Yakovlev while in the US was suspected of being an NKVD, MVD and MGB agent. Yakovlev was the Soviet espionage superior who received the atomic energy secrets. He apparently was a member of the Zubilin (not identified) network. On 8/17/50, the Federal Grand Jury, Southern District, New York, returned an indictment charging Yakovlev with conspiracy to violate Section 32, title 50, US code. Yakovlev was a Bureau fugitive and as of 8/7/69, the bench warrant for his apprehension was still outstanding.

The second American-Soviet Friendship Congress, sponsored by the National Council of American-Soviet Friendship, Inc. (100-146964), was held on 11/6-8/43, at Hotel New Yorker, NYC. On 11/7/43, Anatoly Yakovlev, a Soviet engineer and graduate of the University of Moscow, made a speech at the National Panel of this congress. In his speech, Yakovlev figuratively unfurled the banner of Russia against the Nazi horrors and called for the equality of all nations and the brotherhood of man. (SA's)

Yakovlev, former Soviet Vice Consul, NY, was the Soviet principal of the Rosenbergs who were executed for furnishing atomic secrets to the Russians.
