

Reference is made to the case entitled "SEDTEL; ESPIONAGE-R", NY File 65-16382, Bureau file 65-61685, Newark file 100-34455.

The CIC furnished the names of 668 individuals, employees, former employees, and associates of employees at Fort Monmouth, New Jersey and the Federal Telecommunications Laboratory in Nutley, New Jersey, whom they considered suspect because of their associations with members of the Communist Party and known Soviet agents. A file review was conducted on these individuals and as a result, the Newark, New York and Bureau submitted blind memoranda concerning the results of their file reviews. The above individual was one of these considered suspect by the CIC.

The above mentioned memoranda and any additional correspondence resulting from this project are attached and are being incorporated in the individual's case file.

ADDITIONAL DEROGATORY INFORMATION IN NEWARK FILES

On Associates

NATHAN SUSSMAN - A CP member in 1942-1943, and a member of the TCL at CCNY. Has had periodic contact with ROSENBERG from 1938-1947, and he was seen in ROSENBERG's home by DAVID GREENGLASS, who believed that SUSSMAN may have passed information for ROSENBERG.

HARVEY LEE SACHS - Associate of ALFRED SARANT, suspected Russian espionage agent, while at Cooper Union, NYC, and roomed with SARANT while both employed at Ft. Monmouth. Admits pro-Communist sympathies during period of association with SARANT.

ELEANOR GLASSMAN - Newark files reflect GLASSMAN is the subject of an SM-C case, NY origin. She is the sister of VIVIAN GLASSMAN, who has associated with persons involved in the ROSENBERG espionage apparatus. CIC files reflect PEREZ ZACORIN, referred to on page 2 of weekly Estimate of Subversive Activities dated 9/11/43, visited a home at Long Branch, N. J. on 8/28/43 for the purpose of giving instructions to several civilian employees of the Signal Corps Ground Signal Agency, who are presently organising the UPWA-OIO for their area. According to these files, GLASSMAN was a resident of the above-mentioned home that ZACORIN visited, and attended the meeting.

JUDITH CROLLMAN - CROLLMAN, a former employee of Fort Monmouth, was Shop Steward of the UPWA, and associated with known Communists. CROLLMAN and BALSAM spent the night of 8/23/43 together.

ALICE KATZ - Member of the Executive Committee and Chairman of the Educational Committee of the Monmouth County Chapter, UPWA. It is doubtful that she could have held such positions if she had not been in sympathy with Communist principles.

ESTHER LUTTAN - LUTTAN was the subject of an SM-C case instituted in the Newark Division in 1943 on the basis of her suspected membership in the Shore Branch of the CP from March to August 1943. New York was designated office of origin in this case by the Bureau in July 1944. CIC files reflect LUTTAN was a member of Local 236, UPWA.

VIVIAN FEUCHTBAAK - A close associate of VIVIAN GLASSMAN, described below.

VIVIAN GLASSMAN - GLASSMAN was a girl friend of JOEL BARR, and has been identified by DAVID GREENGLASS as a member of the ROSENBERG apparatus. She has been associated with many of the persons involved in this ring, and admitted to FBI agents that she delivered \$2000 to WILLIAM PERL in Cleveland with instructions for his flight from the U.S. to Mexico. This money supposedly came from a Soviet agent. After PERL refused the money, she was contacted by this man, who reclaimed the money. She has refused to identify this individual.

SOLOMON GREENBERG - GREENBERG formerly employed as an Electrical Engineer at PTL. An informant, of unknown reliability, advised JULIUS ROSENBERG in discussing his contacts said, "You know a man by the name of GREENBERG, who is a big electrical engineer at General Electric in Newark." Investigation disclosed no GREENBERG at GE in or around Newark.

DAVID GREENGLASS said JULIUS ROSENBERG used a certain apartment in N.Y.C. for microfilming. Investigation disclosed ALFRED SARANT was listed as the renter. ALFRED SARANT's notebook contained SOLOMON GREENBERG's name and phone number. GREENBERG denied knowing SARANT.

GREENBERG was found to be taking classified documents from PTL home. GREENBERG stated this was common practice with him for he used them to study. Always returned them.

LEONARD BAUDIN - CP functionary in the New York City area.

WILLIAM PERL - PERL was an associate and acquaintance of JULIUS ROSENBERG who was tried, convicted and executed for espionage. He has been involved with and associated with many of the persons included in the Rosenberg espionage apparatus. PERL was indicted for perjury in connection with the Rosenberg case, and he is presently serving five years for perjury.

JOEL BARR - BARR was a member of the Soviet espionage apparatus in which JULIUS ROSENBERG functioned.

JULIUS AND ETHEL ROSENBERG - On 10/10/50, the Federal Grand Jury, Southern District of New York indicted JULIUS ROSENBERG, ETHEL ROSENBERG, AKATOLI A. YAKOVLEV, MORTON SOBELL, and DAVID GREENGLASS for conspiracy to violate the wartime espionage statute, Sub-section A, Section 92, Title 50, U.S.C. On 3/29/51, SOBELL and the ROSENBERGS were found guilty by a Federal Jury in the Southern District of N. Y. On 6/19/53, the ROSENBERGS were executed in accordance with their sentence.

MORTON SOBELL - MAX KLITCHER, a self-admitted CP member, and associate of both JULIUS ROSENBERG and SOBELL, stated that he was recruited into the CP by SOBELL. KLITCHER advised that ROSENBERG informed him that SOBELL was aiding ROSENBERG in espionage work. KLITCHER further stated SOBELL had attempted to enlist him in espionage work by turning over information to SOBELL obtained by KLITCHER in the course of his employment with the Navy Department, Bureau of Ordnance, Washington, D.C. SOBELL was tried and convicted and sentenced to 30 years imprisonment on 3/29/51 for conspiracy to commit espionage.

RECOMMENDATION

No action warranted because SARANT is the subject of a pending Espionage-R investigation of which Albany is origin.

Alfred Epaminondas Sarant

Sarant was born September 26, 1918 at New York, New York and there is no indication that he was ever employed at Fort Monmouth or FTL.

A source, of known reliability, advised on July 10, 1951 that from information furnished by Julius Rosenberg to him, Alfred Sarant was a member of the Rosenberg Soviet Espionage Network (1944-1950). Sarant's apartment in Greenwich Village was used by the Rosenberg group for espionage purposes, prior to and subsequent to his leaving New York City.

Subsequent to the Rosenbergs' arrest on July 17, 1950, Sarant fled to Mexico and his whereabouts is unknown. The same source mentioned above had advised that Rosenberg stated that Sarant is in Europe.

All information contained in the CIC dossier for the subject
was furnished by the FBI.

2) ON ASSOCIATES:

All information contained in the CIC dossier for the associates
was furnished by the FBI.

PERIOD BY INFORMATION IN NIFARF FILES

1) ON SUBJECT:

Subject, when interviewed in 1950 by agents of the FBI, stated that
he was not at that time a member of the CP. He did state that he was a member

of the CPI for approximately 18 months between 1943-45 in Greenwich Village, NYC. He stated that he was a member of the American Student Union while at Cooper Union Institute of Technology and was a delegate to a national convention held in Washington, D. C., in 1941. He advised that starting with his college days he considered himself a "liberal and a progressive" and that many of the ideas of the Communists seemed to him to be right at the time. He denied ever engaging in espionage for the Russian Government or working as an agent for JULIUS ROSENBERG. He stated that ROSENBERG once "propositioned" him adding "but I did not bite." When asked if he meant that ROSENBERG was "sounding him out" in order to obtain information for Russia, he advised that he did not recall. He stated that he never was too well acquainted with the ROSENBERGS and that he had definitely had no contact with the ROSENBERGS since moving from New York City to Ithaca, N.Y., in 1946.

MATRAK and GERTHOLD SUREMAN, self-admitted former members of Branch 268, Industrial Division, CP - USA, advised that the subject, JOEL RAKI, JULIUS ROSENBERG, and VIVIAN ROSENBERG, among others, were members of Branch 268 from approximately 1942 until 2-44. SUREMAN stated the subject was in regular attendance at the meetings of Branch 268 from 1942 until the time he transferred out of the group sometime prior to 2-44.

2) ON RELATIVES:

LOUISE BOES BARANT, née Louise Jacqueline Rabel - wife

BOEYER admitted CP membership for the period of 1944-45. She admitted knowing JULIUS and VIVIAN ROSENBERG but denied any espionage activity on ROSENBERG's behalf or any other espionage activities.

3) ON ASSOCIATES:

ELEANOR GLASSMAN

GASKE was reported to have defended the Hitler-Stalin Pact and accused Finland of attacking Russia. GASKE was stated by M'D KITTIE to have indicated that he might have been a KCL member. GASKE shared a house with BARANT in 1941-42.

ELEANOR GLASSMAN

According to SILVESTER KATE BARNEY, the subject was acquainted with ELEANOR at 320 Ocean Avenue, Long Branch, N.J., in 1941-42. ELEANOR GLASSMAN is the sister of VIVIAN GLASSMAN, who is documented here under as an associate. ELEANOR GLASSMAN resided with her sister at 320 Ocean Avenue, Long Branch, N.J.

SUSPECT

ERIZELIAH was Shop Steward of the U.P.I. which was Communist dominated and also associated with known Communists.

PLATE C 12

ALICE served on the Executive Committee of U.P.I. at Fort Monmouth. She was described as a close associate of VIVIAN and ELIASAK GLASSMAN, documented herein, and of SARAH.

ALICE KATE BURTY, 266 EAST, 2175 Metcalf Ave., Newark, N.J.

ALICE admitted that she was a former girl friend of the subject while she and the subject were both on bases at Fort Monmouth, N.J., in 1942-43.

A case file on ALICE was opened in the Newark Office because of her active role in the P.A. while employed at Fort Monmouth. She was a member of the Executive Committee and Chairman of the Educational Committee of the Monmouth County Chapter of the U.P.I. and it was doubtful that she would have held such offices if she had not been in sympathy with Communist principles. Likewise, as the subject returned to N.Y.C., no active investigation was conducted by this office and all pertinent information was furnished to New York.

ESTHER LUTTIE BALOGH, 266 LUTTIE

According to ALICE KATE BURTY, the subject was acquainted with ESTHER at 320 Ocean Ave., Long Branch, N.J., in 1942-43.

ESTHER was the subject of an R.M.C. case instituted in the Newark Division in 1943 on the basis of her suspected membership in the Shore Branch of the CP Free March to August, 1943. By Bureau letter dated 7/17/44, New York was designated as origin.

VIVIAN PRUITT

According to ALICE KATE BURTY, OLIISMAK was acquainted with VIVIAN PRUITT, 315 E. 21st St., N.Y.C., and 345 Montgomery St., Brooklyn, N.Y.

PRUCHTBACH interviewed 3/13/53) in connection with the case entitled VIVIAN GLASSMAN, nos., R.F.I. 1438 - R. She declined to furnish any information regarding individuals she had known who were employed at Fort Monmouth during the period she worked there. She indicated she could not furnish any information regarding GLASSMAN because it had been too long ago that she had been associated with her. Investigation disclosed GLASSMAN had spent the day at the home of PRUCHTBACH on 10/14/52. OLIISMAK and PRUCHTBACH are both subjects of blind memoranda.

VIVIAN GLASSMAN

According to ALICE RUTH BURRY, the subject was acquainted with VIVIAN at 320 Ocean Ave., Long Branch, N.J., in 1941-42.

VIVIAN was the girl friend of JULIUS ROSENBERG, an individual who has been identified as a Soviet agent by JAMES WOODWARD, convicted espionage agent, in conversation with DAVID GREENBLATT, another convicted espionage agent. GREENBLATT has advised Bureau agents that JULIUS ROSENBERG was involved in the espionage apparatus. GLASSMAN has associated with persons involved in the ROSENBERG espionage ring and has acted as a messenger on occasion. She has also admitted to Bureau agents as having been very friendly with the ROSENBERGS and having been affiliated with the American Labor Party.

DAVID GREENBLATT

When the subject was interviewed, a personal search disclosed the subject's notebook in which was written on Page 2, "Sol Rosenberg, fed., No. Cr. 93300, ext. 604." During interview, GREENBLATT admitted he was the man referred to but denied knowing the subject.

GREENBLATT was caught taking home classified documents from FBI and admitted that he had done it many times but took them for home study and later returned them.

EDWARD ROSENBERG

ROSENBERG was a member of the YCL at OCHY. He was in periodic contact with JULIUS ROSENBERG from 1938 to 1947. Subject was a member of the Industrial YCL Branch of the CP at the time JULIUS and ERIC ROSENBERG were members of that group.

LEONARD E. GOODMAN

Mr. Attorney, In CP number
GOODMAN is a CP functionary in the New York City area.

WILLIAM PERL

PERL was an associate and acquaintance of JULIUS ROSENBERG, who was tried, convicted and executed for espionage. He has been involved with and associated with many of the persons included in the ROSENBERG espionage apparatus. PERL was indicted for perjury in connection with the MCKEEAN case and he is presently serving five years for perjury.

JULIA BAER

BAER was a member of the Soviet espionage apparatus in which JULIUS ROSENBERG functioned.

JULIUS AND ERNST ROSENBERG

JULIUS and ERNST ROSENBERG were members of a Russian espionage apparatus and were convicted of conspiracy to commit espionage against the U. S. They were convicted in U. S. Federal Court, sentenced to death, and electrocuted on 6/19/53 at Sing Sing Prison, Ossining, N.Y.

CHARLES E. KELL

CHARLES ELITCHER, a self-admitted CP member and associate of both JULIUS ROSENBERG and E. KELL, stated that he was recruited into the CP by KELL. ELITCHER advised that ROSENBERG had informed him that KELL was eliciting CCCP R.D. in co.ionage work. ELITCHER further stated that KELL had attempted to enlist him in co.ionage work by turning over information to KELL obtained by ELITCHER in the course of his employment with the Navy Dept., Bureau of Ordnance, Washington, D. C. ELITCHER stated that KELL requested him to furnish the names of possible recruits for purposes of engaging in espionage work. KELL fled to Mexico in June, 1950, after the arrest of JULIUS ROSENBERG, one of the participants of the ROSENBERG espionage apparatus in May, 1950. KELL was arrested by Bureau agents on 6/18/50 at Laredo, Texas. On 20/10/50, the Grand Jury, F.B.I., returned a true bill charging VORTON KELL, JULIUS ROSENBERG, ERNST ROSENBERG, CHARLES A. TAI VLIV and DAVID J. SCHWARTZ with Conspiring to Commit Espionage. KELL was tried, convicted and sentenced to serve 30 years imprisonment on 3/29/51.



MCCARTHY QUERIES DEFIED BY WOMAN

Witness Refuses to Admit or Deny That She or Former Husband Had Spied

By C. P. TRUSSELL

WASHINGTON, Dec. 11—A small, soft-spoken divorcee from Ithaca, N. Y., defied Senator Joseph R. McCarthy today as he sought to get her to admit or deny that she or her former husband had engaged in espionage.

The witness was Mrs. Louise Sarant. The Senator, who heads the Senate Permanent Subcommittee on Investigations and who sat as a one-man subcommittee, contended that Al Sarant, her former husband, was a fugitive member of the Rosenberg spy ring and had passed radar secrets from the Army's laboratories at Fort Monmouth, N. J. to Communists.

Mrs. Sarant refused to answer questions, invoking the Fifth Amendment, which permits a witness to decline to testify against himself in a criminal case. The courts have interpreted this to mean that a witness at a hearing may remain silent if an answer might tend to incriminate him in a criminal case.

As Mrs. Sarant remained uncooperative under advice of counsel, Senator McCarthy's questions suggested to some of those present that they might have been built upon information gathered by the Federal Bureau of Investigation or contained in the secret files. The F. B. I. started an inquiry into conditions at Fort Monmouth before the McCarthy subcommittee began investigating, but no grand jury cases developed.

F. B. I. Denies Giving Data

At one point Senator McCarthy, a Wisconsin Republican, asked point-blank whether it was true that Mrs. Sarant had refused to give certain information to the F. B. I. This information concerned an alleged "fugitive." Later questions identified the "fugitive" as Mrs. Sarant's former husband. She declined to answer.

At other points the questions dealt with names and places that had not appeared in the independent Senate subcommittee investigation.

A spokesman for the F. B. I. insisted, however, that the Senate group had received none of its confidential file information, officially or unofficially. Subcommittee sources said the group could not disclose its "investigative processes."

Mrs. Sarant declined to say whether she had attended meetings of persons, including her former husband, whose names were on the list of espionage suspects at laboratories designing or producing equipment to warn this country of sneak attacks from the air.

Mrs. Sarant also refused at first to say whether she had sisters or brothers. Later she said she had none. She balked when asked whether she knew two men who allegedly had posed as her brothers in a Communist "cell" formed, Mr. McCarthy said, to infiltrate Fort Monmouth with espionage agents. Mrs. Sarant was continued under subpoena for possible further questioning.

The Associated Press reported tonight that Mr. Sarant, after his marriage in Ithaca in 1945, had worked in the nuclear physics laboratory at Cornell University from 1946 to 1949. Then, the news service said, he went into business as a painting contractor and "disappeared" in 1949. It was reported also that Mrs. Sarant had obtained a divorce in 1950 and went to live, with her two young sons, with her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Victor K. D. Ross, in Ithaca.

Witness Challenges Ruling

The F. B. I. at Albany declined to comment on reports that it had been searching for Mr. Sarant.

Another witness, identified as a former employee at Fort Monmouth, was equally uncooperative. He was Joseph H. Percoff, now an attorney in New York City, who invoked constitutional amendments to avoid answering questions. Senator McCarthy accepted his invocation of the Fifth Amendment, but rejected invocation of other amendments. Mr. Percoff challenged this ruling, holding that Mr. McCarthy, sitting alone, did not constitute a quorum of the investigative subcommittee.

This protest had arisen before but Mr. McCarthy appeared to be in a sound position according to the rules of his subcommittee. These permit one member to constitute an authoritative task force subcommittee of the investigations subcommittee.

Mr. Percoff swore that he never had engaged in espionage. However, he declined, under constitutional protection, to say whether he had passed secret material to any one from the radar laboratories.

The witness asserted that she would answer no questions pertaining to what he called political matters, such as membership or association with the Communist party. Senator McCarthy replied that his questions concerned espionage, not politics, and declared that Mr. Percoff had lost his right to protection under the Fifth Amendment by swearing he had never committed espionage.

On this premise the Senator cited various refusals to answer his questions, and instructed Francis P. Carr, the subcommittee's staff director, to prepare a contempt case.

Senator McCarthy said that questioning of members of a Pentagon screening board, scheduled tentatively for today, was being postponed, as was the subpoenaing of Telford Taylor, a former Army brigadier general.

General Taylor, former Chief Prosecutor at the Nuremberg War Crimes trials, recently said the Senator's Fort Monmouth investigation was a "most dangerous threat to the morale and efficiency of the Army."

The Senator wants to question the Pentagon screening board on the reinstatement of some Fort Monmouth employees.

The next meeting of the McCarthy subcommittee on Fort Monmouth will be held at 10:30 A. M., Monday, at the Federal Courthouse in Foley Square, New York.

SYNOPSIS OF FACTS:

BENJAMIN GEORGE LEWIS in interview advised he met JOEL BARR through ALFRED SARANT due to their mutual interest in music and had no knowledge of any espionage activity. HARVEY LEE SACHS in interview stated he met BARR through SARANT when all worked at Fort Monmouth Signal Corps in New Jersey but has no knowledge of any espionage or questionable activity on the part of BARR. Inquiry in Switzerland reflects BARR not known in that country.

DETAILS:

On November 3, 1953, BENJAMIN GEORGE LEWIS was interviewed by Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation at LEWIS' specific request. LEWIS is currently employed as a research physicist at Hughes Aircraft Corporation, Culver City, California. LEWIS was apprehensive concerning his position with Hughes Aircraft Corporation in view of his former employment at the Signal Corps Laboratories, Fort Monmouth, New Jersey, and his association with ALFRED SARANT and JOEL BARR, both known espionage agents formerly connected with JULIUS ROSENBERG, executed Soviet agent.

LEWIS stated that, while a student at Cooper Union Institute of Technology, New York, New York, he met ALFRED SARANT in 1940 and became friendly with him. He was also acquainted with three other individuals at this time; namely, HARVEY LEE SACHS, MILTON LIPTON, and RALPH KRICKEN, the last of whom LEWIS described as a devoted Communist. He stated that SACHS and LIPTON were employed at the Army Signal Corps, Fort Monmouth, New Jersey, in 1940.

LEWIS stated that he met JOEL BARR through ALFRED SARANT due to their mutual interest in music. LEWIS was not certain, but he believed BARR was also employed at the Army Signal Corps. He stated that he last saw BARR in October, 1945, while visiting ALFRED SARANT in his apartment in Greenwich Village, New York. He stated that he has not seen or been connected with BARR since 1945.

LEWIS stated that he was told by HARVEY SACHS in November, 1952, that both BARR and SARANT had left the United States and that he, SACHS, had been interviewed by FBI agents concerning SARANT and BARR.

LEWIS claimed that he had no knowledge of the present whereabouts of JOEL BARR and ALFRED SARANT, and in regard to knowing anybody that might have knowledge of their whereabouts, he was only able to suggest that an individual named JEAN SCHIFFPLMAN (phonetic) was a friend of JOEL BARR and that SACHS and LIPTON also knew JOEL BARR. He did not know whether they might have any knowledge of BARR's present whereabouts.

He had no knowledge of any espionage activity on the part of ALFRED SARANT or BARR and that he was never asked to engage in any espionage activity. He had in his possession a list of addresses. Among these were included H. SACHS, 224-35 Kingsbury Avenue, Flushing, New York, and H. LIPTON, 30 Laurel Street, Route 20, Long Branch, New Jersey.

HARVEY LEE SACHS, 1158 Ashley Drive, Valley Stream, Long Island, New York, was interviewed by Bureau agents on January 4 and 5, 1954, and he advised that he met JOEL BARR through ALFRED SARANT while residing at 590 Russell Avenue, Long Branch, New Jersey, as BARR on occasions had visited SARANT at this address. He stated that BARR and SARANT worked together in the same section at Fort Monmouth, New Jersey, and appeared friendly with each other. He stated he had no recollection of ever recommending employment at Fort Monmouth to either BARR or SARANT and was not cognizant of BARR's ever remarking to him that he had used SACHS' name as a reference for employment there. SACHS stated BARR, to his recollection, never stayed overnight at the 590 Russell

Avenue address during the time that he, SACHS, resided there. SACHS stated that he characterized his relationship with BARR as that of an "acquaintance," and he was not very friendly with him. He stated that he knows of no espionage or questionable activity on the part of BARR which came to his attention during his association with him. He did advise, however, that from conversations that he had had with BARR, he believed him to be sympathetic to the Communist philosophy. He advised that he had no recollection of seeing or hearing from BARR subsequent to his leaving the 590 Russell Avenue address, which was in 1942.

In regard to C. NASH, from whom Mr. and Mrs. GILBOARD received correspondence dated July 1, 1953, Mr. E. BURRUEZO, superintendent of the apartment house at 20 Clinton Street, New York, New York, advised that one ALBERT NASH, whose wife's name is CHARLOTTE NASH, formerly resided at 20 Clinton Street but no longer resided there, having left sometime during the latter part of 1952 or early 1953. He stated that CHARLOTTE's mother and father still reside there and that their name is WEINSTEIN. He further advised that ALBERT NASH was an engineer and that he had heard that he was now working somewhere in the vicinity of Boston. He also advised that CHARLOTTE was a school teacher.

The New York indices contain no reference to either ALBERT or CHARLOTTE NASH.

T-1, of known reliability, advised that JOEL BARR is not known to be living in Switzerland at the present time.

In regard to JEAN SCHIFFELMAN (phonetic), mentioned by LEWIS, it is possible that this individual, since no further identification was given by LEWIS, is EUGENE HENRY SHEFTELMAN, who formerly worked at the Signal Corps, Fort Monmouth, New Jersey, and who resigned on June 22, 1951. He presently resides at 22-401 130th Avenue, Laurelton, New York, and is employed by the W. L. Maxson Corporation, 460 West 34th Street, New York, New York.

The records of the Board of Elections, Kings County, New York, for the 28th Election District, 17th Assembly District, reflect that SHEFTELMAN, while residing

at 126 Brooklyn Avenue, Brooklyn, New York, in 1939, registered to vote giving his party affiliation as the American Labor Party.

The American Labor Party has been cited as a Communist front by the Special Committee on Un-American Activities, United States House of Representatives, in its report dated March 29, 1944, pages 49, 77, 153, and 189, and the Massachusetts House Committee on Un-American Activities report for 1938 reflects on page 356 that "Support of the Communist Party to the American Labor Party has been recognized by the appointment of a Communist to an official position in the city government."

T-2, another Government agency which conducts security and personnel investigations, advised that it had received an anonymous letter dated July 6, 1940, which declared that EUGENE SHIFFELMAN, who lived in Brooklyn, New York, expressed the belief that Communism is the ideal form of government.

In regard to RALPH KRICKER, mentioned by LEWIS, T-3, of known reliability, advised on November 27, 1953, that KRICKER was formerly a student at Cooper Union, New York, New York, and graduated as an engineer during World War II. KRICKER was employed as a project engineer designing motors for military circulation at the Electrolux plant at Old Greenwich, Connecticut. The informant added that he left this company to become the chief engineer at the Fairchild Camera and Instrument Company, Jamaica, New York.

The informant further advised that KRICKER now has his own business, the Syntorque Laboratories, Incorporated, of Woodstock, New York, and that the main contract at this company is from Cinerama to make camera motors of KRICKER's own design.

The same informant on August 9, 1953, advised that the KRICKERS are close associates of a DOROTHY WILSON, who

is a Communist Party member, but the informant has no definite information as to whether KRICKER is a Communist Party member.

T-4, of known reliability, advised on October 18, 1953, that there was a committee meeting to organize the American Labor Party in Woodstock, New York, but that this meeting was temporarily called off because of the KRICKERS' stating that they planned to join the Democratic Party.

The same informant advised on October 23, 1953, that one DOROTHY LACASS, a Communist Party member, was employed by RALPH KRICKER.

Both T-3 and T-4 have stated that RALPH KRICKER had attended various Communist Party functions in the Ulster County area.

In regard to MILTON LIPTON, mentioned by LEWIS as an associate of JOEL BARR, the New York Office files contain no information identifiable with a MILTON LIPTON who was employed at Fort Monmouth, New Jersey, or who lived at 30 Laurel Street, Route 20, Long Branch, New Jersey.

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The same informant advised on October 23, 1953, that one DOROTHY LaCASS, a Communist Party member, was employed by RALPH KRICKER.

Both T-3 and T-4 have stated that RALPH KRICKER had attended various Communist Party functions in the Ulster County area.

In regard to MILTON LIPTON, mentioned by LEWIS as an associate of JOEL BARR, it should be noted that LIPTON gave as a reference for employment at the United States Bureau of Labor Statistics a Mr. JAY GOULD of the Econometric Institute, New York, New York.

Mr. GOULD, in an interview with Bureau agents, advised that he formerly resided at 206 West 88th Street, New York, New York, and that his address at the time of the interview in 1949 was 13 West 88th Street. He also advised that he was well acquainted with LIPTON and that he regarded him as a completely loyal civil servant.

T-5, of known reliability, advised that JAY GOULD, 206 West 88th Street, New York, New York, was a member of the Greenwich Village Club of the Communist Party until its dissolution in May of 1944. (On May 23, 1944, the Communist Party was dissolved and the Communist Political Association was formed.)

The informant further advised that the records of the aforementioned club indicated in August of 1944 that JAY GOULD was not, as of that date, registered with the Communist Political Association.





HERMAN SKOPP'S son, MORTIMER HENRY SKOPP, is the subject of a closed Security Matter - C and Loyalty of Government Employees investigation, New York files 100-99300 and 221-Y0007.

EUGENE BECKER, former husband of BERNICE BEDOL, was lived at 19-26 83rd Street, Brooklyn, New York, at the time of his death in 1948.

In a further attempt to identify ALFRED SARANT'S contact at the SKOPP residence in Brooklyn, New York, negative attempts were made to locate and interview BECKER at the 19-26 83rd Street, Brooklyn, New York address on 4/7-9/54.

Mrs. JACOB LIEBGOFT of the above address, advised the writer that EUGENE BECKER had formerly resided at this address with his mother, RAY BECKER. She believed that BECKER could be located through his mother who still resides at this address.

BECKER too, confirmed the fact that he had formerly resided at 19-26 83rd Street, Brooklyn, New York, and that his mother currently resides at that address. He stated that from approximately 1939-1948 he was married to HERMAN SKOPP'S daughter, BERNICE. He stated that they were divorced in 1948 and that subsequently he married MARIAN GROSSMAN, nee MARIAN SCHWARTZ on 12/2/52, in an un-named New Jersey city.

BECKER volunteered that his current wife was formerly married to a man by the name of GROSSMAN. He stated that he is presently employed as a Chemist for WRIGHT Aeronautical, Woodridge, New Jersey, and to his knowledge is not working on any work of a classified nature and does not have a security clearance. He stated in this regard he does not recall having ever executed a Personnel Security Questionnaire (PSQ).

Concerning his background he volunteered that he is a Chemical Engineer by profession having graduated in Chemical Engineering from CCNY, Class of 1942. It is noted that during the period 1944-1946, BECKER indicated that he saw service in the U. S. Navy.

BECKER stated that the name of ALFRED SARANT was unfamiliar to him. Among a group of photographs exhibited to him, several of which were the photographs of SARANT, BECKER did not recognize SARANT'S picture. He stated that he does not recall SARANT in connection with any visitor in the SKOPP residence in Brooklyn, nor as an associate or friend of anyone in the SKOPP family.

Concerning himself he stated that he is not now nor has he ever been a member of the CP or any of its front organizations.

In this regard, it is interesting to note the following:

B7D [REDACTED] advised SA EVERETT K. DEANE and SE SAMUEL W. JENNINGS on 12/23/47 that the name of EUGENE D. BECKER was familiar to [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] B7D stated this individual was a member of Lodge Number 817, IWO, New York City as of 12/46. This source stated that BECKER was born in 1917 and was two months behind in his dues according to this informant.

B7D [REDACTED] furnished to this office what is believed to be [REDACTED] the CP or affiliate organizations [REDACTED] The name of EUGENE D. BECKER, 86-55 21st Avenue, Brooklyn 14, New York appeared thereon.

It is noted that the address 86-55 21st Avenue, Brooklyn, New York, in all probability refers to 8665 21st Avenue, Brooklyn, New York, the address which may possibly be BECKER'S for the 1946 period.

BECKER stated that he did not have any information concerning the CP or related activities on the part of any of the SKOPP family. He stated

that as far as he knew his former wife, BERNICE SKOPP was not a member of the CP or any of its front organizations.

During the interview with BECKER, he exhibited what appeared to be certain nervous tendencies, and it was believed by the writer that BECKER permitted the interview due to his current employment with the WRIGHT Aeronautical.

During the interview it was established that his present wife, MARIAM SCHWARTZ GROSSMAN is the subject of a closed Security Matter - C investigation, New York origin, New York file number 100-63912.

It is recommended that a Security Matter - C investigation be instituted for the express purpose of clarifying his employment status at WRIGHT Aeronautical, Woodridge, New Jersey, although BECKER claims to have never executed a PSQ or to have a security clearance. It is believed that an investigation should be conducted to ascertain whether he has within the last several years or has currently a security clearance. It should be borne in mind that BECKER may have violated the Fraud Against the Government statute in connection with execution of a PSQ.

The current Nassau County Telephone Directory, contains a listing for one SAUL COHEN at 7 Fork Lane, Hicksville, Long Island, New York, telephone number LEvittown 9-9380. The writer through the utilization of an appropriate pretext telephone call, ascertained on 5/13/54 that the SAUL COHEN of the Hicksville address is identical with the SAUL COHEN who formerly resided at the Brooklyn address hereinbefore mentioned.

On 8/12/54, Mr. SOLOMON SHERR was interviewed by SA EDWARD J. CAHILL and the writer. Mr. SHERR has a secret clearance working on an Air Force contract for the General Precision Laboratories, Inc., 63 Bedford Road, Pleasantville, NY. He is employed as their Associate AB Electronics Section Head. Mr. SHERR resides at 32 Beaumont Circle, Tuckahoe, NY.

In addition to the information which will appear in report form dated 8/27/54, the following was furnished by Mr. SHERR concerning other individuals whom the Bureau is currently investigating:

SOLOMON GREENBERG

Mr. SHERR stated that he was in a car pool with GREENBERG while he was employed for the Federal Telecommunications Labs (FTL) at Nutley, NJ. He believes that the dates of the car pool extended from September, 1948 until approximately three years thereafter. He states that, to his knowledge, GREENBERG did on occasions take home with him certain trade publications pertaining to Electronics and related matters from FTL. He states that these publications were of a ~~known now~~ classified nature and he has no information concerning any classified documents or other related papers which he, GREENBERG, had ever removed from FTL.

He said that he could furnish no information of a derogatory nature concerning GREENBERG'S loyalty, patriotism, and character; in fact, he always believed that GREENBERG was an anti-Communist and an extremely loyal American citizen. He stated that he was shocked to learn that GREENBERG had lost his job with FTL due to what he had learned to be "security reasons". He stated that he did not recall who had told him of this and attributed the information to the engineers' "grapevine".

Mr. SHERR stated that MAXINE LHOWE was also a member of their car pool. He has no knowledge as to whether

He recalls that several individuals, namely, SOLOMON GREENBERG, himself and his wife CLAIRE, LARRY ROSENBERG and his wife ?, and LEO STACHOVER (ph); on an occasion visited ARTHUR ROTHBART on Van Cortlandt Parkway during the period that he was employed at FTL, September, 1948 to approximately three years thereafter.

He stated that he has not seen SOLOMON GREENBERG since he left FTL, except a casual hello (no further conversation) when they were passing on a street corner near GREENBERG'S home on Ryer Avenue in the Bronx.

JOSEPH LEVITSKY

Mr. SHERR stated that he had known JOSEPH LEVITSKY as an employee at FTL. He recognized photographs of LEVITSKY. He stated that SOLOMON GREENBERG had, on occasions, gone on road trips with LEVITSKY in connection with installation of a system for FTL. He says that he has had no social contact with LEVITSKY other than their contacts when employed at FTL.

Concerning LEVITSKY'S loyalty, patriotism, and character, he could furnish no information. He said that he was indeed shocked to read in the newspapers that LEVITSKY had used the Fifth Amendment in answering questions concerning Communism and espionage before the McCarthy Committee during the Fall and Winter of 1953.

He stated that he was employed as an Engineer at the Western Electric Company from 1941 or 1942 until 1944, at their Kearny, NJ plant, and later at their 42nd Street, NYC plant. 



SYNOPSIS OF FACTS: Subject resides at 1158 Ashley Drive, Valley Stream, LI, NY, and is currently unemployed. Subject voluntarily appeared at NYO on 3/22/55 and was interviewed by Bureau agents. Subject furnished information which, in his opinion, explained how ALFRED SARANT knew where to contact him in 1946.

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DETAILS:

INTERVIEW WITH HARVEY LEE SACKS

HARVEY LEE SACKS telephonically contacted SA ROBERT E. LIKE, JR., on March 21, 1955 and advised that he had come upon certain letters he had written to BENJAMIN LEWIN, a personal friend, in 1946. He advised that in his opinion these letters explained the circumstances surrounding his association with ALFRED SARANT in 1946.

T-1, who was in a position to receive information from JULIUS ROSENBERG, advised on July 10, 1951 that according to information furnished by JULIUS ROSENBERG, ALFRED SARANT was a "member of his organization". This informant reported that ROSENBERG furnished information to him over a period of time, which had lead him to believe that ALFRED SARANT was a Soviet espionage agent who was involved with the ROSENBERG Network.

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JULIUS ROSENBERG, and his wife, ETHEL, were executed on June 19, 1953, having been convicted and sentenced in the United States Court, Southern District of New York, for conspiracy to commit espionage against the United States.

SACHS voluntarily appeared at the New York Office on March 22, 1955 and was interviewed (at that time) by CAMPBELL E. LACE, JR. and ROBERT SUSIN TAYLOR.

SACHS advised that he was currently residing at his new home, 1158 Ashley Drive, Valley Stream, Long Island, New York. He advised that he was (currently) unemployed and had been so since December, 1954, when his employment with Shaw Television Company, 195 Front Street, Brooklyn, New York was terminated with a close of business there.

SACHS advised (the interviewing agents) that he was visited a couple weeks prior to the date of this interview by BENJAMIN LEWIS, and old friend of his, (who he had once resided with and who he has since corresponded with.)

SACHS stated that he and LEWIS were talking over various matters and the subject of SACHS' association with ALFRED SARANT in 1946 was brought up. SACHS stated that LEWIS produced personal letters he had received from SACHS in 1946. These letters referred to SACHS' association with SARANT in 1946. According to these letters written by SACHS to LEWIS, SACHS had told LEWIS that he had been visited by SARANT at SACHS' father-in-law's residence, 200 West 5th Street, New York City approximately March, 1946. SACHS stated that this visit had to be approximately March, 1946 because these letters to LEWIS were dated March 29, 1946, April 14, 1946 and April 19, 1946. SACHS stated that this visit had been preceded by a phone call from SARANT. SACHS stated that he was unable to explain before how SARANT knew to call him at SACHS' father-in-law's residence, where he was at the time of the call. SACHS stated that he has since found out that prior to the phone call SARANT had run into his brother, SYLVAN SACHS, somewhere on Broadway in New York City and had inquired as to his whereabouts. SARANT gave SILVAN SACHS his address and phone number which was in turn given to MARVILY SACHS by his brother. It was then that SARANT and MARVILY SACHS were able to get together. SACHS stated that this explained how SARANT knew to call him at his father-in-law. SACHS stated that since he had not been in touch with SARANT for a long while it had puzzled him how SARANT knew where to call him.

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SACKS went on to advise that approximately two weeks after this visit by SARANT he and his wife visited SARANT at SARANT's apartment. He stated that this was the only visit he made.

SACKS, during the interview with SAC LANE and TAYLOR on March 22, 1955 exhibited the three letters he had written to LEWIS in 1946 and advised the agents that he did not want them to make copies. He stated that the letters contained some obscene passages which might cause him embarrassment. These letters were reviewed by the interviewing agents and were found to contain information regarding the visit to SACKS by SARANT and the visit to SARANT by SACKS.

SACKS stated in conclusion that he hoped this would clarify the question as to how SARANT knew to telephone him at the residence of SACKS' father-in-law in 1946.

SARANT advised that he could be reached at his current residence and would be willing to cooperate with Bureau Agents at any time.
