This is to advise that at approximately 11:30 AM today, I received a call from SA BOB SIMMONS of the New York Office relative to the above captioned case. SA SIMMONS subsequently turned the call over to SA NAUGHTON, who furnished the following information.

NAUGHTON said that the control case mentions a man whose complete last name was not given, but who fits the description of SARANT. He stated that SARANT had hired an apartment in October of 1943 at 65 Morton Street in New York City, which address is mentioned in a Bureau teletype with relation to SARANT and PERL, who is in Cleveland.

According to NAUGHTON, the superintendent at the 65 Morton Street address has been there since October 1943, and advised that SARANT occupied the apartment from 1943 until he moved out in 1945. The superintendent stated that in 1946 PERL moved in as a tenant, but SARANT continued to pay rent every month by check from Ithaca until January 1950, when the apartment was vacated.

The superintendent stated that he had been in SARANT'S apartment on two occasions, the first of these being in January, 1949, when he had occasion to go into the apartment to make some repairs. He said that at that time the apartment was unfurnished except for some articles which apparently were used in connection with photography, and that a photo flood light was set up on the wall in the living room.

With reference to this, SA NAUGHTON stated that RUTH and DAVID GREENGLASS said that they understood that ROSENBERG had two apartments in New York City where they did photography, both taking and developing pictures. One apartment was said to be on the Lower Side and the other in Greenwich Village. The Morton Street address is in Greenwich Village.

The building superintendent at the Horton Street address advised that when he entered the apartment of SARANT on the second occasion, which was in December of 1949, that there were 7 men sleeping in 7 separate sleeping bags on the floor of the apartment.

He further stated that in June of 1949, a man who said he was SARANT but who fits the description of MIKE, came to him and asked for a key to let himself in. NAUGHTON stated that a photograph of MIKE, who has been positively identified as MIKE SIDOROVICH, was being exhibited to the superintendent today for identification.

SA NAUGHTON said that RUTH and DAVID GREENGLASS were very cooperative and had furnished signed statements and information relative to MIKE and his wife, the ROSENBERGS, etc. He said that when the GREENGLASSES were contacted by ROSENBERG in May and early June of this year for money to leave the country, ROSENBERG had given the name of JOEL BARR as an example of an individual who had been in this work and who had fled the United States.

NAUGHTON stated that there appeared to be a strong possibility that SARANT had definite connections with PERL, JOEL BARR and ROSENBERG. He mentioned that as a conspirator, SARANT would face the death penalty and would be tried in Albuquerque, New Mexico.

He further stated that two photographs of ROSENBERG had been sent to Ithaca and that the New York Office did not have a photo of SARANT. He requested that one be furnished to him as soon as possible as well as a photo of SARANT'S wife and information concerning her, and a photo of W. BRUCE DAYTON.

This information has been furnished to SAC WALL at Ithaca.
