



Reference is made to Bureau letter to Albany dated 10/2/58, entitled "SECURITY INVESTIGATIONS OF INDIVIDUALS, COMMUNIST INDEX, INTERNAL SECURITY - C" which is quoted as follows:

Current procedures for the Communist Index (CI) were instituted by SAC letter 56-56 (L), 1C/3C/56. The CI represents those persons who in the light of ever-changing conditions should continually be borne in mind with a view toward possible future investigation under the Security Index (SI) Program. Present instructions provide for removal or deletion of CI cards if the subject is placed on the SI or becomes an informant and that no investigative or administrative effort is to be expended to keep these cards in an up-to-date status. However, in the light of increased international tensions, a re-examination of all cases at this time is considered essential for these reasons:

- 1) The Communist Party (CP) has been in a disorganized state and is now reconstituting and rebuilding its membership on the basis of current issues, such as the Formcsa crisis, segregation, et cetera. Subjects in the CI are those most likely to be recontacted and recruited.
- 2) Many subjects, no longer CP members in the bookkeeping sense, retain their militant international Marxist views independently. There is also that large group of followers of the CP line who may be potentially dangerous even though they never became recorded members of the CP.

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- 3) The recent development of new CP offshoot groups, both to the left and to the right, makes broader intelligence coverage more essential and difficult. Older factions of the CP, such as the Socialist Workers Party, are attempting vigorously to recruit disillusioned former CP members.
- 4) A greater number of informants and potential informants ready to be assimilated into a larger CP and its factions is essential. These CI cases present an excellent informant potential.
- 5) The Bureau notes that numerous subjects, removed from the SI in 1955, have been replaced on the SI on the basis of newly developed evidence. Intensified re-examination of the GI should speed the return of such cases to the SI.
- f) If the international crisis deepens the Soviet Intelligence Service will be restricted in its ability to function on an overt basis from diplomatic establishments. In this situation, greater reliance must be then placed on the covert use of United States nationals with a Marxist background and sympathy.

Accordingly, the CI should be completely re-examined on an individual case basis. This re-examination should be made in equal monthly divisions for one year and, where appropriate, should be adapted geographically to the integrated investigative system.

In the light of the foregoing factors, as each case is reopened disposition should be considered in one of the following categories: a) potential informant; b) espionage subject; c) SI subject; d) retention in CI; e) removal from CI.

The following minimum investigative steps should be taken:

- 1) Review file and all pertinent references thoroughly.
- 2) Contact informants, sources, and defected communists who could be expected to know the subject. Contact for evidence of current activity and also for the sources' evaluation of potential dangerousness.

- 3) Determine residence and employment. Check against the key facilities and classified contractors lists to insure full and complete dissemination is made. Submit Form FD-128 if the subject has moved to a new field division.
- 4) If the subject has been a CP "drop" or ceased activity suddenly, develop information to show the reason. Many of these "drops" are purely on the basis of theoretical and intellectual differences. The convictions of the persons involved remain unchanged in their hard-core devotion to the principles of international communism, waiting only for what they consider to be a more favorable climate within ruling communist circles. It should also be borne in mind constantly that unexplained cessation of communist activity by a subject may well be based upon a contemplated assignment in espionage or illegal underground activity.
- 5) Consider interview or reinterview without regard to prior interview results. Bear in mind the Khrushchev revelations of terror under Stalin, anti-Semitism in the Soviet Union and the Hungarian revolt.
- 6) Secure a current description.

Statistics should be maintained throughout this program. They should be submitted quarterly beginning 1/15/59 as follows:

- 1) Number on CI at beginning of program.
- 2) Number on CI to date.
- 3) Number removed from CI during period.
- 4) Number of informants or potential informants developed.
- 5) Number of subjects placed on the SI as a result of this program.
- 6) Number of espionage cases opened. Identify.

- 7) Number of subjects found to be employed at key facilities or by classified contractors.
- 8) Number of instances where this program turned up subjects with delicate or sensitive employment or relationships requiring additional dissemination in line with FBI's over-all security responsibilities.

In order that this program may be closely followed at the Bureau, you are requested to add to the character of all cover letters to reports submitted the words (Communist Index), 1.e., John Doe, Security Matter - C, (Communist Index).

This program should be completed by 10/15/59.

Pursuant to the above information, this case is being reopened and assigned so that the Bureau's instructions may be complied with. The Agent to whom this case is assigned should insure that all phases of the investigation are complete and accurate. Upon bringing this case to a logical conclusion, the Agent to whom it is assigned should submit a memorandum to Albany file #100-17707, advising of its disposition under one of the above eight headings set forth by the Bureau.

Instant investigation was reopened with respect to instant subject under the Communist Index Program, it being noted that subject was previously investigated since she was the wife of ALFRED SARANT, a member of the JULIUS ROSENBERG espionage network who fled the U.S. in August, 1950, and whose whereabouts have been unknown since that time.

A review of this case file fails to reflect any current or pertinent references with respect to the subject and inquiries and contacts maintained during the past several years have indicated that she continues to reside in Ithaca. N.Y. with her two children. Several months ago subject's father advised the writer that she had become afflicted with arthritis.

On 9/10/59, Mr. V. K. WILLERS, Personnel Supervisor, Cornell University, Ithaca, N.Y., advised that subject was employed in a part-time clerical capacity for a few weeks in May, 1959. At that time she listed her residence as 607 North Tioga St. and indicated no recent employment of any sort.

Mr. WILLERS stated that subject is not currently employed at Cornell.

A phone call to subject's residence, as well $b7\varepsilon$ as a discreet spot check on 9/11/59, determined that she resides in the downstairs apartment at 607 North Tioga St. with her two sons. (3-2009) (3-4 4 ... 4...

On 9/11/59, Mr. BRUCE DEANE, Attorney from Ithaca, N.Y., former associate of VICTOR ROSS, subject's stepfather, advised that in recent conversations with ROSS he has ascertained that subject resides at 607 North Tioga St., that she is unemployed and that she keeps pretty much to herself. It will be noted that after many extensive interviews with subject several years ago and after her testimony at a Congressional hearing she refused to have any further interviews with the FBI. Due to this fact and due to the extensive nature of former interviews, she is not being considered for interview at this time.

Subject was observed by the writer on 9/11/59. Her looks have not changed in recent years and she is described as follows:

Due to subject's past possible connection with a Soviet espionage network, it is recommended that she be continued on the Communist Index. Her status has not changed in any way which would qualify her i'or inclusion in the Security Index.

No additional investigation concerning subject is believed warranted at this time.



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

Bureau has recently pointed out that offspring of Communist Party members are subjected to Communist influence from infancy and upon growing older engage in CP activity.

You should, therefore, identify any children of this subject and conduct sufficient discreet inquiry concerning their activities to determine whether they are engaging in CP affairs. If it is found that such children or youth are active in the Party or a Party controlled or influenced organization, you should submit a separate memorandum so that a separate case file may be opened and investigation conducted, as in the case of an adult individual. In These investigations be alert for associations with other teenagers so that we can examine the extent of Communist influence being exerted against other youth in the community. This investigation must be implemented with discretion and good judgment. For instance, cases would not be opened on very young children.

The above is necessary so that we may keep pace with the Party's continued emphasis on youth activity and exploitation of the youth of this country.

The case of the above captioned subject is being reopened and assigned to you for handling in accordance with instructions contained in SAC Letter Number 60-30 (C), dated June 21, 1960, which are summarized as follows:

The presently constituted Communist Index will henceforth be known as the "Reserve Index" (RI).

Standards for Inclusion of Names in the Reserve Index

The Reserve Index is to insure that it fully represents a list of individuals who should be considered for investigation and/or other action following apprehension of SI subjects. The revised standards follow:

- 1. Membership in a basic revolutionary organization subsequent to January 1, 1949, together with some indication of sympathy or association with such an organization or a subversive front organization subsequent to the reported membership and no reliable evidence of defection.
- 2. Investigation has failed to substantiate allegations of membership in a revolutionary organization within the past five years, coupled with some evidence or information indicating activity, association or sympathy for the subversive cause within the same period, and no reliable evidence of defection.
- 3. The individual, within the past five years, by his associations, writings, financial support or conduct in relation to and support of subversive organizations or the international communist movement is in a position to influence others at the time of a national emergency and no reliable evidence of defection.

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- 4. Leadership or substantial activities in a major subversive front group over three years ago, together with some evidence of continuing activity, association or sympathy for the subversive cause within three years and no reliable evidence of defection.
- 5. Membership in a subversive front organization within the past three years and no reliable evidence of defection.

A review of closed SI cases is not to be conducted to identify additional individuals whose names should be included in the Reserve Index under the revised standards, but names should be added as cases come to the attention of Agents handling security work.

Recognizing that some individuals included in the Reserve Index represent a greater potential threat in time of an emergency than do others, the Reserve Index is being divided into two sections, Section A and Section B.

SECTION A

Section A of the Reserve Index is designed to represent a special group of individuals who should receive priority consideration with respect to investigation and/or other action following the apprehension of our Security Index subjects.

Section A of the Reserve Index should include those individuals whose subversive activities do not bring them within the Security Index criteria, but who, in a time of national emergency, are in a position to influence others against the national interest or are likely to furnish material financial aid to subversive elements due to their subversive associations and ideology. Included in Section A will be those individuals falling within the following categories:

- 1. Professors, teachers and educators.
- 2. Labor union organizers or leaders.
- 3. Writers, lecturers, newsmen, entertainers and others in the mass media field.
- 4. Lawyers, doctors and scientists.
- 5. Other potentially influential persons on a local or national level.
- 6. Individuals who could potentially furnish material financial aid.

SECTION B

Section B is to contain the names of the remaining individuals included in the Reserve Index and will be maintained in the field in the same manner in which the former Communist Index was maintained.

Upon deletion of a subject's name from the Security Index based upon the application of the Security Index criteria, a determination should be made as to whether his name should then be placed in Section A of the Reserve Index. If assigned, the appropriate recommendation is to be submitted. If the facts do not justify inclusion of the subject's name in Section A, the canceled Security Index card should be filed in Section B of the Reserve Index.

Action Required Concerning the Captioned Subject

- 1. Verify residence and employment.
- 2. Conduct indices search and file review to determine whether investigation is warranted at this time or whether an interview of the subject is deemed desirable. Interviews will be handled in accordance with current Bureau instructions set forth in Section 87D of the Manual of Instructions.
- 3. If additional investigation is conducted, or if there is unreported information of a subversive nature contained in the files, a report must be submitted.
- 4. Make a determination as to whether a captioned subject falls within the above criteria for inclusion in Section A of the Reserve Index, and if so, nominate for inclusion in Section A by submission of the appropriate form which the Bureau is providing for this purpose. Attach to that form, to be submitted to the Bureau, a succinct summary setting forth the basis for recommendation that the subject's name be included in Section A of the Reserve Index. If no further investigation is warranted in this case at the present time, or if no report is accompanying the recommendation, a statement to that effect should appear on the page containing the succinct summary.
- 5. If the subject does not meet the criteria for Section A of the Reserve Index, no communication need be forwarded to the Bureau, but instead a brief memorandum should

be written for the subject's file reflecting that the above steps have been taken and setting out suitable justification with the recommendation that the subject's name be placed in Section B of the Reserve Index.

As a matter of information, investigations of subjects listed in Section A of the Reserve Index are to be brought up to date annually and they are to be considered for Security Index status or retention on the Reserve Index. As a minimum, above steps 1, 2 and 3 must be taken, including the submission of reports in the event additional subversive data is developed. Changes in residence and/or employment must be submitted to the Bureau on the appropriate form designed for this purpose with respect to subjects listed in Section A of the Reserve Index.

Section A of the Reserve Index will be maintained in the field and at the Seat of Government in the same manner as the Security Index, except that the Reserve Index will be maintained only alphabetically. A copy of the Reserve Index will be re-located away from Headquarters City in the same manner as the Security Index and at the same location. To avoid confusion with the Security Index, however, distinctive colored cards and forms used in connection therewith will be utilized.

Subject resides at 607 North Tioga Street, Ithaca, NY and is unemployed.

A current indices search reflected no new references, and no investigation with respect to her is deemed warranted at this. time.

Subject was interviewed on 3/9/61. She advised that she still has no idea as to her former husband's whereabouts, and she denied any involvement in Soviet espionage.

Based upon the above, it is not believed that subject's name should be included in Section A of the Reserve Index, but that she be included in Section B. Due to her present status as a mother and homemaker with no employment, it is not felt that she is in a position to be an espionage agent.
