With reference to your attached name check request, this is to advise that a review of the files of this office discloses no reference to captioned firm.

The files reveal that one, Leonard Boudin, was listed as one of the attorneys who represented Judith Coplan. (TAKEN FROM 65-1664-183-p105)

In November, 1953, a source who was in position to furnish reliable information, advised that a Leonard Boudin, not further identified, was a member of the Executive Committee of the Emergency Civil Liberties Committee. (TAKEN 63-0-7)

According to a news item in "The New York Times" issue of June 4, 1954, one of the members of the Executive Committee of the Emergency Civil Liberties Committee

According to a news item in the "Daily Worker"  
issue of December 9, 1955, one of the attorneys who was  
representing a group of suspended school employees for  
refusing to testify as to Communist Party membership was  
listed as Victor Rabinowitz, not further identified. (TAKEN  
FROM 100-9593-473)

In June, 1950, Julius Rosenberg was inter-  
viewed and advised that the Federation of Architects,  
Engineers, Chemists and Technicians Union sent him to  
Victor Rabinowitz, an attorney with offices on Lower  
Broadway, New York City when he was unable to hire  
an attorney himself. (TAKEN FROM 65-1764-15-p8)
