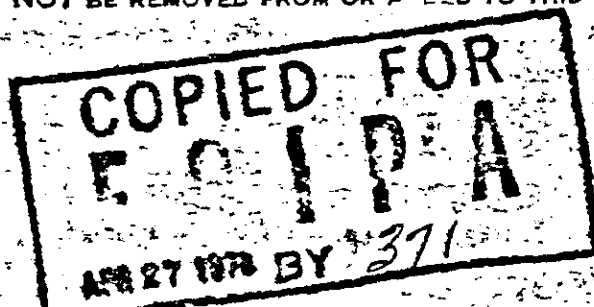

MEMORANDUM FOR THE ATTORNEY GENERAL

X In connection with this Bureau's investigation of Soviet espionage, you have previously authorized a technical surveillance on the residence and office of A. Brothman. It has now been determined that he spends a large portion of his time in his laboratory known as the A.B.A. Laboratory, 85-03 57th Avenue, Elmhurst, Jackson Heights, Long Island, Telephone Newtown 9-6093.

I recommend authorization of a technical surveillance on Brothman at his laboratory for the purpose of determining the extent of his activities on behalf of the Soviets and for the additional purpose of identifying espionage agents.
