Confidential Informant T-l advised that the Chemurgy Design Corporation was known to be at 420 Lexington Avenue on January 8, 1945. The efficers of this corporation were named by informant as: Henry A. Colwynna. President; Abraham Broi man, Vice President; Arthur Pt Weber, Secretary. The corporation was incorporated July 7, 1942, in Connecticut and operates as a chemical engineering and manufacture concern producing processed chemicals and equipment, the principal products being food and synthetic rubber materials. The corporation in June, 1944, was erecting a chemical plant designed by its engineers in Connecticut.

Brothman resigned, according to informant, on August 15, 1944, at which time he organized the consulting engineering firm of A. Brothman and Associates, a partnership with offices in Room 1606, 114 East 32nd Street, New York City. The partnership consisted of the following: Abraham Brothman, age 31; Emil Z. Barish, age 29; Scrimt Mollan, age 34; Oscar J. Vago, age 47; Jules Morchien, age 40. The partnership began operations, according to this informant, on August 15, 1944, and the style of business name was taken by the partnership on August 29, 1944.

Confidential Informant T-1 stated that Brothman was a native born eltison of Russian extraction, graduated from Columbia University in 1933 with a Chamical Engineering Degree, and was amployed by the Bendrick Manufacturing Company of Pennsylvania, just in July, 1942, he became vice fresident of the Chemical Company Design Corporation.



<u> Synopsis:</u>

Arthur Phineas Weber employed Kellex Corporation at Oak Ridge, Tennessee, prior to 6/21/49. During course of Atomic Energy Act-Employee investigation, Weber was found to have been an associate of Abraham Brothman, whom admitted Soviet Agents said they contacted for purpose of obtaining information for ultimate transmittal to Soviet Union. Kellex Corporation unable to locate four classified documents charged Meber's section following his. termination. Harry Gold, convicted Soviet agent, said that in Fall of 1942 Brothman indicated to him that Weber had agreed to join the Communist Party. In 1943, Gold discussed with his Soutet superior the advisability of recruiting Weber into Soviet espionage. interview. Weber denied he ever agreed to join or did join the Communist Party or that he was ever approached to or did engage in espionage activities. By advice of the Criminal Division of the Department, reports in this case were furnished to the United States Attorney, Southern District of New York, who now advises he contemplates presentation of this case to a Grand Jury on November 14, 1952.

DETAILS:

PERSONNEL QUESTIONNAIRE

Arthur Phineas Weber was investigated as an Atomic Energy Act-Employee based on a PSQ submitted by Weber dated 5/26/47. This investigation disclosed Weber was born March 10, 1920, at Brooklyn, New York. His parents were born in Russia. He received a BS in chemistry from the City College of New York in 1941 and has been employed since that date as a chemical engineer. He was employed at Oak Ridge, Tennessee, under a Wanhattan District clearance until 1948 when he was dranted clearance by the Atomic Energy Commission and employed by the Keller Corporation at Oak Ridge, Tennessee, on class fied work until June 21, 1949. Weber made frequent airplane to New York City during his employment at Oak Ridge with the Weber made frequent airplane trips Wanhattan District and following his termination, he is alleged to have visited numerous Atomic Energy Commission installations.

Investigation in the Atomic Energy Act-Employee case disclosed Weber listed Professor Charles A. Warliss, who has been identified with Communist front organizations, as a reference. Weber was determined to be an associate of Abraham Brothman, having known Brothman as a fellow employee since 1941 or 1942 and later Weber and Brothman became officers of an engineering corporation. Brothman was convicted on November 22, 1950, in the Southern District of New York on the charge of Obstruction of justice. During the course of this trial, Elizabeth Bentley and Harry Gold, admitted Soviet espionage agents, testified that they contacted Abraham Brothman for the purpose of obtaining information for ultimate transmittal to their Soviet superiors. Weber was a subject in the case captioned "Tedlee Chemical Corporation; Regal Chemical Corporation; 115 Dobbin Street Corporation; Fraud Against the Government." Investigation in this case disclosed subject corporations charged expenses to the Government consisting of consultant fees which were never actually Weber admitted in a signed statement that he made false statements to the Government by billing fees of approximately \$50,000 of which he actually received less than \$19,000. This case was presented to the Grand Jury in March, 1948, and a true bill returned against the corporations and one of their officers. Weber testified concerning his participation in the fraud; however, he was not considered a Weber testified concerndefendant by the Grand Jury.

Following the termination of subject's employment by the Kellex Corporation, four classified documents, which were charged out to the subject during the period of his employment on classified work of the Atomic Energy Commission, could not be located. On May 26, 1949, Weber submitted a memorandum which reflected in general that the most important of these documents dealt with a meeting of a group of technicians and had been lost en route to an office in the Keller Corporation for reproduction. Investigation disclosed that the Security Office, Keller Corporation, questioned Weber concerning the other three documents, all of which more drawings, and the subject apparently explained their loss satisfactorily.

Harry Gold, when interviewed regarding Weber, recalled that during the latter part of 1941 and throughout 1942 he had numerous telephone conversations with the subject. He stated he first met the subject in person in January of 1943 at which time the subject was accompanied by Abraham Brothman. According to Gold, subject made the statement. "Shake the hand that shook the hand," which Gold believed referred to a meeting between Gold, Brothman and Semen Semenov, Gold's Soviet espionage superior. Gold said that in the Fall of 1942,

Brothman indicated Weber had agreed to join the Communist Party.
In 1943, Gold discussed with Semenov the advisability of recruiting weber into Soviet espionage explaining it was his opinion that this could be successfully done wholly on a monetary basis. Gold believes he wrote a report for Semenov concerning Weber recommending he be recruited and used in the place of Brothman.

Weber has been interviewed by Bureau Agents on several occasions in 1950 and 1951. On August 9, 1951, subject was interviewed and denied he ever joined or agreed to join the Communist Party. He admitted that Abraham Brothman asked him to join; however, he was successful in putting off Brothman without giving refusal or agreement to join the Party. Weber denied he was ever approached to engage in espionage on behalf of the Saviets or that he ever did engage in any espionage activities. Weber denied that Brothman had ever made mention to him that Brothman had been introduced by Harry Gold or anyone else to Semen Semenov or to anyone engaged in espionage on behalf of the Soviets. Further, Weber said that Brothman had never mentioned to him that he had met anyone who was employed by or an official of the Soviet Government. Weber said Brothman never in any way mentioned that he was engaged in espionage activities. Accordingly, Weber said if he had made the statement, "Shake the hand that shook the hand," the statement in ho way indicated that Brothman had mentioned to him that Brothman had been introduced to Semen Semenov, With respect to the documents charged out to the subject at the Kellex Corporation, Weber was unable to recall any details concerning them other than that one of these documents was sent from his section to another for reproduction and never returned.

PROSECUTIVE ACTION:

By letter dated November 30, 1951, Mr. James M. McInerney of the Criminal Division was requested to review reports reflecting investigation of Weber. Attention was called to Weber's denial that he was ever approached to engage or did engage in espionage activities or that he ever agreed to, or did, join the Communist Party, USA. An opinion was requested as to the desirability of presenting the subject before a Federal Grand Jury convening at a future date in order that Weber's denials might be made under oath, By letter dated December 17, 1951, the Criminal Division requested that all available information developed during our investigation of the activities of Weber be made available to the United States Attorney. 



The American Youth Congress has been cited by the Attorney General as an organization coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

DEFORMATION CONCERNING ABRAHAN BROTHMAN

Tt is noted that information appears above in this report that applicant was associated with ARRAHAN EROTHMAN as an employee in 1965.

November 22, 1950, in the Southern District of New York on the charge of conspiracy to obstruct justice and the obstruction of justice.

During the course of the trial of ABRAHAN BROTHNAN in the Southern District of New York, ELIZABETH MANTLEY, an admitted Soviet espionage agent, testified that she acted as a courier in receiving information from BROTHMAN and transmitting same to her Soviet espionage superior, JACON GOLOS during 1941. Further, that during that same year she was known to BROTHMAN as "HELEN" and that during 1941 she made arrangements with BROTHMAN whereby BROTHMAN would be contacted by a new Soviet courier, whose identity was not known to Miss HENTLEY.

Espionage Agent, testified that in about September, 19hl, he received instructions from his Soviet espionage superior, SEMEN SEMENOV, to contact an individual in New York City for purposes of obtaining information. GOLD testified that he did contact this individual, who turned out to be ABRAHAM EROTHMAN, and on the original contact he told BROTHMAN that he was sent by "HELEN". QOLD testified further that subsequently he received various information, much of which related to chemical processes, from BROTHMAN.





The above information relating to the personal and employment history of ETROFFLD was found contained in personnel files relating to the employee at the Department of Commerce and the Department of State.





With regard to WASSERMAN, it is noted that she is a native of Hamburg, Germany who entered the United States in 1939. Significant activities on her part first came to the attention of the Federal Bureau of Investigation through her association with one JULES KORCHIEN. KORCHIEN is a business partner of one ABRAHAM BROTHMAN, who, in 1945, was reported by Washington T-2 as having furnished copies of blueprints to a Soviet espionage agent in New York City. who was known to Washington T-2. At that time, according to the informant, BROTHMAN was employed as an engineer by the Republic Steel Company. Investigation of KORCHIEN, EBCTHMAN and WASSERMAN subsequently revealed that all three were in contact with various other individuals, many of whom have been identified by Washington T-2 as principals in a Soviet espionage conspiracy centering in New York City and Washington, D. C. during the late 1930's and early 1940's. Washington T-2 is a former member of the Communist Party, of established reliability, who has furnished considerable information to the FBI. The informant refused to execute a signed statement and will not testify before a loyalty board.

It is to be noted that Washington Field letter to the Bureau and New York dated August 10, 1950, in the case entitled, "OSGOOD TOWER, NAVY, LGE", reflects that the appointee was acquainted with a Professor BERNARD C. KOPMAN, Mathematics Department, Columbia University, New York City.

Inquiry at the Mathematics Department, Columbia University, New York City, revealed no one by the name of KOPMAN.

The files of the New York Office contain no information concerning a BERNARD C. KOPMAN. However, the following information concerning Professor BERNARD OSGOOD KOOPMAN, Mathematics Department, Columbia University, is to be noted:

The report of SA EDWARD W. DOOLEY dated March 1, 1946, at New York, in the case entitled "NATHAN CREGORY SILVERMASTER, was., et al; ESPIONAGE - R", advised on February 7, 1946 that ABRAHAM BROTHMAN held a conference with BERNARD O. KOOPMAN, Associate Professor of Mathematics, Columbia University, at which time they agreed to meet in KOOPMAN'S room in the King's Crown Hotel, 420 West 116th Street, New York City, at 3:30 P.M. on February 13, 1946. (NY file 65-14603 - 1058)

On February 18, 1946, in the above mentioned report, advised that Professor KOOPMAN held a conference with ABE BROTHMAN, and during the conference told BROTHMAN that he had broken down the differential equation problem and that he would meet BROTHMAN for dinner at the Faculty Club, Columbia University, and show the problem to him.

In a teletype dated February 27, 1950, in the FOOCASE - ESPIONAGE - R, New York advised the Bureau, Boston, Cincinnati and Atlanta of the results of an interview with ARTHUR P WEBER, a former business associate of EROTHMAN. MEDER stated to Agents that among acquaintances of EROTHMAN was one BERNARD KOOPMAN, a mathematician at Columbia University. WEBER stated that BROTHMAN'S association with KOOPMAN was for assistance on a mathematical formula.

By teletype dated June 13, 1950 from Philadelphia to the Bureau and New York, in the case entitled, "ABRAHAM BROTHMAN, ESPIONAGE - R",

NY 121-9499

Philadelphia advised that in the interview with HARRY GOID concerning ABRAHAM BROTHMAN and his associates, GOID described Professor BERNARD KOOPMAN, a friend of BROTHMAN, as definitely not a Communist and stated that if KOOPMAN was a liberal, he was only liberal to a very slight extent. GOID said that the relationship between BROTHMAN and KOOPMAN was one wherein EROTHMAN basked in the reflected glory of KOOPMAN. GOID said that KOOPMAN was one of the few individuals whom EROTHMAN definitely idolized for his mathematical ability.

The files of the New York Office also reflect that Professor KOOPMAN was investigated by this office under the Atomic Energy program. In this connection the report of SA FRANKLIN L. JOHNSON dated May 31, 1950, at New York, in the case entitled, "HERNARD OSGOOD KOOPMAN -WA-15907, AEAA" contains no information of a subversive or disloyal nature concerning KOOPMAN.

On the basis of the information furnished by HARRY GOLD and that which is contained in above mentioned AFAA file, the New York Office felt that it was not unadvisable to interview Professor KOOPMAN.

The files of the New York Office contain no information concerning the appointee or any member of his family, or HUGH C. WYLAND.

Upon recontact during the course of this investigation, Confidential Informant New York City T-6 advised that he is not acquainted with the applicant and does not possess any additional information concerning him. T-6 further advised that he does not know the significance of the aforementioned notation which appeared in the address book of ABRAHAM BROTHMAN.

Concerning ABRAHAM BROTHMAN, it may be noted that the records of the United States District Court, Southern District of New York, reflect that he was tried before IRVING R. KAUFMAN United States District Judge, in November, 1950, charged with two counts; namely, obstructing justice, in that he, with one MIRIAM MOSKOWITZ and HARRY GOLD, agreed on fictitious explanations of their associations with each other and divers other persons, and count two, that he, BROTHMAN, wilfully caused HARRY GOLD to give felse testimony before a Federal Grand Jury on July 31, 1947.

On November 28, 1950 ABRAHAM BROTHMAN was sentenced to two years imprisonment and \$10,000 on count one, and five years imprisonment and \$5,000 on count two, which sentences were to run consecutively.

During the course of this trial, ELIZABETH
BENTLEY, an admitted former Soviet espionage agent, testified
that she acted as a courier in receiving information from
BROTHMAN and transmitting same to her Soviet espionage,
superior, JACOBEGOLES during 1941. Further, that during the
same year she was known to BROTHMAN as "HELEM" and that during
1941 she made Arrangements with BROTHMAN whereby he would be
contacted by a new Soviet courier whose identity was not known
to Miss BENTLEY. Miss BENTLEY also testified that during
the period from 1940 to 1941 she collected ABRAHAM BROTHMAN's
Communist Party dues.

Further, she stated that during BROTHMAN'S trial, HARRY GOLD, a convicted Soviet espionage agent, testified that in or about September, 1941 he received

instructions from his Soviet espionage superior, SEMEN SEMENOV, to contact an individual in New York City for the purpose of obtaining information. GOLD testified that he contacted this individual who turned out to be ABRAHAM BROTHMAN and that on the original contact he informed BROTHMAN that he was sent by HELEN. GOLD also testified that he subsequently received various information much of which related to chemical processes, from BROTHMAN.

Immigration and Naturalization Service

The records of the Immigration and Naturalization Service reflect under petition #569236 that LADISLAV SUTNAR entered the United States for permanent residence at Rouse's Point, New York, from Montreal, Canada, on December 22, 1941 and that he filed Declaration of Intention on May 5, 1942 in the Southern District of New York, and was granted naturalization certificate #6870687 on December 13, 1948. In his petition for naturalization the applicant indicated that he was employed as an artist designer; that he was born on November 9, 1897 at Pilsen, Czechoslovakia and that he was married on July 3, 1923 to FRANTISKA SUTNAR. According to these files, the applicant's wife, FRANTISKA, born on March 19, 1897, entered the United States by plane on June 14, 1946.

These files further reflect that the applicant in a General Information Form listed BRACKET LEWIS, American Friends of Czechoslovakia, 8 West 40 Street, New York, New York, as a "close friend in the United States".

The Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications, prepared and released by the Committee on Un-American Activities, United States House of Representatives, Washington, D. C., deted May 14, 1951, reflects the following concerning the American Friends of Czechoslovakia:

'This front organization became active in June of 1944. Its headquarters is located at 8 West Fortieth Street in New York City, and the organization is under the leadership of William J. Schieffelin. (California Committee on Un-American Activities, Report, 1948, p. 145.)

You may perhaps recall that, according to Informant Gregory, in approximately May of 1940, Jacob Golos, the Russian Agent, introduced Gregory to Abe Brothman, who was employed in the Republic Steel Company, New York City as an engineer. After Gregory met Brothman he indicated that he had some blue prints to be copied and the copies delivered to Golos. Gregory met Brothman approximately ten times until sometime in the Fall of 1940. Sometimes Golos would meet Brothman to obtain these blue prints direct but whenever these appointments could not be handled personally, Gregory would execute them.





On May 23, 1947, KCR CHIEN contacted FRANCES ACCLERNAN, mentioned in previous reports as a close associate of URSULA WASSERIAN, the alleged paramour of MAURICE MINDUS, well known writer and former correspondent of "New York Herald Tribune". McCLERNAN told KCRCHIEN that she saw "FRANK B. FRANK" (ph.) last night and stated that FRANK was a correspondent for "Business Week" magazine and that he was leaving for Prague. McCLERNAN suggested that KCRCHIEN endeavor to reach FRANK before he leaves, and she thought he would make a good contact man in selling the plastic process developed by ABE (probably ABE EROTHMAN) in Central Europe. On the same day, KCRCHIEN contacted the McGraw-Hill Publishing Company. The Company stated that FRANK is no longer working for them and would not be doing enything for them in Prague and that he usually stayed at the Holland Hotel, New York City. The informant advised that KORCHIEN contacted the Holland Hotel with negative results.

On the same day, EROTHERN contacted KCRCHIEN, and they discussed the possibility of using FRANK E.XFRANK as a contact in Prague, Czechoslovakia,

On May 26th, KCRCHIEN was in contact with a Mr. HCLMES, advising him that JOHN/FERNO, KCRCHIEN's brother-in-law, was showing a preview of some of his films at the Preview Theatre, 600 Broadway, New York City. KCRCHIEN then indicated that he may go to Columbus, Chio, for a week or so in June, providing the General Homes Corporation starts production of his aluminum house.

On May 27th, KCRCHIEN was in contact with BELLA DODD and advised her that he had looked over the building for necessary repairs and that it would cost approximately \$10,000. From the conversation, it appeared that the building in question would be used for a school.

On May 27, 1947, an unknown man contacted KCRCHIEN's office. The informant ascertained that the person in charge of KCRCHIEN's office is a negro draftsman and that he gave his name and address to this unknown man as JACK/HILL, 108 East 97th Street, New York City.

On May 28th, KORCHIEN was in contact with oen LEON STRAUSS (ph.) and advised STRAUSS that he had spoken to LEON STRAUSS the housing matter.

On May 29th, KCRCHIEN was in contact with ERCHMAN's office and was advised by MCRIAN/MCS KOWITZ, ERCHMAN's secretary, that ARE was still busy with two covernment men; KCRCHIEN stated to MCSKOWITZ that he had lunch with EDEMITH, who was now in the export-import business. It is to be noted that perhaps this ED SMITH is identical with the former Director of the National Council of Soviet American Friendship.
