The subject ABRAHAM J. SUROVELL registered with LB 136, Brooklyn, MY. His address at the time of registration was 1245 East 9 Street, Brooklyn, MY.

During period in service he was on leave for 10 days in 1943 at 115 West 16 Street, NYC. Both parents of the subject ABRAHAM J. SUROVELL were born in Russia.

As per request of the WFO, the indices of this office were reviewed in connection with the International Economic Research Bureau, 68 Williams Street, NYC, and its director, WILLIAM J. BAXTER.

Mr. BAXTER, who heads the organization, is an economist and statisticism, who was the subject of a registration act investigation by the Bureau in 1942-43.

BAXTER on 10/21/40, published a book entitled "Japan and America Must Work Together", for which he received payment from the Japanese Chamber of Commerce.

The case was subsequently withdrawn from the Grand Jury, District of Columbia, on the request of the Department of Justice.

The general function of the organization is the periodical circulation of bulletin-type circulars by subscription, which circulars predict market trends, business conditions, etc.

In connection with information obtained through interviews of MAX and HELENE ELITCHER, which information was specifically set out in MY letter to Eureau dated 4/4/52, with a cc to the WFO, the NFO should refer to MY report and letter of SA VINCENT J. CAHILL, dated 3/31/52, entitled "COGOG, IS - C", (WFO 100-17070), wherein the subject information is fully set out and documented.

Enclosed herewith are five copies of the Summary Report of SA JAMES D. HUPPERT in captioned matter dated July 18, 1952, at Washington, D. C.

The purpose of instant letter is to set out information regarding the subject in possession of the Washington Field Office which, though considered unsuitable for inclusion in details of enclosed report, is felt pertinent in that it gives further indication of part activities of the subject.

WFO 100-1631 is the case file on HELEN MILIER . . . Hatch Act. Serial 75 sets forth names of 81 persons who sent a telegram to the Secretary of Labor on October 3, 1941, demanding HELPH MILLER's reinstatement and that she be given an impartial hearing. Among the senders of this telegram was listed the name of ARE SUROVELL.

WFO 100-18486-5 containing Military District of Washington report dated August 5, 1947, regarding GERALD L. K. SMITH's "Christian Nationalist Rally" held August 3, 19h7, at monument grounds, Washington, The report reads in part as follows: "The comrades and members of its Washington 'red front' organizations, not content to join in 'the silent treatment' of SMTTH, decided to go all out and oppose him in true militant revolutionary style." According to this report, a meeting was called thirty minutes before SMITH's speech and approximately 100 Communists and their followers met at 718 Fifth Street. Northwest, for instructions. The Washington Police Department furnished the Military District of Washington with the license numbers of automobiles which brought people to the meeting at/710 Fifth Street, N.W. Included was an automobile registered to ARE J J SUROVEIL, 247 Delaware Avenue, S.W.

WWO 100-17070 is the COGOG file in the Washington Field Office. Serial 302 contains a memorandum written by SA WILLIAM R. CORNELISON on March 23, 1948. It states that the agent had examined the address book and calander of ELEANCR CULTEM PRISER, 121 Joliet Street, S.W., on December 23, 1947. Included on the calander, under the unexplaining head, W.C.C.P., was the name ARF SUROVELL FIFANOR and JOSEPH RELSER are known to the Washington Field Office as quite active in affairs sponsored or dominated by the Communist Party an Washington, D. h. 71080038 VOO-446.

On the evening of April 6, 1951, Special Agents JOHN B.
VAN ETTEN and JOSEPF E. KELLER conducted a surveillance in the vicinity of 125 Joliet Street, Southwest, where a social affair sponsored by the Southwest Pranch of the Progressive Party, District of Columbia, was in progress. It was noted that this affair was being held in the apartment of ELEANOR and JOSEPH REISER. Among the automobiles which were parked in the vicinity and whose occupants entered the above address was an automobile registered to APE JACK/SUROVELL of 1102 46th Street, S.E.

On the evening of June 16, 1951, SA VAN ETTEN and GILBERT G. RENJAMIN took up a surveillance in the vicinity of 4863 Potomac Avenue, Northwest, where the Progressive Party was sponsoring a social function. Observed in the vicinity of the above address was an automobile registered to ARE JACK SUROVELL of 1102 46th Street, S.E., but the occupants of this automobile were not observed.

On December 8, 1951, the Washington Committee to Defend the Bill of Rights held a bizarre at 1867 Kalarama Road, N.W. Special Agents VA ETTEN, CRAWFORD F. WILLIAMS and WINFRED H. ANDERS observed persons entering and leaving this affair. At 1:18 p.m., an unidentified white man parked his automobile and entered 1867 Kalorama Road, Northwest, and departed at 2:07 p.m. It was found that this automobile was registered to ARE J. SURCVELL, 1102 46th Street, S.E.

It should also be pointed out with reference to information furnished by MAX and HELENE INTCHER that HELENE ELITCHER has gone into some detail in explaining the workings of the Communist Party group of which she was a member while in Washington, D. C. (This proup was the Navy Department cell of the Communist Party which was not identified in the details of enclosed report to avoid possible disclosure of informant's identity.) Mrs. ELITCHER has advised that no Party membership cards were issued and dues were collected by the chairman who was elected for a period of one year. He would then turn the money over to another person who was known to the chairman to be in contact with Communist Party headquarters.

In addition to information reported as coming from MAX FIGTORER, it is further noted that his membership was also in the Navy Department cell of the Communist Party and was continuous from around 1963 to the spring of 1966 or early summer. At that time he advised the chairman of the cell that he was discontinuing his Communist Party membership and returning to New York. The chairman

to whom MAX ELITCHER gave this information was APE SUROVELL and SUROVELL's membership in the Communist Party was still in effect when ELITCHER left Washington, D. C.

Tiles of the Washington Field Office also reflect that on October 27, 1950, the subject, ARRAHAM JACOB SUROVEIL, testified before the Southern District of New York Grand Jury which was considering the allegations of espionage brought against one MORTON SOBELL. At this time SUROVELL refused to answer any questions of the Grand Jury on prounds of possible self-incrimination.

DETAILS: AT JASHIHGTON, D. C.

I. BACKGROUND

A. Birth Data

On February 9, 1942, SUROVELL was employed by the Hydrographic Office, Navy Department, Washington, D. C. His personnel file reflecting this employment gives his date of birth as March 2, 1920, at Brooklyn, New York. His father's name is HARRY W. SUROVELL, whose address in this file is shown as 115 West 16th Street, New York City, New York.

T-1, a confidential informant of known reliability, advised on June 17, 1952, that the subject's full name if ABRAHAM JACOP SUROVELL.

B. Citizenship

From the aforementioned birth data, it is apparent that subject holds United States citizenship by virtue of his birth taking place within this country.

C. Education

On August 28, 1950, SUROVELL provided information which included details of his background. He advised that he graduated from Brooklyn College in June, 1940, receiving an A.B. Degree with a major in Art.

According to the information furnished by SUROVELL, he enrolled in a National Defense Training Course at McKinley High School after coming to Washington, D. C. He was enrolled in this course June 1941 through August 1941 as per information in subject's personnel file in the Navy Department.

D. Marital Status

Records of the Credit Bureau, Washington, D. C., contain a report on the subject and his wife, ESTHER SUROVELL. The date of subject's marriage to ESTHER SUROVELL is not known and District of Columbia Marriage Records contain no information. However, ESTHER SUROVELL was also employed by the Navy Department and her file reflects she was hired under her maiden name, ESTHER SHAICK, on September 26, 1941. According to this record, she is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. DAVID SHAICK of West Orange, New Jersey.

Mrs. JOHN W. KNOX, 1100 - 46th Street, Southeast, Washington, D.C., advised that subject and wife reside at 1102 with their three children, PAUL, approximately five years of age, and twins, ALLEN and JEFFREY, about three years old.



T-2, of known reliability, was a member of the Communist Party in Mashington, D. C., during the period 1943-46. T-2 advised in February, 1952, the informant knew ESTHER SUROVELL as a member of T-2's group in the Communist Party. The informant stated that ESTHER SUROVELL was also a member of the Housewives Group of the Communist Party. T-2 could not furnish the exact dates of ESTHER SUROVELL's membership in the Communist Party.

T-3, of known reliability, has also advised that ESTHER SUROVELL was known to T-3 as a member of the Communist Party during the same period, but was also unable to furnish her exact membership dates.

On June 5, 1952, T-h, of known reliability, advised that ESTHER and JACK SUROVELL were members of the Progressive Party, Washington, D. C., and were considered "good people" by Progressive leaders in this area. The informant stated that ESTHER and the subject have never, to the informant's knowledge, disagreed with any Communist Party policy or program. This informant had no information which would positively identify ESTHER and JACK SUROVELL as members of the Communist Party.

E. Credit and Criminal Record

The Credit Report at the Credit Bureau, Washington, D. C., on subject and his wife is dated August 16, 1950, and the SUROVELLS are rated as satisfactory on two accounts. This record was checked by SE WALTER J. TOLSON.

Arrest records at the Mashington Police Department reflect that ASE JACK CHROVELL, age 22, was arrested at 2:15 a.m. on August 23, 1942, and charged with fornication. Arrested with subject was ESTHER SHAICK, age 21, of 799 Decatur Street, Northwest. (It is noted that ESTHER SHAICK is subject's wife's maiden name.) This case went to court on August 27, 1942, and the disposition is given as nolle prossed. Subject's address at the time of his arrest was 2403 57th Avenue, Landover, Maryland.

Arrest records further reflect that SUROVELL was arrested for traffic violations on 13 different occasions between August 28, 1947, and March 7, 1951. These records were examined by SE NICHOLAS R. INNFREDA.

F. Employment

As mentioned under the caption "Education", SUROVELL graduated from college in June, 1940. His personnel file at the Navy Department reflects he was employed from September, 1940 until June, 1941 in Tashington, D. C., at the Corcoran Art School.





According to Civil Service Commission personnel records, the subject was appointed as an engineer draftsman with the Federal Security Agency, Office of Education Defense, on August 21, 1941. He resigned this position January 20, 1942.

Further reference to the subject's Navy Department personnel file discloses he was employed on February 9, 1942, as an engineer and draftsman, Hydrographic Office, Washington, D. C. According to this file he was given a military furlough on December 1, 1942. Effective February 18, 1946, SUROVELL returned to the above position and was promoted to Nautical Scientist on April 15, 1946. Subject resigned this employment on June 27, 1947, to accept a position in private industry.

According to the Credit Bureau Report previously referred to, SUROVELL was employed as a partner in Sangster and Surovell Association, 1129 Vermont Avenue, Northwest, as of June 1, 1947.

Mr. JAMANS C. SUIT, building manager, 1129 Vermont Avenue, N.W., advised in February, 1952 that his records show Sangster and Surovell Associates (draftsmen) moved from the fifth floor office about one year ago. The latest address Mr. SUIT had for this firm was rear of 2133 K Street, N.W.

T-5, of known reliability, advised on February 11, 1952, that the subject was engaged in a business known as Cartographics, Incorporated, 2131 Stevens Court, Northwest (rear of 2133 K Street, N.Y.).


Records of Dum and Bradstreet, Incorporated, contain a report regarding Cartographics, Incorporated, dated October 16, 1951. This report lists ABRAHAM J. (SUROVELL as Vice-President of this Corporation which was chartered in Faryland on May 1, 1950, to take over the partnership of Sangster-Surovell. A charter ammendment gave the firm its present name on August 1, 1951. This corporation does graphic arts work, which includes designing and technical drafting, and it is noted in this report that 90 per cent of their work is performed for the United States Government.

G. Residences

It has been pointed out that SUROVELL came to Washington, D. C., in 19h0. The City Directory for that year contains no address for the subject. T-6, of known reliability, advised December 11, 19h3, that SUROVELL had previously resided in New York with his father, HAMMY SUROVELL, at 12h5 East Ninth Street, Brooklyn, New York.

The 1941 City Directory for Washington, D. C., gave the subject's address as 3574 11th Street, Northwest. This Directory also indicates that 3574 11th Street, N.W., was the address of one SIDNEY R. KATZ.

WEO 100-5587



T-7, of known reliability, stated in April, 1941 that SIDNEY H. KATZ was a member of the Communist Party working in Washington, D C., directly out of the National Office of the Communist Party in New York.

T-8, of known reliability, advised in early 19h3 that SIDNEY KATZ was a leader in the formation of the United Federal Workers of America, CIO. T-8 and knew him as a close associate of several individuals known to T-8 as members of the Communist Party. T-8 further advised that Communists who had talked with T-8 about Communist matters had admitted the connection between SIDNEY KATZ and the Communist Party. T-8 stated that this statement also applied to Mrs. 670 KATZ, JULIA SERGOVICS KATZ.

The "Daily Worker" (East coast Communist newspaper) of November 11, 1912, identified JULIA KATZ as a newly elected national director of the CIO Women's Auxiliaries and listed her among the women who had, under Communist auspices, signed and sent a telegram of encouragement to the women of Russia, England and China.

T-9, of known reliability, advised May 23, 1945, that JULA KATZ's name appeared on a memorandum, headed Unity Club, in the CPA (Communist Political Association), headquarters at 201 West Franklin Street, Baltimore, Maryland. T-9 could not attach special significance to this information.

T-10, of known reliability, advised in early 19hh that A. J. and E. S. SUROVELL moved from 2h08 57th Avenue, Tuxedo, Maryland, to Washington, D. C., approximately June 1, 19h3. T-11, of known reliability, advised at the same time that T-11 remembered ABRAHAM SUROVELL having lived with Mr. and Mrs. SIBNET KATZ at the Tuxedo, Maryland, address. T-11 stated that all of these individuals moved from that address in June or July, 19h3.

The Credit Bureau Report on the SUNOVELLS reflects they resided at 247 Delaware Avenue, Southwest, upon their return from Tuxedo, Maryland. The City Directory for 1948 lists this as their street address and their apartment number as 305. The Credit Bureau information further indicates that the SUNOVELLS lived on Delaware Avenue, S.W., for five years prior to moving to 1102 - 46th Street, S.E., in June, 1948. The subject advised in August, 1950, that he resided at 247 Delaware Avenue, Southwest, from August 1943 to May 1948, at which time he moved to 1102 - 46th Street, Southeast. This latter address is subject's present place of residence.

H. Status of Health

Information received from acquaintances of the subject indicates that he is not suffering from any physical deficiency or disability at the present time.

II. CONNECTION WITH THE COMMUNIST PARTY

A. Membership

Reference is again made to information furnished by Confidential Informants T-2 and T-3 regarding the Communist Party membership of subject's wife, ESTHER SUROVELL. T-2 had previously furnished pertinent information regarding subject on September 7, 1950. The informant attended many Communist Party meetings in Washington, D. C., during the period 1943-46 and remembered definitely that ABE and ESTHER SUROVELL were members of T-2's particular group. T-2 could not furnish the exact dates of their membership, but believed they were affiliated with this group throughout the 1943-46 period.

According to T-2, all members of this group were affiliated with the United Federal Workers of America and affairs of the Union were frequently discussed at the meetings. However, T-2 stated there was absolutely no possibility that a person could presume that these were Union meetings and not meetings of Communist Party members. T-2 did not provide specific dates on which meetings took place but stated that the meetings occurred normally every two weeks.

T-3 has advised that T-3 joined the United Federal Workers of America in Washington, D. C., in 1942 or 1943 and was active in Communist Party work, Washington, D. C., until 1948. T-3 knew ABE SUROVELL as a Communist Party member throughout the above period.

Reference has been made to information supplied by the subject on August 28, 1950. The following is quoted as a portion of a voluntary statement made by the subject at that time:

"... I have never been and I am not now a member of the Communist Party. My wife is not and has never been a member of the Communist Party. I have no friends or acquaintances who are members of the Communist Party, as far as I know. I have never attended a meeting of the Communist Party."

As previously mentioned, T-h furnished information on the SUROVELLS on June 5, 1952. Although T-h had no information revealing subject to be a member of the Communist Party, informant stated that SUROVELL and his wife have been sympathetic with Communist Party policies and programs.



A. American Youth Congress

The American Youth Congress has been cited by the Attorney General of the United States as a subversive and Communist organization.

T-12, of known reliability, advised in early 1941 that the second annual youth conference, sponsored by captioned organization, was held in Washington, D. C., November 1, 2 and 3, 1940. Among those who attended, according to T-12, was ARE SUROVELL of the Washington Youth Council, residence 3574 11th Street. N.W.

R. American Peace Mobilization

The American Peace Mobilization, during the Stalin-Hitler Pact has been cited as subversive and Communist by the Attorney General of the United States. T-13, of known reliability, furnished the names of those persons on the active indices of captioned organization in early 1941. Included was the name ABE SUROVELL, 3574 11th Street, Northwest.

C. Town Meeting of Youth

The Special Committee on Un-American Activities in a report dated March 29, 19th, cited the Town Meeting of Youth as a Communist front in Washington, B. C.

According to T-14, ARE SUROVELL of the Washington Youth Council attended this function. 674

D. Washington Book Shop

The Washington Book Shop was cited by the attorney General of the United States as subversive and Communist in December, 1947, and September, 1948.

T-15, of known reliability, advised February 18, 1944, that APE CUROVELL had been an active member of the Washington Book Shop. His address had been 2408 57th Avenue, Tuxedo, Maryland, and according to T-15.

T-16, of known reliability, advised in 1946 that ARE SUROVELL had been an active member of the Washington Rook Shop as of December 13, 1947.





Will reference to various organization which have been cited as subversive or Communist, SIROVEIL included the following pertinent information on August 28, 1950:

a member of the Washington Book Shop, located on 17th Street between I and K Streets I wrote the Book Shop and requested that my name be removed from the membership list. I did this because I read in the paper that it was a Communist organization. I also recall attending a meeting of the American Youth Congress sometime in 1940 or 1941. . . I did not attend as a delegate or an official but merely at the invitation of someone I cannot now recall. I was never a member of the American Peace Mobilization or any other organization of this kind as far as I can remember."

IV. MISCELLANEOUS ACTIVITIES

A. Progressive Party, Washington, D. C.

On December 22, 1951, T-18, of known reliability, advised that the majority of the current officers (including club officers) of the Progressive Party, Washington, D. C., were either Communist Party members or Communist Party sympathizers. On the basis of this identification, the informant was of the opinion that the Progressive Party, Washington, D. C., was infiltrated and controlled by the Communist Party.

T-17, of known reliability, advised January 23, 1952, that a meeting of the Progressive Party, Washington, D. C., was held at 1867 Kalorama Road, Northwest, on January 18, 1952. It was estimated 75 persons attended this meeting including APE SUROVELL and his wife, according to T-17.

at the under the sponsorship of the Southeast Group, Progressive Party, Washington, p. C. stated that the subject attended this function. 17d

B. Emergency Committee to Defend MARIE RICHARDSON

MARIE RICHARDSON was indicted in United States District Court, Washington, D. C., in November, 1951, for falsely disclaiming Communist Party affiliation in government employment applications submitted in 1948 and 1949. She was subsequently tried and convicted on this charge. In December, 1951, the captioned committee was organized in Washington, D. C., to assist in MARIE RICHARDSON's defense. On February &, 1952, T-h advised that the majority of the members of this committee were Communists and that the committee was controlled and dominated by the Communist Party.

On January 12, 1952, this committee gave a benefit party at 641 Fourth Street, Northeast. The affair was raided by officers of the Washington Police Department because liquor was being filegally dispensed. The newspaper, Washington Afro-American of January 19, 1952, published a list of those who attended this party and the list included AEE J. and ESTHER SUREVELL of the 1100 block, 46th Street, S.E.

T-17 advised in February, 1952, that a mass meeting of the Emergency Committee to Defend MARIE RICHARDSON was held February 17, 1952, at the Meridian Hill Raptist Church. The informant stated that both subject and his wife, ESTHER, attended this meeting.

In November, 1950, T-10 advised that LILLIAN CLOTT was then known to the informant as Dues Secretary of the Communist Party, Washington, D. C. 57d

C. Identification Record

Records of the Identification Division, Federal Bureau of Investigation, contain background information, including the finger-print classifications for ABRAHAM JACOB SUROVELL under FBI No. 171753B. The record does not indicate any arrest for the subject.

D. Employment

SA HOWARD M. DENNEY ascertained through personal observation on October 8, 1953, that the subject was still employed at Federal Graphics, Seventh Floor, 1129 Vermont Avenue, N. W., Washington, D. C., as a Draftsman.

E. Residences

The above mentioned identification record reflects the subject's residence as of August 21, 1941, as 17 Pryor Avenue, Tuxedo, Maryland. The September, 1953, Washington, D. C. telephone directory lists subject at 1102 46th Street, S. E.

II. ORGANIZATIONS

A. Washington Committee to Defend the Bill of Rights

T-1, of known reliability, stated that the Washington Committee to Defend the Bill of Rights gave a picnic on July 27, 1952, at 1241 Talbert Street, S. E., Washington, D. C. Informant stated that approximately fifty persons attended this picnic, including subject and his wife ESTHER SUROVELL.

T-2, of known reliability, also mentioned the presence of JACK SUROVELL and his wife, ESTHER, at the above mentioned picnic.

It is noted that T-2 stated in June, 1952, that the Washington Committee to Defend the Bill of Rights was dominated and controlled by the Communist Party of Washington, D. C.; the informant based this opinion

on the fact that all members of the Washington Committee to Defend the Bill of Rights were either Communist or in agreement with the Communist programs and policies. The Washington Committee to Defend the Bill of Rights has been cited by the Attorney General under Executive Order 10450.

B. Progressive Party

T-1, of known reliability, stated that JACK SUROVELL and ESTHER SUROVELL were among approximately 225 persons who attended a mass meeting sponsored by the Progressive Party of the District of Columbia held at Odd Fellows Hall, Ninth and T Streets, N. W., Washington, D. C., on October 16, 1952, which meeting featured a speech by CHARLOTTA BASS, Progressive Party candidate for the Vice Presidency of the United States.

It is noted that in November, 1952, T-2 stated that the current leaders of the Progressive Party of the District of Columbia were either Communists or Communist sympathizers, and that this organization had never, to the informant's knowledge, opposed any Communist Party issue or program. Informant stated that on occasions resolutions had been adopted by the Progressive Party of the District of Columbia which had been introduced by various individuals at the direction of the Communist Party.

T-1 stated that JACK SUROVELL and ESTHER SUROVELL were among an estimated fifty persons who attended a meeting sponsored by the Prince Georges - Mongtomery County Progressive Party held upstairs over the Silver Spring Liquor Dispensary at Silver Spring, Maryland, on the evening of September 15, 1953. Informant stated that the main speaker at this meeting was the writer, CARL MARZANI.

T-3, of known reliability, also mentioned that the subject and ESTHER SUROVELL were present at the above mentioned meeting in Silver Spring.

It is noted that T-h, of known reliability, has stated that the Prince Georges - Montgomery County Progressive Party is affiliated with the Progressive Party of Maryland.

It is further noted that T-5, of known reliability, stated in September, 1949, that the Progressive Party of Maryland was dominated and controlled by District 4 of the Communist Party - USA, and was used to further the aims of the Communist Party; however, the informant stated that all members of the Progressive Party of Maryland were not necessarily members of the Communist Party.

III. MISCELLANEOUS

T-2 stated that JACK SUROVELL and ESTHER SUROVELL were among the persons who attended a motion picture which was shown at the Georgetown Theater in Washington, D. C. on December 11, 1952, which was sponsored by the Polish Embassy and for which invitations were sent out based upon the Progressive Party mailing list.

ADMINISTRATIVE PAGE

In rerep dated July 18, 1952, sets forth information furnished by HEIENE ELITCHER, who is designated as T-2 in rerep and MAX ELITCHER, who is designated as T-3 in rerep, concerning Communist Party membership on the part of ABE and ESTHER SUROVEIL. In this connection it is noted that MAX ELITCHER testified on July 7, 1953, in a closed (executive) hearing of the House Committee on Un-American Activities in New York City, at which time ELITCHER mentioned that among persons who had been included in the membership of the Navy Department cell of the Communist Party in Washington, D. C., sometime during the period from 1942 until the middle of 1948, were ABRAHAH SUROVELL and ESTHER SUROVEIL.

The fact that ELITCHER testified as mentioned above should be kept confidential inasmuch as the testimony was given at a closed hearing of the House Committee on Un-American Activities.

Information concerning this hearing was furnished by the New York Office by teletype dated July 7, 1953, captioned MAX ELITCHER; HEIENE ELITCHER - Espionage - R.

Abraham Jacob Surovell was born on March 2, 1920, at Brooklyn, New York. He presently resides at 1102 46th Street, S. E., Tashington, D. C. He has been the subject of a security investigation since July, 1952, and is on the Security Index. A summary report was prepared by the Tashington Field Office on July 18, 1952, and a supplemental summary was prepared on June 22, 1953. The case is now in a closed status.

Investigation reflects that subject was a member of the Communist Party, Washington, D. C., from 1943 to 1948. He has been closely associated with the following Communist Party-sponsored groups: American Youth Congress, American Peace Mobilization, Town Meeting of Youth, Mashington Book Shop Association, Progressive Party, Mashington, D. C., Emergency Committee To Defend Tarie Michardson, and the Tashington Committee To Defend The Bill Of Rights.

During an interview with Max Flitcher, Elitcher identified Survell as a member of the Navy Department cell of the Communist Party in Washington, D. C., from 1943 until 1948. Elitcher ceased his Party activities in August, 1948, and moved to New York City. He believed that Abraham Surovell was Chairman of the Mavy Department cell at that time.

A review of subject's personnel file maintained by the Many Department disclosed that Surovell was employed by the Navy Department on February 9, 1942 as an engineer. He was granted military leave on Pecember 1, 1942, and he returned to his position with the Navy on February 18, 1946. He resigned his employment with the Havy on June 27, 1947, to accept a position in private industry. He is presently employed at Federal Graphics, 1129 Vermont Avenue, Fashington, D. C.

On August 28, 1950, Abraham Surovell was interviewed by Agents of the Washington Field Office. He said that he was not at that time and had never been a member of the Communist Party. He added that his wife, Esther, was not and had never been a member of the Communist Party. Surovell testified before the Southern District of New York Grand Jury, which was considering the allegations of espionage brought against one Martin Sobell. At that time, Survell refused to answer any questions of the Grand Jury on grounds of possible self-incrimination.

In view of subject's Security Index status, copies of all investigative reports have been furnished to the Department. Reports were not previously disseminated to NI as the subject has not been employed by the Havy since 1947, and NI had no apparent interest.

Subject's identity and a synopsis of his activities, as well as his employment by the Navy were furnished to ONI in a report entitled "Communist Party, USA, District /4, Eashington, D. C., (Navy Department cell) Internal Security - C." This report was dated May 22, 1953, and was furnished to ONI June 5, 1953. This report was also furnished to the Department.

Confidential Informant T-4 stated in February 1952 that the leaders of the Progressive Party of the District of Columbia were either Communist or Communist Party sympathizers, and stated that this organization has never, to his knowledge, opposed any CP issues or programs. The informant stated that on occasions, resolutions have been adopted by the Progressive Party of the District of Columbia which have been introduced by various individuals at the direction of the CP.

Confidential Informant T-5 advised in October 1953 that on October 25, 1953, the 5th Annual Convention of the Progressive Party of the District of Columbia was held at Odd Fellows Temple, 9th and T Streets, Northwest, Washington, D. C. The informant stated that in attendance at this meeting was ESTHER SUROVELL who was a representative of the Northeast Club of the Progressive Party to the Executive Board. The informant advised that ABE SUROVELL was also in attendance at this meeting.

Confidential Informant advised in November 1953 that while he knew the subject to be a member of the Progressive Party North East Club, Washington, D. C., he did not know SUROVELL as a member of the CP. This informant reconfirmed b7D this statement in November 1954.

Confidential Informant advised in January 1954 that on December 31, 1953, a New Years Eve party was held by the South East Club of the Progressive Party at 1202 Mississippi Avenue, Southeast. The informant stated that the subject was one of those in attendance at this meeting.

Confidential Informant advised that he knew ABE SUROVELL to be a member of a city wide Peace Committee of the Progressive Party of the District of Columbia as of November 670, 1953.

Confidential Informant T-7 advised that on February 19, 1954, a meeting of the Progressive Party was held at the Meridian Hill Baptist Church, 1725 Kalorama Road, Northwest, at which the main address was given Doctor W. E. B. DUBOIS. The informant stated that an automobile belonging to the subject with District of Columbia license A-4463 was observed stopping at the above location and discharging occupants who were seen entering the church. These individuals were not identified by the informant.

Confidential Informant has identified Doctor
W. E. B. DUBOIS as a member of the Communist Party in 1945. b7D

Confidential Informent advised that the subject and his wife, ESTHER SUROVELL, attended the above meeting at the Meridian Hill Baptist Church. The informant stated that JOSEPH FORER acted as Chairman of this meeting.

Confidential Informant T-9 has advised that JOSEPH FORER furnished legal counsel to GERHART EISLER and JACOB STACHEL, CP members. In May 1950, FORER represented EUGENE DENNIS, National Secretary of the CP USA in the United States District Court in Washington, D. C., in a Contempt of Congress charge.

Confidential Informant advised in June 1954
that on June 12, 1954, a party called a "hoedown" was held
at Odd Fellows Hall, 9th and T Streets, Northwest, Washington,
D. C., and was sponsored by the Progressive Party of the
District of Columbia. The informant advised that approximately
one hundred persons were in attendance, and that the subject
and his wife were among those present.

Confidential Informant advised in June 1954
that the subject was in attendance at a "hoedown" sponsored
by the Progressive Party of the District of Columbia on June
12, 1954, at Odd Fellows Hall, 9th and T Streets, Northwest,
Washington, D. C.

Confidential Informant advised that the Progressive Party obtained a number of tickets to the September 22, 1954, performance of "The Crucible" at the Arena Stage at Washington, D. C., as a money making venture.

The informent advised the subject and his wife were among those in attendance at the performance on the night of September 22, 1954.

Confidential Informant T-10 advised that on December 5, 1953, he observed a number of persons entering the location at \$\frac{1}{1}02\$ Georgia Avenue, Northwest, Washington, D. C., where a bazaar, sponsored by the Progressive Party of the District of Columbia, was being held. The informant stated that occupants, two or three in number, who were discharged from an automobile bearing District of Columbia license plates A-\$\frac{1}{1}63\$ were observed entering this location. It is noted that the above license plates are registered to the subject.

confidential Informant advised that the subject was one of the District of Columbia Progressive Party members who

Progressive Party of Maryland, 612 W. North Avenue, Baltimore, Maryland.

Confidential Informant T-11 advised that the subject was one of those in attendance at a Progressive Party of the District of Columbia meeting held at 1402 Georgia Avenue, Northwest, Washington, D. C., on October 22, 1954. The informant stated the meeting was primarily for the election of officers and that ABE BLOOM was elected Chairman.

Confidential Informant advised in May 1943 that BLOOM was a member of the New Jersey Shore Branch of the CP 570 in 1943.

C. WASHINGTON FREEDOM OF THE PRESS COMMITTEE

The "Daily Worker", an East Coast Communist daily newspaper, issue of November 25, 1952, in an article on Page 1 entitled "Wash. \$817 Puts Us at Halfway Mark", described a party given in honor of ROB HALL, Washington representative of the "Daily Worker" and his wife MICKEY. The article stated that this party, which was given in honor of the HALLS, "set up on an organized basis, a Freedom of the Press Committee in the Nation's Capitol which will be devoted to fighting for the right of the working class, peace press to publish....."

Confidential Informant advised in November 1953 the subject was in attendance at a mass meeting sponsored by the Washington Freedom of the Press Committee held at the Inspiration House, 1867 Kalorama Road, Northwest, on November 13, 1953. The informant stated that the main speaker at the meeting was JOE CLARK, a former "Daily Worker" correspondent in Moscow, who talked on his travels in the U.S.S.R. 170

Confidential Informant advised in November 1953 that the subject was in attendance at the above described meeting sponsored by the Washington Freedom of the Press Committee at the Inspiration House, 1867 Kalorama Road, Northwest, Washington, D. C. 67D

Confidential Informant T-14 advised in March 1954 that on March 26, 1954, a meeting sponsored by the Freedom of the Press Committee was held at the Inspiration House, 1867

Kalorama Road, Northwest, Washington, D. C., at which AENER BERRY, Daily Worker columnist, was the main speaker. The informant advised that the subject's automobile with District of Columbia plates A-4463 was observed parked in the vicinity of the above location. Upon conclusion of the meeting, the informant observed four unidentified females leave the Inspiration House and drive away in the subject's automobile.

D. ROSENBERG - SOBELL COMMITTEE OF WASHINGTON, D. C.

Confidential Informant T-15 stated in 1953 that the New York headquarters of the Committee to Secure Justice in the ROSENBERG - SOBELL Case was advised that the ROSENBERG - SOBELL Committee of Washington, D. C., was formed for the purpose of continuing the fight to vindicate the ROSENBERGS; to free MORTON SOBELL and to establish a fund for the ROSENBERG children. SYLVIA BERNSTEIN represented this local Committee at the National Conference of the Committee to Secure Justice in the ROSENBERG - SOBELL case in Chicago in October 1953.

Confidential Informant advised in February 1953 that SYLVIA BERNSTEIN was a current member of the CP. 67D

JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG were convicted on March 29, 1951, of conspiring to commit espionage and were executed for the same charge on June 19, 1953. SOBELL, a codefendant, was sentenced to thirty years in prison.

Confidential Informant advised in April 1954 that on April 7, 1954, a meeting of the Committee to Secure Justice for MORTON SOBELL was held at Odd Fellows Hall, 9th and T Streets, Northwest, Washington, D. It is noted that this registration is listed to the subject, SUROVELL, with residence at 1102 46th Street, Southeast.

The Committee to Defend MARIE RICHARDSON has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

In February 1952, Confidential Informant T-4 advised that the majority of the members of this Committee were Communist, and that the Committee was controlled and nominated by the CP.

Metropolitan Police Department, Washington, D. C., advised that the subject and his wife were in attendance at a party held for the benefit of MARIE RICHARDSON on January 12, 1952, at 641 4th Street, Northeast, Washington, D. C., stated that EMMA ROBINSON, 78 U Street, Northeast, Washington, D. C., was arrested on a charge of violating regulations of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board. 674

In 1954 Confidential Informant advised that EMMA ROBINSON was a current CP member in the District of b1D Columbia.

Confidential Informant advised in November 1953 that on November 8, 1953, a party was given at the home of ISADOR and ESTAR PASKOFF, 8410 Tahona Drive, Silver Spring,

Confidential Informant advised in September 1953 that a picnic for the benefit of the Washington Jewish Children's School, 4402 Georgia Avenue, Northwest, Washington, D. C., was held at the residence of ISADOR and ESTAR PASKOFF, 8410 Tahona Drive, Silver Spring, Maryland, on September 20, 1954.

Confidential Informant T-18 advised in September 1953 a picnic was held at the residence of ISADOR and ESTAR PASKOFF, 8410 Tahona Drive, Silver Spring, Maryland, and that the subject was one of those in attendance at this affair. The informant advised that there were approximately sixty to eighty individuals present.

Two informents of known reliability advised subject SURo Vel end his wife, ESTHER, were CP members during the period 1943-1948. Reliable informants reported that SURO VELL attended an American Youth Congress (AYC) conference in 1940 and was on the active indices of the American Peace Hobilization (APM) of 1941. During the early 1940's, subject was an active member of the Washington Book Shop Association and, according to advice from a reliable informant, was still active in this organization in December, 1947.

Burecu Agents interviewed SURV VELL on August 28, 1950, 18 at which time he denied CP membership, past or present, on the part of himself or his wife. He stated he had no friends or associates who, to his knowledge, were CP members. He admitted attending a meeting of the AYC in 1940 or 1941 and affirmed he had been a member of the Washington Eook Shop from 1942 to 1946. Subject explained he had requested his name be removed from the membership list of this organization when he heard it had been cited as a CP front group. SURT VELL furnished the above information to Bureau Agents in a statement which he refused to sign.

Reliable informants advised that subject attended a film sponsored by the Polish Embassy on December 11, 1952; also that he had been in contact with the Rumanian Legation in December, 1953.

According to reliable informants, during the period 1942-1954, SURO VELL attended functions of the Washington Committee to Defend the Bill of Rights, the Committee to Defend Marie Richardson and other CP controlled or dominated pragnizations

Bureau Agents interviewed SUROVELL on August 28, 1950, at which time he denied CP membership, past or present, on the part of himself or his wife. He stated he had no friends or associates who, to his knowledge, were CP members. He admitted attending a meeting of the AYC in 1940 or 1941 and affirmed he had been a member of the Washington Bookshop from 1942 to 1946. Subject explained he had requested his name be removed from the membership list of this organization when he heard it had been cited as a CP front group. SUROVELL furnished the above information to Bureau Agents in a statement which he refused to sign.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Retain on Security Index.

There is no information of subject's membership of participation in the activities of a basic revolutionary organization within the last live years. However, there is substantial information of SUROVELL's participation in the PPDC

within the last three years. It is noted one reliable informant identified SUROVELL as a member of the City-Wide Peace Committee of PPDC as of 11/25/53. The PPDC has been described by a reliable informant as being infiltrated and dominated by the CP. Further there is reliable information that subject participated in the affairs of three other Communist front groups within the last three years. These groups have been cited by the Attorney General. This information is believed sufficient to retain SUROVELL on Security Index under criteria set forth in referenced letter.

Mrs. KNOX advised that during the past year she has learned of no activity or statements on the part of the subject or his wife which would indicate any adherence to Communist ideology or which would indicate any attitude contrary to the best interests of the United States.

C. Credit

The files of The Credit Bureau, Incorporated, 1221 G Street, N.W., Washington, N.C., as reviewed by SE NICHOLAS R. MANFREDA on November 9, 1955, reflected that the subject and his wife had a satisfactory credit rating as of January 14, 1954, and contained no additional information.

II. CONNECTIONS WITH COMMUNIST FRONT ORGANIZATIONS

T-1, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on February 10, 1955, that the subject was registered as a member of the Progressive Party in the District of Columbia (PP DC) in 1954.

The National Committee, Communist Party, USA, in issuing its final text of the "Resolution Growing Out of the Presidential Elections" in "Political Affairs," issue of July, 1953, states in substance that in 1948, the Communist Party helped stimulate the formation of the Progressive Party and correctly supported the Progressive Party through the 1952 elections. It then states:

"However, the mistake our Party made was to confuse this task with the historical task of forming a new mass party of the people. As a consequence, there existed the wrong estimate that the formation of the Progressive Party represented something more than the simple emergence of an important fighting force for peace; that it represented the emergence of a mass people's Party."

As a result of this reasoning, the resolution concludes that the "Progressive Party, the Communist Party and other Communist forces" must unite in a broad mass-front coalition.

Concerning "Political Affairs," mentioned above, ELIZABETH GURLEY FLYNN, a convicted party functionary, testified in the case entitled "United States versus ELIZABETH GURLEY FLYNN, et al," on October 20, 1952, that "Political Affairs" has been the theoretical organ of the Communist Party since the publication's beginning in 1945.

The Communist Party (CP) has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

T-l advised on January 31, 1955, that the leaders of the PP DC were either CP members or sympathizers, who never, to the informant's knowledge, opposed any CP issue or program, and who have on occasion adopted resolutions introduced at the direction of the CP.

On the evening of April 16, 1955, Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation observed two couples emerge from the subject's automobile, a 1953 Plymouth bearing Washington, D.C. license AJ 1506, in the vicinity of 8321 Tahona Drive, Silver Spring, Maryland. The two couples were observed to enter the residence at 8321 Tahona Drive, Silver Spring, Maryland. During the course of the evening, more than twenty other persons were observed entering the same residence.



On May 23, 1955, T-2 advised that ABE SUROVELL attended a "hoedown" on Wednesday evening, May 18, 1955, at Odd Fellows Hall, 9th and T Streets, N. W., Washington, D. C., sponsored by the PP DC.

T-2 advised on October 12, 1955, that on the evening of October 8, 1955, ABE and ESTHER SUROVELL were among the guests of approximately one hundred persons, who attended a farewell party at the home of HELEN and IRVINO WINIK, 3900 Mc Kinley Street, N. W., Washington, D. C., in honor of HELEN and BILL EHONICK and FLORENCE and SOL TABOR, both of which couples were planning to leave Washington, D. C., in the near future.

HELEN and IRVING WINIK and HELEN and HILL SHONICK were identified by T-1 in February, 1953, as current members of the CP in the Washington, D. C. area at that time.

T-3, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised in March, 1953, that SOL TABOR was known to him in approximately 1951, as a member of the CP in the Washington, D. C. area.



The PFDC "Eallot for election, 1955-1956," furnished by T-6 on December 2, 1955, reflected that ABE ELOOM, mentione above, was the Chairman of the PPDC. T-6 was in a position to furnish reliable information in this matter.

JOSEPH FORER, mentioned above, was one of the attorneys representing the CP, United States of America, before the Subversive Activities Control Board.

On September 30, 1955, T-7, who was in a position to furnish reliable information in this matter, furnished information which reflected that as of that date, checks of the JCS, described in Section II-1, bore the name MEYER KRAUS, identified thereon as President. This information was furnished on a confidential basis and should not be made public except in a usual proceeding, following the issuance of a subpoena.

HERBERT FUCHS, 2220 49th Street, N. W., Washington, D. C., an admitted former member of the CP and the Communist Political Association (CPA), 1934-1946, who was active in secret U. S. Government CP groups in a leadership capacity in Washington, D. C., and in Denver, Colorado, 1936-1946, advised on August 23, 1955, that DAVID REIN, mentioned above, was a member of the Secret U. S. Government CP group at the National Labor Relations Board (NLRB) during the period October, 1937, to mid-summer, 1942. FUCHS was unable to give the exact dates of NEIN's CP membership, but stated that it comprised almost the entire period that REIN was employed by the NLRB.

REIN's personnel file at the NLRB indicates that he was employed by that agency from March 16, 1938, to July 20, 1942.

The CPA has been designated by the Attorney General of the U. S. pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

At 8:35 p.m. on January 6, 1956, a Special Agent of the FBI observed MEYER SAMOLS, identified by T-3 on February 12, 1954, as a current CP member, enter subject's residence at 1102 46th Street, S. E.

WASHINGTON SOBELL COMMITTEE, also known as, Sobell Committee of Washington, Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case, Rosenberg-Sobell Committee of Washington, D. C., Committee for the Release of Morton Sobell

An informant, who has supplied reliable information in the past, on March 7, 1952, reported that the Washington, D. C., chapter of the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case was at that time operating in the District of Columbia. The informant subsequently identified this group as the "Washington Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case."

An informant, who has supplied reliable information in the past, in September, 1953, reported that the District of Columbia group of the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case, known as the "Rosenberg-Sobell Committee of Washington, D. C.," was becoming active in the District of Columbia for the purpose of vindicating the Rosenbergs and obtaining the release of MONTON SOBELL.

The informant noted above, who reported on March 7, 1952, again reported on December 30, 1954, that the Washington, D. C., Group of the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case was known at that time as the "Committee for the Release of Morton Sobell."

An informant, who is in a position to supply reliable information, on May 21, 1956, made available information reflecting the name of the District of Columbia group of the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case at that time to be "Sobell Committee of Washington."

A previously referred to informant on August 21, 1953, reported that of eighteen persons making up the "working" members of the Washington Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case who took part in arranging the activities of this group, ten were known to the informant as being members of the CP. Informant added that the activities of this group were controlled by the CP. This informant reported on December 30, 1954, that the Rosenberg-Sobell Committee of Washington, D. C., must receive approval for its present activities from the National Headquarters of the National Rosenberg-Sobell Committee.

WFU 100-5587

An informant, who has supplied reliable information in the past, on September 25, 1956, reported that the Sobell Committee of Washington continues to function in the District of Columbia. This informant on the same date made available information reflecting that this organization currently used the name, "Washington Sobell Committee."

The National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case (NCSJRC) maintains national headquarters in Room D, 940 Broadway, New York City, and the mailbox servicing this office is labeled "Sobell Committee."

JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG and MORTON SOBELL were convicted in the United States District Court, Southern District of New York, on March 29, 1951, of conspiracy to commit espionage on behalf of the Soviet Union. The ROSENBERGS were sentenced to death on April 5, 1951, and MORTON SOBELL to thirty years imprisonment on the same date. JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG were legally executed at Sing Sing Prison, Ussining, New York, on June 19, 1953, and MORTON SOBELL is currently serving his sentence at the United States Penitentiary, Alcatraz, California.

NOWARD RUSHMORE, a newspaper reporter with the "New York Journal American," advised in January, 1952, that the NCSJRC was formed on January 2, 1952, for the purpose of obtaining a new trial for the ROSEMBERGS.

A confidential informant, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on May 9, 1956, that the NCSJRC was attempting to keep alive the Rosenberg Case and to fight for the release of NCRTON SOBELL. He stated that the CP took an extremely active part in assisting the committee.

THE PROGRESSIVE PARTY OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA (PPDC)

on January 15, 1943, Mrs. MARY STALCUP MARKWARD, an admitted member of the CP and CPA in Washington, D. C., 1943-1949, advised that at a meeting of the City Committee of the CP of the District of Columbia on January 11, 1948, motions were passed to set up a Political Action Committee in Washington, D. C., for the purpose of coordinating all activity with regard to the "Third Party Movement." It was decided to set up "Wallace for President Clubs" in Washington, D. C. These groups subsequently became the PPDC. On December 17, 1951, Mrs. MARKWARD advised that the PPDC during the years 1943 and 1949 was dominated and controlled by the CP of the District of Columbia.

An informant, who has furnished reliable information in the past, on February 25, 1952; November 14, 1952, November 27, 1953; and January 31, 1955, identified the leaders of the PPDC, as of the above dates, as either CP members or CP sympathizers. This informant added that the PPDC has never opposed the CP on any issue or program.

It is noted than an informant, who has supplied reliable information in the past, on February 8, 1956, reported that the PPDC was dissolved on February 7, 1956.

Regarding the National Progressive Party, it is noted that the National Committee, CP, USA, in issuing its final text of the "Resolution Growing Out of the Presidential Elections" in "Political Affairs," issue of July, 1953, states in subtance that in 1943 the CP helped stimulate the formation of the Progressive Party and correctly supported the Progressive Party through the 1952 elections. It then states:

"However, the mistake our Party made was to confuse this task with the historic task of forming a new mass party of the people. As a consequence, there existed the wrong estimate that the formation of the Progressive Party represented something more than the simple emergence of an important fighting force for peace; that it represented the emergence of a great mass people's Party."

As a result of this reasoning, the resolution concludes that the "Progressive Party, the CP and other progressive forces" must unite in a broad, mass-front realition.



I. BACKGROUND

Residence

On April 16, 1957, T-1, who was in a position to furnish reliable information, reported that subject had sold his residence at 1102 46th Street, S.E., Washington, D. C., on April 12, 1957. T-1 stated that subject would reside as of April 15, 1957 at 76-12 166th Street, Flushing, Queens Borough, New York, but had retained the right of occupancy to his residence in Washington, D. C., until Nay 1, 1957.

On April 16, 1957, and April 22, 1957, T-2, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that subject had left Washington, D. C., for New York on April 16, 1957. T-2 continued that subject's wife, ESTHER SUROVELL would remain in Washington, D. C., with their children until April 30, 1957, at which time she would join her husband in New York City.


ESTHER SUROVELL, mentioned above, was identified during the late 1940's by T-3 as a member of the Navy Yard Department Cell of the Communist Party at Washington, D. C., during the period 1942-1948. T-3 has furnished reliable information in the past. The Communist Party has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

The records of the New York State Bureau of Motor Vehicles reviewed by SA DONALD A. RIVERS during April, 1957, reflected that 1957 New York license 3C-7908 was issued to ABE J. SUROVELL for a 1953 Green Plymouth automobile. This registration reflected his residence as 76-12 166th Street, Flushing, Long Island, New York.

Personal observation of SA G. MAYLON MILLER on April 16, 1957, at Washington, D. C., reflected that subject's 1957 Green Plymouth automobile bears New York State license 3C-7908.

Employment

Records of the New York State Bureau of Motor Vehicles, noted above, reflected subject's business address as 811 Union Street, Brooklyn, New York.

On April 12, 1957, T-2, described above, advised that subject's Washington, D. C., employer, the Atlantic Map Company, Warner Building, had sold this business and was moving its office and staff to New York City.


II. MISCELLANEOUS

On December 13, 1956, T-4, who has furnished reliable information in the past, reported that subject had been among the 55 people present at a social affair held at the residence of IRVING and HELEN WINIK, 3900 McKinley Street, N.N., on December 8, 1956. T-4 continued that Dr. ANNETTE T. RUBENSTEIN, the featured speaker, spoke concerning her recent book "I Vote My Conscious" about the life of the late VITO MARCANTONIO.

On February 26, 1953, T-5 identified IRVING and HELEN WINIK, mentioned above, as current members of the Communist Party. T-5 has furnished reliable information in the past.

On December 10, 1956, T-6 identified Dr. ANNETTE T. RUBENSTEIN, mentioned above, as a member and one-time candidate of the American Labor Party. T-6 has furnished reliable information in the past.

T-7, who has supplied reliable information in the past, advised on September 9, 1954, that from the time of its inception in 1936 there existed within the American Labor Party (ALP) a struggle for power among three groups. These were the Communist Party, the Socialist Party, and the Social Democratics. By the early 1940's the Communist Party emerged as the controlling force within the ALP in the major industrial area in New York State. Generally these were the areas around Albany, Buffalo, Jamestown, Rochester, Schenectady, Syracuse, Troy and the Hudson River Valley; Columbia, Dutchess, Nasseu, and Westchester Counties; and New York City with the exception of Brooklyn. In 1942 the Communist Party was able to capture the ALP in Brooklyn. Informant knew this situation to continue up until at least 1949. The ALP never developed into an organization of any real consequence in the nonindustrial areas of the New York State.



T-8, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on May 4, 1956, that the Communist Party then as in the past through its members in key positions in the ALP constituted the force that controlled it.

On October 7, 1956, PETER HAWLEY, New York State Chairman, ALP, announced the ALP State Committee unanimously approved a resolution dissolving the organization and ordering the liquidation of its assets.

IOUIS F. BUDENZ, former Managing Editor of the "Daily Worker," an east coast Communist newspaper, advised on August 8, 1950, that "as early as the late 1930's I was advised by EARL BROWDER that VITO MARCANTONIO was a close friend of the party but it was not until the early 1940's that I was definitely advised by JACK STACHEL that VITO MARCANTONIO had agreed to be under Communist discipline."

EARL BROWDER was the former General Secretary of the CPUSA; JACK STACHEL was a former CP functionary in New York.

On February 5, 1957, T-9, who was in a position to furnish reliable information in the past, related that ABE and ESTHER SUROVELL, 1102 Li6th Street, S.E., Washington, D. C., were among the individuals who forwarded Christmas greeting cards during 1956 to MARIE RICHARDSON HARRIS at the Federal Reformatory, Alderson, West Virginia.

MARIE RICHARDSON HARRIS, noted above, was convicted on February 28, 1952, in the United States District Court for the District of Columbia for violation of Section 1001, Title 18, United States Code. Following appeals she was committed to the District of Columbia Jail on July 1, 1954, and on September 13, 1954, was transferred to the Federal Reformatory for Women, Alderson, West Virginia.

On February 26, 1953, T-5, described above identified MARIE RICHARDSON HARRIS as a current member.

On March 5, 1957, T-6, described above, reported that a

III. RESULTS OF INTERVIEW

Subject was contacted without prior notice in the vicinity of 13th and F Streets, N.W., on April 12, 1957, by SAs DAVID P. HURIEY and G. MAYION MILLER. Upon being advised of the identity of the interviewing agents subject stated that he had "nothing to say to the FBI." Upon being further advised that he was as yet unaware of the nature of the agents inquiry SUROVELL indicated that it made no difference. SUROVELL was then informed that the interview was in connection with his affiliation with certain organizations which had been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450. He immediately replied that he did not care to discuss these affiliations. Inquiry was then made as to whether he was desirous of further considering this matter and being contacted at a later date. He then stated categorically that he had nothing to say at this time and that he would have nothing to say to this Bureau at any future time. Further attempts to engage him in conversation resulted in his repeating "I have nothing to say. I don't care to talk to you." At this point the interview was terminated.





Residence and Employment

On July 22, 1957, Mrs. DOROTHEA SMITH, 76-18 166th Street, Flushing, Long Island, New York, advised SA TOY J. FUSON, JR., that she did not know the subject by name. However, Mrs. SMITH did state that the owner of the house at 76-12 166th Street had related to her that a family who had formerly resided in Washington, D.C., had moved into the second floor apartment at 76-12 166th Street, Flushing, Long Island, New York.

On July 24, 1957, HUGH MALLARD, 76-12 166th Street, Flushing, Long Island, New York, advised SA FUSON that ABE SUROVELL resides at that address with his wife, ESTHER, and children. MALLARD said the subject had recently moved from Washington, D.C.

Mr. MALIARD further related that the subject was employed in Brooklyn, however, he did not know the name of the company.

Mr. MALLARD revealed that the subject obtained the apartment at that address through some relatives in the neighborhood, names not recalled. He explained that the business was transacted over the telephone and he knew none of the subject's relatives or associates.

A person who identified himself as Mr. ROTTENBERG, the owner, revealed that SUROVELL was employed by that company as a salesman. Further, he related that the subject was formerly employed by their company in Washington, D.C., for two years.

APPENDIX

The Rosenberg-Sobell Committee of Washington, D.C.

An informant, on March 7, 1952, reported that the Washington, D.C., chapter of the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case was at that time operating in the District of Columbia. The informant subsequently identified this group as the "Washington Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case."

An informant, in September, 1953, reported that the District of Columbia group of the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case, known as the "Rosenberg-Sobell Committee of Washington, D.C.," was becoming active in the District of Columbia for the purpose of vindicating the Rosenbergs and obtaining the release of MORTON SOBELL.

The informant noted above, who reported on March 7, 1952, again reported on December 30, 1954, that the Washington, D.C., Group of the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case was known at that time as the "Committee for the Release of Morton Sobell."

An informant, on May 21, 1956, made available information reflecting the name of the District of Columbia group of the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case at that time to be "Sobell Committee of Washington."

A previously referred to informant on August 21,1953, reported that of eighteen persons making up the "working" members of the Washington Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case who took part in arranging the activities of this group, ten were known to the informant as being members of the CP. Informant added that the activities of this group were controlled by the CP. This informant reported on December 30, 1954, that the Rosenberg-Sobell Committee of Washington, D.C., must receive approval for its present activities from the National Headquarters of the National Rosenberg-Sobell Committee.



An informant, on September 25, 1956, reported that the Sobell Committee of Washington continues to function in the District of Columbia. This informant on the same date made available information reflecting that this organization currently used the name, "Washington Sobell Committee."

The National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case (NCSJRC) maintains national headquarters in Room D, 940 Broadway, New York City, and the mailbox servicing this office is labeled "Sobell Committee."

JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG and MORTON SOBELL were convicted in the United States District Court, Southern District of New York, on March 29, 1951, of conspiracy to commit espionage on behalf of the Soviet Union. The ROSENBERGs were sentenced to death on April 5, 1951, and MORTON SOBELL to thirty years imprisonment on the same date. JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG were legally executed at Sing Sing Prison, Ossining, New York, on June 19, 1953, and MORTON SOBELL is currently serving his sentence at the United States Penitentiary, Alcatraz, California.

HOWARD RUSHMORE, a newspaper reporter with the "New York Journal American," advised in January, 1952, that the NCSJRC was formed on January 2, 1952, for the purpose of obtaining a new trial for the ROSENBERGS.

An informant advised on May 9, 1956 that the NCSJRC was attempting to keep alive the Rosenberg Case and to fight for the release of MORTON SOBELL. He stated that the CP took an extremely active part in assisting the committee.



A review of the Bureau's file in this matter shows that the subject was reportedly a member of the American Peace Mobilization in 1941; the Washington Bookshop Association, 1942-1947; the Communist Party (CP) and Communist Political Association, 1943-1948; the Progressive Party of the District of Columbia (PPDC), 1953-1954; attended meetings and functions of the PPDC, 1952-1956; attended meetings of the Emergency Committee to Defend Marie Richardson and the Washington Committee to Defend the Bill of Rights in 1952; and attended a meeting held by the Rosenberg-Sobell Committee of Washington, D. C., in November, 1954, and May, 1956. The subject invoked the Fifth Amendment when appearing before the House Committee on Un-American Activities in October, 1953, and was uncooperative when interviewed in April, 1957.

In view of the subject's reported inactivity in CP or related affairs, the Bureau is of the opinion that he does not represent a threat to the internal security of the country. The Bureau is canceling the Security Index card on the subject and you should do likewise.
