

The diagram and equations on the reverse side of one of the press in Al appear to be legitimate work notes on a simple problem in Physics.

The original evidence constituting Al has been handled as noted in a separate laboratory report setting forth results of the ocument examination. Photographic copies are being placed in the Laboratory File.

SCHOTT has published the first part of this method /11 Combo, or rather, the exclusively original one of CUSTE, which is included in this publication 19 pages, without any explanatory text, while in the E. LEWOINE edition, there are 51 pages with a complete text, plus other exercises which do not senear in G-A. The work of N.C. ends in the 25 etudes which have been published and much exhausted in a short time, but fortunately, AlFRLOO COTTIN has ro-edited them, revised them, fingered them, through the medium of the firm of "Costallat & Co., Paris." In them can be seen the formidable musical structure of the work of Co. which denotes the profound knowledge of harmony, counterpoint and guitar technique possessed by the author. Of the work of COSTE, we have in our possession, published by the mentioned "O-A", those of opus 11, 12 pieces; opus 51, 11, pieces; opus 52, 37 pieces, the majority of which are transcriptions to which the German publishing house has assigned the numbers 12, 13 and 14 respectively in its recerds.

(The hereinafter quoted information was contained in a memorandum from the Omaha Office to the Baltimore Office dated March 22, 1949, and reflects all the information available here concerning GLEENMAN and his wife.)

"By letter dated January 13, 1949, the New York Office made available an exhibit obtained by their Confidential Informant ND-426 on October 22, 1948, which reflected that L. W. GLEEKMAN. Post Office Box 710, Iowa City, Iowa, was a subscriber to the Daily Worker, East Coast Communist newspaper.

The records of the registrar's office, State University of Iowa, Iowa City, Iowa, reflect that GLEEKMAN attended the Graduate College from the Summer of 1946 until August 4, 1948, at which time he received his Doctor of Philosophy Degree, with a major in Chemical Engineering. It was noted that his transcripts of credits were, transferred on September 3, 1948 to the University of Delaware. Newark, Delaware. The records reflect GLEEKMAN was born on June 10, 1920 at Lynn, Massachusetts; and that his home address was 592 Bishop Avenue, Bridgeport, Connecticut; that his father is MORRIS B. GLEEKMAN, 592 Bishop Avenue, Bridgeport, Conn.

"The records reflect that he received a Bachelor of Chemical Engineering Degree in 1942 from the Cooper Union Institute of Technology, New York, N.Y., and also that he attended the Stevens Institute of Technology, Hoboken, N.J., in 1944 for one semester.



EETTY SAUNDERS, who was believed to be a close friend of Mrs. ALFRED SAMANT, was interviewed July 24, 1950 at Schrooms Crest Manor, Pottersville, New York.

SAUNDERS was shown a photograph of a group of persons on a hiking trip. The group included SAUNDERS, JOEL SARR and Mrs. ALFRED SARANT. SAUNDERS identified herself and Wrs. SAHANT in the photograph and then declined to answer further pertinent questions pending advice of counsel. After further discussion, however, shedid say that she had been a close friend of Mr. and Mrs. ALFRED SAFANT, meeting SARANT first about 1942 and meeting Mrs. SARANT some short time later. She stated she did not recall specific details as to how she met these people. She stated she had visited 65 Morton Street on many occasions while the SAFANTS resided there, but did not recall the names of other persons whom she met there. She further stated that when she first saw the picture of JULIUS ROSEN-BEFG in the newspapers she recalled him as an individual whom she might have met someplace. However, she declined to answer further questions concerning JULIUS POSENBERG.

SAUNDERS stated that she is returning to New York City on the night of August 2, 1950, where she will remain until August 5. After August 5, she will go to "somewhere in the West" for a singing engagement. It is noted that in a letter to Ers. ALFRED SARANT dated in July, 1950, she advised Mrs. SARANT that she had a singing engagement in New Mexico at a progressive ranch. She did not state, however, what the address of this ranch was.

SAUNDERS advised that agents of the New York Office should contact her through her home, 2212 Ditmas Avenue, Brooklyn, New York, telephone BU 23510. The telephone at this address will probably be listed under the name of SCHLENGER, which is SAUNDERS' correct name and the name of her mother. who also resides at that address. She requested that the agents not indicate to her mother, either by phone or in person, that they are with the FBI, but simply to leave a message and she will contact them. She stated that at that time she will have made her decision as to whether or not she desires to cooperate with the Eureau in this matter.

If SAUNDERS will consent to a further interview by agents of the New York Office, it should be borne in mind that there is a definite possibility that she is implicated in the ROSENBERG espionage ring and that she undoubtedly has information about visitors to SARANT's apartment at 65 Morton Avenue, which would be of great assistance.

Since she stated that she would not answer questions fully without advice of counsel, she was not shown photographs of BARR, PERL, SIDOROVITCH, the ROSENBERGS, the ELITCHERS or SOBELL.

A photograph of SAUNDERS, which is a good likeness, is being forwarded with a copy of this letter to New York, for exhibition to the ELITCHERS.

For the information of the New York Office, SAUNDERS is undoubtedly a member of the Party. In a letter dated October 1, 1949 to Mrs. ALFRED SARANT, she describes both the Peekskill incidents. She advised that she attended both through her employment as chairman of Peoples Artists of New York City, which organization was one of the sponsors of PAUL ROBESON at Peekskill. Throughout this letter she continually refers to "our boys" as heroes and describes the actions of the police in clubbing negroes. She also described the activities of her brother, who drove one of the busses leaving the area.

The Newark Office indices were negative on BURDICK and the records of the Office of Selective Service at Trenton, New Jersey, had no record on BURDICK.

Lieutenant Commander JAMES A. GUIDA, Naval Air Station, Lakehurst, New Jersey, was interviewed on July 14, 1950. He stated he has known ALFRED SARANT since his Senior year at Hempstead High School, Hempstead, New York.

Lieutenant Commander GUIDA stated that SARANT can be considered very brilliant. GUIDA advised SARANT attended Cooper-Union College where he finished fourth among those taking the entrance examination. GUIDA stated that he was a very good friend of SARANT at this time, and that they had both taken the entrance examination to Cooper-Union College, but he was not fortunate enough to be admitted.

Lieutenant Commander GUIDA stated that SARANT's parents were Greek immigrants. GUIDA advised that ALFRED SARANT's brother, RAY, was in England during the Blitz and later entered the United States Army and served in the African campaign where he was captured. According to Lieutenant Commander GUIDA, RAYMOND-SARANT, after four attempts, escaped and worked with the Underground movement in France. Another brother, WILLIAM, was an enlisted man in the Quarter-master Corps of the United States Navy. GUIDA advised that he wrote a letter of recommendation for a Commission for ALFRED SARANT to the United States Navy in 1941 but SARANT did not receive this Commission.

According to Lieutenant Commander GUIDA, SARANT worked at the Signal Corps Laboratories, Fort Monmouth, New Jersey, and left there to go with the Western Electric Company in New York and later with the Bell Telephone Laboratories. He left the Bell Telephone Laboratories to get a Doctor's degree in Physics at Cornell University and is now a building contractor in the vicinity of Cornell University, New York.

Lieutenant Commander GUIDA stated the last correspondence he had with ALFRED SARANT was a Christmas card from SARANT telling him of his being a contractor. He stated the last time he saw ALFRED SARANT was in April, 1945 when the USS Benjamin Franklin was at the Brooklyn Navy Yard after a cruise and he took SARANT through the ship.

GUIDA advised that he considered SARANT a good friend of his and during his college days saw him about once every three to six months. He stated that SARANT, as well as himself, had a very heavy schedule in college and, as a result, did not see each other more often.

Lieutenant Commander GUIDA volunteered the information that SARANT is for the "under privileged", but felt he was never a member of the Communist Party. He stated SARANT had talked him into subscribing to a small pamphlet named—In Fact, by GEORGE SELDES. He stated that he and SARANT had discussed the press of this country and felt it did not give a true picture, being somewhat biased, and this was one of the reasons he purchased "In Fact". In connection with this, GUIDA also volunteered that due to his opinion of the press he reads "The Mation" and "The New Republic" in order to get a better picture of happenings.

GUIDA stated that SARANT and he both had a great admiration for the Russian war effort during the past war and often discussed it. He also advised that SARANT had never visited him anywhere, but that he had looked up SARANT during the war in order to take him for a tour through the USS Benjamin Franklin. He also looked him up in New York City where he went through the 42d Street plant of the Western Electric Company where SARANT was working on radar.

GUIDA advised that SARANT had never requested him to give any information concerning the work he was doing in the United States Navy, and further stated that EARANT was working on more highly classified work than he during the war while employed with the Western Electric Company. He related that SARANT was looked upon with high regard by his fellow employees and superiors while he was employed at the Western Electric Company and Bell Telephone Laboratories.

Lieutenant Commander GUIDA advised that as far as he knows SARANT is still living in the vicinity of Ithaca, New York, with his wife and son. GUIDA was cautioned to keep the interview concerning SARANT confidential.

the apartment consistently (late 1947-early 1948) until he returned to Cleveland in June of 1948. He paid SARANT by check or money order at Ithaca, New York by mail and denies paying SARANT any money after June of 1948.

FERL denies seeing or being in contact with SARANT since he last paid the rent on the Morton Street apartment to SARANT and specifically denies ever seeing SARANT in Ithaca, New York although he admittedly worked at Cornell University for approximately six weeks during the summer of 1947 and lectured at Cornell on October 12, 1948. It is noted Cornell University is located at Ithaca, New York.

During an authorized search of PERL's residence two photographs of children were obtained. One photograph bers the notation on the reverse thereof JEREMY—20 months, Lugust, 1948 and the other bore the notation on the reverse thereof STEVE—six menths, December, 1948. When these photographs were presented to PERL he advised he did not know the identity of the children nor the source from which he had procured them but insisted on retaining them.

On a subsequent interview (July 21, 1950) PERL volunteered he believed these photographs may have been pictures of SARANT's children although he was at a loss to explain why he should have them since he had been only a casual acquaintance of SARANT and had steadfastly maintained he had not seen SARANT nor been in contact with him since the fall of 1946. He reiterated him only correspondence with SARANT was in forwarding rent checks to him from late 1947 to June, 1948 but stated that since these photographs indicated dates of August, 1948 and December, 1948 he must have received them from SARANT by mail.

PERL denied writing to SARANT since June, 1948 and specifically denied writing to SARANT in January of 1950 advising he had no further use for the 65 Norton Street apartment.

He further denied ever visiting ALFRED and LOUISE SARANT at: Ithaca New York at any time and emphasized he paid no rent to SARANT after June of 1948.

He denied purchasing a guitar at any time.

It is noted AIFRED SARANT and his wife LOUISE have advised in a recent interview that PERL visited them in Ithaca sometime between April, 1947 and July, 1948. It is also noted SARANT had in his possession a money order stub dated November 24, 1948 bearing the signature W. PERL as remitter.

In addition a money order stub dated October 28, 1949, signed by W. PERL as remitter and payable to ALFRED SAGANT was located at the U. S. Post Office, Ithaca, New York.

There was also found in SARANT's possession during an authorized search a Bill of Sale of the Tatay Music Chop, 147 West 46th Street near Broadway which was dated March 24, 1925 and which was made out to Mr. WILLIAMOUTTERPERL, 1516 East 193th Street, Cleveland, Ohio for a Spanish guitar and accourtements, towalling \$75.65. The number of this bill was 6639 and it was noted thereon cash had been paid. It is also noted FERL was born WILLIAM MUTTERFERL and legally changed his name on January 3, 1945 to PERL.

WILLIAM PERL advised he may have met LOUISE SARAMT but he did not identify a photograph of hur.

MICHAEL and AND SIDERVICH have advised they do not know the subject and neither effected an identification of his photograph or a photograph of his wife IDUISE.

Dultimore teletype dated August 1, 1950 reflects that Mulberry 7681 is the telephone number of "Mars, The Contract Co.", and that one SAMUEL ... SCHARLLR is personnel manager of this company. This teletype states that SCIPERLER has been connected with the Communist Party since 1936, and that New York has background information in their file 121-473, and in Baltimore letter to the Bureau and New York dated April 5, 1949, entitled "Unsubs, Was. Bill and Catherine, Esp.-R (Gregory Case)". The Bureau has background in Bufile 100-4820.

The material obtained during the search of the subject's home included a Metropolitan Savings Bank Pess Book #214528, which reflects that ALFRED SARUIT and SARUTOMORIER opened a joint savings account there on . January 6, 19/1 with a deposit of \$2.00. This pass book reflects no further deposits, no withdrawals, and no entries of any kind.

When interviewed about this book, SARAHT said that SAM SMOOKLER was a friend with whom he went to school at Cooper Union. He said that he did not know why they opened this joint savings account.

Hew York is requested to ascertain if there has been any further activity in the joint bank account of SARANT and SMOOKLER at the Metropolitan Savings Bank, 754 Broadway, corner of 8th Street, New York City.

DAYTON described as close friend of a Professor MORRISON of Physics Department, Cornell, and that both DAYTON and MURRISON active in Progressive Party, Ithaca, New York. DETAILS: AT SEATTLE, WASHINGTON

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent RCEERT K. MacNAMARA and the writer.

Dr. HANS A. HETHE, 1723 East 36th Street, Seattle, Washington, was interviewed on July 28, 1950. Dr. BETHE has been employed as a summer faculty member of the Physics Department, University of Washington at Seattle. Dr. HETHE advised that he first met VICTOR N. D. ROSS in December, 1945, when RCSS was recommended to him as an attorney by a fellow professor at Cornell, GEORGE WINTER. ROSS was engaged by BETRE to perform legal services in connection with a purchase of a home in Ithaca. Dr. BETHE states that ROSS did considerable legal work in connection with this matter. BETHE stated that ROSS refused to accept a fee for his legal services in connection with this house purchase and when asked why. ROSS stated that it would be necessary for him to charge Dr. BETHE approximately \$1,000.00 if he were adequately paid for his services, and he knew that Dr. HETHE did not desire to pay that large a fee. DETHE stated that it was his impression that NOSS desired his friendship and that this may have been the major reason for refusing a fee. ROSS impressed BETRE as being an individual who sought the friendship of college professors and may have desired HENHE's social acquaintanceship because of RETHE's reputation as a nuclear physicist.

ROSS initiated a social acquaintanceship with Dr. HETHE by inviting the RETHES to his hone, which invitation was returned on one occasion by the RETHES; however, no close social relationship developed. BETHE stated that ROSS since has drawn up a will for BETHE and performed legal service for RETHE's wife in drawing up a charter for a club to aid an Ithaca hospital in which lirs. BETHE is interested. RETHE stated that he stillmaintains a friendly, but definitely not a close relationship with ROSS, stating he has nothing in common with ROSS on which to base a close friendship. BETHE stated that he has paid ROSS for his legal service in connection with this will and charter.

ROSS and RETHE, during the few times they met socially, had violent political discussions, according to BETHE. He stated that he and ROSS thoroughly disagreed on politics and the heated arguments he had with ROSS left RETHE with the impression that ROSS' opinions were very close to the Communist Party line. He further stated it was his impression that ROSS was politically naive. RETHE stated that he has no information to indicate that ROSS is a Communist Party member, but does know that ROSS has been an active supporter of the Progressive Party.

In February, 1946, ROSS told BETTE about his son-in-law, ALFRED SARANT, who at that time was working for Bell Telephone Laboratorics at New York City and who was very interested in studying physics. BETHE states that ROSS asked him if he could help SARANT enter Cornell University as a graduate student. BETHE claims he told RCSS that he was not in a position to commit himself to sponsor anybody, but would be glad to talk to SARANT to ascertain if SARANT were sufficiently qualified to enter the graduate school at Cornell. BETHE states that it was not his impression at the time that RCSS was attempting to push him into sponsoring SARANT and that the discussion regarding ROSS' son-in-law was entirely normal and brought up during normal conversations. During approximately Hay, 1946. BETHE first met SARANT when SARANT was brought to BETHE's office at the University of Cornell by his father-in-law, ROSS. ESTIR states that he talked with SARANT at this time for a short time concerning SARANT's qualifications. HETHE claimed that from his discussion with SARANT, it was apparent that SARANT was not qualified to enter the graduate school in physics and that he so advised SARANT. Dr. HETHE advised that he told SAPAIT it would be necessary for him to further qualify himself before his application could be considered inasmuch as there were many botter qualified students who were seeking admission to the graduate school at Cornell and that many students better qualified than he were being refused admittance because of the large number desiring acceptance in this field. EETHE recommended several general physics texts for SARANT to study, but told him that his chances for admission were not good.

Later, BETHE told the Head of the Physics Department at Cornell that in regard to SARANT's application, he, BETHE, saw no reason to recommend SARANT and that subsequently SARANT's application was refused. Also concerning SARANT's application, BETHE states that he received a letter from Bell Telephone Laboratories in New York City in which the Bell Telephone Company advised that SARANT had been an agitator in union activities while employed at Bell Telephone Laboratories.

In view of BETHE's refusal to sponsor SARANT's acceptance by the Physics Department at Cornell as a graduate student, he said that he was very surprised when SARANT decided to go to Ithaca anyway in the fall of 1946. He said that he considered it very strange that SARANT SE 65-3114 ---

should give up a position with Bell Telephone Laboratories because he definitely gave SARANT no encouragement and SARANT had no assurance whatsoever of acceptance at Cornell. Further, Dr. BETHE states to his knowledge SARAIT had no promise of any job in Ithaca when he first went there. Several months later, which Dr. BETHE placed as approximately late fall in November or December, 1946, the Physics Laboratory at Cornell University began construction of a synchrotron. He explained that this machine is used to generate electrons and is in no respect confidential. Rectrical engineers were required for this construction and SARAMT applied and received a position as an electrical engineer. ECTAE states that he does not know how SARANT knew of this position, but states that SARANT used the Physics Library at Cornell from time to time for individual study and also was acquainted closely with one ERUCE DAYTON, a graduate student in physics at the University. It was Dr. BETHE's guess that SARANT probably heard of a possible position on this construction through DAYTON. DATTON was described by Dr. BETHE as "close to the left and active in the Progressive Party

Dr. HETHE stated that during the time that SARANT was employed at Cornell, the University had no confidential contracts and that SARANT had no access to confidential data in his work on the synchrotron. BETHE stated that the only confidential information of which he was aware at Cornell University at this time was contained in various documents relating to a confidential consultant contract which BETHE has had with the Atomic Energy Commission since the termination of his duties at Los Alamos, New Mexico, but claims that SARANT had no access to this information. BETHE stated that DAYTON formerly was employed at California Technical Institute and may have had access to classified information at that time which possibly could have been available to SARANT.

Concerning the confidential information in the possession of BETHE, he stated that all documents relating to his consultant contract are now maintained in two safes in his office at Cornell University. The combination to one safe is known only to himself and the combination to the other safe is known only to himself and to his secretary, DOROTHY SATORR. The last mentioned combination was changed by order of the Atomic Energy Commission in January, 1950, but the previous combination to this safe was known to Professor FINHAN and Professor MORRISON,

both of the Physics Department at Cornell. BETHE stated that FEYNMAN probably did not know SARANT and was not close to BRUCE DAYTON, knowing DAYTON only as a graduate student. Dr. BETHE advised, however, that Professor MCRAISON was close to BEUCHYDAYTON and both were active in the Progressive Party in Ithaca. Dr. HETHE advised that he had no knowledge of any espionage activities on the part of any person except what has appeared recently in the public press and stated that he had no further information concerning ALFRED SARANT.





ALFRED SARANT ESPIONACE - R CONFIDENTIAL

As set out in my memorandum of July 17, 1950, captioned, "Julius Rosenberg; Espionage - R," David Greenglass has advised Bureau Agents that in conversations with Julius Rosenberg, the latter indicated that he was renting two apartments in New York City, one in Greenwich Village and the other in the vicinity of Twelfth Street and Avenue B, both of which were used for microfilm work and were not tenanted.

Investigation has disclosed that one Alfred Sarant was the lessee of Apartment 6-I at 65 Forton Street, in the Greenwich Village Section of New York City, from October, 1943 to January 31, 1950, and that he is well acquainted with Julius and Ethel Rosenberg.

Sarant was born September 26, 1918 in New York City, attended
Cooper Union, New York City from September, 1936 to June, 1941, receiving
a Bachclor's Degree in Electrical Engineering. He was employed by the
Western Electric Company on June 16, 1941 and resigned on September 20, 1941.
He was appointed as Junior Radio Engineer on September 22, 1941 in the Army
Service Forces, Signal Corps Ground Signal Agency, Fort Monmouth, New Jersey,
and was discharged with prejudice on September 3, 1942, but the nature of
his termination was later changed to "Resignation without Prejudice," effective
September 3, 1942. He was suspended from duty on September 4, 1942 for failure
to comply with official travel orders; he contended, however, that his
difficulty with his superiors resulted in fact from his pro-union activities.
The Signal Corps Officer in Charge of the section in which Barant was employed
characterized him as a labor agitator and furnished considerable derogatory
information concerning Sarant with respect to the latter attitude,
cooperativeness and the quality of his work.

Sarant was rehired by the Western Electric Company on September 30, 1942, was transferred to the Bell Telephone Laboratories, New York City on October 15, 1945, and resigned from this concern on September 31, 1946. He married Jacqueline Louise Ross on July 6, 1945 and since 1946 has resided in Ithaca, New York, where he is self-employed as a building and painting contractor.

Serant has been interviewed by Bureau Agents on several occasions, commencing on July 19, 1950, on which date a search of his residence was conducted after Serent voluntarily consented thereto in writing. During the initial interview with Serant, he admitted membership in the Communist Political Association in 1943 and 1944. He also admitted acquaintanceship with Julius and Ethel Rosenberg, and declared that he believes he met the former some time between January, 1942 and January, 1945, possibly through introduction by Joel Barr, who was a classmate of Rosenberg at the College of the City of New York. Serant contended that he has seen Rosenberg on eight or ten occasions since their initial meeting, and declared that his second meeting with Rosenberg occurred at the latter's spartment in New York City.

During the course of the initial interview, Sarant decied that he had ever engaged in espionage activities with Rosenberg. In response to the question if Rosenberg ever propositioned him to engage in such activities, Sarant replied that Rosenberg did advance such a proposition to him on one occasion. Sarant declared that one evening when he and Rosenberg were walking slong the street, possibly on the lower East Side of New York City, he got the impression from Rosenberg's conversation that the latter was sounding him out politically, and Sarant informed Agents, "I didn't bite." Intensive questioning of Sarant concerning this conversation resulted in his insisting that he could recall no details as to what exact proposition Rosenberg was sounding him out politically. Sarant's definite impression that Rosenberg was sounding him out politically. Sarant definitely states, however, that Rosenberg did not at this time, or any other time, ask him for any information for transmittal to the Russians.

Sarant claims to be unable to recall the details or circumstances of the various other meetings he admits having had with Rosenberg and states they may have been casual meetings at restaurants or meetings of the Federation of Architects, Engineers, Chemists and Technicians, of which union both Sarant and Rosenberg were members. Barant declared that he has not seen or heard from Rosenberg since moving to Ithaca, New York in 1946 and he was extremely vegue as to the reason for the names and address of Julius and Ethal

Rosenberg appearing in his personal telephone list finder. Serent informed Agents he is willing to cooperate in the investigation, but it was observed that he was extremely vaciliating and equivocal in his answers with respect to his association with Rosenberg, while, on the other hand, his replies to questions concerning less pertinent matters were positive and definite.

Sarant admitted that he has met Ethel Rosenberg from Dur to eight times although he claimed inability to recall the location or circumstances of such meetings. He did deny that Ethel Rosenberg was ever in his apartment at 65 Morton Street, New York City, but admitted that his wife was acquainted with Ethel Rosenberg.

Hith reference to his statement that he believes he met Julius Rosenberg through Joel Barr, Sarant explained that he first met Barr shortly efter September, 1941, when both were employed at the U.S. Army Signal Corps Laboratories, Fort Monmouth, Hew Jersey. He said that he and Barr became quite friendly and often visited each other's residences. He recalled that Barr was fired from the Signal Corps Laboratories because he was a Communist. Sarant declared that he and Barr spent considerable time together from 1943 through 1945, going on cance trips together, and said that Barr was a frequent visitor to his apartment at 65 Morton Street, New York City and had a key to his apartment. He admitted that he believes Parr was a member of the Communist Party, but denied that they ever attended any Communist Party meetings together.

It was further learned from Sarant that some time in the late summer of 1946 when he had decided to move to Ithaca, New York, he was asked by Barr if the latter could take over the Morton Street apartment. Sarant agreed, and said that the last time he saw Barr was when the latter went to Ithaca late in 1946 or early in 1947. He said that the last he had heard of Barr was that the latter was in Finland studying music.

Further questioning of Sarant elicited the information that some time after he was married and residing at 65 Morton Street, he and Joel Barr rented a first-floor span at an address he claimed he could not now recall but which, to the best of his recollection, was located within ten or fifteen

minutes walking distance from his Morton Street apartment. that this room was rented by Barr and himself some time between July, 1945 and September, 1946, and claimed that the room was used as a combination bobby and workshop. He said he and Barr adopted the name Sarant Laboratories. Inc. although they never incorporated, and said they purchased gold lettering and placed it in the window of the room to identify the place under the above name. They also had letterheads printed, but Sarant contended that he and Barr never attempted to obtain any work through this shop but used it merely as a hobby. Sarant emphatically denied that this establishment was used as a cover for espionage activity and said he had no knowledge of the uses to which the room was put by Barr, who continued to use it after Sarant moved to Ithaca. Sarant admitted considerable interest and proficiency is photography and said he maintained two sets of flood lamps, as well as film-developing equipment, in his Morton Street apartment. He denied that any such equipment, however, was used for any purposes other than personal photography. U

with reference to the apartment at 65 Morton Street, New York City, a lease for the premises was located during the search of Sarant's residence. The lease reflects that Sarant leased that spertment, unfurnished, on September 19, 1943, effective October 1, 1943, for a monthly rental of 445. Sarant has stated that he resided alone in the apartment until he was married on July 6, 1945, after which he and his wife resided there until September, 1946, when they moved to Ithaca. He declared that musicals were often held in the apartment and that numerous guests of both himself and Barr attended those affairs. He specifically denied that Julius and Ethal Rosenberg, Max and Helene Elitcher or Morton and Helen Sobell ever attended thom musicals, and, furthermore, denied that he has ever known or heard of the Elitchers or the Sobells.

Sarant declared that after he agreed to turn over the apartment to Barr in September, 1946, it was agreed that Barr, or whoever was using the apartment, would send the monthly rent to Sarant who, in turn, would pay the realty company. Sarant admitted that he received money orders for the rent ITom Barr, William Perl and Vivian Glassman, the last-named apparently being Earr's paramour.

Earant denied that he had ever returned to the Morton Street address after moving from there in September, 1946 and likewise denied that he had ever resided at any other address from 1943 to 1946. He denied knowing what the epartment may have been used for after he vacated it, and said that he believes he terminated his lease for the apartment on January 31, 1950, at the request of William Perl. U

Concerning William Porl, Sarant declared that he met this individual through Barr while living at 65 Morton Street, and characterized him as morely an occasional acquaintance whom he saw only a few times. Serant was extremely indefinite as to the number and nature of such meetings between himself and Porl, although it is to be noted that the search of Sarant's residence reflected several items of correspondence addressed to Sarant and his wife by Perl indicating a rather close relationship among them.

Jacqueline Louise Ross Sarant, wife of Alfred Serant, was also interviewed by Buresu Agents and she advised she was born in New York City on April 2, 1923. She declared that in 1944 she was employed by the Soviet Government Purchasing Commission in Washington, D. C. in a clerical espacity and she admitted past membership in the Greenwich Village Branch of the Communist Perty.

The Superintendent of the premises at 65 Morton Street, New York City, advised Agents that some time in the winter of 1944, he had occasion to enter the Sarant spertment in connection with his custodial duties. He declared that he observed very little furniture in the spartment, but recelled that the spartment contained three iron single cots, that the living room contained a workbench, a considerable quantity of tools of the type an electrician would-use, and that the closet held several black metal toolboxes and the chassis of what appeared to be two radios.

The Superintendent recalled some of Sarant's visitors and volunteered the opinion that Sarant and his friends constituted a Young Communist organization He based his opinion on observation of gatherings of ten or twelve people,

male and female, in Sarant's apartment, and recalled seeing one or two Megro men at some of these gatherings.

Floyd Elwyn, Jr., son of the Superintendent at 65 Morton Street, advised Agents that when he entered Sarant's apartment in December, 1949 or January, 1950, he observed that a reflector type photo flood bulb, or similar type bulb, was suspended from the wall over the kitchen table, and that there were at least a dozen fountain pens and a few colored pencils on the table. He also recalled that there was an easel or drawing board left in the spartment after it was vacated.

It is to be noted that none of the keys located in the search of Julius Rosenberg's apartment incident to his arrest fits the lock on the Sarant apartment. Neither Mr. Elwyn, Senior, or his son could identify photographs of Julius and Ethel Rosenberg.

The results of the continuing investigation of Sarant will be furnished to you promptly as received.

These musicales, according to the subject, were held frequently and were attended by various people, invited and uninvited friends of his and JOHL BARR.

MAX ELITCHER has edvised the New York Office that JULIUS ROSENBERG, MORTON BOBELL, WILLIAM ERL, Na., WILLIAM OTTERPERL, and the ELITCHERS socialized in 1945-1946 at SARANT's apartment at 65 Morton Street, New York City and that ELITCHER gained the impression that all of these parsons, with the exception of himself, were cooperating with JULIUS ROUERTHARG in his espionage network.




