Interview with FRANK LA ROCK

Frank La Rock was interviewed at his paint store, 537 W. State St., Ithaca today. He furnished the following info:

He and Sarant are 50-50 partners in the business. Intermaggio was considered in forming the business, however, Intermaggio was unable to raise enough money and finally it was formed by Sarant and La Rock. Sarant takes no active part in the store. La Rock said he does all banking abd bookkeeping, bank account is at Tompkins County Trust Co. Sarant seldem receives telephone calls or mail at the store. Such calls or mail are apparently for business purposes. La Rock says his association with Srant is completely for business reasons and does not have any social contact with him.


La Rock Stated to his knowledge Sarant has been out of Ithaca only twice in the time he he known him, which is since January, 1950. In April, Sarant and Intermaggio went to NYC together, purpose of trip being rasing of money to start the business. Sarant contacted his father for this purpose, La Rock believes. The tother teip out of Sthaca is his present vacation trip, though La Rock said he has no idea where Sarant is spending his vacation.

Regarding phone calls, La Rock recalled that about one or two days before Sarant went on his vacation, Howard Gruber called on the phone at the store, asked form Sarant, then left his extension number at Cornell and his residence telephone number with request that Sarant call him. Leter, when Exant had not contacted the store, La Rock called Sarant at his home and relayed the message. Sarant told La Rock, Gruber had just called him.

La Rock said Sarant's father-in-law handled the legal work in setting up the business, but as Ross is the "nearest thing to a shyster" in Ithaca, La Rock took the precaution of reviewing the propecals with a Cornell professor who is an attorney and accountant. La Rock also mentioned that Wiggins, a law student at Cornell, who formerly warked as a painter for Sarant, is now workin in Ross office.

La Rock was asked whether Sarant had ever broken a business appointment for some unknown or unusal reason. La Rock said he did not recall anything like that.


By teletype dated December 10, 1947, captioned, "POLISH ENTELLIGENCE ACTIVITIES, IS-R", the New York Office advised that ANTHONY SZYMANOWSKI is a close contact of JAN GALEWICZ, Polish Consul General, New York City, and is reported to have spent some time in Moscow.



Mr. FRANK McINERY, Assistant Manager of the Hotel Sir Francis Drake, Sutter at Powell Streets, San Francisco, advised that subject checked into Room 1115, a single room accommodation, at approximately 7 P.M. on December 9, 1947. Surveilling agents, PETER T. SEXTON and JERCAE J. DAUNT, observed GREZEBIENIOWSKA and the subject as they were sitting in the lobby of the Hotel Sir Francis Drake, where they conversed from 9:10 to 10:15 P.M. on the night of December 9, 1947.



On December 10, 1947 Special Agents DOUGLAS G. ALLEN and ROBERT RONKSLEY observed the subject as he met GRZEBIENIOWSKA at Berkeley, California at 9:45 A.M. They proceeded to the International House and from there went to South Hall on the University of California campus and entered Room 202, the office of Dr. FRANK M. RUSSELL. At 12:10 P.M. the surveilling agents observed GRZEBILNIOWSKA and the subject as they entered the International House, where they were met by three men and three woman.



At 3:20 P.M. subject and GRZEBIENIOWSKA entored the CIC Building, 150 Golden Gate Avenue, San Francisco, where SIDNEY ROGERS, the radio news commentator, has office space in Room 302. At 4 P.M. they were observed to

anter the Chronicle Building, 5th and Mission Streets, San Francisco, where LARRY FANNING, the Managing Editor of the San Francisco Chronicle, has his office.

On December 10, 1947 Special agents PETER T. SEXTON and JEROME J. DAUNT observed subject and GRZEBIENIOWSKA as they were engaged in lengthy conversation at the Pig and Whistle Restaurant, 33 Powell Street, San Francisco, where they had dinner. Later they were observed as they were sitting in the lobby of the Hotel Sir Francis Drake. At 6:55 P.M. they parted company.

On December 11, 1947 CRZEBIENIONKA departed from San Francisco for Portland, Oregon on Flight 551 of the United Airlines at 9:45 A.M. unaccompanied.

At 12:20 P.M. on December 11, 1947 surveilling agents DOUGLAS ALLEN and ROBERT ROMKSLEY observed SZYMANOVSKI and CHARLES SIDNEY FLATO as they entered the Hotel Sir Francis Drake and were later scated in the lobby of the hotel discussing a brief or document of some kind. Copies of photographs of CHARLES SIDNEY FLATO are contained in the files of this office. The description of FLATO, as taken from the observations of the surveilling agents, is as follows:

SZYMANOWSKI departed on Flight 185 of the United Airlines from the San Francisco Airport at 4:50 P.M. bound for Portland, Oregon.

Confidential Source T-1 made available to this effice copies of the address of JOZEF WINIEWICZ, mbassador of Poland, entitled "POLAND IF THE POST WAR WORLD" delivered on December 12, 1947 at the City Club of Portland, Oregon. A copy of this address has been forwarded to the tashington Field office.

Brief background information concerning the individuals with whom SEYMANOWSKI had appointments during his stay in San Francisco from December 9 through December 11, 1947, as obtained from the files of this office is hereinafter set forth.

ALLAN C. BLAISDELL, Director of the International House, Berkeley, California, has served as a member of the committee for raising funds for Russian har Relief and is known to have been in contact with known Communists. Informants of this office have furnished conflicting information as to whether BLAISDELL is in sympathy with the Communist movement. It is known that he has been in contact with a number of known Communists.

SIDNEY ROGER, who is a San Francisco news commentator, has long associated with the top functionaries of the Communist Party in San Francisco. He maintains close liaison with RARTLEY CRUM on controversial matters and in his news cast "The News Behind the News" sponsored by the CIO labor union, he has adhered closely to the Communist Party line. ROGER has addressed such Communist front organizations as the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee, Council for Civic Unity, and meetings held under the auspices of the American Russian Institute.

DR. HOLL'ND ROBERTS is the educational director of the Communist dominated California Lobor School and is President of the American Russian Institute. He has been instrumental in determining the policies of the ARI and on matters of policy has been known to confer with Soviet Consular officials in San Francisco. In Docember, 1947, ROBERTS showed particular interest in mapping out plans for the showing of Soviet films and exhibits of Soviet culture.

LARRY FANNING is the acting managing editor of the San Francisco Chronicle and is a close friend of DAVID JENKINS, director of the California Labor School and JCHN PITTHAN, the former editor of the Daily Feoples World. Communist officials have successfully utilized him in supressing news which would be harmful to the Communist cause and have counted on him for favorable publicity on the affairs of the American Russian Institute and the California Labor School.

By teletype dated December 14, 1947, captioned "Polish Intelligence Activities - Internal Security - R", the Portland Office advised that the subject departed from Portland, Oregon via United Airlines at 2:30 P.M. on December 14, 1947, accompanied by CRZEBIENIOWSKA and was to arrive in San Francisco at 6:30 P.M. While in Portland both subject and CRZEBIENIOWSKA were in contact with the Communist element there. It was stated further that subject had requested a reservation at the Rotel Clark, Los Angeles, Clifornia from December 17 through 20, 1947. Subject

is expected to contact CHARLES FLATO at the Mayflower Hotel, San Francisco Apon arrival.

FRANK McINERY, Assistant Manager of the Hotel Sir Francis Prake, advised subject checked into Room 808 at that hotel at approximately 7 PM on December 14, 1947.

Special Agents ROBERT I. RONKSLEY and PETER T. SEXTON observed subject and GRZEBIENIOWSKA as they were seated in the lobby of the hotel Sir Francis Drake from 3 to 3:25 PM on Decomber 15, 1947. GRZEBIENIOWSKA was observed holding a pamphlet in her hand to which she referred several times. Subject was observed as he pulled a piece of paper from his pocket and read from it.

it 6:30 PM Special -gents DON.LD H. SLOAT and DOUGLIS G. ALLEN observed subject as he got out of a yellow cab and entered the Hotel Sir Francis Drake. CHIRLES SIDNEY FL.TO remained in the cab and drove away.

At 8:20 PM on December 15, 1947 surveilling agents observed subject and GRZEBIENIOWSKA as they entered the San Francisco Opera House to attend the piano recital "MALCUQYNSKI".

On December 16, 1947, surveilling agents PETER T. SEXTON and ROBERT I. RONNSLEY observed subject and GRZEBIENIO'SKA as they entered the residence address of ALEXIS E. POST at 2427 Divisadero Street, San Francisco. It has previously been reported that IREME POST, the wife of ALEXIS E. POST is a contact of GRZEBIENIOWSKA.

At 8:30 PM on December 16, 1947 surveilling agents DONILD SLOAT and DOUGLIS ALLEM observed CHIRLES SIDNEY FLATO as he arrived at the Hotel Sir Francis Drake, where he met the subject. Both were observed as they walked to the Colonial Room, 679 Sutter Street, a bar also known as the "Home of the Mint Julep". At 9:30 PM they walked to the Mayflower Hotel, 975 Bush Street, where FLATO and his wife reside in Room 602. At 12:05 AM December 17, 1947 subject departed from the Mayflower Hotel and proceeded to his room in the Hotel Sir Francis Drake.

On December 17, 1947 surveilling agents PETER T. SEXTON and ROBERT RONKSLEY observed subject as he arrived at the Southern Pacific Depot, Third and Townsend Street, San Francisco. It was noted that he occupied Seat 37 in Car 9 of the Southern Pacific Morning Daylight bound for Los Angeles, California.

Commerciang CHERLES SIDNEY FLATO, with whom subject was in contact while in San Francisco, Confidential Informant T-2 advised that FLATO is a

free lance writer and publicity man who was formerly with the government service. His last position as Special Assistant, Surplus Property Board, C.N.M.P., was terminated on June 30, 1945 by the Civil Service Commission in view of an unsatisfactory report. This source listed contacts of FLATO as ANN FELTUS, wife of RANDOLPH FELTUS; Mrs. CHARLES MILIER; CHARLES KRAMER, MAURICE HELPIRN, GREGORY SILVERMASTER, JOHN DIERKES, JOSEPH GREG, ALLEN ROSENBERG, DAVE MAHL, all of whom figure prominently in Russian espionage investigations being conducted by the Bureau. His previous residence was listed as 1731 New Hampshire Avenue, Apartment 615, Washington, D. C., and his office address was listed as P. R. ASSOCIATES, INC. 1737-H Street, NW, Washington, D. C.

According to Confidential Source T-2, FLATO became a member of the Communist Party in 1934 when he was employed in a Communist Party book store in Boston, Massachusetts. In 1936 or 1937 FLATO was connected with the reportedly Communist controlled NAU as a publicity man.

On November 26, 1947 when FLATO registered at the Mayflower Hotel, San Francisco, he furnished his permanent address as 128 E. 56th Street, New York City, New York. The records of this hotel reflect that CHARLES FLATO has during the period of November 26 through December 18, 1947 been in repeated telephonic contact with the office of BARTLEY C. CRUI, prominent attorney in San Francisco.

On December 17, 1947, SF 1474 informed this office that he had learned from GERTRUDE CRUI that ANTONI SZYMANOWSKI had visited her husband, BARTLEY CRUI, in his office and had discussed propaganda. Informant stated that JANE MacBANE had stated to Mrs. CRUI that in her opinion SZYMANOWSKI was a Communist. Informant stated that Mrs. CRUI had informed him that she had heard them convincing JANE McBANE that every Pole wasn't a Communist.

PANTER TOLLEFSON, auditor of the Hotel Sir Francis Drake, made available records which reflect that during the period that subject resided at the Hotel Sir Francis Drake from December 9 through 11, and from December 14 through 17, 1947, he made the following telephone calls from his room:

ORdway 3-7010 - Myflower Hotel. It has been ascertained that CHARLES SIDNEY FLATO, above mentioned, was registered at the Mayflower Hetel at that time.

EXbrook 2-3434 - Mark Hopkins Hotel.

EHRLICH is the law partner of BARTLEY C. CRUM, with whom he occupies office space, Room 2002

Russ Building. During the absence of CRUM, EHRLICH handled the legal affairs of LOUISE BRANSTEN.



On August 2, 1950, the writer interviewed Mr. PAUL H. MAYER. Director of the Division of Placement and Unemployment Insurance, Department of Labor, 1279 Broadway, Albany, New York, who furnished information to the - effect that there never has been any returns filed by the Sarant Laboratories, 227 West 11th Street, New York City, or at any other address. Mr. MAYER, however, furnished returns on ALFRED SARANT, Cayuga Heights Road, Ithaca, New York, doing business under his own name at that address. He furnished information on the return which took in the quarter between September 25, 1949 and December 31, 1949, as follows:

The return reflected the following employees, Social Security numbers and the amounts received from ALFRED SARANT during the above-mentioned period:

Mr. FRED TICE and Mr. HENRY ELWYN, Sr., formerly assistant superintendents of the apartment building at 65 Morton Street, New York City, the building in which subject had an apartment for several years, were interviewed by SA NICHOLAS L. DUNBAR on July 28, 1950. Mrs. FRED TICE was also interviewed by Agent DUNBAR.

The results of these interviews are here set out.

AT STAMFORD, NEW YORK

Mr. FRED TICE, who now resides on Main Street, Soth Kortright, New York, was interviewed at Stamford, New York, the place where he works, and to and from which he commutes each day. Mr. TICE stated that he was Assistant Superintendent of the apartment building at 65 Morton Street, New York City for about two years. He gave November 1944 to October 1946 as the dates of his employment there.

Mr. TICE said he knew ALFRED SARANT as a tenant who resided in Apartment 6I . Mr. TICE stated that he had occasion to see SARANT and talk to him a number of times. It was pointed out by Mr. TICE that he collected the rent each month from SARANT which he was often tardy in paying. Payments were usually by check. On some of these rent collecting visits to SARANT's apartment, he would be invited in sometimes for a drink. Also, Mr. TICE said he was in the apartment a few times to fix windows and doors. Mr. TICE recalled the first time he had contact with SAFANT was in late November 1964 when he had to fix a pine that was leaking in the bathroom. It was also stated by Mr. TICE that in the winter of 1945-1946, as he recalls it, he and Mr. HENRY ELWYN, Sr., superintendent of the building, removed a wire, apparently an 4C wire from SARANT's apartment. This wire was stapled to the window in the living room of apartment 6I and was hanging down the side of the building. Mr. TICE was not certain whether this wire was fastened to a window of apartment 51 which was directly beneath apartment 61. It is here noted that this wire had been kept in Mr. TICE's possession and was secured from him by the reporting 65-1664158 agent.

Mr. TICE said that from these visits to the SARANT apartment, he recalls that there was never much furniture. He remembers seeing a home-made bed in the

bedroom, a work bench in the living room and some radio equipment which caused Mr. TICE to assume that SARANT was a "ham" radio operator. Mr. TICE could not name any specific radio equipment that he saw and said he remembers that at the time he noticed it he thought of it as being radio equipment which would be in possession of a ham radio operator. Mr. TICE went on to state that following SARANT's marriage in the summer of 1946, it appeared that little by little more furniture was added to the apartment's furnishings, but that there was never very much in the way of furniture there. Mr. TICE also mentioned that he recalls seeing a musical instrument, just what instrument he can't remember, and a music stand in the apartment.

Mr. TICE stated that prior to the summer of 1946, which was the time that SARANT informed him that he was married, that there were often white girls who visited the apartment. Mr. TICE said he never knew the names of any of them and doubts that he would recognize the pictures of any of them except SARANT's wife who lived with SARANT in the apartment prior to the time they said they were married. Mr. TICE said that parties were often held in apartment 6I both before and after SARANT's marriage, but mostly before that time. Indescribing these parties, Mr. TICE said that they seemed to him to be big "raucous" drinking affairs. He never saw any colored people in the apartment and advised he does not recall an musicales being held in the apartment. Mr. TICE did state, however, that while he never exactly saw any colored people in SARANT's apartment, he often saw colored people entering the building, and he determined that they, for the most part, went to the fifth and sixth floors, but to just which apartments he never learned. Mr. TICE said that SARANT and his wife moved out about a month, as he recalls it, prior to the time that he, Mr. TICE, concluded his job, , which would place it around September 1, 1946 that SARANT left. Mr. TICE said that he was in the apartment once following SARANT's departure and noted that all the furniture had been removed. Mr. TICE said he remembers SARANT telling him he was leaving because he was being transferred in his job, and that he was moving to Massachusetts. Mr. TICE said further, that he was introduced by SARANT to the man that was going to take over the apartment when SARANT left. Mr. TICE said SARANT introduced him as "my cousin" but he does not now recall the man's name.

When Mr. TICE was shown a photograph of JOEL BARR, he stated that could have been the man who replaced SARANT in the apartment but that he could not be certain. Mr. TICE said he never again saw the new tenant following the introduction mentioned above and cannot positively state when or whether this new tenant actually moved there. Mr. TICE explained that he, Mr. TICE, was himself moving from the apartment building at about that time.

It was Mr. TICE's observation that the SARANT apartment had AC current throughout the time that SARANT lived there.

August 2, 1950

Photographs of ALFRED SAFANT, JOEL BARR, DAVID GREENGLASS, RUTH GREENGLASS, JULIUS ROSENBERG, W. BRUCE DAYTON, MAK ELITCHER, WILLIAM PERL and MORTON SOBELL were exhibited to Mr. TICE. He immediately recognized SAFANT and BARR. He advised that he often saw BAFR entering and leaving the apartment building and often times he would be in the company of SARANT. Mr. TICE said he would not say positively, but feels certain that he has actually seen BARR in SARANT's apartment. He mentioned that he positively saw him at some of the parties that he observed in the SAFANT apartment. Mr. TICE identified JULIUS ROSENBERG as a person he recalled seeing in the drug store at 85 Barrow Street.

He said he positively remembers seeing him there as a customer. Mr. TICE was hesitant in identifying ROSENEERG from the photographs in which ROSENBERG is not wearing glasses, but when shown a photograph of ROSENBERG wearing glasses he made a positive identification.

Mr. TICE stated that he recalls having seen W. ERUCE DAYTON but he could not place where. He said also that WILLIAM PERL "struck a familiar cord" with him. Mr. TICE failed to identify DAVID GREENGLASS, RUTH GREENGLASS, MAX ELITCHER, or MORTON SOBELL.

Mr. HENRY S. ELWYN, Sr., who now resides at Stamford, New York, R.F.D., advised that he was Assistant Superintendent of the apartment building at 65 Morton Street, New York City for approximately 16 months. He gave March 15, 1947 to July 15, 1948 as the approximate dates of his employment there.

Mr. ELWYN stated that to his recollection, he was in apartment 6I only once. As he recalls it now, he entered this apartment one Sunday morning to turn off the water which was running in the shower. This entry was made following a complaint from a tenant in one of the adjoining apartments. Mr. ELWYN said he does not remember anything concerning the interior of the apartment. He could not say whether there was any furniture in the apartment. He finally remembered that he noticed a towel hanging on the rack in the bathroom.

It was Mr. ELWYN's observation that he never saw anyone enter or leave apartment 6I during the time he worked in the building. Mr. ELWYN advised that he recalls that he was also under the impression that ALFRED SARANT was the person to whom the apartment was leased, but since he, Mr. ELWYN, never had any occasion to contact the tenant in this particular apartment, he never saw the occupants of it. Mr. ELWYN stated that it was his duty to collect the rent from the tenants in some of the apartments but that apartment 6I was not one of those from which he collected. It was Mr. ELWYN's impression that the rent on this apartment was sent directly to the realty company.

August 2, 1950

Mr. ELWYN stated that he remembers that on one occasion, a package containing literature was delivered for apartment 6I from a publishing house. The date of this was just after July 4, 1947, but the name of the publishing house and the type of literature was unknown to Mr. ELWYN. Mr. ELWYN said that he received this package from the delivery boy at the door of the apartment building and placed it in the store room where it was picked up later by a person or persons whom he did not see.

Mr. ELWYN reiterated that he never saw or heard any activity in apartment 6I during his tenure as assistant superintendent. When asked specifically concerning any meetings, musicales, parties and the like that may have been held in apartment 6I, Mr. ELWYN said he did not remember ever seeing or hearing about any.

Photographs of ALFRED SARANT, JOEL BARK, DAVID GREENGLASS, RUTH GREENGLASS, JULIUS ROSENBERG, W. BRUCE DAYTON, MAX ELITCHER, WILLIAM PERL and MORTON SOBELL were exhibited to Mr. ELMYN but he failed to identify any of them with the exception of JOEL BARR. He identified the photograph of BARR as as man for whom he fixed an automobile clutch around May or June, 1948. Mr. ELWYN stated that he thinks the car was a 1941 Studebaker. He could give no further description of the automobile. The car, according to ELWYN, was paded in front of either 53 or 59 Morton Street, but he does not know whether the man lived in either of the buildings at those addresses or not. Mr. ELWYN said that was the first and last time he had ever seen this person. were easels in the back seat of this car which lead ELM.YN to believe that the man was an artist. Mr. ELWYN said he did not ask the man's name; that when he finished the job, he was paid cash for it and where the man went from there, he does not know. ELWYN said that his contact with the person that he identified as BARR came about as a result of inquiries by BARR in the neighborhood for a person who could fix automobiles. Mr. ELWYN said that in addition to being assistant superintendent of the apartment building, he also, from time to time, did mechanic's work.

AT SOUTH KORTRIGHT, NEW YORK

Mrs. FRED TICE, wife of the previously mentioned assistant superintendent of the apartment building at 65 Morton Street, New York City, was interviewed and she could furnish nothing that her husband had not previously covered. She did explain that she and her husband sometimes observed the "wild" parties that were held in apartment 61 from the roof of the building.

The photographs of SARANT, BARR, DAVID and RUTH GREENGLASS, JULIUS ROSENBERG, W. BRUCE DAYTON, MAX ELITCHER, WILLIAM PERL and MORTON SOBELL were shown to Mrs. TICE. She immediately recognized SARANT and BARR. She said BARR used to stay with SARANT for weeks at a time. This was prior, she said, to SAFANT's



Mrs. TICE said she feels certain that she has seen WILLIAM PERL in the apartment building. She also stated that W. BHUCE DAYTON looks like a fellow who used to stay with SARANT cuite a bit.

Mrs. TICE observed that ROSENBERG's picture was very familiar, but could make no further identification.

Mrs. TICE did not recognize ELITCHER, SOBELL, or DAVID or RUTH GHEENGLASS.

AT ITHACA, NEW YORK

Manifest records of Robinson Air Lines furnished by Mr. M. STUART GOLDEMITH, Assistant Treasurer, showed that on? FOSENBERG was a passenger on Flight No. 10 from Ithaca, to Newark, N.J., March 5, 1950. Mr. GOLLSWITH further advised that ROBERT W. BUSCHMAN was the steward on Flight No. 10, march 5, 1950, and that BUSCHMAN was presently at the Robinson Air Lines Airport, Endicott, New York.

Mr. F. D. FLORES, Station Wanager, Robinson Air Lines, advised that the passenger list records which would contain the phone number of passengers boarding Flight No. 10, March 5, 1950, had been destroyed. Ar. FLORES pointed out that these passenger list records are kept for three months and , then destroyed.

Mr. LOU DAMIANO, Reservations Clerk, Robinson air Lines, who prepared the manifest on Flight No. 10, March 5, 1950, and therefore in all probability sold a ticket to the ROSENBERG who went from Ithaca to Newark on that date, when shown photographs of JULIUS ROSENBERG, said he could not identify the pictures as being those of a person to whom he had ever sold a ticket. However, Mr. DAMIANO said the pictures closely resembled a person he recalled seeing at the airport on one or two occasions. Mr. DAMIANO was unable to state when he saw this person who resembled the pictures but was certain it was during the period January 1 - June 1, 1950.

AT ENDICOTT, NEW YORK

Mr. ROBERT W. BUSCHMAN, steward on Flight No. 10, March 5, 1950, when shown photographs of JULIUS ROSENEERG, could not identify them as being any person who had been seen by him. Mr. PUSCHMAN did say that the head and shoulders photograph of ROSENBELG without glasses looked familiar, but he could offer nothing further.

The following information has been developed regarding JULIA GODSEY, whose name was contained in relet:

The records of the Credit Bureau of Cincinnati, Inc., reflect that JULIA GODSEY was born November 7, 1920, and is the adopted daughter of J. H. GODSEY, of Itta Bena, Mississippi. She came to Cincinnati in 1943, and during that year was employed at the U. S. Printing and Lithograph Company, Robertson and Beech Streets, Norwood. Since 1944 she has worked for the Central Trust Company, which has a number of branches throughout the Cincinnati area. The Credit Bureau's records contained a former address for JULIA-GODSEY of 2204 Feldman, and a current address of 2265 Park Avenue. The latter address, it is noted, is that of the Norwood Branch, YWCA.

Special Agent WILLIAM GUILFOILE requested the writer to locate JEAN HHCWNEACK, who is the subject of Albany file 65-1651, and interview her in connection with the SARANT and RCSENBERG cases, inasmuch as she was reported to have lived at 74 Barrow Street, Greenwich Village, New York.

This is to advise that JEAN BROWNEACK was located at the Hidden Valley Hanch, Lake Luzerne, New York, where she is employed as a housekeeper and was interviewed on July 29, 1950.

JEAN BROWNDACK, upon interview, advised that she maintains an apartment at 74 Barrow Street, Greenwich Village, New York, and that she has maintained this apartment and has lived there off and on since 1945. She further advised that when she is not residing there she subleases it, and at present it is subleased to two Dartmouth College students, BILL LOARIS and CARL MESSENGIR. She advised that she has resided in the apartment during 1948 and 1949 and that her last period of residence was from Uctober of 1949 to March of 1950.

Mrs. BROWNBACK was asked if, during her period of residence, she was ever in contact or knew RCSENBERG, SARANT or SCRELL. She advised that she had never heard of them or heard any of her accusintances speak of them.

Mrs. BROWNBACK advised that during 1948 and 1949 she became interested in the progressive movement and joined the Young Progressives of America and attended a few of their meetings. She advised, however, that she had never joined the Communist Party, although they were very active in that vicinity.

Mrs. BROWNBACK advised that a CHRISTIAN SIACEL, JR., who at the time of her residence in New York, resided at 184 Perry Street, Greenwich Village, and whose home address is either Fairview Street or Fairview Avenue, Chatham,

New Jersey (phone is listed in his father's name), was active in the progress movement, but that she understood that he has since disaffiliated himself with that element. She advised that if he was interviewed he could probably offer considerable information concerning the so-called progressive element that was active in that area during the 1948-1949 period.

Mrs. BROWNBACK was asked if, during her period of residence, she had noted anything that might be of a subversive nature or any matters pertaining to the security of the country.

She advised that in the Fall of 1949 CORISTIAN SLAGEL was asked to go down to the Brooklyn Waterfront and the area around the Brooklyn Lavy Yard and photograph the section. She stated that he was requested to do this by a fellow called MAX. She advised that she had only seen this person called MAX only once and described him as a German-Jew, heavy set, hig jowls, heavy accent, black bushy hair. She stated that he hangs out at a place called Julius', which is located near Mick's. She also advised that she had heard that the woman that runs Mary's, a so-called night club located in the same vicinity, was also tied up with this MAX in his activities. She further advised that she did not know whether CERISTIAN SLAGEL had actually gone down and taken the requested pictures.

Mrs. BROWNBACK further advised that in the Fall of 1949 she took a plain sealed package from CHRISTIAN's residence to a candy store in Flatbush and delivered it to a person named BCD. Mrs. BROWNBACK could not offer any identifying data concerning the location of the candy store in Flatbush or the person named BCB.

Mrs. BROWNBACK furnished the name of Dr. FREDERICK L. WEDER, Box 225, Route #1, Toms River, New Jersey, who was also active in the progressive movement at that time who might also furnish information concerning the activities of the so-called Progressive Group in the Greenwich village area.
