and EMANUEL KLINE and that he was totally unaware of the other members of the KLINE family, other than EMANUEL and DANIEL KLINE, and that he only knew DANIEL KLINE through his visits to the GOLD home in Philadelphia with HARRY's brother, JOSEPH GOLD.

HARRY GOLD advised that the successor of PAUL SMITH,
"Little FRED," was pressuring him to obtain a source of information
at the Philadelphia Navy Yard. GOLD learned through his conversations with DANIEL KLINE that he was, during that period, employed at
the Philadelphia Navy Yard and thereafter had suggested his name
to "Little FRED" as a possible recruit for Soviet intelligence.
He stated that he has often times since regretted having furnished
DANIEL's name to "Little FRED" and had furnished the name under
pressure as this was a means at that time of getting "Little FRED"
"off his neck." GOLD definitely did not approach DANIEL KLINE
himself and had no knowledge as to whether any of the Soviets had
contacted DANIEL KLINE. He never received any information or
indication from DANIEL KLINE that he was ever contacted by the
Soviets and to his knowledge he may be "OK," but he pointed out

that it is very unlikely that any of his Soviet superiors would have informed him of the fact that DANIEL KLINE had been recruited, if such had been the case.

When first questioned as to his knowledge of JERRY or JEROME KLINE, GOLD stated that he seemed to recall that such a person existed; however, he could not recall ever meeting him or talking to him and could not recall where he was employed, or if he was any relation to DANIEL KLINE.

GOLD recalled that he had worked for ABRAHAM BROTHMAN at New York City during the period May 1946 to June 1948 at his own laboratory and that BROTHMAN operated a consulting engineering firm. He stated that it was prior to this time that BROTHMAN had been giving information to GOLD to pass on to his Soviet superiors, roughly the period October 1941 to 1943. GOLD further remarked that this was one of the unfortunate situations that had developed, that is, his going to work for BROTHMAN after the previous relationship with him. GOLD stated that BROTHMAN in the fall of 1947 and continuing on through 1948, had done some work for Mr. MIKELSTANTON of Stanton Laboratories, Philadelphia, Pa. He explained that his old friend, THOMAS BLACK, at that time an employee of CHARLES BERG, had recommended to STANTON that BROTHMAN's firm might be able to be of assistance to STANTON. explained that STANTON was involved in the manufacture of thioglycollic acid, an acid used in cold wave preparations and in high demand at that time. He stated that BLACK knew that GOLD was at that time associated with BROTHMAN and since STANTON needed a new plant design to manufacture his product, BLACK, out of loyalty to GOLD, had suggested BROTHMAN's firm to STANTON. stated that so far as he knew, STANTON's association with BLACK was purely a business association, as was STANTON's association with BROTHMAN and that to his knowledge STANTON was perfectly "all right." MICHAEL A.

GOLD recalled that during the period 1948, BROTHMAN was desperate for money. He stated that about June 1948, he, himself, and other employees of BROTHMAN, quit the firm over a wage dispute, and that he personally had been under the impression that he was an associate of BROTHMAN in the business. He stated that the only time he was an "associate" was when business was bad, but when business was good, he was merely an "employee."

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GOLD advised that shortly after he had terminated his association with BROTHMAN in June 1948, MIKE STANTON had called him to his house and asked GOLD as to whether he thought he should continue his association with BROTHMAN in the re-designing of his factory. GOLD stated that as he recalled he had advised STANTON that he had so much money invested in BROTHMAN at that time that he might as well continue with him and see if he couldn't recover as much as possible. He stated it was at this time that he now recalls that STANTON had complained to him regarding the large sums of money that he had loaned to BROTHMAN. GOLD at this point stated that he now thinks that it was at this time that he first heard the name of JEROME or JERRY KLINE mentioned, and that it had been JERRY KLINE who was instrumental in BROTHMAN obtaining the loan from Stanton Laboratories; however, he did not at that time associate JERRY KLINE with DANTEL KLINE mentioned above. pointed out that the KLINE name is a common name in the Philadelphia area, and he never gave the matter any thought that JERRY KLINE and DANIEL KLINE could be related.

GOLD stated that he has never known anyone by the name of JOSEPH GRENBERG, and as previously indicated, cannot positively state that the photographs of GRENBERG are identical with the person he knew as PAUL SMITH, his former Soviet contact. He stated further that he has absolutely no knowledge of the association between BROTHMAN and JEROME KLINE and that he definitely did not place JEROME KLINE in contact with BROTHMAN.

GOLD stated that he wished to comment that his former Soviet contact, known to him as PAUL SMITH, impressed him as being the person responsible for setting up industrial espionage in the United States during that period. He stated that SMITH did not impress him as the type of person that would be engaged in a menial job as a cover to his true occupation and he based this on the fact that SMITH was always well dressed, well rested, very smooth and polished, and to GOLD's knowledge, this person's only contact was Amtorg. As previously indicated, GOLD stated that he is still confident that he will be able to positively identify a photograph of his first contact, if shown one, even at this late date.

On July 28, 1958, HARRY GOLD was again interviewed by SA SAUNDERS. On this occasion GOLD was shown some additional photographs of the subject, one of which was designated photograph #2, having been furnished by Confidential Informant T-4 on April 30, 1958. Concerning this photograph, GOLD remarked, "This looks

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"an awful lot like PAUL SMITH, but the face is a little long. The photograph doesn't eliminate him as not being identical with SMITH. Everything in the photograph looks like the man I remember except the head is a little long, making the face appear long. The only thing that bothers me is the length of the face. You definitely should not eliminate this person as not being identical with PAUL SMITH." GOLD further commented that photograph #2 to him depicted a certain amount of coarseness which he does not associate with PAUL SMITH. GOLD stated that he just could not positively identify the person in photograph #2 as being identical with PAUL SMITH; however, he felt, as indicated above, that this person should not be eliminated.

The following is a resume of GOLD's recollections concerning PAUL SMITH, his first Soviet contact:

Residence

GOLD stated he has no direct knowledge of SMITH's residence during the time SMITH was contacting him. He stated that he assumes that SMITH resided in the vicinity of Broadway in the 80's or 90's, and he based this on the fact that most of his meets with SMITH were in this vicinity.

Employment

GOLD stated that he gained the impression that the only employment SMITH had when he was contacting him was at Amtorg. He stated that SMITH did not seem to have a job where he reported to a desk at a given time, and he based this statement regarding the association with Amtorg on the fact that on one occasion when blueprints were turned over to SMITH, SMITH told GOLD that he was going to take them to Amtorg and have them reproduced. SMITH had them reproduced and returned them to GOLD the same day they were delivered to him. GOLD stated that SMITH never mentioned any "cover" employment to him and never conveyed to GOLD the thought that he was employed at anything other than his espionage activities. GOLD stated that SMITH never conveyed to him the impression that he would ever perform servile type labor, in particular that of a waiter, and to GOLD this type of employment was not the type of work that he would associate with SMITH's personality. He pointed out further that SMITH never seemed to be in a hurry, was always well dressed, and always appeared well rested.

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Drinking Habits

GOLD advised that when he and SMITH did drink together they always drank Canadian Club whiskey. GOLD stated that he personally used ginger ale as a mixer and SMITH, without fail, always used soda. He said that on rare occasions they would drink Scotch whiskey, and on those occasions SMITH would use the same mixer. He said he cannot at this time recall the names of the bars where he and SMITH did their drinking. GOLD further advised that SMITH impressed him as a moderate drinker and he had never observed him to drink anything other than mentioned above. GOLD said it was his recollection that SMITH was having stomach trouble, possibly an ulcer, and for that reason he did not drink to excess at the time he knew him.

Eating Habits

SMITH, according to GOLD, frequently ate at Child's Restaurant located on Columbus Circle, New York City. He stated that one of the waitresses at Child's apparently knew him and SMITH would often take a card from his pocket which contained his diet and would order from the menu on this card. He recalled that SMITH did not go in for rich foods but usually ate something that was easily digested like lamb chops or baked ham and did not eat fancy dressings or side courses. He said that it was while eating with SMITH on one occasion that SMITH spoke to one of the waitresses in what he was told was the Danish language.

Reading Habits

GOLD stated he has no direct knowledge of SMITH's reading habits but gained the impression that SMITH was a well read man. GOLD has nothing to back up this statement other than SMITH's mannerisms and demeanor during their meetings.

Smoking Habits

GOLD stated that when he knew SMITH, he was strictly a cigarette smoker; however, he could not recall the brand. GOLD stated that he never observed SMITH to smoke anything other than cigarettes and recalled that he was what he considered to be a heavy smoker.

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Entertainment Habits

GOLD advised he has no knowledge of SMITH's entertainment habits; however, SMITH impressed him as a person who would go to the theater or the movies. He said SMITH did not impress him as the "sport" type and never heard him mention anything about attending sporting events of any type, in particular the race track. GOLD said that this type of activity is completely foreign to the type of man that he supposed SMITH to be.

Dress and Personal Notes


GOLD said that SMITH was a very neat dresser and wore what he thought to be expensive clothes as they fit too well to be ready-made. He recalled that SMITH had a habit of, after eating a meal, to place both hands flat on his belt and hitch his pants up. He said SMITH walked quite slowly and with the toes pointed out, but not quite to the point of a "duck waddle." He recalled that SMITH came down "heavy" on his feet, almost like a marcher. He said that it is a very outstanding walk to him. GOLD further advised that SMITH, to his recollection, did not wear glasses and to his knowledge did not wear dentures. He said he has no knowledge of the brand names of any toilet articles used by SMITH. However, he recalls that SMITH was always cleanly shaven.


GOLD stated that he cannot honestly recall whether SMITH had a mole on his left cheek or not. GOLD did recall that while walking, SMITH leaned a little forward.

GOLD stated he could recall that SMITH usually wore gray or brown suits with a little blue but not a dark blue. He lastly recalled that SMITH impressed him as being a shrewd, intelligent and educated individual who would not "stick out" in a group of cultured people. However, GOLD believed that SMITH had not received too much formal higher education.

Declassify on: OADRY On July 26, 1951, the United States Court of Appeals, Second District, affirmed the conspiracy count, but reversed the count charging the intimidation of a government witness. He was confirmed to a United Ites Penitentiary, Atlanta, Georgia, on August 21, 51, and released on November 5, 1952.
