**DETAILS:** This investigation is predicated upon receipt of a request from the Bureau that information in possession of the Des Moines Office be supplied, as no previous information is in the possession of the Bureau concerning CHARLES FOSTER RANSOM.

A review of the Des Moines file reflects that subject first came to the attention of the Des Moines Office through a memorandum dated December 12, 1940, submitted by Chief Clerk I. S. OLSEN, which reflected that Mr. PAUL A. BROWN, Assistant Postmaster, Des Moines, Iowa, telephonically advised that RANSOM was unusually interested in Communist matters; that he resided at 4115 Welker Street, Des Moines, Iowa, and that he, BROWN, believed it would be advisable for an agent to call upon him.

A memorandum submitted by reporting agent on January 9, 1941, reflects that a city mail carrier, Mr. R. E. CHAPMAN, 3910 Amick Avenue, had called Mr. BROWN'S attention to a large number of cards which had been sent out by CHARLES RANSOM, and that numerous replies

had been coming in for a period of several weeks. It was ascertained that RANSOM is an officer of the Iowa Civil Liberties Union, and that the nature of the cards was to the effect that the persons to whom they had been addressed had been asked if they wished to be placed on the mailing list of this particular organization. At that time RANSOM was employed as an editorial writer for the Des Moines Register & Tribune Newspaper. RANSOM had formerly resided at 920 27th Street, but had now moved to 4115 Welker Avenue. 0/5

Again, a memorandum by the writer dated April 18, 1941, reflected that in a report of former Special Agent T. W. DAWSEY, Washington, D. C., dated March 10, 1941, in the case entitled "National Federation for Constitutional Liberties - Internal Security R," that on Page 74 of that report appears the name of CHARLES F. RANSOM, *is a name in the actual index of the NFCL.*

In another memorandum by the writer, dated June 27, 1941, it was noted in the report of Special Agent J. A. CARLSON, Kansas City, Missouri, dated June 14, 1946, in the case entitled, "American Peace Mobilization - Internal Security R," b7D

In a memorandum of Special Agent ROBERT E. DOWD, dated March 5, 1946, based upon an investigation conducted in the case entitled "Sodac, New York City - Internal Security R," it is noted that it developed that one ANATOLI YAKOVLEV, Clerk of the Soviet Consulate, New York City, was scheduled to arrive in Des Moines, Iowa, on February 14, 1946, further.

It was noted that CHARLES RANSOM met YAKOVLEV at the train and was seen in his company at the National Farm Institute at the Hotel Fort Des Moines, Des Moines, Iowa, which was in session on February 15 and 16, 1946, and that RANSOM escorted YAKOVLEV to the train when he departed at 11:30 p.m. on February 16, 1946. The other person who met YAKOVLEV with RANSOM was JAMES WALLACE, who is the son of Secretary of Commerce HENRY WALLACE, and who is Secretary and Treasurer of the Pioneer Hybrid Seed Corn Company, Des Moines, Iowa. WALLACE resides at 5310 Grand Avenue, Des Moines, and is a member of the American Legion Post No. 60. b1

An editorial appearing in the Des Moines Tribune on February 19, 1946, entitled, "You can Hear Anything About Those Russians," is an editorial highly favorable to the Soviet. It is not known, but presumably it was written by RANSOM. 0/5

In commenting on a legend that Soviet officials in this country had a rule against any of them ever opening their mouths in public, the editorial writer commented, after YAKOVLEV had made his speech at the convention, that he had asked Mr. YAKOVLEV about the rule, at which time YAKOVLEV said there was not such a rule. The comment of the editorial writer is, "So, lots of things people 'know' about Soviet Russia, aren't so." The whole tenor of the editorial is highly favorable toward the Soviet.

A memorandum in the file dated June 13, 1946, by the writer, discloses the following information:

RANSOM is registered with Local Draft Board No. 3, Des Moines, Iowa, and a check of his file discloses that he was born on November 29, 1909, at Somerville, Massachusetts. His wife is KATHRYN OWEN RANSOM, who was born in Marshalltown, Iowa. RANSOM is employed by the Register & Tribune as an Editorial Writer, and has been so employed since September 6, 1937. He took his B.A. Degree at Tufts College in 1931, and his MA. from the John Fletcher School of Law. He has taught History and Political Science at Tufts and at Drake University in Des Moines. His Social Security Number is [REDACTED]. He also indicated that he operated puppet shows for about ten years. His family physicians are MAURICE RUTHKOW and W. W. HANSEL, both of Des Moines, Iowa. He was married on June 25, 1938. He is not eligible for Army service because he shows a history of Tuberculosis. He was classified 4-A on October 31, 1945. His file reflects that his wife at one time had been Society Editor for the Register & Tribune and that her Social Security Number is [REDACTED].

A review of the file, as well as interview with [REDACTED], whose identity is known to the Bureau, fails to disclose any information which would indicate that RANSOM is a member of the Communist Party or has any such connections. It would appear that the subject is a liberal thinker belonging to the category of those individuals interested in the Civil Liberties Union. It is known that he has been on the staff of the Register & Tribune under W. W. WAYMACK who is considered a liberal, if not radical, editorial writer for the Register and Tribune.

In a book review section of the Des Moines Sunday Register dated August 4, 1946, appears a review of the book entitled "The Great Globe Itself," by WILLIAM C. BULLITT. This review is by CHARLES RANSOM and as showing the attitude of subject in dealing on the subject of Russia, this review is being set forth as follows:

"The great globe is Shakespeare's (The Tempest, Act IV, scene 1) which 'shall dissolve, and ... leave not a rack behind' — just what is likely to happen if Bullitt has his way.

"Bullitt is one of that numerous host to change his mind violently about the Soviet Union, only instead of acquiring balance in the process, he moved from a moderately favorable to a violently anti position.

Subject and family entered the United States at Portland, Oregon on April 16, 1944 and departed the United States at New York as passengers aboard the SS MARSHALL GOVOROV on August 25, 1948.

TCHEPOURNYKH, after his arrival in the United States, was listed by the USSR Consulate as an "employee" or "operative worker." However, in February 1948 he was made a Vice-Consul.

Intelligence TCHEPOURNYKH was a public relations man at the USSR Consulate, New York City, and was in a key position inasmuch as he handled all applications by Americans for visas to visit the Soviet Union as well as Armenian matters. He was treated with an amount of respect that is unusual in view of his position as an "employee" or "operative worker" and later as a Vice-Consul at the Consulate.

He also played a prominent part in the recent Soviet teacher OKSANA S. KASIENKINA incident at the Soviet Consulate in New York City.

Investigation by the NY Division and the Chicago Division, however, disproved the allegations regarding BORIS YAKOVLEFF and upon Bureau instructions on 11/9/53 this case was placed in a closed status.

Inasmuch as this case has been discontinued, no further investigation is being conducted by the NY Division.

In connection with ANDRE SCHWOB, the New York files reflect that he is a diamond importer and is the brother of MAURICE SCHWOB, Fighting French High Commissioner for the Pacific, and personal representative of General De GAULLE. It is to be noted that considerable information concerning MAURICE SCHWOB has been set forth in the New York case entitled, "FIGHTING FRENCH DELEGATION; INTERNAL SECURITY - F". 3rd AMERICAN SLAV CONGRESS

The 3rd American Slav Congress was held at New York City from September 20 to September 22, 1946. There were 17 foreign delegates to the Congress who included five representatives of the Ukrainian Society for Cultural Relations with Foreign Countries, 6 representatives of the Russian All Slav Committee, three Bulgarian, 2 Polish and one Czechoslovakian delegates from the All Slav Committee in the respective countries. The Yugoslavian Delegation was denied admission to the United States by the Department of State under the immigration regulation barring Communists and those who advocate the overthrow of the Government by force.

On September 21, 1946, Mr. J. D. BOOSTAVER, Special Assistant to the Attorney General, advised the New York Office that he had been sent to New York from Washington to handle the matter of calling upon the foreign delegates to the American Slav Congress to register under the provisions of the Foreign Agents Registration Act of 1938 as Amended. He indicated that

delegates should register under protest. During the conference PIRINSKY told RECHT that TESLOA DRAGOTTICHEVA discussed with the Justice Department the rumor that the American Slav Congress would be asked to register if the foreign delegates registered in view of the fact that the American Slav Congress was host to them and she stated that she had received advice to the effect that the rumor was groundless. Both PIRINSKY and RECHT agreed that the American Slav Congress would fight any attempt to have it register.

On October 5, 1946, RECHT told HYMAN OPPENHEIM that he had discussed the registration of the delegates with MARY PIRINSKY, wife of GEORGE PIRINSKY, who is associated with the American Slav Congress, and she told RECHT that she had been at the Soviet Consulate and that they had prepared a letter to the State Department stating that the American Slav Congress had severed relations with the delegation after they arrived and that all letters in this regard should be addressed to the Soviet Consulate and the particular individuals concerned. RECHT told OPPENHEIM that he was disgusted with LOMAKINE, Russian Consul General, and did not care what LOMAKINE did but does not want the "S.O.B." to think he ran out on him. RECHT was referring to his going to Czechoslovakia.

On October 6, 1946, JOYCE CAMPBELL, Executive Director of the American Committee of Yugoslavian Relief, told RECHT that the Ukrainian Delegates were in trouble in that they have to register but have been told not to. RECHT remarked that they were told not to register and did not want to register. However, he added, registration would be necessary or they would not be allowed to leave the country.

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

The June 16, 1945 issue of "Russky Golos" revealed that the United Russian American Committee turned in two checks totaling \$13,000 to the president of the Russian Section of the Ambijan Committee, Prince A.M. Putiatin, in the presence of A.A. YAKOVLEV, of the Soviet Consulate in New York City. According to the article, this sum represented the first installment of the cost of caring for two hundred orphans of Stalingrad for one year. These checks were signed by ANTON HARBIN, Financial Secretary of the United Russian American Committee.

The same issue of the paper revealed that on June 8, 1945 HARBIN and KLIMKOFF attended a meeting of the United Russian American Committee, at which time plans were made to begin a campaign to send a carload of foodstuff to Russia. A picnic for this purpose was planned for July 8, 1945.

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Mr. SHEPPARD was interviewed in the New York Office on March 16, 1944 by SAs Dan G. Bardin and Edward F. Hummer. He advised that at a previous time he had applied to the Soviet Consul for a position in the Soviet Union as a radio engineer. He stated that he wanted to do something for the war effort since he was rejected by both the Army and Navy because of poor eyesight, and further because at the time he had been given a very menial position with the Hazeltine Electronics Corporation. He felt if he applied for a position with the Soviet Union he could secure a very valuable position as a radio engineer because of his technical knowledge,

experience and education. He further advised that he had continued his studies at the Brooklyn Institute in New York and was studying the Russian language at the American-Russian Institute. He explained his visit to the Soviet Consulate on May 5, 1943 as a response to an application made by him, and he was referred to Mr. YAKOVLEV. He further stated he was advised by YAKOVLEV that it would take approximately nine months to clear his application with the Soviet Union. Mr. SHEPPARD further stated that he had no intentions at the time of the interview of going to the Soviet Union since he had been given a more responsible position by the Hazeltine Corporation, but that he did consider going to the Soviet Union following the war, since he felt that radio technicians would be "a dime a dozen in the United States following the war". Mr. SHEPPARD stated he had been contacted by YAKOVLEV on at least five or six occasions following his original contact on May 5, 1943, each time at the initiative of Mr. YAKOVLEV.

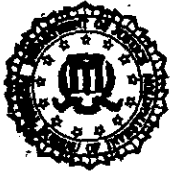
Re Bureau letter of 3/5/74 suggests that additional investigation be conducted to develop complete information concerning the activities of SHEPPARD since he was last called to the attention of the Bureau in 1944. This investigation to be conducted with the aim of ultimately interviewing SHEPPARD.

As indicated in referenced New York letter,

The period of particular interest to the FBI in this matter is 1944 and it would appear that additional investigation at this time concerning SHEPPARD's activities would not develop additional information concerning his contacts at that time. Also, it would be unlikely that if [REDACTED] it (S)

is doubtful that investigation at this time would develop that information. It is believed that the information contained in the enclosed LHM sufficiently documents activities of SHEPPARD after his return to the Philadelphia area in 1945 as far as any overt facets of his life are concerned.

In view of the foregoing, Philadelphia agrees with New York that SHEPPARD should be interviewed at this time rather than continuing investigation of him prior to interview.

In connection with the possible identification of UNSUB HILL, attention is directed to the report of SA WILFRED H. HEWITT dated 12/15/44 at New York captioned ALTO CASE.

On page 104 of this report it is stated that on October 4, 1944, SAs CLIFFORD P. HARTLEY and JAMES M. McGRATH, while surveilling JOSEPH KATZ, at noon observed him leaving the building at 119 West 57th Street at 12:45 PM with a man who was surveilled to 234 Fifth Avenue. Description of this individual was:

Age	30
Height	5' 10"
Weight	155 lbs.
Carriage	Very good; very rapid walker; leather heels
Appearance	Brown raincoat; thick tie; dapper personality; apparently American; ruddy complexion; collegiate dress.

In this regard it is noted that the above address on Fifth Avenue appears on page 112 of referenced report as the address of the American and Overseas Mercantile Company, with whom KATZ was in telephonic contact. In addition, it is noted that BENTLEY'S last contact with HILL took place approximately September 16, 1944, while her first contact with JOSEPH KATZ was in October 1944. Therefore, the above meeting between KATZ and the unidentified man took place apparently between the last meeting between BENTLEY and HILL and her first meeting with KATZ.

It is further noted that the physical description between the unidentified person above and UNSUB HILL is very similar, particularly the dapper personality and collegiate dress.

The files of this Division do not reflect that this individual has been identified. In the event he was not identified, it is suggested that the surveilling Agents be interviewed, if they are still in New York, and ascertain if they can recall further details and also that the photograph of ANATOLE LAKOVLEV be shown them since BENTLEY said that he resembled UNSUB HILL.

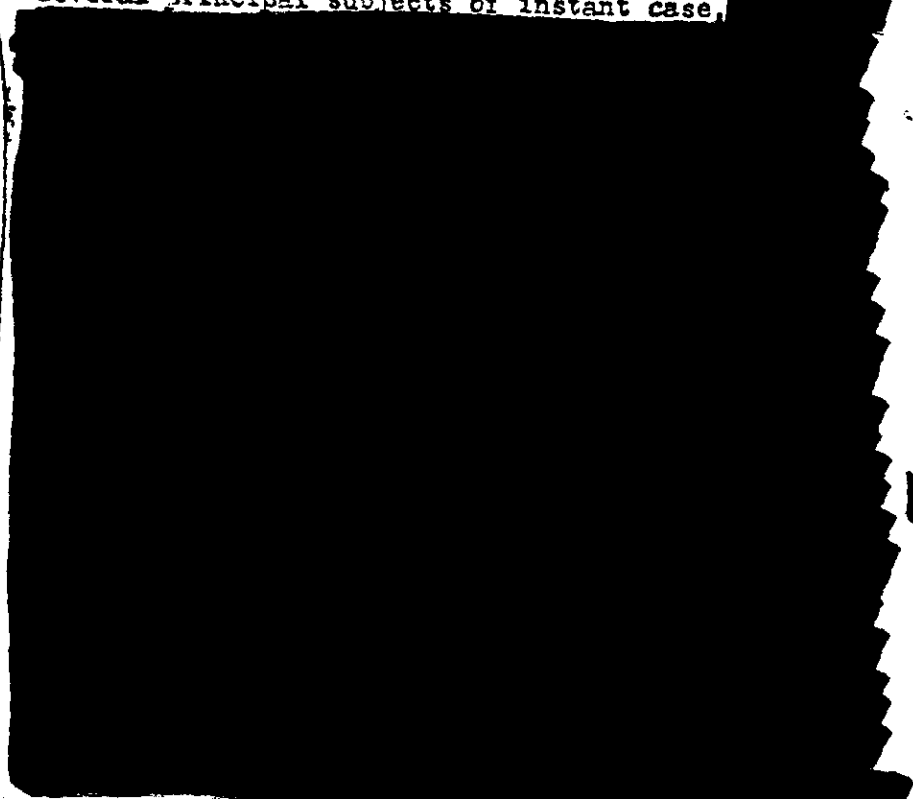

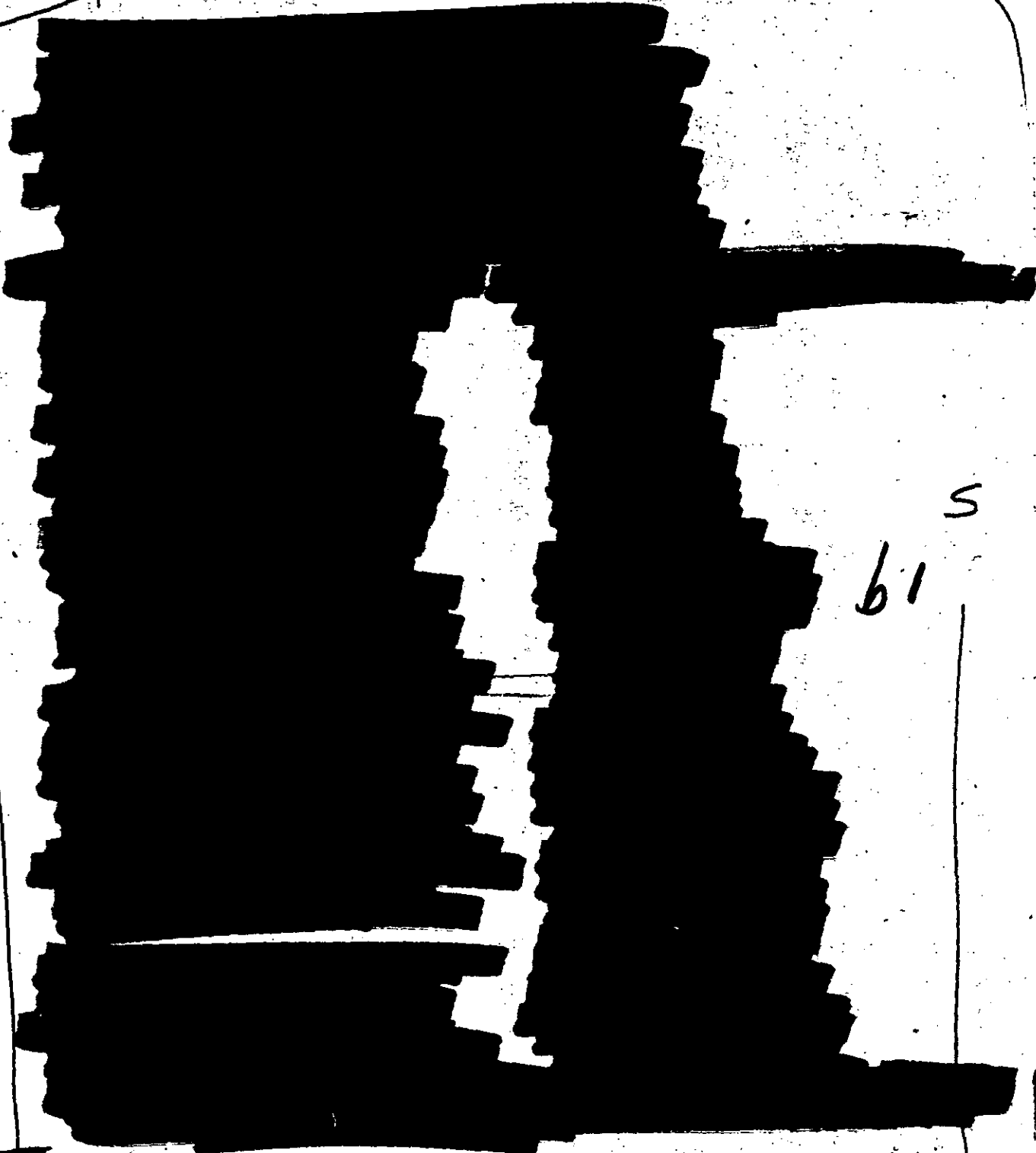

Guest of honor was General WALTER (KAROL) SWIERCZWSKI former Commander of International Brigade and presently Vice Minister of National Defense of Poland and allegedly NKVD agent.

Speeches and other communications reflect definite pro-Soviet and CP sympathies. BEN DAVIS, member of CP National Committee cited "complete solidarity" existing between CP and VALB. Organization closely followed Party line on anti-FRANCO policy. VALB newspaper ad was altered to conform with pronouncement of NY State CP Secretariat, Relations with Communists and International Brigaders in other countries set out. VALB supported and was supported by known Communist organizations and fronts. "Volunteer for Liberty" and "News on Spain" reviewed. Recent bank deposits noted. National and local officers set out. Resolution on Spain: Resolved that the organization and its members use all resources possible to campaign to raise funds to relieve the conditions of Spanish Republican refugees and to "materially aid the anti-fascist Republic inside of FRANKO Spain." Further Resolved that the organization press the Government to make sharp representations in Madrid against the arrest and imprisonment of Spain's best men.

Resolution on Action: Resolved that the organization explore every means of instituting a blockade of FRANKO Spain by this country by preventing the shipment of goods for Spain and by placing a boycott on all goods manufactured in Spain and sold to this country.

Resolution on International Brigades: Resolved that the VALB initiate a campaign to solicit funds and supplies in large quantities for immediate shipment to I.B. Comrades overseas who have distinguished themselves in the fight against fascism under difficult conditions and are now engaged in the gigantic task of reconstruction and "democratization of their countries."

Resolution on Thanks to the Polish Government: Resolved that the Convention express its appreciation of the anti-FRANKO work of the Polish Government through its spokesman OSCAR LANGE, and pledges the support of the VALB in the continuation of this fight.

Resolution on American Slav Congress: Resolution adopted sending greetings to the American Slav Congress.

Resolution on Yugoslavia: HAROLD SMITH proposed the adoption of a resolution against the boycotting of supplies (UNRRA) going to Yugoslavia, pointing out the record of the Yugoslavian people and "their close relationship to us."

The Convention then voted to remove the section on death benefits and to stress rehabilitation.

The Convention elected a National Board, to be set out under another section of this report. It also elected National Officers, which will also be set out under appropriate heading.

Though we are dissatisfied regarding the results of the collection of the signatures, we are on the other hand confident that our Comrades will put forth great efforts in this matter. The APLA hand in hand and in close cooperation with the country's progressive elements have strived against reaction and in favor of the interest of the American and Armenian populations. Our organization participated in the election campaigns and in favor of the candidates of the Progressive Party. We helped the Civil Rights Congress and (American) Committee for Protection of Foreign Born. Moreover, we have sent our delegate to their convention in Detroit. We have participated in the May Day Celebration. With our press and organizations, we have actively helped the victims of reaction...."

JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG were convicted in the United States District Court, Southern District of New York (USDC, SDNY) on March 29, 1951, of conspiracy to commit espionage on behalf of the Soviet Union. The ROSENBERGS were sentenced to death on April 5, 1951.

JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG were legally executed at Sing Sing Prison, Ossining, New York, on June 19, 1953.

The following information has been located in the New York files and may possibly pertain to the subject of instant investigation:

Confidential Informant T-1 advised the New York Office on December 29, 1944, that two days earlier a Miss TREEBACK (phonetic) of the Jewish Writers and Artists Committee at New York City, contacted ANATOLI YAKOVLEV, who was then a clerk at the Soviet Consulate at New York, and advised him that the Jewish Writers and Artists Committee of New York had received a cable from the Joint Anti-Fascist Committee in Moscow advising

that a shortwave broadcast would be made on December 31, 1944, at 15 o'clock, twenty minutes, Moscow time (4:30 A.M. New York time), on a wavelength of 19.7 and 51.43 meters, by the leaders of the Joint Anti-Fascist Committee at Moscow including (Professor SOLOMON) MIKHOLS, (SHAGNER) EPSTEIN, (JAZEK) PEFER, BERGELSON, KALKIN, KVIKO and ZOOSKIN, all phonetic. YAKOVLEV apparently had no previous knowledge concerning the broadcast. (S)(u)

The above is included here since it is known that ESTHER RAND, in her business activities, uses her maiden name, FREIBACH. If the above individual who contacted the Soviet Consulate is identical with the subject it would appear that in 1944 the subject was employed by the Committee of Jewish Writers and Artists in New York. (S)(u)

It will be recalled from information contained in the writer's report of February 13, 1948, that ESTHER RAND departed from New York by plane for Paris on January 27, 1948, as a member of a delegation of the United Jewish Appeal with which she is employed. On February 19, 1948, an article appeared in the New York "Daily News" reflecting that Arabs had shot at a delegation of the UJA which was touring Palestine. The article stated that 28 American delegates of the UJA, on a tour of inspection of European Jewish Displaced Persons Camps and Palestine, were travelling in Palestine from Tel Aviv to Haifa when Arabs fired on their armored buses. None of the delegates was injured. However, they were reportedly badly shaken by the attack which occurred near Mount Carmel and were indignant concerning the fact that British Airborne Troops searched them for weapons on the suspicion that the first shots had been fired by the delegates. The article then stated that one of the delegates was Mrs. ESTHER T. RAND of New York.
