



Serge STEPANOFF Alexandre STEPANOFF

- 1. A usually reliable source has reported that Serge STEPANOFF. born 8 September 1870 at Saint Petersburg (Russia), is new living in the United States. He is said to hold American passport #94940 issued 18 July 1947 at New YorkCity at which time he claimed that he was employed in New York City as a mechanic. In May 1949 Serge STEPANOFF allegedly passed several days at a pension at Saint-Pierre de Rumilly, Haute Savoie, France, formerly owned by CHTRANGE (or STRANGUE). In Paris (presumably during the same visit to France) he is reported to have been visited frequently at his hotel by a Madame Tamara Wakhrouchev JAKOVLEV, born 31 August 1919 at Nyni-Novgorod (Russia).
- 2. According to the records of this Agency a Michael CHTRANGE was reported to be an agent of the Soviet Military Mission in Paris in 1947. In the same report it was stated that his father, Michel Nikolaevitch CHTRAIGE, ran the Chateau d'Arcine at Saint-Pierre de Rumilly as a pension Tor various Russian friends of the family. Both Michel CHTRANGE and his father were suspected at this time of running a liaison chain for the Soviets between France and Switzerland. The Madame JAKOVLEV referred to may be related to Alexandre Aleksieievitch AKOVLEV or YAKOVLEV, Anatoli JAKOVLEV, or Vladimin TAKOVLEV all of whom have been connected with Soviet diplomatic installations or missions in Paris.
 - 3. Our files further indicate that a Serge STEPANOFF, born 7 October 1900, applied for an immigration visa 26 January 1946 at the American Embassy in Paris. When he applied for the immigration wise, which was never completed, STEPANOFF claimed that his brother, Alexander STEPANOFF, was a naturalized American citizen and resided at 568 Spruce Street, Berkeley, California, where he was employed by the Matson Lines as a master mariner.

4. We would appreciate being furnished all the material you may have on Serge and Alexander STEPANOFF including, if possible, the dates on which they have entered and departed from the United States, the numbers of their passports, naturalisation papers and any other data which might help us establish their identity. We are particularly interested in knowing if derge STEPANOFF


Confidential informants who have furnished reliable information in the past, and who are familiar with certain Communist Party figures and organizations in New York City, advised in October and November 1954 that they are not acquainted with the subject.

LAN ADOMIAN was interviewed on September 29, 1950, by SAS RAYMOND P. WIRTH and JAMES P. LEE, at which time he advised that during the period 1944-46, he had numerous contacts with ANATOLE ANTONOVICH YAKOVLEV, Vice-Consul, Soviet Consulate, New York City.

According to LAN ADOMIAN, the above contact was initiated when he went to the Soviet Consulate to obtain a visa to visit Russia. LAN ADOMIAN related that he was unsuccessful in obtaining this visa. He further advised that he travelled to Europe in 1938 in order to fight with the Abraham Lincoln Brigade in Spain. He stated that he worked at the Amtorg Trading Corporation as an interpreter for a four month period in late 1939 or early 1940.

The Abraham Lincoln Brigade has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

ADOMIAN testified as a government witness during the March 1951 trial of JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG and MORTON SOBELL. ADOMIAN identified a photograph of YAKOVLEV as being the man known to him as ANATOLI ANTONOYLCH YAKOVLEV, Soviet Vice-Consul of the Soviet Consulate, New York City. In 1950 HARRY GOLD, self-confessed espionage agent identified YAKOVLEV as one of his superiors.

The investigation at Tulsa, Oklahoma was conducted by SA STEINAR E. GORUD.

For the information of Detroit, as reflected in enclosed letter from NY to Bureau dated 4/4/56, DONALD THOMAS AXON was interviewed BY SA-S JESSE L. ORR and BENNIE C. GARREN at Tulsa, Oklahoma on 3/16/5% in connection with the case entitled, "JULIUS ROSENBERG, et al. Espionage -R" inasmuch as DAVID GREENGLASS had identified AXON on 3/15/51 as one of eighteen men included in either or both lists of potential Soviet Espionage recruits furnished to ROSENBURG in January, 1945, and to HARRY GOLD in June, 1945. It was indicated further that HARRY GOLD stated the list he received was turned over to ANATOLI A. YAKOVLEV of the Soviet Consulate, New York, N. Y. in June, 1945. During the interview, ANN, who was then Assistant to the Vice-President, Manufacturing and Research, Deep Rock Oil Corporation, residence address Apartment 312, 1607 East 12th Street, Tulsa, Oklahoma, denied knowing ROSENBERG and GOLD but stated he was stationed at Los Alamos, New Mexico, from about 2/3/45 to about 3/9/46 while in the U.S. Army, and from 3/9/46 to about 9/12/47 as a civilian employee of the University of California at Los Alamos. He stated he met GREENGLASS for the first time when he was originally assigned to Los Alamos; that he met Mrs. GRZENGLASS only once when he had dinner with her and her husband in their apartment in Albuquerque, New Mexico when only the three of them were present; that he doesn't recall GREENGLASS ever mentioning the names of ROSENBERG and GOLD, whom he later determined from newspaper accounts were alleged espionage agents for Russia; that neither GREENGLASS nor anyone else had ever asked him to furnish information to Russia; that GRZENGLASS claimed there was more freedom in Russia than AXON thought; that GREENGLASS appeared sympathetic to Russia in his conversations and claimed to have relatives in Russia; that GREENGLASS stated he objected to individual discrimination because of race or color and that he, AXON, shared the same view at the time; that he, AXON, did not consider GREENGLASS to be a Communist and would not have reported GREENGLASS if he had suspected such connection because none of the security lectures which he had attended indicated that Communists were excluded from the plant at 🐇 Los Alamos. AXON stated that at the time his own ideas were so similar to those entertained by GREINGLASS that he did not consider them Communistic and he could not recall any conversations with GREENGLASS wherein the latter was attempting to obtain unauthorized information. On this occasion agents commented administratively that AXON was reserved and nonspecific in answering questions.







MARIAS MALISCRY, a senior student at the University of Pennsylvania, advised that he was just 17 years of age and in high school when his father died. MARIAS advised that he had his own circle of school friends and claimed that he knew virtually nothing about his father's business or personal associates. 



ANATOLITYAKOVIEV: YAKOVIEV gave his title as Assistant Consul General at the Eussian Consulate, New York City and his destination as the Eussian Consulate, New York City. He had U. S. Diplomatic Visa Number 844, issued by the State Department in Washington, D. C. on May 21, 1946. The New York indices revealed that ANATOLI ANTONOVICH MAKOVIEV was born in Borisoglevsk, U.S.S.R. on May 31, 1911, that he arrived in the United States on February 4, 1941 and assumed clerical duties at the New York Eussian Consulate on February 8, 1941. YAKOVIEV is believed to be a Eussian agent operating from the Eussian Consulate, New York City, and is presently under investigation by this office.



Consul, Soviet Consulate, San Francisco, was displayed to
JOHN MAGDIEL and he stated the individual pictured was identical
with the KAHEIFETS whom he contacted in San Francisco.

A photograph of SEMEN MARKOVICE SEMENOV, Amtorg Representative, was displayed to JOHN MAGDIEL. However, he could not identify this photograph as identical with the SEMENOV he met in 1939.

MAGDIEL could not identify a photograph of <u>ALEXANDER</u> P. GRACHEV, Soviet Government Purchasing Commission Officer at Long Beach, California.

ANTONVICH YAKOVLEV, who has been identified as a Soviet Espionage Agent by HARRY GOLD, convicted Soviet Espionage Agent, was displayed to JOHN MAGDIEL who stated the individual pictured was not identical with the YAKOVLEV he met in 1929.

When questioned concerning his Communist activities JOHN MAGDIEL denied that he was a member of the Communist Party. He stated that also he was a member of the Mormon Church. He did not agree with all their teachings and in his interpretation of the Bible he had come to the conclusion that the Russian people were one of the ten lowest tribes of Israel and furthermore that despite the efforts of the Catholic Church and Western Democracy the Russian people would eventually rule the earth.
