

A review of the instant file failed to reflect that a security index card has been prepared, and it would appear that PETERS, a Communist concerning whom the Arm-Navy-Air Force Personnel Security Board has suspended a grant of consent previously issued for PETERS to have access to secret matter, and has denied consent for the subject's access to all classified matter, should receive consideration for additional investigation.



The information contained in referenced latter has been discussed in detail on several occasions with Chief Assistant United States Attorney, MINES J. LANE, Southern District of New York. He has stated in substance that he relieves the denials of acquaintance or association by both FRL and the SIDURGUYICHES before the Grand Jury can be proven at this time material to the espionage investigation.

In this connection it is to be noted, that to date, VIVIAN GLASSMAN has refused to testify before the Grand Jury concerning information previously given by her to Agents of the New York Office during her interview on August 3, 1950. While it has been considered that PERL has admitted to Bureau Agents and before the Grand Jury details concerning GLATEMAN'S visit to his which are substantially the same as GLATEMAN'S proposed testimony, it. LANK is of the opinion that it would be given at trial by GLATEMAN herself. Regotistions are currently underway between Mr. LANK and the attorneys for FERL and GLATEMAN in Hem tork City in an effort to obtain this testimony.

For information consideration is given by Fr. LANE and the Department to joining the ROSENEEDS, DAVID GREENGLASS and MONTON SCHELL as defendants in a superseding indictment in the Southern District of New York, which indictment will charge Conspiracy to Counit Espionage. However, it is not contemplated at present that PERL or the SIDERCYICHES or ALPERD APART will be included in this indictment.

Er. LANT has also suggested that proceeding against PFRL and the SILOROVICHES for perjury prior to the disposition of the ROSELERA, GRENOLASS, and SOBELL cases under the Conspiracy to Correct Espionage Statute might weaken the latter by a gremature disclosure of certain evidence necessary to show the actionage ramification in the perjury trial. Accordingly, Er. LANT has said that he is not at this time roady to make a final decision on the point of the evidence necessary to show the materiality of the alleged perjury of PEL and the SINFOVICHES and consequently on the question of proceeding against these subjects and the rejury Statute.



SCHILLER stated that GLEENAN was attending a New York City college at the time, believed to be Cooper Union College.

SCHILLER stated that he knew very little about GLEEKKAN, knowing nothing about his beliefs, affiliations or associates. SCHILER further tated that he has not seen GLEEKMAN since that time, and that he has communicated with him on but few occasions. SCHILLER advised that he toes not know ALFRED E. SARANT.

It will be noted that the above mentioned report of SA REINHART eflects that the name ANNETTE, 2024 Benedict Avenue, Bronx, New York, ippeared in the correspondence found in the deak drawer of LEWIS GLEEKHAN,

ANNETTE DAVIS, 508 East 11th Street, New York City, advised that she met LEMIS and HELEN GLEEKMAN through her husband, HERMAN JOSEPH ZIKOFSKI at Iowa City, Iowa, where both LEMIS GLEEKMAN and HERMAN ZIKOFSKI were attending the University of Iowa. This meeting took place in about the fall of 1946. Shortly thereafter she and her husband rented the first floor we a home located on RFD \$1, Coralville, Iowa, a suburb of Iowa City. In order to defray the expense, GLEEKMANS moved in with them in late 1946 or early 1947, and shared a living room, kitchen and bath. This arrangement continued for a period of about 6 or 7 months, at which time the GLEEKMANS to obtained a house on the campus and the ZIKOFSKIS an apartment in Iowa City near the school. She said that there friendship with the GLEEKMANS continued until January, 1949, when she, ANNETTE DAVIS, separated from her husband. She stated that she does not know if HEIEN and IFWIS GLEENAN were ever members of the Communist Party, having never seen them at any Communist Party meetings, having never seen them in possession of a Communist Party card, nor having ever heard them say that they were members of the Communist Party. She stated, however, that the GLEENANS were active in clubs on the Campus at Iowa City, considered to be "left wing" such as the Civil Liberties Club and the Progressive Party. She advised that during the time the GLEENANS shared living quarters with them, she received the "Daily Worker" and that she is certain both of the GLEENANS read this paper. " (b) 7 C

ANNETTE DAVIS further stated that she does not recall the names of any of the associates of the GLEFMANS and that she never heard them mention the name ALFRED SARANT.

Concerning the possibility that a lead be set out to interview HERMAN JOSEPH ZYKOFSKY concerning any possible knowledge he might have of the subject of instant case, ANNETTE DAVIS advised that she does not know his address; however, it is her belief that he is presently in Chicage, Illinois. She said that his address could possibly be ascertained through a brother, MICHAKL ZYKOFSKY, who resides on Unicoport Road, Parkchester, Bronx, New York.
