husband, operates the Hungler Bakery & Delicatessen, 300 Vine Street, Reading, Ohio, advised that her maiden name was ARTEMIS KETTAS; and that she resided with her mother and sister at 878 LaFayette Street, Cincinnati, Ohio for seven years prior to 1947. She advised that upon the death of her mother, she and her sister APHASIA B. KETTAS left that address. She advised that her sister APHASIA is known as BETTY KETTAS, and that she now resides in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. She advised that her brother, JOHN KETTAS resides in South Bend, Indiana.

MRS. HUNGLER advised that she was employed by the Auto Car Company, 241 East McMicken Street, Cincinnati/ Ohio for about five years prior to 1947 and during that period resided at 878 LaFayette Street, Cincinnati, Ohio.

MRS. HUNGLER stated that the names ALFRED SARANT and LOUISE SARANT are not familiar to her and further that she is not familiar with the names of BRUCE DAYTON, LOUISE RUBEL or LOUISE ROSS. She further advised that she has never known anyone with the nickname "Puss" or "Pussy Cat". MRS. HUNGLER stated that she has never known anyone who resided in the Greenwich Village Section of New York City and that she has never known anyone who resided at Ithaca, New York.

MRS. HUNGIER further stated that she has not visited the New York area since 1939 and that on that occasion she went with her family to visit relatives in New Jersey. She stated she was about coventeen years old and that her visits to New York City were brief and that she recalled meeting no one on this trip meeting the descriptions of the subjects. She stated that it was highly improbable that she would have met either of the subjects on this trip inasmuch as she was with her family at all times, and the people whom she met were all relatives of her family. She advised she is of Greek descent and that all of the individuals whom she met on her trip to New Jersey were of Greek descent. She stated, however, that she recalled meeting no one by the name of SARANT. MRS. HUNGLER stated that she is positive that she has met no one meeting the description of either of the subjects at Cincinnati, Ohio.

MRS. HUNGLER advised that in 1940 she was married to an individual by the name of NICK MATZARIS, a resident of Cincinnati, who went into military service in 1941.

She stated she obtained a divorce from this individual several years later and that to her knowledge, this individual has returned to the Cincinnati, Ohio area after his military service, and continues to reside in this area. MRS. HUNGLER stated that NATZARIA is an engineer and that he served with a group of engineers while in the United States Army. MRS. HUNGLER stated that possibly MATZARIA gave her name to servicemen whom he might possibly have suggested that they contact her if they ever should visit Cincinnati. MRS. HUNGLER stated, however, that she has no indication that MATZARIA did give her name to any individual.

MRS. HUNGLER stated that during the war the Greek community at Cincinnati frequently entertained servicemen, particularly those of Greek descent; that they had parties for servicemen on a weekly basis. She stated that she met many servicemen at these parties and suggested the possibility that one of them had given her name to the subject.

MRS. HUNGLER stated that other than the above, she has no idea how her name would come into the possession of either of the subjects.

MR. RAY SCHRAFFENBERGER, Parts-man, of the Auto Car Company, 241 Eat McMicken Street, Cincinnati, Ohio, advised that he worked closely with MRS. HUNGLER while she was employed as a secretary at the Auto Car Company for approximately five years prior to 1948. MR. SCHRAFFENBERGER stated that MRS. HUNGLER had an excellent reputation. He stated that during the time that she was employed by this company, she seldom took vacations and at no time during her employment there, did she take a trip to the east, particularly New York City. MR. SCHRAFFENBERGER stated that he has never heard MRS. HUNGLER mention the name of either of the subjects and further stated that he has never heard anyone mention the names of either of the subjects.

According to Mrs. MARKUS, MINA ROSS in 1945 was confined in a hospital at Sayre, Pa., and thus she, Mrs. MARKUS, paid her a visit. She added that at the hospital she met ALFRED and LOUISE SARANT, who were also visiting Mrs. ROSS.

Mrs. MARKUS stated that a few months later she went to New York City with JANE SPARGO. a friend of LOUISE SARANT, and while they were in New York City, they briefly visited ALFRED and LOUISE SARANT at their apartment, the address of which she does not recall. She added that during the visit she did not meet any acquaintances of the SAPANTS.

She stated that subsequently and prior to the time she left Ithaca, New York, for Pittsburgh, Pa., in September, 1946, she met ALFRED and LOUISE SARANT on several occasions in Ithaca.

New York. She added that on some of these occasions, mutual friends of the SARANTS and her were present; namely, RRUCE and CAROL DAYTON and JOE and GLORIA LEVINSON. She further added that she never met any of the SARANTS' friends from New York or for that matter, anyone who may have been residing outside of Ithaca, New York, and that she was not acquainted with any other friends or associates of the subjects other than the aforementioned.

According to Hrs. MARKUS, after she left Ithsca, New York, in September, 1946, she lost contact with the SARANTS and the DAYTONS. She pointed out that JCE and GLORIA LEVINSON, whose address was c/o Louisiana State University, Beton Rouge, La., in December, 1951, were very close friends of the DAYTONS and the SARANTS, and that the LEVINSONS might be able to furnish some information as to the activities and contacts of the SARANTS.

It is noted that it was previously reported that in the course of a permissive search of the subject's residence in July, 1950, two address books, a Bates list finder and a small address book were located. Among the names found in the above was that of SAUL COHEN, 1504 Over Ave., telephone ES 7-7474.

A review of the current N. J. Bell Telephone directories reflects that the only New Jersey exchange having the prefix letters S is the Essex exchange in Newark, N. J. However, there is no Essex 7 exchange.

A review of the New York City telephone books reflects that there is an Esplanade 7 exchange in New York. The 1950-1951 Brooklyn, New York telephone book lists one SAUL OCIEN, Telephone number Esplanade 7-7474 as residing at that time at 1504 Ocean Ave., Brooklyn, New York.

It is further noted that among the names which appear in the address book and list finder was that of "SHERIDAN X 862". When questioned concerning this entry, the subject advised he believed that this individual was a former fellow employee at Western Electric or the Bell Telephone Co. Laboratory.

Mr. W. A. MILLET, Personnel Dept., Western Electric Corp., Kearny, N. J., made available to the writer the employment records of all persons by the name of SHERIDAN who have been employed by the company in a clerical, technical or engineering capacity. A review of these records fail to reflect that any of these persons had ever been employed in a position in which they would have had occasion to come in contact with or associate with the subject in the course of their employment.

In addition, a review was made of the Company telephone directories for the years 1940 through 1946. However, these directories fail to reflect that anyone by the name of SHERIDAN had ever been employed in the same department with the subject.

With respect to the notation X 862 which followed the name SHERIDAN in the subject's address book, Mr. MILLET was questioned as to the probability that this could have been a telephone extension of the 'estern Electric Corp. and the possibility of ascertaining the location of this extension. Mr. MILLET advised that he has been employed in the Kearny Division of Western Electric for over 20 years and to the best of his knowledge, the company has never used an 800 series of telephone extensions. He further stated that following World War II, the company communication system was completely revised. He said that the company maintains no records of the location of old telephone extensions and the only place where such information might be obtained was in the library of the New York Bell Telephone Co., New York City. Mr. MILLET suggested that if these records were to be checked, that a Mrs. HAGEN, who is employed at the library and whose telephone extension is 2192, should be contacted. Mr. MILLET further advised that the telephone number of the New York Bell Telephone Co. Library is EXchange 3-9800.

I. INVESTIGATION TO IDENTIFY SARANT'S CONTACT AT 86-65 21st Avenue

#### A. Introduction

During the permissive search of ALFRED SARANT'S Ithaca, New York residence by Bureau agents on July 19, 20, 1050 the following entry was noted on the reverse side of his Certificate of Fitness from SARANT'S Local Board Number 719, Hempstead, Iong Island, New York, dated July 9, 1944:

"West End BMT 20th Ave. 8665 21 Ave. SKOPT OARBACHS . 9:00 P.M."

Concerning the above entry it should be noted that the West End line of the BMT has a 20th Avenue, Brooklyn, New York stop. This would be the most readily accessible subway stop for the address 86-65 21st Avenue, Brooklyn, New York address.

#### B. Probable Identification of "SKOPT"

### 1-Herman Skopp

Mrs. SALVATORE GUMINA, 86-65 21st Avenue, Brocklyn, New York advised the writer on February 27, 1953 that her father and mother, who currently reside in the lower part of this two unit dwelling, purchased this house approximately six years are from the United States Life Insurance Company, 84 William Street, New

York. She stated that this house had been formerly owned by an elderly man by the name of SKOPF(Phonetic), who had lost the house due to failure to meet his mortgage requirements. She stated that this individual named SKOPP (phonetic) had two daughters, names unrecalled, and that he had formerly operated an antique shop on 86th Street, within walking distance of this address.

A survey of the vicinity described by Mrs. GUMTNA on 86th Street failed to indicate any antique shops being operated in that vicinity. However, a Procklyn telephone directory dated February, 1943 reflected one HERMAN SKOPP, general merchant-diser, 6-09 18th Avenue, telephone number BE 6-3667, and who had residence at 86-65 21st Avenue, telephone number ES 2-6351. Further, it was noted that the current Brooklyn telephone directory for 1952-1953 lists one NERMAN SKOPF, 557 Maple Street, subscriber to telephone number PR 2-9217.

A Brocklyn address telephore directory dated February 8, 1952 indicated that one LOUIS THUCK, 86-65 21st Avenue, had telephone listing ES 3-4159.

Mrs. GUMINA advised that LCUIS IUCCI, above mentioned, is her sister's husband.

The Brooklyn address telephone directory dated
December 19, 1947 reflects a listing for one ELAINE JAZZETA,
telephone number ES 3-4158. Mrs. GUMINA stated that this refers
to her sister. The same telephone directory reflected a listing
for one NANCY-IUCCI, 86-65 21st Avenue as subscriber to ES 3-4150.
Mrs. GUMINA advised that this refers to her mother.

Goncerning the entry appearing in SARANT'S notebook it is noted that the word "SKOPT" is written therein. It is logical to assume that this name may recailly refer to someone in the HERMAN SKOTP family, which formerly resided at 86-65 21st Avenue, Brooklyn, New York.

Confidential Informant T-1, of known reliability, advised on January 23, 1953 that the name of HERMAN SKOPF, 86-65 21st Street, Brooklyn, New York appeared on a list of delegates to the American Peace Mobilization meeting in Chicago, Illinois during 1940. SKOPP was representing Branch Number 140 of the International Workers Order (IWO).

It is to be noted that the American Peace Mobilization and the IWO have been declared by the Attorney General as organizations coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

Confidential Informant T-1 further advised that RERMAN and IDA SKOPP (no address) attended the first anniversary of the Jefferson School of Social Science held at the Hotel Roosevelt, New York City on February 5, 1945.

The Jefferson School of Social Science has been cited by the Attorney General as an organization coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

Confidential Informant T-1 also advised that HERMAN SKCFF, 86-65 21st Avenue, Brooklyn, signed a 1940 Communist Party Nominating Petition, 16th A.D., page 1120; a BROWDER-FORD 1940 Communist Party Nominating Petition, page number not shown; an AMTER 1942 CIMF, page 6502 and a CPMP for Councilman CACCHIONE, 1943, page 1306.

Confidential Informant T-1 has also advised that HERMAN SKOPP, 550 Maple Street, Brooklyn, New York was shown as an American Labor Party (ALP) county committee member on 1951 petitions 37th E.D., 18th A.D., page 36.

It should be noted that the Attorney General as cited the Communist Party as an organization coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

The following information concerning the ALP is contained in a booklet entitled, "Guide To Subversive Organizations and Publications," propared and released by the Committee on Un-American

Activities, United States House of Representatives, Washington, D.C., May 14, 1951:

"American Labor Party

"I. For years, the Communists have not forth the greatest efforts to capture the entire American Labor Party throughout New York State. They succeeded in capturing the Manhattan and Prooklyn sections of the American Labor Party but outside of New York City they have been unable to win control."

"(Special Committee on Un-American Activities, Report, March 29, 1944, p. 78).

\*2. Among 'organizations that are victims of Communist domination'.

"(Californal Committee on Un-American

Activities, Report, 1048, pp. 40 and 41)."

On October 8, 1952 Mrs. DAVID J. ROSEN, 2978 Perry Avenue, Bronx, New York, telephonically contacted the New-York Office and advised that her niece, JUNE-HEDGES, a former Government employee, had told her on April 9, 1951 that last Fall (1950) HERMAN EKOPE, 517 (550) Maple Street, Brooklyn, New York, had taken JUNE to a meeting in the Thomas Jefferson School (the Jefferson School of Social Science) in New York City, at which meeting the editor of the "Daily Worker," an East coast Communist newspaper, was the speaker. According to Mrs. ROSEN, JUNE also mentioned that SKOPE makes monthly trips to Canada and takes papers with him and brags that he can take them into the country because the Customs men are stupid. He tried to recruit JUNE into the CP.

On November 10, 1952 MARGE BLAUSTEIN, owner and operator of Steens' Beauty Shop, 1266 Lexington Avenue, New York City, advised SAS HAROLD C. BARRETT, Jr. and BOYD B. HENRY, Jr. that she met a man named HERMANTSKOPPE about four years and through an introduction by a Mr. HERMAN-GREENFIELD, an old friend and owner



of a plumbing shop in the neighborhood, in Brooklyn, where SKOPPE operates an antique shop. She did not know the location of the entique shop.


Mrs. BLAUSTEIN stated that she had three or four dates with SKOPPE and on her last date with him, about four years ago, he took Mrs. BLAUSTEIN and her niece, JUNE, to a play at the Jefferson School of Scoin Science, and as a result she considered him to be a Communist and had not dated him since that time.

Mr. HERMAN-GREENFIELD (who is married to JUNE HEDGES! mother), 3900 itlantic View Avenue, Seaford, Long Island, advised SA LEO H. FRUTKIN on December 1, 1952 that he had formerly lived in Eath Beach, for about 25 years and knew HERMAN SKOPP from there. He stated that he did not know the correct spelling of the name but pronounced it SKOPP. SKOPP had a store which dealt in second hard goods and on occasions in bric-a-brac at 18th Avenue and 86th Street. He now has a similar store at 18th Avenue between Eenson Avenue and Eath Avenue (opposite a Pontiac dealer).

GREENFIELD said he had known SKOPP for about 20 years. SKOPP had been selling GRIENFIELD furniture and bric-a-brac for many years. SKOPP had been making trips to Canada to see his relatives in Montreal. GREENFIELD stated that they still occasionally meet one enother when GREENFIELD is in the Bath Beach neighborhood and goes by SKOPP'S atore.

GREENFIELD stated that he is convinced that SKCPP is a Communist but cannot recall any specific remarks made by SKOPP to substantiate his helief. He also helieves that SKOPP's deceased wife was a Communist and also his daughter, PERMICE, but cannot give any proof of this.

Mrs. JUNE HEDGER, 3000 Atlantic View evenue, Seaford, Long Island, advised SA FRUTKIN on December 1, 1952 that she knew SKOPP only through the occasional contacts had by GREENFIELD and her mother with him when they bourst furniture from SKOPP. She further advised that in the Fall of 1968 she and her parents (the GREENFIELDS) went to SKOPP'S store to pick out some furniture




and during the course of conversation suggested that they take a trip to Canada together. He stated he liked company and hated to travel that far by himself. At the time the GREENFIFLD were hoping to interest SKOPP and MADGE FLOUSTEIN (JUNE'S aunt previously mentioned) in matrimony, so that the trip was arranged to include MADGE BLAUSTEIN. SKOPP'S Puick was utilized in this trip, which took place in September, 1948, when they journeyed to Montreal.

MADGE and herself stayed at the Laurentian Hotel, however SEOPE did not stay there. They did not know where SECPP stayed while in Montreal. She stated that they visited there for a week and SECPP saw them daily, however, they went sightseeing without him. They did not know what he did except he was suprosed to be visiting relatives. He bought socks and other merchandise for his store. When they returned he indicated he was sightseeing and was angry in advance about the search he expected the Customs men to make. However, the actual exemination by Customs did not amount to enviting. In the car on the way home he said the bookle in the United States had to work so much for so little while in Russia they "have it so good." He felt the Government did not do enough for the people. He said "money represents time and work and no one person should get more money than his labor calls for."

He invited them to attend a lecture on music at the Jefferson School of Social Science in New York City, and a few weeks after their return, JUNE, Mr. and Mrs. GREENFIELD, "KOTT and a girl named MARIAN KONROTHER (phonetic) (whom TROPF brought along to meet JUNE) attended a lecture at that school. The lecturer was the night editor of the Daily Morker, whose name was not recalled. A Nagro man was also a speaker. They speke about music not being capable of expression by anyone but the workers. JUNI, her parents and MARIAH "CNRUTHIR found the lecture very unpleasant and MARIAN told JUNE she would never so there again.

MARIAN KONRUTHER lives at 100 Lefferts Avenue, Brooklyn.

Mrs. HERMAN GREWNFIELD (ALBERTA PEDGES GREENFIELD) 3900 Atlantic View Avenue, Scaford, Long Island, advised SA FRUTKIN that SKCPP'S relatives in Nontreal, Canada are believed to be



cousins named GREENBERG, who run a hairdressing business there. Further, she advised that SKOPP, during the trir to Canada, told her she should not let her son go into the Wavy. Fe said, "If every American mother refused what could they do?" He said te did not have to no to Russia because in 1951 Communism would be over here.

He was corrying a vase to the GREENBERGS and had something in this wase for them. He brought some porter (beer) and socks from Canada for the GREENFIELDS. The following description of SKOPP was obtained from Mrs. GREENFIELD:


Confidential Informant T-2, of known reliability, has adviced that HERMAN SKOPP, 550 Maple Street, Brooklyn, appears on a list of subscribers to the Civil Rights Congress Pail Fund in the amount of \$250.00, dated November 13, 1947.

The Civil Rights Congress has been cited by the Attorney General as an organization coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

Confidential Informant T-3, of known reliability, advised on June 17, 1949 that the name HERMAN SKOPP, born 1886, appears on an IWO general office membership list for Lodge Number 140, which is dated June, 1949.

On March 8, 1950 and October 3, 1951 the same informant further advised that the name HERMAN SKOPP, born 1886, appeared on the same IWO general office membership list, dated March, 1950.

#### 2-BERNICE CECILE BECKER, nee SKOPP and NAOMI SORKEY, nee SKOPP




Confidential Informant To be brown reliability, advised on March 31, 1951 that

a sister of NAOMI SCRKEY, nee brore, with alias has HERMAN SCRKEY, NAOMI SCRKOVITZ, Mrs. SCRKOVITZ, and who was visiting the SCRKOVITZ family during 1947-1948 at Norman, Oklahoma. The informant stated that this individual's name was unrecalled. However, she was in Norman for the purpose of obtaining a divorce. The informant said that Mrs. SCRKOVITZ'S sister was of Russian-Polish descent, a member of the IWO, approximately 29 years of age and had been a member of the CP in New York.

This informant also advised that Mr. and Mrs. HERMAN SCRKCVITZ were mombers of the Norman Branch of the CP, Norman, Oklahoma, during 1947-1948.

Confidential Informant T-5 further advised on April 4, 1951 that NAOMI SORKOVITZ'S sister who visited her was named BERNICE SKOPP and she was employed as a waitress at the Coffee Cup, Norman, Oklahoma for a short period of time during the latter part of 1947 and early 1948. The informant recalled that she was in Norman for the purpose of obtaining a divorce and did so obtain a divorce in the Court of Cleveland County. Further, the informant recalled that BERNICE SKOPP was accompanied by Mr. and Mrs. SKOPP, her mother and father, of New York City and that the latter individuals, in 1938, paid an extended visit to Russia. The Informant advised that Mrs. SKOPP is preyently



deceased but Mr. SKOPP is a frequent visitor in Norman. The informant stated that he had not heard, that Mr. SKOPP was a CP member but knew that he was a member of the IWO in New York City.

The records of the District Court of Cleveland County, Norman, Oklahoma reflect that on March 2, 1948 one BERNICE CECILE RECKER filed a suit for divorce from EUGENE-PICKER. Mrs. BECKER charged "gross negligence and non-support," indicating that the BECKERS were married on January 28, 1939 at Frooklyn, New York and had one child, ROPLRT1 ANN BECKER, age 3½ years. EUGENE PECKER'S address was listed as 19-26 83 Street, Brooklyn, New York. A final decree of divorce was granted on April 18, 1948.

Confidential Informant T-6, of known reliability, advised that BERNICE CECILE RECKER, in 1948, resided with a sister or brother, students at the University of Oklahoma, Norman, Oklahoma, in care of Box 149, Prefab G2, Wilson Center, Norman, Oklahoma. Mrs. BECKER came to Norman from Brooklyn, New York for the purpose of obtaining a divorce and reportedly returned to Brooklyn after having been granted her divorce in April, 1948.

The registration records at the University of Oklahoma, Norman, Cklahoma, indicate that HERMAN SORKEY, in 1951, was a student at the University and resided at Prefab G2, Box 149, Wilson Center Norman, Oklahoma:

Confidential Informant T-7, of known reliability, advised that BERNICE-SKOPP-BECKER resided with Mr. and Mrs. HERMAN SORKEY, box 149, during 1947-1948, but had no further address for Mrs. BECKER. This informant advised on July 9, 1951 that Mrs. SORKEY had received a costcard signed "BEUNICE," which was postmarked Montreal; Canada: The following is a description of BERNICE CECILE BECKER, nee SKOPP:

## II. INVESTIGATION RE AND INTERVIEW OF Mrs. CLIFFORD B. RICH, nee SYLVIA RANDOLPH

During the course of interview of ALFRED SARANT on July 19, 1950 by Bureau agents he executed a waiver authorizing a search of his home in Ithaca, New York. Among the things located was a small address notebook and the following entry was noted therein:

"SYLVIA RANDCLPI 320 Cent. Pk.W.

Mrs. JESSE ROTH, apartment 2F, 320 Central Park West, Manhattan, telephone number SC 4-3768, advised the writer on February 20, 1053 that a Miss SYLVIA RAMDOLPH had formerly resided in her home during the early 1940's. Miss RAMDOLFH assisted Mrs. ROTH in the tutoring and caring for her daughter in exchange for room and board. Miss RAMDOLFH had been a student at the Juliard School of Music in New York City and was believed to have attended the Medical Schools of either New York University or Columbia University.

On February 20, 1953 the records of the Julliard School of Music, New York City, were reviewed by the writer and it was ascertained that SYLVIA RAEDCLFH is now known as Mrs. CLIFFORD W. RICH and had been enrolled as a special student from February, 1940 to May, 1940. She withdrew on February 1, 1941. Her address at that time was shown as 48 Eighth Avenue, New York City, telephone number CH 3-4687. Her date of birth was indicated as November 20, 1918, Montreal, Canada, Where SAMMEL J:-RANDOLPH, 4277 St. Urban Street, Montreal, Canada, Where

he was employed as a clothier. Her record further indicated that she had attended Girls High School in Brooklyn, New York, for two years.

On February 24, 1953 Mrs. CLIFFORD H. RICH, 14 Innes
Road, Scarsdale, N.w York, was interviewed by SA FREDERICK C.
BAUCKHIM and the writer. Mrs. RICH stated that she met ALFRED
SARANT in approximately 1944 through her younger sister, ANN;
who is now married to JOSEPHATZ, 236 Montgomery Street, Brooklyn,
New York. She said at that time they were probably residing on
Eighth Avenue, between 15th and 16th Streets, with their sister,
ELEANOR (deceased) and a brother.

Mrs. RTCH indicated that SARANT would often come to their apartment due to a mutual interest they had in music. He would play his guitar and sing folk songs. It was her impression that SARANT had "left-wing" tendencies, which she stated could be termed as pro-Communist. However, she was unable to further advise concerning this belief.

She recalls that possibly her sister, ANN, ALTRED SARANT and herself visited in his apartment at 65 Morton Street, Greenwich Village, New York City on one occasion. She does not recall anyone else's being present at the time of this visit.

Mrs. RICH was questioned concerning whether or not SAE NT had over telephoned her or called on her when she lived at 320 Central Park West, New York City. She advised that he may possibly have called her when she resided at 320 Central Park West during the 1943-1944 period. The substantiated the information furnished by Mrs. JESSE-ROTH in that she cared for Mrs. ROTH'S daughter, ELAINE, while she resided at that address in exchange for her room and board.

Mrs. RICH stated that she does not recall brying ever met any of ALF? D MARANT'S friends.

The Wow York office indices fail to reflect any references to Mrs. RICE or her sister, ANN.

It should be noted that CLIPTORD HOWARD RICH, husband of SYLVIA RANDOLPH RICH is currently practicing law at 80 West 40th Street, New York City, telephone LO 4-2260. He was formerly an Assistant United States Attorney in the Southern District of New York in 1938-1939. He is the son of CHARLES S. and SADIE LEVINE RICH, having been born on May 12, 1914 in the Bronx, New York. He received an A.B. Degree from Harvard College in June, 1944 and an LLB Degree from Harvard Law School in June, 1947.

## III. INVESTIGATION TO IDENTIFY ONE HELEN INTIL. PROV.... CORP., 90 GOLD STREET

During the course of the search of SARAMT'S residence, hereinbefore mentioned, the following entry was noted in SARAMT'S small address notebook:

"INT'L. PROV...CORP. (illegible)
90 Gold St.
HELEN"

In connection with another investigation it was ascertained that the International Projector Corporation, 88-96 Gold Street, New York City was formerly at that address and is now located at 55 La France Avenue, Bloomfield, New Jersey, telephone number Bloomfield 2-8052.

#### IV. INVESTIGATION TO LOCATE EDITH WINTER

Mrs. JOSEPHINE ANTINORI, daughter of the superintendent, 170 Thompson Street, New York City edvised the writer on February 16, 1953 that EDITE WINTER had resided with ANN BZIK, apartment 10, for approximately three years. She moved to some unknown address during January, 1953. ANN BZIK has resided here for approximately ten years, according to Mrs. ANTINORI and after EDITH WINTER left ANN'S cousin, JOSEPHINE SPONGIN, moved in with her.

Confidential Informant T-9, of unknown reliability, advised on February 20, 1953 that EDITH WINTER is now residing in Brooklyn, New York.

Confidential Informant T-8, of known reliability, advised on March 26, 1953 that EDITH WINTER and ANN BZIK filed a change of address on February 2, 1953 to 69 South Second Street, Brooklyn, New York.

Inquiry was made at the Cooper Union for Advancement of Arts and Sciences, New York City on February 20, 1953 by the writer in an attempt to develop EDITH WINTER'S current employment and residence. The registrar's records reveal that EDITH WINTER of 9012 Second Avenue, North Bergen, New Jersey, attended the Cooper Union Art School, Evening Division, from September, 1944 to June, 1948, at which time she graduated having majored in Industrial Design. She was born September 12, 1923, Weehawken, New Jersey and she graduated from Union Hill High School, Union City, New Jersey in January, 1940. Her current address and employment were not recorded.

#### V. INVESTIGATION RE RETTY MALDO

Confidential Informant T-10, of known reliability, has advised that LOUISE SARANT and/or her parents, Mr. and Mrs. VICTOR K.D. ROSS, were in contact with Miss BETTY MALDO, New York City, telephone number PLaza 7-1145 or DAyton 8-7041.

Confidential Informant T-11, of known reliability, or February 12, 1953 identified the subscribers to FLaza 7-1145 as HAYES Registry, JURAL Jewelry and BILLIE J.-NELSON. The current Manhattan address telephone directory indicates that these subscribers appeared in the Manhattan telephone directory for the first time in the 1953 issue.

Confidential Informant T-11 further advised that the subscriber to DAyton 8-7041 is Mrs. MARGARET TUCKER, 773 Beck Street, Bronx, New York. This number first appeared in the 1953 Manhattan telephone directory.

The indices of the New York Office fail to reflect any identifiable information concorning BETTY WALDO, HAYES Registry, JURAL Jewelry, BILLIE J. NELSON and Mrs. MARGARET TUCKER.

## VI. INVESTIGATION AT ART STUDENTS LEAGUE OF NEW YORK

Mrs. JACK YOGMAN, nee ASTHER HAYDEN, 205 West 103d Street, New York City (temporary address), advised the writer on December 10, 1952 that she recalled that ALFRED SARANT allegedly was a student at the Art Students League of New York.

On January 29, 1953 the records of the Art Students League of New York, 215 West 57th Street, were checked by the writer. No record was located for ALFRED SARANT.

#### VII. ADDITIONAL INVESTIGATION TO LOCATE SARANT

Confidential Informants T-12, T-13, T-14 and T-15, all of known reliability, have advised that no mail was received from either ALFRED or LOUISE SARANT by NONDA GEORGE SARANT, ALFRED'S father; ELECTRA SARANT JAYSON, his sister; or by WILLIAM, GEORGE or RICHARD SARANT, brothers of ALFRED SARANT, during the period covered by this report.

It is noted that GEORGE SARANT, brother of ALFRED, was, as of February 11, 1953, in Mexico and would remain there until March, 1953, according to information furnished by Mr. JOSEPH H. GRAY, of Freeport; Long Island, to SA KENNETH R. ROUTON on February 11, 1953. GRAY said that GEORGE SARANT had first gone to Florida.

As was previously reported, information was developed that subject, LOUISE SARANT, might possibly have some connection with the Ithaca Cooperative Day Nursery. Mrs. JOHN CAREW, RD 2, Ithaca, New York, Secretary of the Ithaca Cooperative Nursery, advised that one of subject's children attends this school in the mornings. Mrs. CAREW stated that subject herself is not employed in any capacity by this school.

Motor Vehicle Bureau records on file at the Tompkins County Sheriff's Office reflect that subject has a 1951 Willys panel truck, green in color, registered to her with New York State 1953 commercial registration 588-061.

It will be noted that VICTOR K. D. ROSS owns both a house and adjoining cottage on Taughannock Boulevard. LOUISE SARANT resided in the cottage during the summer of 1952 before moving into the ROSS residence. The residence telephone number is Ithaca 3-1865; the cottage telephone number is Ithaca 3-1665; ROSS's office is located at 114 North Aurora Street, Ithaca, telephone 2650.

#### INTERVIEW WITH LE ROY SMITH

LF ROY SMITH, 121 Cleveland Avenue, Ithaca, New York, advised that he was employed in a temporary capacity as a painter by subject ALFRED SARANT during 1949 and 1950. SMITH admitted that he himself was at one time a Communist Party member, but denied ever knowing LOUISE or ALFRED SARANT to be Communist Party members. SMITH stated that he never considered himself a social acquaintance of the SARANTS, and that he knew nothing concerning their home life or outside activities. SMITH was questioned concerning any known associates or contacts of the subjects and was displayed photographs of JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENPERG, WILLIAM PERL. JOFL RARR and MAX FINESTONE. SMITH stated that he was acquainted with MAX FINESTONE, havin known him before he moved to New York City from Ithaca, but that he never knew him to be a close friend of either subject. SMITH stated that none of the other individuals were known by him. He stated that he met BRUCE DAYTON and his wife during his employment by ALFRED SARANT, but that he could furnish no information concerning these individuals, other than that they were formerly neighbors of the SARANTS on the Cayuga Heights Road.

SMITH stated that he had learned that ALFRED SARANT had left Ithaca, but that he never knew of the circumstances surrounding his leaving, and that he has no knowledge of his present whereabouts.

#### IDENTIFICATION OF PREVIOUS CONTACTS OF LOUISE SARANT

As was previously reported, subject LOUISE SARANT was in Syracuse, New York, in August of 1951, and was in contact with Syracuse

telephones 3-9950, 3-9238 and 75-6920. It was also ascertained that Mrs. DORA POWERS, Syracuse University, was a possible contact of the subject.

Syracuse telephone number 75-6920 was listed to BENJAMIN L. ESKRIDGE, a salesman at 735 Ostrom Avenue, in August, 1951. In May, 1952, this number was transferred to HELEN P. WAND, 735 Ostrom Avenue.

It was also previously developed that subject was in contact with Liverpool telephone 69-7817. According to Confidential Informant T-2, this phone, in March, 1952, was listed to CIARENCE L. WOOD, Hiawatha and Elmcrest Streets. On October 8, 1952, this number was taken over by C. H. REIMMEN, of Rhinecliff Avenue, Liverpool, who presently has this number.

Miss BARBONI, Business Office, Syracuse University, advised that DORA K. POWERS is presently a secretary and clerk in the School of Arts, Syracuse University. 





The following investigation pertains to CARL HARRISON GOLDEN, former employee of ALFRED SARANT and friend of MAX FINESTONE, who is currently employed Mitchel Air Force Base, Hempstead, Long Island, and resides at Levittown,

CARL HARRISON GOLDEN

8/2/50, Confidential Informant

On 6/26/51, SAS ROBERT L. STEVENSON and WILLIAM A. FLINN, JR:, of the New York Office, interviewed SEYMOUR HOROWITZ, 64 Woodland Street, Mount Kisco, New York. He said that he had been employed as a housepainter with DON BENNETT and CARL GOLDEN during August 1950 in Ithaca. New York.

Confidential Informant Mreliability, Jadvised SA FETER F. MAXSON. no date reflected, that CARL GOLDEN, a chose friend of MAX FINESTONE, was employed by ALFRED SARANT, and that it was his recollection that FINESTONE accompanied GOLDEN to New York City over Labor Day in 1949 for the purpose of attending a convention of some labor group.

On page 14 of a booklet entitled \*A Tribute to Congressman Vito Marcantonio" dated Saturday 1/30/49, Saint Nichelas Arena, the name of CANL H. GOLDEN appears on a list of the State Executive Committee of the ALP.

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noted that this committee "extends warm greetings to our own NARC-fighting champion of the people, tireless tribute of democracy, America's true voice in Congress."

On March 10, 1953, ERNEST M. RIGGS, owner, Riggs Collection Service, Ithaca, New York, advised PETER F. MAXSON that he had received information through credit sources that CARL H. GOLDEN is presently employed as manager of the "Post Exchange" at Mitchel Field, Long Island.

On March 31, 1953, CARL HARRISON GOLDEN, Manager of the Restaurant Concession of the NCO Mess, Mitchel Air Force Base, Hempstead, Long Island, and who resides at 30 Silver Land, Levittown, Long Island with his second wife and a step-son, PETER SMITH, was interviewed by SAS RICHARD A. MINIHAN and ROBERT F. ROYAL. GOLDEN advised that he left Ithaca, New York during the fall of 1950 and moved to Long Island, New York after having lived and worked in the Ithaca, New York area from 1940 to the fall of 1950.

GOLDEN advised that he first met ALFRED SARANT through the ALP of Tompkins County in approximately 1948. He recalled that SARANT sang and played his guitar at two ALP meetings. Further, he was employed by SARANT for several months as a housepainter during 1950 and concluded this employment approximately two weeks after SARANT left Ithaca (7/26/50). He recalled that "PUSS" (Mrs. ALFRED SARANT) paid him two weeks wages after her husband left Ithaca and still owes him house after ALFRED SARANT invited him and his son for dinner at her house after ALFRED SARANT left Ithaca. He accepted this invitation and recalls that BRUCE DAYTON dropped over to her house after dinner. He explained that he had known DAYTON through the ALP and the Central Labor Council in Ithaca. GOLDEN stated that he does not know the whereabouts of ALFRED SARANT and has had no additional contact with LOUISE SARANT since the hereinbefore mentioned dinner engagement.

Concerning other visits to the SARANT residence in Ithaca, he advised that he had repaired their roofin an occasion, time unrecalled. He did not recall ever seeing EDWARD JAMES WEINSTEIN and/or his automobile at the SARANT residence, although he knew WEINSTEIN through the ALP and had seen his automobile on occasions. He believed that WEINSTEIN was acquainted with ALFRED SARANT. Photographs of JULIUS ROSENBERG and WILLIAM PERL, among others were exhibited to GOLDEN. He was unable to identify these individuals as anyone he personally knew or had seen with or at the SARANT'S residence.

GOLDEN advised that he has not seen ALFRED SARANT since he left Ithaca, nor does he know the whereabouts of ALFRED SARANT. He advised that he was unable to furnish any additional information concerning this matter.

Concerning MAX FINESTONE, he advised that he had met him through the ALP in Ithaca in approximately 1948. He also de acquainted with FINESTONE's mother and step-father, ANNA and HUGH CHAFFIN, also through the ALF. From approximately 1948 on he has been in contact with FINESTONE and recalls running into him last Christmas at a bus station in New York City. He did not recall attending a convention of some labor group in New York City over Labor Day in 1949, nor having accompanied FINESTONE to New York City at that time.

GOLDEN said that he had also known JOHN MARQUSEE, a former student at Cornell University and who lives in the New York City area, through the ALP. He was of the opinion that MARQUSEE knows ALFRED SARANT.

Concerning himself, he advised that he was Chairman, Executive Committee of the ALP of Tompkins County during 1950. There were approximately 35 - 37 members in this group. He said he knew of no influence by the CP, USA on his group. He further advised that he was interested in the Progressive Party during 1948 and had formerly been president of Ithaca's Bartenders Union, Local 691, AFL. He said that he is not now nor was he ever a member of the CP, USA or any of its fronts. No one has ever attempted to recruit him into the CP and further he has no information concerning CP members or Communist matters.

In this connection it is interesting to note that an undated letter addressed to "Dear DAVE, LIL SASCHA" from "CARL, MILLIE, PETE PEPPER, 66 Trenton Avenue, East Atlantic Beach, New York" was obtained by SA WALTER C. JOHNSON on 6/7/51 in a search of the apartment recently vacated by DAVID W. BROWNSTONE, 310 College Avenue, Ithaca, New York, self-admitted Communist leader in Ithaca. This letter states:

"We did receive your letter but I am probably the world's worst correspondent.

"Congratulations on the expected event.

"We will send you the dough we owe you sometime during the month of May. The reason for the delay is that we are moving and we spent our accumulated bankroll for furniture.

N.Y. "Our address after May 1 will be 30 Silver Lane, Levittown, L.I.,

"We looked forward to having you come over for dinner around Christmas. JOHNNIE promised faithfully that he would pick you up and come over: Needless to say that was the Last we saw of JOHN.

"MAX hasn't been over since he moved but I talked to him on the phone a couple of weeks ago.

It is believed that "MAX" and "JOHN or JOHNNIE" referred to in this undated Letter from CARL GOLDEN to DAVE BROWNSTONE refers to MAX FINESTONE and JOHN MARQUSEE.

It should also be noted that BROWNSTONE, subject of SM-C investigation, Bufile 100-366463, NY 100-98798, moved to New York City during 1951 and his whereabouts are unknown. Apparently he has gone underground.

The Albany Office advised New York by letter dated 10/6/50 under the CARL H. GOLDEN, SM- Cocaption that the above captioned individual is by trade a bartender and has been employed in that capacity in various Ithaca, N.Y. establishments during the past few years. However, he had had the reputation of being a Communist and has not been able to keep any steady job due to this fact. Information has been received that GOLDEN, with his wife, moved from Ithaca, N.Y. approximately two weeks ago. Up until 10/1/50 they were to be located at 66 Trenton Street, long Beach, N.Y. After that date they were to take up permanent residence at 101 Minnesota Avenue, Long Beach, N.Y.

Albany advised that although GOLDEN has never been identified as a Communist Party member by informants of their office, Corporal DONALD MC GRANAGHAN, BCI, New York State Police, assigned to investigations of a security nature, has reported that he definitely regards GOLDEN as a member of the Communist Party

A news item from the Ithaca "Journal" dated 3/1/50 carried the following below a photograph "Members of the Former Labor Committee to aid the families of striking coal miners are shown here loading supplies of food and clothing gathered in Ithaca." GOLDEN is identified as one of those in this photograph. It was noted that the aid to striking coal miners was part of the CP line at the time the photograph was taken.

"Union News"; Volume 2, for February 1950. "Union News" is the official organ of Ithaca Bartenders' Union Local 691. A.F. of L. A news item in this paper names GOLDEN retiring president of the Local.

A letter to the Editor of the Itnaca Journal, published in the paper for 6/28/50 under the heading "ALP Comment on Steinharts", was signed "CARL H. GOLDEN, Chairman, Executive Committee of the American Labor Party Tompkins County." The letter was in the usual vein, claiming in the first paragraph that the war mongers are driving us to Fascism at an alarming rate. It continued, in paragraphs 3 and 4:

"Fridays Ithaca Journal carried the story of two Ithacans who seem to have been singled out as victims of the hysteria created by those who conspire to build up enough hatred to drive us into war with Russia. Mr. and Mrs. STEINHART seem to be excellent choices for persecution by the war machine, since they have consistently led in the struggle for housing, civil rights and peace.

"The fact that the livelihood of Mr. and Mrs. STEINHART, CARLA and the unborn child depend upon Mr. STEINHART's opportunity to hold a job, seems to mean nothing to Mr. McCARTHY's Committee, and acting president CORNELIS W. de KIEWIET of Cornell University who states: 'The allegations come at a time when the university is reviewing Mr. STEINHART's status as a member of the staff.'

The administration holds to its affirmed policy that there is no place for a known Communist on its staff."

The person referred to by GOLDEN in this letter is VICTOR
STEINHART, former Physics Librarian at Cornell University, who is named as a
former CP member in the Pittsburgh area by MATT CVETIC, former Bureau informant,
in testimony before the House Committee on Un-American Activities and as a
CP member in Ithaca by

advised SA PETER F. MAXSON that CARL COLDEN's parents recently wrote to him at 106 Bedford Street, New York, New York. Informant's stated that he believed that this address is GOLDEN's current residence address.

#### Interview with CHESTER ROISTACHER

#### At Lumberville, Pa.

#### Smithville Farm

CHESTER ROTSTACHER advised SA THOMAS P. SCOLLARD on May 26, 1953, that he was a social acquaintance of ALFRED and LOUISE SARANT during the period from 1945 to 1949 when he attended Cornell University. ROTSTACHER said he last saw ALFRED SARANT about February 1949 at Ithaca, N. Y., and last saw LCUTSE SARANT about January 1951. ROTSTACHER said he had no knowledge that the SARANTs were connected with the Communist Party or engaged in subversive activities. ROTSTACHER said he could not recall any associates of the SARANTs whom he had any reason to believe were engaged in subversive activities.

ROJSTACHER stated he was introduced to LOUISE SARANT, then not married, by BFTTY SANDERS in January 1945 at a New York City nightclub, just prior to his entering Cornell University. ROTSTACHER said LOUISE informed him she lived in Ithaca, N. Y., and encouraged him to visit her home. Ahrough visits to the home of LOUTSE, he became acquainted with ALFRED SARANT. Shortly thereafter, LCUTSE and ALFRED were married and lived with her parents. ROTSTACPER said he knew very little of ALFRED SARANT's background other than that he came from Greenwich Village. He did not know SARANT to hold any regular job from 1945 to 1949, but understood ALFRED was taking courses at Cornell University and doing some work on a new building for the university. ROTSTACHER said that ALFRED spent most of his time working on blueprints of a new house he was building himself. RO'STACHER said that through his frequent visits to the SARANT house during this period, he noticed that during 1949 the SARANTs appeared to be having marital difficulties, but they gave him no indication as to the cause of this trouble.

ROISTACHER said he left Ithaca, N. Y., in 1949 and did not return to the East until January 1951. He said that during this period he wrote several cards to the SARANTS, but never received acknowledgement from them. Upon returning to Ithaca in Jahuary 1951, ROISTACHER said he visited the SARANT home. He recalled that at this time LOUTSE was in a very high emotional state, and he could learn from her only that ALFRED had disappeared suddenly and his whereabouts was unknown. ROISTACHER said he has the recollection that some mention was made of ALFRED leaving with the wife of a neighbor, but due to the emotional state of LOUTSE, he did not inquire into the details of this situation. ROTSTACHER said that since January 1951,

he has had no contact with LOUISE SARANT, and has heard nothing concerning the whereabouts of ALFRED SARANT.

ROTSTACHER advised that while attending high school in New York City in 1934, he was enrolled as a member of the International Workers Order through his father, who was also a member of this organization. He stated that his father and a brother were killed in an automobile accident and are buried in an International Workers Order burial plot.

The International Workers Order has been cited by the Attorney General of the United States as coming within the purview of Executive Order 9235.

ROTSTACHER said he grew up under the influence of "progressive ideas" from his father and neighborhood friends. ROTSTACHER said he did not know that his father or any of his friends were members of the Communist Party, but they did participate in parades and other demonstrations sponsored by the International Workers Order. ROTSTACHER said he did not continue his membership in the International Workers Order and has no sympathy with this organization or any other Communist-influenced organization.

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FRANCINE APRIL, who presently resides at 410 Dryden Road, was interviewed on June 4, 1953. During the course of this interview, Miss APRIL admitted having been a former member of the Communist Party in New York City. She stated that several years ago she was introduced to LOUISE ROSS by her parents, Mr. and Mrs. VICTOR K. DIAROSS. She stated that in the mid-1940's, LOUISE ROSS moved to New York City, where she married ALFRED SARANT. While residing in New York City, Miss APRIL stated that she visited the SARANT apartment at 65 Morton Street on possibly two occasions. She stated that during these visits no individuals were present other than ALFRED and LOUISE SARANT. She states she definitely did not like ALFRED SARANT, and because of this fact did not carry on a friendship with the SARANTS. Miss APRIL stated she never was acquainted with JULIUS or ETHEL ROSENBERG, WILLIAM PERL, JOEL BARR, or WELDON BRUCE DAYTON.

Miss APRIL stated that she did not know IOUISE or ALFRED SARANT as Communist Party members, and that she never suspected them of any subversive or espionage activities. She stated that ALFRED SARANT was undoubtedly a bad influence on his wife, and that at the present time, in recent conversations with IOUISE SARANT, she gained the definite impression that she holds no one responsible for her present difficulties other than her husband. Miss APRIL stated that she herself moved to Ithaca about two years ago and since that time she has had occasional contacts with IOUISE. She stated she is of the definite opinion that IOUISE has absolutely no knowledge of ALFRED SARANT's present whereabouts.

The following entry was contained in the SARANT address books:

"MARY, Home -- 3-2437; Office -- 9527"

ALFRED SARANT has advised that he could not recall this individual. Mrs. SARANT identified this person as an assistant or office girl to Dr. MILTON SIMON, a dentist in Ithaca, New York.

As has been previously reported, investigation indicated that this individual is undoubtedly identical with MARY CARSIDE. Dr. SIMON stated that MARY GARSIDE was the only girl ever employed by him named MARY. He advised that she is now married to PAUL JONES and resides at 224 Cliff Street, Ithaca, New York.

Mrs. MARY JONES was interviewed on June 9, 1953, at which time she advised that she met LOUISE ROSS as a patient when she was employed by Dr. SIMON. Mrs. JONES stated she went to lunch with LOUISE on two occasions and she recalled that she appeared to be a very lonely type of individual. Mrs. JONES stated she worked for Dr. SIMON in 1945 and 1946, and that she has not seen or heard from LOUISE ROSS since that time. She stated her acquaintance with LOUISE ROSS was very casual and she never knew her well at all, and she never met her husband, ALFRED SARANT.


#### WELDON BRUCE DAYTON

On the basis of information received to the effect that DAYTON would be in Ithaca on May 4, 1953, for the purpose of securing a divorce, the Court Calendar for the session of the New York Supreme Court, commencing in Ithaca May 4, 1953, with Judge DANIEL J. MC AVOY presiding, failed to reflect any divorce action listed with DAYTON as plaintiff. On May 7, 1953, Judge MC AVOY advised he had been contacted by Attorney VICTOR K. D. ROSS and that he had made an appointment for ROSS and his client, WELDON BRUCE DAYTON, at 10 a.m. May 8, 1953, in his chambers in Binghamton, New YORK:

Confidential Informant T-1, of known reliability, advised that DAYTON and ROSS arrived in Binghamton at 9:20 a.m. May 8, 1953, and that they were in the Binghamton Court House from 9:50 a.m. to 10:20 a.m. Judge MC AVOY was contacted in Binghamton by SA PATRICK A. MUNIEY. He advised that on May 7, 1953, DAYTON's attorney at Ithaca told him that DAYTON would be in Ithaca for the weekend only and would not be available for appearance in Court on May 11, 1953. He stated this was the reason the hearing was being held on May 8, for the purpose of putting some more information in the record. After the hearing, Judge MC AVOY advised SA MUNIEY that DAYTON said he was employed at the High Altitude Iaboratory at Idaho Springs, Colorado. At the hearing in his chambers, ROSS made arrangements so that he could have a deposition taken from DONALD and RUTH HAINES, Tucson, Arizona, which would show that DAYTON's wife and AIFRED SARANT stayed there as man and wife for a period of time.

Confidential Informant T-2, of known reliability, advised that DAYTON was observed in Ithaca, New York, on the afternoon of May 8 in company with VICTOR K. D. ROSS.

#### DETAILS:

#### I. TRIAL OF WILLIAM PERL

WILLIAM PERL, also known as WILLIAM MUTTER PERL, a contact of ALFRED SARANT, was convicted on two counts of perjary in the United States District Court, Southern District of New York on May 22, 1953. PERL is to be sentenced on June 5, 1953. II. CONTACTS OF LOUISE SARANT AND/OR PARENTS

Confidential Informant T.1, of known reliability, advised that LOUISE SAFANT and/or her parents, Mr. and Mrs. VICTOR K. D. ROSS, of Ithaca, New York, were in contact with the firm of Wolf, Popper, Ross, Wolf and Jones, 160 Broadway, New York City on January 21, 1953.

It is noted that this is the law firm of HENRY H. WOLF, BENEDICT WOLF, MARTIN POPPER, PAUL I. ROSS and PHILIF JONES as reflected in the current Manhattan address telephone directory dated March 27, 1953. Their telephone listing is Worth 4-8541.

Confidential Informant 1-1, mentioned previously, advised that LOUISE SARANT end/or her parents, Mr. and Mrs. VICTOR K. D. ROSE of Ithace, New York were in contact with N. S. F., 40 hast 49th Street, New York City on February 26, 1953. The current Manhattan address telephone directory dated March 27, 1953 lists the National Share Croppers Fund at 40 East 49th Street, New York City, telephone listing Plaza 9-1600.

#### III. INTERVIEW OF CARL HARRISON GOLDEN

On March 31, 1953, CARL HARRISON GOLDEN, Manager of the restaurant concession of the NCO Mess, Mitchel Air Force Base, Hempstead, Long Island, and who resides at 30 Silver Land, Levittown, Long Island with his second wife and a step-son, PETER SMITH, was interviewed by SA RICHARD A. MINIHAN and the writer. GOLDEN advised that he left Ithaca, New York during the fall of 1950 and moved to Long Island, New York after having

lived and worked in the Ithaca, New York area from 1940 to the fall of 1950.

GOLDIN advised that he first met ALFRED SARANT through the American Labor Party of Tompkins County in approximately 19bB. He recalled that SARANT sang and played his guitar at two American Labor Perty meetings. Further, he was employed by SARANT for several months as a housepainter during 1950 and concluded this employment approximately two weeks after SARANT lest Ithaca (July 26, 1950). He recalled that "FUSS" (Mrs. ALFREDASERANT) pail him two weeks wages after her husband left Ithaca and still owes him \$30.00. GolDEN said that "PUSS" SARANT invited him and his son for cinner at her house after ALFRED SARANT left Ithaca. He accepted this invitation and recalls that BRUCE PAYTON dropped over to her house after dinner. He explained that he had known DAYTON through the American Labor Party and the Central Labor Council in Ithaca. GOLDEN stated that he does not know the whoreabouts of ALFRED SARANT and has had no additional contact with LOUISE SARANT since the hereinbefore mentioned dinner engagement.

Concerning other visits to the SARANT residence in Ithaca he acvised that he had revaired their roof on an occasion, time unrecalled. He did not recall ever seeing EDWARD JAMES WEINSTEIN and/or his automobile at the SARANT residence, although he knew WEINSTEIN through the American Labor Party and had seen his automobile on occasions. He believed that WEINSTEIN was acquainted with ALFRED SARANT. Photographs of JULIUS ROSENBERG and WILLIAM PEFL, among others, were exhibited to GOLDEN. He was unable to identify these individuals as anyone he personally knew or had seen with or at the SARANT's residence.

GOLDEN advised that he has not seen ALFRED SARANT since he left Ithaca, nor does he know the whereabouts of ALFRED SARANT. He advised that he was unable to furnish any additional information experming this matter.

Concerning MAX FINESTONE, he advised that he had met him through the American Labor Party in Ithrea in approximately 1948. He also is acquainted with FINESTONE's mother and step-father, ANNA and HUGHESHAFFIN, also through the American

Labor Party. From approximately 1948 on he has been in contact with FINESTONE and recalls running into him last Christmas at a bus station in New York City. He did not recall attending a convention of some labor group in New York City over Labor Day in 1949, nor having accompanied FINESTONE to New York City at that time.

GOLCEN said that he had also known JOHN MARQUSEE, a former student at Cornell University and who lives in the New York City area. through the American Labor Party. He was of the cpinion that MARQUSEE knows ALFRED SAFANT.

Concerning himself, he advised that he was Chairman, Executive Committee of the American Labor Party of Tompkins County during 1950. There were approximately 35 to 37 members in this group. He said he knew of no influence by the Communist Party, U. S. A. on his group. He further advised that he was interested in the Progressive Party during 1948 and had formerly been president of Ithera's Bartenders Union, Local 691, AFL. He said that he is not now nor was he ever a member of the Communist Party, U. S. A. or any of its fronts. No one has ever attempted to recruit him into the Communist Party and further he has no information concerning Communist Party members or Communist matters.

In this connection it is interesting to note an undated letter addressed to "Dear DAVE, LIL SASCHA" from "CARL, MILLIE, PETE, PEPPER, 66 Trenton Avenue, East Atlantic Beach, New York" was obtained by Confidential Informant T-2 from the apartment of DAVID M. BROWNSTONE, 310 College Avenue, Ithaca, New York, self-admitted Communist leader in Ithaca, subsequent to the vacation of this apartment. This letter states:

"We did receive your letter but I am probably the world's worst correspondent.

<sup>&</sup>quot;Congratulations on the expected event.

<sup>&</sup>quot;We will send you the dough we owe you sometime during the month of May. The reason for the delay is that we are moving and we spent our accumulated bankroll for furniture.

"Our address after May 1 will be 30 Silver Lane, Levittown, L. 1., N. Y.

"We looked forward to having you come over for dinner around Christmas. JOHNNIE promised faithfully that he would pick you up and come over. Needless to say that was the last we say of JOHN.

"MAX hasn't been over since he moved but I talked to him on the phone a ccuple of weeks ago.

"I must apologize for this letter but it's too damned early in the morning for me to think clearly. (9 AM)

"We will, no doubt, both be too busy, when you come down on the first of May, but we are looking forward to seeing you when you get back in town. I will send our phone number as soon as we get one installed.

"Please rest assured that you will have at least \$75 to help defray expenses when KARL JOSEPH FREDERICK is born.

"Love

"CARL, MILLIE, PETE & PEPPER"

It is pointed out that "MAX" and "JOHN" or "JOHNNIE" referred to in this undated letter from CARL GOLDEN to DAVE BROWNSTONE refers to MAX FINESTONE and JOHN MARQUSEE.

#### IIV. ADDITIONAL INVESTIGATION TO LOCATE SARANT

Confidential Informants T-3, T-4, T-5, and T-6, all of known reliability, have advised that no mail was received from either ALFRED or LOUISE SARANT by NONDA GEORGE SARANT, ALFRED'S father; ELECTAN SARANT LAYSON, his sistem; or by WILLIAM, GEORGE or RICHARD STRANT, brothers of ALFRED SARANT during the period covered by this report.

On April 20; 1953 Mrs. ETTA SARANT, the wife of GEORGE SARANT, brother of ALFREC, who resides in Inseport, Long Island, was interviewed by SA LEO H. FRUTKIN. She said that

neither she nor GOERGE nor any member of the family has heard from ALFRED SARANT. They do not know where he is. She said that LOUISE SARANT has divorced ALFRED, and that she and her husband saw LOUISE during approximately the winter of 1951 when they were visiting in Florida. She was then living on Le Jeune Road, Coral Gables, Florida. She stated that LOUISE advised that she has not heard from ALFRED. Mrs. ETTA SARANT stated that they had not heard from LOUISE since that time. She edvised the reason they visited her in 1951 was that as long as they were in Florida they decided to look her up and see how she was getting along.



In connection with another investigation conducted by the New York Office, it was ascertained that the International Projector Corp., which is presently located at 55 LaFrance Ave., Bloomfield, N.J., was previously located at 83-96 Gold St., New York City, F.Y.

Projector Corp., has advised that he was in charge of security for the corporation during World War II. Mr. WURDAR stated that during the period 1943 to 1946 the company had a Government contract to make parts for the Norden bombsight which was classified as confidential. He further advied that in the latter part of 1945 he recalls that the corporation also did some work on a Government contract calling for the manufacture of batteries for submarines. stared it was his recollection that this contract was also classified as confidential. He stated that with theexception of the above two contracts, the company was engaged in non-classified commercial work involving the manufacture of instruments during the period 1943-1940.

With regard to the identification of a person having the name Halan who might possibly have been employed by the corporation during the period from 1943 to 1946, Mr. Workfulk stated that at that time the company employed approximately 1200 persons and in order to determine the identity of the person having the name ILLaW it would be necessary to review payroll records and personnal records covering that period.

A review of the payroll records of the company for the years 1943 to 1946 reflects there were 71 persons having the first initial H. who were employed by the company durin that period. In order to determine if any of these persons had the first name of Halak, Mr. WORFOLK advised it would be neces any to review company HK 65-4088

personnel records for the period and he noted that at the present time these records are in storage.





LINDEN, is the sister of ALICE WARD and LEONA GOULDING.

It is noted that the whereabouts and employment of NED SPARKS have been unknown since June, 1951. No information has been received to indicate that SPARKS has been removed from the national level of the Communist Party: Informants feel that he is possibly a prominent leader in the Communist Party underground. No information concerning the whereabouts and employment of ALICE WARD has been developed since the fall of 1951.

Two copies of SA ROEMER'S report were sent to Albany. Background investigation concerning Mrs. GOULDING is also set forth in SA ROEMER'S report.

The indices of the New York Office fail to reflect an additional identifiable references to PHYLLIS GOLD and Mrs. LEONA GOULDING.






