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





ARKADI KRUTCHKOV gave his age as 31 and stated that he is a fur specialist. He stated that he has one child, EUGUENI, age 2. KRUTCHKOV stated that he was born in Libava, USSR. His New York residence was given as 109 West 103rd Street, New York City. He possessed Passport Number 14229/261798, issued at Moscow, Russia, on July 16, 1938, which expired on January 9, 1940. He stated he arrived in the United States at New York City on August 22, 1938, on the SS Queen Mary for a length of stay of nine months. KRUTCHKOV came to the United States for the purpose of placing Russian furs on the American market. He is employed at the Amtorg Trading Corporation, New York City, at \$252.00 per month.

On September 16, 1941, KRUTCHKOV was advised of his change of status to that of a foreign Government official.

Records of the United States State Department, Washington, D. C., reflect that YAKOVLEV arrived in the United States at San Pedro, California on February 4, 1941, listing his destination as the Soviet Consulate in New York City. He assumed his duties as a Clerk at the Soviet Consulate in New York City on February 8, 1941.

On July 26, 1946, YAKOVLEV advised the Immigration and Naturalization Service, New York City, that he was then the Assistant Consul General or Vice Consul at the Soviet Consulate, New York City.

A physical surveillance conducted on December 27, 1946, by SA ROBERT J. WIRTH, reflected that YAKOVLEV and his family left the United States on the SS America on that date.

On August 17, 1950, a Federal Grand Jury in the Southern District of New York returned an indictment charging YAKOVLEV and others with a conspiracy to violate Section 32, Title 50, United States Code, in that they had conspired to furnish information pertaining to the national defense of the United States to a foreign nation, namely the USSR.

VAKOVLEV by Federal District Judge T. HOYT DAVIS of the Southern District of New York. A superseding indictment was returned by a Federal Grand Jury of the Southern District of New York on January 31, 1951, charging YAKOVLEV and others with a conspiracy to commit espionage. He used the name JANES SWITH while living in New York during the time of his arrest.

The unknown individual was later identified by the Philadelphia Field Division as WALTER CARL NEUNSON who resides at that address. The New York files reflect that an IVANI PABLOVICH VERONIN arrived at San Francisco February 6, 1941 from Russia. This man was born at Moscow January 15, 1913 and came to the United States as a technician attached to the GLAVESPROM COMMISSION with the AMTORG TRADING CORPORATION. While in the United States he studied production under contract with RCA-at Camden, New Jersey. He allegedly departed from the United States at Los Angeles on May 16, 1941 on the SS ANNE JOHNSON. The files also reflect that an I. WORONIN, who may be identical with this man, received \$494 from the ALTORG CORPORATION some time between March 1 and September 12, 1941

The New York files further reflect that one ARSENY PETROVICH VORONIN entered the United States January 18, 1945 at Seattle on the SS DVINA and began his duties as a clerk at the SOVIET EMBASSY at Washington, D. C., January 27, 1945. This individual was born February 28, 1912 and between 1940 and 1945 was employed as a worker at an aviation plant in Moscom.



Confidential informants who have furnished reliable information in the past, and who are familiar with certain Communist Party figures and organizations in New York City, advised in October and November 1954 that they are not acquainted with the subject.

LAN ADOMIAN was interviewed on September 29, 1950, by SAS RAYMOND P. WIRTH and JAMES P. LEE, at which time he advised that during the period 1944-46, he had numerous contacts with ANATOLE ANTONOVICH YAKOVLEV, Vice-Consul, Soviet Consulate, New York City.

According to LAN the above contact was initiated when he went to the Soviet Consulate to obtain a visa to visit Russia. LAN ADOMIAN related that he was unsuccessful in obtaining this visa. He further advised that he travelled to Europe in 1938 in order to fight with the Abraham Lincoln Brigade in Spain. He stated that he worked at the Amtorg Trading Corporation as an interpreter for a four month period in late 1939 or early 1940.

The Abraham Lincoln Brigade has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

ADOMIAN testified as a government witness during the March 1951 trial of JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG and MORTON SOBBLL. ADOMIAN identified a photograph of YAKOVLEV as being the man known to him as ANATOLI ANTONOVICH YAKOVLEY, Soviet Vice-Consul of the Soviet Consulate, New York City. In 1950 HARRY GOLD, self-confessed espionage agent identified YAKOVLEV as one of his superiors.

The applicant's Loyalty form, previously described, reflects residence at 145 Second Avenue, New York City during 1941 - 1942, as well as present membership in the organization, the American Veterans Committee.

Concerning the American Veterans Committee, an article in the May 12, 1946 issue of the "New York Times" reflects that at the first convention of the Metropolitan Area Council of the American Veterans Committee, LARRY KNOBEL, Executive Secretary, when accused of being a Communist Party member, refused to affirm or deny the accusation.

The January 15, 1947 issue of the "New York Sun" reflects that the American Veterans Committee does not consider its Communist problem nation wide but that it admitted that the New York Area Chapter (Metropolitan Area Council) was "red ridden."

The above is included here since it is known that ESTHER RAND, in her business activities, uses her maiden name, TREBACH. If the above individual who pontabled the Soviet Consulate is identical with the subject it would appear that in 1944 the subject was employed by the Committee of Jewish Writers and Artists in New York.

It will be recalled from information contained in the writer's report of February 13, 1948, that ESTHER RAND departed from New York by plane for Paris on January 27, 1948, as a member of a delegation of the United Jewish Appeal with which she is employed. On February 19, 1948, an article appeared in the New York "Daily News" reflecting that Arabs had shot at a delegation of the UJA which was touring Palestine. The article stated that 28 American delegates of the UJA, on a tour of inspection of European Jewish Displaced Persons Camps and Palestine, were travelling in Palestine from Tel Aviv to Haifa when Arabs fired on their armored buses. None of the delegates was injured. However, they were reportedly badly shaken by the attack which occurred near Mount Carmel and were indignant concerning the fact that British Airborne Troops searched them for weapons on the suspicion that the first shots had been fired by the delegates. The article then stated that one of the delegates was Mrs. ESTHER T. RAND of New York.

On February 26, 1948, the subject arrived at laGuardia Airport by airplane from Paris. With the aid of Confidential informant T-2 a search was conducted of the subject's brief case without her knowledge and the contents of the case were photographed. The material contained in the brief case appeared to relate solely to her activities as secretary of the UJA delegation. One copy of the photographs of this material is being retained in the New York file and one copy is being forwarded to the Bureau in the event that any portion may become pertinent to this investigation at a later date. The material has been completely reviewed and since it does not appear of importance it is not being set out in detail at this time.
