Photographic copies of this letter are being sent to the FBI Laboratory with the request that the handwriting be compared with the known handwriting of Henrietta Savidgs.

Copies are also being forwarded to New York and Cleveland for their information. If not already done, New York and Cleveland are requested to forward handwriting specimens of SAVIDOE to FBI Laboratory.

Newark is requested to conduct investigation to ascertain the names of the persons residing at 601 Winthrop Road, W. Englewood, New Jersey, on July 7. 1948.

It should be noted that the report of SA JOHN B. O'DONOGHUE dated' 8-7-50 at Cleveland in the case entitled, "WILLIAM PERM, Wa. - ESPIONAGE - R", reflects that PERL states he believes he may have returned to Columbia University for lectures between June 26 - July 9, 1948.



KNOW ANY OF THEM. LEWIS GLEEKMAN STATED HE MET SUBJECT AT COOPER UNION AT LUNCH. PROBABLY THROUGH HARVEY SACHS. ANOTHER COOPER UNION STUDENT WHO RESIDED IN GLEEKMANS NEIGHBORHOOD AND WITH WHOM HE RODE TO SCHOOL. HIS ACQUAINTANCE WITH SARANT WAS MAINLY THROUGH HAVING LUNCH TOGETHER AND THEY HAD NO CLASSES TOGETHER APAK AND DID NOT ASSO-CIATE AFTER SCHOOL HOURS. THIS ACQUAINTANCE CONTINUED ABOUT ONE YEAR ADOM AND GLEEKMAN DID NOT SEE OR CORRESPOND WITH SARANT FROM TIME GLEEKMAN LEFT SCHOOL IN NINETEEN FORTYTWO UNTIL ABOUT JUNE. FORTYFOUR. WHEN HE REESTABLISHED ACQUAINTANCE WITH SARANT THROUGH FRED WOHLER, WHO WAS ROOMING WITH GLEEKMAN AT ONE FOUR SIX WAVERLY PLACE, GREENWICH VILLAGE, NYC, WHICH WAS WITHIN A FEW BLOCKS OF SARANT-S APARTMENT. GLEEKMAN SAID HE DID NOT KNOW SARANT WAS IN THE NEIGHBORHOOD, BUT KOHLER ALSO KNEW SARANT AND BROUGHT SARANT AND GLEEKMAN TOGETHER. GLEEKMAN ADVISED THAT HE AND KOHLER VISITED SARANT-S APARTMNT ABOUT ONCE A WEEK, BUT NOT NECESSARILY EVERY WEEK FROM JUNE FORTYFOUR TO FEBRUARY FORTYFIVE. AND USUALLY FOUND A GROUP LISTENING TO MUSIC. HE SAID THEY NEVER STAYED LONG AS THEY WERE USUALLY LOOKING FOR A DATE OR GOOD PARTY AND THE GREEK GIRLS AT SARANT-S USUALLY HAD DATES. GLEEKMAN SAID HE MET LOUISE SARANT ON ONE OR TWO OCCASIONS AFTER THE SARANTS WERE MARRIED, BUT HE KNEW NOTHING ABOUT HER AND COULD NOT IDENTIFY HER FROM PHOTOGRAPHS.

GLEEKMAN HAS NOT SEEN SARANT SINCE SARANT LEFT NYC FOR ITHACA, NY AND BELIEVES HE LAST SAW HIM SOMETIME IN NINETEEN FORTYFIVE. HE HAS NEVER CORRESPONDED NOR TALKED TO SARANT ON PHONE. MRS GLEEKMAN ADVISED SHE MET SARANT ON ONLY ONE OR TWO OCCASIONS AT MUSI-CALES AT SARANT-S APARTMENT PRIOR TO TIME HE WAS MARRIED AND SHE COULD FURNISH NO ADDITIONAL INFO. DURING PERMISSIVE SEARCH NOTHING WAS FOUND INDICATING ASSOCIATION OF GLEEKMANS WITH PERSONS MENTIONED ABOVE. HOWEVER. NUMEROUS COPIES OF QUOTE IN FACT UNQUOTE AND QUOTE NATIONAL GUARDIAN UNQUOTE WERE OBSERVED AND A SMALL NOTEBOOK WAS OBTAINED CONTAINING NOTES THAT APPEAR TO HAVE BEEN TAKEN AT CP MEETINGS . INCLUDED IN THE NOTEBOOK UNDER DATE OF NOVEMBER ONE. FORTYSEVEN, ARE NOTES ON REPORT BY GIL GREEN. NUMEROUS REFERENCES TO AVC. AYD. PCA AND CP APPEAR AND FIRST NAMES OF SEVERAL PERSONS ARE LISTED. GLEEKMAN REFUSED/TO FURNISH

No record of ZDAN or SUSSMAN ever being employed Western Electric, Burlington, N. C. ARTHUR N. OGDEN, Engineer Department Chief, Western Electric, Burlington, was SUSSMAN's supervisor for 6 to 10 months, latter part of 1945, early part of 1946 in Bayonne, N. J., Western Electric Plant. J. R. SCHUEFFER and C. W. REYNOLDS not contacted.

DETAILS:

#### AT BURLINGTON, N. C.

E. L. SMITH, Personnel Director, Western Electric Plant, advised that there is no record of a WILLIAM ZDAN or NATHAN SUSSMAN ever having been employed in the Western Electric Plant in Burlington, North Carolina. He advised that the Burlington, North Carolina, Western Electric Plant was opened on April 15, 1946, and that the Winston-Salem Western Electric Plant began operation in May of that same year.

ARTHUR N. OGDEN, Engirneer Department Chief, Western Electric, advised that NATHAN SUSSMAN was transferred to the Bayonne, New

Jersey, Western Electric Plant from the 11th Avenue Plant in New York City sometime during the latter months of 1945. OGDEN stated that SUSSMAN had worked under him for about 6 to 10 months during the latter months of 1945 and the early months of 1946, stating that the exact dates of SUSSMAN's employment at Bayonne, New Jersey, could be verified by checking the personnel records at the Kearney, New Jersey, Western Electric Office. OGDEN stated that has last contact with SUSSMAN was about 3 or 4 months prior to October of 1946 when SUSSMAN was transferred from Bayonne, New Jersey, to Winston-Salem, North Carolina. OCDEN advised that as he recalled SUSSMAN was a capable, honest, trustworthy, and dependable employee. He was unable to recall distinctly whether SUSSMAN had made a trip to Washington, D. C., at any time on business for Western Electric adding that the engineers under his direction had frequently made trips to different Western Electric Plants. OGDEN concluded by stating that he was unacquainted with either WILLIAM ZDAN or ALFRED SARANT.

Mr. E. L. SMITH, Personnel Director, advised that C. W. REYNOLDS is the superintendent of engineers in the Winston-Salem, North Carolina, Western Electric Plant, and that J. R. SCHAEFFER, a Department Chief, Western Electric, Burlington, North Carolina, was out of the state on a business trip at that time but could be contacted at Burlington, North Carolina the following week.

By teletype dated August 2, 1950, at 8:05 P. M. to the Director and SACS Albany, Charlotte, and New York, the Newark Office requested interviews with Western Electric Supervisors C. W. REYNOLDS, A. N. OGDEN, and J. R. SCHAEFFER in the Burlington, North Carolina, Western Elecgrit Tant in instant matter.

By teletype dated August 3, 1950, at 4:16 P. M. to the Director and SAC Charlotte, Albany, and New Jersey, the Newark Division requested the Charlotte Office to hold in abeyance the interviews of REYNOLDS, OGDEN and SCHAEFFER pending receipt of further advice from the Albany Office.

By teletype to the SAC Charlotte dated August 3, 1950, at 7:57 P. M. the Bureau advised that it appeared certain that JULIUS ROSENBERG was identical with the unknown subject and Antenna-Liberal and that further investigation to determine if SARANT ETAL were identical with the unknown subject was accordingly not necessary.

Reference is made to New York teletype to the Bureau, Washington Field, Newark and Los Angeles dated August 23, 1950.

ROBERT JOSEPHUS SHANK, Head of Radar Department, Hughes Aircraft Company, Culver City, California, advised this date that he met the subject in 1943 when the subject was employed by the (Bell Laboratories in New York and SHANK was with Western Electric in New York. SHANK said he knew the subject only through their employment and considered the subject to be a loyal and conscientious worker, although he knew the subject to be liberal, but "not to such an extent as to be obnoxious." SHANK stated that he, himself, was liberal to some extent but that he drew a definite line between liberalists and left-wingers.

SHANK said that he never had any contacts with the subject nor did he know the subject's residence address in New York. SHANK stated he has not corresponded with the subject since leaving New York City in 1947.

SHANK named the following individuals as mutual acquaintances who were employed either by Western Electric or Bell Laboratories: JACK DELL. Western Electric; HARULD TOWELL and LESTER MORRIS of Bell Laboratories.

SHANK advised that during his employment with the Bell Laboratories, he was residing at 224 Sullivan Street, Greenich Village from 1942 to 1945 and 300 W. 12th Street, New York City from 1945 to 1947. SHANK's present address is 4105 Weslin Avenue, Sherman Oaks, California, which is a suburb of Los Angeles.

The above interview was brief due to a previous engagement of SHANK's. It is believed additional information may be furnished by SHANK, therefore a re-interview may be conducted in the near future

The Los Angeles indices reflect that ROBERT JOSEPHUS SHANK was investigated by this office as an AEAA and no derogatory information was developed in this regard.

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

#### AT LOS ANGELES, CALIFORNIA:

RICHARD P. YFEYNMAN, Physicist employed at the Institute of Numerical Analysis, University of California at Los Angeles, was interviewed on August 2, 1950 by Special Agent HOWARD H. DAVIS and the writer. FEYNMAN advised his first meeting with SARANT occurred approximately in December of 1916 in Ithaca, New York, at which time a friend of his, BRUCE DAYTON, telephoned FEYNMAN and said that a girl was visiting with the SARANTS, and that she would make a good date for him. FEYNMAN recalled that the girl's name was BETTY SANDERS. He met SANDERS on that date and took her out on several dates during her visit with the SARANTS. He recalled that at that time the SARANTS lived on Eddy Street at the corner of Williams, that they lived on the second floor, and that it was in the same building with Leonardo's Night Club.

Following this meeting FEYNMAN stated the SARANTS called him and said that BETTY SANDARS was again visiting them and that she was giving recitals of folk songs at Cornell University. FEYNMAN said he attended many social functions and musicales with the SARANTS following his first

meeting with them. He said that in 1947 SARANT obtained employment at Cornell University at the Laboratory of Nuclear Studies, and it was his recollection that he was an electrical engineer. He recalled that SARANT was very active in the Teachers' Union at Cornell, and that some time during his visits with the SARANTS he met VICTORAROSS and MINNA ROSS at the SARANT residence. FEYNVAN recalled that SARANT and DAYTON had built new homes on the outskirts of Ithaca.

According to FEYNLAN no secret work was being conducted at the Cornell laboratories, and he was positive that SARANT was not attempting to obtain any information from FEYNMAN. He said that in view of the fact that SARANT was not a physicist, it was impossible for him to converse concerning topics connected with the type of work that FEYNLAN was doing. FEYNMAN was of the opinion that he last saw SARANT in the spring of 1950 in Ithaca, New York, at which time FEYNLAN was in that city for a short time.

Reference is made to my memorandum to you dated August 3, 1950, in captioned matter, wherein were set out facts available as of that time concerning Alfred Sarant and his possible implication in the espionage operations of the Julius Rosenberg network.

Reference is also made to my memorandum dated August 16, 1950, with which was transmitted a copy of the report of Special Agent Peter F. Maxson dated August 7, 1950, at Albany, New York and to my memorandum dated August 23, 1950, transmitting a copy of the report of Special Agent Robert F. Royal dated August 7, 1950, at New York City.

On July 26, 1950, Sarant left his residence in Ithaca, New York via automobile for a vacation of one week's duration with relatives in Baldwin, Iong Island, New York. Spot checks of his activities indicated he was in the vicinity of Baldwin until August 4, 1950, and during most of that period was in the company of Carol Dorothy Dayton, wife of Weldon Bruce Dayton. You will recall that Weldon Bruce Dayton is mentioned in the report of Special Agent Royal in connection with the investigation of the apartment at 65 Morton Street, New York City, which was leased by Sarant from October, 1943 to January 31, 1950. He and his wife are next door neighbors of Alfred and Louise Sarant in Ithaca, New York.

When attempts were made to locate Carril Ryton for interview in connection with the matter, her husband advised that she had departed from Ithaca for Boston, Massachusetts, a few days prior to July 26, 1950, the date on which Sarant left for New York City. According to Dayton, his wife was to attempt to locate an apartment in Boston since he is joining the staff of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology in September, 1950. Both Weldon Bruce Dayton and Louise Sarant, wife of Alfred Sarant, have advised that they have not heard from their respective spouses since the latter left Ithaca on the dates mentioned.

Investigation was conducted by the Bureau to locate subject and Carol Dayton and on August 23,3 1950; information was received from Donald Haines, husband of a deceased sister of Carol Dayton, that on or about August 8, 1950, Haines and his wife drove Sarant and Dayton to Hermosillo, Mexico from Tucson, Arizona. Mr. Haines who resides

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at 2805 Drachman Street, Tucson, Arizons but who was interviewed while on vacation in Sacramento, California, explained that Sarant and Carol Dayton arrived at his home via automobile on or about August 6, 1950, remained two nights at his home, and on or about August 8, at his wife's insistence, he drove them from Tucson to Hermosillo, Mexico. Haines declared that upon their arrival at Hermosillo, they stopped at the Anza or the D'Anza Hotel in Hermosillo for dinner, and when they returned to the Haines' automobile after dinner, Sarant had a bellboy from the hotel remove the luggage and take it into the hotel. Haines and his wife then returned to Tucson and did not see Sarant or Dayton register at the hotel. He stated that it was his impression that Sarant intended to travel by bus from Hermosillo to Guaymos, from which point he intended to take a boat, with Mexico City as his ultimate destination. It is possible that Sarant intended to take a boat coastwise to a point south of Guaymos, then continue the trip to Mexico City overland by bus.

Mr. Haines was unable to furnish the details of the itinerary of Dayton and Sarant before they arrived at his home in Tucson and stated that during the two nights they were guests in his home, Dayton and Sarant occupied separate bedrooms. He declared that both Dayton and Sarant secured documents to enter Mexico at the Mexican Consulate in Tucson, that these travel documents were valid for a period of six months, and that Carol Dayton's papers were obtained in her true name although he did not know in what name Sarant's documents were issued. It was also learned from Mr. Haines that before leaving Tucson, Sarant transferred the title of his 1936 Dodge sedan to Warren Haines, son of Donald Haines.

Mr. Haines also declared he gained the impression that Sarant was in some sort of trouble and was leaving the United States to avoid testifying as a witness against a friend of his who was in trouble, the exact nature of which was not known to Haines. It would appear from the investigation conducted in this and related phases of the operations of the Rosenberg network that the "friend in trouble" is undoubtedly identical with Julius Rosenberg, whom Sarant has admitted knowing and who, according to Sarant, once "propositioned him" to engage in espionage. Mr. Haines stated that Carol Dayton planned to return to Boston, Massachusetts from Mexico City by air on September 1, 1950.

As you will have noted from a review of the report of Special Agent Maxson mentioned above, Sarant has consistently denied participation in espionage activities. He has, however, admitted numerous conversations with Julius Rosenberg, and he has also admitted that he was formerly a

member of the Communist Political Association in New York City. It will also be recalled that David and Buth Groenglass reculled montion by Julius Rosenberg of an apartment he used for photographic work in the Greenwich Village Section of New York City, and it is not improbable that this may have been the apartment leased by Sarant at 65 Morton Street.

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

It will be noted that although holes numbered 1 - 4 inclusive do not form any definite pattern, it is believed that possibly some type of crude homemade device may have been constructed which would allow a camera used for document purposes to be suspended above this table, and that this device could have allowed the camera to be raised and lowered according to the needs of the document being photographed.

In addition to the above, an electric wire three feet in length was located in the apartment by the current tenant upon occupancy. This electric wire had a three way electrical receptacle on one end and it extended along the baseboard of the room from an outlet which was 4'2" from the left inside door frame on which the door containing ten holes was hinged. This electric wire and three way outlet is being maintained as an exhibit in connection with this case by the New York office.

There are two theories as to the significance of the ten holes as previously described, one being that they were utilized in connection with document filming and the other that they were used in connection with an electrical engineering experiment which BARR and SARANT were known to have been conducting in the apartment during the period of 1944 - 1946. The nature and extent of this electrical experiment is not definitely known, however, SARANT has advised that he was attempting to perfect a signalling device by which either morse code or an audible signal could be sent by use of a frequency modulated infra-red beam.

SARANT at the time he was interviewed by the agents of the New York office on July 28, 1950, advised that he had not drilled the ten holes in the bedroom door of his apartment, and that he had no knowledge as to what significance there was to the drilling of these ten holes and utilization thereof.

The Laboratory is requested to take the above facts concerning the holes which were drilled in the bedroom door and the other





information furnished in this letter and attempt to arrive at some conclusion as to their probable utilization.

A set of nine pictures each of SARANT'S apartment are being forwarded as enclosures with this letter to the Albany and Cleveland Offices for assistance in their investigation. The Albany and Cleveland Offices should interview their subjects in the ROSENBERG espionage parallel for any information which they might have as to the significance of the ten holes which were drilled in the bedroom door as previously set forth.

In addition, the New York office would greatly appreciate any ideas which the Cleveland Office might have as to the possible utilization of the ten holes.



The bedroom door when closed and by use of a curtain in the hallway would provide a workable darkroom utilizing the board mentioned in referenced letter on the outside panel as a table; and immediate access to water facilities of bathroom.

It is also suggested holes one through four could have been the result of wall clothes hooks, oddly staggered to prevent overlapping of clothing, and holes five through ten the result of a shoe holder attached to the door.

It is contemplated that WILLDAY WILL will be reinterviewed in the near future and this matter will be broached during the course of such interview.

Re New York letter to Bureau 8-16-50, concerning the holes appearing in the bedroom door of the 65 Morton Street apartment.

LOUISE SARANT, wife of the subject, was reinterviewed concerning these holes, and the photographs accompanying referenced letter were displayed to her. She repeated that she had no idea what could have caused these holes and that to the best of her knowledge no such holes were in this door during her residence in the apartment.

Re Cleveland letter dated August 22, 1950 suggesting that these holes could possibly have been made by clothes hooks and a shoe holder attached to the door. This possibility was taken into consideration in the interview with Mrs. SARANT, and she definitely stated that the door was never usel for this purpose. She recalled that they did have a plastic shoe holder, but that it had been attached to the bottom of a closet door.

The photographs of the door have been examined closely by this office, but no additional possible explanation for the presence of the holes has been forthcoming.

SA Charles Tignor of the Phoenix Office called at 2:40 P.M. and advised that a teletype had been received by the Phoenix Office from the Albany Division early this morning requesting investigation at Tucson, Arizona, for the purpose of locating Sarant. According to Tignor, the Albany teletype requested that if Sarant were located, the Albany Office should be advised telephonically.

Investigation conducted at Tucson by SA Jack Sheik indicated that Sarant, accompanied by one Carol Payton, arrived in Tucson about August 8, 1950, and remained there for a day or two at the residence of Donald Haines, 2805 E. Drachman Street. While there Sarant sold a 1936 Dodge which he was driving, New York license plates 7x4997, to Warren Haines, son of Donald Haines.

Warren Haines was interviewed. He stated that on August 10 his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Donald Haines, drove Sarant and Carol Bayton to Hermosillo, Mexico, which is approximately 125 miles south of the American border. Warren said his parents made this trip down and back in the same day and he, Warren, did not know at what address in Hermosillo Sarant and Bayton were left. He did, however, indicate that he thought Sarant and Bayton may have gone on to Guamos, Mexico, but he had no particular reason for this statement.

Warren stated that on August 17, 1950, his parents left Tucson to visit his grandmother, Mrs. E. V.—Dorothy, 3309 22nd Avenue, Sacramento, California. By this time, August 23, Warren Haines stated he believed his people may be occupying a cabin owned by Carol Bayton at Echoe Lake, California.

Warren Haines said that his father had told him very little about Sarant and Bayton but he did mention that Carol Bayton was very radical and was very radical during her college days. Further, in his (the father's) opinion, Baytan was a Communist. Warren advised that his father also wad told him that Sarant likewise may be a Communist and he, the father, did not want to get mixed up in anything connected with there of these persons. Warren added that he believed his parents would be cooperative if interviewed concerning the present whereabouts or day information they might have regarding the plans of Sarant.

Mr. Tignor added that he was furnishing this information to the Bureau promptly in the event the Bureau felt that the case was of such importance as to warrant action seeking the present location of Sarant through the Legal Attache's Office in Mexico.



On the afternoon of August 23, SAC Wall, while discussing this case, suggested the possibility of establishing a violation of the White Slave Braffic Act on the part of Sarant and the woman who accompanied him to Arizona and probably to Lexico. Mr. Wall advised that both of these individuals left minor children when they departed on this trip and thus it could become under the aggravated class of White Slave fraffic act violation.

It would appear that this is a good suggestion and may give us the basis for proceeding against Sarant and his companion in the absence of other prosecutive action. Further, if we are able to proceed under the WSTA we may be able to cause Sarant to give us more accurate information concerning his possible involvement in Espionage activities.

with this thought in mind it is suggested that appropriate offices be notified by teletype to develop information reflecting a possible violation of the MSTM during their interviews in attempting to locate Sarant.

It was ascentained through the Post Locator that 2nd Licutenant CYNTHIA HYRENE GRAY, LAC, ASN L-1010189, is presently assigned as assistant Special Services Officer for the MAC Training Center.

Licutement GRAY was interviewed by Special Agent IEONARD W. MALTERS and the writer on August 23, 1950 and gave the following information with regards to the SARANTs and their acquaintances:

GRAY advised that she first became acquainted with the SARANTs in the Spring of 1947 when they hired her to act as a baby sitter. At that time GRAY was a senior at Cornell University studying entomology. She acted as a baby sitter for the SARANTS approximately once a week and

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sometimes more often until her graduation. GRAY went on to say that she graduated from Cornell University on August 10, 1947 and shortly thereafter left Ithaca, New York for her home in Saint Louis, Hissouri. She stated that the SARANTS resided at 320 Eddy Street, Ithaca, New York when she first met them. GRAY returned to Ithaca, New York in the summer of 1948 to visit her former roommate, Hrs. PHILLIP S. AOBBINS, and at that time called on the SARANTS for a social visit. In the summer of 1950, on July 11 or 12, GRAY visited Cornell University to see the Entomology Department and at that time again called on the SARANTS.

GRAY advised that to her knowledge the following persons are close friends and visitors of the SARANTS: VICTOR K. DAROSS and MIN ROSS, parents of the SARANT, ARTHER and URREST SUDIN, 9 Cay Street, New York; BETTY SANDERS, 2212 Ditmes, Brooklyn, New York; WALTER and JOYCAN IGGINS, Ithaca, New York: WALTER WIGGINS, being a law student at Cornell and working part time for VICTOR D. K. ROSS; BRUCZAD.YTON, residing next door to the SARANTs at their present address on Cayuga Heights Road, Ithaca, New York, and a Mrs. CaPLAN, 130 Blair, Ithaca, New York. In addition to the above persons, GR..Y advised that a man and his wife, identity unknown to her, but graduate students in the College of Arts and Sciences, Cornell University, were also very friendly with the SARAMTs. GRAY also gave the name of Dr. FRED LIRCUSE, formerly attached to the Psychology Department at Cornell, as a very close friend of the SARANTs. To GR.Y's knowledge, M.RCUSE is believed to be the head of a Psychology Department of some western university or college. She also mentioned the name of MATTERNAM, a physicist at Cornell, as being a close friend of the Sarants.

With regards to AIFRED SARINT's activities and background, she could furnish little information other than that he was employed by Cornell University in 1947 in connection with the installation
of a cyclotron and at the present time is self-employed as a contractor.
His hobbies are building radios, music and studying physics. She went
on to say that in 1948 the SARINTS and ROSSES were very active in the
campaign of HENRY MAILACE and definitely supported the Progressive Party.
These persons, CRLY advised, seemed very disappointed that she had not
voted for WAILACE. During her visit to Cornell in July, 1950, Mrs. MINA
ROSS made the remark to her, upon seeing her in the uniform of a WAC
officer, that each person has the right to decide on their own course and
that she, GRAY, would probably see some of her friends in concentration
camps shortly. On one occasion, exact date not known, Mrs. ROSS told GRAY
that she, Mrs. ROSS, was a "radical" and would admit this to anyone.

July 11 or 12, 1950, that lirs. SARANT was planning on leaving her husband because of marital difficulties and was taking a plane for New York to visit the BOUDINS on the same day that CRAY talked to her. No discussion of the Korean situation took place at this time, but a discussion on Spain did take place. CRAY said that she was advised during this discussion that the Spanish people who were against FRANCO were not Communists, but were morely anti-fascists.

mentioned that they had an apartment in New York City. She could not recall any organizations to which the S.R. NTs belonged or any meetings of a political nature which they attended.

She did not know how long DICK SARANT-remained at the SARANT residence, but advised he was still there when she went home to Saint Louis shortly after August 10, 1947.

CRAY considers herself to be a friend of the SARAMTS and ROSSes, but definitely stated that she did not agree with their political point of view and has very carefully avoided any organization which she considered might have any connection with Communism. She went on to say that she has been raised with the idea of loyalty to the United States.

During the interview with GRAY, she advised that the SARANTS, insefar as she could recall, had never mentioned the names of JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG, JOEL BARR, WILLIAM PERL, VIVI. M. LLASSIAN, HENRIETT. SAVIDGE, MORTON and HELEK SOBELL, MAX and HELENE FRITCHER, JUKE and ANNE SIDOROVICH, HARRY GOLD or RUTH and DAVID PREENGLASS.

GR.Y also advised that she was not surprised that the SARANTs were being investigated because of their "liberal" attitude and also the attitude of the ROSSes.

GRAY further reiterated that while members of her family know PAUL ROBESON, they do not agree at all with his attitude and preachings.

During the interview, GRAY appeared to be very cooperative and stated she was glad to help in any way she could.





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

Agents GUY L. TULL and J. FREE AN TAINER:

On August 23, 1950, Mr. and Mrs. DONALD L. ATES of Tucson, Arizona, former son-in-law of Mrs. EDNA V. DOROTHY, were interviewed at the home of Mrs. DOROTHY, 3309 22nd Avenue, Sacramento, Culifornia. Both Mr. and Mrs. HARTES submitted signed statements in which they advised of their participation with regard to the transporting of ALFRED SARANT and CAROL DAYTON from Tucson, Arizona, to Hermosillo, Nexico, on or about August 9, 1950. These signed statements, which will be retained in the San Francisco office, are set out as follows:

"Sacramento, California August 23, 1950

\*I, DOMAID JAILS HAIMES, make the following voluntary statement to GUY L. TULL and J. FREE AN TANDER who have identified themselves to me as Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. No threats or promises have been made to me to get me to make this statement, and I understand it may be used against me or others in a court of law. I have been told that I do not have to make this statement, and that I have the right to an attorney.

I reside at 2805 E. Drachman, Tucson, Arizona. I am employed by the Southern Pacific Failroad as a brakeman and have been so employed since 1928. I was born May 12, 1908, at Sunrise, Wyoming. In September, 1930 I married THELLA RUTH ACROTHY in Mapa, California. She is now deceased, having passed away in October, 1940. Prior to my marriage to THELLA and for a period of two years or so I knew her sister, CAROL DOROTHY ATTON.

I have of course known her ever since.

PI had not seen CAROL, who is now married to ERUCE PLITON, for a period of three wars until on or about August 7, 1950, when she and a man I now know as AL SARANT came to my home in Tucson, Arizona. They came there in a 1936 Dodge sedan, grey in color, bearing a New York license. They stayed two nights at my home, occupying different bedrooms. I do not know their itinerary before coming to my home except that they came there from New York City. They did mention coming through Wichita Falls, Texas, and Las Cruces, New Lixico, on the way to Tucson.

MON August 9, 1950 as best I recall, my present wife, MUTINE HAINES, CAROL DAYTON, AL SARANT and I drove to Hermosillo, Hexico in my Buick automobile, a 1950 Buick Special two door sedan, bearing 1950 Arizona license C 24746. In Hermosillo we left CAROL and AL SARANT at the de Anza or Anza Hotel in that city. Following that my wife and I returned to Tucson, Arizona.

on August 9, 1950, and arrived in Hermosillo, Mexico, about 6:00 p.m. the same day. We went directly to the Anza Hotel where we all had dinner, that is, all four of us. After dinner my wife and I left Hermosillo, Mexico, to return to Tucson. We left about 7:30 p.m. It was at this hotel that we left CAROL and AL SARANT. A bell boy came out to my car and got their bags and took them into the hotel. I do not know if CAROL and AL registered at this hotel or not. They did not register in my presence.

"As to their plans in Hermosillo I recall that CAROL and AL indicated they might go on to Guyamas, Mexico, a town about 30-40 miles from Hermosillo. AL SARANT made inquiry at the hotel about bus service to this town. He also inquired about boats out of Guyamas for Mexico City. I heard him make these inquiries of the desk clerk in the hotel. I recall him being told that there were no boats from Guyamas for Mexico City. I recall that CAROL and AL SARANT's ultimate destination was Mexico City. Mexico, though I do not know why they selected Mexico City. However, I clearly recall EARANT saying that he had a relative in that city, either a mother-in-law, or aunt, or at least a female relative and that they would visit this relative. I recall CAROL saying she would fly back from Mexico City directly to her home in Ithaca, New York, and that she would return around September 1, 1950. As to SARANT he stated he would have to return in six months inasmuch as his visitor's permit would expire in that time. I clearly got the impression that CAROL would leave SARANT in Mexico City.

would like to say that to the best of my knowledge they arrived at my home on August 7, 1950, while I was at work. I was on a run to El Paso, Texas, on an extra train and I did not return home until the night of August 8, 1950. At that time RUTH, my wife, told me that CAROL DAYTON and E friend were there and wanted me to take them to Mexico. CAROL and SARAM tere at a show the evening I got home so I had an opportunity to talk with my wife alone. I asked my wife why they wanted to go to Mexico and she said that SARAM and to testify in court and he did not want to and for that reason the go to Mexico and wanted us to take them to Hermosillo. It are

from my wife that I first heard the place 'Hermosillo, Mexico' mentioned. I told my wife that I didn't know if I could get off or not. However, I did call the Southern Pacific Railroad later that evening and asked if I could get off and they said I could.

"Later that evening, August 8, 1950, as I recall, C.ROL and S.RAM came in and I met SARAM for the first time. I recall him being a small, dark man, with black curly or wavy hair. He was foreign-looking and I believe CAROL said he was of Greek extraction. During this particular evening CAROL asked me if I could drive them (she and SARAMT) to Hermosillo, Nexico. I asked her 'what it was all about' and if there was any way I could get involved. She said no, that SARANT had done nothing wrong but it would hurt his reputation or his business to remain in Ithaca, New York, because of something he would have to testify I did not ask her what it was. I asked her for the second time if I could be involved and she said inot. It was then that I agreed to take them and called the crew dispatcher to see if I could take off the following day, Aug. 9, 1950, and he said 'Yes'. The following morning I went to the Mexican consul in Tucson and got a visitor's permit for my wife and I to go to Hermosillo, Nexico. I paid six dollars for the two permits. I knew at the time that CAROL and SARANT had their permits to go because my wife told me they had obtained these permits

earlier. We stopped in Nogales, Mexico, and had lunch at the Fray Karcos' de Niza Hotel. While eating lunch I asked the waiter the name of a good place to eat in Hermosillo. At that time he mentioned the Anza or de Anza Hotel. It was because of this that we went to the de Anza Hotel in Hermosillo, Mexico. CAROL DAYTON and AL SARAHT did not have any reservation at this hotel, to the best of my knowledge.

ever engaged in any type of espionage. To my knowledge Carol Diyton has never been involved in any espionage activity in her life. I do not know SARANT personally other than meeting him on this one occasion.

SARANT left his 1936 Dodge sedan at my home in Tucson, in fact gave it to my son WARREN LEFT HADES, age eighteen. My son did not buy this car allow h SARANT gave him a bill of sale.

"S.RAM" left some papers in the glove comportment of this car. They look like notes on his work which I believe to be painting. These papers are in my home in Tucson and their phereabouts are known to my son J.RREM.

"I should like to add that while in Hermosille, Maxico, and during the time that SARAT walked from the automobile to the hotel I had an occasion to talk with CARCL briefly: At this time I suggested, in fact, pleaded, with her to return to Tucson with me. I realized, or at least believed, that CARCL was possibly involved in a scrious matter. I did not show then nor do I know now what she was involved in but I felt that she was going to extremes to leave her family in New York and travel with a man not her husband to Mexico. With this in mind I suggested to her that she might be taking 'loyalty' too far. She answered, 'There are some things which I have to decide for myself.! I had previously asked CAROL DAYTON why it was necessary for her to accompany SARLAT on this trip. She replied as best I recall, 'We are his best friends and I was the only one who could go with him.' I did not then know nor do I now know what she meant, however, I have the impression based on what my wife and CARCL said that he was afraid of some type of reprisals by some individual or individuals. This impression is very vague in my mind and I am unable to explain it any further. I have personally read this statement consisting of this and four other typewritten pages and is true and correct to the best of my knowledge. I freely and voluntarily slip my name below, after initialling the four preceding pages and all corrections.

"I, Mrs. NOTH KRIGHBRING MINES, do hereby make the following voluntary statement to J. FREMIN THEER and COY L. TULL, who have identified themselves to me as Special agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. No threats or promises have been made to me to get me to give this statement & I have been informed that it may be used against me or others in a Court of Law. I have been told I have the right of an attorney before making any statement.

"I on 12 yrs. of ago, and was born December 8, 1907, in Aberdeen, S. D. I presently reside at 2305 E. Frachman, Tueson, Ariz. I am prepently visiting at the home of Mrs. EDMA V. DOROTHY at 3309 - 22nd Ave., Sacramento, Calif.

"I have known CAROL DOROTHY DAYTON since 1942. I as married to DOHALD J. HALLES, the former husband of THELMA DOROTHY, CAROL'S sigter.

"On August 7, 1950, CAROL DATTON, whose husband is BHDCE DATTON, came to my home in fueson in company with a man I now know as AL SARWIT. I had not seen CAROL for 3 grs. prior to this visit.

"At the time of CAROL's and SARAMT's vicit, my husband DOMALD was out of town. During the evening of August 7, 1950, C.ROL and EARANT told a or indicated to me that they wished to go to Mexico, and asked me questions concerning the procedure. I told them the normal procedure that would be followed. However, at that time, or at least during this particular evening S.RAMT and CAROL indicated they wished to 'slip' into Mexico. I mean by that, to enter Mexico illegally. During this evening, either ChileT or CARCL said that SARAHT was leaving New York to avoid further questioning by agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. learned during this evening from both CAROL and SARLHT that SARLHT did not wish to be further questioned by the F.B.I. They stated, and I am unable to say exactly which one, that SARAWT had done nothing wrong but that any publicity be got would be harmful to his reputation and his business. They further stated that Sakall had lived with some individual that the FBI was interested in and that he did not wish to talk any further about it and that this was a 'good time to take a vacation' meaning to leave how fork so as to not be further questioned.

The Daring this discussion they mentioned that the FM might be extended in the mirport and for that reason they would not fly to Mexico. They

also stated that they had driven 'right through' without stopping. I believe this was to avoid their being questioned. They also stated they could not drive the 1936 Gray bodge sedan, which they arrived in, because it was registered in SIRAIT's name and that sight cause them to be caught. I explained to them that this was impractical and that we, meaning my husband & I, might take them to Mexico. They seemed to appreciate this and accepted the offer. The next morning, mag. 8 - 1950, C.ROL & I went to the office of the Mexican Consul in Tueson & there she get 2 visitors permits in order that she & SIMINT might get into Mexico. I saw her make out the applications. They were made out in her name, C.ROL B.YTOH and BRUCE DAYTOH, her husband's name. This is the permit SARAIT used.

"As to Hermosillo, hex., it may have been I that mentioned they might go there inacmuch as neither my husband nor I had ever been there and that we might enjoy the trip.

"Following that and on Aug. 9, 1950, we did go to Hermosillo, Hem. for the purpose of transporting CAROL & Saftaff to that place. We left them at Di Anzo hotel in Hermosillo. I do not know if they registered there or not but it is my belief that they did.

"Their ultimate destination, according to their statements, was Mustico City, Mex., because AL SARAHT had an nunt or mother-in-law there, name unknown to me.

"CLROL did say to me that I might be questioned about this but that I could say nothing because I didn't know anything. She did not request me to tell a lie in this matter but she did say that I didn't know anything.

While at my house CAROL wrote a letter to a person I believe to be JUDY DREGMAN. She told me that she had enclosed a letter in this letter for hiss BREGMAN to mail on to her husband BRUCE. This letter was mailed by my husband after our return from Hermosillo, Morico. I clearly recall the letter was addressed to Boston, Mass.

"I might state that on the morning of August 7, 1950, I received a letter from CLROL DLYTON that was postmarked in N.Y.C. In this letter she said that she & a 'friend' would be in Tucson shortly & would see me. She stated in this letter that if we were not at home to leave the keys to my house with the neighbors. However, I was home & in fact they, CAROL & SLRANT, arrived at my home the same afternoon that I received her letter, namely, August 7, 1950.

"During the events & because of the statements made by CARCL & SARLAR, I know something was wrong and I know I was doing conething wrong in assisting her. However, I thought maybe the was in trouble and if she wished to do what she was doing I would nelp her. I did not stop & think of the Government but I guess I should.

"I have read this statement. It is true and correct.

On August 23, 1950, DONALD MOROTHY was interviewed at 1933 O'Farrell Street by Special agent RICHARD G. FIETCARR and the writer. Hr. DeROTHY advised that he has had no direct contact with his sister, CAROL DATON, since the fall of 1947 at which time she came to Sacramento, California, to attend their father's funeral. He stated that he frequently nears of his sister from his mother in Sacramento and that on or about adjust 1, 1950, his mother advised him by letter that CAROL DAYTON was on route from Ithaca, New York, to Boston, Massachusetts. The purpose of this trip to Boston was to find housing by September 15 at the trice PRUCE DAYTON was to start instructing at Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

Mr. DOROTHY suggested that his mother-in Sacramento be contacted and also his former brother-in-law in Tueson, Arizona.

Mrs. DOROTHY explained that C/ROL DAYTON might be at Lake Winnipausaukee at the present time in order to alleviate her serious hay fever condition.

Mrs. DOROTHY volunteered that in her opinion, her daughter is quite liberal and not a person holding the same views as she (Mrs. DOROTHY) with respect to political and idealogical matters. Mrs. DOROTHY stated that she would cooperate completely with the Bureau and would advise when she receives any information concerning her daughter's whereabouts.

Mrs. DOROTHY is employed as Secretary to Mr. E. H. BURKHART, Executive Secretary to the California Adult Authority, State Office Building No.1, Sucramento, California.

through a girl with whom she went to school at Whitworth College, Brookhaven, Mississippi, in 1940 and 1941. Miss GODSEY stated that the name of this girl was NORMA HANNON, whose married name and present address is unknown to her. GODSEY stated that sometime in 1944, she quit her job at the United States Printing and Lithograph Company, Norwood; Ohio, when NORMA HANNON sent her money for transportation and suggested that she come to New York to study music and try to get a job there. She stated that after arriving in New York, she stayed at the home of the parents of NORIA HANNON in Brooklyn, New York for one week and after that time she went to live with ALFRED SARANT in an apartment maintained by him somewhere in Greenwich Village, New York City. She stated that efter she was in New York one week, NORMA HANNON advised her that the CIO Union, for which NORMA worked, was moving its offices to Detroit. Michigan, and that Miss GODSEY should accompany her there. Miss GODSEY stated that she was having a wonderful time in New York and decided to stay there as long as her money would hold out. She stated that when NORMA HINNON left for Detroit, "she accepted" SaRANT's invitation to share his apartment. She stated that her relations with SARANT were "strictly platonic" and that she had a mutual interest with SARANT in music. Hiss GODSEY advised that she believes that NORMA HAMNON was aware of the fact that CODSEY was staying at SARANT's apartment, but that she realized that their relationship was platonic and she was not offended by this.

In regard to the relationship between SARANT and HANNON, GODSEY advised that they too had a platonic relationship and that they too had a mitual interest in music.

## ESPIONAGE ACTIVITIES

GODSEY advised that she had no knowledge of any Espionage activity on the part of SARANT. She also advised that she had never met or heard of the following individuals:

JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG
VIVIAN GLASSMAN MIX and HELENE ELIDCHER
MORTON and HELEN SOBELL
MICHAEL and AWNE SIDOROVICH

### SARANT'S APARTMENT

GODSEY advised that she was unable to state the location of the apartment which she shared with SARANT while she was in New York City. She stated that she recalled that it was located in Greenwich Village, but that she was unable to recall the apartment number or the name of the street. She stated that it was her recollection that this was a one bedroom apartment, having a living room, bathroom, and kitchen, beside the one bedroom, and that it was scantily furnished.

## PHOTOGRAPHIC EQUIPMENT

of camera or cameras SARANT possessed. She stated that it was her recollection that he had one very good camera and that he also had developing equipment, a tripod, and flood lights. She added that the flood lights were often used to illuminate the apartment when the regular light bulbs went out. She stated that she recalled that SARANT did his own developing and that he always used the toiled bowl for this purpose.

## ACQUAINTANCES

GODSEY advised that during the time that she was in New York, she recalled meeting only three people more than one time. They were: ALFRED SARANT, NORMA HANNON, and an unidentified male friend of SARANT. GODSEY advised that this unidentified friend was 6 feet tall, dark complexioned, sharp features, jet black hair, and of Jewish descent. She stated that she believes that his first name was JOE or JOEY, but of this she could not be sure. She advised that this individual was at the apartment of SARAJT on several occasions and appeared to be a close friend of his. She stated that she was unable to recall the occupation or the place of business of this individual and that she could recall no other identifying information.

GODSEY advised that the friends of SARANT whom she met in New York were different from any people that she had ever met before or since that time. She stated that when she and SARANT went to a party at a place of entertainment, there was usually a mixed crowd of Whites and Negroes. She stated that most of these friends appeared to her to be interested in music.

## OCCUPATION OF SARANT

GODSEY advised that SARANT was employed as electrical engineer, but that the exact place of employment was unknown to her. She stated that it was her impression that SARANT was employed on 42nd Street, about five blocks west of Broadway. It is pointed out that this is the approximate locality of the Western Electric Company.

## ACTIVITIES IN NEW YORK

GODSEY advised that while in New York and living with SARANT, she and SARANT spent most of their evenings and week-ends visiting the Metropolitan Art Nuseum, Metropolitan Opera House, and other places of interest around New York. She stated that they usually had their meals in restaurants around Greenwich Village, the names of which were unknown to her and that in the evenings they visited the Cafe Society Downtown, The Village Barn, Jack Delaney's, and other places around Greenwich Village, names of which were unknown to her. She stated that she recalled that on one occasion, she attended with SARANT a mixed party in a penthouse somewhere in Manhattan. She was unable to advise the name of the person having the party or the location of the penthouse.

## SUBVERSIVE ACTIVITIES

GODSEY stated that it was her impression that HINNON and SARANT had been good friends for a long time and she stated that after she returned to Cincinnati, it became apparent to her that -HAVNON and SARANT had a mutual interest in subversive activities. Miss GCDSEY stated that she based this belief on the fact that while she was in New York, she attended several meetings with HANNON and SARANT and it was her impression that these meetings were sponsored by some subversive organization or by the Communist Party. She related that the topics discussed at those meetings were not appealing , to her and that she paid no attention to what was said. She stated that to the best of her recollection, these meetings were held in the second floor of an office building in New York City, but that the exact location was unknown to her. She stated, in connection with this meeting, that after she returned to Cincinnati, she received the "Daily Worker" for one year. She stated that she paid no attention to this newspaper and she threw it out without reading it. She stated that she did not apply for a subscription to the "Daily Worker," and it was her belief that the subscription was arranged by ALFRED SARANT.

GODSEY advised further that the meetings which she attended with HANNON and SARANT were also attended by the before mentioned unknown friend of SARANT. GODSEY advised that it was her impression that SARANT had a Greek-Russian background. She stated that she realized he was Greek from his name and his appearance, but she got the impression that he had a Russian background from the fact that he taught her Russian Folk Songs. She added that SARANT knew a great many of these songs and that he sang them frequently.

## VISITS TO CINCLINATI

GODSEY advised that about a month after she returned to Cincinnati, SARANT visited her here. In this connection, GODSEY produced a phonograph record album containing the date, October 31, 1944, and she advised that this album was given to her by SARANT on the date of his first visit to Cincinnati. She stated that SARANT flew into Cincinnati on October 31, 1944, that he stayed over that night, and left the following day for either Detroit or Cleveland. She stated that SARANT told her that he was on a business trip.

GODSEY advised that about a month later, SARANT again visited her in Cincinnati. She stated that on this occasion he brought with him a hand made copper bracelet which he gave to her. She stated that on this occasion, SARANT asked her to marry him and come back to New York with him. She stated that she refused this proposal because they had nothing in cormon. She stated that it is her recollection that he flew in and stayed for one day, and flew out. She stated that his destination when he left Cincinnati is unknown to her.

## CORRESPONDENCE

GODSEY advised that SARANT has never called her long distance by telephone. She stated, however, that he did write post cards and letters to her. GODSEY advised, however, that she was unable to locate any of the post cards or letters, and she believes that they were all destroyed. GODSEY advised that about a year after she returned from New York, she received a letter from NORMA HANNON, written in Detroit, Michigan, which advised her that SARANT had been married. She advised further that she has not heard from SARANT or HANNON since that time.


## DATES OF VISIT TO NEW YORK

During the course of the interview with JULIA GODSEY, GODSEY stated that her trip to New York occurred between the time that she left her employment at the United States Printing and Lithograph Company and the Drackett Company. In this connection, Mr. K. C. DETWILER, Personnel Director at the United States Printing and Lithograph Company, Beech and Robertson Avenues, Norwood, Ohio, advised that GODSEY was employed there from February 22, 1943 to August 21, 1944. In the same connection, Mr. V. K. EWALD, Assistant Personnel Manager of the Drackett Company, 5020 Spring Grove Avenue, Cincinnati, Ohio, advised that JULIA GODSEY was employed by that concern from October 30, 1944 to November 3, 1944.

The interview with Miss JULIA GODSEY conducted in the Cincinnati Office on August 17, 1950 was conducted by Special Agents JOSEPH A. VERICA and THEODORE O. THOMA. Miss GODSEY, at this time, advised that she was unable to recall the last name of NORMA HANNON, and in this connection, requested permission to write to the Whitworth College for Women, Brookhaven, Mississippi, to ascertain her maiden name, her married name, and her present address. On August 23, 1950, Miss GODSEY furnished to SA THEODORE O. THOMA a letter from SINCLAIR DANIEL, President of Whitworth College, who advised that the name of the person in question is NORMA HANNON. Enclosed with this letter is a carbon copy of a letter which Mr. DANIEL had written to Mr. L. A. HANNON, c/o Pioneer Life Insurance Company, Balter Building, New Orleans, Louisiana, in which he stated, "Some years ago, your daughter, Miss NORMA HANNON, was a student at Whitworth College. We try to keep up with the name and addresses of our former students and would appreciate her married name and present address." In this connection, Miss GODSEY advised that as soon as Mr. DANIEL obtains the desired information, he will furnish the same to Miss GODSEY, who in turn, will furnish same to this office.

Upon receipt of this information, all offices receiving a copy of this report will be notified of the married name and present address of NORMA HANNON. 


