In connection with the authorized search of the residence of ALFRED SARANT at Ithaca, New York, by Bureau Agents on July 19, 1950, there was located, among other items, a small address book. This address book contained the names and addresses and telephone numbers of individuals and concerns, and among those appears the name of "TONY PETERS, 2150 Tremont Avenue, TA 9-8193, MU 5-7134".

It is to be noted that this individual is identical with the ANTHONY PETERS in instant file.

Confidential New York Source 2 has advised that the number MU 5-7134 was discontinued in January of 1950. The Informant stated that this number was formerly listed to JACK JENKINS, 188 Lexington Avenue, New York City. (S)(X)

The indices of the New York Office have not been checked for the name of JACK JENKINS.

Further, it is to be noted that ALFRED SARANT is believed to be a member of the JULIUS ROSENBERG espionage parallel.

A review of the instant file failed to reflect that a security index card has been prepared, and it would appear that PETERS, a Communist concerning whom the Arm-Navy-Air Force Personnel Security Board has suspended a grant of consent previously issued for PETERS to have access to secret matter, and has denied consent for the subject's access to all classified matter, should receive consideration for additional investigation.

It is to be noted that ALFRED SARANT is believed to be a member of the JULIUS ROSENBERG espionage parallel, and he is the subject of the case entitled, "ALFRED SARANT, was. ESPIONAGE - R", Albany origin.

Reference is made to Newark letter to New York dated October 25, 1948, entitled, "BEATRICE SHOR, was. SECURITY MATTER - C", wherein the contents of an address book for BEATRICE SHOR was furnished to the New York Office as an enclosure. A review of this address book failed to reflect the name of ALFRED SARANT, however, it did reflect the name of JOEL BARR, 241 West 97th Street, New York, New York, telephone number MO 2-5602, and SAM MUTTERPERL, 936 Tiffany Street, Bronx, New York.

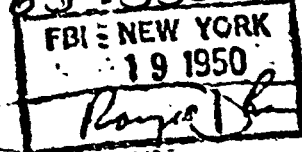

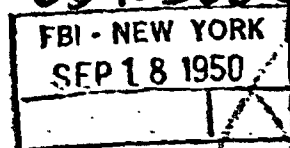

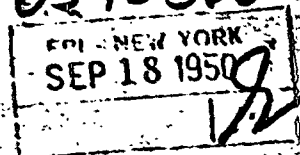

Re Cleveland letter 9/15/50 which reviewed evidence at hand in this and related espionage investigations as it pertains to possible perjury proceedings against PERL and the SIDOROVICHES.

The information contained in referenced letter has been discussed in detail on several occasions with Chief Assistant United States Attorney, MYLES J. LANE, Southern District of New York. He has stated in substance that he believes the denials of acquaintance or association by both PERL and the SIDOROVICHES before the Grand Jury can be proven at this time material to the espionage investigation.

In this connection it is to be noted, that to date, VIVIAN GLASSMAN has refused to testify before the Grand Jury concerning information previously given by her to Agents of the New York Office during her interview on August 3, 1950. While it has been considered that PERL has admitted to Bureau Agents and before the Grand Jury details concerning GLASSMAN'S visit to him which are substantially the same as GLASSMAN'S proposed testimony, Mr. LANE is of the opinion that it would be more profitable if this testimony should be given at trial by GLASSMAN herself. Negotiations are currently underway between Mr. LANE and the attorneys for PERL and GLASSMAN in New York City in an effort to obtain this testimony.

For information consideration is given by Mr. LANE and the Department to joining the ROSENBERGS, DAVID GREENGLASS and MORTON SOBELL as defendants in a superseding indictment in the Southern District of New York, which indictment will charge Conspiracy to Commit Espionage. However, it is not contemplated at present that PERL or the SIDOROVICHES or ALBERT SARANT will be included in this indictment.

Mr. LANE has also suggested that proceeding against PERL and the SIDOROVICHES for perjury prior to the disposition of the ROSENBERG, GREENGLASS, and SOBELL cases under the Conspiracy to Commit Espionage Statute might weaken the latter by a premature disclosure of certain evidence necessary to show the espionage ramifications in the perjury trial. Accordingly, Mr. LANE has said that he is not at this time ready to make a final decision on the point of the evidence necessary to show the materiality of the alleged perjury of PERL and the SIDOROVICHES and consequently on the question of proceeding against these subjects under the perjury Statute.

Among these transfers was one of \$25. to a FRIED SARI in Hungary from a Miss SALLY LEBOWITZ, Chase National Bank, Park Ave, NYC.

There was no further reference to SALLY LEBOWITZ in the files of the NY Office.

A report of the Credit Bureau of Greater NYC, dated 11/21/46, verified the residence of SALLY LEBOWITZ at 1127 Sheridan Ave, Bronx. It contained the additional information that she was then employed by the State Insurance Fund, 625 Madison Ave.

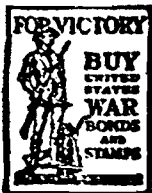

DAVID said that later on he asked JULIUS how the wife was and JULIUS told him that she was then O.K.

It is noted in this connection that LOUISE SARANT gave birth to her second son, STEPHEN MORDA, on 6/15/48, and that SARANT was during this period collecting sufficient funds to build his Ithaca home.

Although it is not known to whom ROSENBERG gave the sum of money, it is believed that consideration can be given to the possibility that this money could have gone to SARANT.

Triangle 5 - 6371 is listed in the name of Edward Purvis & Son, York and Jay Streets, Brooklyn, N. Y.

It was noted from the Brooklyn Telephone Directory that the number Triangle - 5 - 5371 is listed in the name of Polytechnic Institute of Brooklyn, Microwave Research Institute, 55 Johnson St.

SA Ray Mullins, Section 11, advised that a Dr. Ernst Weber is Head of the Electrical Engineering Division of the Institute and Director of the Microwave Research Institute. Weber is not known to be teaching but is believed to devote his entire time to the Research Institute. Two years ago, Mullins stated, the address of Weber was 159 Lorraine Ave., Mount Vernon, N. Y. and his telephone was Mount Vernon 8 - 7541. The Westchester Telephone Directory currently lists Dr. E. Weber at that same address with the same telephone number.

Agent Mullins stated that he has never had occasion to contact Weber at the Institute and recalls that he was told that Weber is one of the individuals at the Institute that should not be contacted. Mullins believes that the files of the New York Office should reflect information that would indicate the reason why Weber should not be contacted.

The telephone indices of the New York Office shows the listing of Murray Hill - 2 - 7551 in the name of Protestant Digest. The telephone directory does not list this subscriber in the current issue.

There is no record in the Indices of the New York Office in the name of Augusta Arkus.

The files of the New York Office contain several references in the name of Protestant Digest. The files reflect a number of contacts made by the management staff of the Protestant (a publication by the same organization as the Protestant Digest) with officials of the Communist Party and known Communist sympathizers. Information furnished by Confidential Informant [redacted] whose identity is known to the Bureau furnished the following information concerning this organization - (b)(7)(D)

Informant advised on September 22, 1942 that from its inception three years ago, "The Protestant" has been evidently a Communist front due to the character of its leading contributors, the systematic trend of its articles, the promotion of the publication by known Communists, Fellow Travelers and Communist front organizations and the systematic sponsorship by the magazine and its editor, Kenneth Leslie, of Communist promoted causes.



Confidential Informant [redacted] whose identity is known to the Bureau, advised on October 27, 1942 that Kenneth Leslie, editor of "The Protestant" has consistently followed the Communist Party line for several years and has acted as spokesman for the religious front of the Communist Party. (b)(7)(D)

Confidential Informant [redacted] whose identity is known to the Bureau, advised on April 15, 1943 that Harold Prosser was employed by "The Protestant". It is noted that Harold Prosser is a well known [redacted]. (b)(7)(D) (b)(7)(C)

Clippings from the Daily Worker appear in the file which show high regard for Kenneth Leslie, Editor of "The Protestant" and for the subjects of the articles which he has written.

It will be noted that the name EDGAR S. SCHILLER, 827 Lafayette Avenue, Brooklyn, New York, appeared in the correspondence found in the desk drawer of LEWIS GLEEKMAN. This information was set out in the report of SA JAMES L. REINHART, dated September 8, 1950 at Baltimore, Maryland.

EDGAR J. SCHILLER, 827 Lafayette Avenue, Brooklyn, New York advised that he was acquainted with LEWIS GLEEKMAN prior to World War II when GLEEKMAN and he were residing at the same Young Men's Hebrew Association at an address on the lower East side of New York City, which at the present time he is unable to recall. SCHILLER stated that GLEEKMAN was attending a New York City college at the time, believed to be Cooper Union College.

SCHILLER stated that he knew very little about GLEEKMAN, knowing nothing about his beliefs, affiliations or associates. SCHILLER further stated that he has not seen GLEEKMAN since that time, and that he has communicated with him on but few occasions. SCHILLER advised that he does not know ALFRED E. SARANT.

It will be noted that the above mentioned report of SA REINHART reflects that the name ANNETTE, 2024 Benedict Avenue, Bronx, New York, appeared in the correspondence found in the desk drawer of LEWIS GLEEKMAN.

[redacted] to the address 2024 Benedict Avenue, Bronx, advised that the only ANNETTE at that address that he could recall was an ANNETTE DAVIS whose married name is ANNETTE ZYKOFSKI. [redacted] further advised that this individual presently resides at 508 East 11th Street, New York City, and is employed as a technician at Bellevue Hospital, 26th Street and First Avenue, New York City. (In the event this information furnished by [redacted] is incorporated in a report, his identity should be properly concealed).

ANNETTE DAVIS, 508 East 11th Street, New York City, advised that she met LEWIS and HELEN GLEEKMAN through her husband, HERMAN JOSEPH ZYKOPSKI at Iowa City, Iowa, where both LEWIS GLEEKMAN and HERMAN ZYKOPSKI were attending the University of Iowa. This meeting took place in about the fall of 1946. Shortly thereafter she and her husband rented the first floor of a home located on RFD #1, Coralville, Iowa, a suburb of Iowa City. In order to defray the expense, GLEEKMANS moved in with them in late 1946 or early 1947, and shared a living room, kitchen and bath. This arrangement continued for a period of about 6 or 7 months, at which time the GLEEKMANS obtained a house on the campus and the ZYKOPSKIS an apartment in Iowa City near the school. She said that their friendship with the GLEEKMANS continued until January, 1949, when she, ANNETTE DAVIS, separated from her husband. She stated she left Iowa City in March, 1949 and her only contact since then with the GLEEKMANS has been when she wrote them a letter on one occasion.

ANNETTE DAVIS advised that she and her husband, HERMAN ZYKOPSKI, joined the [redacted] Party at Iowa City in the latter part of 1946 and that they took active part in the Party until they separated, in January, 1949. She stated that she does not know if HELEN and LEWIS GLEEKMAN were ever members of the Communist Party, having never seen them at any Communist Party meetings, having never seen them in possession of a Communist Party card, nor having ever heard them say that they were members of the Communist Party. She stated, however, that the GLEEKMANS were active in clubs on the Campus at Iowa City, considered to be "left wing" such as the Civil Liberties Club and the Progressive Party. She advised that during the time the GLEEKMANS shared living quarters with them, she received the "Daily Worker" and that she is certain both of the GLEEKMANS read this paper. (b7)(c)

ANNETTE DAVIS further stated that she does not recall the names of any of the associates of the GLEEKMANS and that she never heard them mention the name ALFRED SARANT.

Concerning the possibility that a lead be set out to interview HERMAN JOSEPH ZYKOPSKI concerning any possible knowledge he might have of the subject of instant case, ANNETTE DAVIS advised that she does not know his address; however, it is her belief that he is presently in Chicago, Illinois. She said that his address could possibly be ascertained through a brother, MICHAEL ZYKOPSKI, who resides on Unionport Road, Parkchester, Bronx, New York.

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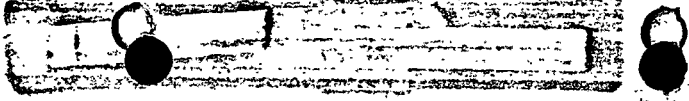
