



KRIKORIAN, AF 31388007, 4019th A & E Maintenance Squadron, and interview him concerning his knowledge of a telephone call made from the JAMES YATES! Shop, New York City, to the KRIKORIAN residence at Worcester, Mascachusetts, July 26, 1948 and if possible secure data concerning the background and activities of JAMES YATES and JOEL BAPR.


For the information of the Albuquerque Office, ALFRED SARANT has been identified as a member of the JULIUS ROSENEERG espionage ring. In 1950 SARANT disappeared with CAROL DAYTON, wife of WELDON BRUCE DAYTON. The latter is also suspected of being a member of the ROSENBERG group. SARANT and CAROL DAYTON disappeared while SARANT was being questioned by Bureau Agents concerning his connection with the espionage ring and subsequent investigation has determined he and CAROL DAYTON proceeded to Mexico.

It is stated that ALFRED SARANT formerly operated the Sarant Laboratories, 227 West 11th Street, New York, New York. JAMES YATES succeeded SARANT as proprietor of the premises, but JOEL BARR, another member of the Rosenberg espionage group and an associate of SARANT at the laboratories continued to enjoy the use of the premises for a period of time after YATES took over the shop.

On July 26, 1948 a telephone call was made from YATES' Shop to the telephone at the residence of the KRIKORIAN family. The investigation concerning YATES is to determine if he were involved with JOEL BARR in the latter's espionage activities.

A review of the New Orleans file in this matter reflects that the Albuquerque Division was furnished a copy of the report of SA PETER F. MAXSON dated at Alban; January 6, 1951 which contains detailed information concerning the subject.

One copy of this report is being furnished the New York Office for information in view of the fact that SARANT's activities carried him into the New York Area.

A review of the file in this case reflects that Louise Sarant, wife of the subject, upon interview advised that in 1942 or 1943, she visited for several months with James and Elizabeth Rosenhouse in Mexico City, D. F. Their address was given as Lucerna 72-21. The only information appearing in Bufiles under the name Rosenhouse was noted to have been obtained through consorship intercepts. According to this information one Samuel James Rosenhouse Strong and wife resided at the above Mexico City address. Strong was reported to have been born in Russia in 1886, to have become a naturalized United States citizen, and to have entered Mexico as a tourist in 1942. Further, he was stated to have been employed as a technician in charge, Mexico City Branch, watson Phillips Company, a British export firm dealing in medicinal plants. From the information available it could not be determined whether the James Rosenhouse visited by Louise Sarant was identical with Samuel James Rosenhouse Strong.





T-1 stated that, in a convensation with LOUISE SARANT's son, GEREMY, he stated that his father had gone away and was never coming back.

T-1 stated that Mrs. SARANT is not employed and has been spending most of her time tending to household duties and caring for her two small children. T-1 stated that he himself has no information regarding LOUISE SARANT's husband, ALFRED SARANT, and T-1 is quite sure that Mrs. SARANT has not been in contact with her husband and that her husband has not been in Miami.

The Phoenix Office is requested to determine through established sources if the subject or Mrs. CAROL DAYTON are in the Tucson area.



DETAILS:

I. ADDITIONAL INVESTIGATION RE ONE OF JULIUS ROSENBERG'S TWO ESPIONAGE CONTACTS WITH ALFRED SARANT AT ITHACA, NEW YORK

Confidential Informant T-1, of unknown reliability, advised on July 10, 1951, that JULIUS ROSENBERG had confided that ALFRED SARANT was "a member of his organization". The informant Interpreted this quoted phrase to mean that SARANT was a Soviet espionage agent and was affiliated with the ROSENBERG group.


Confidential Informant T-1 stated that ROSENBERG told him that he had made two trips to Ithaca, New York, to see ALFRED SARANT. According to information furnished to the informant by JULIUS ROSENBERG, the purpose of these trips was to make "pick-ups" which the informant interpreted to mean that SARANT was furnishing espionage material to ROSENBERG.

ROSENBERG stated to the informant that one of these trips was made via train from Cleveland, Ohio, to Ithaca, New York, where he had made a "pick-up" from MICHAEL and ANNESIDCROVICH. This trip had originated at New York City. According to the informant, ROSENBERG stated that he stayed overnight at SARANT's Ithaca, New York home where the contact was made. The informant stated that SARANT's wife, whom he referred to as "PUSS", was present during the period that ROSENBERG was at the SARANTS.

It is noted that "PUSS" is a nickname for LOUISE SARANT.

ROSENBERG further advised the informant that ALFRED SARANT had built his own home in Ithaca, New York, and had engaged in some type of a contracting business there. SARANT was educated, according to ROSENEERG, as an electrical engineer and was in his opinion "an extremely intelligent man". According to the informant, ROSENBERG thought a lot of SARANT.

Confidential Informant T-1 was questioned pertaining the dates of the two contacts that ROSENBERG had with ALFRED SARANT at Ithaca, New York. Informant stated he does not recall ROSENBERG having furnished either of these dates. However, he commented it would be his observation that ROSENBERG's trip to Ithaca via train from Cleveland would have in all probability taken place subsequent to the completion of SARANT's Ithaca, New York residence,

It is noted that previous investigation has developed June 10, 1950 as the most probable date on which the other contact ROSENBERG had with S.RANT took place.

ALFRED SARANT has advised in interviews (July 19-25, 1950) that from July 1948 until February 1949, he and his family lived with the WELDON FRUCE DAYTONS, Cayuga Heights Road, R.D. #1, Ithaca, New York. During this period, he stated that he worked on the construction of his house, located next door. SARANT advised that from Fobruary 1949 and up until and including the dates of his interviews, he resided in the previously referred to house located on Cayuga Heights Road, Ithaca, New York.

It is noted that providing the informant's observations are correct, the first contact between ROSENBERG and SARANT would have taken place subsequent to February 1949.

JULIUS ROSENBERG was sentenced to death for conspiracy to commit espionage against the United States on April 5, 1951.

According to Confidential Informant T-1, mentioned proviously, MICHAEL and ANNE SIDOROVICH were members of JULIUS ROSEN-BERG's "organization". The informant interprets the word, "organization", to mean Seviet espionage.

BOSENTERG on July 17, 1950 at his residence, 10 Monroe Street, Now York City, SA REX L. SPRODER located in the effects of ROSENBERG


several items which will be described more fully below, which appear to have been possibly used in connection with JULIUS ROSENBERG's contact with ALFRED SARANT on the occasion when he used train transportation:

- 1. A New York Central time table effective January 30, 1949, Form 1001, wherein on page 14, under the title "Condensed Time Table Chicago, Detroit, Toledo, Cleveland, Toronto and Hamilton to Buffalo, Albany, New York and Boston, Table No. 1", it was noted that a pencilled circle had been drawn around the times 12:30 (p.m.) for the Easterner, No. 52, which leaves Cleveland daily at the Union Terminal, and around 5:35 (p.m.) for the Interstate Express, No. 46, which leaves Cleveland daily at the Union Terminal. Further, it was noted that circles had been drawn around the hours 8:40 (p.m.) and 12:46 (a.m.) for the respective arrivals at Syracuse of the above two mentioned trains.
- 2. A New York Central time table effective January 30, 1949, Form 1001, wherein on page 15, under the title "Condensed Time Table New York, Albany and Boston to Buffalo, Hamilton, Toronto, Cleveland, Toledo, Detroit and Chicago, Table No. 2", it was noted that various trains described below loaving Cleveland were underlined in pencil as follows:

Southwestern Limited, No. 11 daily	12:45 (p.m.)
Cloveland Limited, No. 57 daily	1:35 (p.m.)
The North Star, No. 21 daily	2:15 (a.m.)
The Niagara, No. 59 daily	3:50 (p.m.)

It is noted that after the hour 4:50 (p.m.), the departure time for The Iroquois, there appears a perpendicular line drawn in pencil.

It was further noted that a line drawn in pencil appears on page 15 for various trains arriving at Glovoland's Union Terminal, which is set forth as follows:

It is further noted in connection with the Iroquois arrival time at Cleveland that a perpendicular line in pencil had been drawn.

On page 14 of this item, under the title "Condensed Time Table Chicago, Detroit, Toledo, Cleveland, Toronto and Familton to Buffalo, Albany, New York and Boston, Table No. 1", there appears both pencilled and penned lines for various trains arriving in Syracuse, as follows:

3. A Lohigh Valley Railroad schedule of trains between New York, Philadelphia and Wilkes-Barre, Ithaca, Rochester, Buffalo, Niagara Falls, Toronto, Detroit and Chicago, dated April 28, 1940, Form TT1, wherein on page 7 under Table No. 10, "Auburn and Ithaca Branch", there appears a pencilled check mark in front of 1:30 (p.m.), the departure and arrival time for Train No. 302 daily at Ithaca. It was also noted that a pencilled check mark appears after the arrival and departure time of 11:55 a.m. at Auburn.

It was noted on Table No. 10 that the Auburn and Ithaca Branch connects with the New York Central, which has Syracuse as its first stop past Auburn.



From a review of the above three items which were located in the search of JULIUS ROSENBERG's apartment, it would appear that he was attempting to arrange a train schedule from Cleveland to Ithaca, New York, which would cause a minimum delay in his connections between the New York Central and the Lehigh Valley Railroad trains.

ilthough from this above mentioned investigation we are mable to definitely set the date on which JULIUS ROSENBERG contacted BARANT in Ithaca, New York, it would appear from the above that this contact took place subsequent to January 30, 1949 (effective date, lew York Central time table, Form 1001) and his arrest on July 17, 1950. In all probability, this trip took place prior to FINESTONE's return to New York City in October 1949 inasmuch as FINESTONE is believed to have driven JULIUS ROBENBERG to Ithaca, New York, on June 10, 1950 in order to contact ALFRED SARANT. Therefore, it is believed, due to FINESTONE's absence from the New York City area prior to Cotober 1949 that the train trip took place some time between January 30, 1949 and October 1949.

II. INVESTIGATION RE ALFRED SARANT'S AMENGERY - AMERICAN REYSIGAL SOCIETY

American Physical Society, Room 905, Pupin Physics Laboratories, Columbia University, advised SA HERMAN C. LITTLEJOHN that ALFRED



SARANT, who was employed at the Laboratory of Nuclear Studies, Cornell University, was elected to membership in this organization on November 28, 1947. He was nominated by two individuals, "DAYTON" and "McDINIEL". It is believed that these individuals are probably identical with WELDON BRUCE DAYTON and BOYCE DAMEDANIEL, both nembers of the American Physical Society. SARANT's addresses were 122 Eddy Street, Ithaca, New York, as of January 8, 1948, and Cayuga, Heights Road, Ithaca, as of August 15, 1948.


Miss NELSON advised that SARAFT was dropped from member-ship for non-payment of dues. This action was taken by the Society at the 1951 meetings held on January 31, February 1 and 2, 1952, at Columbia University.

TII. HEINTERVIEW OF MISS GERTA GOLDNER ON APRIL 14, 1952

On April 14, 1952, SA HERMAN C. LITTLEJOHN and the writer reinterviewed Miss GERTA GOLDNER at her residence, 85 Barrow Street, New York City. Miss GOLDNER further advised concerning ALFRED SARANT that she recalls that there was a merchant seaman who possibly attended one of the musicals at SARANT's apartment, 65 Morton street, New York City, in 1944-1945. She does not recall his name. However, she recalled that he was white, medium height and weight, maked a pipe and had derk hair. Photographs of MAXWELLAFINESTONE were exhibited and she stated that FINESTONE is not identical with the unknown merchant seaman. She was unable to identify FINESTONE is anyone whom she had previously known in connection with ALFRED MRANT or any of her associates.

Miss GOLDEER further advised that SARANT once mentioned, possibly in 1945, that he had had a girl friend who had a sister amed ALICE who was ill: Photographs of ALICE KATZ BARSKY were whibited. She stated that this individual is not familiar to her.

Miss GOLDMER initially advised in interview on August 31, 950 by S. LITTLEJOW and the writer that the last time she saw ILLLIAM PERL was in April or May 1949 at the Henry Street Settlement louse in the Village, where they by chance met. She stated that on his occasion she inquired pertaining to JOEL BARR and ALFRED SARANT and PERL advised her that BARR was in Rotterdam, Holland, studying usic, and that SARANT was still living in Ithaca, New York.



She advised on April 14, 1952 that the last time she was in contact with PERL was possibly in the Spring of 1950. She further advised that PERL was by chance met at the Henry Street Playhouse, New York City, where the play entitled "The Dy Book" was being presented. Hiss GOLDNER advised that PERL was accompanied by a young woman whose name she does not recall. Further, PERL indicated to her that this woman was a social worker. She described this young woman as white, 5' 6" or more, 125 lbs., in her midtwentics, dark brown curly hair and light complexion.

A photograph of ELUANOF GLASSMAN was exhibited to Miss GOIDNER. She commented that Miss GLASSMAN might possibly be identical with the young woman who accompanied PERL at the Playhouse.

Miss GOLDNER initially stated on August 31, 1950, that she met PERL for the first time on a hike which she, JOEL BARR, PERL and a girlfriend of PERL who was a teacher, made to Bear Mountain in September 1945. She said she possibly again met PERL at SARANT's apartment during one of the chamber music periods. She stated that the last time she met PERL was as stated above.

On April 14, 1952, Miss GOLDNER advised that this hike was possibly in the Fall of 1946. She described PERL's girlfriend as white, medium height, in her twenties, dark hair, and a teacher by profession. She also indicated that PERL was at that time possibly residing in SARANT's 65 Morton Street apartment. She stated that this hike took place on a Sunday between 10 a.m. and 5 p.m. Miss GOLDNER recalls that they all stopped at BARR's parents home on West 97 Street, New York City, and that they took pictures up in Central Park. She was unable to recall how or by what means they traveled to Bear Mountain. She did, however, recall that this trip was subsequent to a trip that she had taken to California during the Summer of 1946, and that there may have been some discussion between PERL and herself concerning California weather. It is recalled that PERL had returned from California during midsummer 1946.

Miss GOLDNER stated that the school teacher is not believed identical with either FEDE SAVIDGE (Mrs. WILLIAM PERL) or ELEANOR GLASSMAN, whose photographs were shown to her on April 14, 1952 in an attempt to identify PERL's date on the hike, Fall 1946. NY 65-15360

IV. IDENTIFICATION OF SOL GREENBERG

It is recalled that there appeared the following entry in SARANT's small address notebook:


"SOL/GREENBERG Fed. Bo. Gr 9-3800 x 609"

SARANT's small address notebook was obtained during the course of an interview with him on July 19, 1950, at which time he executed a waiver authorizing Bureau agents to conduct a search of his home at Cayuga Heights Road, Ithaca, New York.

It is recalled that Mrs. ALFREDISMANT, when questioned concerning the identity of the persons whose names appear in this address book, was unable to furnish any identifying data concerning this entry.

Confidential Informant T-2, of unknown reliability, has advised on November 16, 1950 that he had occasion to question JULIUS ROSENBERG concerning the names of his contacts, and ROSENBERG said, "You know a man by the name of GREENBERG who is a big electrical engineer at General Electric in Newark." ROSENBERG also advised Jonfidential Informant T-2 that GREENBERG was a friend of a man who is now deceased and whose name was BOLOS or POLOS. Informant was unable to recall his first name and tried to recollect the last name accurately for some time. Ifter sufficient recollection, Confidential Informant T-2 was unable to recall the name and was asked if the name GOLOS was familiar. Informant said that this sounded very much like the name that ROSENBERG mentioned.

Confidential Informant T-3, of known reliability, has advised on April 25, 1952 that Bowling Green 9-3800 is the telephone number for the International Telephone and Telegraph Company (IT&T), 57 Broad Street, New York City. IT&T is the parent company of many subsidiaries, some of which occupy space in the same building at 57 Broad Street, New York City. One of the subsidiaries is the Federal Telecommunication Laboratories (FTL). FTL occupied quarters on the third floor at 67 Broad Street, New York City, during the years 1941 to 1947, at which time FTL moved to its present location.



500 Washington Avenue, Nutley, New Jersey. Confidential Informant T-3 advised that while occupying space in the IT&T building, 67 Broad Street, New York City, FTL used the same telephone number as the parent company, IT&T.


Confidential Informant T-3 caused a search to be made of the IT&T records (which includes the parent company and all subsidiaries) and advised that the only record of SOL GREENBERG which could be located was that of SOLCMON GREENBERG, who is presently employed by the Federal Telecommunication Laboratories, Nutley, New Jersey. According to Confidential Informant T-3, SOLOMON GREENBERG was employed by FTL in January 1943 as a junior engineer. His place of work was at 67 Broad Street, New York City, from the beginning of his employment until December 1947, when he was transferred to FTL, Nutley, New Jersey.

Concerning Extension 209, it was ascertained this extension was assigned to the Legal Department of IT&T.

The records of Brooklyn Polytechnic Institute, Brooklyn, New York, reflect that SOLOMON GREENBERG was admitted for graduate studies at this school on September 24, 1943, and was employed as a junior engineer from June 1943 to present (February 15, 1944) at the Federal Telephone and Radio Laboratories, 67 Broad Street, New York City, telephone number Bowling Green 9-3800, Extension 604. It should be noted that ALFRED SARANT attended Brooklyn Polytechnic Institute in 1943 and 1944 and attended several of the same classes which SOLOMON GREENBERG did during this period.

ALFRED S.MART's small address notebook has been forwarded to the FBI Laboratory in a further attempt to ascertain if the Extension 609 appearing therein could be 604. From the cursory examination, it is believed that this extension could be interpreted as 604.

Confidential Informant T-4, of known reliability, advised on or about April 8, 1952 that a copy of the partitioned layout of the second floor of IT&T, Beaver Street, dated November 25, 1943, reflects location of Extension 604 as being in Section R-34. Soction R-34 consists of two office spaces plus a laboratory. One of the offices was occupied by two senior engineers while the other was occupied by several other individuals, including SOLOMON TREENBERG. The phone for Extension 604 was located in the office occupied by GREENBERG.



Mr. FATRICK FALLON, guard at FTL facilities, Nutley, New Jersey, has advised that within a period of ten days after EMILE LABIN (LABIN was formorly employed at FTL as their Technical Director. His clearance for access to classified material was revoked by the Army, Navy, Air Force Security Board, in February 1952.) travelled to Washington, D. C., FALLON sew MAXINE THOWE and SOLOMON GREENBERG leave the FTL Laboratories together on eight or ten occasions. They left by the west door of the laboratories and proceeded slowly, in carnest conversation, toward the parking lot located near the west gate of FTL at Washington Avenue, Nutley, New Jersey. On positively two and possibly three occasions FALLON observed LHOWE give GREENBERG a brown bulky envelope, approximately eight inches by ton inches, which GREENBENG placed in a brief case he was carrying. On the remaining occasions FALLON observed LHOWE · and GREENBERG merely in conversation, proceeding on foot toward the parking lot.

It is noted that EMILE/LABIN went to Washington, D. C. on the night of January 18, 1952, and that on several occasions subsequent to the information furnished by Mr. FALLON, GREENBERG has been observed to be placing confidential and restricted plans in envelopes and removing them from FTL. He has also been observed to return similar type of envelopes to the plant.

V. INVESTIGATION TO IDENTIFY PROF. HILL AND GEORGE ATSADES

It is recalled that WARREN HAINES, son of Mr. and Mrs. DONALD HAINES, 2805 East Drachman, Tucson, Arizona, advised SA JOHN F. SHEIK on August 22, 1950 that he purchased ALFRED SARANT's 1936 Dodge sedan on or about August 7-9, 1950. WARREN HAINES advised that he searched this automobile and found numerous papers and notebooks which he kept. Among the names found in the notebooks were: GEORGEATSADES and PROFERED.

SA HEINZ H. EISELE of the New York Office advised the writer on April 10 and April 11, 1952 that he had formerly resided in Ithaca, New York, and attended Ithaca College. He stated that in all probability ALFRED SABANT was referring in his notebook to one GEOIGE ATSEDES of Greek derivation, who currently owns the "Alhapbra", a night club in Ithaca, and formerly operated a club known as "Claret". His brother, PETER A ATSEDES owns the "College Spa" on State Street, Ithaca, New York.

SA EISELE stated that there is a Professor LAVRENCE/HILL at Itheca College. He is Dean of the School of Health and Physical Education. He further advised that this individual is commonly known as Professor HILL.

VI. INVESTIGATION TO IDENTIFY SARANT'S CONTACT AT 86-65 21 AVENUE

It is noted that the following appeared on the reverse side of his Certificate of Fitness from SARANT's Local Board No. 719, Hempstead, Long Island, dated July 9, 1944:

"West End BMT 20th Ave. 8665 21st Ave. Skopt Oarbachs 9:00 PM"


The current Brooklyn address telephone directory, February 8, 1952, reflects that one LOUISATUCCI resides at 86-65 21 Avenue and has telephone number ES 3-4159. This number first appeared in the alphabetical telephone directory in December 1948. The Brooklyn address telephone directory dated January 17, 1947 has no telephone listings for this address. However, as of the December 19, 1947 issue of this directory, there appear two listings, one for ELAINE/IAZZETA, ES 3-4158, and one for NANCY/TUCCI, ES 3-4159.

It should be noted that the West End Line of the BMT Subway has a 20th Avenue, Prooklyn stop. This would be the most readily accessible stop for 86-65 21 Avenue.

The current Manhattan address telephone directory reflects that there is an Ohrbachs (department store) located on lith Street facing Union Square, telephone number SP 7-9000, which has a buying and main office at 841 Broadway. It is noted that there is no listing for Carbachs in the New York City telephone directory.

The files of the New York Office failed to reflect any reference to LCULS LUCCI, NANCY LUCCI and ELMINE LAZZETA.

It is not known what SARANT was referring to when he wrote "Skopt".



VII. INVESTIGATION RE SCHECLON RUBIN LETTER

Confidential Informant T-5, of known reliability, has advised that LOUISE SARANT received mail for one SCHECLON MUBIN, 50 Barron, New York City, postmarked December 26, 1951.

Miss CERISTINA M. MINOR, business agent for 50 Barrow Street, with offices at 92 Grove Street, New York City, advised the writer on March 10, 1952 that a Miss MURIEL SCHOCHEN, also known as MURIEL SPARON, has resided in a second floor rear apartment at 50 Barrow Street since sometime prior to 1944. Miss MINOR indicated that this individual is possibly a teacher by profession and has recently indicated that she might go away for a year. She lives alone.

Miss MINOR described her as white, 5' 4" tall, 128 lbs., dark brown eyes, black hair, 30 to 35 years of age, attractive.

At 6 p.m. on November 2, 1950, SA's RAYMOND A. MOSSHART and RICHARD A. WRIGHT observed Mr. and Mrs. VICTOR K. D. ROSS, HELEN TISENBERG of Binghamton, New York, BERNARD GOODMAN, 308 Fossel Boulevard, Champaign, Illinois, and three unilentified persons leave the Stavens Hotel and proceed by a cab to the Issbell's Restaurant, 946 Rush Street, where ROSS and a party of fifteen had dinner. SA MOSSRA.T ascertained that the reservations had been made by a Dr. RUBIN.

At 8 p.m., SA MOSSHERT observed Mr. and Mrs. ROSS, Mr. and Mrs. KASSMEN and HELEN EISENBERG proceed via cab to the Goodman Theatre at Monroe Street and Inner Drive.

In this connection it was noted on page 1, part 4 of the "Chicago Daily Tribune", November 2, 1950 issue, that SEYRIL SCHOCHEN, who is Mrs. M.RTIM RUBIN of Ithaca, New York, was at Chicago for the world premiere of her prize winning play, "The Moon Besieged".

It is noted concerning the above that on November 1, 1950 the ROSSES were in contact with a man called MATY", and that they had dinner on November 2, 1950 with a party for whom reservations were made by a Dr. RUBIN.

Confidential Informant T-6, of known reliability, has advised that Mrs. CIROLATTON received mail from one Manuell, Ithaca, New York, on July 29, 1950. It is noted that Mrs. CAROL DAYTON was, as of that date, with ALFRED SIRANT visiting his relatives in the Freeport-Baldwin, Long Island, New York, area.

Confidential Informant T-7, of known reliability, has and used that BRUCK DINTON, 45 Orchard Street, Jamaica Plain, Massachusetts, received their from MARTINIRUBIN, DDS, First National Bank Building, Ithaca, New York, proctober 1, 1951, and postmarked September 29, 1951, and on November 1, 1951, postmarked October 30, 1951.

From the above it would appear that possibly Mrs. MARTIN RUBIN, also known as SEYRIL SCHOCHEN, was the addressor of the above mentioned lotters.

The files of the New York Office failed to reflect any reference to MURIEL SCHOCHEN or MURIEL SHARON.

VIII. INVESTIGATION RE MRS. W. LOEB

Confidential Informant T-8, of known reliability, has advised that LOUISE SARANT received a letter from Mrs. W. LOEB postmarked August 5, 1951 at East Patchogue (New York).

Confidential Informant T-9, of known reliability, advised on September 26, 1951 that one W. LOEB and one ZORN had received mail in care of PHILLIP F. LEVINE, Rod Street, which is located at the foot of Dunton avenue on the waterfront in East Patchogue.

Confidential Informent T-10, of known reliability, advised on September 26, 1951 that PHILLIP F. LEVINE, Rod Street, East Patchogue, is a summer resident of the community and has resided there for the past three summer seasons, to the informant's knowledge. Informant stated that mail was received for LCEB and ZORN in care of LEVINE on infrequent occasions. This informant stated that no mail had been received for LEVINE since Labor Day and it was presumed that they had returned home, but informant could not furnish any information pertaining to their winter address.

NY 65 15360

SA CHARLES M. CURRY noted on September 26, 1951 that the LEVINE summer home is located in an isolated section of a colony of summer homes and that a warning sign posted on the property for protection reflected the name of PHILLIP F. LEVINE, 540 East 5 Street, Brooklyn, New York, telephone number GEdney 5-7843. It was further noted by SA CURRY that the roadside mail box bore the names of SOB LEVINE, MD; HARRY H. LEVINE, MD; as well as that of PHILLIP F. LEVINE.

Mrs. J. DE FILLIPPI, grocery store operator, Dunton Avenue, East Patchogue, advised SA CURRY on September 26, 1951 that one Mrs. LOEB, a woman of about 24 years of age and a mother of two children, had resided in the LEVINE home during the past summer season, and that it was her impression that Mrs. LOEB was the narried daughter of SOL LEVINE and that Dr. HARRY LEVINE and PHILLIP LEVINE are her brothers. She could not recall the first name of Mrs. LOEB or her husband, who walks with a noticeable limp. She stated that they occasionally spend their weekends at their summer home during the winter months.


The files of the Brookhaven Township Police Department, Patchogue, Long Island, were searched by SA CURRY on September 26, 1951, and he was unable to locate the name of LOEB. This Police Department covers East Patchogue.

It is recalled that during the permissive search of LFRED SARANT's residence at Cayuga Heights Road, RD #1, Ithaca, New York, on June 19 and 20, 1950, a slip of paper with the following notation was located:

"ELVINGER
c/o LEV
589 El Monto
Los Altos, Cal."

In the reverse side was the address:

"LOEB 378 Adelphi St. Brooklyn 5 Novins 8-5890"



The listing, NEvins 8-5890, was subscribed to by Mrs. MOLLY/LEVINE, 311 Lincoln Place, Brooklyn, New York, as of April 2, 1948. The current Brooklyn address telephone directory dated rebruary 8, 1952 fails to reflect any listings for the address of 378 Adelphi Street.

The name and address, "LEVINE, 1598 Ocean Avenue, selephone number ES 7-6030", appeared in SARANT's Bates List Finder which was obtained from SARANT through a permissive search of his residence in Ithaca, New York, on June 19 and 20, 1950.

ALFRED SARANT stated that this entry pertaining to LEVINE is probably MELBATEVINE who, as of July 1950, resided in Ithaca, lew York, and whom his wife knows socially.


LOUISE SARANT stated that this refers to NEDRAYLEVINE, former school friend.

The Brooklyn telephone address directory dated November 16, 1950 reflected a listing for SOL LEVINE, MD, at 1598 Ocean Avenue, telephone number ES 7-6030.

The files of the New York Office failed to reflect any eferences believed to be identical with Mrs. W. LOEB, MELBA or FIEDRA LEVINE.

IX. ADDITIONAL INVESTIGATION TO IDENTIFY FRANCESCA AND JACK SHULMAN

In attempt to further identify FRANCESCA, who sent a selegram to JACTASTULMAN, apartment 20-3, 342 West 71 Street, New ork City, on June 3, 1951, which stated, "Will return Monday some ime. Sorry but must stay. Urgent.", Mr. HERBERT LYONS, Manager of the 342 West 71 Street apartment building, was contacted by the riter on March 10, 1952. He stated that JACK SHULMAN has resided in a furnished apartment, 20-3, at this address alone since May 24, 951. He stated that FRANCESCA is not known to him and that he is enerally acquainted with SHULMAN's contacts and those who correspond ith him inasmuch as he usually personally delivers SHULMAN's mail to him.



X. IDENTIFICATION OF ONE JAYSON, OLD WESTBURY, FREEPORT, NEW YORK

Confidential Informant T-5 has advised that LOUISE SARANT received mail from one JAYSON, Old Westbury, Freeport, New York, postmarked December 15, 1951.

This mail is undoubtedly from Mrs. JOEL JAYSON, who is also known as RLLCTRA SARANT JAYSON, sister-in-law of LOUISE SARANT, who currently resides at 4 Old Westbury Road, Wegmore Estates, Old Westbury, Long Island.

XI. INVESTIGATION RE LOUISE SARANT'S RELEPHONIC CONTACTS

A. Trefalger 4-9882

It is recalled that a collect toll charge was made to the Ithaca 7466 which was subscribed to by LOUISE SARANT, Ithaca, New York, from New York City, Trafalgar 4-9882, on June 19, 1951. Confidential Informant T-11, of known reliability, advised on November 29, 1951 that Trafalgar 4-9882 is subscribed to by Century Sea Grill, 127 Columbus Avenue, Manhattan.

It would be noted that LOUISE SARANT testified before the Federal Grand Jury, Southern District of New York, at New York City, on June 19, 1952. Therefore, it is believed that possibly LOUISE SARANT called her Ithaca residence on that particular date from the Century Sea Grill, Manhattan.

B. Or 5-5984

It is recalled that on June 20, 1951, Mr. ALFRED LANDI, Partner and Manager, Hotel Earle, 103 Waverly Place, New York City, advised the writer that a telephone call emanating from LOUISE SARANT's room in that hotel was made to 0r 4-5984 at 8:25 p.m. on June 14, 1951.

Confidential Informant T-11, mentioned previously, has advised on August 23, 1951 that the subscriber to Orchard 4-5984 is CHARLES BERTOLINO, 349 East 12th Street, New York City.

MY 69-15360

The files of the New York Office failed to reflect any record believed to be identical with this individual, and an inquiry was made of Mr. GALLIANO OTTO, 339 East 12 Street, New York City. Mr. OTTO, who is superintendent of the 349 East 12 Street apartment building, advised the writer on March 10, 1952 that CHARLES BERTOLINO resides at the above address with his wife and possibly three small children. He pointed out that BERTOLINO has a married daughter by the name of JOSEPHINE. OTTO believes that this individual is a taxi driver and indicated that he has resided at this address for several years.

In a further attempt to ascertain whether the listing, Orchard 4-5984, could have been incorrectly furnished to the writer by Mr. LANDI, he was recontacted on March 11, 1952. Mr. LANDI rechecked his telephone charge slips for LOUISE SARANT's room while residing in his hotel and ascertained that the number was incorrect and should be Or 5-5984.

Confidential Informant T-11, mentioned previously, advised that the subscriber to Or 5-5984 is MAY H. KINKELDEY, who resides at 200 West 15 Street, Manhattan.


The files of the New York Office failed to reflect any record for MAY H. KINKELDEY.

JANES YATES, WAS SECURITY MATTER - C

As you are aware, subject Yates took over the occupancy of the basement store located at 227 West 11th Street, NYC, during the latter part of 1946; which store was previously rented by Alfred E. Sarant under the name of the Sarant Laboratories. Yates was interviewed on July 19, 1950, and July 25, 1950, concerning his relationship with Sarant and Joel Barr, the results of which were set forth in the report of SA Robert F. Royal dated at New York on February 10, 1951, in the Sarant case.

It is noted from a review of the information set forth in CA Royal's report that there appears to be a number of discrepancies with respect to Yates' exact connection with the operations at the above premises, as well as his association with Sarant and Barr. It is noted that although Yates claimed he took over the place desired the latter part of 1946, the records of the records of the Consolidated Edison Company were in Sarant's name until August 8, 1949. Further, Yates during his interview claimed he had heard about the shop being available, and went there and met Barr. He denied, however, that he knew Sarant, but became acquainted with the fact that Sarant was formerly connected with the shop through old letterheads left at the place. These statements are, of course, in conflict with the information received from the Johnsons, who were superintendents of the building, to the effect that they had observed Yates in the store with Sarant and/or Barr on numerous occasions.

In addition to the foregoing, there is suggested for your consideration the fact that on July 25, 1950, Yates announced to the rental agency of the building that he was going to sell his business as he was sick and intended to go away for a long, long time. As you are aware, this announcement of his departure occurred within only a short period of time after his interview by Agents of the Burcau and after the arrest of Julius Rosenberg. Inasmuch as your last contact with Yates was on July 25, 1950, it is not known whether he actually did leave on the intended trip.

It is noted as a result of a review of this file that the last investigative action reported therein covers a period prior to July 14, 1949. Instant file fails to reflect the results of your recent investigation and your interviews with Yates have been appropriately reported therein. It is of particular importance that the admissions of Yates concerning his connection with the Abraham Lincoln Brigade, Young

Communist League, and the Communist Party be incorporated in this report. His present residence address and occupation, if any, should be established and furnished to the Bureau in order that the Security Index records may be up to date.

As you are aware, the Eureau has recently opened a separate Espionage - R investigation on one Solomon Greenberg, who is identical with the Sol Greenberg whose name was located in an address book of Alired Sarant. In addition, you are sprised of the fact that there were found in Earant's possession either in this address book or a Bates List Finder the names of Joel Barr, Julius and Ethel Rosenberg, Vivian Glassman, Maxwell Finactone and Weldon Bruce Dayton, all of whom have been identified as either known or suspected members of a Boviet espionage network.

For your information, the Bureau Leboratory as a result of an examination of an entry on page 2 of a small address book obtained from Sarant has indicated that the extension for the Bowling Green 9-2800 number appearing therein appeared to be 604 which was Solomon Greenberg's extension during the period of his employment at the Federal Telecommunication Leboratories, 67 Broad Street, New York City.

In view of the foregoing, the Bureau desires that the Albany Division carefully review the list of names appearing both in Sarant's address book and his Bates List Finder to insure that every effort has been exerted to determine the identity of each person listed therein and the nature of his contact with Sarant. In those cases where you have experienced difficulty in determining the exact name, address or telephone number due to the fragmentar; or unintelligible nature of the writing, same should be referred to the Bureau Laboratory for appropriate handwriting examination.

In connection with this examination, where it appears from information available to your office that the individual listed was more than a mere social or legitimate business contact of Sarent, it is suggested that you may desire to have an appropriate check made to determine the possibility that this individual may have been an espionage contact of Sarant.

This matter should receive your prompt attention.







While in Havana, Cuba they stayed at the Engleterra Hotel in downtown Havana and, according to the Legat, the ROSSES made no contacts of apparent significance while in Havana.

SECURITY INFORMATION

On 8-9-52 the Liami office advised telephonically at 1:00 P.M. that VICTOR ROSS and MINNA-MOSS, stepfather and mother respectively of LOUISE SARANT, divorced wife of the subject, and who presently resides in coral Gables, Florida, had departed Miami for Havana on the morning of 8-8-52, according to a neighborhood informant. This informant advised that the ROSSES had indicated that they had planned to stay at a downtown Havana hotel for three or four days. The Liami office stated that there had been no known contact between the subject and his divorced wife since 1950 when the former abandoned the latter but suggested coverage in the event the subject tried to contact the ROSSES. The Miami office could not furnish the means of travel or the exact destination in Havana of the ROSSES.

A check of the airline passenger lists revealed that Mr. and Mrs. VICTOR ROSS had traveled from Miami on 8-8-52 on National Airlines Flight 455, leaving Miami at 8:00 A.M. and arriving in Havana shortly after 9:00 A.M. They gave their Havana address as the Hotel Inglaterra.

HAV-4 placed a surveillance on the ROSSES on the evening of 8-9-52 after verifying that they were registered at the Hotel Inglaterra as Mr. & Mrs. VICTOR K. D. ROSS, Route 3, Ithaca, N. Y.

Source said that the ROSS' activities apparently consisted of nothing more than the usual tourist activities of an elderly American couple. Their only contact was with another couple, a Mr. & Mrs. RANKIN, 48 Caldwell Road, Nixon Park, New York, who had been registered at the Hotel Inglaterra since July 29, 1952. Source, who was in possession of photographs of subject and CAROL MAYTON, said that the RANKINS were definitely not identical with the subject and the DAYTON woman.

COPIES DESTROYED

R 47 NOV 21 1960 Source verified that the ROSSES were scheduled to return to R 47 NOV 21 1960 National Airlines Flight 456 on 8-11-52. This information was furnished telephonically to the Miami office on 8-11-52 prior to the departure of Flight 456 from Havana. The surveillance was discontinued of HAV-4 when the ROSSES departed Havana.

Source said that his investigation indicated that the ROSS' tour was arranged by a travel agency, Travel, Inc., 2700 Ponce de Leon Elvd. Coral Gables, Florida.

The current Manhattan telephone directory lists BEekman 3-8956 to WILLIAM B. CHEREVAS, Attorney, and MELV IN STENZLIER, Attorney and Certified Public Accountant. A listing also appears for one IRVING CHEREVAS, Attorney, 15 Park Row, telephone number Cortlandt 7-6452. Mrs. SPECTOR stated that she is now married to one HARRY SPECTOR and was previously married to one WILLIAM MOODY.

At the outset of this interview Mrs. SPECTOR informed that she did not desire to answer any questions comperning her Communist Party membership or activities or any questions pertaining to any of her friends in the Communist Party. It pointed out by the interviewing gents that this interview pertained to an espionage investigation. Mrs. SPECTOR acknowledged that she knew ALFRED SARANT, having met him probably in the hallway of a West 15th Street apartment building, near Seventh Avenue, in 1943. She explained that SARANT had an apartment in the same building in which she resided. She could not recall the address of the apartment building but stated that the building was located on West 15th Street, near Seventh Avenue, New York City. She acknowledged that she may have shared her apartment there with one GLADYS MEYER (Mrs. JUNIUS SCALES), whose whereabouts were unknown to her. She claims that she has not seen GLADYS MEYER since approximately GLADYS MEYER at that time was residing at an unknown 1945. New Jersey address.

Mrs. SPECTOR stated she met a man named JOELWBARR through an introduction by ALFRED SARANT, but that she did not believe that JOEL BARR shared ALFRED SARANT'S apartment at the unknown address on West 15th Street, New York City, although he was a frequent visitor at SARANT'S apartment. She stated that SARANT was living in the West 15th Street apartment before she moved into her apartment which was located across the hall from his apartment. At first she recalled that SARANT was still living at this location when she moved from New York City to Detroit, Michigan, in approximately September of 1944. At the time of her move to Detroit she was employed by the National Maritime Union in New York City and her section was transferred to Detroit just prior to the Congress of Industrial Organizations (CIO) Convention, which was hold there in October, 1944

Later during this interview she stated that ALFRED SARANT may have been living at another Greenwich Village address unknown to her at the time she departed for Detroit, in approximately September of 1944.

Mrs. SPECTOR advised that she was in contact with ALFRED SARANT several times a week during the 1943-1944 period and that she had frequently visited his apartment to listen to the playing of phonograph records of which SARANT had a large collection. She stated that SARANT was very interested in music. She could not recall his having manifested any interest in photography; that he, to her knowledge, had no camera or photographic equipment in his apartment and she does not recall either SARANT or BARR having ever discussed their employment with her.

Mrs. SPECTOR stated that she also had dated JOEL BARR and could have been considered "his girlfriend" during the above described period. She recalls that on one occasion BARR took her to his parents! home on West 97th Street, which was a penthouse type apartment. She stated that BARR'S parents were not home at the time but recalls having met JOEL BARR'S sister (ROSE) there.

Concerning people she met while dating BARR and SARANT, Mrs. SPECTOR recalled a girl named "PUSS", whom she had met during that time. She believes that while walking with BARR she met AIFRED SARANT and "PUSS" at Sheridan Square, and Seventh Avonue, New York City, and believes that she met "PUSS" with AIFRED SARANT on one other occasion while dating JOEL BARR. She believes that "PUSS" married SARANT at a later date. Mrs. SPECTOR is in all probability referring to LOUISE ROSS SARANT whose nickname is "PUSS".

Mrs. SPECTOR stated that she does not know VIVIAN GLASSMAN and has only a vague recollection of this name. She stated that photographs shown to her by the interviewing agents were not familiar and that her recollection of the name may stem from mention of VIVIAN GLASSMAN to her by JOEL BARR.

She professed not to know that BARR was dating VIVIAN GLASSMAN during parts of the same period which she dated him.

Mrs. SPECTOR stated that a photograph of WILLIAM PERL was definitely not familiar and that she did not know him.

She stated she recognized the photographs of MAXWELDFINESTONE and that she had known him since she was employed at the National Maritime Union, (NMU), as he was also employed by the NMU in about 1944. She recalled that FINESTONE was in the Merchant Marine Service during World War II and that he came to see her on one occasion while she was living in Detroit. She stated that she had dated FINESTONE on several occasions in 1944 in New York City and again in 1945 in Detroit. FINESTONE flew to Detroit in about 1945 to see her and remained there approximately two days. She claimed not to have seen FINESTONE from about 1945 until 1952, when she by chance met him at a Greek Seamens Dance, in New York City, and spoke to him there briefly.

When questioned about whether SARANT or BARR or FINESTONE had taken her to listen to record playing at any other apartment that they may have rented, Mrs. SPECTOR advised that she had never visited any other apartment of either of them and that she did not know that FINESTONE knew either BARR or SARANT. She denied having ever visited an apartment located at 65 Morton Street, New York City, and stated she has not seen either BARR or SARANT for years nor has she received any correspondence from them. She stated that she does not now know the current location of either BARR or SARANT.

Mrs. SPECTOR volunteered that she was romantically interested in both BARR and FINESTONE at separate times and probably at those times she considered herself "in love" with both of them. She said that she never had any romantic interest in SARANT. She also advised that she has no interest whatsoever in these individuals now and would not withhold any information concerning them due to her previous association with them.

She stated that she had never met JULIUS or ETHEL ROSENBERG while in the company of SARANT, BARR and FINESTONE, and had never heard the ROSENBERGS mentioned during the period she had known them. She said the first that she had heard concerning the ROSENBERGS was the newspaper accounts concerning their arrests in 1950. She stated she had noted that they lived in Knickerbocker Village. She stated that in 1947 she lived in an apartment on Madison Street, New York City, which was in close proximity to Knickerbocker Village and was somewhat curious about having lived so close to a "spy". She stated that this accounted for her interest in the ROSENBERGS arrest and their subsequent trial.

Further concerning her girlfriend, GLADYSAMEYER, she stated that GLADYS was interested in ALFRED SARANT and that she was not aware that MEYER was ever interested in JOEL BARR. MEYER did not confide in her that she had any "longing" for BARR. She professed no knowledge of the incident of ALFRED SARANT having sought the advise of VIVIAN GLASSMAN in his quest for the affections of GLADYS MEYER, as related by Mrs. NATHAN SUSSMAN. Mrs. SUSSMAN and GLADYS MEYER were known to one another and that the incidents concerning them may have occurred subsequent to her departure from New York City in 1944.

Concerning JULIA GODSEY'S visit to New York City during the Summer of 1944, Mrs. SPECTOR advised that GODSEY had considerable musical talent and that possibly upon her suggestion she came from Cincinnati, Ohio, to New York, City during the Summer of 1944, to further hor musical career. She recalled that Miss GODSEY stayed with she and hor parents (Mrs. SPECTOR'S parents), at their Brooklyn residence for a short period of time and thereafter resided in the apartment of ALFRED SARANT, somewhere in the Greenwich Village area of New York City for a period of time. She believes that Miss GODSEY was introduced to SARANT by her. She further advised that her friendship with Miss GODSEY began when they were both students at a girls school in Mississippi. She stated that she has not been in contact with her since the time she moved to Detroit, Michigan, and does not know of her current address.

It is noted that Miss JULIE GODSEY who has been previously interviewed in connection with this matter currently resides at 4906 Ravenna Avenue, Madisonville, Cincinnati, Ohio.

Although Mrs. SPECTOR did not desire to discuss her Communist Party background or Communist affiliations of other individuals, she exhibited what appeared to be cooperation in connection with background material concerning the above mentioned individuals. She indicated that any time that she could be of further assistance she preferred that Bureau agents would contact her through her business office rather than at her residence.

It is not knownwhat is the significance of this statement, however, it is surmised that she does not desire to have her husband, HARRY SPECTOR, who is employed by the New York Auction Company, 226 West 26th Street, New York City, to know of this contact and subsequent contact by Bureau agents.

Colorado, to SAMUEL and SARAH SHERMAN SPECTCR, both who were born in Russia. He is a graduate of the University of Chicago, Chicago, Illinois, and was dismissed from a Government position in Aberdeen Proving Ground, Aberdeen, Maryland, June 26, 1946, as a security risk because of Communist Party affiliations. He resigned his teaching position, Board of Education, Baltimore, Maryland, October, 1948, as a result of publicity of his Communist Party affiliations.

Confidential Informant T-1, of known reliability, advised that ELSIN SMITH, Secretary, District number 4, Communist Party, USA, referred to HARRY SPECTOR as a member of the Communist Party on May 26, 1948. SPECTOR at that time resided in Baltimore, Maryland.

II INTERVIEW OF SOL GREENBERG

It is recalled that there appeared the following entry in SARANT'S small address book: "Sol Greenberg, Fed. Bo. Gr 9-3800, X 604".

SARANT'S small address book was obtained during the course of an interview with him on July 19, 1950, at which time he executed a waver authorizing Bureau agents to conduct a search of his home at Cayuga Heights Road, Ithaca, New York,

It is recalled that Mrs. ALFRED SARANT, when questioned concerning the identity of persons whose names appeared in this address book, was unable to furnish any identifying data concerning this entry.

SOLYGREENBERG, who is also known as SOLOMON GREENBERG, 2183 Ryer Avenue, New York City, and who is employed as a developmental engineer, Federal Telephone Laboratories, Nutley, New Jorsey, was interviewed by SEEDWARD J. CAHILL, ROBERT E. CHASEN, and the writer, during the period from August 5 - August 8, 1952. During the course of this interview SOL GREENBERG was questioned concerning the above entry which appeared in SARANT'S small address book. GREENERG repeatedly denied any knowledge of SARANT and was unable to identify photographs of him. Ho readily admitted that the entry in SARANT'S notebook pertained to him inasmuch as he had telephone number Bowling Green 9-3800, extension 604, during 1943-1944. Bowling Green 9-3800 was subscribed to by the International Telephone and Telegraph Company (IT&T), 67 Broad Street, New York City, during the period mentioned. IT&T is the parent company of Federal Telephone Laboratories, of which GREENBERG has been employed since his graduation in June, 1943 from the College of the City of New York. GREENBERG was unable to explain how his name, employment, telephone number and correct extension, found its way to SARANT'S small address notobook. He was advised that SARANT attended some of the same classes as he

did during 1943-1944, at Brooklyn Polytochnic Institute, where they were both pursuing graduate degrees in Electrical Engineering. GREENBERG not not recall SARANT as a classmate at Brooklyn Polytechnic Institute.

It should be noted that in connection with the interviews of SOL GREENBERG that he admitted to having removed classified documents from Federal Telephone Laboratories since approximately 1949, in fact, he had a classified document in his possession at the time of initial interview during the evening of August 5, 1952. Briefly, he explains the removing of classified documents as an expedient means of expediting some of his administrative functions at Federal Telephone Laboratories. He admitted that removal of classified documents was contrary to Federal Telephone Laboratories' security policy and did so wilfully, however, he continuously emphasized that the reason for this was to expedite his administrative functions at Federal Telephone Laboratories.

GREENBERG was shown photographs of JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG, ALFRED and LOUISE SARANT, JOEL BARR, VIVIAN GLASSMAN, WILLIAM FERD, MIKE and the SIDOROVICH, among others. He failed to identify any of these individuals as persons whom he had known or had any knowledge of.

III IDENTIFICATION OF "clark X 2056", APPEARING IN SARANT'S BATES LIST FINDER

It is recalled that there appeared the following entry in SARANT'S Bates List Finder:

"Clark x 2056".

ALFRED SARANT advised that this individual was met either at Western electric, New York City, or at Bell Laboratories, New York City. SARANT'S Bates List Finder was obtained during the course of an interview with him on July 19, 1950, at which the he executed a waver authorizing Bureau agents to conduct a search of his home at Cayuga Heights Road, Ithaca, New York.

On July 8, 1952, SA EDWARD J. CAHILL, interviewed Mr. J. S. MC DONOUGH, Security Officer, Bell Telephone Laboratories, lith Street and Eighth Avenua. MC DONOUGH reviewed the Bell Telephone Laboratories! telephone directories for the period from 1944-1946 and determined that extension 2056 was listed for O. P. ACLARK. HENRY D. WILSON, Employment Manager, Bell Telephone Encoratories, further identified CLARK as one OMER PERCYCLARK, who was born on Rebruary 25, 1918, at Sabula, Iowa. His father is snown is PERCYCLARK and his mother is ROSE W. HENRICH. YELARK attended the State University of Iowa from September, 1936 until June, 1941. He was employed at Western Electric plant (Hawthorne) from April, 1942 until December, 1943, when he came to the New City. CLARK has resided at the following places:

3 E. Market Street, Iowa City, September, 1937 until June, 1941; 1912 S. 49th Street, Cicoro, Illinois, Juno, 1941 until March, 1943; 3712 E. Avonue, Berwyn, Illinois, March, 1943 until December, 1943; 153 S. Clinton Street, East Orange, New Jersey, from December 28, 1943, until October 26, 1943; 25 Alexander Avenue, Madison, New Jorsey, from October 26, 1946, until ---

CLARK gave as references, RALPH KUNAN, T. F. THOMSON, and RAY PAPKA, all of Sebula, Iowa, who had known him for twenty-five years.

CLARK was employed from June, 1941 until December, 1943, as an Engineer for Western Electric Company, Chicago.
Mr. G. F. RAYMON was his supervisor. Thereafter he became a member of the Technical Staff for Bell Telephone Laboratories, 463 West Street, New York City. His supervisor there was Mr. R. C. NEWHOUSE. CL. RK'S wife's name is AGNES HANNAM, who was born in Ivasdale, Illinois.

Further, the records reflect that CLARK has had frequent access to secret and top secret material. In 1941 he attended an Airborn Radar course at Western Electric.

He is described as: male; white; 5'8"; 165-170 pounds; brown hair; and blue eyes. CLARK has indicated membership in the Institute of Radio Engineers, 1 East 79th Street, June, 1941 to date, and the Eta Kappa Nu, 140 West Street, New York City, March, 1940 to date.

The indices of the New York Office fail to reflect any references to OMER PERCY CLARK.

IV "THE DY BOOK" PERFORMANCE DATES

It is recalled that Miss GERTA GOLDNER, 85 Barrow Street, New York City, advised SA HERMAN C. LITTLEJOHN and the writer on April 14, 1952, that the last time she was in contact with WILLIAM PERL was possibly in the Spring of 1950. She further advised that PERL was by chance met at the Henry Street Playhouse, New York City, for the play entitled, "The Dy Book", which was being presented. Miss GOLDNER advised that PERL was accompanied by a young woman whose name she does not recall. Further, PERL indicated to her that this woman was a social worker. She described the young woman as white, 5'6" or more, 125 pounds, in her mid-twenties, dark brown curly hair, and light complexion.

On June 17, 1952, Miss BETTY YOUNG, Director of the Henry Street Playhouse, 466 Grand Street, New York City, advised the writer the "The Dy Book", a play, was presented at all evening performances from April 11th through April 18, 1950. It is recalled that WILLIAM PERL was in New York City during this period and has advised that he resided in the home of ELEANOR GLASSMAN during that period. A photograph of ELEANOR GLASSMAN was exhibited to Miss GOLDNER on April 14, 1952, at which time she commented that Miss GLASSMAN might possibly be identical with the young woman who accompanied PERL at the playhouse. From the above it would appear that ELEANOR GLASSMAN is identical with this person who accompanied PERL.

V INVESTIGATION INSTITUTE OF RADIO ENGINEERS

In an attempt to ascertain whether SARANT had ever been a member of the Institute of Radio Engineers (IRE) Miss EMILY SIRJANE, an employee of the IRE, I East 79th Street, New York 21, New York, was contacted by the writer on August 11, 1952. She advised that a check of her records failed to indicate that SARANT is now or ever was a member of this organization.

VI ADDITIONAL INVESTIGATION TO LOCATE ALFRED SARANT

Confidential Informants T-2, T-3, T-4, and T-5, all of known reliability, have advised that no mail was received from either ALFRED or LOUISE SARANT by NONDA GEORGE SARANT, ALFRED'S father, ELECTRA SARANT WAYSON, his sister, or by WILLIAM, GEORGE, or RICHARD SARANT, brothers of SARANT, during the period covered by this report.

Sarant, you will recall, shortly thereafter disappeared into Mexico and his whereabouts is unknown. He is an important figure in the Rosenberg network.

Both Greenberg and Sarant attended Brooklyn Polytechnic Institute during 1945 and 1944 and in some instances attended the same courses. Greenberg has insisted in interviews with agents that he does not know Sarant. Professors Weber and Fenn are believed to have conducted courses in which both Greenberg and Sarant were students; therefore, these interviews are for the purpose of ascertaining whether the Professors can produce records or can remember facts showing an association. The Bureau files reflect no information which can be identified with Professor Fenn. As set forth in referenced letter from New York, Weber, as of 1946, was a member of the American Soviet Science Society, Inc., which originated in 1943 as the Science Committee of the Mational Council of American Soviet Friendship, 114 Bast 32nd Street, HYC. In August, 1946, the Society established headquarters at 58 Park Avenue, HYC, which address is the headquarters of the American Russian Institute. Both the M.C.A.S.F. and A.R.I. were cited by the Attorney General as Communist Fronts. The Bureau files reflect no additional information of a derogatory nature which can be identified with Weber.

Interviews with Weber and Fenn are believed to be logical and necessary in the Greenberg investigation.

The above-named individual is the subject of a pending FBI investigation. This investigation was instituted in connection with efforts to identify members of the Soviet espionage group headed by Julius Rosenberg. Sarant is known to have been personally acquainted with Rosenberg and other individuals suspected of espionage activities. As you are aware, Rosenberg and his wife, Ethel, Morton Sobell and David Greenglass, were convicted on espionage charges in the Southern District of New York on March 29, 1951, the Rosenbergs being given death sentences, Bobell, a thirty-year sentence, and Greenglass, a fifteen-year sentence.

During the course of this investigation, Sarant was interviewed on several occasions. We comitted membership in the Communist Party in 1943 and 1944 in Hem Tork. He also admitted acquaintanceship with Julius and Ethel Rosenberg, stating that he believed he met Julius Rosenberg some time between January, 1942, and January, 1945, possibly through Josl Earr. For your information, Barr, a former classmate of Rosenberg's at the College of the City of New York, was likewise suspected of being implicated in the Rosenberg network and left the United Etates in January, 1948. Barr's last known residence was in Parts, France, from which residence he disappeared in June, 1950. Barr's present whereabouts is unknown.

Sarant admitted seeing Rosenberg on eight or ten occasions and declared that his second meeting with Rosenberg took place in his apartment at 65 Morton Street, New York City. He denied he had ever engaged in espionage activities with Rosenberg or anyone else. He admitted that I on one occasion Rosenberg "propositioned" him to sound him out politically, but, Sarant claimed, "he didn't bite." If



Concerning Joel Barr, Sarant explained that he first met Barr shortly after September, 1941, when both were employed at the United Llates Army Signal Corps Laboratories, Fort Monmouth, New Jersey. He recalled that Barr had been dismissed from his employment there because he was a Communist. He further stated that he and Barr spent considerable time together from 1943 through 1945 and that Barr was a frequent visitor to his (Sarant's) apartment at 65 Horton Street, and had a key to this apartment. He believed Barr was a member of the Communist Party but denied that they ever attended Communist Party meetings together. Sarant claimed that the last time he saw Barr was in late 1946 or early 1947 when Barr came to Ithaca, New York, to visit him.

According to David Greenglass, Rosenberg mentioned on one occasion that he had an apartment in the Greenwich Village section of New York City which was used for photographic work in connection with his espionage activities. It is believed eignificant in this respect that Sarant's apartment at 65 Morton Street, is in the Greenwich Village section of New York. It should be noted that Sgrant had a lease on this apartment from October, 1949, to January, 1950, even though Sarant himself moved to Ithaca, New York, in the Fall of 1946. Investigation has disclosed that Barr, and later William Perl, who was susperted of being another member of the Rosenberg network and who is presently under indictment in the Southern District of New York on charges of perjury, occupied the apartment for the duration of Sarant's lease and paid rent to Sarant. Sarant admitted considerable interest and proficiency in photography and the possession of film developing equipment and flood lamps in the Morton Street apartment, but denied ever doing any document photography. He admitted that Barr had a Leica camera when Barr was residing with him at 65 Morton Street. but denied that Barr, to his knowledge, ever engaged in document photography.

Sarant was born September 26, 1918, in New York City, and was graduated with a degree in electrical engineer-ing from Cooper Union College in June, 1941. He was discharged from the position of junior radio engineer with the Army

Signal Corps Laboratories at Fort Montrath; New Jersey, on September 3, 1942, and was characterized by his superior as a labor egitator. He was thereafter employed as an engineer for the Western Electric Company and the Bell Telephone Company in New York City, resigning from the latter concern on September 11, 1948. He married Louise Jacqueline Ruble Ross on July 6, 1945, and they have two children. In October, 1945, Sarant moved to Ithaca, New York, where he became self-employed as a building and painting contractor. He is also known to have taken graduate work at Cornell University, Ithaca, New York. U.

PURPOSE:

BACKGROUND:

Lewis, born 12-25-18, Brooklyn, New York, of Russian parents, was a classmate and close companion of Alfred Sarant at Copper Union, New York City, from 1937 to 1941. As you know, Sarant, a suspected member of the Julius Rosenberg espionage network, disappeared shortly after the arrest of Rosenberg in July, 1950. Lewis was also a co-employee with Sarant at the Army Signal Corps Laboratory, Fort Monmouth, New Jersey, from 1941 to 1942. During that period they also shared an apartment together in Long Branch, New Jersey. In August, 1942, Lewis entered the U.S. Naval Reserve and served in the Navy until 12-23-45 when he was released to inactive duty. He was regalled to

DETAILSE

In October, 1952, ONI requested a Bureau name check on Lewis and Sarant and furnished for our information an ONI report on Lewis dated 9-5-52 which set forth Lewis! past associations with Sarant while at school and at the irmy Signal Corps Laboratory, Fort Monmouth, New Jersey. We furnished ONI a summary memorandum on Sarant, dated October 20, 1952.

Concerning Lewis, a check of our files reflected substantially the same information as appearing in the afore-mentioned ONI report. No other identifiable information on Lewis was located in our files. ONI was advised accordingly by memorandum dated Dotober 20, 1952.

By letter dated 10-24-52, DNI furntaked us additional reports reflecting its complete investigation of Lewis and requested that we institute an investigation of Lewis.

OBSERVATIONS:

It is not believed that we should undertake an investigation of Lewis for the following reasons:

l. Lewis' status as a naval officer clearly makes him the primary responsibility of ONI.

2. A review of the ONI reports in this matter reflects that its investigation of Lewis has been comprehensive and substantially complete and that additional investigation by us is unwarranted. The only information of a possible derogatory nature developed on Lewis in the investigation is that his brother, Herbert Clyde Lewis, a Hollywood screen writer, now deceased, was an active CP member in Los Angeles. In that connection, it is noted that several acquaintances of Lewis who were interviewed during the ONI investigation stated that he was not close to his brother.



tion of assuming responsibility for the continuance of discontinuance of Lewis in the naval service by conducting additional investigation of him.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that in response to the request of ONI, we advise that agency that no additional investigation will be conducted by the Bureau concerning Lewis. However, it is being suggested to ONI that it might desire to interview Lewis concerning his past association with Sarant and if such interview is conducted, we be apprised of the results thereof.



He was questioned concerning his knowledge of ALFRLD SARANT and advised that he could not recall the name. It was pointed out to him that SARANT has been employed at the Bell Telephone Laboratories in New York and had his telephone extension number among his records.

CLARK stated that 2056 was his extension at the Bell Telephone Laboratories in New York City but that individuals may have had it for business reasons in order to contact him.

He was shown a picture of ALFRED SARANT and stated that the picture looked familiar to him but he could not recall anything further. He advised that he never knew ALFRED SARANT as far as he can recall but that numerous people worked for Bell Laboratories during the war period and that a number of people shared the same room with him and SARANT could have been one of these.

CLARK stated that he had never been a member of the Communist Party or any Communist affiliated or subversive organization at any time.

Indices of the Newark Office contain no information regarding CLARK.

He was also shown the picture of DONALD DAVID GRIEG and SOLOMON GREENBERG. The only persons CLARK could identify were JULIUS ROSENBERG and his wife. He stated he remembered their photos from the newspapers.

DETAILS:

I. INTERVIEW OF HARVEY LEE SACHS

A. BACKGROUND

ALFRED SARANT has advised that from September, 1941 to September, 1942 he rented a furnished house with BENJAMIN DEWIS and HARVEY SACHS, also employed at Fort Monmouth, New Jersey. This furnished house was located at 590 Russell Avenue, Long Branch, New Jersey.

There was located in SARANT'S Bates List the following entry:

"SACHS C.O. 5-7389 511 lst Avenue As. Pk"

SARANT advised that this was HARVEY SACHS with whom he used to travel in New Jersey.

There was also located in the permissive search of ALFRED SARANT'S Ithaca, New York, home on July 19, 1950 by Bureau agents a letter addressed to ALFRED SARANT from E. HARVEY SACHS.

Mrs. JOEL JAYSON, sister of ALFRED SARANT, advised SAS FREDERICK BAUCKHAM and DANIEL F. O'CONNOR on July 26, 1950 that on one occasion she stayed overnight at ALFRED SARANT'S 65 Morton Street apartment. She recalled that the following individuals were there:

JOED BARR; BARR'S girlfriend (VIVIAN GLASSMAN); GLADYS MEYER; BETTY SANDERS, HARVEY SACHS, BLAIR a classmate of ALFRED SARANT at Cooper Union who was an art student; a male guitarist with a Spanish name who is a member of a guitarist society, and an unknown male with then reddish blond hair who is a member of the Veterans of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade (VALB) and who is approximately 25 years of age, 5: 3" or 4".

It is noted that the VALB has been declared by the Attorney General as an organization coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

It is recalled that LOUIS GLEEKMAN advised on August 16, 1950 that he was of the opinion that he had probably been introduced to ALFRED S.RANT by HARVEY SACHS, another Cooper Union student, who resided in GLEEKMAN'S neighborhood and with whom GLEEKMAN rode to school. GLEEKMAN at that time lived in the Washington Heights section of New York.

B. INTERVIEW

On August 25, 1952 HARVEY L. S.CHS, Plant Manager, Shaw Television Company, 195 Front Street, Brooklyn, New York, was interviewed by the writer. SACHS stated that he resides at 224-35 Kingsbury Avenue, Queens Village, New York, telephone number HO 5-3315. He stated that he was a classmate of ALFRED SARANT at Cooper Union and that they both graduated with an Electrical Engineering degree from that school in June, 1941. He stated this class consisted of approximately twenty students and that they were all comparatively well known to one another due to its size. He recalled that SARANT was employed by Western Electric at Kearny, New Jersey, and thereafter SARANT was employed at the United States Signal Corps Depot, Fort Monmouth, New Jersey.

It is noted that SACHS was employed by the Fort Monmouth Laboratories subsequent to his graduation from Cooper Union. He stated that after SARANT began employment at Fort Monmouth they roomed together in Long Branch, New Jersey, on 114 Norwood Avenue. He stated that in approximately October, 1941 they rented a two story furnished house in Long Branch for \$80.00 per month. This was located at 590 Russell Avenue.

SACHS advised further that BENJAMIN LEWIS, who was also a Signal Corps employee and a classmate of theirs at Cooper Union, shared with them this two story house. He stated that they continued to live at this address until

April, 1942, when he left to do field work with the Signal Corps. Thereafter he saw SARANT occasionally and recalls seeing him in approximately December, 1942 after he had returned to Western Electric.

SACHS recalls that later SARANT had a six floor walk-up apartment in Greenwich Village and after his memory had been refreshed he recalled that this apartment was located at 65 Morton Street. He also recalls that he saw SARANT once in approximately 1946 on a social visit to the above apartment, at which time he met ALFRED'S wife and recalls that he advised him that he was going to go to Cornell University for additional study.

HARVEY SACHS, after further recollection, stated that he knew that SARANT had this apartment prior to his entry into the United States Navy in April, 1944. He stated that he was discharged from the Navy in February, 1946. SACHS further advised that he possibly had corresponded with SARANT on some occasions.

SACHS recalls JOEL BARR who also worked at Fort Monmouth and believes that BARR moved into the 590 Russell Avenue house after he, SACHS, had left to do field work for the Signal Corps. He recalls that BARR later was employed by the Western Electric Company.

Concerning ALFRED SARANT'S sister, ELECTRA (Mrs. JOEL JAYSON), he stated that he had last seen her in approximately February or March, 1942 when she came to their furnished house in Long Branch with some fellow. He stated he definitely did not recall having met ELECTRA at the Morton Street apartment, as described above.

A photograph of WILLIAM PERL was exhibited to SACHS and he stated that the photograph was vaguely familiar. However, he could not add anything else to his statement. At this point of the interview SACHS recalled that he probably visited the Morton Street apartment on two occasions and that on the first occasion he saw SARANT there alone and on the second occasion he saw SARANT and his wife at the apartment.

A photograph of MAXWELL FINESTONE was exhibited to SACHS and he stated it was unfamiliar to him. He said he does not recall having seen this individual.

Concerning SARANT'S Communist activities, he recalls that in their senior year at Cooper Union SARANT indicated to him that he was interested in Communist Party ideology and SACHS indicated that at that time he was "a parlor pink." He explained this by stating that he was pro-Communist at that time. As their friendship developed he stated that SARANT was strongly sympathetic toward the Communist Party or its ideology and that he too was strongly sympathetic to the Communist philosophy. However, with the advent of his field work with the Signal Corps in approximately April, 1942 he saw less and less of SARANT and drifted from this strong sympathy to the Communist philosophy until he is at this time extremely anti-Communist.

SACHS stated that possibly SARANT attempted to recruit him into the Communist Party in 1942 due to his idealistic Communist Party philosophy. However, he stated that he did not join mainly due to the financial demands which the party would have made on him. He stated that at that time they would have requested him to give two to three percent of his salary to the party.

He recalled that SARANT dated one ALICE who is possibly identical with ALICE KATZ BARSKY in approximately 1942. He stated that this young lady resided in Long Branch, New Jersey, and worked at Fort Monmouth.

Concerning JOEL BARR he stated that he was under the impression that BARR was married when he first met him in Long Branch and that thereafter he possibly separated from his wife whom he did not know or about whom he could furnish no information.

Concerning BENJAMIN LEWIS who shared the 590 Russell Avenue, Long Branch, New Jersey, house with SARANT and himself, he stated that BENJAMIN LEWIS was from the outest and continuing throughout their friendship and association extremely outspoken anti-Communist. He stated that

BENJAMIN LEWIS whom he believes to be currently an officer in the United States Navy had a keen insight into the evils of the Communist Party from the very beginning and was opposed to pro-Communist philosophies exhibited by both SARANT and himself.

Upon further reflection he advised that ALFRED SARANT may have been a member of the Communist Party during 1942. However, he had no definite proof of this, but would strongly suspect it were so inasmuch as possibly SARANT attempted to recruit him into the Communist Party during that year. SACHS reiterated that he did not join the Communist Party due to the financial reasons given hereinabove and has not participated in any Communist Party endeavors since that time.

It should be noted that HARVEY SACHS exhibited complete cooperation during the course of this interview and expressed a sincere desire to assist this Bureau in any way possible in the future.

II. INTERVIEW OF DR. ERNEST WEBER

It is recalled that there appeared an entry in SARANT'S small address notebook which was obtained during a permissive search of SARANT'S residence in Ithaca, New York, by Bureau Agents on July 19, 1950. This entry is as follows:

"Br. Poly TR 5-6920 Weber TR 5-6371"

Mrs. ALFRED SARANT has advised that this appears to be the Brooklyn Polytech Institute, but she did not know who WEBER referred to.

On October 24, 1952 Dr. ERNEST WEBER was interviewed by SA (A) EDWARD J. CAHILL and the writer. Dr. WEBER is the head of the Microwave Research Institute and is head of the Department of Electrical Engineering at Brooklyn Polytech Institute. Dr. WEBER readily identified a photograph of ALFRED SARANT and recalled that he was a quiet, intelligent and studious individual. He stated that they had no outside contact and was unable to advise as to why SARANT had the above entry in his notebook. He stated that it was not uncommon for students to maintain his telephone number and the telephone number of the Brooklyn Polytech Institute inasmuch as he could be readily contacted by phone pertaining to assignments, etc.

Dr. WEBER'S records reflect that SARANT was in his G629 (Higher Mathematical Analysis) class during the 1943 - 1944 school year at Brooklyn Polytech. His records further reflect that ALFRED SARANT and SOL GREENBERG were in his G353 (Electromagnetic Theory) class for the second semester of 1943 - 1944. He stated that the roster indicated that this class began with approximately 54 students.

Dr. WEBER stated that he did not personally recall SOL GREENBERG. However, he stated that it was highly probable that GREENBERG and SARANT were known to one another.

III. INTERVIEW OF DR. D. WHITFORD

Dr. D. WHITFORD, Professor of Mathematics, Brooklyn Polytech Institute, Brooklyn, New York, advised SA (A) EDWARD J. CAHILL and the writer on October 29, 1952 that SOL GREINBERG and ALFRED SARANT were both students in Professor IRWIN FENNS "Theory of Functions (Complex Variables)" G619 class from February 15, 1944 to May 29, 1944. This class began with 13 students and two of these dropped the class.

Dr. WIITFORD advised further that he taught "Vector Analysis III" G625 during the fall term, 1943 - 1944. On the moster of this class appear the names of S. GREENBERG and A. SARANT. Dr. WHITFORD states that this class began with 16 students and three of these dropped out. He did not recall either SARANT or GR. ENBERG and was unable to identify either from their photographs.

IV. INVESTIGATION RE LOCATION OF ASTER HAYDEN

The following entry appears in ALFRED SARANT'S small address notebook which was obtained by Bureau Agents during a permissive search of SARANT'S Ithaca, New York, residence on July 19/1950:

"ASTER MOYDEN 205 W. 103 NY 25 AL 4-7469"

Mrs. SARANT states that this is an old girlfriend of her husband whom she once met.

The current Manhattan Address Telephone Directory reflects a listing for one ASTHER MAYDEN, 205 West 103 Street, and she has telephone number MO 3-2069. Inquiry was made at this address on August 25, 1952 by the writer and it was ascertained through ASTER HAYDEN'S mother, a Mrs. HAYDEN, that her daughter is now married to one JACK YOGMAN and they currently reside at 404 East Imperial, Brea, California.

The indices of the New York Office are negative for ASTER or ASTHER HAYDEN and JACK YOGMAN.

V. INVESTIGATION RE POSSIBLE SUBSCRIPTION TO "ELECTRONICS" BY ALFRED SARANT

On August 20, 1952 the writer contacted the circulation department for the trade publications "Electronics" and "Nucleonics" published by McGraw - Hill, 333 West '42 Street, New York City. No record of a subscription to either magazine was located for ALFRED SARANT.

VI. ADDITIONAL INVESTIGATION TO LOCATE ALFRED SARANT

Confidential Informants T-1, T-2, T-3 and T-4, all of known reliability, have advised that no mail was received from either ALFRED or LOUISE SARANT by NONDA GEORGE SARANT, ALFRED'S father; ELECTRA-SARANT JAYSON, his sister; or by WILLIAM, GEORGE or RICHARD SARANT, brothers of ALFRED SARANT, during the period covered by this report.



His employment reflects him to be a member of Sigma Chi and American Physical Society. COLE was a member of U. S. Air Force from June 24, 1944, to May 18, 1946.

Birth data and background data contained in employment records of COLE is as follows:

Father, FRANCIS COLE, born in the State of West Virginia; mother, JOANA BARTH, place of birth reflected as New York City, present address is 337 East 86th Street, New York 28, New York; occupation of father listed as export manager, and naturalization of FRANCIS T. COLE reflects him to be a citizen by birth. COLE is single, reads and speaks French and German fluently. His date and place of birth was listed as October 6, 1925, at Lynbrook, Long Island, New York.

Confidential Informant Omaha T-1, of known reliability, advised that MARY DOYLE PRINGER (who is a subject of a security investigation being conducted by the Omaha Office) went to Chicago July 3, 1952, to attend the Progressive Party Convention which was being held in Chicago, Illinois, at that time. MARY DOYLE SPRINGER is reported by T-1 as having gone to Chicago in a car bearing Iowa license 52-4067, which license, according to the Iowa license bureau, Iowa City, Iowa, was registered to one FRANCIS T. COLE residing at 501 North Dubuque Street.

J. G. SENTINELLA, 614 North Gilbert Street, Towa City, Towa, who is employed in the Department of Physics in charge of the tool room and who has furnished reliabile information in the past, advised he was acquainted with FRANCIS T. COLE, Assistant Professor in the Department of Physics. Mr. SENTINELLA stated that he has heard of no activity on the part of COLE as having been interested in political groups or student groups of any kind and stated that he has had no reason whatever to doubt the loyalty, reputation or character of FRANCIS T. COLE.

Mr. SENTINELLA has a son who is an Agent of the FBI presently assigned to the Buffalo Field Office.

JAMES JORDAN, Bureau of Information Service, University of Idwa, and who has been reliable in the past, advised he knew of no activity of COLE on the campus as to student groups or otherwise. He stated that to his knowledge, COLE has a good



ReBulet November 10, 1952. This letter advised that Mrs. JUNE CHASE DAYTON of 147 Eastern Avenue, Plainfield, Indiana received a package in October from Mrs. ERUCE T DAYTON, "Rica Soma Lima, 149, apartment 302, Rio de Janeiro." Mrs. JUNE CHASE DAYTON is a known Communist and the daughter of Mrs. ELBA-CHASE MELSON, Executive Secretary of the Communist Party of New Hampshire in 1951. Mrs. JUNE DAYTON is married to RHODES PIKE DAYTON, a scientist. The Rio office was instructed to determine whether the sender of the package was identical with CAROL DAYTON, who is the wife of WELDON BRUCE DAYTON, generally known as ERUCE DAYTON. Carol is believed to be living with the subject using the name of her husband.

It was determined that the Dayton family in this city is not identical with CAROL DAYTON and ALFRED SARANT, the subject. The following is being set out as of interest, with extra copies of this letter for appropriate distribution to interested Field Offices should the Bureau desire.

Confidential Informant RIO-2 conducted the following investigation:

visa, Nº 525 issued October 4, 1951 at Los Angeles. He resides
at 2237 Glyndon Avenue, Venice, California. JUANITA MAY DAYTON MAY
born Sparks, Kansas, September 6, 1912, the daughter of BERT
ZIMMERMAN and HESTER E. TROWBRIDGE. Married to above Bruce.
She arrived in Brazil with her husband and two daughters, Sally
Jane, 15 and Virginia Ellen, 14 years old.

The writer had previously met ERUCE TOSTEVIN DAYTON and his wife socially, through his immediate superior, Mr. CHARLES CORT, who represents Douglas Aircraft Corporation of Santa Monica, California, in South America. Mr. CORT is a good friend and is reliable. It should be noted incidentally that DAYTON bears no resemblance to SARANT. DAYTON is about 6'2" tall and weighs about 190 pounds, and is rangy in build.

CORT had established the Rio office of Douglas Aircraft, and some time later he and his wife had taken a trip to the United States. CORT learned that DAYTON, who worked for Douglas, was to be assigned to Rio de Janeiro. DAYTON invited Mr. and Mrs. CORT to his home for dinner. The Daytons had a house in Venice, California. CORT observed that many of DAYTON's relatives lived with him and "on him." He also observed that Mrs. DAYTON did most of the work in connection with the household, getting little help from the others in the household.

During his association with DAYTON, Mr. CORT has learned the following: DAYTON and his wife were able to buy a house in Venice and were getting along well. Bit by bit his family, mother, fether, brothers, etc. moved in on them, practically uniquited. They became such a burden, psychologically as well as in other ways, that DAYTON sought an assignment which would take him away from his relatives. The house is still his, CORT thinks.

DAYTON said that some of his family had "funny ideas" but the closest to anything specific on this that CORT ever heard was that DAYTON said a brother of his had gotten so "leftist" in some of his remarks, that he had put him out of his house, and for a long time had nothing to do with him. CORT believed this brother lived some place in the mid-west.

DAYTON had also said on one occasion that DOUGLAS had loaned him to a military or air force project which was working on special equipment. Feeling that the equipment was to be used for destructive purposes, that is in war, he requested a transfer from the project, and when the foreign assignment came along he had another reason for accepting it, besides the escape it offered him from his relatives.

No information was found in the files of the Political or Criminal Police.

No further investigation is being conducted in this matter by this office unless specific instructions are received from the Bureau. As noted above, extra copies of this letter are provided should the Bureau desire to forward them to interested offices.

several occasions other than at the present time. The personnel card reflects that Miss SKILLINGS was born on February 27, 1937, and that she moved to Pennsylvania in June 1949 and returned in September 1950. She is presently living with her grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. HENRY MOOSE, 39 Montezuma Street, and her mother's name is ELIZABETH MOOSE SKILLINGS. Mr. BOWLER advised that BARBARA SKILLINGS is a nice person and he knew nothing of a derogatory nature concerning her. He further stated that he knew ELIZABETH MOOSE SKILLINGS while she was in school at Lyons School, where she took a general course. He said that Mr. and Mrs. MOOSE sent ELIZABETH to an institution of higher education. He did not know the name of the institution or whether ELIZABETH MOOSE SKILLINGS ever received any degree.

ROSE MARIE MUTO, a clerk at the Clyde Central School and a neighbor of the MOOSE family on Montezuma Street, advised that the girl's mother did not live on Montezuma Street and that she did not visit BARBARA very often. She said that the mother did not appear to treat BARBARA SKILLINGS like a mother should and that she left the child to the care of the care of the grandparents. Miss MUTO advised that Mr. and Mrs. HENRY MOOSE were good, honest, and loyal people.

EDGAR JENNINGS, 99 Broad Street, advised that he had employed Mr. HENRY MOOSE as a Foreman in his factory for thirty years and the employment ended in 1949. JENNINGS advised that HENRY MOOSE had sent his daughter, ELIZABETH, to school after her graduation from high school and that it was a physical education school connected with Cornell University. He also advised that this was approximately sixteen years ago and he is not clear on the details. However, he recalled that ELIZABETH returned to Lyons, New York, during her stay at school in order to have a child. The father of the child was not known to JENNINGS or any others in the community. JENNINGS further advised that there has always been mystery around the life of ELIZABETH and nobody seems to know where she is. JENNINGS stated that a brother, JOHN MOOSE, and the parents of ELIZABETH enjoy a good reputation in Lyons, New York, and there is no question concerning their honesty or loyalty.

Mrs. JOSEPHINE TROMBINO, 31 Montesuma Street, advised that she has lived at this address for approximately twenty years and knows the HENRY MOOSE family quite well. She stated that ELIZABETH was studying physical education at an institution of higher learning when she got into trouble and became pregnant. She returned to Lyons, New York, and had a child, BARBARA, but nobody ever saw or heard of the father. Since that time she believes that ELIZABETH MOOSE married a person by the name of SKILLINGS, but that this person is not the father of BARBARA SKILLINGS. She also advised that ELIZABETH does not concern herself with BARBARA SKILLINGS, as it is common gossip that she has left her to the care of the grandparents and does not even send money for her support. Mrs. TROMBINO had no idea of





CRAMPTON and WULETICH are aware of no indications that GNESIN might be engaged in any form of espionage based on his activities in and around Chesterton, Indiana.

Cashier of Chesterton State Bink, advised that when Dr. and Mrs. GNESIN first came to the Chesterton, Indiana, area they lived in cottage rented from Dr. JOSEPH G. BERKOWITZ M.D. (name changed to JOSEPH G ABERKLEY) concerning whom the Chicago READ went on to state that the GNESINS then bought property from the bank and built a home of their own on this property. They maintained residence here at the present time and are regarded 🖄 as established residents of the community, although Dr. GNESINAS work takes him to Chicago a great deal of the time. READ stated that Dr. GNESIN is Director of the Goodman Theatre which is part of the Art Institute in Chicago. He frequently stays in Chicago for two or three days at a time, and while staying in Chesterton commutes to Chicago frequently. READ stated that GNESIN is a scholarly individual and is able to speak several languages. ne recalled for example that GNESIN, line contemplation of a state of the contemplation of a state of the contemplation of the contempl trip to Mexico, learned to speak Spanish very fluently in a short period of time.

Mrs. GNESIN has been a member of the local PTA, League of Women Voters, and other such organizations, but has never been particularly active in these local organizations. Dr. and Mrs. GNESIN have one son who is presently serving in the United States Army. READ continued by stating that it is his personal knowledge that the GRESINS put all of their savings into United States Defense Bonds. He stated further that there has never been any occasion during his association with Dr. and Mrs. GNESIN which would lead him to believe that either or both of them are in any way connected with an espionage ring.

He pointed out, however, that because of the nature of Dr. GNESIN position in Chicago, he might logically become associated with individuals whose loyalty to the United States would be subject to question. He suggested that further inquiry be made at Chicago inasmuch as Dr. GNESIN is better known there than in Chesterton, Indiana.






